Swindon Town

Swindon Town are currently on the crest of a revival that has seen them start to climb away from the bottom of the table, a position they had almost exclusively occupied until November, when a change of manager brought about a much needed change in fortune.

No pundit at the start of the season could have foreseen the plight that the Wiltshire club were soon to be in. After all, here was a team that had caught the imagination of the public last season with a glorious run of success in both Cup competitions, only for those extra matches to edge them out of the promotion race they had previously figured in quite prominently.

Furthermore, the squad had been strengthened in the close season with the signing of Brendan Guest from Lincoln, Colin Barrett from Notts. Forest, Paddy Greenwood from Sunderland and Andy Rollings from Brighton. So, all in all, it was not surprising to see Swindon high up on the bookmakers' lists of favourites to take the 3rd Division title.

But then, disastrously, the season began with five League defeats and only four wins being registered in the first 21 League fixtures. Strong measures had to be taken and on October 1st manager Bobby Smith was dismissed, with former Swindon boss Danny Williams stepping down from his post as Club Executive to look after the team.

On October 18th veteran defender John Trollope, a local lad who had joined Swindon as a 17-year-old way back in 1960, made his 765th League appearance, thus creating an all-time record by beating Jimmy Dickenson's previous best of 764.

Trollope went on to play his 770th game for his one and only club and then on November 12th he was invited to take over the Town managership. his one and only club, and then on November 12th Cancelling his playing contract at the same time, "to remove the temptation of turning out again," he has since successfully injected youth into the side in the shape of Hughes, Henry and Rideout and has sold ace striker Alan Mayes to Chelsea for £200,000.

So far, little has gone wrong and Swindon are now on the up, though still too near the danger zone for comfort. J.P.

Focus on . . .

JIMMY ALLAN (Goalkeeper): Joined Swindon ten years ago from Scottish non-League football. Made his debut in September 1971, and has been first choice keeper for most of the last four seasons. Had made 227 League appearances at the end of last season.

COLIN BARRETT (Defender): Made 50 League appearances for Manchester City before signing for Nottingham Forest in March 1976. Appeared in Forest's 1977/78 League Championship side and won a League cup winners' medal in 1979. Joined Swindon in June 1980.

ROY CARTER (Midfield): Played part-time Western League football for Falmouth before joining Hereford in 1975. Was in Hereford's Third Division Championship side in 1976. Signed for Swindon in December 1977.

GLENN COCKERILL (Midfield): Signed from Lincoln for a then club record of £110,000 in December 1979.

ROY GREENWOOD (Forward): Formerly of Hull, Sunderland and Derby County, he joined Swindon last year.

CHRIS KAMARA (Midfield): Served his apprenticeship at Portsmouth where he made 56 League appearances before signing for Swindon just before the start of the 1977/78 season. Supporters' Player of the Year last season.

RUSSELL LEWIS (Defender): Joined Swindon from Welsh League football in 1976 and made his League debut at York City in April 1977. Had made 52 League appearances to the end of last season.

TOM McALISTER (Goalkeeper): Formerly of Sheffield United and Rotherham United he moved to Swindon during the summer of 1980 from Blackpool.

IAN MILLER (Forward): Formerly of Bury and Nottingham Forest, he signed for Swindon in 1978 from Doncaster Rovers.

DAVID PEACH (Defender): Started his career with Gillingham and moved to Southampton during the 1973/74 season. In March 1980 he signed for Swindon. During his time with the Saints, he made 220 League appearances, appeared in two cup finals (winning an F.A. Cup winners' medal in 1976) and captained the side. At £150,000 he represents the Club's most expensive signing.

ANDY ROLLINGS (Defender): Began his career with Norwich City and in 1974 moved to Brighton where he played in the sides that won promotion from both the Third and Second Divisions. Joined Swindon in May 1980.

ANDY ROWLAND (Forward): An apprentice with his home town team Derby. He moved to Bury before the start of the 1974/75 season. He was three times leading scorer and made 169 League appearances before his move to Swindon in September 1978.

KEN STROUD (Defender): Joined Swindon from school, signing professional forms in 1970 and is the longest serving player at the club.

JOHN TEMPLEMAN (Defender): Formerly of Portsmouth, Brighton and Exeter. He joined Swindon during the 1979 close season.

Founded as an amateur club in 1881 by the Rev. W. Pitt, Swindon rapidly flourished, and within a few years the final of the Wiltshire Cup was between the club's first and second teams!

By 1894 professionalism had come to Swindon and they became original members of the Southern League Division One. In 1896 the club moved its headquarters from The Croft to its present County Ground.

Swindon first hit the headlines in 1909 when their inside-right, Harold Fleming won an England cap v Scotland. Fleming went on to make 11 England appearances, all out of the Southern League, scoring 9 goals.

Fleming was the leading inspiration in Town's cup runs of 1910, 1911 and 1912 when they reached the F.A. Cup semi-finals twice and the quarter-final once. Not bad for non-Leaguers!

Their first League game in Division Three in 1920 was against Luton Town, and once again, that man Fleming grabbed the glory, scoring four goals in an amazing 9-1 win. In their first nine seasons Swindon always finished in the Division Three (S) top ten, but in the next eight campaigns they only finished in the top half once.

After the second world war Swindon never looked like getting out of the Third Division, and in 1956 and 1957 they had to apply for re-election. In 1963 however, they did win promotion to Division Two, but remained there for just two seasons.

Their finest season came in 1968-69, when they scored a remarkable double. After beating Torquay, Bradford City, Blackburn, Coventry and Derby, the Wiltshire side, whose main aim was to win promotion to Division Two, played First Division Burnley in the League Cup semi-final.

They beat Burnley at Turf Moor in the first leg but lost by the same score, 2-1, at home, so the tie went to a third match at The Hawthorns, home of W.B.A. Swindon won 3-2 and qualified to play at Wembley against the mighty Arsenal.

A 98,000 crowd saw the Wiltshire men humble their London opponents by winning 3-1 in extra time, with goals from Roger Smart and two from Don Rogers. The team of that day of Downsborough, Thomas, Trollope, Butler, Burrows, Harland, Heath, Smart, Smith, Nobe and Rogers will never be forgotten in Swindon.

The same team went on to win the club's main objective of promotion to Division Two as runners-up to Watford.

Later that year Swindon won the Anglo-Italian League Cup Winners Cup and in 1970 they won the Anglo-Italian Trophy in a match that was marred by rioting Italians in Naples.


