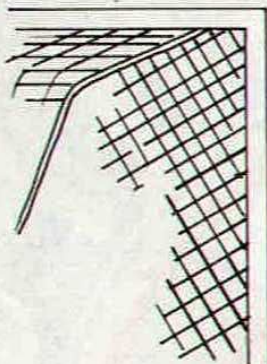

FRANK TALKING...

I hope you are all as excited about the prospects as I am; if you are and if our anticipation proves well founded, then I'm sure we are all in for an exciting and rewarding nine months.

Obviously the prospect is particularly exciting for me since this is my first full season as manager of a famous Football League club.

Nothing could suit the occasion for me more than to have MY team in opposition to the one other club who have a real meaning for me.

I have spent the best part of 20 years in soccer but Swindon Town and now Pompey are the two stopping off places in my career for which I have special regard.

It is a strange quirk of fate that throws the two clubs which for me are extra-special together in the first round of a competition which of course holds special memories for me.

It was Swindon's trip to Wembley and League Cup glory which provided the pinnacle of my playing career — now I hope of course that they fall at the first hurdle.

But at the same time I would like to welcome Swindon's directors, with particular mention of chairman Cecil Green who I came to know and respect so much during my years at the County Ground, their manager Bobby Smith, his players and the Swindon supporters who were so kind to me over the years.

Coming up against Bobby Smith is another case of old friends in opposition; Bob and I became great mates when we were both at Scunthorpe.

I like to say that while we were there I did all the work while Bob got all the glory — it wasn't quite true of course, but it's a good line on which to end these first notes.

Today I hope it is us at Pompey who get the glory by striding to a win which will see us in the second round after Tuesday's second leg.

Swindon Skipper RAY McHALE

ALAN MAYES [Forward]. Joined Swindon in February 1979 from Watford and scored hat trick in his first match at Rotherham. 21 League appearances for the 'Town'.

BRIAN WILLIAMS [Midfield]. Brian is from Manchester and played 148 games for Bury until present Swindon Manager Bobby Smith sold him to Q.P.R. during the 1977 close season. He made 22 First Division appearances for Q.P.R. before signing for Swindon in June, 1978.

JOHN TEMPLEMAN [Full Back]. A close season signing, John was once a Portsmouth hopeful but had to await a transfer to Brighton before getting his chance to play in the League in 1966/67. He moved on to Exeter in 1974 from whom Swindon purchased his registration.

JIMMY ALLAN [Goalkeeper]. Born in Inverness he was signed from Brora Rangers in October 1970 as an apprentice and on full forms nine months later. Although he made his debut in September 1971, it was not until 1976/1977 that he became established in the side. Had made 182 League appearances at the end of last season.

PHIL BATES [Forward]. Known as Chic he became a member of the Swindon squad in January, 1978. Coming from West Bromwich he spent seven years as a Southern League Player before signing for Shrewsbury in 1974. Made 160 League appearances for Shrewsbury and was top goal scorer for two seasons. Has made a further 45 appearances for Swindon Town.

ROY CARTER [Midfield]. Roy who comes from Torpoint, Cornwall played part time Western League Football with Falmouth before joining Hereford in the summer of 1975. He quickly established himself in the side there and played in the team that won promotion to the second division in 1975/86. Signed for Swindon in December 1977 having made 64 League appearances for Hereford and had made 64 more for Swindon by the seasons end.

PAUL GILCHRIST [Midfield/Forward]. Paul was a member of the Southampton Team that won the F.A. Cup in 1976, and he made 96 full appearances for that Club. He originally came from Charlton and Doncaster before joining Southampton, who in turn transferred him to Portsmouth. Paul after receiving a free transfer from Portsmouth joined the Town in August, 1978, primarily to strengthen and give experience to our Youth and Reserve Teams, but due to injuries in the first team, he has proved to be a useful acquisition to the senior squad for whom he has made 10 full League appearances.

CHRIS KAMARA [Midfield]. Chris comes from Middlesbrough but made his League debut for Portsmouth in September, 1975 as one of a number of young players given a first team chance by that Club due to financial problems. Those problems forced Portsmouth to sell Chris to Swindon in August 1977 after 56 League games and he has since played 59 more for Swindon. A few of these have been as deputy centre forward, but he is at his best attacking from Midfield.

IAN MILLER [Forward]. Ian comes from Perth but he first played League football for Bury making 9 full appearances and a number as substitute. He moved to Nottingham Forest but did not make the first team until a further move to Doncaster Rovers in August 1975. He became a regular first team player there before his transfer to Swindon who had been interested in signing him for a number of months in the 1978 close season. 44 League appearances for the 'Town'.

RAY McHALE [Midfield]. Ray comes from Sheffield

and made his League debut for Chesterfield in Season 1971/72. After 123 League games he signed for Halifax Town where he was top scorer in one season although a midfield player. He did not miss a single match before signing for Swindon in September 76 for whom he has played 130 League games. Usually plays as the link man in midfield although he likes to get forward.

CHRIS OGDEN [Goalkeeper]. Signed from Oldham Athletic in August, 1978 where he made over 100 appearances for the Lancashire Club and although only 5'10½" his very agile performances have earned him a regular place in the first team.

ANDY ROWLAND [Forward]. Andy was signed from Bury in September, 1978, where he had been the top scorer for the past two seasons. Prior to signing for Bury in 1974, Andy was on the playing staff of Derby County. Has played 28 League games for Swindon.

KEN STROUD [Midfield]. Ken is a Londoner but has been with the Club since he was an apprentice and is now one of the longest serving players at the Club. Although signed as a professional in 1970, and made his League debut in 1971/72, it was not until 1974/75, that he gained a regular place in the first team. Ken had made 198 League appearances to the end of last season, mostly in midfield but he enjoys playing as a central defender, when the need arises.

BILLY TUCKER [Centre Half]. Billy linked up with Bury in December 1976 after serving Hereford United during their remarkable run from the Southern League up to the Second Division of the Football League. Joined the 'Town' during the close season.

STEVE AIZLEWOOD

I shall feel a trifle strange at 3 p.m. this afternoon when the new season gets underway.

Not at finding myself in a Pompey shirt for the first time in a competitive match, although it is obviously different, but because the players in the other half of the field are those I know best in the game.

It seems strange that Swindon, the club where I had a number of very happy years should be drawn against Pompey in the opening match of the season; still I can assure everyone that it won't make any difference to the way I approach the match.

Before the kick off and after the final whistle, we'll all be mates — while the match is on they will be so many total strangers and I shall be getting stuck in to see that Pompey and not Swindon go into the hat for the second round.

This programme gives me a chance to introduce myself to the supporters of my new club.

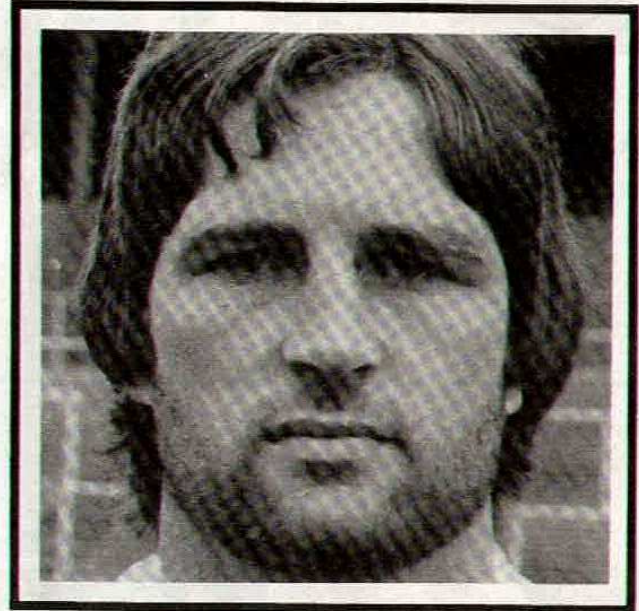
I was born in Newport, South Wales, and made my debut for them in Division IV when I was 16 and became the youngest player in their history to make 100 League appearances.

Then they sold me for £13,000 when Swindon were looking for someone to take over at centre-half from Frank Burrows.

My family has no great soccer tradition, although my grandfather did play a few games for Rotherham at one time, and it is a little odd perhaps that the Aizlewoods have now produced two League players in the same generation with my brother Mark following me into the Newport team before being sold to Luton.

But back to myself. Since I moved here a lot of people have asked my why I chose to leave Swindon who just missed out on promotion from Division III last season to drop down into Division IV?

The answer really is quite simple — Frank Burrows.



I thought I was a pretty useful player when I left Newport to go to Swindon; Frank soon showed me that I had a lot to learn and proceeded to teach me much of it.

He certainly made me a much better player and when he came in for me after I had refused another contract at Swindon because I felt it was time for a change, I jumped at the chance of joining him.

Frank knows how to get me to play; he knows I'm the sort of player who needs pushing to avoid complacency — and I know quite well he will do the pushing.

Apart from that there is not a great deal for me to tell you.

I have no great interests outside the game, although I'm keen on most sports without playing too many of them.

Otherwise I'm really a home-loving bloke and enjoy being with my wife Val and four-year-old son Simon.

I hate being away from home and that was what made pre-season training extra-tough — it meant leaving them for two weeks.

Right now Val, Simon and I are living in a rented house in Emsworth but we are just waiting to move into our own house in Cowplain near Colin Garwood — and that can't come soon enough for me.
