Newman**

Ron will be best remembered for his sparkling displays on the right wing for the Fourth Division championship side of 1963-64.

Signed by Freddie Cox in September 1963, he scored on his debut and netted a total of 20 goals in 93 Football League appearances.

Ron began his professional career with Portsmouth—then First Division side—in 1954. Before moving on to Leyton Orient, seven years later, he chalked up 108 appearances and scored 21 goals.

He later had a short spell with Crystal Palace from where he joined Gills.

In January 1967, Ron emigrated to the United States. For the last nine years he has been with Dallas Tornado, first as a player and now as chief coach.

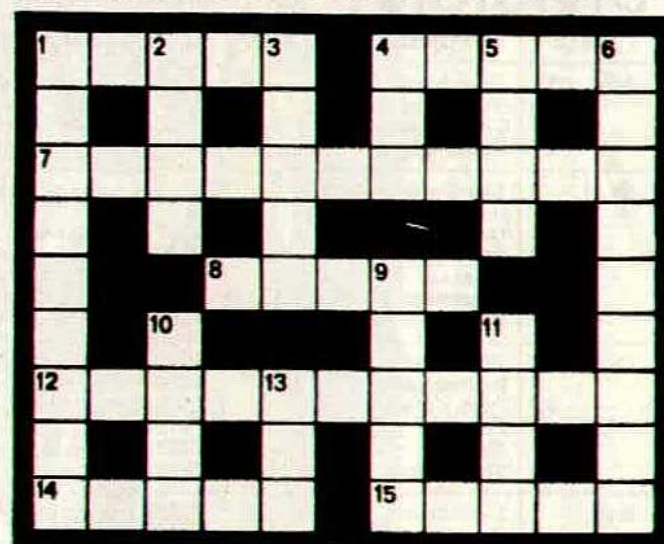

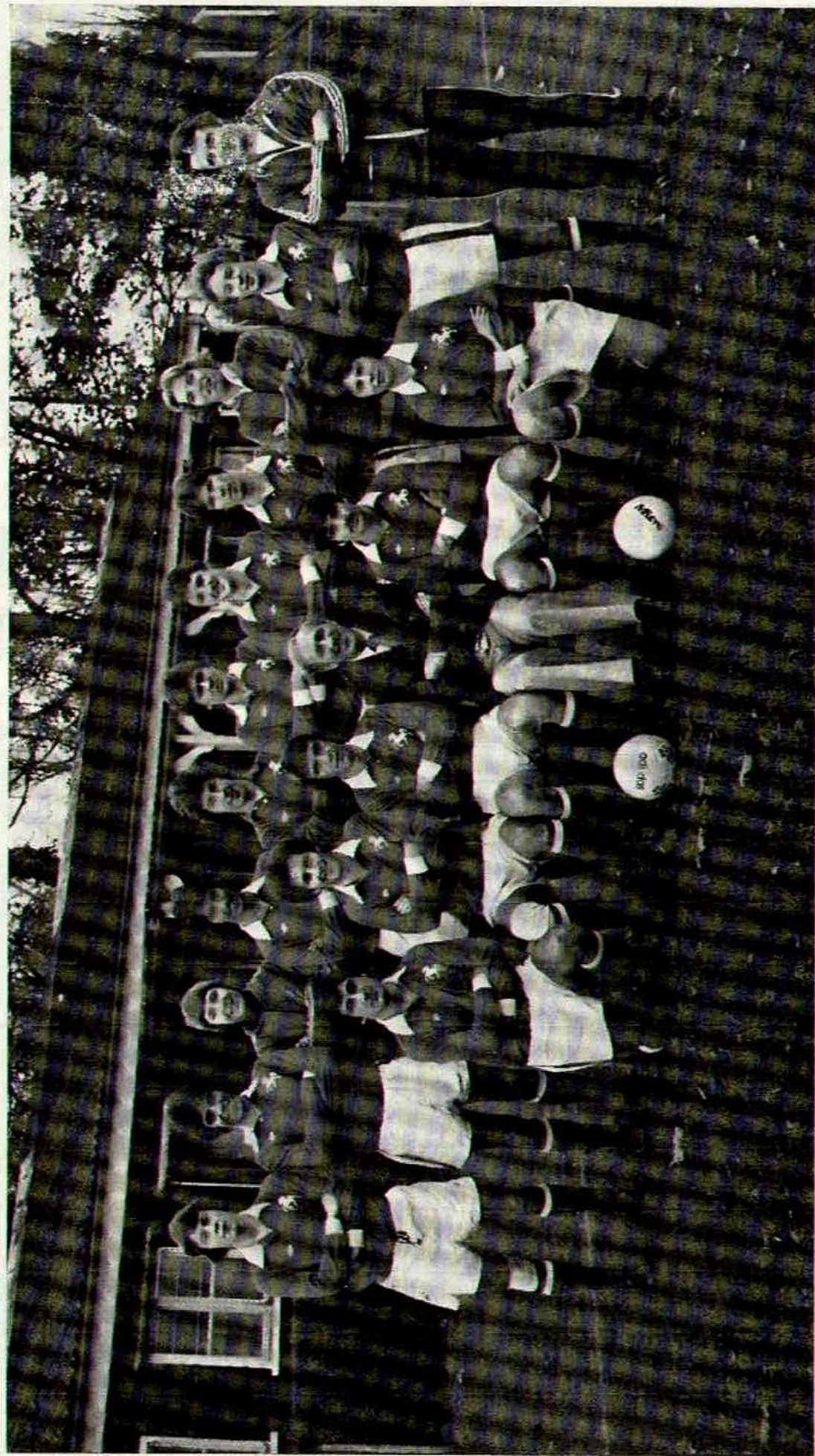

FOREST FIRE!

Two weeks ago 'Match of the Day' was most fortunate to be at Old Trafford for the match between **Manchester United** and **Nottingham Forest**. In what was surely the best game so far this season, Brian Clough's Forest set about demolishing United in front of the Stretford End and the normally fast moving 'Red Devils' were made to look almost pedestrian. Forest were inspired by a 23rd minute goal when Brian Greenhoff was unfortunate to be in the way of a rebound from Tony Woodcock's snap-shot that hit the post. From that moment on it was nearly all one way traffic and United's defence was completely cut to ribbons by Forest's slick first-time passing. It was a sheer delight to watch. Forest increased their lead with a superb move ending with Tony Woodcock blasting the ball home from close range after 29 minutes. John Robertson ran through to make it 3-0, and Woodcock scored Forest's fourth with just one minute left.

'THE ROBINS'

This afternoon we bid welcome to **Swindon Town** in what will surely be an exciting match as most Gills/Swindon games seem to be. Swindon started the season in fine style, winning five and drawing one of their first six games, a run which saw them go as high as second in the division. **Highlight of that run was undoubtedly a 5-1 home victory against Second Division Cardiff City in the second round of the League Cup.** After that, Swindon won only one of their next six games, culminating in a 2-5 defeat at Cambridge. However, the unpredictable 'Robins' bounced right back and in the next game, at home to third-placed **Shrewsbury**, they rattled up a 5-0 win with goals from Kamara, Aizlewood, Moss, Trollope and Guthrie. However, it was to be another five games before their next win. But it was well worth waiting for—a 4-0 home victory over **Exeter City** (Anderson 2, Moss and McHale). Since then, Danny Williams' side have only lost two out of 12 games. Top goalscorers for Swindon, at the time of going to press, are Dave Moss 12, Ray McHale 11, Trevor Anderson 9 and Chris Guthrie 8.

RETURN FOR CHIVERS?

Former Spurs and England striker, Martin Chivers, is hankering for a return to English football after 18 months with Swiss club Servette. Although Fulham and Crystal Palace have both shown an interest, it seems that Norwich City are favourites for his signature.

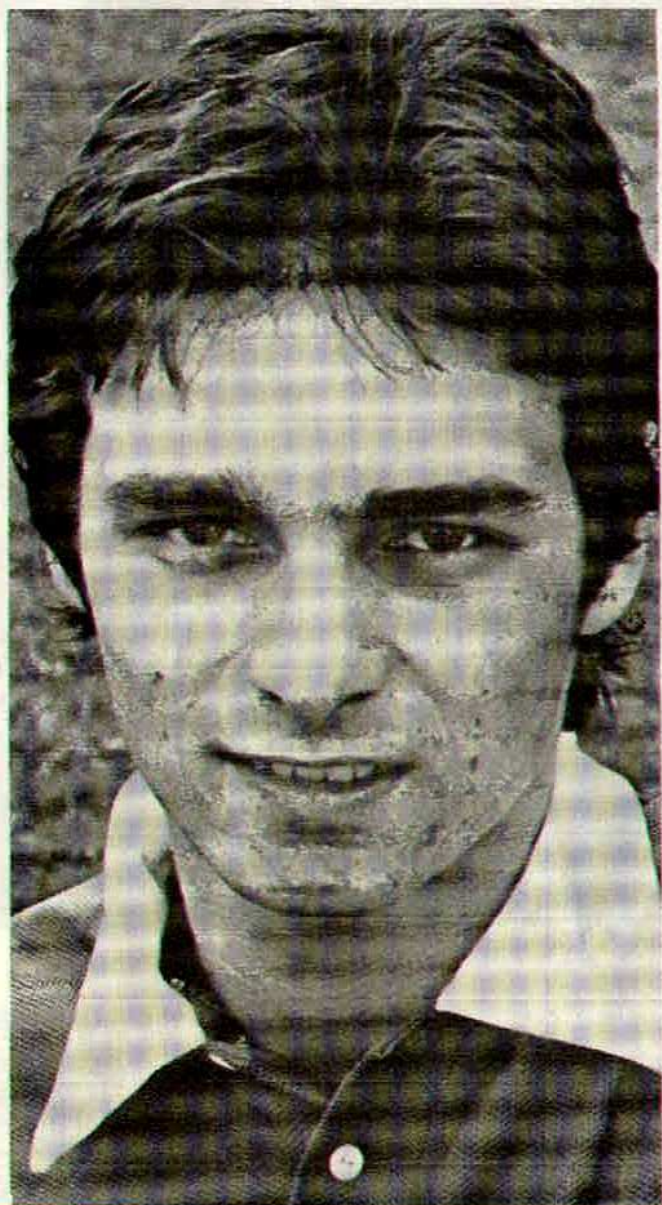

PRIESTFIELD PROFILE



Born: Rotherhithe 13 April 1959. **Signed for Gillingham (as a professional):** July 1976. **League Record:** Gillingham 1 app, 0 goals.

It's been a frustrating season so far for this free-scoring young striker. As the first team attackers have all been in good form, Terry simply hasn't had the opportunity to add to his one Football League appearance, at Brighton, last term.

Injury and illness has prevented him from playing in two of the reserves' limited fixtures but even so he has already scored six goals in nine appearances.

Last season—Terry's first as a professional—couldn't have started better. He registered seven scores in his first three games for the Youth team and had he maintained that rate would have finished with 84 goals to his name! He didn't quite manage that but did net a combined total of 29 for the youth and reserve sides compared to 22 the previous season.

Terry is a fine taker of chances and in many ways is reminiscent of Brian Yeo. He could well be the man the first team look to for goals in the future.

Jimmy Allen (Goalkeeper). Born in Inverness, he joined Swindon from Brora Rangers in October 1970 as an apprentice. Signed full professional forms in July 1971. Made his League debut two months later and last season made 43 League appearances.

Andy Ford (Defender). Upon leaving school he joined Bournemouth and switched to Southend two years later. Made 135 League appearances for Southend before moving to the County Ground last August.

John Trollope (Defender). The club's longest serving player having signed professional forms in August 1960. Holds the club appearance record with 697 League appearances up to the start of this season and is playing as well as ever.

Steve Aizlewood (Defender). Began his career with Newport County. Made 191 League appearances for his home town club, before his transferring to Swindon in March 1976. He won four Welsh U/23 caps whilst with Newport.

Colin Prohett (Defender). Born in Crewe, he made his professional debut with Sheffield Wednesday. Moved on to Norwich in 1973 and made 34 First Division appearances before his transfer to Swindon in September 1974. Made 45 League appearances last season when he performed in the role of sweeper.

Ray McHale (Midfield). Hails from Sheffield. He made 123 League appearances for Chesterfield before moving on to Halifax in October 1974. In almost two years there he did not miss a match, making 86 League

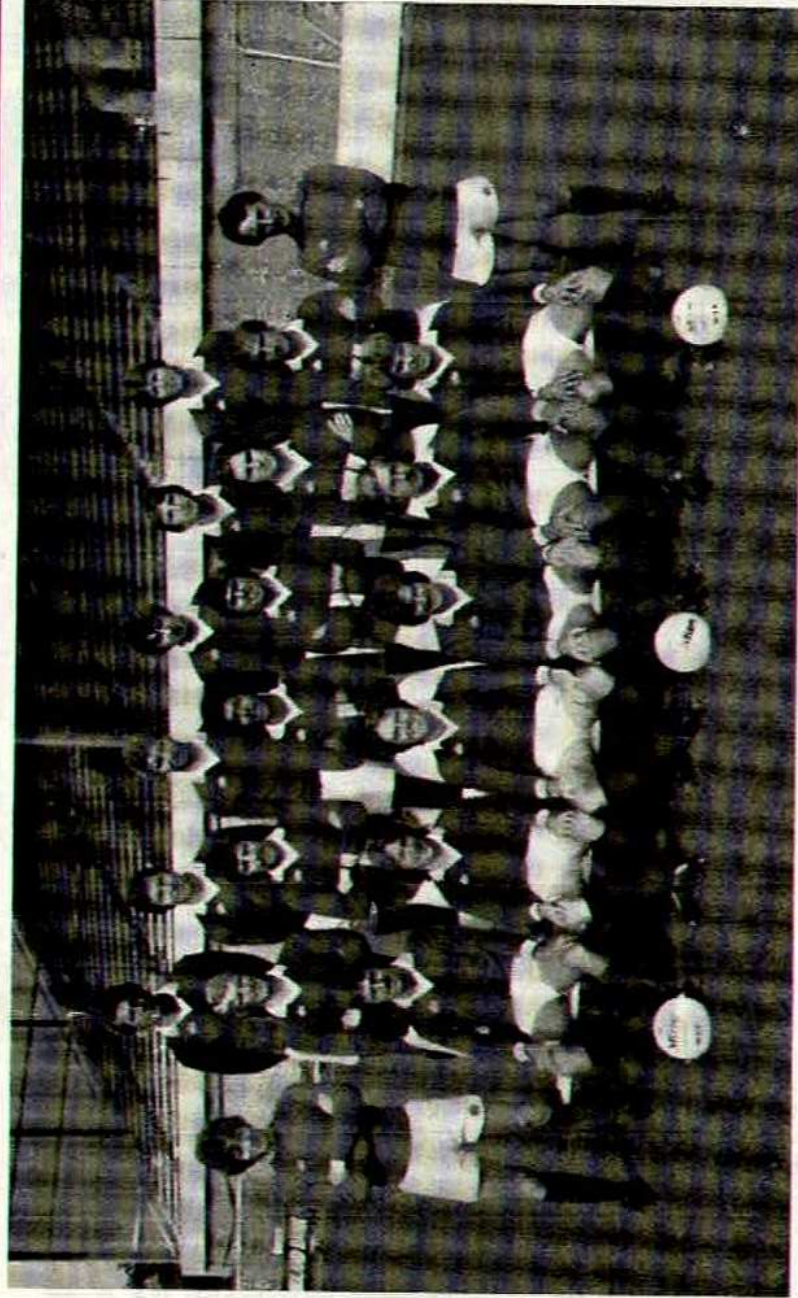

Kenny Stroud (Midfield). Although London born, he served his apprenticeship with Swindon before becoming a full professional in 1970. Has played as a central defender, but is more at home in midfield where he has made the majority of his 120 League appearances up to the start of this season.

David Cunningham (Midfield). A Scot from Kirkcaldy, his first club was Brechin City. Moved on to Southend in 1973 and made 56 League appearances for them before joining Swindon last summer. Also spent a short loan spell with Hartlepool.

Trevor Anderson (Forward). Born in Belfast, he began his professional career with Portadown. Moved on to Manchester United, but found first team opportunities limited and made only 13 League appearances for them. Arrived at the County Ground in November

1974. Full Northern Ireland International.

Dave Moss (Forward). Signed from non-League Witney, his local team. Made his League debut for Swindon in April 1972 and made 172 League appearances up to the start of this season. Last season's leading goalscorer, he is an orthodox winger.

Chris Kamara (Forward). Born in Middlesbrough and signed schoolboy forms for that club. Joined Portsmouth as an apprentice and signed a full professional contract in December 1975. Made 56 League appearances for Portsmouth before signing for Swindon last August for a £20,000 fee.

Chris Guthrie (Forward). Born in Newcastle, he made only five appearances for his home club before moving to Southend where he made 107 League appearances and was twice their leading goalscorer. Transferred to Sheffield United during the summer of 1975 but could not settle and was signed by Swindon last July.

Micky French (Forward). A native of Eastbourne. His first professional club was QPR. Moved on to Brentford in season 1974-75 and made 56 League appearances for them before arriving at the County Ground last February.
