

CHATTER

Good afternoon to you all and welcome to Claremont Road. We have pleasure in entertaining today the Officials, Players and Supporters from Swindon Town Football Club in the F.A. Challenge Cup, 2nd Round. Victory this afternoon will mean a place in the next round draw with the giants from the 1st and 2nd Divisions of the Football League. Following our first ever Cup victory over a league side in the last round we at Hendon hope very much that the team will be able to recapture the form that put our first Football League scalp under our belts. Whatever the outcome of the game let's hope we see an entertaining afternoon's football, with the better side getting victory.

RECENT FORM

Following our fine win over Reading the next week we entertained Basingstoke Town in the F.A. Challenge Trophy final qualifying round, First half goals from Jefferies, Childs and two from Baker put us well on the road to victory. In the second half Phillips added a fifth before Baker completed his hat-trick and so record a fine six goals to one win. The side was indeed in great form and it was hoped that they could repeat this performance last Saturday at Leatherhead in the London Senior Cup. Perhaps paying the penalty for committing ourselves to attack we trailed at half time by one goal to nil. In the second half, although we played some good football Leatherhead always seemed to be able to hold anything we could throw at them and mid-way through the second half they scored again and so record a two goals to nil victory.

In both these games Bill Fisher named the same side that beat Reading even though last week there were last minute doubts over the fitness of several players. With this in mind anyone who saw the game at Leatherhead must agree that the team played well, but perhaps did not get the luck they deserved.


