




We are currently in the midst of a very busy period footballwise, with our continued involvement in two Cup competitions in addition to League duty. Whilst the outcome of our F.A. Cup tie with Huddersfield was not known at the time of writing, I am convinced that the short training break we took after the Liverpool match, in Tenerife, has refreshed and stimulated the players for the challenges we will face in the coming weeks.

The value of the training we were able to do on this trip was brought home to us on our return, as the atrocious storm conditions rendered Thursday's session at Mitcham a virtual non-event in terms of quality work.

On a more general note, it would appear that with the findings of the Taylor Report finally being published and making a forceful recommendation against the Government's proposed I.D. scheme, that the threat of this legislation will be removed. The vast majority of people in football have voiced their opposition to the scheme, as indeed have a number of M.P.'s, and it seems that their voice has finally been heard. Like many Palace fans I see a considerable number of games up and down the country, and I think they would agree with me that the climate at football grounds has improved, and that generally speaking, watching football has once more become a pleasurable and relatively safe occasion.

Finally, we once again have the pleasure of welcoming Swindon Town to Selhurst Park for a match where the stakes are considerable. Last season, of course, we were fortunate enough to defeat them over two legs to earn our place in the Second Division Play-off final. Tonight, the prize at stake is another two-leg affair in the Southern Area final against Chelsea with Wembley Stadium on the horizon.

GOVERNMENT I.D. SCHEME SHELVED

Deputy leader of the Labour Party, Mr. Roy Hattersley, a keen soccer supporter and Sheffield Wednesday fan, told Palace Clubcall last week "I think the Government's compulsory I.D. scheme is dead. It would be impossible in my view to go ahead with it, since Lord Justice Taylor has said that far from improving ground safety it could actually put the safety, and even the lives of fans at risk . . . I think the Government have finally realised what all football fans

have known for ages."

Mr. Hattersley, who hopes to visit Selhurst Park next month, when Wednesday are the visitors, believes, in common with Palace chairman Ron Noades, that football has made significant progress in addressing the hooligan problem, and that strong action by the police and courts are the ultimate solution to the organised thuggery associated with the game.

As far as the shelving of the I.D. scheme is concerned, it would appear to be good news, both for clubs and genuine

supporters everywhere.

Personality Spot

The name Clive Taylor probably does not mean a great deal to most supporters, but then until this season, neither did that of Zenith Data Systems. Clive Taylor is Z.D.S. 

18. The War Cup 1943-44

The Cup competitions run by the FA during the War seasons were usually played in mini-leagues in their early stages: the Southern sections were invariably divided into groups of four or six clubs with the top one or two going through to the knock-out quarter- or semi-finals. It was in the War Cup for the 1943-44 season that Palace came nearest to qualifying for the later, sudden-death, part of the tournament. (Palace's only other War-time 'success' in a knock-out competition was gained in 1940-41 in the London Cup when we reached the last four-but this was only a supplementary competition anyway).

Victories over Brentford, away (4-3), Charlton, at home (5-1) and Brighton, away (4-2) had put the Palace in a position from which victory in their last preliminary match would give us a semi-final place. However, home defeats by Brighton (2-3) and Brentford (1-2) had cost us dearly and our final game was at The Valley against a Charlton side for whom a draw would be sufficient to ensure that they went through for the second year in succession.

Astonishing interest

Such was the interest generated by this clash that it attracted a crowd of almost 20,000 and in those trying days a gate of such proportions was an astonishing turn out.

The Palace programme for our FA War Cup tie against Charlton.

It was one of those matches that could have been won by either side: Palace claimed an early penalty for a push on Bob Ferrier and Robinson, our guest inside right from Sheffield Wednesday, hit a post, but then Charlton were awarded a penalty only for our keeper Alf Tootill to make a fine save, and then in the second half Charlton's Don Welsh hit our crossbar. In the end the result-a draw-was utterly fair, and the scoreline-0-0-amazing in the light of the many close encounters in front of both goals: the outcome was disappointment and frustration for the Palace and elation for Charlton, who went on to the Final itself and beat Chelsea 3-1 at Wembley.

The Palace side at The Valley on March 25th, 1944 was as

follows:





On arriving at a ground the Ref notices that the pitch is square. The groundsman explains that there has been drain trouble, he has had to re-mark the pitch to avoid the damaged ground; he argues that the rules say the length must be at least 100 yards, and the width must be not more than 100

yards, so a square pitch is legal. What should the Ref do?

ANSWER TO REE'S PUZZLE: the Rules state that the pirch must be rectangular; this could be a square shape. But they go on to say that the length must exceed the breadth. The pitch would have to be remarked; but it could be 101 yards long and 100 yards wide, almost a square shape!

DID YOU KNOW? Odd Facts About Selhurst Park

The name Crystal Palace was a nickname made up by the humorous magazine Punch for the original glass and iron Great Exhibition building erected in Hyde Park in 1851. After the Exhibition it was taken apart, and transported to the area where the BBC TV transmitter now stands, and re-erected. If it had been put anywhere else in London our Club would have had another name.

The present site, Selhurst Park, cost £2,570 in 1922; it was a brickfield, with two tall chimneys standing where the pitch is now. One main advantage was being near three railway stations, Thornton Heath, Selhurst and Norwood Junction.

Archibald Leitch was commissioned to design the ground. A series of strikes and disputes held up the building work, and when the Lord Mayor of London opened the stadium on 30th August 1924, the ceremony took place in an unfinished Stand. The Stand — the present Derek Ormonde (formerly Members') Stand was almost identical to his designs at Fulham, Huddersfield and Stamford Bridge. (PS How did 'Derek' change to 'Derrick' — as spelt on the side of the Stand??)

The other three sides of the ground were open banking, with terracing only on the lower part of each side, the rest being grassed to the top. There was as ditch along the front of the Main Stand; the ball was constantly having to be retrieved from the muddy water that accumulated.

Floodlights were installed in September 1953; these rather primitive ones, with wires hanging around the ground, were replaced by the present four corner pylons in 1962. The first game played under the new lighting system was against Real Madrid, watched by 25,000 fans.

Record attendance at Selhurst Park was 51,482 at the match v Burnley which secured Palace the 2nd Division Championship and promotion to Division One, in May 1979.

Some of you are still sending in questions; well, here we go again, I've picked out the most


interesting to answer.

There is a kind of computer in the hut to the left of scoreboard, and the messages are typed on a keyboard. The moving display, like when it says GOAL or COME ON PALACE, or the picture of the REF telling off a player, is recorded, and just pressing one command sets each display going. All the regular messages and adverts like FLY VIRGIN and READ THE ADVERTISER are recorded in this way, they don't have to be typed each time they are used.

"How do they change the bulbs on the floodlights?" (Martin, aged 12, Crawley) Vic Worrall, our hard-working Stadium Manager waits until there are several needing to be replaced, then sends for an electrician. The bulbs cost over £100 each! The electrician climbs up the enclosed ladder to the top of the pylon, unscrews the dud bulb and puts the new one in. If Vic wants to check the job has been done properly he has to climb up too; fortunately he has a good head for

"Why does a linesman or the Ref look at the substitute's boots?" (Kathrine, aged 9, Guildford)
The players' kit is checked before the match, especially the studs on their boots. If a player wore
sharp or extra long studs these would be dangerous for other players. When a sub comes on his







SWINDON TOWN MANAGER: '0SSIE' ARDILES



'Ossie' Ardiles joined Swindon Town as their Manager in July 1989 and the Wiltshire soccer fans are greatly impressed with The Robins' new boss for his team are playing an attractive brand of football and are poised to earn another tilt at the Play-Offs next

May, or perhaps even clinch outright promotion to Division One.

The diminutive Argentinian International first came to the attention of British soccer fans when he helped his country to win the 1978 World Cup, where, along with Mario Kempes, Ossie was widely regarded as the star of the tournament.

To the delight of many British football enthusiasts Ossie signed for Tottenham later that year in a £750,000 double deal with big Ricky Villa and both became an instant success in the football league. Ossie quickly established a reputation as an outstanding player and during his decade with Spurs he collected FA Cup winners' and UEFA Cup winners' medals in 1982 and 1984. Ossie also had two spells away from

White Hart Lane on loan, first with Paris St. Germain (14 French League appearances), then with Blackburn Rovers for whom he played 13 times in the latter part of the 1987-88 season including the 2nd Division play-offs.

Ossie's career with Tottenham embraced 259 English League and Cup matches — all of them full appearances — plus a further 13 European and Super Cup and Charity Shield games and he scored 25 goals for the North

London club.

In 1988 he joined Queens Park Rangers, but he broke his leg after making only 11 appearances for the Loftus Road club, and, following a period of recuperation he spent the summer of 1989 with Fort Lauderdale in the North American Soccer League.






SWINDON TOWN

FRASER DIGBY: Height 6'0". Born in Sheffield on 23rd April, 1967. The former England U21 International was the only player to make the maximum number of league appearances last season. Fraser, who has attracted the attention of many of the leading Clubs in the First Division, began his career with Manchester United as an apprentice. Following an initial period on lean at the County Ground, the Sheffield born goalkeeper moved to Swindon Town, for a fee of £12,500 in December 1986. Manchester United insisted on retaining fifty per cent of any profit, in the event of the player being transferred to another Club. Appearances: League: 116, League Cup: 1, FA Cup: 8. League, debut: Swindon Town v Rotherham United, September 27th 1986.

DAVE HOCKADAY: Height: 5'10". Born in Billingham on 9th November, 1957. Dave has given the Club sterling service since he joined Swindon Town from Blackpool on a free transfer in August 1983. A professional who can be described as a true utility player capable of playing in several positions. In fact, Dave originally joined the Club as a winger and was successfully converted to a full back role. During the Club's rise from the Fourth Division to the Second he proved to be one of the Club's most consistent performers, and he has given the Club excellent service for six seasons. Dave should make his 450th senior appearance in the early part of this season in a career spent with two Clubs. Appearances: League: 346, Sub: 23, Goals: 21, League Cup: Appearances: 28, Sub: 3, Goals: 2. League debut: Notts County v Blackpool, September 18th 1976.

ROSS MACLAREN: Height 5'10". Born in Edinburgh on 14th April, 1962. Ross moved to the County Ground in July 1988 from Derby County, after a Football-League Tribunal had set the fee at £150,000. The Scottish born defender settled into a sweeper role with the Clublast season. Ross entered Football League with Shrewsbury Town in August 1980 after being released on a free transfer by Glasgow, Rangers. After five years with the Gay Meadow Club he moved to Derby County in July 1985 after a Football League Appeals Committee set the transfer fee at £67,000. Ross made the maximum number of League appearances at the Baseball Ground in the 1986-87 Second Division championship triumph. COLIN CALDERWOOD: Height 6'0". Born in Glasgow on 20th January, 1965. Colin, who is the Club Captain, returned to the form of last season, that made him an attraction in previous seasons, for several of the country's leading Clubs. Colin, who is widely regarded as one of the Second Division's strongest central defenders, was signed from Mansfield Town with a Football League Appeals Committee setting the transfer fee at £27,500 in June 1985, with the added stipulation that in the event of the Player being transferred to another Club for a fee in excess of £27,500 then Swindon Town will pay Mansfield Town 50% of such an excess. PAUL BODIN: Height 5'10". Born in Cardiff on 13th September, 1966. Paul joined Swindon Town from the now defunct Newport County in March 1988. The Welsh born utility player commenced his career in the Football League with the former Somerton Park Club without making a senior appearance. It was after joining fellow Welsh Club Cardiff City that he made his League debut. After three seasons with the South Wales Club he drifted into non-league football with Bath City after being given a free transfer by the Ninian Park Club. Newport County eventually paid the Southern League Club £15,000 for his return in January 1988 after Paul had been attracting the attention of several Clubs with his consistent performances. Last season the versatile Paul, proved he was adept in a full back or midfield role with Swindon Town. Appearances: League: 92. JON GITTENS: Height 5'11". Born in Moseley on 22nd January, 1964. Jon joined Swindon Town in July 1987 with a Football League tribunal committee setting the fee at £40,000, following his move from Southampton. The Birmingham born central defender was signed by the 'Saints' from Paget Rovers, the Midland Combination Club in October 1985 for an initial fee of £6,000. The First Division Club having to pay the non-league Club a further sum of £16,000 on completion of a set number of first team appearances. Jon's appearance last season were limited due to disciplinary suspensions. Jon was suspended for the first two matches of this season following an FA ruling for passing 51 disciplinary points for last season. The fine form he had displayed in his early games with the Club deteriorated with his disillusionment with the long ball tactics the Town adopted. Tom's frustration resulted in a transfer request, which he eventually withdrew following Manager Ossie Ardiles' appointment. Tom was forced to miss the early pre-season and league matches due to a cartilage operation just after pre-season training commenced, although the injury had flared up in the play-off matches with Crystal Palace last season. Eventually given a free transfer by Liverpool, he joined Grimsby Town in 1984, Steve spent one season with the then Second Division Club before joining Sheffield United in August 1985. He spent two seasons with the Bramall Lane Club. Ironically all of Steve's league appearances have been at Second Division level. It was generally regarded that the Liverpool born midfield player produced his finest form last season in helping the Town to a play-off position. A troublesome ankle injury in the last few weeks of the season robbed the influential Steve of his earlier fine form. Originally a full back, Alan was converted to a midfield role and he relished the transition. Last season he established a regular position in the Town's Second Division promotion drive. Alan spent two periods on loan with Torquay United during the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. Appearances: League: 61, Sub: 6, Goals: 7, League Cup: Appearances: 1, Sub: 1, Goals: 0, FA Cup: Appearances: 5, Sub: 3, Goals: 0, League debut: Swindon Town v Newport County, September 2th 1989.



During his only season with the London Club, he spent brief loan periods with Lincoln City and amazingly Luton Town! Steve returned to his native West Country roots with Bristol Rovers in August 1983, for a fee of £35,000. After three seasons with the thon Eastville Club, he was surprisingly given a free transfer! Swindon Town stepped in quickly to take the experienced striker to the Country Ground in July 1986, and in three seasons he has never failed to reach double figures in the goalscoring charts. During this period, Steve has helped the Club to promotion from the Third Division and a play off position in last season's Second Division. 

RICKY UNDER TREATMENT


Unfortunately, not such good news for midfield man Ricky Newman who is currently sidelined with a back injury, and is currently undergoing treatment at Fulham.






A special coach brought the children to the stadium, they met the Palace players in the Boardroom, had a tour of the ground, then enjoyed a fish & chip meal in the
