

The Juniors go to Liverpool for their Quarter-Final Game in the F.A. Youth Cup on Monday next. Once again the kick-off time is to be put forward to 3 p.m. because of the existing emergency. This is a great achievement by our Juniors to get into the last eight of the Youth Cup, and we sincerely hope that they can add this handsome trophy to those that they have won during their last few Seasons.

The same Junior team we have been talking about in the previous paragraph have been invited to take part once again in the ADO Youth Tournament at The Hague in June this year. This was the Tournament in which we were runners-up last Season, and it is pleasing to note that we are the only English Club invited from a truly Continental gathering — WELL DONE LADS!

# WELCOME TO SWINDON TOWN

Swindon's visit to Ayresome Park this afternoon enables us to welcome back Arthur Horsfield, who started his professional career with us and who is now Swindon's top scorer with eight goals. Arthur first played in our League team in 1963/64 and it was towards the end of the 1968/69 campaign that he left us to join Newcastle. He didn't stay at St. James Park long before going down to the Wiltshire club in the close-season. He now needs only nine more goals for his century in League football.

The remainder of the side will probably be chosen from:

Peter Downsborough (Goal-keeper). Peter was still an amateur when introduced to League football with Halifax Town. He turned professional in 1960 and joined Swindon for a nominal £3,000 fee five years later.

Rod Thomas (Right-back). Rod is now first-choice at full-back for Wales. He is the only player in postwar soccer to win his first seven full caps while playing in Third Division football. He now has 20 caps.

Paul Peterson (Right-back). Paul joined Swindon from Leeds United last summer and recently made his debut for them. His first-team games at Leeds were limited to three, two seasons ago.

John Trollope (Left-back). A Swindon discovery, John made his League debut in 1960 and remained in the side for an incredible run of 360 consecutive League games, the sequence ending when he broke an arm at Hartlepool in 1968. He returned as soon as he was fit again and is once again a model of consistency.

Ray Bunkell (Right-half). A former England youth international, Ray developed in Spurs' junior sides but didn't get into their League eleven. He joined Swindon last summer and made his League debut against Watford in September.

Frank Burrows (Centre-half). Frank left Raith Rovers to try his luck in English football with Scunthorpe in 1965. In his last two campaigns, before joining Swindon in 1968, he missed only five League games. Last Saturday he moved up to score the only goal of the game against Sheffield Wednesday.

Joe Butler (Left-half). Joe entered League football with Newcastle in 1963/64 but was not fortunate enough to get many chances in their first-team so he joined Swindon in 1965.

Terry Hubbard (Outside-right). A local discovery, Terry made one League appearance as substitute last season, and was given a further opportunity. last month.

Roger Smart (Inside-right). Roger is a product of Swindon schools football who got his first taste of League football in 1961/62. He helped Swindon into the Second Division for the first time in 1963 and again in 1969.

Peter Noble (Inside-left). Another native of the North-East, Peter started with Newcastle and cost Swindon £10,000 in January 1968.

Don Rogers (Striker). An England Under-23 international, Don has been a regular for eight seasons and top scorer for four of the past five campaigns. Last season he scored 20 in League and Cup. Many First Division clubs have sought his signature.







# Spotlight on Today's Manager . . . DAVE MACKAY (Swindon Town)

Dave Mackay has become a legend in his own lifetime. Two broken legs failed to deter him. He has been declared "finished" on numerous occasions and, by all normal standards, his playing career should have been over a long while ago. But Mackay is Mackay. And he's playing on as determined and effectively, as ever.

Dave learned his rudimentary skills kicking a ball around the streets of Edinburgh. Usually those impromptu "matches" found Mackay facing bigger boys than himself and he had to develop his toughness to survive. Hearts, the team he had always supported, signed him as a part-time professional at £10 a week.

He entered their first-team in 1953/54 and thus began his unique record of achievement. He was capped for Scotland at schoolboy, under-23 and full international levels, won Scottish League Cup and Scottish Cup medals plus a Scottish League Championship medal with Hearts. Later, at Spurs, he won English League and Cup medals.

Spurs paid £30,000, then a record for a half-back, to get Mackay on their books in 1959 and he was one of the vital cogs in that fine machine which won the League and Cup double in 1961 and won the

F.A. Cup again the following year. Injury kept him out of the Spurs' team which became the first British side to win a European competition in 1963 — they beat Atletico Madrid 5-1 in the final of the European Cup-Winners' Cup — though he played in every game on the way.

The following season, in the same competition, he broke his leg playing against Manchester United. They thought that was the end of Dave Mackay. But, of course, he came back.

When Dave Mackay believed his days as a First Division player were numbered, he decided to join Derby County because he felt he could contribute some of his own very special brand of energy to this progressive club's drive to improve its status. Indeed, he helped to revitalise Derby and take them back into Division One after an absence of 16 years.

Last season, when his job at the Baseball Ground was completed, Derby agreed to release him. Instead of fading into retirement, he took on an even tougher task — trying to repeat his Derby feat and take Swindon into the First Division!

He began the season as captain but was appointed player-manager after the departure of Fred Ford.


