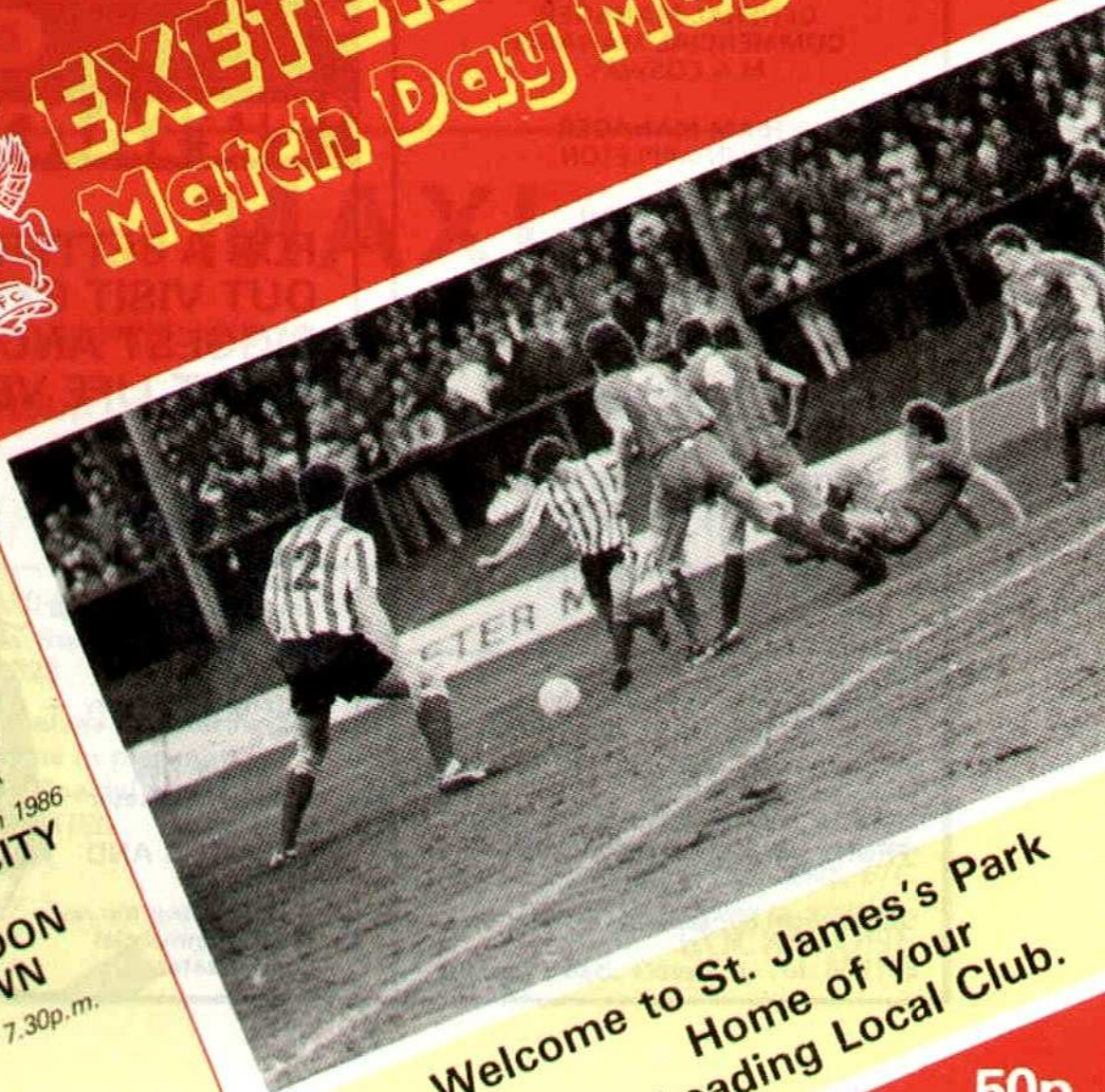

I hope that we can give you something to warm the cockles of your hearts tonight and bring a little sunshine to the club after the bitterly cold period we have experienced.

SWINDON TOWN

Scottish International **LOU MACARI** took over as Manager of Swindon Town in July 1984 after a successful playing with both Celtic and Manchester United, making 311 Football League appearances for the Old Trafford club where he spent eleven years. Now in his second season with Swindon. The Wiltshire side are well on course for promotion, to win back their Third Division place next season, being relegated four years ago.

Goalkeeper **KENNY ALLEN** was Torquay United's Player of the Year last season, joining Swindon in September. He made his League debut in 1968 for Hartlepool, and has also played for West Bromwich Albion, Bath City, A.F.C. Bournemouth, Yeovil Town and Peterborough United, as well as spells in both South Africa and Sweden. **COLIN CALDERWOOD** cost Swindon a £27,500 fee from Mansfield Town at the start of this season, the Glasgow born player had joined Mansfield as an apprentice in 1981 from Ayr Boys Club. **DAVID COLE** was signed on a free transfer from Swansea City in February 1985, making 20 appearances for Swindon last season. **CHARLIE HENRY** signed professional forms for the club in February 1980, and has made over 150 appearances since making his full Football League debut against Rotherham United seven months later.

LEIGH BARNARD was of course on loan at Exeter City last season, scoring two goals in six appearances. He started his career with Portsmouth, had a spell on loan at Yeovil Town, and then moved on to Peterborough United. Joined Swindon

in July 1982 on a free transfer. Another former Torquay United player last season is **DEREK HALL** who commanded a £5,000 fee on his move to Swindon in July 1985. He was previously at Coventry City and signed for Torquay in March 1984. Now in his third season with Swindon is **DAVE HOCKADAY**, who was signed from Blackpool, his only previous club, where he made over 100 appearances. **CHRIS RAMSEY** is a former Bristol City apprentice, but he made his League debut with Brighton and Hove Albion, who he joined in 1980, he went to Swindon on loan in August 1984, returned to Brighton, but then re-signed on a permanent basis four months later. Longest serving player at the club is **ANDY ROWLANDS**, he joined Bury in 1974 from Derby County, and in September 1978 Swindon paid a £80,000 fee for his signature, equally at home in attack or defence, he has made around 300 appearances for Swindon.

After playing for both Manchester City and Manchester United **PETER COYNE** moved into Non-League football with Ashton United, then Crewe Alexandra and Hyde United before Swindon signed him in August 1984. **TONY EVANS** has appeared for a number of clubs including Exeter City (on trial), Forbury, Blackpool, Cardiff City, Birmingham City, Crystal Palace, Bolton Wanderers and Wolves. Top scorer last season was **COLIN GORDON** who was also the club's Player of the Year. Joined Swindon from Oldbury United in October 1984 **BRIAN WADE** is a new signing this season from Southern League Trowbridge Town.

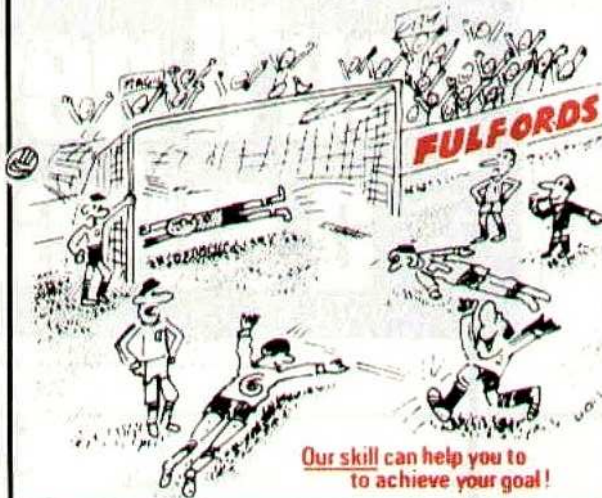

Down Memory Lane

TUESDAY 4th MARCH 1952.

Southampton Fullback Norman Kirkman and his club Chairman were due to meet the Exeter City Directors. A possible development was that Kirkman would become the Player-Manager at St James's Park, whilst the current City boss George Roughton would move to Southampton as their Manager. Kirkman, Bolton born, began his career with Burnley, and subsequently played for Rochdale, Chesterfield and Leicester City before joining Southampton in July 1950.

Three days later the proposed exchange of Managers between Exeter City and Southampton did in fact take place. The City Directors agreed to release George Roughton from his contract with the club despite the fact that it still had eighteen months to run.

MONDAY 4th MARCH 1962.

Mr George Gillin, Exeter City's Vice Chairman gave an assurance that the St James's Park club would not become a second Accrington Stanley. He said that if the Chairman, Mr Reg Rose and himself had not been prepared to carry on and put money into the club, the Exeter City would not be in existence. Certainly the club needed help, but they were determined to carry on.

The withdrawal of Accrington from the Football League had meant that all games played against them were expunged from the records. Ironically Accrington's next game before their financial collapse was to be against Exeter City. The Division Four League table was revised omitting games against Accrington but this did not help Exeter City's cause, dropping down the table only three points clear of the bottom four.

WEDNESDAY 4th MARCH 1964.

Young Irishman George Spiers became the second player within a week to request a transfer from Exeter City. He joined John Henderson, the club's Scottish forward, in a bid to establish a first team place with another club. Spiers, 22 years old, was signed from Crusaders two days before the season began. He made four appearances for the City, and wanted to stay in the Football League rather than return to Ireland.

The City Reserves meanwhile entertained Bristol City's "A" team in a Western League fixture at St James's Park but crashed to a 4-0 defeat, they lined up as follows:- Jim Parkhill; Peter Quarrington, Keith Parsons; Peter Rutley, John Henderson, Ray Gough; Alan Riding, John Symington, Dermot Curtis, John Edgar, Eric Welsh.

Club Chairman Reg Rose revealed that two replies had been received to the advertisement for 15 acres of land in or near the City that Exeter could use for training purposes. He did not say however, where the land was, or how much the club would have to pay for it.

EXETER WIN HELPS BOYS CLUB

That thrilling away win over Bristol City in the FA Cup in December brought an extra and unexpected bonus to the members of Robarton-Lyngford Boys Club in Taunton.

A panel of the game's top managers, chaired by England's Bobby Robson, decided that the 2-1 victory merited the FIAT Performance of the Week Award.

Robarton-Lyngford Boys Club have five soccer teams and are represented by their under-16's, who number among them Hung-Dang who has done so well in the game, both locally and nationally.

THE FREEZE OF 63.

The recent spell of bitterly cold weather and snow brought back memories of the 1962-63 season, when hardly a game of football took place for over two months. It turned out to be the coldest winter since 1947, with Exeter City suffering badly from postponement of fixtures along with everyone else. City travelled to Stockport on the last Saturday of December, but did not play again until February 23rd 1963, when Oldham Athletic visited St James's Park! The trip home from Stockport proved to be a nightmare. To make matters worse, the City had lost 4-3 as well, with Arnold Mitchell, Graham Rees and Eric Welsh getting the Exeter goals. The City party left Manchester on the midnight train, which battled through blizzards and snowdrifts. The train was at least warm, and there was plenty of tea on board, but the City official and players had not eaten since 6 p.m. on the Saturday. They eventually reached Exeter on Sunday afternoon, instead of the scheduled 9 a.m. arrival time.

It was not the end of the journey for City Centre Half Keith Harvey though. A taxi took him as far as Newton St Cyres and could go no further. Harvey had to trudge the last four

miles to his Crediton home through deep snow. City Manager Cyril Spiers had offered to put Harvey up in an Exeter Hotel for the night, but the player wanted to make sure his wife and family were safe, so he set off for Crediton.

With no games, no income and players finding it hard if not impossible to train for several weeks, this was a very bleak time for the club. Training actually took place at the back of the cowshed, although obviously space was somewhat restricted. The pitch was covered in snow, with packed ice several inches thick underneath. It was so cold, that pipes twice burst in the grandstand, flooding the Boardroom and Offices.

The Youth Team managed to get a game after 6 weeks inactivity, when they defeated Bexleyheath, 3-1 in Kent in the Third Round of the F.A. Youth Cup. The first team had to wait a further two weeks however, but the enforced rest obviously did the City a power of good, as they toppled the then League leaders Oldham Athletic 2-1 on a very "sticky" surface. Arnold Mitchell and John Henderson got the Exeter goals, and both players and supporters were glad that Football was back!

Welcome to tonight's attractive match against top of the table Swindon Town who look odds on to reach the Third Division. At the time of writing they are two points clear of Chester and have two games in hand. And it seems that only Chester can stop the Robins winning the Championship.

Our last home game against Cambridge was certainly frustrating for those who turned up in bitterly cold weather. When you are on a bad run it seems that whatever you do the ball just won't go in and that is what happened against Cambridge. Hopefully our goal drought will have ended at either Stockport or Tranmere. As a sideline to the Cambridge game the crowd of only 1369 was our lowest ever which all things considered was not surprising. We will need to be in good form tonight as our visitors' fortunes have been in stark contrast to our own. Since beating us 2:1 back on October 1st Swindon have won 18 out of 21. At home they established a club record 13 consecutive victories while away from the County Ground they have won 8 times including 5 out of the last 6. Their total of only 17 goals conceded away is the best in the division. They won at Burnley 2:0, Scunthorpe 2:0, Chester 1:0, Northampton 1:0, Torquay 1:0, Stockport 2:0, Wrexham 1:0 and Preston 3:0.

Our recent record against Swindon is not too good. Our last 7 matches have seen us gain only 2 points. Last season here Ray Pratt gave us a first-half lead but Peter Coyne equalised 10 minutes from the end. Our other draw was 2:2 at the County Ground in 1980-81. In 39 previous visits to the Park Swindon

Already this season injury and illness have necessitated us using 24 players in the league which is one behind last seasons' total and three behind the 1983-84 figure. Only Jim McNichol has played in every game and if he were to play in all 46 games he would be the first player since Tony Kellow in 1981-82 to appear in every match.
