I hope you followers are also keeping an eye on the activities of Blackpool Reserve. They



ALAN SPRATLEY (Goalkeeper). Born Maidenhead. Close season signing from Queens Park Rangers where he was required to compete against Phil Parkes for a first team place.

ROD THOMAS (Full-back). Born Glyncorrwg. A former youth player with the club. He was signed from Gloucester City in July, 1964. Has gained Welsh Under-23 caps and Full Welsh caps. Regular member of promotion winning side of Season 1968/69. Played in Football League Cup Final Cup Winning Team of Season 1968/69. Played in League Cup Winning Team of 1969 and in Anglo-Italian Inter-Club Competition Winning Team, Season 1969/70.

JOHN TROLLOPE (Full-back). Born Wroughton near Swindon. Joined the club from school and has become its longest serving professional, signing in August 1960. Since his League debut at the age of 16 he has made over 600 appearances for Swindon.

JOE BUTLER (Full-back). Born Newcastle. Joined Swindon from Newcastle United in August, 1965, where he graduated to the senior ranks through the club's Junior Team. A tenacious player whose speed and ability amply make up for his lack of inches. Regular member of promotion winning side of Season 1968/69. Played in Football League Cup Winning Team of Season 1968/69. Played in League Cup Winners Cup Winning Team of 1969, and in Anglo-Italian Inter-Club Competition Winning Team, Season 1969/70.

FRANK BURROWS (Centre-half). Born Larkhall, Scotland. Joined the club from Scunthorpe United for whom he played three seasons. Formerly with Raith Rovers. A strong defender who has made his mark in the first team. Regular member of promotion winning team of Season 1968/69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of Season 1968/69. Played in League Cup Winners Cup winning team of 1969, and in Anglo-Italian Inter-Club Competition winning team of Season 1969/70.

RON POTTER (Left-half). Born Wolverhampton. He started his career with West Bromwich Albion as a centre-half where his opportunities were limited. Transferred to Swindon November, 1970.

DAVID MOSS (Outside-right). Born Witney. Was spotted playing in junior soccer and signed professional 1969.

MICK McGOVERN (Forward). Born Hayes. Signed from Queens Park Rangers in February, 1973, and formerly played in London amateur soccer.

RAY TREACY (Centre-forward). Born Dublin. Joined Swindon from Charlton Athletic. Prior to this he was a member of the West Bromwich Albion squad. Ray has been a representative of Eire at schoolboy, youth, under-23 and full international level. Excellent header of a ball and has been a regular marksman with his previous clubs.

RAY CLARKE (Forward). Born Hackney, Signed from Tottenham Hotspur during close season. Ray was a leading goal scorer in the Spurs Football Combination side.

TOM JENKINS (Winger). Born London. Signed from Southampton in October, 1972, after Swindon had sold Don Rogers to Crystal Palace. Formerly with Orient and Reading, he also had a spell with Southern League Margate.

TERRY HUBBARD (Inside-forward). Born Newport. Apprentice Professional. Signed Professional 1969, Has now established himself as a regular first team and Welsh Under-23 player.

RAY BUNKELL (Wing-half). Born Tottenham. Joined the club June, 1971, from Tottenham where he was a regular Football Combination player. He also played for the England Youth Team.





# A STAR WITH ELEVEN BOSSES!

FRIENDS of his are apt to think that six-feettall, hard tackling Terry Alcock is exaggerating if ever he says: "I have played under 11 different managers."

But when it comes to a count-down Terry proves that what he claims is absolutely correct. His memo, about managers may also be a record in the realms of soccer statistics.

Alcock, during a career spanning 12 years has served only two clubs, Port Vale and Black-pool—plus a shot term on loan with Bury. But during this time Terry's miscellany of managers has been considerably greater than a professional would normally expect to work with throughout his playing days.

In Alcock's case they have been Norman Low, Freddie Steele, Jackie Mudie, then Sir Stanley Matthews while Terry was a player for Port Vale, followed by Stanley Mortensen, Les Shannon, Harry Johnston and Jimmy Meadows (both "temporaries"), Bob Stokoe and Harry Potts, at Blackpool, with Tom McAnearney as his Gigg Lane "boss".


Mention of such names as Stanley Matthews, Jackie Mudie and Stan Mortensen promptly points to 26-year-old Terry having a series of extraordinary links with Bloomfield Road and Vale Park. In the long ago, his father Ted (likewise a footballer with Manchester City and Congleton Town) went to Wellington Road senior school, Hanley, and sat in the same class as young Stan Matthews.

Part of Sir Stanley's soccer destiny was to wear the "Tangerine" shirt for years as a Blackpool player before returning to the Potteries. Jackie Mudie's greatest footballing days were as a Seasiders' forward. And throughout his career at Bloomfield Road the likeable Terry Alcock has had a "buddie" from his Hanley schooldays as a Blackpool team-mate, the redoubtable Bill Bentley.

"Like Sir Stanley Matthews and my father, I also went to Wellington Road school, at Hanley," Alcock recalls. "About the time I became a 15-year-old apprentice with Port Vale I was in the Stoke Schools team which won the English Schools Shield.

"Bill Bentley, then attending St. Gregory's School, Longton, was in the same side. Our coach was Dennis Wilshaw, the Wolves and England international forward. He first tutored us into playing the 4-2-4 system."

In July, 1967, the former Blackpool manager Stan Mortensen accomplished a bargain "buy" when he obtained Alcock from Port Vale for £30,000—Terry at the time having 112 league appearances, plus a string of cup games to his credit. "Morty" travelled back to the Potteries early in January, 1969, determined also to sign Bill Bentley, the former colleague of Terry's

from the Stoke-on-Trent schools team which had won the English Schools Shield.

Stoke City collected a £30,000 cheque for parting with the dependable Bentley, since when Terry and Bill have been outstanding members of a consistently splendid Seasiders' defence. Alcock regards his career with Blackpool as having been "tremendously enjoyable." He feels the team got the greatest "kick" of all from competing in the Anglo-Italian Cup, particularly from winning the trophy.

'As a long-experienced 26-year-old star of topclass soccer, Terry Alcock is keenly aware of the help that players like himself can render to the youngsters. In this respect, Terry never forgets his indebtedness to Roy Sproson, a Port Vale veteran who "schooled" Alcock throughout his early days at Vale Park.

"I learned a lot from him," Terry recollects.
"He would 'talk' me through a game, helping me
to iron out my faults and offering a word of
praise whenever I did my work well. There
was also Lol Hamlett, our trainer, and Billy Cope
—both of whom had played with Bolton
Wanderers. Us juniors owed much to seniors
like these."

Terry, with his wife Sandra (a Stoke-on-Trent girl) and their little son Warren, aged five, lives in Ashfield Road, Bispham. Golf is Alcock's favourite recreation—"not at any particular course, but wherever the rest of the Blackpool lads happen to be playing."

Terry is a keen motorist, drives a Capri 2,000 GT styled in gold and black. Being a Gilbert O'Sullivan "fan" the Blackpool wing-half keeps handy in his car a stock of O'Sullivan "tapes" in order to enjoy them over his cassette hi-fi equipment while out "on the road."

But there is an even more important reason why Alcock has felt "on song" recently. He explained: "It has been the pleasure of heading in a goal against Portsmouth, shortly after getting two earlier goals when we beat Fulham, at Bloomfield Road.

"Till that time I had gone 13 matches without ever finding the net after doing so in our opening game versus West Brom. I was beginning to wonder if I had lost my scoring 'knack'," Terry declared.

Last Saturday Alcock was on target again with two vital goals at Preston.

Clearly, Alcock has NOT lost his scoring ability, while his prowess as a defender is something special that has helped to swing the Seasiders into top gear lately.



IN THE last programme we put forward a competition for letter writers asking how to provide incentive for attacking play and goalgetters. The same afternoon Blackpool rammed five past Portsmouth and last Saturday hit three more at Preston!

Eight goals in two games from a team that likes to attack and use the wings, but is often hampered by the defensive approach of visiting teams, some of whom are now putting FOUR men in midfield in a 4-4-2 style.

Unfortunately, there aren't enough managers like Harry Potts or teams like Blackpool who are willing to take risks in order to entertain and get goals—which is what football is all about.

The game has changed since the Fifties. Some blame it on England's 1966 World Cup success when clubs copied Sir Alf Ramsey's 4-3-3 system.

Look at these figures. In 1956-57 season Manchester United won the title by scoring 103 goals. Leicester City got 109 in winning promotion from Division Two and Ipswich (101) and Derby (111) were centurions in the Third Division North and South Sections.

Even Charlton, who were relegated from Division One, scored 62 goals.

Compare this with last season. Champions Liverpool hit 72 goals, runners-up Arsenal got only 57 and relegated West Brom. scratched together only 38.

There are many suggestions on how to provide incentive. Some say alter the rules, like limiting offside to goal-side of the present 18-yard penalty area extended to the touchline.

Or banning passing back to the goalkeeper from the same line.

Such amendments would, however, be of no use unless the whole football world agreed as

## How to get back the big scores

we could not play domestic and international matches under different sets of rules and markings on the pitch.

But points for goals in the League could provide incentive without changing any rules.

Mr. G. Parkinson of Bispham (the winning letter this week) suggests a bonus for winners and losers (or a draw) providing at least two goals are scored.

He says: "The margin between a draw and a win is too narrow. Even if a team scores two goals and loses they should get a bonus. For example, a 2-3 defeat would, under my bonus scheme, get two points for the losers (a point for each goal). The winners would get five points (2 for a win and 3 for the goals).

A 2-2 draw means both sides get three points, but a 0-0 or 1-1 draw leaves only one point, thereby punishing the teams who can't score. Even a team that sits on a one-goal lead to win

would get only two points."

LOOKING forward . . . to Bristol City's visit to Bloomfield Road next March. They are believed to be the only club to have a barber on the staff. He visits the players once a month to ensure their hair is kept "in trim". It will make a change . . . just being able to recognise players without relying on shirt numbers!


