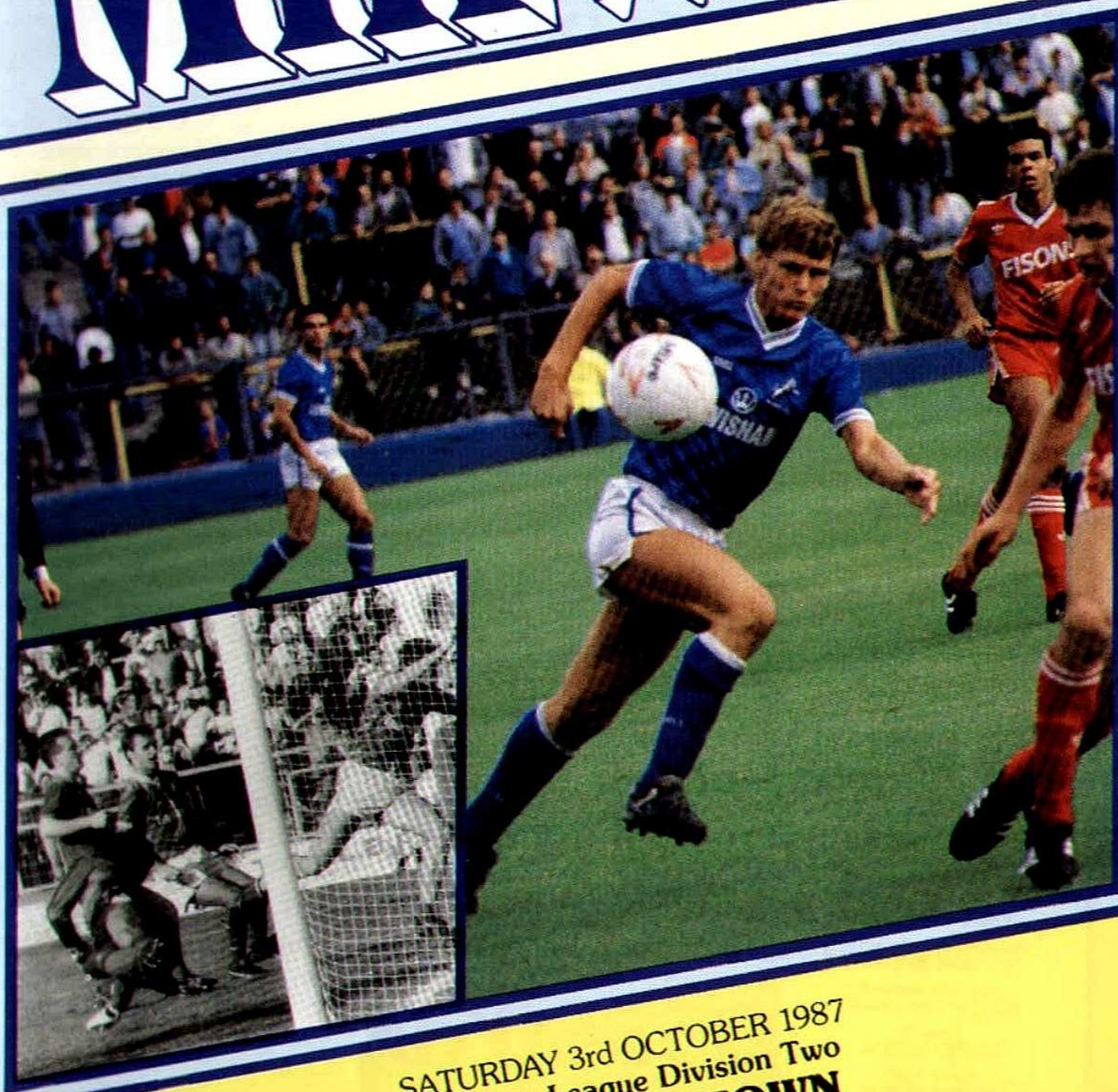

INTRODUCING

BAMBER (Dave) (Forward) b. St. Helens 1.2.59. This much travelled forward played a prominent role in **Swindon's** two promotion seasons (1985/86 and 1986/87). Previously with **Blackpool**, **Coventry**, **Walsall** and **Portsmouth**, Dave joined **Town** from **Pompey** (fee £12,500) in March 1986 and hit 19 goals in League and Cup football last season. League career (end 1986/87): 194 matches, 58 goals.

BARNARD (Leigh) (Midfield) b. 29.10.58. Signed on a free transfer from **Portsmouth** in July 1982, Leigh is currently **Swindon's** longest serving player - an indication of the changes effected since the arrival of Lou Macari. Apart from **Pompey**, **Barnard** has had loan spells at **Peterborough** and **Exeter**. League career (end 1986/87): 282 matches, 30 goals.

BERRY (Steve) (Midfield) b. Gosport 4.4.63. Another former **Portsmouth** player now on **Swindon's** books, Steve started his career at **Fratton Park** and also assisted **Aldershot** (on loan), **Sunderland** and **Newport** before linking up with **Town** in March this year. A virus prevented Berry making his **Swindon** debut until the final League match of last season. League career (end 1986/87): 131 matches, 10 goals.

CALDERWOOD (Colin) (Defender) b. Stranraer 20.1.65. Since his arrival from **Mansfield Town** in July 1985 (fee £27,500), Colin had the distinction of skipping **Swindon** during their two promotion seasons and being an "ever present" during this great period in the Club's history. A target for many of the leading clubs in this country and North of the Border, **Calderwood** is tipped by many judges for eventual Scottish honours. League career (end 1986/87): 192 matches, 3 goals.

COYNE (Peter) (Midfield) b. Manchester 13.11.58. After a promising early start to his career with **Manchester United**, punctuated by two separate spells out of the League with **Aston United** and **Hyde United**, Peter has

played his full part in **Swindon's** recent success since his £5,000 signing from **Hyde** in August 1984. A former England schoolboy international, Coyne, who has an excellent scoring record, also had a long spell with **Crewe Alexandra**. League career (end 1986/87): 240 matches, 78 goals.

DIGBY (Fraser) (Goalkeeper) b. Sheffield 23.4.67. A former **Manchester United** apprentice, Fraser joined **Swindon** from the Old Trafford Club in December 1986 (fee £25,000) and is proving a fine investment. Already honoured by England at schoolboy and youth levels, Digby's outstanding displays last season (his first campaign) won him under-21 honours. League career (end 1986/87): 39 matches.

FOLEY (Steve) (Midfield) b. Liverpool 4.10.62. Another of Lou Macari's close season captures, Steve joined **Swindon** from **Sheffield United** in July 1987 for a Tribunal-decided fee of £35,000. A former **Liverpool** apprentice, Foley actually made his League debut while on loan at **Fulham**. Free transfers took him to **Coventry** and then to **Sheffield United** where he finished top marksman last season with 12 League and Cup goals. League career (end 1986/87): 100 matches, 16 goals.

GITTENS (Jon) (Defender) b. Moseley 22.1.64. Lou Macari's fifth close season signing, Jon joined **Swindon** from **Southampton** in July 1987 for a £40,000 fee. Gittens, who was signed by Saints from **Birmingham** non-league club **Paget Rangers**, had 14 First Division outings for **Southampton** last season and is a former colleague of **Millwall's** George Lawrence. League career (end 1986/87): 18 matches (no goals).

HAMMOND (Nicky) (Goalkeeper) b. Essex 7.9.67. Signed from **Arsenal** on a free transfer in July 1987, Nicky's only League experience was with **Bristol Rovers** last season when he made three appearances while on loan. League career (end 1986/87): 3 matches.

HENRY (Charlie) (Midfield) b. Acton 13.2.62. A utility player, capable of playing in many positions, Charlie finished top scorer with 18 goals

in **Swindon's** 1986/86 promotion season but struggled for good form last season when he had brief loan periods with **Torquay** and **Northampton**. League career (end 1986/87): 196 matches, 24 goals.

HOCKADAY (Dave) (Defender) b. Billingham 9.11.57. A former midfielder or winger, Dave, who joined **Swindon** from **Blackpool** in August 1983, switched to full back during season 1985/86. An influential member of last season's promotion campaign, Hockaday is fast approaching 300 League appearances. League career (end 1986/87): 282 matches, 31 goals.

JONES (Mark) (Midfield) b. Berinsfield 26.9.61. A £25,000 signing in October 1986 from **Oxford United** where he was familiar with success, Mark proved a lucky omen for **Swindon** last season enjoying his most successful campaign with 9 goals from 40 League outings. League career (end 1986/87): 169 matches, 16 goals.

KAMARA (Chris) (Midfield) b. Middlesbrough 25.12.57. Now in his second spell with **Swindon**, who he rejoined from **Brentford** in August 1985 (fee £12,500), Chris also had two spells with **Portsmouth** - his first club. Made his 400th League appearance, appropriately against his home town club, **Middlesbrough** last season. League career (end 1986/87): 435 matches, 60 goals.

KELLY (John) (Midfield) b. Bebbington 20.10.60. Snapped up by Lou Macari from **Chester** in July 1987 (fee £15,000), John's career started with **Tranmere Rovers** before his moves to **Preston** (£35,000) and **Chester**. League career (end 1986/87): 279 matches, 53 goals.

KING (Phil) (Defender) b. Bristol 28.12.67. Joining **Swindon** from **Torquay** in March 1987 (fee £12,500), it meant that Phil had served three clubs in three seasons having started his League career with **Exeter** (1984/85) before a £3,000 move to **Torquay** (1986/87). Spent a brief spell training with **Tottenham** last season. League career (end 1986/87): 72 matches, 3 goals.

McLOUGHLIN (Alan) (Defender) b. Manchester 20.4.67. Alan joined **Swindon** on a free transfer in July 1986, from **Manchester United**,

for whom he did not make the League team, and had a period on loan with **Torquay** last season. League career (end 1986/87): 25 outings (no goals).

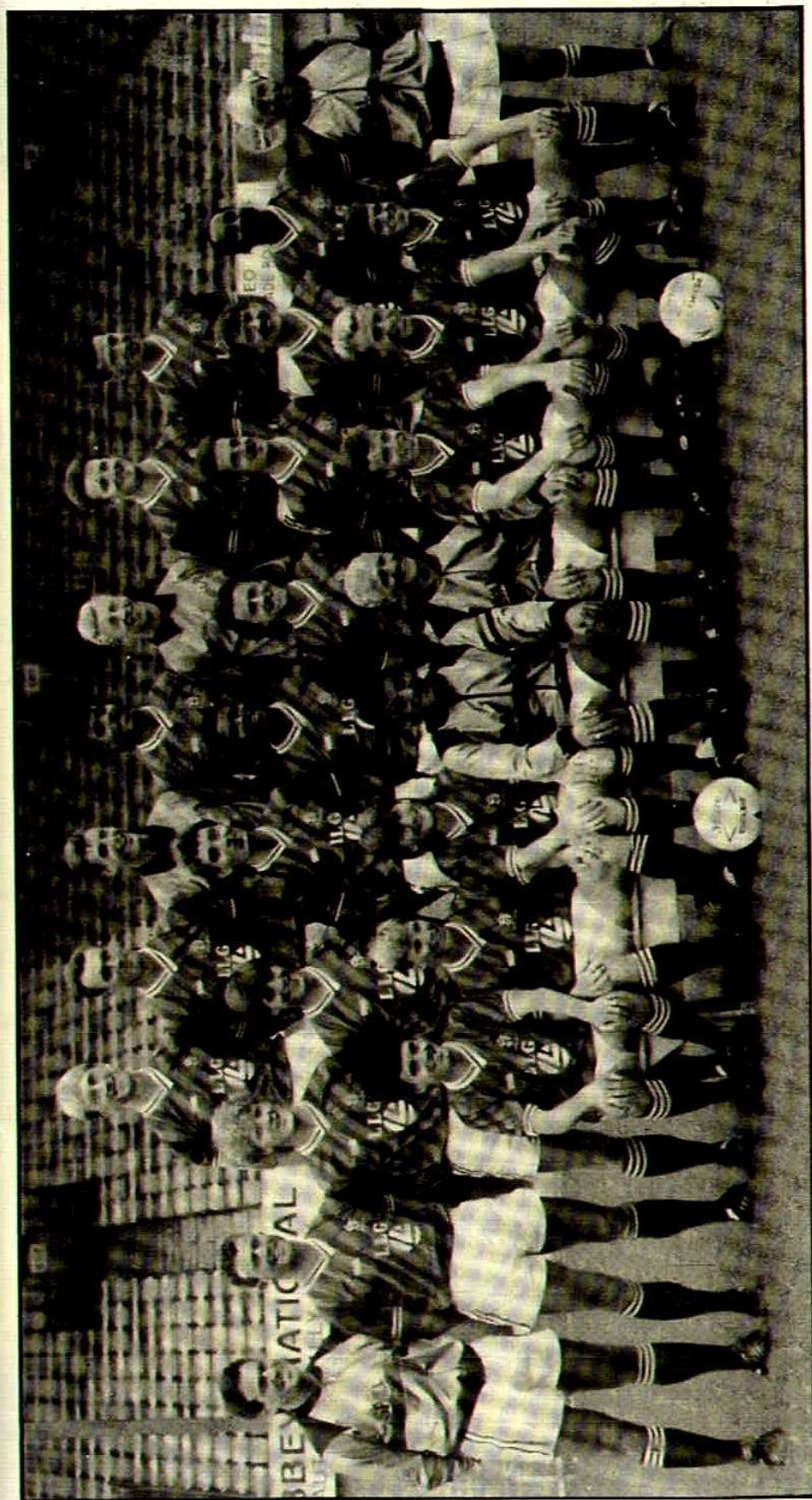
O'REGAN (Kieran) (Defender) b. Cork 9.11.63. Signed from **Brighton** on a free transfer in August 1987, Kieran has won four full "caps" for **Eire**. League career (end 1986/87): 86 matches, 2 goals.

PARKIN (Tim) (Defender) b. Penrith 31.12.57. Tim joined **Swindon** from **Bristol Rovers** in July 1986 (fee £27,500) and was a prominent member of **Town's** promotion squad last season. Parkin, whose career started with **Blackburn** had a spell with **Swedish club Malmo** before joining **Bristol Rovers**. League career (end 1986/87): 251 matches, 13 goals.

QUINN (Jimmy) (Defender) b. Belfast 18.11.59. "Capped" 13 times by **Northern Ireland**, Jimmy rejoined **Swindon** from **Blackburn** in December 1986 (fee £50,000) and to say this happening was significant is an understatement. Quinn rediscovered his scoring touch, producing 9 goals in 22 League outings last season; **Town** were promoted; and Quinn's sensational start to this season (11 goals to date) has rocketed **Swindon** into fifth place, immediately above **Millwall**. Ironically when Quinn left for **Blackburn** (fee £32,000), three years ago, it was Lou Macari's first transfer deal for **Swindon**. League career (end 1986/87): 142 matches, 36 goals.

WADE (Bryan) (Forward) b. Bath 25.6.63. Signed from **Trowbridge Town** for a small fee two years ago, Bryan has made the big jump to League soccer very successfully, scoring many vital goals in **Swindon's** two promotion seasons. League career (end 1986/87): 57 matches, 18 goals.

WHITE (Steve) (Forward) b. Chipping Sodbury 2.1.59. Steve has always been a good target man so it was of some surprise that he was allowed to move from **Bristol Rovers** to **Swindon Town** on a free transfer in July 1986. And what a gift he has proved! Apart from heading both the League and Combination scoring charts last season, he wrote his name into **Swindon's** club history by netting the two goals in **Town's** sudden death 2-0 play-off victory over **Gillingham** at **Selhurst Park** last season.

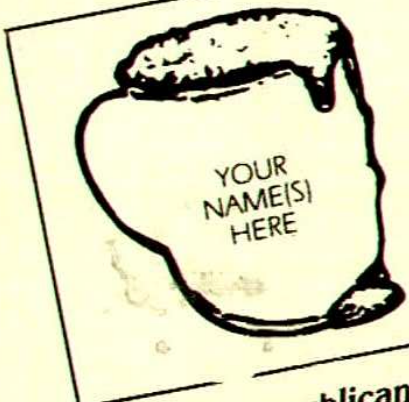
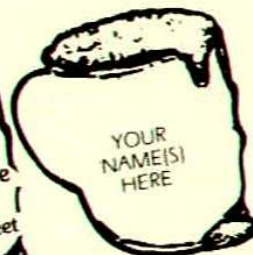
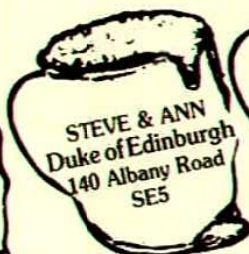

A to Z

Part 28 – by Tony Pullein

SPARHAM, Sean. Sean joined the club as a youngster and developed in the youth team. He made a successful first-team debut at left-back against **Leyton Orient** in the first round of the Littlewoods Cup in August. He did well enough to hold his place in subsequent weeks.

League record: Millwall 5 aps. (Up to and including September 19)

SUMMERS, Johnny. Johnny was big-hearted, hard-hitting winger who was a constant danger to all defences. He didn't get many chances with his first club **Fulham** and it was at **Norwich** where he began to make his name as a goalscoring winger. Johnny came to The Den in May 1954 and delighted fans with his exciting wing performances for two-and-a-half years before moving on to **Charlton**. It was at The Valley that he made his biggest headlines, twice scoring give goals from the wing. In one famous match against **Huddersfield**, **Charlton** were trailing 1-5 at one stage. Aided by Johnny's five goals they turned that into a sensational 7-6 victory! And **Charlton** had only ten men. When at his prime he was struck by illness and he died in 1962 at the age of 33.

League record: Fulham 4 aps.; Norwich 71 aps., 33 gls.; Millwall 92 aps., 41 gls.; Charlton 171 aps., 100 gls.

SUMMERSBY, Roy. Roy was a wing-half who developed in the junior teams at The Den. He made his League debut during the 1951/52 campaign and enjoyed several runs in the first-team over the following five seasons. After transferring to **Crystal Palace** in December 1958 he achieved a more permanent place in League soccer holding a first-team place for five years before signing for **Portsmouth** in 1963.

League record: Millwall 87 aps., 14 gls.; Crystal Palace 176 aps., 79 gls.; Portsmouth 12 aps., 1 gl.

TAGG, Tony. Tony served his apprenticeship with **Q.P.R.** and made a few League appearances for them during the 1975/76 season. Further opportunities did not present themselves so he was happy to join **Millwall** in the summer of 1977. He made several appearances in our senior side the following season and then enjoyed three full seasons as a fixture in the Lions' defence. Tony moved on to **Wimbledon** in

1982 but after only a few weeks he suffered a knee injury that was to end his career.

League record: Q.P.R. 4 aps.; Millwall 130(3) aps., 9 gls.; Wimbledon 14 aps.

TERRY, Pat. Pat was one of football's happy wanderers, rarely staying very long in one place. He served nine clubs and scored well over 200 goals but it was here at The Den where he won one of his rare medals. Pat was playing for **Eastbourne** when **Charlton** spotted him. He didn't get many first-team opportunities at The Valley, though, so in 1956 he stepped down into Third Division football with **Newport**. There he produced early signs of his goalscoring potential and in February 1958 he moved on to **Swansea**. It was after joining Fourth Division **Gillingham** in October 1958 that the goals started to flow. He was on two occasions the Gills' leading scorer before transferring to **Northampton** in 1961. **Millwall** were chasing promotion from the Third Division when we signed Pat in February 1962. He scored 13 goals in only 17 games in helping us to the divisional Championship. For the following two seasons he was our leading scorer with 18 and 10 League goals before the wanderlust got hold of him again in 1964 when he moved on to **Reading**. He became a top scorer at Elm Park and later served **Swindon** and **Brentford**.

League record: Charlton 4 aps., 1 gl.; Newport 55 aps., 30 gls.; Swansea 17 aps., 9 gls.; Gillingham 109 aps., 60 gls.; Northampton 24 aps., 10 gls.; Millwall 97 aps., 41 gl.; Reading 99 aps., 41 gls.; Swindon 60(1) aps., 23 gls.; Brentford 29 aps., 12 gls.

THIRD DIVISION. The club commenced its League career as one of the founder members of the Third Division (South) in 1920, remaining in that section until winning the Championship in 1928. Relegated back again in 1934, it took the Lions four years to regain Second Division status. Our next spell of Third Division football started in 1948 but ten years later we dropped into the newly-formed Fourth Division. In 1962 we returned to Division Three but within two years, we were back in the basement. After winning promotion in 1965, we remained in Division Three for only one season before moving up into Division Two. Following relegation in 1975, we won promotion at the first attempt. Moving down again in 1979, the Lions remained a Third Division club until our most recent promotion in 1985.

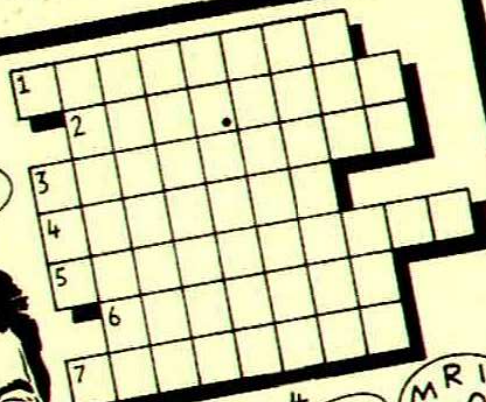

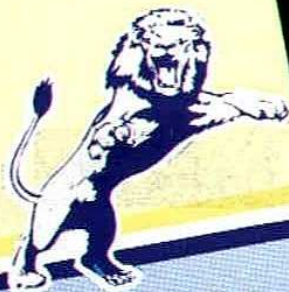

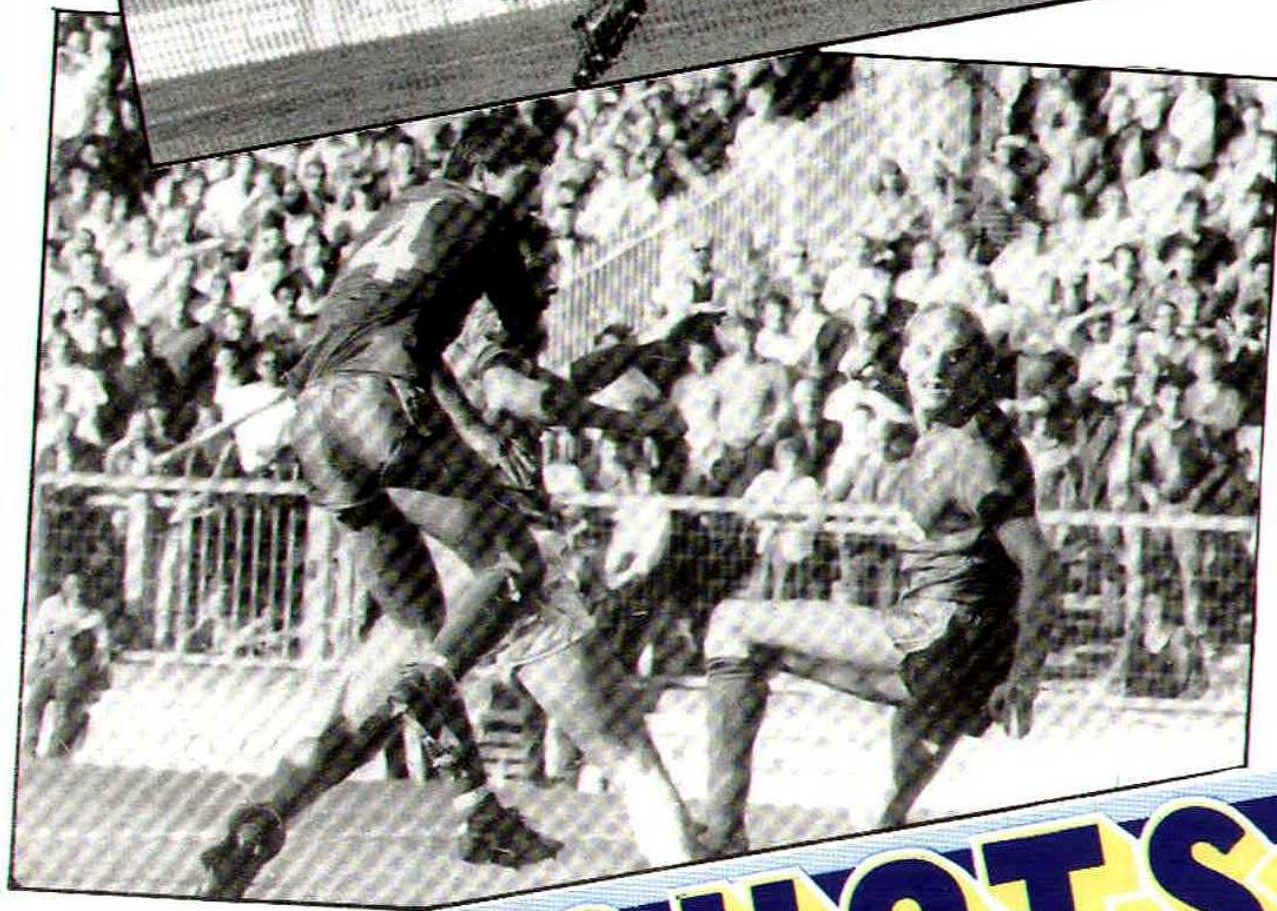

ALAN McLEARY

ALAN McLeary's rise from a schoolboy on The Den terraces to Millwall's club captain is the sort of story the 'Roy of The Rovers' script writers would be proud of.

And as the 22-year-old defender develops into one of the Lions' most valuable assets, McLeary's success is further evidence (as if any was needed) of the value of **Millwall's** youth development policy.

"I used to stand on the terraces with my mates and they still come to all the home games," admitted Alan, who was spotted playing for South London's Under-16 side.

"I was linked with a couple of other clubs as a schoolboy, but obviously as a **Millwall** supporter I jumped at the chance to join the Lions.

"Peter Anderson was in charge at the time, although it was Barry Kitchenner who gave me my First Team chance during his spell as caretaker-manager.

"I was still eligible for the Youth Team at the time and when George Graham took over I had a long spell in the Reserves before coming back in for the tail-end of the 1984-85 season."

It wasn't until the following season that Alan really established himself as a First Team regular with 32 appearances and three goals as the Lions finished in ninth place in the Second Division.

Despite his stylish, accomplished performances at the heart of the defence it was still something of a shock when John Docherty offered him the Club Captaincy towards the end of last season.

"It was quite a surprise because it wasn't as though I was one of the most experienced players," he admitted. "But when Les Briley got injured the manager offered me the job and I was happy to accept.

"I do enjoy the extra responsibility. It's funny but I was captain of my school side and of South London, and it's just something that seems to be good for me as a player."

McLeary got a baptism of fire as Docherty's young, inexperienced side struggled to preserve their precious Second Division status — in the face of a nightmare injury crisis.

"It was a difficult season for the club and for the manager," explained Alan. "When John took charge there were a lot of experienced players who for one reason or another didn't want to play for the club and that meant he had to rely on a lot of youngsters.

"It was a tricky time, but we reached eighth position at one stage and if we hadn't picked up so many injuries and suspensions towards the end of the season I think we would have finished a lot higher.

"I could understand the fans' frustration, but there were a lot of things at the Club that had to be put right and under the circumstances I felt we had a pretty good season.

"Hopefully we have now got the sort of strength in depth that you need if you are going to be successful and once all the new players have settled in I am confident we will do well."

Unfortunately Alan's hopes of helping Millwall established themselves amongst the early season pacemakers were shattered when he limped out of the Littlewoods Cup tie with **Orient** with badly torn knee ligaments.

"It was very frustrating," he admitted. "With the new signings the manager had made during the summer I was really excited about our chances and to get injured so early on was particularly disappointing.

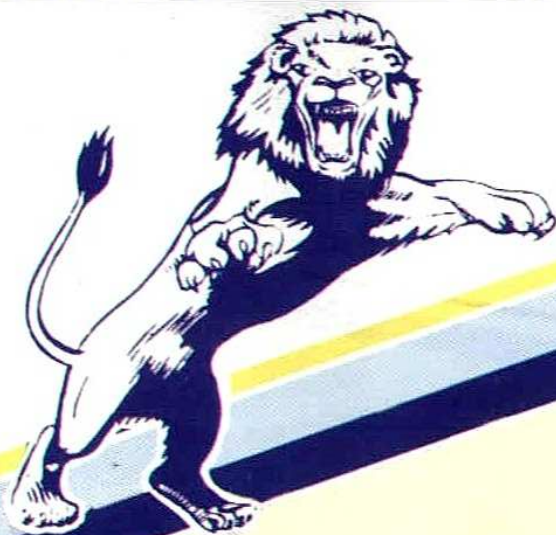
"I am not a particularly good watcher. I prefer to be out there getting on with it, but I have seen our last few games and the lads have got off to an encouraging start.

"I think their performance at **Queens Park Rangers** showed what they are capable of and obviously people like **ALAN WALKER** and **STEVE WOOD** are going to make it as difficult as possible for me to get my place back."

Alan began the long haul back to full match fitness with a run out during **Millwall's** Reserve Team game against **Arsenal**, and hoped to be back in the First Team reckoning in time for today's game.

"I am not going to rush things though," stressed Alan, whose enforced absence from the First Team has at least given him more time to be with his wife Karen and 14-month old daughter Nichola.

"Injuries like these can easily flare up again, and after all the hard work I've put in it would be stupid to overdo things and risk being out for another month."

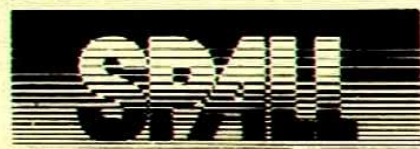

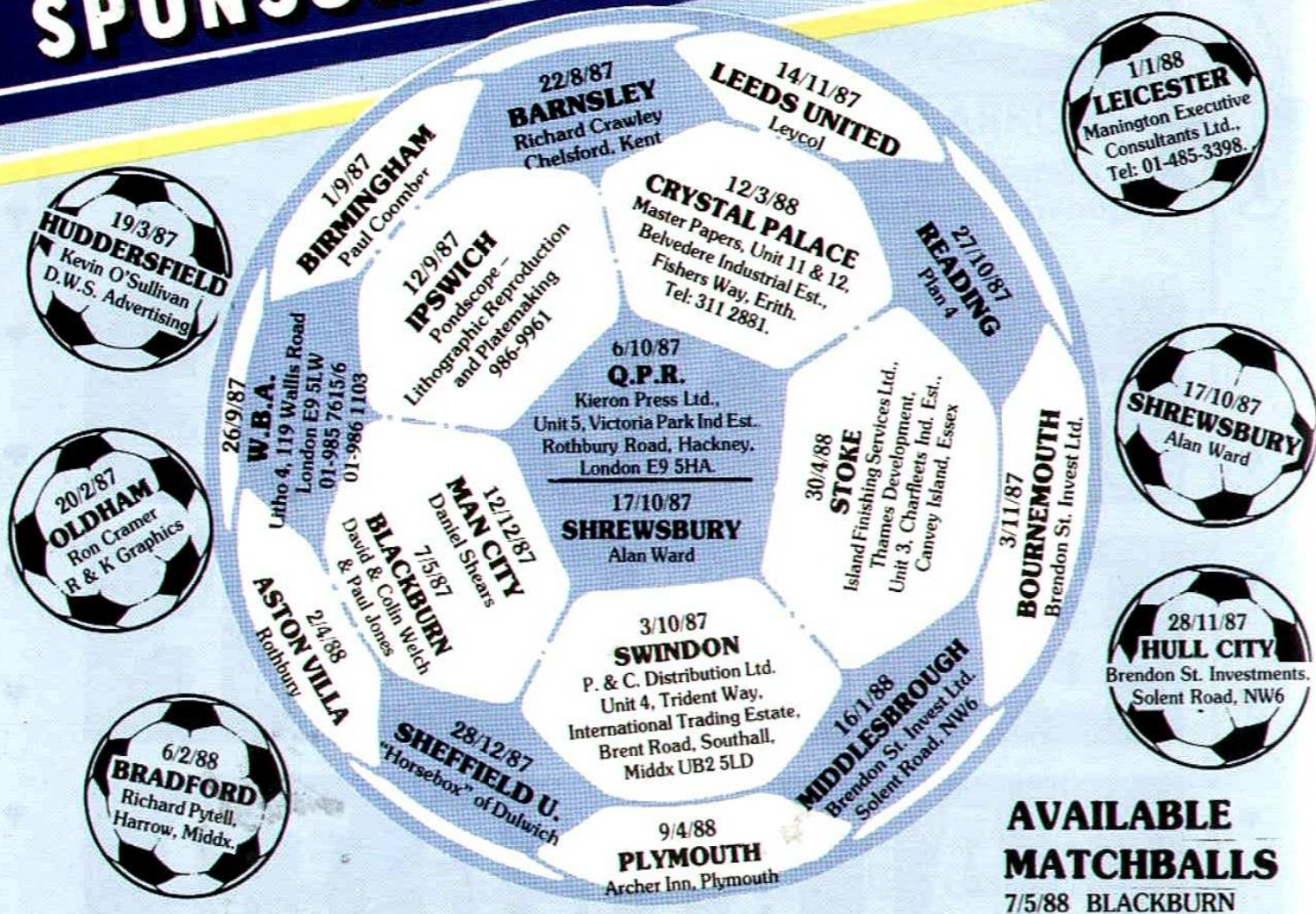

QUALITY COMES FIRST

SCENE

HULL City's impressive start to the season has surprised a lot of people – but not manager **Brian Horton**.

The unfashionable Boothferry Park club clawed their way clear of the relegation zone last season with a string of victories which left Horton convinced that they could make an impact on this year's promotion race.

"I thought at the end of last season that on our day we were as good as any side in the Second Division," he explained. *"But what we really needed was to improve our consistency."*

Horton, who guided the club to promotion from the Third Division during his first season in charge, has picked up plenty of useful tips during a playing career that included spells under **Alan Mullery** at **Brighton** and **David Pleat** at **Luton**.

And he is realistic enough to know that the only way a club like **Hull** can survive is by building up a successful youth policy.

"David Pleat always used to say 'if a player is good enough he is old enough', and that's a philosophy that I have adopted since I took over this job," said Horton.

Horton's faith in his youngsters has paid off with an impressive away win over arch rivals **Leeds United** and home victories over **Oldham**, **Aston Villa** and **Bournemouth**.

In fact, **Hull's** start has been so impressive that Horton even decided to drop his pre-season interest in unsettled **Charlton** striker **Jim Melrose**.

Instead Melrose, who commuted to Selhurst from his Macclesfield home, has been handed the task of reviving **Leeds United's** promotion ambitions after their goal-starved start to the season.

Elland Road boss **Billy Bremner** paved the way for Melrose's arrival by selling striker **Keith Edwards** to **Aberdeen** for £60,000 – and that means something of a reunion for both players.

Melrose will be linking up with his old **Charlton** pals **Mark Aizlewood** and **John Pearson**, while Edwards rejoins his former **Sheffield United** manager **Keith Edwards** who is now in charge at **Pittordrie**.

Bremner went straight back into the transfer market to sign **Liverpool's** reserve midfielder **Kenny de Mange** for £75,000.

And hard-up **Manchester City** caused quite a stir when they splashed out a cool £100,000 on **Liverpool** defender **Mark Seagraves** – despite the fact that he never made it into the first team at **Anfield**.

Maine Road boss **Mel Machin** knows what he is buying though – he was assistant manager at **Norwich** when the former England Schoolboy international spent a month on loan at **Carrow Road** last season.

Sheffield United, struggled at the wrong end of the table, face an uphill battle to keep hold of their jet-paced midfielder **Peter Beagrie**.

West Ham, **Luton** and **Arsenal** are amongst the clubs regularly reportedly interested in Beagrie, though the asking price will have soared from the £50,000 that **Sheffield** paid **Middlesbrough** for his services.

And **Middlesbrough** manager **Bruce Rioch** can also expect a phone call or two from the big boys before long, with Ayresome Park youngsters **Tony Mowbray**, **Gary Pallister** and **Bernie Slaven** all attracting rave reviews.

We're ringing the changes with a new telephone number for Lewisham Council's main buildings.

But there's a whole lot more involved than just a seven figure switchover. The new system will speed up communications inside the Town Hall and other Council buildings, and will give a speedier service for people ringing from outside. Operators will be able to pinpoint officers far quicker, and calls can be transferred to other departments without having to go through the switchboard.

The new number is 695 6000, bringing Lewisham Town Hall and other buildings such as Riverdale Offices in line with the Housing Department at Leigate, which was converted to the new number earlier this year.

The old 690 4343 system will be given a well-deserved retirement, at least 10 years after it should have been put out to grass.

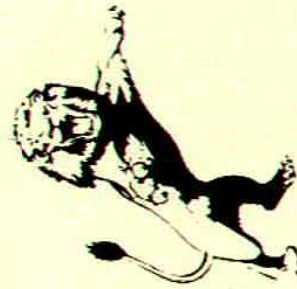

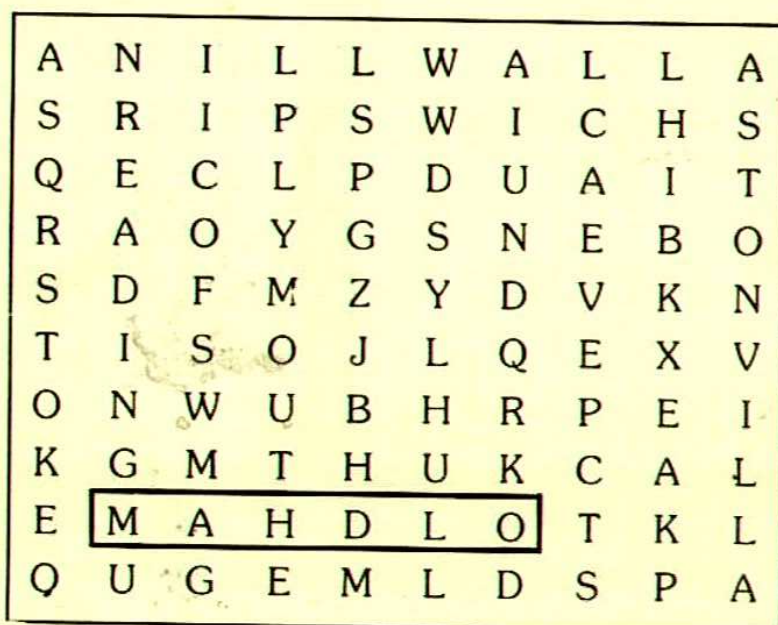
