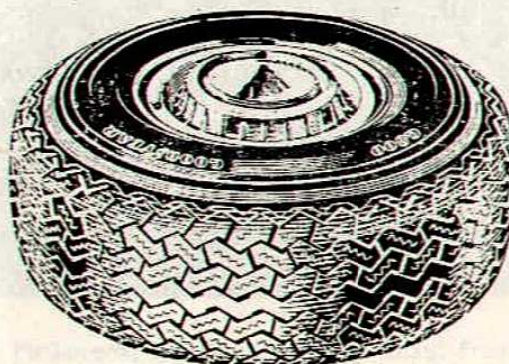

Introducing . . . Swindon

● Despite a shaky start, Swindon Town have emerged as one of the most entertaining sides in the Division this season, with £70,000 record buy **Peter Eastoe** contributing to more than enough to the sides push for promotion.

● The Tamworth-born striker joined the relegation doomed Robins on loan from Wolves towards the end of last season after the departure of manager Ronnie Allen and the "homecoming" of Mr. Danny Williams, six years after he had won Swindon (Don Rodgers and all) a place in history by being only the second Division 3 side ever to win the League Cup, and then to secure promotion into Division 2.

● Swindon paid a club record £70,000 for Eastoe following the successful loan spell in which he scored eight goals in nineteen outings, and after another season of crashing home the goals (he has almost thirty to his credit), it looks as though Yorkshireman Williams has yet again waved his magic wand of success.

● The shrewd Swindon boss seems to have a calculated head for buying teams primed for promotion from Division 3, and you only have to look at some of the "big-name" buys in the side to see how.

● His investments this season include goalkeeper **Jim Barrow**, who joined them in July from Nottingham Forest on the same day that **Hugh Maclean** joined them from West Brom.

● Barrow made nearly 200-appearances for Forest after making a similar number with Oxford, and brief spells with Chelsea and Wolves. In contrast, Maclean had made only a handful of League appearances before joining Swindon.

● Northern Ireland international **Trevor Anderson** joined Swindon in November from Manchester United, where he made only two League appearances last season, and Mr. Williams also secured the signature of one of his former players at Sheffield Wednesday **Colin Prophet**, who joined them after a season stay with Norwich City.

● Alongside Prophet in defence there is veteran full-back **John Trollope**, who is now nearing the 700-appearance mark for the club. Trollope is one of only three survivors of the side which won the League Cup in 1969. The others being **Joe Butler** and **Frank Burrows**.

● Butler moved to Swindon from Newcastle in August 1965, and celebrated his testimonial year by chalking up his 350th League appearance.

● Burrows is a Scot who began his career with Raith Rovers and had a three season stay before joining Swindon.

● There are likely to be three former Youth Internationals in the side today, including Welsh International **Terry Hubbard**, who joined Swindon from school, and Salisbury-born striker **Dave Syrett** who won recognition with the England Youth side.

● Young **John McLaughlin** was signed from Colchester eighteen months ago after joining them straight from school. He has also won England Youth recognition.

● Before signing Eastoe, the club's transfer record was held by Tommy Jenkins, who was signed from Southampton after being "re-discovered" by Reading after failing to make it with Orient.

● Another player to move down the League ladder to success at Swindon has been **Mike Dillon** who joined the County Ground Staff after being with Tottenham.

Our record with Swindon is far from impressive. In four visits to the County Ground, we have failed to pick up a point, and here at The Racecourse have shared the points from our three meetings evenly—with each side winning one, drawing one and losing one game.

FIVE-A-SIDE SUCCESS

- Wrexham FC retained the Clifford Lloyd Memorial Trophy at the Plas Madoc Leisure Centre, Acrefair, a week last Friday, when they beat off the challenge of fourteen other clubs before beating Brymbo Steelworks in a closely-fought final.
- The competition is for five-a-side teams under the age of eighteen, and is organised by Wrexham A.F.C. Supporters' Association, who were rather disappointed that only sixteen teams competed after the great success of it's inaugural season.
- On the way to the final, Wrexham beat Rhos Youth Club (3-0), Ysgol Rhiwabon (6-2) and Little Acton (3-2), while Brymbo beat last year's beaten finalists Ajax of Deeside (1-0), Caergwrle Boys Brigade (2-0) and Llay Welfare (4-1).
- Mike Williams gave Wrexham an early lead in the final, and Robert Evans added another before Brymbo staged a fine fightback to take a 3-2 lead just after half-time. But it was left for Williams to steal the show with two late goals, including a match-winning penalty a minute from time.



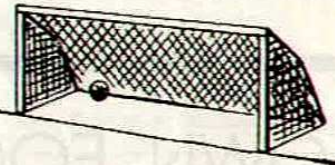

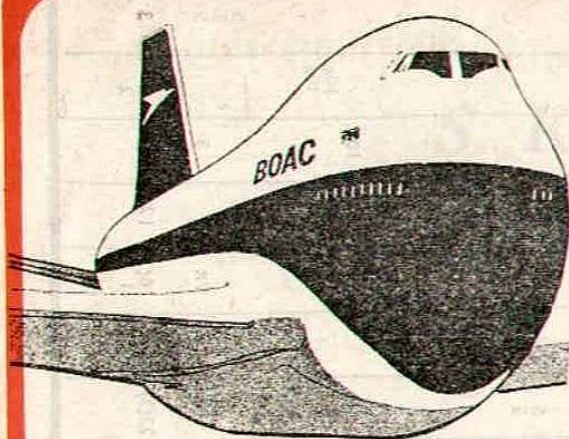
