STATEMENT

BURNLEY FOOTBALL CLUB chairman, Mr. Frank Teasdale, on Wednesday evening accepted the resignation of Martin Buchan as manager with great regret.

Mr. Buchan, who was appointed manager of Burnley Football Club on June 22nd this year informed Mr. Teasdale that he had not been happy with his performance as manager and felt it was in the best interests of the club and of himself that he should leave immediately.

Mr. Buchan added that the decision was entirely his own and he saw no real purpose in trying to make changes in the re-structuring of the team when it had become obvious to him that he would not be able to continue as manager in the longer term.

Mr. Teasdale made strong efforts to persuade Mr. Buchan to change his mind and stay on but he was informed that there was no going back. So the club chairman had no alternative but to accept the resignation on behalf of the board of directors.

Tommy Cavanagh, who has great experience in the game, and has been assisting Mr. Buchan since before the start of the season, has accepted an invitation from the board to take charge of the team and matters relating to the club's players until further notice.

Mr. Teasdale stated that he felt Mr. Buchan had become a victim of his own very deep personal integrity.

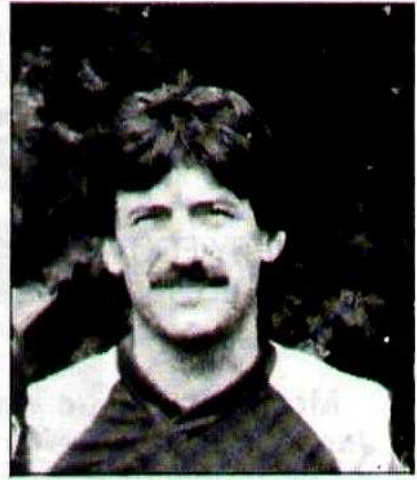

Soccer Chat



IN each match programme this season we will be talking to a Burnley Football Club personality and asking their views on soccer topics. This afternoon we meet Peter Hampton.

Peter, tell us something about how you began in football.

- I was born in Oldham, but moved to Burnley with my parents at the age of seven and we stayed four years. I went to Rosehill Junior School and played for Burnley Schoolboys but then we moved to Bishop Auckland in the North-East.

Who was manager of Leeds United when you signed for them?

- Don Revie. I had a good football education at Elland Road and stayed 10 years after going there as an apprentice. I was a forward as a schoolboy but they switched me to left-back and I've played there ever since.

Who did you make your first team debut against?

- Southampton at the Dell. I was 17, we lost 3-2 and the Leeds team included Jack Charlton and Billy Bremner. That was Jack's last season as a player.

Any other matches that stand out?

- The one in which I scored my first League goal. It was against Burnley at Elland Road and my shot from 20 yards went in after a short free-kick. I eventually moved on to Stoke when Alan Durban made a bid for me and Jimmy Adamson accepted it.

Like all the other Burnley players last week's performance at Chester must have disappointed you.

- It was a big disappointment to lose like that. And all the lads realise we have to do loads better.

What is your other sporting interest apart from football?

- My favourite other sport is golf. It's a game I greatly enjoy.

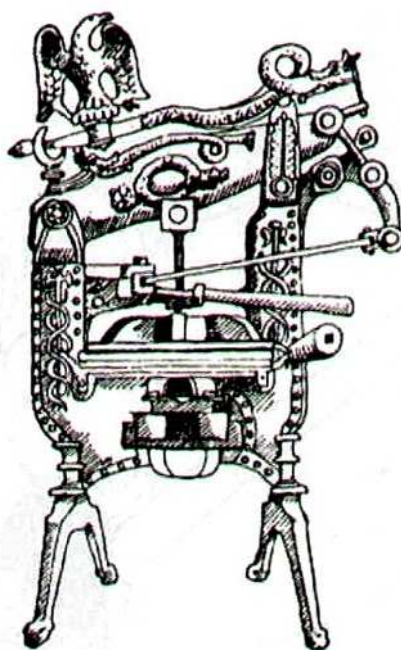

What the Papers said about...

THE DEFEAT BY CHESTER AT SEALAND ROAD

KEITH McNEE (Lancashire Evening Telegraph):

"The warning signs were there early on as an error by Geoff Palmer let in David Brett, and Ray Deakin headed off the line. Vince Overson was greatly missed and Chester went two up after only 20 minutes. Goalkeeper Dennis Peacock made several first-half saves, but Burnley were lucky to survive a Gary Bennett header that struck the inside of a post."

BRIAN NORTH (Sunday People):

"Chester went in front through Rimmer with his 12th goal of the season, and minutes later Graham scored his first for the club. Burnley had scored only one goal in the last five matches and the Chester defence did not give them much opportunity to end that dismal record."

GRANVILLE SHACKLETON (Burnley Express):

"Clearly Vince Overson was badly missed and while Ray Deakin tried hard in his place that left the midfield weak and with Kevin Hird not 100 per cent fit after his attack of flu Alan Taylor was a lone raider up front. Taylor almost put Burnley in front after three minutes and later threatened the only danger to Chester. Any hopes of a Burnley recovery disappeared on the hour when John Kelly scored Chester's third goal."

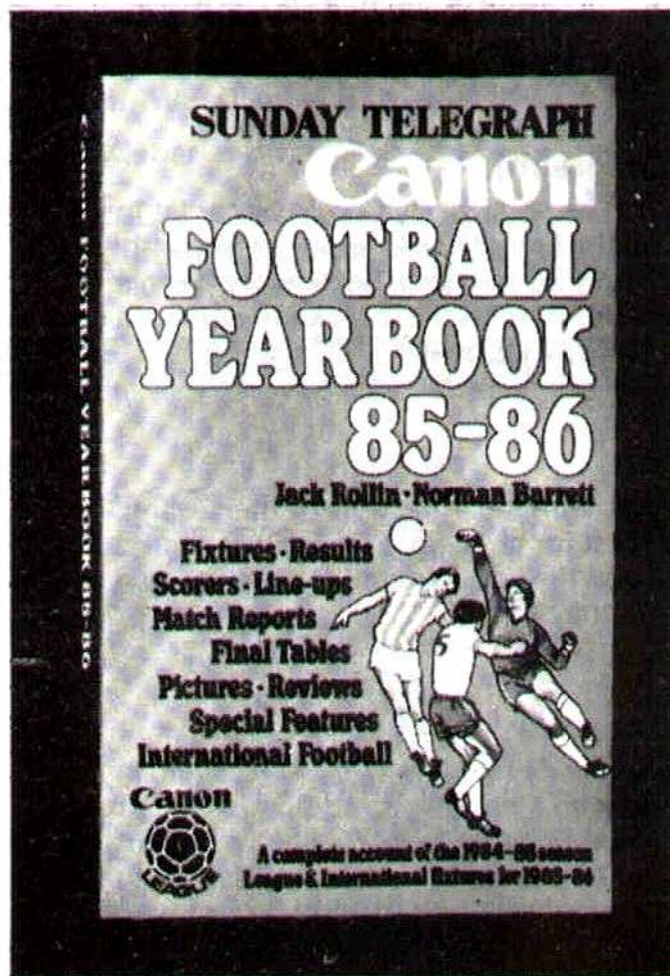

Swindon Town

LOU MACARI'S Swindon Town come to Turf Moor only a few days after their Milk Cup triumph over Sunderland. They defeated the Second Division club 5-4 on aggregate, winning the second leg 3-1 at the County Ground in front of a crowd of more than 9,000 spectators. Goals from Andy Rowland and Brian Wade (2) put them through to the third round.

In the Fourth Division, Swindon have taken only 13 points from their first 10 matches, and have scored only one away goal. But their 4-0 home win last Saturday over Rochdale, and that success against Sunderland, shows that they are running into form.

Player-manager Macari did not play in the Rochdale and Sunderland matches because of a groin injury, and at the time of writing was rated doubtful for this afternoon's fixture. Definitely out of the Swindon team through injury are David Moss and Chris Kamara.

Burnley have had some memorable games against the Wiltshire club including the semi-final of the League up in 1969. Swindon won 2-1 at Turf Moor, Burnley won 2-1 at the County Ground and a dramatic play-off at West Bromwich went to the Robins. Their team at that time included Peter Noble, later to give the Clarets such magnificent service.

Lou Macari is, of course, a former Manchester United and Scotland international team mate of ex-Burnley manager Martin Buchan. He joined the Old Trafford staff from Celtic and after winning Scotland Under-23 honours he went on to play for his country 24 times in full international matches.

Swindon's other well-known players include the experienced Andy Rowland, former Brighton full-back Chris Ramsey, ex-Blackpool player David Hockaday and Peter Coyne.

Coyne scored two hat-tricks for England Schoolboys and had a spell with Manchester United before going on to play for Ashton, Crewe and Hyde.

Swindon finished in eighth position in the Fourth Division last season when their leading scorer in League matches was the well-built Colin Gordon with 17 goals. Next highest was Coyne with 15 including three penalties.

Swindon Town's team for this afternoon's match is expected to be chosen from the following players:-

KENNY ALLEN (goalkeeper): Did not play in this week's game against Sunderland as he was "cup-tied". Signed from Torquay.

CHRIS RAMSEY (full-back): Played for Brighton in the 1983 F.A. Cup final against Manchester United. Birmingham-born, his first club was Bristol City.

NICK COLEMAN (full-back): On loan from Millwall for whom he has made one League appearance.

DAVID COLE (central defender): Born in the Isle of Man, he was signed from Swansea after a spell with Sunderland.

COLIN CALDERWOOD (central defender): Signed from Mansfield after making 100 League appearances.

LOU MACARI (player-manager; midfielder): Doubtful for today with a groin injury. Scottish international and vastly experienced former Celtic and Manchester United player.

PETER COYNE (midfielder): Scored 15 League goals for Swindon last season. Previous clubs include Manchester United, Crewe and Hyde.

PAUL ROBERTS (midfielder): Former Brentford and Millwall player. Signed for Swindon after a spell in Finland last summer.

DAVID HOCKADAY (midfielder): Made 147 appearances for Blackpool before joining Swindon.

LEIGH BARNARD (midfielder): Formerly with Portsmouth. Played very well in this week's win over Sunderland.

ANDY ROWLAND (striker): Experienced former Bury player. Made 174 League appearances for the Gigg Lane club and has made over 250 for Swindon.

COLIN GORDON (striker): Top scorer last season with 17 League goals. Signed from Oldbury United.

BRIAN WADE (striker): Formerly with Trowbridge. Scored twice against Sunderland in this week's Milk Cup match.

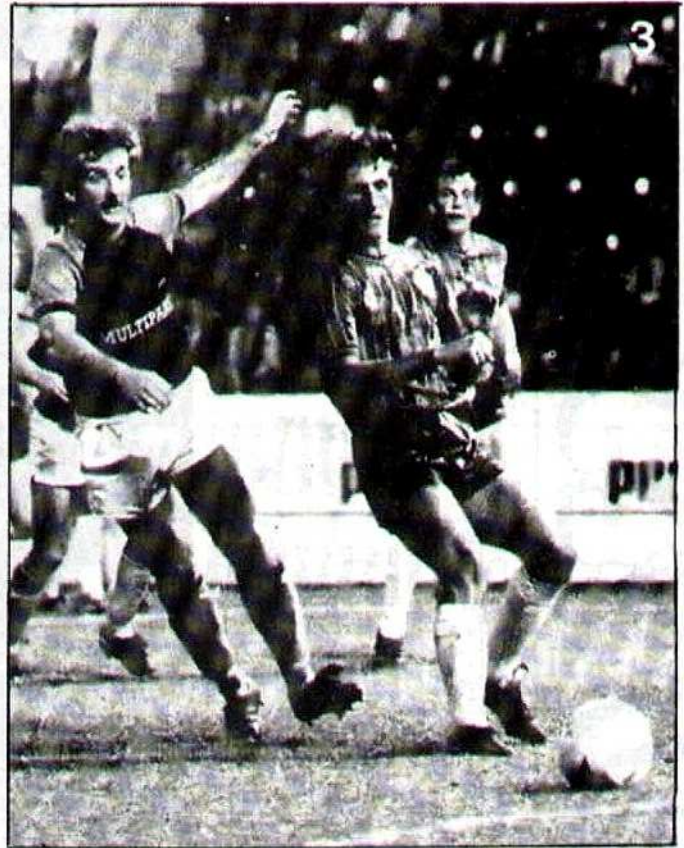

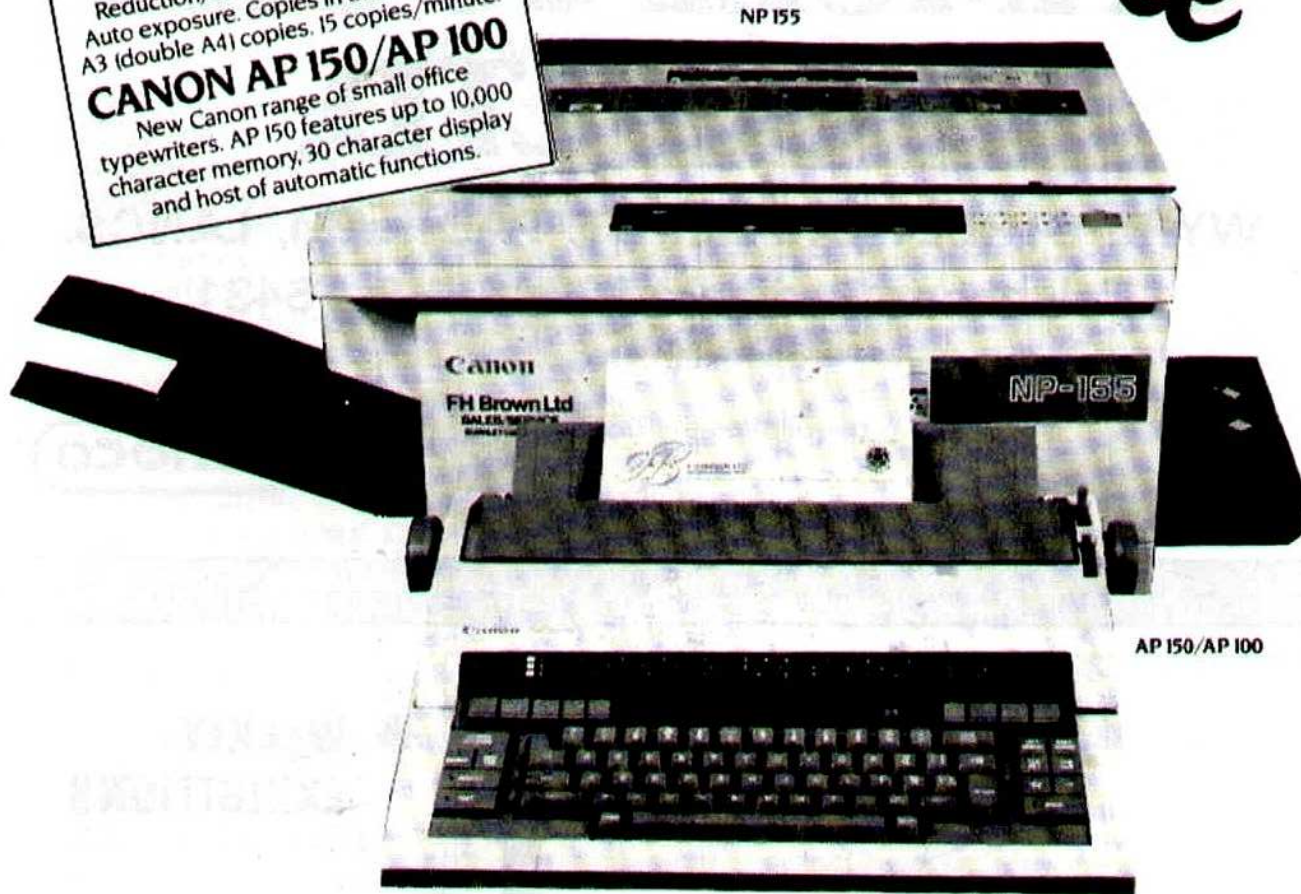

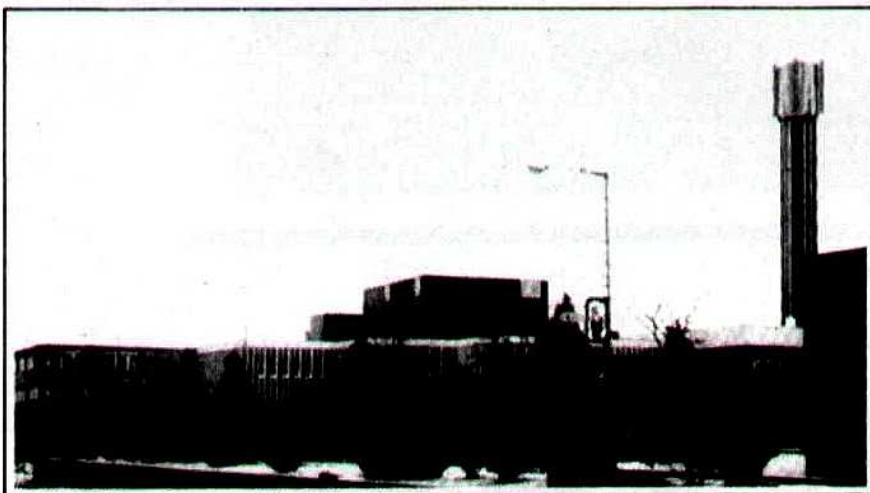
