

JOHN NEWMAN'S

It was a case of daylight robbery when Tranmere Rovers beat us last Saturday with one of the very few shots they managed to put on target during the 90 minutes.

The result was a travesty of justice because we dominated the game for long periods. We should have been three up at half time and could have

won by five or six.

In my opinion we played just as well as we did when we beat Cardiff City three days earlier but lacked the finish we displayed at Ninian Park. That was the big difference. In fact I consider that the football we played was good enough to beat any team and afterwards their manager Bryan Hamilton agreed that Tranmere wouldn't collect three luckier points.

He is not the first manager to tell me that this season. It's happened three or four times, and when Blackpool beat us Sam Ellis admitted, "How we managed to win I just


don't know."

We once again created plenty of openings and, though we had hard luck on a couple of occasions, there was no excuse for some of the missed chances. Until we get it right we are going to continue to struggle.

A lot of things go to make up a good team but the vital ingredient is scoring goals and our record so far this season is pretty terrible to say the least. You have to score goals to win matches and it is something we need to do much better.

Results like last Saturday can be soul-destroying but we have got to pick ourselves up and apply ourselves to the task of beating Swindon Town tonight. We badly need the points to keep a jump ahead of a permanent place in the bottom four.

SWINDON TOWN slipped into the Fourth Division for the first time last season and during the first half of the campaign looked set for a quick return to the Third Division.

They were second in the table at Christmas time and were occupying a place in the top four at the start of the New Year.

They still looked a good bet when they beat Hereford United 3-2 in early February but failed to win one of their next nine games, collecting only three out of a possible 27 points.

They finally finished in eighth position and this season, although gaining some notable cup victories, they have failed to make their mark as potential promotion challengers.

Formed in 1881 the Robins have had two spells in the Second Division but have spent

most of their life in the Third — a total of 55 seasons out of 63.

The club's glory year was in 1969 when they reached the final of the Football League Cup as a Third Division club and toppled mighty Arsenal at Wembley, winning 3-1 in extra time. At the end of the season they also gained promotion to the Second Division.

The Robins have enjoyed more cup glory than most clubs in the lower bracket of the league and during their early years when in the Southern League they twice reached the semi-finals of the F.A. Cup.

Only three years ago they also reached the semi-finals of the league cup after beating Arsenal again in a replay. But they were then eliminated themselves by Wolves, the eventual winners, in a replay.

scott endersby. Goalkeeper. Spent three years with Ipswich Town before joining Tranmere Rovers with whom he made 91 league and cup appearances before signing for Swindon during the summer.

KEVIN BADDELEY. Defender. Made his league debut with Bristol City after serving his apprenticeship at Ashton Gate. Joined Swindon on a free transfer he quickly established himself as a first team regular and has now made in the region of 100 first team appearances.

SIMON GIBSON. Defender. Joined Swindon on loan from Chelsea in October and was officially transferred to the club the following month. He netted his first league goal when he opened the scoring in Swindon's home match against Hereford United earlier in the season.

COLIN BAILLIE. Defender. A former club apprentice he made his league debut two years ago and has since topped 50 first team games. NIGEL GRAY. Defender. Linked up with Swindon at the start of the current season after playing 261 league and cup matches for Charlton Athletic.

CHARLIE HENRY. Defender. Another player to come through the apprentice ranks he has since topped 100 league and cup games for the Wiltshire club.

GARY EMMANUEL. Midfield. Started his career with Birmingham City, making his debut in 1975 and making 77 first team appearances, he was transferred to Bristol City for £50,000. He made 72 appearances for City and then moved to Swindon in a player-exchange deal the season before last. He has now made in the region of

100 league and cup appearances since then.

PAUL BATTY. Midfield. Another club apprentice he made his debut in September last season and never missed another game during the campaign. This season he topped 50 league games with the club.

LEIGH BARNARD. Midfield. Joined Swindon from Portsmouth last season and was one of the club's everpresent players, making 53 league and cup appearances. He has played 89 first team games for Pompey.

PAUL RICHARDON. Midfield. Signed during the summer after making 471 league and cup appearances for Nottingham Forest, Chester, Stoke City, Sheffield United and Blackpool. Stoke paid £30,000 for his signature and Sheffield United £15,000. He started his career as an apprentice with Forest with whom he played 48 games.

ANDY ROWLAND. Forward. He was an amateur with Derby County but made his league debut for Bury, scoring 70 goals in 205 games with the Lancashire club. Since moving to Swindon he has added another 89 goals to his total in 250 games.

JIMMY QUINN. Forward. Swindon paid Oswestry Town £10,000 for his signature last season when he netted three goals in 13 appearances. This season, however, he has already topped double figures.

GARY NELSON. Forward. Signed in August from Southend with whom he scored 18 goals in 140 league and cup matches.

ALAN MAYES. Forward. An apprentice with QPR he made his league debut with Watford and Swindon paid £65,000 for his signature and then transferred him to Chelsea for £200,000. He returned to Swindon this season and recently scored his 100th league goal. He has made in the region of 400 league and cup appearances. KEN BEAMISH. Manager. He scored 179 goals in 607 league appearances during service with Tranmere, Brighton, Blackburn, Port Vale, Bury and Swindon, figuring in transfering fees involving over £100,000.



SWINDON TOWN will be bidding to complete a double-double over HEREFORD UNITED tonight.

Last season they beat United 2-1 and 3-2 and they made it three wins in a row when they won the first of this season's two fixtures by three clear goals in November. SIMON GIBSON, ALAN MAYES, penalty, and LEIGH BARNARD shared the goals, which were all scored in the first half.

Shrewsbury will now entertain Kidderminster Harriers in their replay next Monday and Swansea City meet Barry Town at the Vetch the following night.

United will be home again next Wednesday when they entertain PORT VALE in the new Associate Members Cup competition.

Vale also did the double over United last season when they finished third in the table but they are finding life tough in the Third Division this season.

It will be an all-pay match and season ticket holders must book their seats by Tuesday evening. United produced some of their old giant-killing form to reach the semi-finals last week when they gained a well deserved 3-1 win over Second Division Cardiff City at Ninian Park.

It was only their second-ever victory at the Welsh club's headquarters and ended a run of 10 successive defeats in league and cup since January 1958.

On that occasion United beat Cardiff City 2-0 in a fifth round Welsh Cup match and their team was: Gerry Sewell, Eric Tomkins, Joe Wade, Bob Masters, Idris Niblett, Henry Horton, Ray Hardiman, Sid Prosser, Frank Fidler, Roy Williams and Cyril Beech.

ROY WILLIAMS and CYRIL BEECH scored the goals and Cyril, who now lives in Merthyr Tydfil, was present at Cardiff last Wednesday to recall United's fine win there 26 years ago.

He stated, "It's quite a few years since I last saw Hereford play and they certainly deserved their victory like we did when United were in the Southern League.

At the time of going to press United were still waiting to hear who they will be playing in the semi-finals of the Welsh Cup.

Although Wrexham gained an unexpected 1-0 win over Newport County at Somerton Park the other two quarter-final ties were drawn.

SWINDON TOWN have won only two of their 14 away league matches but have shared the spoils on five other occasions. Last Saturday they completed a double over STOCKPORT COUNTY with goals from twinstrikers Alan Mayes and Andy Rowland.

They also shared the goals when Swindon won at Stockport earlier in the season.

At the foot of the table HARTLEPOOL UNITED gained another victory in their bid to move clear of bottom place.

They crushed HALIFAX TOWN 3-0 to register their third win in six games after winning only two of their first 21 matches. They are now six points clear of CHESTER, who are well and truly anchored at the bottom.

MANSFIELD TOWN, who entertain United on Saturday, figured in a goalless draw with PETERBOROUGH, and so far have won only four of their 12 home matches.



IVE DONATED TO HEREFORD UNITED SAVE OUR SOCCER APPEAL FUND HAVE YOU?



Hereford United SOS committee recently issued an audited balance sheet for the period between April 1st, 1982, when the appeal fund was launched, and January 31st this year.

The net total amount of money raised was £39,894.96 and the biggest money-spinner was the two Bull draws that netted a magnificent sum of £18,715.74.

Donations, collection forms and sponsorship produced £8,273.93 and next on the list was the three Country and Western Festivals which boosted the fund to the tune of £3,965.35.

The two Christmas draws and Grand National draw organised by stalwart HARLEY PRICE produced a very handsome sum of £2,623.33, and the two Race Nights staged in the Starlight Room raised £777.93.

During the coming year the committee, whose target is £50,000, plan to hold another Country and Western festival at Edgar Street, and are also investigating the possibility of staging a pro-am golf tournament at Wormsley.

This may depend on whether a local firm is prepared to sponsor the event or, failing that, whether 18 sponsors will purchase a hole apiece.

If the tournament goes ahead it will give 54 local golfers the chance to play with a top professional and the prize money should prove very attractive.
