






TAKING THE OPPOSITE OF VIEW

WEST BROMWICH ALBION

West Bromwich Albion, one of the twelve founder members of the Football League back in 1888 – indeed F.A. Cup winners that year – have a proud tradition as one of this country's top Clubs.

The history books show Albion also won the F.A. Cup in 1892, 1931, 1954 and 1968, the League Cup in 1966, the League Championship in 1920 and were runners-up in 1954.

The man now charged with restoring Albion to the big time is player-Manager Brian Talbot, who himself has savoured some of the game's high spots during a distinguished playing career. Brian has had to take over in midseason, following Ron Atkinson's sudden departure to Atletico Madrid, which is always a difficult task.

Albion lost their prized First Division status in 1986 and neither Ron Saunders nor Ron Atkinson succeeded in finding the right formula for success during their brief spells at the helm at The Hawthorns.

Now Brian Talbot has been installed as player-Manager, many Albion supporters are hoping for a repetition of the Second Division promotion achieved by their last player-Manager, Johnny Giles in 1975.

Albion's origins, in fact, date back to

1879 when a group of lads playing cricket for a local works team decided to form a football Club which they christened West Bromwich Strollers, little realising this embryo Club would grow into one of the most famous in the Country.

The Club's nickname The Throstles' dates back to those early days also. In 1884 they adopted as their crest a thrush perched on a branch, Throstle being the local name given to this bird.

Many grounds were used in the Club's early days, but in 1900 they moved to The Hawthorns, which today is a fine, modern stadium with an approved capacity of 35,500.

This is Albion's sixth spell in the Second Divison, but to date they have never yet dropped down to the Third, though they were too close for comfort in each of the last two seasons.

Currently Albion are pushing hard for a return to Divison One. They topped the table in December but then fell away. Recently they have regained their composure and are placed third – looking confident for at least a spot in the promotional play-offs.

At the time these notes were penned Brian Talbot was attempting to sign Craig Shakespeare from Walsall and Greg Downs from Coventry in time to beat the transfer deadline.

MEET THE MANAGER AND PLAYERS

Brian Talbot (Player-Manager). Appointed Albion's Manager at the age of 35 following Ron Atkinson's departure to Atletico Madrid in October. He is ambitious to succeed in management now his distinguished playing career is reaching his twilight. The former England International midfielder gained a wealth of experience at Ipswich, Arsenal, Watford and Stoke, including two F.A. Cup and U.E.F.A. Cup winners medals. He holds both the preliminary and full F.A. Coaching awards, and has acquired great negotiating skills during his five years as Chairman of the Professional Footballers Association.

Stuart Naylor (Goalkeeper). Rated one of the best 'keepers in Divison Two. Signed from Linclon City in February 1986 for a six-figure fee, having previously had loan spells with Peterborough United and Crewe Alexandra. Aged 26.

Arthur Albiston (Defender). Snapped up on a free transfer in the summer after 14 years with Manchester United, winning F.A. Cup winners medals in 1977, 1983, and 1985. Former Scottish International, he made over 400 appearances for the famous Red Devils.

Stacey North (Defender). Cost sixfigure fee when signing from Luton Town just after Christmas. Another tall, commanding central defender. Product of Luton's youth scheme.

Martyn Bennett (Defender). Missed the first half of this season following an operation on his back. His absence during the past two campaigns have been a principal reason for Albion's slump in fortunes. Still only 27 has made over 200 appearances for Albion. Chris Whyte (Defender). Former Arsenal and England Under-21 star, aged 27, who has just returned to this country after two seasons in the American Indoor League with New York Express and Los Angeles Lazers. Carlton Palmer (Defender/Midfield).

Carlton Palmer (Defender/Midfield). Most improved player last season still only 23, this former YTS trainee performs with distinction at full back, centre back and midfield. Hs made over 100 League appearances.

Darren Bradley (Defender/Midfield). Signed for Aston Villa in March 1986 but injuries have hampered his progress. He has already shown considerable ability at right back and in midfield.

Robert Hopkins (Midfield). Previously with Aston Villa, Birmingham City and Manchester City, joined Albion in October 1986. Aged 27, a midfielder, usually playing wide right.

Gary Robson (Midfield). Younger brother of England's Bryan Robson, this 23 year-old midfielder is a product of Albion's youth scheme and had his best season to date last season. Verging on 100 League appearances.

Wayne Dobbins (Midfield). Promising teenager who helped Albion win promotion back to the First Division of the Central League last season and who is mounting a strong challenge for a regular first team place this campaign. Colin Anderson (Midfield). Previously with Burnley and Torquay United, joining Albion in March 1985. A tenacious midfielder, usually playing wide on the left. Aged 26 nearing 200 League appearances in total.

Don Goodman (Striker). A £50,000 buy from Bradford City in March 1987. One of the fastest sprinters in the Second Divison. Only 22, has become a feared goalscorer.

John Paskin (Striker). South African from Cape Town, given his English League baptism by Albion this season. Had previous experience of professional football in Hong Kong with F.C. Seiko and Belgium with K.V. Kortrikj.

Kevin Bartlett (Striker). Brian Talbot's first buy-for Albion, a £100,000 recruit from Cardiff City, who discovered him at non-League Fareham. He is expected to add considerable pace to the attack. Colin West (Striker). A £250,000 purchase for Sheffield Wednesday. Recently scored twice in the vital 2-0 win over Blackburn. A former apprentice at Sunderland has also seen service with Watford, Rangers and Sheffield Wednesday.


So that's the preaching over with, but it would be nice to see this ground full over the next two crucial months.

force in the Division as anyone in Wright and Bright. They have defensive problems and are always likely to concede goals.


