


# Talk of the Town by the Chairman

Today we play our first league home game on a Saturday this year and in fact our last Saturday game we played against Bristol City on the 5 December 1981. This must make an unenviable record which has been due to cancelled fixtures through our inclement weather and argues strongly for a change to the football season.

Today we welcome Burnley Football Club to the County Ground, a club that has held a proud position in the First Division for many years, but which has suffered its setbacks over the last few seasons. Burnley have never commanded the big gates of some of our other First Division clubs, but kept to the forefront by developing young players through its Youth Policy but, like all clubs, its support has dwindled through unemployment in their area and, of course, lack of interest amongst the many diversities from which we all suffer.

We failed to score against Southend United on Tuesday last, as indeed we did against Preston away last week, but our defence was magnificent on both occasions and I am sure that we shall find our scoring habits soon and I hope that it will be today, although Burnley have come to us with a very good record of results recently.

On Thursday next our Mayor and Lady Mayoress are officially opening our new Sponsors' Suite which is to be named after the late Harry Cousins, one of Swindon's most respected and dedicated players who joined us as a young player in 1932 and remained on our staff, when his playing days were over, as a coach, trainer and youth manager, and this room will be a living memory of a great sportsman who dedicated his life to our club.

Following the last few weeks when both Oxford United and Bristol City hit the news with their financial troubles, we were all relieved to know that both clubs have, at least, for the time being weathered the storm, but Bristol City have had to withdraw from the Football Combination. This must be a great blow to them because this league is considered one of the strongest reserve leagues in the country and so essential to have a stepping stone to the Football League.

At our regional meetings we have already discussed the formation of a regional reserve league which would cater for such clubs as Newport, Swansea, Exeter, Bournemouth etc. who are not members of the Football Combination.

Much has been said and written concerning clubs going part-time in the near future to try and make football economically sound, but do the supporters want to see part-time standards. The present following of teams of this standard is very low even with the successful non-league clubs. A suggestion which has come to the forefront is the introduction of indoor football, catering for organised five-a-side teams of league standards which are so popular at the moment, it seems, in America. To attract enough people to make it a worthwhile exercise would be difficult in most towns because of the lack of facilities, but at the moment clubs, I am sure, will welcome any new venture.

The Third and Fourth Division clubs were looking forward to starting out on a new knockout competition, but due to the cancellations of fixtures during the bad weather, this idea has been put back for a year.

Next Saturday we are away to our near neighbours Reading, and perhaps if the weather is nice we shall have a good following of our supporters. The players, I know, benefit from your support.

We hope that you enjoy today's game and thank you for your support.

# BURN



TREVOR STEVEN. Trevor hails from Berwick-Upon-Tweed. He has represented Berwick & District Schoolboys; Northumberland County U14's and U19's and has gained seven International Caps with England Schoolboys in 1978/79. Trevor became an apprentice with Burnley in June 1980 and later signed as a professional on the 21st September 1981. After a short spell in the clubs junior teams, he has quickly established himself in the first team. He is a skilful player and his talents in midfield prove that a great future is predicted for him.

MARTIN DOBSON. Martin is in his second spell at Turf Moor after rejoining the Club from Everton. Martin started his career at Bolton but after being given a free transfer was snapped up by the Clarets and developed into one of their most outstanding players of the past 15 years. The cultured midfield player captained Burnley to the Second Division Championship in 1972-73 and was capped by England before being transferred to Everton in August, 1974. Returned to Turf Moor five years later and now one of the key players in the Burnley team. Last season, Martin was switched from midfield to the back four of the defence where he was an ever-present. Martin made a total of 56 First Team League and Sup appearances last season and scored 9 goals.

ALAN STEVENSON. Alan comes from Staveley and proved himself a talented goalkeeper with Chesterfield before a big-money transfer to Burnley in January, 1972. An England Under-23 International, he has had many outstanding matches for the Clarets and he can make brilliant reflex saves. He is a top-class goalkeeper in every respect. He made 44 League appearances last season and 10 Cup appearances. Alan has played over 300 First Team matches for Burnley.

COLIN ANDERSON. Colin comes from Newcastle, and was spotted by Burnley's North East scouts while playing for Newcastle Boys'. Colin became an apprentice for Burnley in June, 1979, and then signed professional forms for the club in April last year. Colin is another young player who has worked hard and has come through from our junior teams. Last season he was a regular member of our Reserve side, although he has made one First Team appearance against Chesterfield and was substitute in 3 matches last term.

BILLY WRIGHT.Billy hails from Corbridge and is another player from the North East of England to join our club. Billy was a non-contract player with the club before signing as a professional in January this year. He is a tall centre-forward and likes to get amongst the goals.

DAVID REYNOLDS. David comes from Belfast where he was spotted by Burnley's Northern Ireland scout. David is ideally built for a goalkeeper being around 6ft 1ins and weighs about 13st 8lbs. He is a former Northern Ireland Schoolboy International and has had trials with the Irish Youth Team. David is learning his trade well and he is improving with every match.

ANDREW WHARTON. Andy comes from Bacup a matter of only six miles from Turf Moor. He represented Rossendale Schoolboys and played for the County Schoolboys. He is another young player who has made rapid progress through the club's junior ranks and he has developed into a very good strong tackling full-back. Last season, Andy made 6 First Team appearances and was substitute in 5 matches. Another young player who should do well.

BRIAN LAWS. Brian comes from Wallsend where he was spotted whilst playing for Northumberland Schoolboys. Brian made his way into the First Team via the junior teams, and has made the right full-back position his own. Brian has a very good future in the game. He played 42 League matches and 6 Cup matches for Burnley last season.

STUART ROBERTSON. Stuart was born in Glasgow. He was spotted while playing in junior football, and on completing his schooling he left his native Scotland to join Burnley as an apprentice in June, 1976. He signed professional for the club in July, 1977. Stuart is a hard working midfield player and he uses the ball very effectively. He made 17 First Team appearances last season.

BILLY O'ROURKE. Billy was spotted whilst playing for a junior team in Nottingham, his birthplace. He is a well-built goalkeeper. He signed as an apprentice in May 1976 and later became a professional for Burnley in January, 1978. He is another young player to come through from the junior teams. He has made only two First Team League appearances but he has the right temperament for the job.

VINCE OVERSON. Vince is a tall powerfully built centre-back. He signed professional terms for Burnley in November, 1979 and made his debut for the First Team against Orient at Turf Moor on the 3rd November that year. Vince has all the necessary qualities to make a first-class career in the game. He made 43 First Team League and Cup appearances last season. He comes from Corby.



DAVID HOLT. David, another full back, comes from Padiham near Burnley and joined the Clarets from Oldham Athletic in July 1980. His first Football League Club was Bury and he made 179 appearances for them, captaining the team which won promotion from the Fourth Division. He was transferred to Oldham 7 years ago for a fee of £40,000. He made 127 League appearances for Oldham including 32 in the 1979/80 season. He was Burnley's fourth signing last Summer, following the arrival of two of his former Oldham Team Mates, Ian Wood and Steve Taylor and Tommy Cassidy from Newcastle United. Last season David made 35 League appearances and 9 Cup appearances for the Clarets.

STEVE TAYLOR. Steve is a prolific goal scorer, he was signed by Burnley in July 1980, from Mansfield Town. He comes from Royton, Lancashire, and his first Club was Bolton Wanderers. Steve scored 16 goals for them in 34 Football League appearances, and also had a good scoring ratio with his second club, Oldham Athletic. For them, he scored 25 League goals in 45 appearances. He was transferred from Oldham to Luton Town and he moved to Mansfield in July 1979. He was one of three former Oldham Athletic players to join Burnley in Mid-1980. Last season he made 37 League and 9 Cup appearances for the Clarets and finished up leading goalscorer with a personal tally of 17 goals.

TOMMY CASSIDY. Tommy signed for Burnley from Newcastle United in July 1980. Belfast born, his first Club was Glentoran and he moved from there to Newcastle in 1970. He made over 300 appearances for Newcastle and at the time of his move to Turf Moor his total number of appearances for Northern Ireland in full International Matches was 25. Along with centre-forward Billy Hamilton, Tommy was a member of the Northern Ireland team which won the British Championship in 1980. He played for Newcastle in the 1974 F.A. Cup Semi-Final against Burnley at Hillsborough and in the Final that year against Liverpool. He also played for Newcastle in the 1976 Football League Cup Final. He made 28 League and 7 Cup appearances for Burnley last season.

BILLY HAMILTON. Striker. Billy signed for Burnley on the 28th November, 1979, from Queens Park Rangers. Billy stands 6ft 2½ins and weighs in at around 12st 11lbs. He is a bustling type of centre-forward, particularly good in the air and he has a very deceptive turn of speed for a big man, and he also has very good ball control. Billy is a Northern Ireland International and was a member of the successful Irish team that won the British Championship last year. Billy made 46 League appearances and played in all 10 cup-ties for Burnley last season and scored 9 goals.

PAUL DIXON. Paul comes from Londonderry, Northern Ireland. He signed as an apprentice in August, 1976. He gradually made his way through from the junior ranks. He is a steady positional player and keeps cool under pressure. Paul made his debut for Burnley on the 10th November, 1979 against Leicester City (away). He plays at centre-back and is a very promising player. He made only one First Team appearance last season as substitute following a long period out of the game through injury, but after recovery he made 31 appearances in the Rèserve Team.

ERIC POTTS. Liverpool-born Eric joined Burnley from neighbours Preston North End on September 17th, 1980, and made his debut three days later in the 0-0 draw at Chester. He began his football career with Sheffield Wednesday and made 160 League appearances for the Yorkshire club, scoring 21 goals. Then he signed for Brighton, but after 33 League appearances he returned North and signed for Preston. He made a total of 57 appearances for Preston North End and then moved to Burnley and played very impressibly both on his away debut and in his first home appearance when Millwall were beaten 5-0 at Turf Moor. Eric made 33 First Team League appearances and 3 F.A. Cup appearances last season and scored 5 goals.

MICHAEL PHELAN. Michael was born in Nelson, only four miles away from Turf Moor. He represented his Town team and County team at Schoolboy level. He joined the club as an apprentice in July, 1979, and later signed as a professional for Burnley on the 24th July, 1980. Michael has made excellent progress through our junior ranks and has now established a place for himself in our First Team squad. He is a current England Youth International. He made his First Team Debut last season against Exeter City. Michael has a tremendous career in front of him at both club and international level.

DEREK SCOTT. Derek comes from Gateshead and is a former England Schools International. He is a very strong player and always gives his best. He is quick and likes to get amongst the goals. He has made most of his League appearances at right-back but can also play in a midfield position. Derek signed for Burnley on the 9th February, 1975 and made hs first team debut when the Clarets were in the First Division. He now has quite a good deal of experience behind him. He made 38 appearances last season and scored a total of 11 goals.

KEVIN YOUNG. Kevin hails from Sunderland where he was spotted whilst playing for Sunderland Schoolboys. He signed Apprentice for Burnley in June, 1977 and signed Professional for the Club in May, 1979. Kevin made his debut for the Clarets against Wrexham at Turf Moor on the 16th April, 1979. Basically a left-sided midfield player he has played in the left full-back position. His distribution and skill on the ball are one of his main features and Kevin must surely have a great career in front of him. He made 32 League and Cup appearances in the First Team last season and was called upon as substitute in 13 matches.







# Colin Benson spotlights TREVOR STEVEN

A lot of things have happened to Burnley football Club in the past ten years and most of them have been frustrating experiences. In the 1960's this small footballing outpost which snuggles beneath the Pennines, blazed a trail of glory across the soccer fields of Europe. They matched and beat the big city glamour clubs, they overcame the class system and pioneered the course for the underdog.

With only a small catchment area it was not easy. Small cash returns through the turnstiles meant that the Lancashire club had to base their economy on raising their own football stars. They ploughed their resources into creating training facilities second to non and quickly emerged as soccers first university.

The Turf Moor academy produced a whole host of star names such as former England midfield star Martin Dobson - who is now back in the ranks of the claret and blues following his sojourn with Everton. Dave Thomas and Steve Kindon and Welsh Internationals Bryan Flynn and Leighton James.

All graduated through the Burnley house of learning but were then allowed to leave and blossom forth with other clubs. It is all a question of balancing the books. Burnley have simply had to sell to survive, what money can not be generated from the terraces has to be balanced through the transfer market. . . . it is simple economic logic.

The question on Turf Moor fans lips at the moment is whether the same fate will befall the clubs latest golden find - 18 year old Trevor Steven.

Trevor is a midfield player of considerable class already, adding youthful exuberance to the experience and poise of Martin Dobson and Northern Ireland international Tommy Cassidy.

The son of a Berwick-upon-Tweed businessman, he was born only three miles south of the Scottish border and insists "I'm definitely English" A keen sportsman at school he soon excelled at football and in 1978 was selected for the England schoolboy team, for which he played in seven internationals.

Young Trevor had already caught the eye of the professional world following a schools match in Newcastle and received overtures from Newcastle United, Sunderland, Celtic and Rangers before deciding to join Burnley on schoolboy forms at the age of 14.

"I made the right choice" he insists "since I joined Burnley they have been very good to me and I have benefitted enormously from the instruction and encouragement I have received."

Trevor is obviously aware of the trend for Burnley's prize possessions to follow the gravy train, but is not thinking in those terms himself: "Not at the moment" he says. "Although the club policy in the past has been to sell players that is not the feeling around here now. Our manager Brian Miller wants to keep the team together. We are growing-up together and that is the idea, to cement us together and make us into a very good team."

There are certainly positive signs that this approach is reaping its reward. Burnnley travelled to Doncaster on Tuesday with a fifteen game unbeaten record behind them in the Third Division, and that has been good enough to haul them back into promotion contention.

"It has given us all a lot of confidence and made it much easier for me coming in as a new boy" admits Trevor who first made his debut as a substitute last April against Huddersfield.

Again when he was called up for his first full League debut at Bristol Rovers last September Trevor never dreamed that it would be a long term promotion: "At the time I thought it was just a temporary measure, because I was not expecting a chance so early in the season," he says, "but I decided to give it all I had and take my chance the best I could."

His best proved good enough and now the teenager with golden boots who has worked hard to become a professional since first signing schoolboy forms, is an established and important cog in the Burnley team.


Of course as you would expect of a player of ability he has his sights set on far wider horizons: "Yes I want to play in the First Division and play for England and I think I can achieve both these ambitions with Burnley. We are certainly good enough to win promotion from the Third Division for since we started getting things together we have not met a better side than us in the League.

"Today's game won't be easy we know, you beat us 2-0 at Turf Moor, but that was when we were playing badly. This afternoon you will see a much better Burnley team, one that is looking to avenge that previous defeat."


