# SCENE 3

History could well be made this season with both Walsall and Wigan striving to reach the sixth round of the F.A. Cup for the first time in their respective histories.

Walsall chalked up their eleventh home win in a row (a club record) on Saturday in beating neighbours Birmingham in the F.A. Cup, their goal coming from Paul Jones whose cnly previous goal this season was in the Littlewoods Cup at Mansfield. They now take on former Third and Fourth Division Club Watford, who are now in their fifth successive season in Division One.

Wigan meanwhile who were in the fourth round of the F.A. Cup for the second season in succession, this time went one stage further with an own goal winner against Norwich, who like Watford are a team who for many years were associated mainly with Division Three. They are now in the second season of their third spell in Division One, the sort of achievement that must give hope to any clubs who are currently in the midst of substantial spells in Division Three and Four.

Wigan now take on the winners of the Hull v Swansea tie, thereby ensuring that there will be at least one team from outside Division One in the last eight. There were plenty of goals scored in the relatively few Third Division games played last weekend. Scoring honours went to Mansfield's former Southampton striker KEITH CASSELLS, who got four of his side's five goals against Bristol Rovers. This was the first time that Mansfield had scored more than once in a game for two months yet oddly enough they have lost only four league games this season and they are still in with a chance of getting in on the promotion race.

Plenty of goals too at Brentford on Sunday. Making light of the recent resignation of manager Frank McLintock the Bees followed up their recent 4–2 Freight Rover Trophy wins over both Swindon and Walsall by drawing 3–3 with Fulham before a 5,340 gate that is easily the highest at Griffin Park this season. Things seem to be looking up with Fulham too, this point at Griffin Park following up their Freight Rover Trophy win over all-conquering Fourth Division leaders Northampton Town. Young striker Kenny Achampong is currently running into form for Fulham with three goals in his last four games.

After four defeats in a row during December Bournemouth are now right back in the promotion frame, Saturday's 1–0 win at Bolton extending their unbeaten run to eight games. Though still in the top three Notts County, however, are not looking quite such a good bet and on Saturday dropped home points in a 2–2 draw with Darlington, who are now battling hard to pull out of the bottom three and have just drawn three away games in a row. Former Middlesbrough striker David Currie has now scored in each of his last three games for the 'Quakers'.

# INTRODUCING SWINDON TOWN

Today we welcome Swindon Town for their first league game at Bloomfield Road since 19th February, 1985 when we beat them with an Ian Stewart goal. At that stage they had lost only one of their previous four games here and their recent record of only one defeat in nine games suggests that they will provide us with a real test today even though they may be a little weary after their midweek F.A. Cup battle with Leeds.

Founded in 1881 they reached the semi-final of the F.A. Cup in both 1909/10 and 1910/11 while still in the Southern League in which they were twice champions and in the top five for seven successive seasons. They became founder-members of Division Three in 1920 and this became Division Three (South) a year later. Swindon stayed there without a break until 1963 when they won promotion for the first time. Their first spell in Division Two lasted only two seasons, but in the mid-sixties the presence of men like Mike Summerbee, Ernie Hunt, Cliff Jackson and Don Rogers made them one of the most exciting Third Division teams ever.

They reached the last eight of the F.A. Cup in 1966/7 and though Summerbee and Hunt had moved on by then they won the Football League Cup in 1968/9 with an unforgettable extra time win over Arsenal at Wembley. They also won promotion that season for good measure and stayed in Division Two until 1974, their highest position being fifth in 1969/70. The later seventies saw them having near misses for both promotion and relegation and then in 1982 they slipped to Division Four for the first time. They then finished eighth, seventh and eighth respectively before roaring to promotion last season.

That success was achieved despite losing five of their first eight games and struggling in 21st place as late as November. A remarkable run of 22 wins in 25 games lifted them to top place in March and there they remained. They did not lose a single league match from early January until the end of the season.

#### THIS SEASON

Now in his third season at the helm, former Manchester United stalwart Lou Macari has seen his side kick off with a win at Bolton and they have in fact lost only three away games (at Middlesbrough, Walsall and Bournemouth though they have lost four times at home. One of their best performances was a win at Gillingham at the end of December and they earned their fourth round tie with Leeds by a stint of F.A Cup wins over Farnborough, Enfield and Fulham. Their heaviest defeat was of course in September when we chalked up a remarkable 6–2 win at the County Ground with four goals in the first half.

Our former striker DAVE BAMBER, who arrived there via Coventry, Walsall and Portsmouth has been one of Swindon's most regular scorers recently with good support from STEVE WHITE, a former Luton and Charlton man who arrived from Bristol Rovers this season. JIMMY GILLIGAN (ex-Watford and Grimsby) is another close season signing whom we may see up front today while BRYAN WADE (ex-Trowbridge and Bath) may also be seen up front in this, his second season at the County Ground.

In midfield CHRIS KAMARA, who has had two spells each with both Portsmouth and Swindon, and former apprentice CHARLIE HENRY provide plenty of experience and have been joined recently by former Manchester United junior ALAN McLOUGH-LIN. TIM PARKIN is a new signing from Bristol Rovers doing well in defence this season and snatching the occasional goal. He may be linking up with MARK JONES, another recent newcomer in the centre with our former player DAVID HOCKADAY and LEIGH BARNARD (from Portsmouth in 1982) on the flanks and former Manchester United, England Youth cap FRASER DIGBY in goal. Another former Manchester United man PETER COYNE may be up front or in midfield today - he has snatched a number of goals recently.



### AMATEUR SCENE

Probably the best Alliance League record is held by 2nd Division King Edward F.C. The squad is completed by Paul Stone who can fill any number of positions created when injury

befalls his team mates. A real stalwart is the regular linesman Stuart Taylor who is another one of the club determined to reach the Premier Division as quickly as possible.

Pool's commercial manager Geoff Warburton is in charge of 4th Division Tangerine Nite Spot who recently gained their first point and whose performances lately have shown a vast improvement over early season.

### SEASIDERS SCRAP BOOK

#### BLACKPOOL FAIL TO KEEP THE PACE . . . .

September 11th, 1954 saw Aston Villa visit Bloomfield Road, with a solitary goal from PACE setting up Villa's victory and Blackpools gloom as they were firmly rooted to the foot of the First Division. A crowd of 31,417 saw this match which saw Blackpool fail to win the points and take them off the bottom of the table which they shared with Sheffield United. This defeat was Blackpools fifth successive defeat, their third at home, with only one club having a worse record – that of Middlesbrough, who were languishing at the foot of the Second Division with just one point from 7 matches. Blackpool had a record of Played 6, Won 1, Drawn 0, Lost 5, with a goals tally of seven For and thirteen Against.

League leaders Wolves continued their fine season with two more points in a fine 3-1 away win at Charlton where 32,340 saw Slater, Swinbourne and Smith score Wolves' goals. Joining them as leaders were Manchester United, both clubs being on eleven points, Matt Busby's Babes were still maintaining the pressure on the Wolves with a point at Bolton in a match which fell below pre-match expectations. Wolves however, were leaders through a better goal average. The cup holders West Bromwich Albion gave Preston a bit of a jolt with their 2-0 victory which took them onto ten points and into fourth place with Manchester City in third position, who could only draw that afternoon with Chelsea. Bert Trautmann made his 200th League appearance for the Manchester club. In a devastating twenty-minute spell during the second half, Arsenal thrashed Sheffield United at Highbury in front of 41,679 fans. Roper and Tapscott scored two in a minute, with Lishman keeping up his record on the season, of scoring in all his six matches to that date, Arsenal ran out 4-0 winners. Fulham's Bedford Jezzard has also managed to have his name on the scoresheet in every match so far too, and his goal against Notts County helped to take the London side to the top of the Second Division in the 3-1 win.

Also in the Second Division, Stoke City lost their unbeaten record at home to Rotherham, who moved into second position in the table through winning the match at the Potteries 2-1. Poor Middlesbrough, they failed to get away from the bottom of the table due to another failure at home,

that afternoon to Luton Town, who moved into the top five position after beating Boro 2-0, 18,000 people saw Luton's Turner and Davies score the all-important goals. Liverpool, who were relegated along with Middlesbrough the previous season, were not doing too well up to that date either, they too suffered a defeat that afternoon, going down by the odd goal in seven at Blackburn Rovers. 29,200 people turned out to watch an exciting match. Mooney, Briggs and two for Quigley scored the Rovers goals with Liddell and Evans (2) for Liverpool. Goals were also plentiful at Elland Road were Leeds United where entertaining Swansea Town. 21,000 people saw Nightingale score a hat-trick of goals to send the home side well on their way to a 5-2 win, Kefoot and Brook scored the remaining Leeds goals with Ivor Allchurch and Jones scoring for the Welsh club. Nottingham Forest, who were also languishing in the bottom four of the table, never really recovered from two early goals by Law and Clarke in the first thirteen minutes of their home match against Bury, and went down 3-2 despite a brave attempt to recover from such an early set-back. In the Southern Section of the Third Division, Coventry City continued to set the pace at the top of the division with a 2-1 win at Torquay, but good wins by both Queens Park Rangers and Leyton Orient narrowed the gap a little. Rangers winning 2-0 at home to Newport County and Orient by the same scoreline away at Shrewsbury. Bottom club Walsall managed to hold Millwall to a 1-1 home draw.

In the Third Division Northern Section, leaders Scunthorpe managed to overcome third from bottom club Barrow away from home, 6,123 people saw Brown, Haigh and Gregory score goals to give United a deserved 3-1 win. Pushing hard on their heels in second position was Bradford City, who managed to bring both points back home from their travels to York, Chew scored the only goal of the match for Bradford, 9,225 saw that match, Oldham Athletic, also struggling in the lower half of the table that season, travelled up to Yorkshire to play Halifax Town, a club constantly in the news due to financial difficulties, and that season in the position of being in second from bottom position, 6,000 saw a drab 0-0 drawn match, but a valuable point for the Lancashire side. Accrington Stanley also travelled that day, they met Mansfield Town at the Field Mill ground and despite being a goal behind at half time, came away with a point from a 2-2 draw. Other Lancashire based clubs playing in the Third Division that day were Rochdale and Southport. 'dale enjoyed a good afternoon's football at Spotland by beating Tranmere Rovers by 2-0 in front of 4,313 people, while Southport went down at home to Barnsley by 2-0, 4,095 saw both goals being scored during the first period.

In the Central League, Blackpool's reserve team travelled to the Midlands to play Aston Villa's reserve, it proved a bad day all round for Bloomfield Road, as our reserves also fell by 2-0.

Today's visitors to Bloomfield Road, Swindon Town, were playing in Division Three, Southern section that afternoon, they were in ninth position in their league after the days results, with eight points from seven matches. That afternoon they entertained Aldershot, a crowd of 9,949 turned up to see Swindon win the match by a solitary first half goal from Hunter.



Every time you read this column you inevitably read about finance or more to the point the lack of it. The need for a football club like Blackpool to run fund raising activities in conjunction with soccer is of vital importance.

Should we gain promotion into the Second Division the need for extra funds will be of paramount importance.

Abroad the situation is not quite the same. If you were to visit say Barcelona or Real Madrid your admission charge alone would be a minimum of £6 for a terrace ticket and up to £25 for a seat. Following Aldershot's recent gate for the Cup tie I am sure that we would not be hearing the cheers from the paddocks and stands if we were to ask you to pay £9 to stand and £11 to sit at our remaining big games this season and we would have a larger crowd outside the front of the club holding a demonstration.

The answer is you obviously would not pay this so this is why I ask you to continually support our fund raising events. The Lifeline scheme has attracted over 850 members but I am sure you could all spread the word around the town so that we could reach the first magic figure of 1000. This would increase weekly prize money and the end of year jackpot whilst helping to increase the fund which is steadily building up.

I would also like to see more people coming forward to sell the club's lottery tickets. Over the last twelve months the lottery has paid out more than £60,000 in prize money and many people have collected prizes worth winning.

Our latest winner, Mrs. Sandford of Bela Grove was doubly lucky by winning £100 the week before Christmas and then last weekend followed this up with a £1,000 prize.
