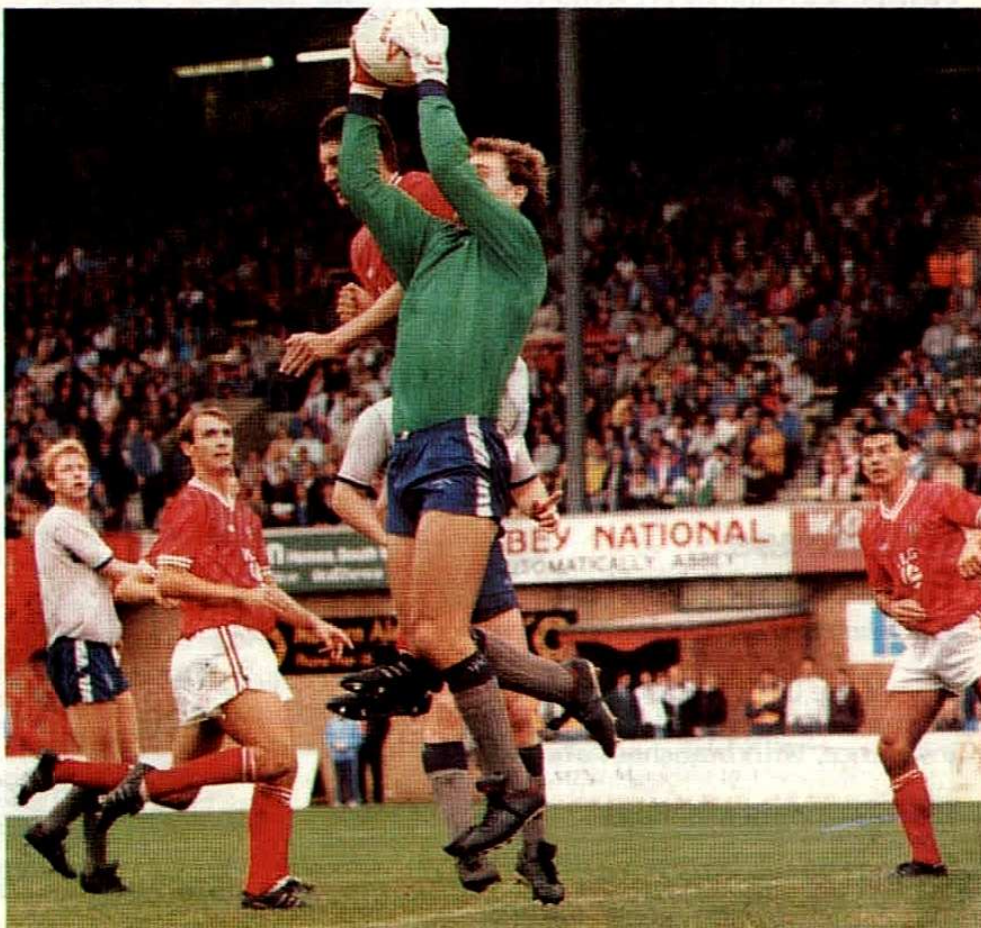

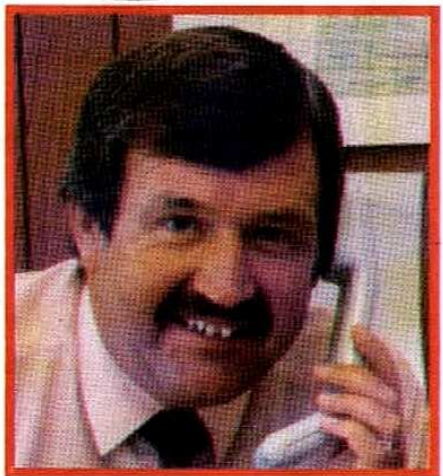

You all probably know that we have recently added 'Chic' Bates to the County Ground coaching staff. 'Chic' who was, until recently, Manager of Shrewsbury Town will be able to provide a wealth of experience to our staff.

It is a well known fact that a lot of successful Clubs have, over the years, had a long line of continuity on their staff, men who have years of service with their Club. Liverpool are a perfect example. Only last week Watford admitted they would have been wiser to perhaps have offered some of their former Managers aides the vacancy that arose when Graham Taylor moved to Aston Villa. They reverted to this policy last week when Steve Harrison was brought back from the Midlands to take over from Dave Bassett.

Off the field Dave King, the Club Secretary, Doug Buswell, our Commercial Manager, and Doug Woodman, who manages the Sports and Souvenir Shops, have spent most of their years in connection with this Club. In my opinion these type of people serve the



Club better. They have a natural interest which can only be to everyones advantage.

It is far better to have this type of person around a Club than people who have no long-lasting interest in their place of employment. As I have already stated, Liverpool prove this. 'Chic' will add a new voice and opinion and make a change for players used to the same voices day after day.

We were unable to shift the Football Association disciplinary committee with regard to the suspension of Bobby Barnes. My thoughts on this subject have been well publicised and there is nothing I can add to them. Players now know that they cannot gesture or speak out of turn, however innocent the

remark. It is advisable to say little to officials or to gesture with them. Sad, but it is a fact, Bob gestured in innocence and was punished.

I would like to welcome John Hollins and his Chelsea team here tonight. John receives more than his fair share of adverse press comment. I have never really understood why, he never appears to have done anything wrong. John is another example of a long-serving Club servant.

We have had three or four players out of action recently with injuries, Fraser Digby, Mark Jones, Leigh Barnard, Peter Coyne and Alan McLoughlin. We do not possess a large squad and it is important that these players soon resume full fitness so that we can complete the season with a sufficient number of players to competitively select from. Of course, Mark will not play this season but I will keep you up-dated on his condition as he progresses.

### Wednesday January 6th

Former Swindon Town player and Shrewsbury Town Manager 'Chic' Bates rejects Lou Macari's offer to join the Town staff. 'Chic' instead accepts an offer to link up with Birmingham City. This move will mean that his family will not have to leave the Midlands.

Despite the atrocious weather conditions the Combination match goes ahead at Calne. Once again our Reserve team prove that their away form holds them in good stead at home! They record a 3-1 win against Charlton Athletic. Despite the heavy conditions they overcome the elements and a visiting team that includes former Tottenham Hotspur favourites Garth Crooks and Paul Miller. Goals from Bryan Wade, Kieran O'Regan and Adrian Viveash prove too much for the South London Club.

Agreement is reached with the Football Combination and Portsmouth to play next weeks fixture at Calne. The kind actions of the Western League Club have again helped the Town out of a dilemma with the concerted fixtures in the rainy period!

Palace announce that it is the date of the Simod Cup Final and they have every intention of being at Wembley. Even so, if the situation arises the Second Division fixture will have to be postponed.

Cup tie referee Ken Warmsley plans an overnight stay at Swindon in preparation for the Norwich Cup tie. Based in Blackpool he will be on hand for any rapid deterioration in the weather conditions.

Finals of the competition.

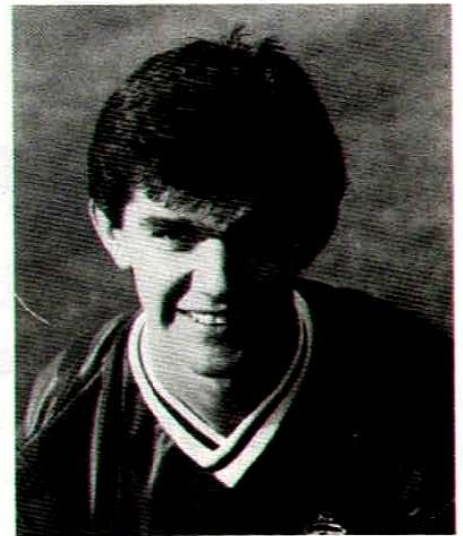

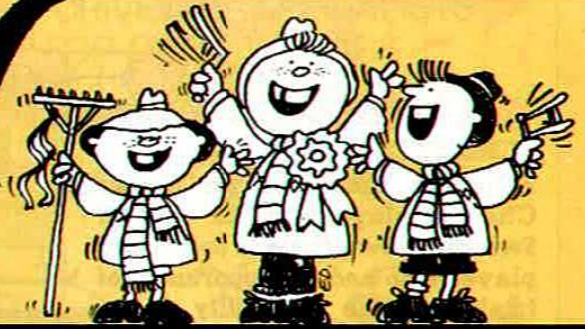

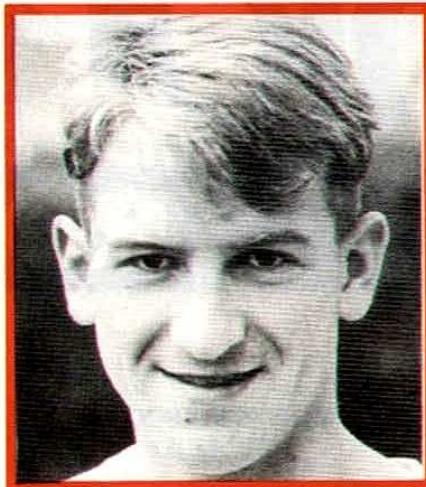


**Although there are no former Chelsea players on the staff of Swindon Town there is one young player who had the opportunity of trials and the possibility of impressing the Stamford Bridge Club. Enough, to add him to their never ending list of home-produced talent – his name is Gary Marshall.**

Gary, has been on trial with the Town since the beginning of this season. A frustrating time for the former Coventry City trainee as he explained, "I just hope I will be given the opportunity of a years contract." Frustration is now a new experience for the Stroud born player. "After being a member of Coventry City's F.A. Youth Cup winning team, and being part of a Club that went to Wembley and captured the F.A. Cup, to be told you were no longer wanted prepared me for most things."

Gary is one of the long production line of young talent that has been developed by Paganhill Youth Club in Stroud. As Gary explained, it really is a phenomenal record in recent seasons. "In the same team as myself there were Ian Olney, who is now at Aston Villa, Richard Dryden, now with Bristol Rovers, Mike Cook and Simon Blythe who is with Bristol City. Mike Cook actually made his debut for Coventry City first team the other week against St. Mirren in the Anglo Scottish Cup."

Gary played for the Stroud Schoolboys team and a host of Clubs were trailing him in their eagerness to obtain his signature. "There were several Clubs besides Coventry City. There were Aston Villa, West Bromwich Albion, Newport County, Wolves, Cardiff City and Chelsea."

He then added, "Swindon Town were also interested and as a 13-year-old I used to come here."

Time passed by and Gary eventually opted to sign for Coventry City. "I used to spend my school holidays with them and when I was fifteen, I signed apprentice forms."

The Highfield Road set-up soon impressed Gary and his first mentor was John Sillett who was then the 'Sky Blues' Youth Coach. When John was appointed to Team Manager, Mick Coop, took over. Both made an impression on Gary. "They were both different types, John was an aggressive, loud man, who would give everyone a rollicking, while Mick was a pleasant and quiet man, but both were good coaches."

Their influences bore fruition last season as the Highfield Road youngsters swept to the F.A. Youth Cup Final and defeated Charlton Athletic in the Final. "It was mar-

vellous, we were each presented with a Cup and medal," said Gary. Honours did not finish there, for he collected another medal when City's Youth team reached the final of the Midland Youth Cup.

Coventry City have since given a first team opportunity to Stephen Livingstone, one of that victorious Youth team.

Although Gary had no doubt who he considered to be the most talented of the young players at Highfield Road. "They have a young lad who plays in a midfield position, Paul Shepstone, who is already in their Reserves and doing well."

Those dreams of being given a full contract at Coventry last season disappeared. "I was the last apprentice and the youngest to be told I was being released." The summer came, the months moved nearer a new season, and that is where Swindon Town entered Gary's life again. "I was offered the chance of a trial and I have enjoyed it here. It is different to Highfield Road in the training methods. A lot more running here, where we probably did more ball work at Coventry, five-a-sides and set pieces."

Gary was looking forward to the visit of Chelsea, he had always liked the London Club as a young lad. It will be interesting to see if he earns a contract with Swindon Town. Meanwhile we now have a permanent link with Pagenhill Youth Club and three of their most promising young players now attend the Swindon Centre of Excellence. Gary's father, Terry, is one of the officials of the Gloucestershire-based Club. He certainly had a vested interest.

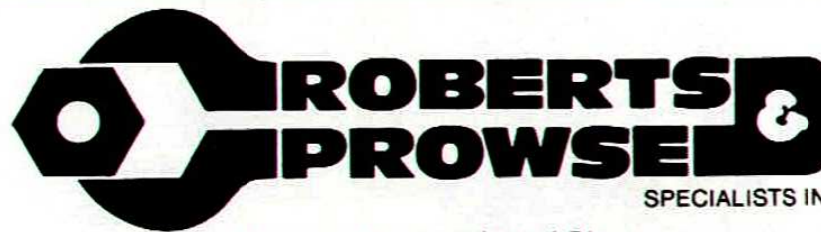

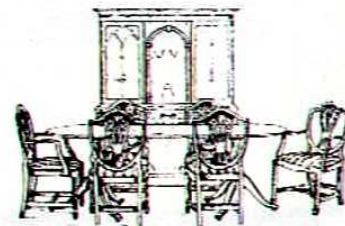

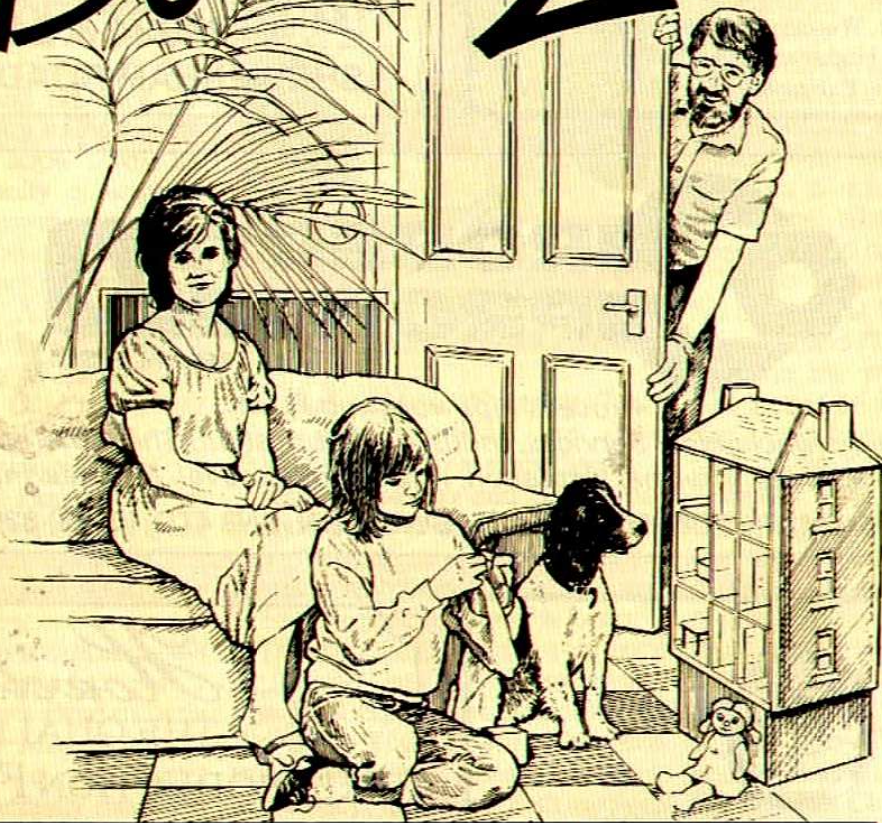

### MEET THE PLAYERS AND MANAGER

**John Hollins (Manager).** Appointed Manager at Stamford Bridge in June 1985 in succession to John Neal. Was previously the Assistant. Capped once at full international level by England, also gained youth, under-23 and 'B' caps. Began his playing career as an apprentice at Chelsea and went on to make nearly 750 League appearances for Chelsea, Q.P.R., Arsenal and Chelsea.

**John Bumstead (Midfielder).** Age 29. Long serving midfield player who has made nearly 300 appearances having signed professional in December 1976. Born Rotherhithe.

**Steve Clarke (Midfielder).** Age 24. Versatile player who was recently selected for the Full Scottish International squad. Signed from St. Mirren in January 1987 for £422,000. Born Saltcoats, Ayrshire.

**John Coady (Defender).** Age 27. Utility player who scored on his debut at Q.P.R. last season having signed from Shamrock Rovers in December 1986 for £35,000.

**Kerry Dixon (Forward).** Age 26. England International who signed from Reading in August 1983 having been an apprentice at Tottenham before moving to Southern League Dunstable. Born Luton. Has made 156 League appearances for Chelsea, scoring 76 goals.

**Tony Dorigo (Defender).** Age 22. England Under-21 International who captained the team during their summer tour. Signed from Aston Villa in June 1987 for £475,000.

**Gordon Durie (Midfielder).** Age 22. Scottish Under-21 International who signed from Hibernian in May 1986 for £381,000. Born Paisley.

**Roger Freestone (Goalkeeper).** Age 19. Goalkeeper who signed from Newport County in March 1987 for £95,000. Returned from loan to make his first team debut at Q.P.R. following injuries to Tony Godden and Eddie Niedzwiecki. Born Newport.

**Mike Hazard (Midfielder).** Age 27. Midfielder who signed from Tottenham Hotspur in September 1985 for a fee of £310,000. His appearance record for Tottenham was 113 (25), scoring 23 goals. Born Sunderland.

**Gareth Hall (Midfielder).** Age 18. Promising youngster who made his debut coming on as substitute in the final League game of last season at Watford. Born Croydon.

**Kevin McAllister (Midfielder).** Age 25. Signed from Falkirk in May 1985 for an initial fee of £34,000. Born Falkirk.

**Joe McLaughlin (Defender).** Age 27. Central defender who was made club captain during the summer. Signed from Morton in May 1983 having made over 300 appearances. A former Scottish Under-21 International. Born Greenock.

**Jerry Murphy (Utility).** Age 28. Signed on a free transfer from Crystal Palace in August 1985 where he made 229 League appearances. Born Stepney.

**Pat Nevin (Forward).** Age 24. Scottish International who signed from Clyde in May 1983. Born Glasgow. Had scored 30 goals in 156 appearances prior to the start of this season.

**Eddie Niedzwiecki (Goalkeeper).** Age 28. Welsh International goalkeeper who signed from Wrexham in May 1983. His appearances have been limited following a knee injury in early 1986. Played in the European Cup for Wrexham when only 16. Born Bangor. Has made almost 250 League appearances.

**Roy Wegerle (Forward).** Age 23. Signed from Tampa Bay Rowdies for £75,000 in July 1986 having spent a short period on loan during the 1985/86 season. Born Johannesburg.

**Darren Wood (Defender).** Age 23. Although signed as a full back from Middlesbrough in September 1984, played the latter part of last season in a midfield role. Born Scarborough.

**Clive Wilson (Midfielder).** Signed from Manchester City. Began his career at Maine Road before being loaned out to Chester. Went on to make a further 94 appearances for Manchester City before moving to Stamford Bridge.

**Kevin Wilson (Forward).** A prolific goalscorer, he was signed from Ipswich. Joined Derby County from his local club Banbury United and made 122 appearances - 30 goals before being transferred to Ipswich.

This will be only Chelsea's third official visit to the County Ground. Both of the previous encounters were in Cup competitions with honours even.

One of the top Clubs in the country, Chelsea, with that impressive Stamford Bridge stadium, are steeped in tradition.

Elected to the Second Division in 1905 the Club, in their 83 years of League football, have always featured in the top two divisions.

Just once has the First Division title been won, that was in the 1954-55 season and the Second Division title once also, in season 1983-84.

However, Chelsea have ended up runners-up in the Second Division on no fewer than five occasions.

It is in Cup competitions that the Blue have excelled. After an epic F.A. Cup Final replay Chelsea defeated Leeds United 2-1 in extra time at Old Trafford to finally land the Cup for the only time in the Club's history. This compensated for finishing as beaten finalists in both 1914-15 and 1966-67.

Chelsea were also one of the first winners of the Football League Cup, way back in 1964-1965 season, and finished as runners-up in 1971-72.

Their biggest Cup success, though, came a year after winning the F.A. Cup. Chelsea reached the final of the European Cup-Winners Cup and were pitted against the mighty Real Madrid. A goal from Peter Osgood cancelled out the effort from Zoco and with the scorelines still at 1-1 after extra time, a replay was needed.

Two days later, in the same Athens Stadium in late May, Chelsea made no mistakes this time, winning 2-1, with goals from John Dempsey and Osgood.

Chelsea have the distinction of being the first holders of tonight's competition - the Full Members Cup (Simod Cup).

In an exciting final at Wembley on March 23 1986 they beat Manchester City 5-4 in front of a 68,000 crowd.

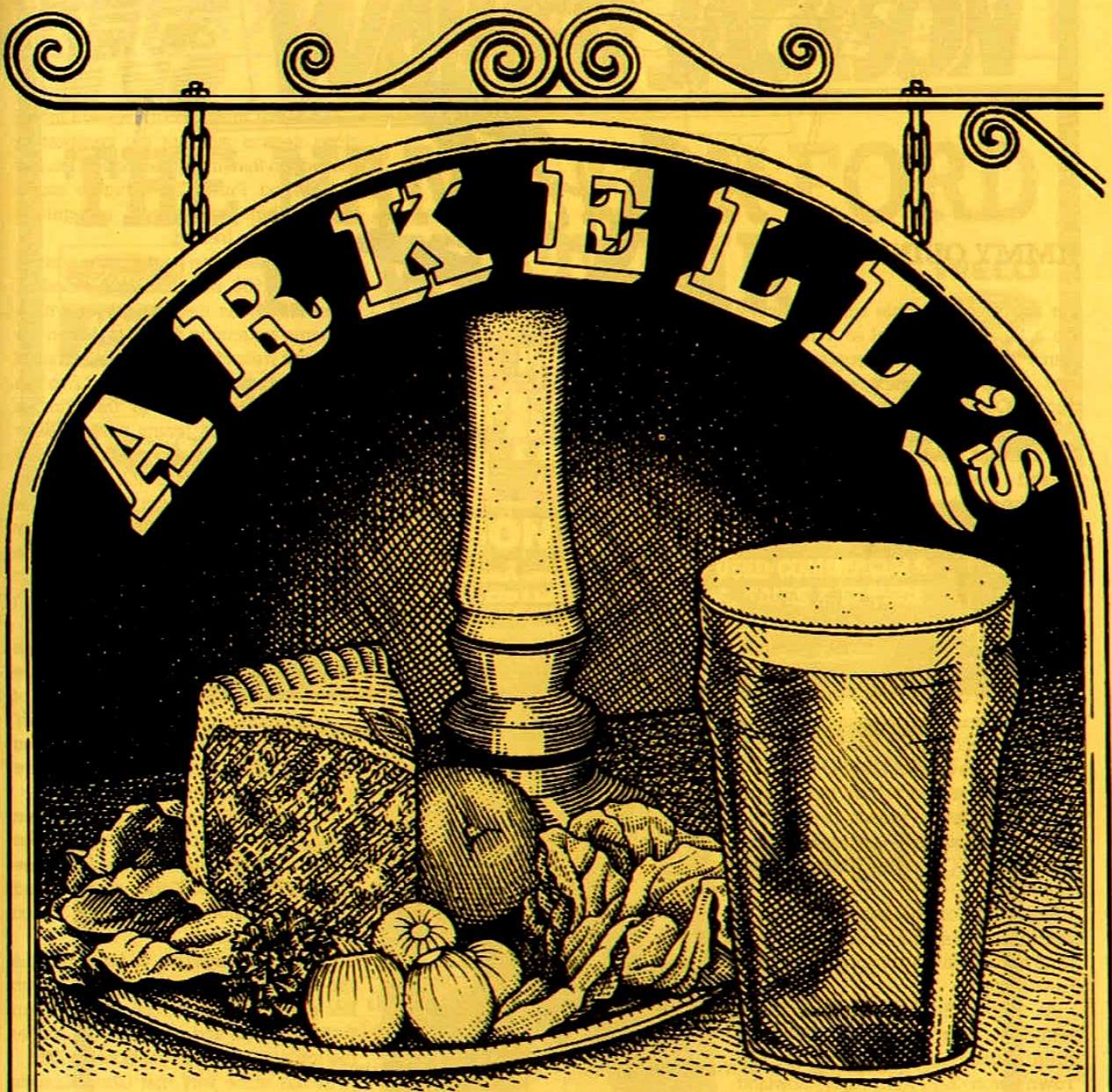

# A to Z

## OF SWINDON TOWN

### JIMMY QUINN

Just as the predictable scribes always see a Steve White goal as 'White Hot', Jimmy Quinn's achievements are invariably greeted the next morning with 'Mighty Quinn' headlines.

Those plaudits have been plentiful this current season as the Northern Ireland International has shown his immense ability.

Jimmy's first serious moves in football came in the Northern Premier League with Oswestry Town.

Swindon Town signed the Belfast born striker in the 1981/2 season at the age of 22 to give him his break in League Football.

His debut came in the 2-2 away draw at Walsall as a substitute, making his first full appearance in an embarrassing 5-0 reverse at the Manor, Oxford.

Jimmy appeared on two more occasions in that fateful season, in the home game at Plymouth and another substitutes role at Bristol City as the 'Town' romped home 3-0.

More time on the bench followed in Swindon's first season in Division Four as Jimmy made only 4 full appearances but 9 as substitute.

At Edgar Street, Hereford, Quinn netted his first goal for Swindon only three games into the season as the 'Town' won 2-1 with Andy Rowland getting the other goal.

The last four games of the 1982/83 season saw Quinn make 3 consecutive substitute appearances, start the last game of the campaign against Bristol City and score 2 goals, one against Stockport and Northampton respectively.

The following season brought Jimmy's establishment in the 'Town' side, making 28 appearances, scoring seven goals in

a season which saw some incredibly low attendances both at the County Ground and around the country in the Leagues basement.

The final match of the season at Gigg Lane, Bury, proved to be Quinns last for Swindon Town, for the time being at least!

His move to Blackburn Rovers in the close season was not the passport to perfection that Jimmy had hoped for, but the Ewood Park Club's higher status brought him International recognition with Northern Ireland.

Jimmy's selection for the game against Israel in 1985 saw him make football trivia history as the first player with a surname beginning with Q to pull on the Northern Ireland jersey. For the alphabet set, it now only needs an X and Z to run out at Windsor Park in that famous emerald shirt. As Jimmy made steady but unspectacular progress at Ewood Park, Lou Macari was still rueing the insurmountable situation that took the strikers services away from the County Ground. With the transfer agreed before the Scot had taken over, there was little that Lou could do other than watch enviously and wait for developments.

Through the bars of the cage at Belle Vue, Doncaster in December 1986 came the welcome Christmas present of Jimmy Quinn running out for the 'Town' again. After a settling in period Lou Macari's hunch and wait for the centre forward proved most worthwhile.

His appearances since, have been studded with incredible opportunist goals, all memorable, particularly those against Fulham and York last season and his superb effort to beat Peter Shilton this time last month.

Jimmy's resurgence in form and his shoot-on sight policy have brought him back to the forefront of the Northern Ireland squad and of course put him at the top of the League goalscorers list.

In the same way that Chris Kamara has proved an integral part of the set-up on his return, Jimmy is bringing unpredictability to the County Ground as the ball flashes into the net from all angles.

Jimmy Quinns future must lie at the higher level and hopefully it will be with Swindon Town before too long, with the County Ground playing host to Chelsea in the First Division.

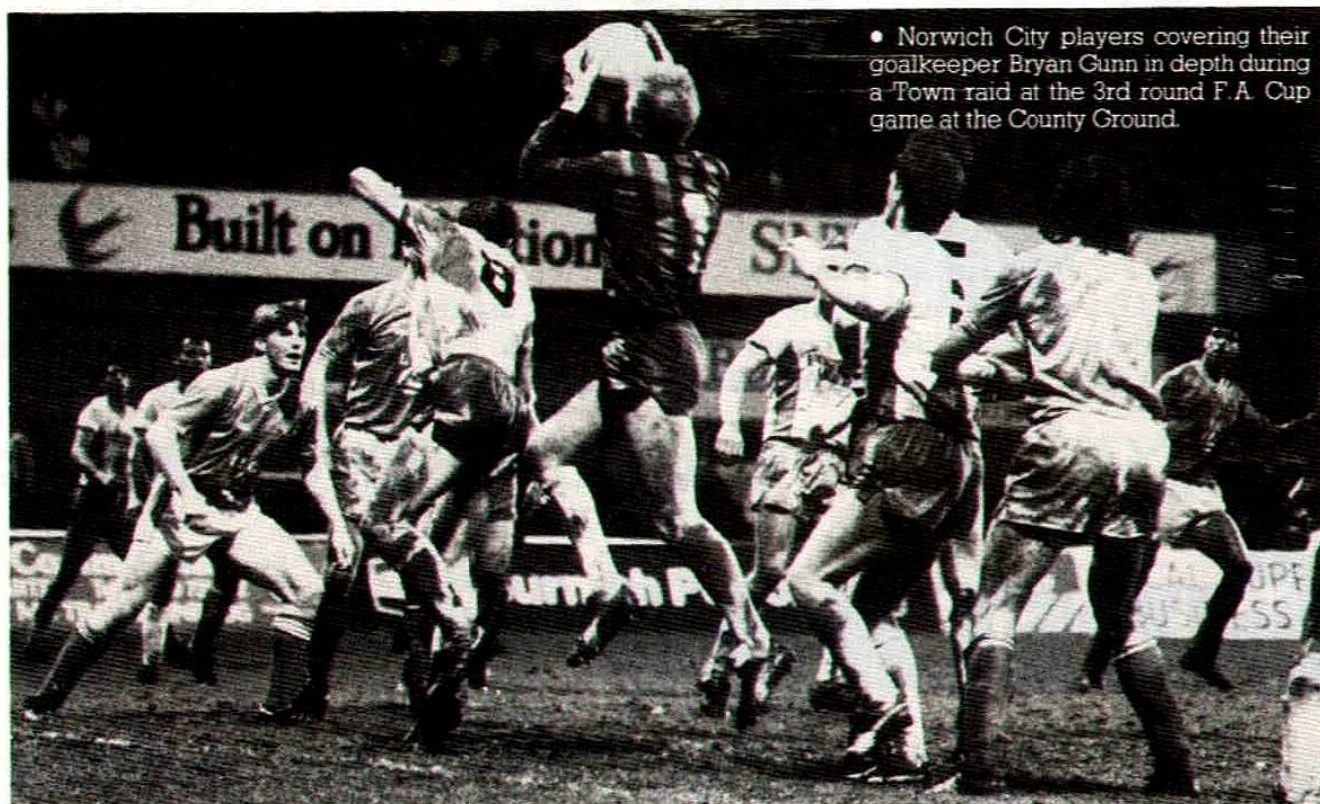

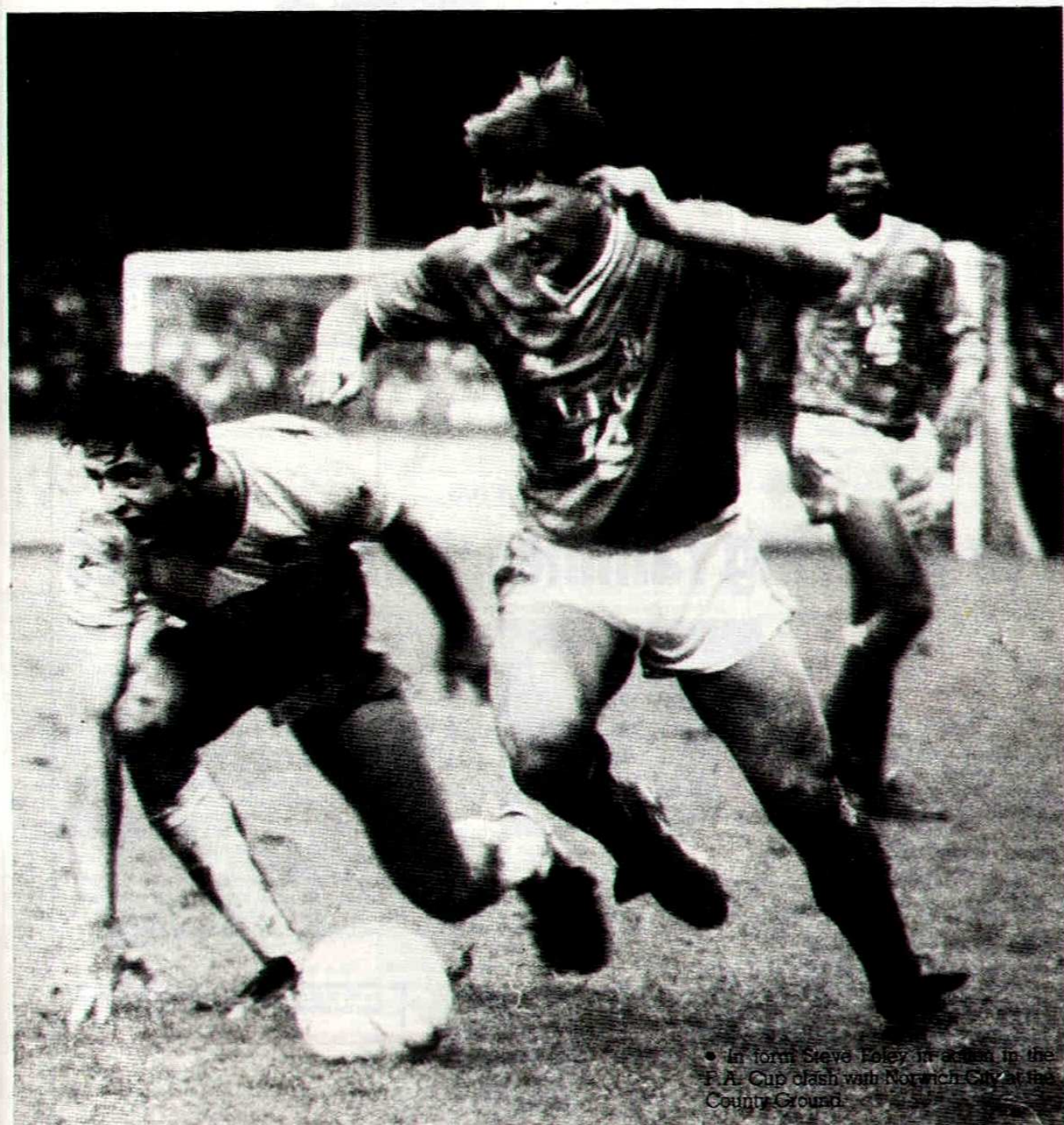

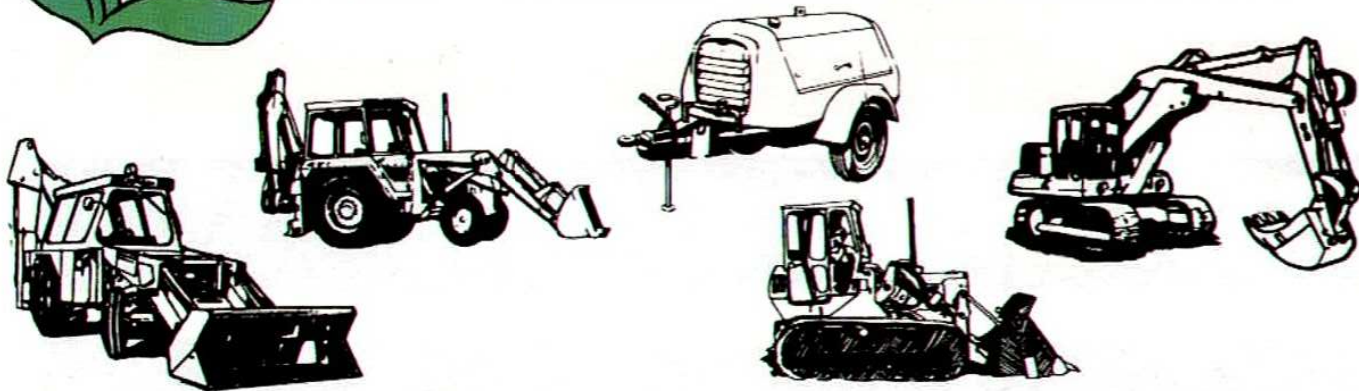

There was little incident of note in our Third Round F.A. Cup tie at the County Ground, most of the report of the match centred on the disallowed Jimmy Quinn effort.

William Pierce of the 'Sunday Express' was typical of this type of report.

Swindon were furious last night over a controversial handball decision which prevented them taking a First Division cup scalp.

But manager Lou Macari had to admit victory would have been a dreadful injustice on a day when Norwich showed what little class there was in an anti-climactic third round tussle at the muddy County Ground.

Nothing, though, will ever convince striker Jimmy Quinn he did not score the winner three minutes before half time.

The big Northern Ireland striker had already turned away in celebration of what he believed was his 24th goal of the season after forcing the ball home in a hectic scramble following full-back Dave Hockaday's free kick.

But referee Ken Walmsley cut off Quinn's joy when he ruled that Swindon skipper Colin Calderwood had handled as he nudged Hockaday's right-wing kick through to Quinn in the six-yard box.

Quinn was clearly incensed and had his name taken for vigorously protesting the decision.

As the pace and gluepot pitch began to take its toll on the Wiltshire side, Norwich took a firm grip and had the chances to make Wednesday's Carrow Road replay unnecessary.

Tony Rand of the 'News of the World' followed suit...

First Division Norwich went into the match as the bookies' underdogs - and came out relieved to get a second chance.

Second Division Swindon, 5-4 favourites to beat the Canaries, had a first-half Jimmy Quinn goal controversially disallowed.

And last night furious Swindon skipper Colin Calderwood was still insisting there was nothing wrong with Quinn's 42nd minute effort.

Quinn was booked for protesting after Blackpool referee Ken Walmsley disallowed his goal, signalling he had spotted a handball by Calderwood.

Swindon's long ball tactics put Norwich under pressure.

And, in the end, boss Dave Stringer, who left record signing Robert Fleck on the bench, was content with Wednesday's replay.

There were bookings for Norwich danger man Ruel Fox and Swindon's Phil King.

Robert Steen of the 'People' saw the match in a different view. It was all birds and animals for Robert! He centred the report around the 'Canaries' and Fox.

The Canaries weren't exactly singing after this tempestuous tie, but they had every right to chirp contentment.

A month ago Norwich, dumped out of the cup by Wigan last season, would have been ripe for another humiliation at the hands of a gritty bunch like Swindon, conquerors of Portsmouth and Derby already this season.

But, pumelled by gusts that reduced Gunn's goal kicks and clearances to boomerang demonstrations, the team that Ken Brown nurtured and Dave Stringer inherited provided the culture in a hectic first half.

Goss and Putney slithered repeatedly in the mud to nick possession and set up one-touch moves at which one marvelled given the bad conditions.

## MASTER

The pace of Fox, however, was Norwich's sharpest blade. One-stop go run saw him whip past Kamara and King only for Hammond to punch the resulting cross off Rosario's eyebrows.

Still, Swindon were muscling back into contention. Quinn, easily Butterworth's master in the air, volleyed past an upright and Parkin's header grazed a stanchion.

Quinn then ended a desperate goalmouth scrummage by squeezing the ball inside the post. But the referee had blown for handball against White.

## CONTROL

But Norwich's resurgence has been no fluke, and they re-established control. Parkin cleared off the line from Drinkell and Hammond plunged to hold Goss's drive.

Our fantastic replay victory brought the following tribute to Dave Bamber's ability in the air from Barry 'Flatman' of the 'Daily Express'.

Dave Bamber's air force sent Norwich flying out of the F.A. Cup in the shock of the third round at Carrow Road last night.

Bamber struck twice with second half headers as Swindon stunned First Division Norwich in this rain-soaked replay.

Much-travelled Bamber, who cost Second Division

Swindon £15,000 from Portsmouth, took his goal tally for the season to 10 as he set up the fourth-round trip to Newcastle.

Cup upsets are nothing new to Bamber. Earlier this season he scored twice in the Littlewoods Cup win at Pompey.

And his lethal heading ability also proved too much for Norwich.

Bamber caught their flat-footed defence, who badly missed ex-skipper Steve Bruce, in the 66th minute as he headed in Dave Hockaday's corner.

## LETHAL

And Norwich still seemed in a state of shock three minutes from time as Bamber leapt high above his markers to power in Jimmy Quinn's free kick.

Swindon felt victory was nothing more than they deserved after claiming they had won Saturday's game at the County Ground only to have a Quinn effort disallowed.

Apart from a few furries, First Division strugglers Norwich hardly posed a threat to Lou Macari's spirited team.

Bamber forced a first-minute save from Norwich goalkeeper Bryan Gunn before skipper Colin Calderwood came to Swindon's rescue.

Twice in a matter of seconds Norwich's top-scorer Kevin Drinkell fired in close-range shots but Calderwood made goal-line clearances.

## SLIPPED

Then ex-Spurs fullback Mark Bowen joined his attack to shoot against Swindon's crossbar.

But that was all that was seen of Norwich's attack before the break while Swindon went close through Hockaday and Chris Kamara.

Swindon came out fighting after the break and Bobby Barnes slipped past two challenges on the left wing only to fire inches wide.

Norwich tried to pep their attack by bringing on £550,000 substitute Robert Fleck. But they were never allowed to find the rhythm which had taken them to a four match unbeaten run.

Within three minutes of Fleck's arrival Swindon were in the lead and Norwich were flattened.

### SWINDON BASED RON HOLDS THE CHELSEA RECORD

Former Stamford Bridge favourite **Ron Harris**, who now owns a nearby golf complex, holds the record for the most appearances for the London Club.

Ron made **655** appearances in League matches, **63** in the F.A. Cup, **48** in the now renamed Littlewoods Cup, **13** in the European Cup-Winners Cup, **14** in the E.U.F.A. Cup and **8** in the Anglo Scottish Cup for a grand total of **801** appearances in a career lasting from 1961 to 1980 with the Stamford Bridge Club.

The previous holder of this record had been one of Ron's former team mates, goalkeeper **Peter Bonnetti**, who made **600** appearances. In fact Peter is the oldest player to appear for the Club age **37** years and **10** months during the 1978-79 season.

### CHELSEA HAVE WON THIS COMPETITION

Chelsea have won this competition, when it was known as the Full Members Cup, in 1985-86. They won the Cup on March 23rd 1986 at Wembley before an attendance of 68,000.
