#### OUR REFEREE TO-NIGHT . . .

KEN RIDDEN (Shrewsbury). Began refereeing in Durham and served on the Northern League before moving to Shrewsbury and switching to Southern League. Went on the League line in 1966 and was appointed to the full list for last season after a season on the Supplementary list. Refereed last season's F.A. Sunday Cup Final and on the line for the 1973 F.A. Challenge Trophy Final at Wembley and a European Cup match in Belgium in 1969. A Senior Lecturer at Shrewsbury Technical College he is married with two children. Enjoys refereeing matches in local Schools' Competitions, wood-turning and oil-painting. From our research, it would appear that Mr. Ridden has not officiated at Gigg Lane before. We therefore bid him welcome to new territory.

## "FLASHBACK"

50 years ago. Saturday, October 24th, 1925. Division 1. Bury 2 Aston Villa 3.

Seemingly down and out, Villa stunned the Gigg Lane crowd with two late goals to snatch the points

from Bury's grasp.

With only three minutes gone the Shakers raced into the lead. Robbie cut inside and slipped a short pass to Bullock, who in little space, pivoted and hammered the ball through a ruck of defenders into the net.

The Shakers exercised complete command for the remainder of the half and scored again through Amos. But even so, Villa managed to squeeze a goal in. In a rare attack from the Birmingham side, a quick throwin caught the Shakers napping and York dashed in unchallenged to head a simple goal.

The Shakers pressed for the whole of the second half but were unable to turn their many openings into goals. And they were made to pay for this in the most painful way possible as Villa showed how to put the chances away.

Right-winger York was Bury's tormentor as he added to his earlier goal with a 15-yard shot and then grabbed his hat-trick six minutes from time with a glancing header.

25 years ago. Saturday, October 14th, 1950. Division 2. Bury 3 West Ham United 0.

Bury gave their brightest display of the season as they powered their way to victory and hammered West Ham into submission with a barrage of fierce attacks.

The Hammers were never allowed a look in and an abundance of thrilling incidents in and around their goalmouth kept the crowd on their toes and Bury keeper Evans a lone figure at the other end.

After 18 minutes, Bodle played a short pass to Plant then seized the return and fired it past Gregory,

who was to have a busy afternoon.

Walton scored a second goal and then Plant eluded Walker and beat Gregory with a dipping cross-shot to seal an outstanding victory.

From the start Bury were in a goal-hungry mood and Birmingham must have sensed it was not going to be their day.

And it took them only ten minutes to break the deadlock. Parry lashed in a shot which Schofield could only deflect into the path of Pointer who snapped up the chance.

Another positive attack yielded a second goal ten minutes later. And it was sheer brilliance from Ray

Parry.

Parry moved onto a clearance, headed the ball over an onrushing defender, gained control and slammed the ball wide of a helpless Schofield.

The Shakers added further goals through Bell, Pointer and Bird. Darrell hit Birmingham's solitary

After catching Bury cold with a tenth minute goal Aldershot proceeded to worry the Bury defence with a string of high balls aimed at their tall forward line. But the Shakers repulsed the challenge and fought back to draw level.

Tinsley rolled a free-kick to Hoolickin who stepped forward and rocketed an unstoppable shot into the top

Captain for the day Steve Melledew, playing against his former club, almost clinched the points for Bury in the dying seconds but he shot weakly with only the goalkeeper to beat.

## SWINDON TOWN

ENTHUSIASM reached unprecedented heights in the West Country on 6th March, 1969, when Swindon Town became League Cup holders by beating Arsenal 3-1 in extra time at Wembley-and at the end of the season also gained promotion to Division Two.

A clergyman formed the club in 1881 and it became the top amateur side in Wiltshire, turning professional

and entering the Southern League in 1894.

After 43 years as a Third Division club, Swindon gained promotion as runners-up in 1963. They started off well in Second Division football, being undefeated for their first nine games, but eventually finished the season well down the table, and the following year they were back in the Third Division.

One of the club's earliest stars was Harold Fleming, an inside-forward capped nine times for England. His skills played a major part in Swindon's two F.A. Cup semi-final appearances in 1910 and 1912. Others of renown have included Grenville Morris, who scored 47 League goals in 1926-27 and a total of 216 in eight seasons; Maurice Owen, another with goalscoring flair and 554 League appearances for the club (1946-63); Norman Uprichard, Ireland's goalkeeper in the 1950s; England International Mike Summerbee and Under-23 caps Ernie Hunt and Don Rogers; and Dave Mackay (ex-Tottenham and Scotland), who joined Swindon in the summer of 1971.
