



OUR FUTURE?

Although the County Ground this evening may be tingling with hope and anticipation with the visit of First Division Club Sheffield Wednesday, it may not be so far removed that we could be witnessing soccer here at the County Ground in a different sphere providing certain proposals are implemented.

The following extracts are taken from a Gola League programme of recent days:-

'The Gola League scene is buzzing at the moment with proposals which have received the backing of The Football League Management Committee and will be presented for acceptance to the ninety-two League chairmen on November 12. They include an amalgamation of the existing Fourth Division with clubs from the Gola League in an 'Intermediate League' with automatic promotion between the two competitions. A bitter battle seems inevitable as the smaller clubs fight to resist any threat to their membership, but an acceptance of the proposed reforms could mean a major improvement in status for clubs like ours.'

In hope of averting a damaging breakaway by the top clubs, an introduction of an 'Intermediate League' including the 4th Division and Gola, is proposed and will be accepted or rejected by the 92 chairmen on November 12. Our meeting with clubs like Hereford United, SWINDON TOWN, Torquay United or Exeter City may not be a pipe dream after all!'

No-one can fore-tell the future but there are really only three options - Gola, Intermediate or Division Three of The Football League. On the day in question the attendance at that particular Gola League match was higher than some Fourth Division attendances, an argument for change perhaps, but with it would come part-time players and membership of The Football League is a honour and something to be cherished.

While celebrities like Kevin Keegan are advocating the abolition of the Fourth Division, the question should be asked of a man who proposes such action. Where did you start your career?

John Smith, the Liverpool chairman is another who strongly recommends drastic change, maybe. Strange how Liverpool out of the European competitions for the first season and with a loss of revenue, are bleating. That ban was exercised following the behaviour of which clubs supporters?

Strange how some people see life, they steal or borrow from the next door neighbours garden and then blame the neighbour for their own predicament. Super Leagues or European Super League are of no concern to the rural areas of England or Wales. They will concern only the large city clubs, while they may feel that they have to protect their own interests, likewise the Directors or custodians of Fourth Division Clubs have to protect their interest.

If the benefactors of Preston, Aston Villa, Wolves, Blackburn, Bolton, West Brom, Accrington Stanley, Everton, Burnley, Derby, Notts County and Stoke City had adopted the same attitude on April 17th 1888. Liverpool or even this evening's visitors Sheffield Wednesday would not be playing First Division soccer now - why?

Because the initial meeting to form the Football League had to turn down hopefuls like Sheffield Wednesday and Nottingham Forest as there were only twenty-two fixture dates available! Liverpool entered The Football League Division One in 1894 and promptly finished bottom!

There is no record of Accrington Stanley or Small Heath seeking their removal! Liverpool finished as Second Division Champions the following year while Crewe finished bottom. Of course John Smith could not remember those days, but his predecessors were pleased to entertain Alexandra and collect two points and return to Division One.

Liverpool have since built a fine history to be admired and obviously they want to safeguard their own interests, they have that fundamental right.

Whether you are Kevin Keegan, Liverpool, Swindon Town or A.N.Other or even plain old John Smith, you are entitled to an opinion.

Backtrack

Our association with Sheffield Wednesday stretches back over 57 years, to the occasion of an F.A. Cup fourth round tie, here at the County Ground, on January 28th 1928. Swindon, for a change, were doing reasonably well in the Third Division (South), and were unbeaten in their last 16 matches, disposing of Newport, Crystal Palace and Clapton Orient to qualify for this stage of the competition. The Wednesday, on the other hand, were holding a mid-table position in the First Division and had K.O.'d Bournemouth in the last round. A large crowd was expected for the game, but a wet and windy day kept the attendance down to 17,494 and indeed it was the conditions as much as the opposition that defeated Swindon. Harry Morris gave us the interval lead, but Wednesday hit back through Seed and Harper in the second half to take the game.

Forty years later, on 17th February 1968, Swindon had the chance for revenge when they were drawn away, again in the fourth round. An estimated 6,000 travelled to Hillsborough as Swindon again took the lead, Roger Smart heading home in the 34th minute. But again Wednesday stuck twice in the second-half, Wilf Smith equalising after 65 minutes and John Ritchie getting the winner with just five minutes remaining, in front of a massive 37,457.

Two years later we met on equal terms for a Second Division game, on 28th November 1970. That game saw Danny Williams, the Town's manager at the time of the last meeting, return to the County Ground, but as manager of the Sheffield club. However, he could do little to stop the Town netting three times through Don Rogers (2) and Rod Thomas, with 15,412 present. The return the following January resulted in a 2-2 draw after Swindon had taken a 2-1 half-time lead, Rogers again getting two. A season later the Town went down by the only goal of the game in Yorkshire, but managed to reverse that score-line, thanks to Frank Burrows, for the home game in February, in front of 11,589.

August 16th 1972 again saw us at Hillsborough, this time losing 2-1. Our consolation that day came from David Moss, his first League goal, making only his third full appearance. Tom Craig and Brian Joicey got Wednesdays brace to earn them the points. Two weeks later a Ray Treacy goal eight minutes from time was enough to ensure victory and push the Town into seventh spot. A year later we won here by three goals to one on the opening day of the season, but lost 2-1 away in January, Peter Eastoe getting ours. Following our relegation at the end of that season, we next met Wednesday for a Third Division match on 13th September 1975 when goals from Trevor Anderson and Peter Eastoe ensured a 2-1 success after being a goal down at half-time. With us winning 2-0 in the return, thanks to David Syrett and Wilf Dixon, we notched up our only 'double' over the Sheffield Club.

September 13th 1976 saw us record our biggest win over Wednesday, running in 5-2 winners here with 8,698 present, but we went down 3-1 in Yorkshire the following February, Colin Prophett scoring against his old Club with 11,265 in attendance. The next season saw a sharing of the points, being 1-1 here on 20th August and 2-2 away in January 1978. September of that year saw us knock in three without reply through 'Chic Bates', Andy Rowland and Paul Gilchrist, but it was the return that was crucial. Needing to win to stay in the promotion hunt, Swindon travelled to Hillsborough on 11th May full of hope. But it wasn't to be, as goals from Ian Nimmo and Brian Hornsby ensured another season of Third Division soccer. Alan Mayes netted our only reply, although Ray McHale did miss from the penalty spot. The following season we lost 4-2 away in September, and 2-1 here on 9th February, ours coming from a McHale penalty with 16,415 present.

In Town Tonight

MARTIN HODGE (goalkeeper). Martin started his career with Plymouth and Everton signed him for £190,000 in 1979. He did not always hold the first team spot at Goodison and spent loan periods with Preston, Oldham and Gillingham before joining Wednesday for £135,000 in 1983.

MEL STERLAND (defender). Mel developed in the junior teams and made his first appearance in 'The Owls' League eleven in 1978/79. He won a regular place two seasons later and he now has seven England Under 21 caps.

PAUL HART (defender). Paul opened his League career with Stockport in 1970/71 but moved on to Blackpool for £25,000 in 1973. Leeds paid £330,000 for him in 1978 and he remained a fixture in their defence until transferring to Nottingham Forest in 1983. Though a permanent member of the Forest defence for the past two seasons, he was released this summer.

MIKE LYONS (defender). Mike spent his early days with Everton, making his bow in League football in 1971. He played more than 400 games for Everton and won five England Under-23 caps before moving on to Wednesday for £80,000 in 1982. He scored their first goal of the new season in the 1-1 draw with Chelsea.

MARK SMITH (defender). Mark made his League debut for Wednesday in 1978, immediately after completing his apprenticeship. He now looks back on more than 250 first-team games and has been capped five times by the England Under-21s.

LAWRIE MADDEN (defender). Lawrie got his chance in League football with Mansfield in 1974/75. Charlton signed him in 1977 and he made well over 100 League appearances for them before moving on to Millwall in 1982. Wednesday signed him in 1983.

PETER SHIRTLIFF (defender/midfield). Peter played for Barnsley boys and was an England Schoolboy trialist before serving his apprenticeship at Hillsborough. He made his League debut in 1978 and now looks back on well over 150 games.

CHRIS MORRIS (defender). Chris is a former England Schoolboy International who developed in Wednesday's junior teams. He earned a few first team outings two seasons ago.

ANDY BLAIR (midfield). A Scotland Under 21 cap, Andy was signed from Aston Villa in 1984. Andy started his career with Coventry where his midfield displays earned him the first of five Scotland Under-21 caps. He moved on to Aston Villa for £300,000 in 1981. When he lost his place two seasons ago, he joined Wolves on loan.

NIGEL WORTHINGTON (midfield/-midfield). Nigel, who won his third N. Ireland cap against Israel last season, first came into English football in 1981 when Notts County signed him from Ballymena United. He made 67 League appearances for the Meadow Lane Club before joining Wednesday for £100,000 in 1984. He can play equally well in defence or in midfield.

GARY SHELTON (midfield). Gary joined Wednesday from Aston Villa for £50,000 four seasons ago. He started with Walsall, joined Villa for £60,000 in 1977 and six seasons ago spent a loan period with Notts County. Gary won his first England Under-21 cap last season.

TONY GREGORY (midfield). Tony was given a surprise call for first team duty in August. Though only 17 and still an apprentice, he made his debut at Manchester City and held his place for the Watford game.

GLYNN SNODIN (midfield). Glynn joined Wednesday from Doncaster this summer. He served his apprenticeship with Doncaster and he went on to complete more than 300 League appearances for the club. He had been top scorer for two of the past three seasons, hitting a personal best of 19 last season.

SIGGI JONSSON (midfield). Siggi joined Wednesday last season after impressing in International matches for Iceland. Though still only 19, he has played for his country at all levels and hopes to establish himself in English football this season. He

scored Wednesday's winning goal at Oxford - his first in League soccer.

GARRY THOMPSON (forward). Wednesday invested a club record £450,000 to sign Garry from W.B.A. this summer and he got off the mark with one of the goals in their victory at Manchester City. He won six Under-21 caps during his early days at Coventry but it was after moving to W.B.A. in 1983 for £225,000 that he produced his best form. He was Albion's top scorer in his last two seasons at 'The Hawthorns' with 18 goals in 1983/84 and 21 last term.

LEE CHAPMAN (forward). Lee joined Wednesday from Sunderland for £100,000 during the 1984 close season. Though he started his career with Stoke, he made his League debut with Plymouth during a loan period, in 1978/79. He got into the Stoke side the following season and he twice led 'The Potteries' scoring list with 17 in 1980/81 and 17 again the following season. Arsenal signed him for £600,000 in 1982 but that move was not a success and he moved on to Sunderland just over a year later, Lee has rediscovered his old scoring touch. Last season he was the 'Owls' second highest scorer with 20 goals.

BRIAN MARWOOD (forward). Brian served his apprenticeship with Hull City, making his League debut in 1980. He was top scorer with 19 in 1982/83 and 16 the

following season, form that inspired Wednesday to pay £115,000 for him in 1984. Brian scored 12 times last season and opened his account this season with two at Manchester City.

GAVIN OLIVER (full back). Was on schoolboy forms for us and joined Sheffield Wednesday as an apprentice in July 79, becoming a full professional in August '80'. Born in Felling in the North East.

CARL SHUTT (forward). A local lad who joined Wednesday from non-league football with Spalding United in April 1985.

IAIN HESFORD (goalkeeper). Former Under-21 goalkeeper. Born in Endola, Gambia. Joined Wednesday from Blackpool at the start of the 83/84 season. Has not played in the League as yet but is a very important member of the Sheffield Wednesday squad.

IAN KNIGHT (centre-half). Born Hartlepool and joined Barnsley as an apprentice after being freed by Barnsley and joined Wednesday in August '85'.

MARK CHAMBERLAIN (winger). Joined Wednesday from Stoke City in September. An England International, he began his career with Port Vale. An exciting winger who will be seeking to restructure a career that suffered the setback of relegation with Stoke City last season.





SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY



Sheffield Wednesday have made a dream start to this season having already established themselves as serious contenders for the League Championship. Something they have not won since 1930.

When the Hillsborough Club returned to First Division soccer last season after being absent for fourteen years, it was regarded by the Owls Manager Howard Wilkinson as merely a stepping stone in his bid to put Wednesday on the way to lifting one of the game's major trophies.

During the summer Howard Wilkinson completed several important signings despite the disappointment of having lost last season's leading goalscorer, 21-goal Imre Varadi to West Bromwich Albion. He soon snapped up a replacement when he secured the signing of the Hawthorns striker Gary Thompson for £450,000. The England Under-21 International had been expected to join a European Club instead. Central defender Paul Hart was signed from Nottingham Forest and immediately secured a first team place but Glynn Snodin who was signed from Third Division Doncaster Rovers has been kept on the sidelines as the competition for places in the Hillsborough line up gains momentum.

The Sheffield Wednesday chief did not hesitate to move into the transfer market soon after the season began when he signed England and Stoke City winger Mark Chamberlain for a Football League Tribunal settled fee. While selling striker Simon Stainrod to Aston Villa for £400,000 last month.

Not regarded as a headline maker during his playing days Howard Wilkinson has more than made amends as a Manager.

It is of particular self satisfaction that he has been able to bring success to Hillsborough, the home of Sheffield Wednesday for they were the Club that launched his own professional career.

Sheffield born, Howard joined Sheffield United as an amateur. He failed to make any impression at Bramall Lane. From there he moved to Hillsborough. After turning professional in June 1962 he had to wait for two years before making his debut in attack for 'The Owls'.

His opportunities were limited in the Wednesday League team and Howard accepted an opportunity to join Brighton in 1966. His career began to take off at the Goldstone Ground and he found little difficulty in maintaining his position in the Brighton Team during their Third Division days.

In 1971 he left League soccer to take over as Player/Manager of Boston United. During that period of his life Howard put good use to his spare time by studying and achieving his Bachelor of Education Degree at Sheffield University, spending two years teaching at a Grammar School. Football still remained very much a large part of his life though and Howard gained a lot of self satisfaction as he was appointed an Official F.A. Coach.

Notts County appointed him to their coaching staff in 1980 and Howard had a big influence upon the Club's rise from the bottom of the Second Division to regain a place in the First Division in 1981.

Those efforts were rewarded when Notts County appointed him as their Team Manager in 1982.










INTO THE WILDERNESS

Sheffield Wednesday might never have enjoyed playing at their Hillsborough home had one suggestion been taken up in the late 1800's.

The idea was that they would share Bramall Lane with City rivals United but talks broke down and Wednesday settled on a new site at Owlerton.

In 1899, Owlerton was not even in Sheffield but in the unspoilt hills on the other side of the City and so began the task of building 'Out in the Wilds'. The ground was opened for Wednesdays first match in Division Two (v Chesterfield) on



September 2nd 1899 and fifteen years later Owlerton became part of the new Parliamentary Constituency of Hillsborough and the ground changed its name accordingly.

The existing South Stand was opened in January 1914 but it was in 1961 that the most impressive change came with the opening of the new North Stand.


