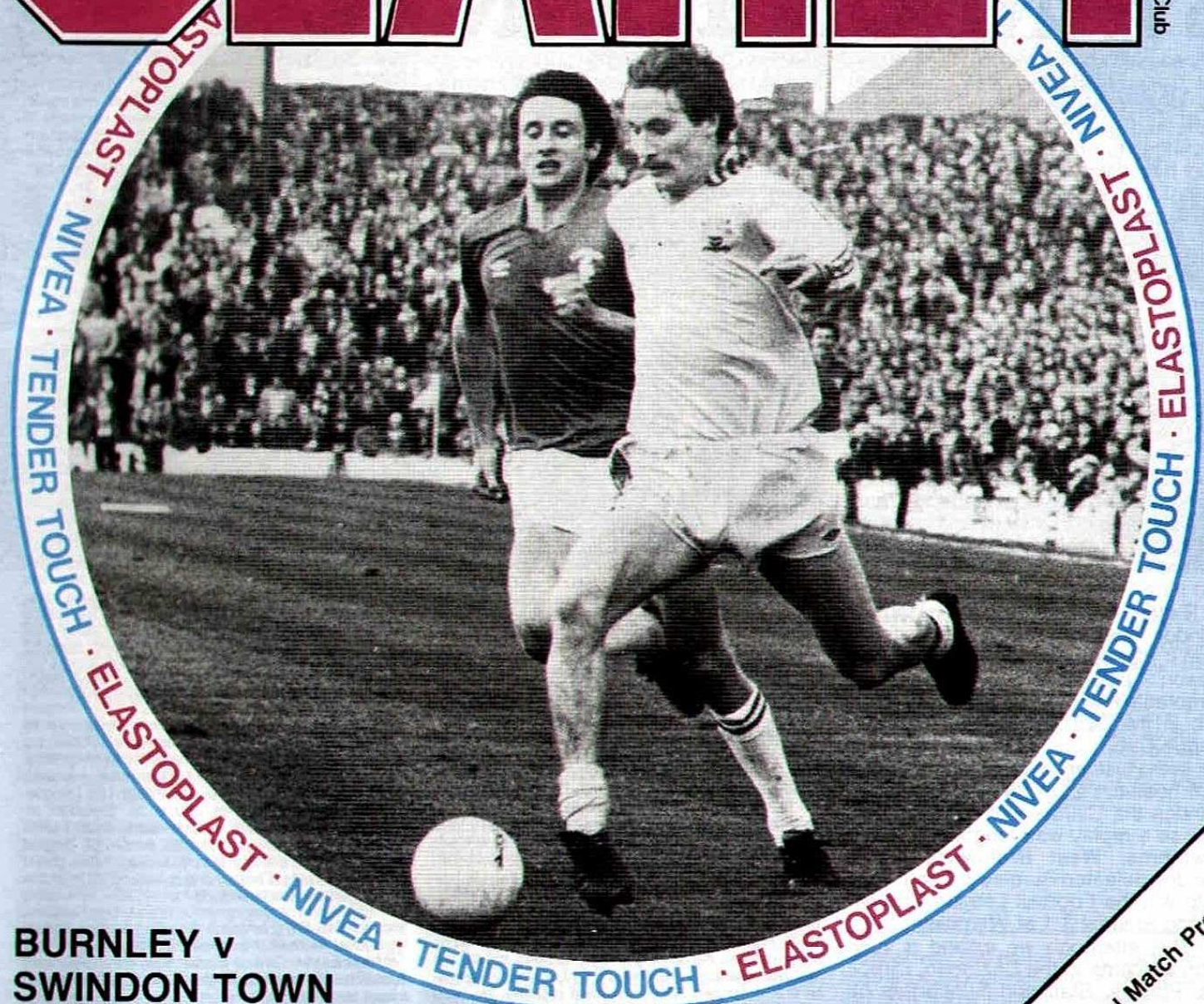

WELCOME TO SWINDON TOWN FC

This season sees Swindon Town Football Club celebrating their centenary year. The Wiltshire club was formed in 1881, and became a limited company when they turned professional in 1894. They became one of the original members of the Third Division in 1920.

It goes without saying that everyone connected with Swindon Town would dearly have loved to win some major honour in this their one hundred years as a Football League Club, but it was not to be. Instead Swindon find themselves down in the relegation zone and fighting for survival in Division Three. But that is football! Just at a time when you would like to achieve something, your plans fall apart and your dreams are shattered. However, Swindon Town Football Club are noted for having a strong character and if they can just have the run of the ball and collect a few valuable points then we are sure to see them still in Division Three again next term.

From past experience we know that Swindon Town can rise to the occasion when it matters, as they proved this in Season 1968 when Burnley had a memorable encounter with the Wiltshire Club in the Semi-final of the Football League Cup.

In the first leg at Turf Moor, Burnley were beaten 1-2. In the second leg at Swindon the Clarets won 2-1 in extra-time, so a replay was fought out at the Hawthorns, West Bromwich, when Swindon defeated Burnley 3-2 and went on to win the Football League Cup by beating Arsenal 3-1 at Wembley.

This afternoon we extend a very warm welcome to the Chairman, Directors, Players, Staff and Supporters of

Swindon Town Football Club, and look forward to seeing a very enjoyable game of football.

Jimmy ALLAN (Goalkeeper). Born in Inverness, Jimmy will have been at Swindon for ten years this season, having been signed from Scottish non-league football. He made his debut against Queens Park Rangers in September 1971, and has been first choice Keeper for most of the last four seasons. He had made 227 league appearances at the end of last season.

Roy CARTER (Midfield). Roy comes from Torpoint, Cornwall, and played part time Western League football for Falmouth before joining Hereford in the summer of 1975. He played in 64 league games there including the side which won the Third Division Championship in 1976. He signed for Swindon in December 1977, making his debut against Carlisle that month, and had made 104 league appearances to the end of last season. His usual role is as an attacking midfielder player, but he is a true utility player having played in the forward line and, on a number of occasions in central defence.

Glenn COCKERILL (Midfield). Glenn is from Grimsby and made his league debut with Lincoln City in season 1976/77. He played well over 50 league games for Lincoln and Swindon began watching him in March 1979. He eventually signed for a then club record of £110,000 in December 1979, but injury and other factors prevented his league debut until March 1980. He is a hard working and determined midfielder and made eight appearances last season.

Chris KAMARA (Midfield). Chris is from Middlesbrough but served his apprenticeship at Portsmouth where he was one of a number of teenagers given league debuts in season 1975/76. He went on to make 56 league appearances for Portsmouth and signed for Swindon just before the start of the 1977/78 season. His debut for Swindon was against Sheffield Wednesday in August 1977 and he had made 89 league appearances by the end of last season. An attacking midfielder player, he began last season being put up for transfer and almost left but finished being voted the Supporters' Player of the Year.

Russell LEWIS (Defender). Born in Blaengwynfi, he joined Swindon from Welsh League football in 1976 and made his league debut at York City in April 1977. His first team chances were limited until last season when he broke through, playing mostly at full back, although until then he had normally been a central defender. Noted for hard tackling, he had

made 52 league appearances to the end of last season.

Ian MILLER (Forward). Ian is from Perth and made his league debut with Bury for whom he made 9 league appearances before moving to Nottingham Forest. He did not make the first team there, but a move to Doncaster Rovers in August 1975 gave him regular first team football. He stayed for three seasons making 124 league appearances and signed for Swindon during the 1978 close season. He made his debut against Bury in August 1978 and had made 81 League appearances to the end of last season. An orthodox winger who uses pace to beat opponents.

David PEACH (Defender). David comes from Bedford and started his career with Gillingham for whom he made 186 league appearances. He moved to Southampton during the 1973/74 season and stayed there until March, 1980, when he signed for Swindon. During this time with the Saints, he made 220 league appearances, appeared in two Cup finals (winning an FA Cup winners' medal in 1976) and captained the side. His debut for Swindon was at Millwall in March, 1980, but an injury restricted him to 10 games before the end of last season. A naturally left-sided player who can play at full-back or in midfield, at £150,000 he represents the Club's most expensive signing.

Andy ROLLINGS (Defender). Andy comes from North Weston and started his career with Norwich City for whom he made four League appearances. A move to Brighton in 1974 gave him first team football regularly, and he played in the sides that won promotion from both the Third and Second Divisions. He played around 170 league games for Brighton before signing for Swindon in May, 1980. An experienced and dependable centre half.

Andy ROWLAND (Forward). Born in Derby he was apprenticed with his home town team but did not play league football until a transfer took him to Bury before the start of the 1974/75 season. He was three times leading scorer and made 169 League appearances before his move to Swindon in September 1978. His debut came that month against Blackpool and he had made 72 league appearances to the end of last season. Although he plays as the target man, he also scored 28 goals in all competitions last season.

Steve ABBLEY (Forward). A young winger signed from local football, he made his debut in the First Team at Exeter City on Easter Saturday 1980, and subsequently made a further two league appearances last season.



Ken STROUD (Defender). Although a Londoner, Ken grew up in Swindon and joined the Club from school, signing professional forms in 1970 and making his League debut the following year against Queens Park Rangers. He had made 243 league appearances to the end of last season, and is the longest serving player at the Club. Although much of his career has been spent as a ball winning midfielder, he prefers to play as a central defender and has spent the last two seasons playing in defensive positions.

Billy TUCKER (Defender). From Kidderminster he played part time Southern League football for Hereford United but turned full time when that club was elected to the League in 1972. He played in the sides that won promotion from the Fourth Division and the Third Division Championship and made 135 League appearances for the club. In December, 1976, he moved to Bury and added a further 96 League games over the next 2½ seasons. He moved to Swindon during the summer of 1979 and after making his debut against Sheffield United in

August, 1979, last season saw him make 35 League appearances, all at centre half.

Roy WALSH (Midfield). Born in Belfast, Roy played for Glentoran Football Club on a part-time basis since 1972, where he captained the team. He also played twelve times in European games, including against Juventus. In the summer of the 1979/80 season, Roy played for the New Jersey Americans in the USA, and was also in the side that beat New Zealand in the Irish League International 'B' Team. Roy signed for Swindon Town in March 1980.

Brian WILLIAMS (Midfield). A Mancunian, Brian is another player who was formerly with Bury. He made his League debut during season 1971/72, and played 148 league games before a transfer to Queens Park Rangers in July 1977. He spent one season in London making only 9 full League appearances, and signed for Swindon in June 1978. He had made 58 League appearances for Swindon at the end of last season. A left sided midfielder player he can also play on the left wing or as a central forward.

Today's home game against Swindon is our first at Turf Moor for almost a month.

We've had a very disappointing time with postponements during the last few weeks. When you train all week and everything gets motivated for games such as Rotherham and Huddersfield, it's a big disappointment when they are called off at the last minute.

We have, during the space of four days, suffered two setbacks, notably our results against Barnsley and Rotherham. These two teams are probably the strongest in the Third Division, Barnsley being the best side to visit Turf Moor this season. Let me stress that results are the most important thing in football and results win Leagues and F.A. Cup Finals, but our performances against both Barnsley and Rotherham have been outstanding.

The attitude, work rate and performance in both games could basically not be faulted. After 86 minutes of battle against Barnsley the referee, in my opinion, made a very bad decision. He said Martin Dobson handled the ball when in fact it was Derek Parker. This is a sickener after such a good, hard game and it tends just to deflate everybody.

Anyhow, myself, my coaches and the players are the people not to



lie down and cry over such bad luck. We've got to keep working, fighting and playing, trying to get results and developing our players. And I know that we have definitely the makings of a **good** side which will prove a handful for many teams next season.

Omniturf

It looks at this stage that we may struggle to lay the Omniturf pitch which you have probably seen on TV or read about in your newspaper.

I went to Wimbledon to have a look at a tennis court laid down by Omnisport. I was very impressed

with the surface and was confident that it was suitable for good football to be played on it.

It's a great commercial project which allows a stadium to be open 52 weeks in a year and if possible right through the summer months when clubs could get money through the turnstiles during a period when there is no income at all.

As I said, it's a great commercial project, but the most important factor is whether it is a good surface for football. In my opinion it is a very good surface and would be ideal for good football, and players would be playing on the same type of pitch and able to use more and more skills during training and on match days.

One thing that is standing in our way at this present moment is money. We are trying every way possible, but in the end it may just end up a pleasant dream.

Finally, I would like to thank all our supporters who followed us to Barnsley and Rotherham. You gave the team tremendous encouragement. I appreciate it, the team appreciates it and we hope that you will keep travelling with us when possible and we will try to get good results for all of you in the very near future.

(Goalkeeper)

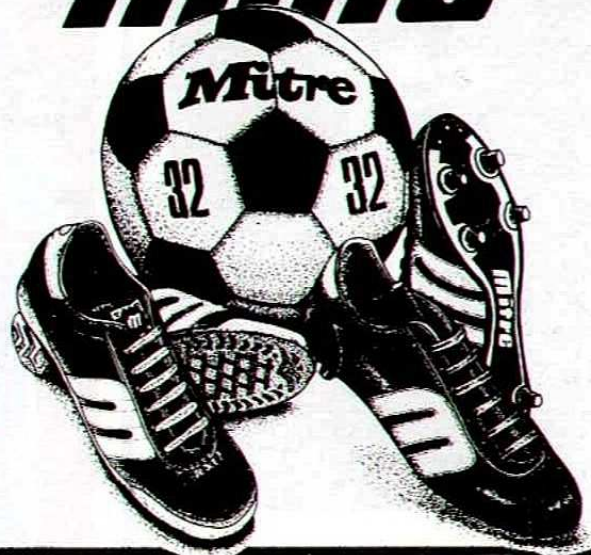

Born at Oswaldtwistle, Lancashire. Burnley signed this reliable defender from Great Harwood on 13th October, 1937. Made his first team debut for Burnley on 1st October, 1938, against Luton Town at Turf Moor.

Missed only one game in the 1946/47 season when Burnley won promotion to the First Division and also reached the F.A. Cup Final. Played at left half in the Cup Final against Charlton Athletic when Burnley lost 1-0 to a Chris Duffy goal in extra time.

Came from a footballing family, with his brother playing for Manchester City. When George retired from the playing side of the game he was appointed to the training staff at Turf Moor.

Played his last game for Burnley on 29th September, 1951, against Stoke City at the Victoria Ground.

Did you know?

Answers to referee's quiz from page 21

1. No. Law 3 states 'a match shall be played between two teams, each consisting of eleven players, one of whom shall be the goalkeeper'.
2. Yes, by-one of the attacking side standing outside the penalty area in a position nearer to the defenders' goal-line than the ball when on the spot, and there are not two defenders between him and the goal-line. Should the ball, after being kicked from the penalty spot, be diverted to him or even go direct to him from the penalty kick, **without having been touched by a defender**, he must be offside.
3. 130 yards less 12 yards x 2 = 106 yards.
4. No. This is the referee's prerogative.
5. Law 2 states 'the outer casing shall be made of leather or other approved materials. No material shall be used in its construction which might prove dangerous to the players'.
6. Send off the offender and re-commence with an indirect free kick.
