LES MUTRIE was signed from Colchester United for a fee of around £2,000. Les began his League career with Carlisle United. He then went on to Northern League Blyth Spartans and after an outstanding three games against Hull City in the 1980/1 F.A. Coup the Tigers paid £30,000 for Les' services. After his spell with Hull, he then moved to the south coast, and after an unhappy

time returned to his native North East.

KEVIN DIXON was signed from Carlisle United on a free transfer. Kevin's previous clubs include Drybroughs Northern League Tow Law from which Carlisle signed him. After only a limited number of appearances at Brunton Park he was often used as substitute. Showed good touches in the recent friendly against Newcastle, and will prove a good asset to 'Pools.

# Bob Wilkinson writes .....

## SOCCER IN BELGIUM

Today we briefly review the history of Belgian soccer. Since the end of the Second World War Belgian football has been dominated by two clubs, as in Scotland, although some others have merged to challenge for honours these last few seasons.

Anderlecht and Standard Liege are the two dominent clubs in question but strangely they never featured amongst the honours before the war. The Belgian F.A., was founded in 1895, and until the advent of the war, the honours were divided between F.C. Antwerp, Daring Brussels, Racing Club Brussels, F.C. Liege and Union St. Gilloise.

Arguably the most famous of Belgium's clubs is Anderlecht who hold two records. That of 16 League Championships and 5 F.A. Cup wins. They are also their country's only club to have won a European trophy, when in season 1975/6 they defeated West Ham United 4 - 2 to take the European Cup Winners Cup back to Brussels. Indeed they appeared in the final of this competition the following two seasons, losing out to S.V. Hamburg in 1976/7, but whacking W.A.C. Austria 4 - 0 in 1977/8 to again take the European Cup Winners Cup.

Anderlecht can also boast of two of Belgium's all time greats in Jef Mermans and Paul Van Himst. Jef's record of 37 goals in 30 matches still stands, and his total tally had reached 212 by the time he retired in 1957. Van Himst collected a record 81 caps for Belgium, was voted Footballer of the Year 3 times as well as being the League's top scorer in three seasons.

In 1964 the club had the unusual distinction of having eleven of their players playing for the national team with, surprise surprise, their 'keeper coming out after half time as a substitute to set a rare record in football, certainly by present day standards.

Standard Liege have won the League Championship six times and the F.A. Cup three times including the first since the war in 1954. Between 1956 and 1962 the Belgian Cup was not contested as the top teams deliberately had themselves knocked in the early rounds. They changed their minds in 1963 when a place in the European Cup Winners Cup was up for grabs. This is one reason for the emergence of some of the lesser clubs such as Beveren Waas who won the F.A. Cup in 1977/8, and the League Championship the following season.

Another club to come to prominence in latter years is F.C. Bruges, who twice reached the final of a European Cup trophy only to lose both times to Liverpool. In the 1975/6 UEFA Cup Final they lost 4 - 3 over two legs, and in the 1977/8 European Cup Final at Wembley they lost 1 - 0.

On the national scene Belgium are also emerging as a force having qualified for the finals of the last World Cup, and European Championships.
