



UNTIL this season, we had never played Swindon Town in League Football. They were relegated to the Fourth Division in 1982 at the same time as we were promoted to the Third Division. Today they are making their first visit to Springfield Park and what an important occasion it is. After their 2-0 win at home against Bolton last Tuesday, Swindon are now third in the table with 66 points. They have two matches in hand of Bournemouth and Middlesbrough above them, which makes Swindon potential League leaders. Our excellent win against Notts County on Tuesday has kept us in the promotion race, especially in view of the games we have in hand. These games have got to be won if we are to maintain our interest and today's game is therefore one of the most important of the season. When we played at Swindon on Sunday the 5th October, we were only just coming out of a bad spell and we lost 3-1. Tuesday's fine game here against Notts County should have restored full confidence and our boys need no extra motivation today. The stage is set for a great sporting occasion with vital points at stake. We hope you will give the team your full vocal support and show them that you are solidly behind them in the promotion struggle.

As a result of our wonderful run in the F.A. Cup, we are now equipped with a new television platform high in the Main Stand, together with facilities for closed-circuit television for crowd supervision. This is all part of our build-up for football in the top divisions, which is our aim. We hope we shall be rewarded with adequate support by the public in our efforts to keep Wigan in a prominent place in the nation's main sport.

The attitude of our lads on the night was first class and nothing less than that for today's game against Swindon will be good enough to get us the result required to keep us in line for promotion.


The old cliche of a six pointer with no thought of before today's game and it is important maximum points are taken from the teams above us to close the small gap.


With the talent already in the side anything less than the above mentioned player would not of been good enough.



Wigan treated Macclesfield with a respect they didn't deserve and the Silkmen responded with a display totally lacking all the qualities they possessed only a couple of seasons before. What made Athletics failure to achieve total involvement harder to take was the injury of Macc Keeper Wilf Hall after half an hour. He hobbled around painfully for the rest of the match and a shot more than a yard to either side would have beaten him. It took a Joe Fletcher header a minute from half time to prise the points away from Macclesfield. Rising unchallenged to meet a Graham Oates corner, he powered the ball just under the bar and well away from the stranded Hall. This was to be Fred Willder's last game for Wigan. Playing for Macc was Dave Lyon who joined Athletic for the 73/74 season.

10 YEARS AGO

Latics slipped to their first league defeat since New Years Day against a formidable Northwich side. It was a hard, torrid affair played on a sticky pitch made worse by continuous rain. The Wigan attack which had been so effective in the past few matches never slipped into gear against the biggest defence in the league. It was obvious that one goal would settle the match and so it turned out. Thirteen minutes from time, Wigan's defence was left exposed by a break between Morrey and Vickers. Morrey took the ball to the bye-line before crossing for Vickers to "stomach" the ball into the net from two yards. Playing for Vics were former Latics players Phil Jones and Johny King. Frank Corrigan was also in their side and he was to sign for Athletic in March 78 for a four figure fee. 5 YEARS AGO

After early Latics pressure had come to nothing, the Wigan defence was caught square after sixteen minutes as striker Phillips collected a through ball from Showers on the left to beat Roy Tunks with a low drive. Wigan pushed forward at the start of the second half and seemed to have equalised after 55 minutes when Eamon O'Keefe helped Les Bradd's header into the net. However, a linesmans flag came to Herefords rescue. Soon after, new boy Brian Taylor (on loan from Preston) ran onto a perfect Larry Lloyd through ball only to hesistate and fire wide with only keeper Brand to beat. This was to prove costly as minutes later, Hereford defender Price ran from the half way line to beat Tunks to a through ball from his skipper Harvey. Just to emphasise Wigan's bad luck, Peter Houghton hit the inside of the upright before Price made certain for Hereford with his second goal. This was Athletics third successive away defeat but Hereford manager Frank Lord praised Wigan for their willingness to put the accent on attack.

DID YOU KNOW?

Swindon were the last non-league side to reach the FA Cup Semi Finals in 1910 and 1912. They lost 0-2 to Newcastle and 0-1 to Barnsley (after 0-0) Both sides went on to win the cup.

Swindon won the League Cup at Wembley in 1969 beating Arsenal 3-1. Goalscorers for the then 3rd Division side were Smart and Rogers (2). Swindon also won the Anglo-Italian League Cup Winners Cup in 1969 (5-2 on agg v Roma) and then won the Anglo Italian Cup in 1970 beating Napoli 3-0. Swindon hold the record for most points in a season for any division - 102 points gained last season.

John Trollope holds the record number of LeagueAppearances for one club - 770 for Swindon over 21 seasons (1960-80).

Just Vi SWINDON

Swindon Town won their first Football League title last Season as they swept to the Fourth Division Championship under the astute guidance of their Team Manager Lou Macari, the former Scotland, Glasgow Celtic and Manchester United star

In compling a Football League Record of 102 points, Swindon Town passed several previously existing Club records with consummate ease.

Naturally the exploits of last Season attracted several of the leading Clubs to take a definite interest in the immediate future of the diminutive Scot, who had become one of the brightest and most promising young Managers in the Football league.

The Summer months were spent dissuading Coventry City, Leicester City and Glasgow Celtic from adding Lou Macari to their staff. While overtures were received from all three Clubs along with more than a little interest from Spain, it was eventually a compromise that decided the immediate destiny of the popular Scot. After being offered the position of Assistant Manager with Glasgow Celtic, Lou Macari finally settled for remaining as Manager of Swindon Town. While his decision to stay at the County Ground caused disappointment at Parkhead, the home of his former Club, Glasgow Celtic, he renewed his links with the Scottish champions by accepting scouting duties, with emphasis placed on the South of England.

Although interest was centred around the future of Lou Macari, he did not neglect his duties at the County Ground. In preparation for a return to Third Division soccer Lou Macari strengthened his record breaking squad with four signings of merit. Former Watford and Grimsby Town Striker Jimmy Gilligan returned South for a fee of £31,500 while the

payment on Central Defender Tim Parkin, from Bristol Rovers and the highly promising Martin Ling from Exeter City were decided by a July sitting of the Football League Tribunal.

Swindon Town had to pay £27,500 for Tim Parkin, while Exeter City were the recipients of £25,000 for Martin Ling. Former Bristol Rovers Striker Steve White also moved to the County Ground on a free transfer after scoring sixteen goals last Season for the former Eastville Club.

DAVE HOCKADAY (DEFENDER) Born 9.11.57 The versatile former Blackpool player who moved to the County Ground from the Bloomfield Road Club in the close Season of 1983, proved a revelation in the Full Back hole he fulfilled in the second half of last Season. Dave made 34 appearances and three substitute appearances in the Towns championship winning line-up of last Season.

TIM PARKIN (DEFENDER) Born 31.12.57 Joined the County Ground staff

from Bristol Rovers in July for a Football League Tribunal fee of £17,500. The tall commanding Central Defender had made 219 League appearances for Rovers. Tim moved to the Bristol Club from Malmo (Sweden) in August 1987. Rated at £50,000 by Bristol Rovers prior to his move to Swindon, Tim had been 'Player of the year' in successive Seasons with the former Eastville Club. He originally made his Football League debut with Blackburn Rovers for whom he made 13 League appearances.

COLIN CALDERWOOD (CENTRAL DEFENDER) Born 20.1.65 Without doubt Colin proved to be Lou Macari's outstanding signing as he built his championship winning team in the Summer of 1985.

The former Mansfield Town Defender attracted a lot of attention from First Division Clubs last Season with his brilliant displays. Stranraer born, Colin, was the only Swindon Town player to make the 46 maximum League appearances as



Swindon collected their first ever League Championship title. Colin rightfully won the 'Player of the year' award in his first Season with the Club.

CHRIS KAMARA (MIDFIELD) Born 25.12.57 Chris rejoined the Club for a second spell in August 1985 from Brentford for a £12,500 transfer fee. Absent through injury in the first half of last Season the former Portsmouth apprentice made 19 League appearances and one as substitute, scoring one League goal. Chris is one of the few players in the Football League to have played for two League Clubs in different spells - Portsmouth and Swindon.

Chris made 183 First Team appearances in his first spell with the Club. STEVE WHITE (STRIKER) Born 2.1.59 Steve was surprisingly given a free transfer at the end of last Season by Bristol Rovers. After scoring sixteen goals for the former Eastville Club last Season, Lou Macari fought off opposition from several Third Division Clubs to obtain his signature in July.

Steve was in his second spell with Rovers having been transferred to Luton Town for a fee of £200,000 in 1979. He later played for Charlton Athletic before his return to Bristol Rovers.

BRYAN WADE (STRIKER) Born 25.6.63 Bryan made a successful entry into League soccer last Season from Southern League Trowbridge Town.

To have finished with a championship medal in his first Season of full-time soccer was beyond the former Bath City and Trowbridge Town's Strikers wildest dreams.

Bryan's ten League goals from his 31 League appearances, and three as substitute had a significant part in the Town's first ever championship title win.

SPRINGFIELD SCENE

LAST Saturday's Third Division game at Darlington was a bit special for Swindon Town fan John Menham.

It was his 300th consecutive League game, home and away, following his beloved Town.

That would be a great record for any fan, but for one who has to spend his life in a wheelchair it is an incredible one.

Little wonder that Town manager Lou Macari presented him with an inscribed watch earlier this year . . . identical to those given to the players to mark their Fourth Division championship success.

John, 28, saw his first Swindon game in 1969. And he started in style ... it was the League Cun Final at Wembley, when 'Thanks for coming' — Lou

they beat Arsenal 3-1.
It was also his 11th birth-

day that day, March 15. From then, 17 years ago, he has not missed a single home game.

And, during the last ten or so seasons, has missed only a few away.

"He's our greatest fan, so he tells me. But I'd like you to know that he did miss a youth game a couple of weeks ago," said Lou Macari today.



In Reserve

OUT of the last three reserve performances the one at West Bromwich on Wednesday in which we achieved a 3-2 win was not as good as the previous two, where, amazingly, only a point from each fixture was the outcome.

The obvious reason for this was the ability to take the chances created during the West Bromwich match and although not playing that well defensively the three points were deserved.
