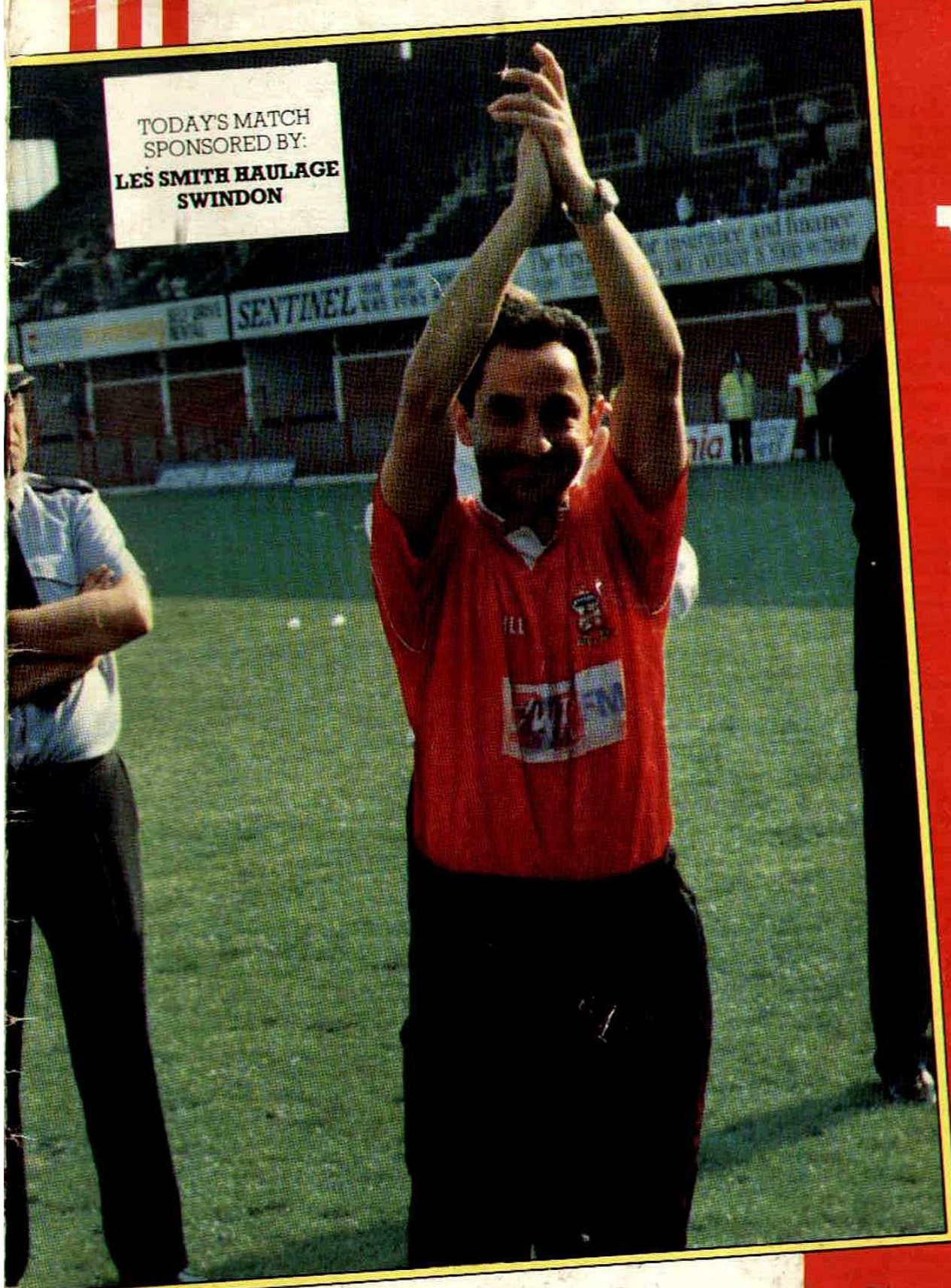

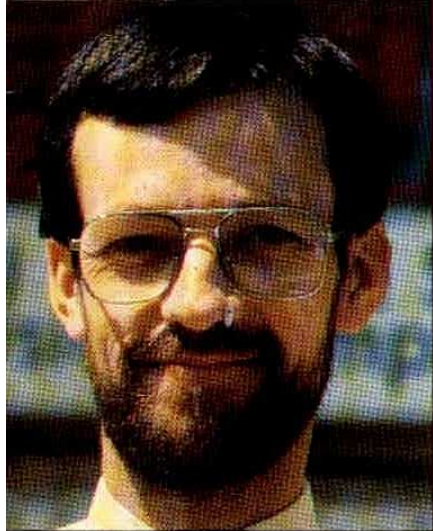

Today the curtain comes down on yet another season at the County Ground and another that has, through the innovation of the play-off system, brought welcomed additional revenue to the club. It gives me the chance to look back on a season that has been eventful, to say the least, both on and off the field. As too much has already been said – and written – on activities off the park, I shall be concentrating on the action on it.

OMEN

If Steve White does not finish as top goalscorer, he can count himself very unlucky. The last time that a tally of 25 goals for the Town didn't land the honour was in 1962/63, when Jack Smith was second to Ernie Hunt's 27. Swindon were promoted that season – an omen?

Swindon broke a 'duck' at Ewood Park on Easter Monday when Jon Gittens scored their first League goal there in seven visits. The point gained at Sunderland in December was also their first in seven trips and that at Newcastle last month the first in three. The victory over champions Leeds in February was the first in eight League meetings.

A.F.C. Bournemouth's victory at Swindon in December was their first at the County Ground in eleven meetings. Sheffield United's win five days later was their first-ever here – and the first time that they had prevented the Town from scoring at home.

Brighton's victory five weeks ago was their first at Swindon in fourteen attempts – the last being in November 1954.

LONGEST

The mammoth Littlewoods Cup tie with Bolton was the first time that any Cup tie involving the Town had extended to four games – and at 450 minutes, it was the longest tie in the history of the competition.

The Southampton tie also went into the Town record book as the one that took the longest to complete – 48 days. This time it was the wonderful weather that caused the delay.

Against bottom club Stoke in November, it was a case of double measures. In each of their last five home games the Town had scored three goals. And in the previous two visits by the Potteries club, Swindon had scored three times with a home striker collecting two

goals. This time they hit six and both strikers – Duncan Shearer and Steve White, – scored twice!

Mick Stockwell's own goal at the County Ground in October was the third conceded by an Ipswich player in the last four meetings at Swindon. Mick McNeil (1964) and Ian Cranson (1987) were the other two unfortunates.

The fastest goal of the 58 games in which Swindon Town featured prior to the play-offs, came from Blackburn's Simon Garner in 25 seconds on Easter Monday. Kenny Black of Portsmouth was a close second (32) in February.

EARLIEST

The earliest by a Town player was timed at 3 minutes 56 seconds, by Duncan Shearer at The Hawthorns just before Christmas.

That game also saw the home side awarded three penalties in the space of seven minutes. Only one was successful. It was Swindon's turn to miss two spot-kicks in March, against Leicester.

Steve Foley's goal against Middlesbrough was the Town's 100th of the season in League and Cup competition.

The midfielder's injury at the beginning of March brought to an end a run of 21 consecutive matches that Swindon had fielded the same eleven players – by far the best sequence ever recorded in club history.

And the scheduled season closed with the Town squeezing into fourth place in the Second Division table – the club's highest ever final League position.

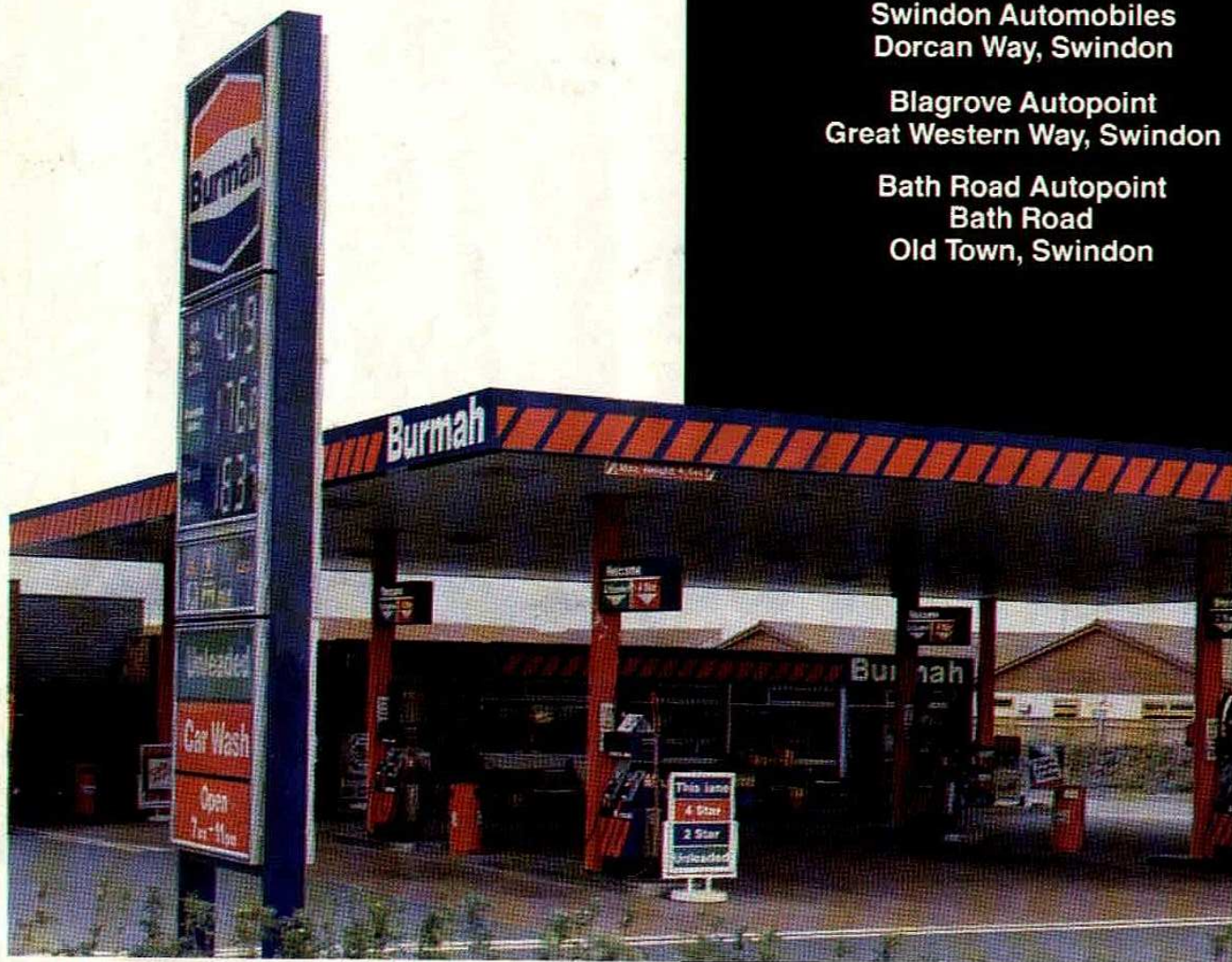

They say a week is a long time in politics. In football, it's even longer. The week preceding our last scheduled match of the season at Stoke must rank as one of the worst in the club's history, but it ended with Stanley Matthews (no less) saying that we were the best team he's seen this season. Even the Sunday People (who have been keen to say bad things about the club all season) said we would grace the First Division. Of course, they are right.

Quite how we failed to beat a poor Stoke side when we produced such stylish football is beyond me. I suppose it was the combination of the usual early goal and wayward finishing which gave Stoke their luckiest point of the season. Once again Messrs Kerslake and McLoughlin put in brilliant performances.

Point or no point, Stoke were obviously doomed long before the last day of the season. But what a pity that such a club – with a ground good enough for the First Division – should find itself in the Third. Despite the terrible season Stoke had had, the support they were able to generate showed us another reason why I, for one, will be hoping to see them bounce back.

Most things went right on that last day of the season. They certainly did for us. Firstly, the two big Geordie clubs managed to pair up in the play-off line up, which has to be good news. Compared to the trip to Newcastle or Sunderland, even travelling to Blackburn seems like a home game! We also managed to reach our highest-ever

finishing position in the League and get home advantage for the second leg of the play-off.

A great day out at Stoke was marred by two things. Firstly, gangs of thugs from Leeds – whom I won't call football supporters – managed to spoil the season for thousands of real fans by what can only be described as an invasion of Bournemouth. Quite obviously, the match was used as an excuse to wreak havoc. Leeds provided video screens so that those without tickets could still watch the match, but those without tickets still went along, knowing they would not be allowed in and not wanting to see the football anyway. I do not believe that there was anything Leeds United Football Club could have done to stop it.

It will be interesting to see what punishment the football bosses hand out. In view of their monumental blunder in refusing to re-schedule the match, we might just see them resist what they normally do and punish the innocent supporters.

The day was also a black one because Luton Town avoided relegation to the Second Division with another of their Houdini acts. Luton may well be celebrating, but what used to be the finest League in the world is still tarnished by a club that is an insult to all football fans.

But let us forget the depressing things about football for at least one day. Today could be another glory day for Swindon Town with Blackburn Rovers standing between us and a day at Wembley and possibly our first ever season in the First Division. It's really a pity that if we are to progress further, it will have to be at the expense of Blackburn Rovers. As regular play-off qualifiers ourselves we know enough

about them to sympathise with Blackburn's near misses.

I know of no set-up, in any sport, where there is a system as unfair as the play-offs. We will be hoping for a repeat of the day we won the Third Division play-offs with a win over Gillingham. The unfairness of the system was nearly brought home then when we came close to losing. We had finished miles above Gillingham and they even had the cheek to say they deserved it more. You have only to look at where they are now to see what injustice so nearly came about.

Whatever the result today, we will at least have one thing to show for it – a respectable attendance. And it's at this point that I have a message for all those people here tonight who might be making their first or perhaps their second visit of the season. **WHERE HAVE YOU BEEN?**

Why not make a habit of it next season? We certainly have the players and the management here now to prove that anything is possible... as I hope we will see today.

When the Football League introduced the play-off system in 1986/87 it was no new idea, but merely a rehash of a system that they had operated some ninety years earlier – when games which decided promotion and relegation issues were known as the 'Test' Matches.

Both Swindon Town – then operating in the Southern League – and Blackburn Rovers were involved in Test Matches.

SUSPICIONS

The Football League shelved the idea after 1898 when two clubs, Stoke and Burnley, knew that by drawing their final games they would both preserve their First Division status. Suspicions were aroused following the 0-0 scoreline and automatic promotion and relegation was thus introduced.

Blackburn took part in those last ever Football League Test Matches. Rovers, fighting to stay in the First Division, defeated Newcastle 4-3 at Ewood Park but went down 0-4 in the return.

But they retained their place when the League decided to extend both its First and Second Divisions by two clubs. Nearly fifty years had passed before Blackburn suffered relegation for the first time, in 1936.

Swindon Town were involved in Southern League Test Matches three times and although on each occasion it was as the bottom-placed club in the First Division, they always avoided the drop.

Gillingham, who faced the Town in the Third Division play-off final in 1987, were their first opponents in a Test Match back in 1895. The Kent club was then known as New Brompton.

ONE PENNY

The match was staged at Reading, who then played at Caversham Cricket Ground, reached by a ferry across the Thames at the grand cost of one old penny! The boat trip obviously did not agree with the Swindon players, as they suffered a 5-1 defeat.

Again an extension of the Division was the saviour. The Town then

avoided the bottom places for six years until 1901, when they made a return trip to Reading to face Brentford.

This time the game ended goalless. Extra time was played but, in true Test Match fashion, 'bad light stopped play' before the end. No replay was ever staged. Brentford went up and Swindon stayed up.

Twelve months later, the Town made their last appearance in the Test Matches. For the third time Reading was the venue, but the opponents were Fulham. A 3-1 win ensured that Swindon remained a

DRAMA

More drama followed. At Gillingham an 82nd-minute goal from David Smith spoilt a good night's work by the Town, but worse was to come. Just seventeen minutes into the second leg, a fearsome volley from Karl Elsey put the Gills 2-0 ahead on aggregate. Fortunately, Coyne and 'super-sub' Charlie Henry levelled the scores and a third meeting, at Selhurst Park, was necessary.

There, it was an uphill struggle for Gillingham from the moment Steve White put Swindon ahead in

First Division club on merit.

Returning to the 1987 play-offs, there was the matter of disposing of Wigan Athletic prior to the final. And when Chris Thompson and David Lowe had the Town trailing 2-0 after only fifteen minutes at Springfield Park, few would have given them any hope of progressing.

With twenty minutes left, the score was the same but goals from Dave Bamber (72) Jimmy Quinn (80) and Peter Coyne (88) sealed a dramatic 3-2 victory. A 0-0 draw at the County Ground saw Swindon through.

the second minute and he put the seal on the victory with an opportunist second in the 65th.

After taking four points from Swindon in April 1988, Blackburn – prompted in midfield by Ossie Ardiles – reached the Second Division play-offs. But they went down 6-1 on aggregate to Chelsea.

Last season, the Rovers were there again as were the Town. Both faced Crystal Palace – and both failed by one goal. It is a great pity that one of them has to fail again today.

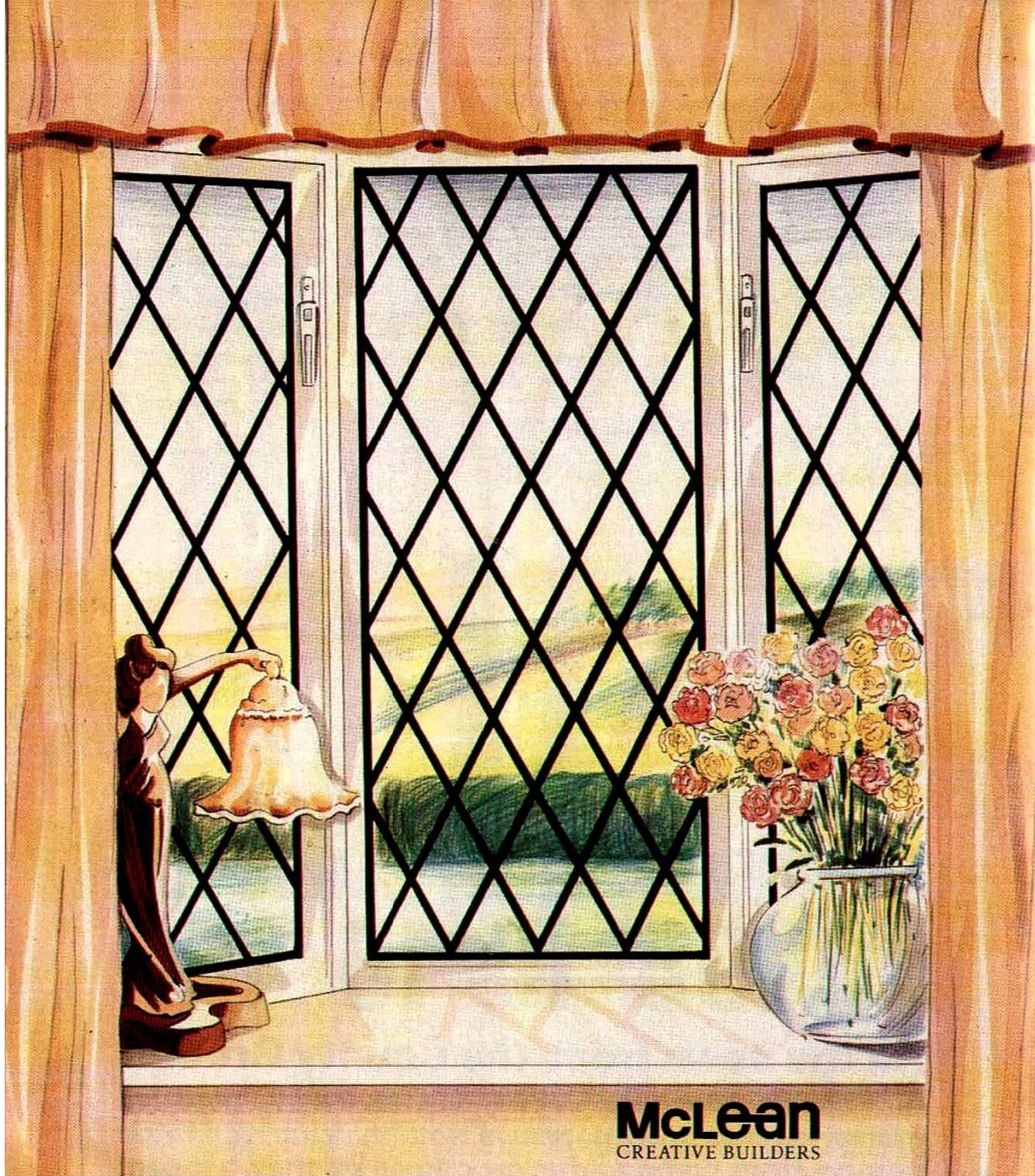

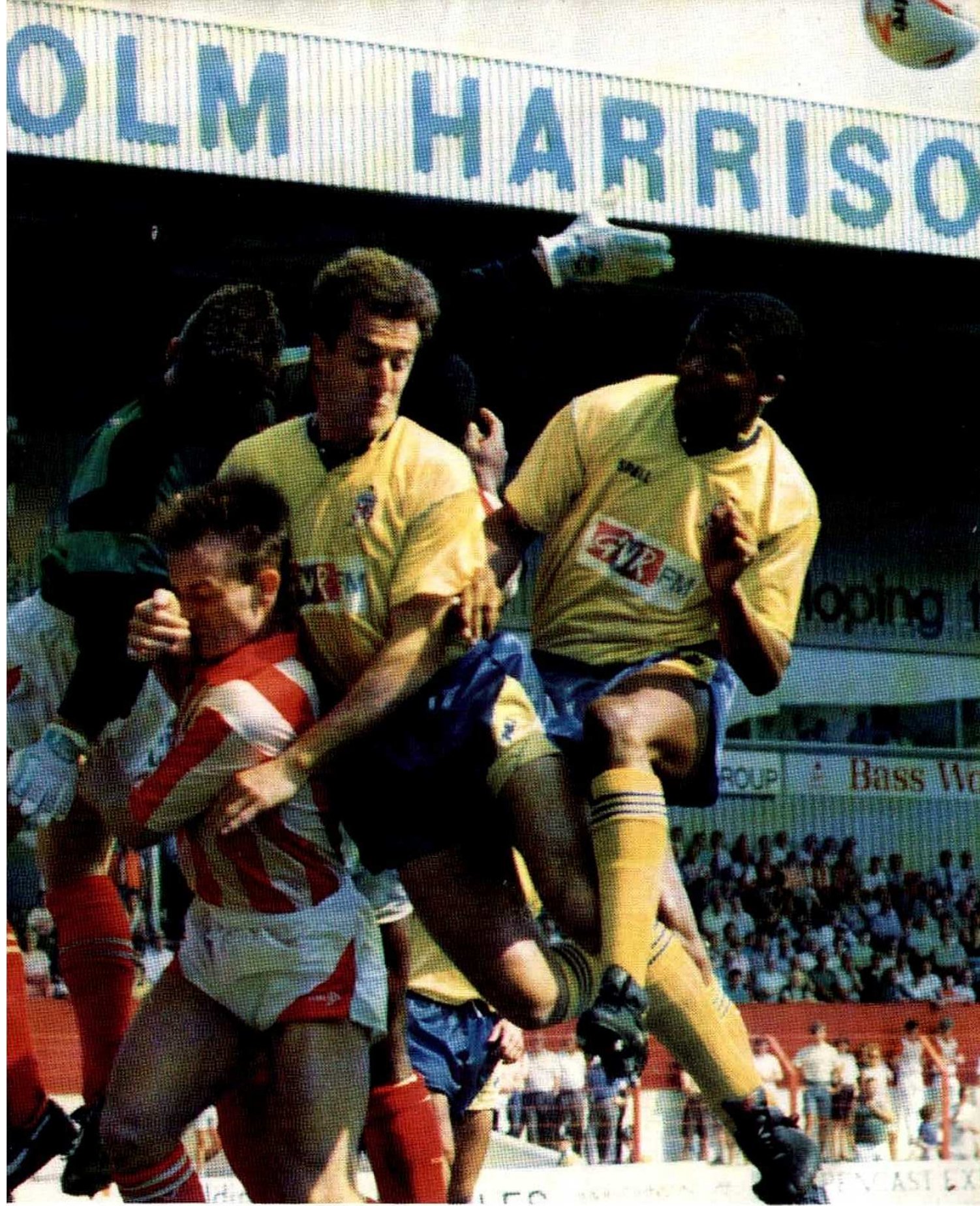

BLACKBURN ROVERS

GOALKEEPERS - Former Middlesbrough keeper **Darren Collier**, took over the custodians position for the final game Rovers played in September and he has shared with Terry Gennoe the number 1 spot since then. Prior to this season his only game had been his debut at Ipswich on May 13th last year. **Terry Gennoe**, is a veteran of 411 League appearances, made with Bury, Halifax Town and Southampton. Nearly 283 of those have been made with Blackburn Rovers. Terry played against us in the first leg.

Life has been like one hard luck story after another for Blackburn Rovers these past four years. After missing promotion by a mere three points, Rovers have qualified for the play-offs for the past three seasons. The Ewood Park Club lost its First Division status in 1966.

DEFENDERS - Mark Atkins, joined Rovers from Scunthorpe United for £45,000 in the summer of 1988. Ever-present last season and up to just before Christmas this season. **Chris Sulley**, cost Rovers a small fee from Dundee United. He began his career with Chelsea

but made nearly 250 senior appearances for A.F.C. Bournemouth. Central defender **Keith Hill**, began his career in the Club's youth teams. He had made only sixteen League appearances before this season. **David Mail**, made his League debut against the Town last season. David shared the number 6 shirt in the early part of this season with the now departed Colin Hendry. Another product of Rovers youth scheme. **Alistair Dawson**, spent twelve seasons with Glasgow Rangers before joining the Ewood Park Club in 1987. Nominated as substitute for the first six match of this season. **Len Johnrose**, scored his first League goal after appearing as a second half substitute in the home 2-2 draw with Ipswich Town on November 11th. **Justin Skinner**, made 73 League appearances for Fulham until he moved North in the close season. Justin has been restricted to substitute appearances this season.

During Don Mackay's first season as Manager, Blackburn Rovers enjoyed an unbeaten run of 23 matches, as they drew level with Aston Villa at the top of the Second Division.

MIDFIELD - **John Millar**, joined Rovers for a minimal fee from Chelsea in 1988. Made 38 League appearances last season and is also a regular this season. Former Leeds United player **Scott Sellars**, joined Rovers for £25,000 in 1986. Ever-present last season and also this term. Scored two of Rovers goals in the 5-4 defeat of West Ham United on November 25th. Team Captain, **Nicky Reid**, joined Rovers on a free transfer from Manchester City after making 217 League appearances for the Maine Road Club in a decade of service to City. **Ron Hildersley**, has spent his career with clubs in the North West. After commencing his career with Manchester City he later played for Chester City, Rochdale and Preston North End before joining the Ewood Park Club. Ron also had a loan spell with Cambridge United while he was at Deepdale.

Blackburn Rovers cherish the record of being the last Club to win the F.A. Cup three seasons in succession. That was way back in 1884-85-86. Rovers have won the Trophy on six occasions. The Ewood Park Club have twice won the League Championship.

FORWARDS - **Simon Garner**, had scored 153 goals for Rovers prior to this season. A hat-trick against Manchester City last season saw him break Tommy Briggs aggregate of 140 goals, a new Club record. Simon once scored all five goals in a Second Division clash with Derby County. Simon scored in Rovers 4-3 defeat at the County Ground this season. **Frank Stapleton**, was signed on a free transfer from French Club Le Havre. The Eire International, who spent several seasons in the top flight with Arsenal and Manchester United, has been ever-present in Rovers attack this season, although goals have been difficult to come by. Set for the World Cup Finals in Italy next summer. **Andy Kennedy**, was a £50,000 signing from Birmingham City in the summer of 1988. Although unable to claim a regular place in Rovers line-up this season he scored against us in the first leg last Sunday. **Fony Finnigan**, joined Rovers from Crystal Palace where he made 105 League appearances in the Selhurst Park Club's senior team. **Howard Gayle**, had played for Liverpool, Birmingham City, Sunderland and Stoke City before moving to Ewood Park in 1987. Howard has also spent loan spells with Fulham and Newcastle United while he was Anfield. Scored 19 League goals for Rovers last season. **Alan Irvine**, was formerly with Queens Park Rangers and Dundee United. He interspersed this spell with Scottish Clubs by playing for both Everton and Crystal Palace before joining Rovers in October.

Blackburn Rovers are one of only four teams this season to score three goals against Swindon at the County Ground. The others are Bolton Wanderers in the Littlewoods Cup and A.F.C. Bournemouth & Hull City in the League.

The fact that we've had a mixed season could also in some ways be down to disruptions such as these, but we can be reasonably pleased with our mid-table finish.

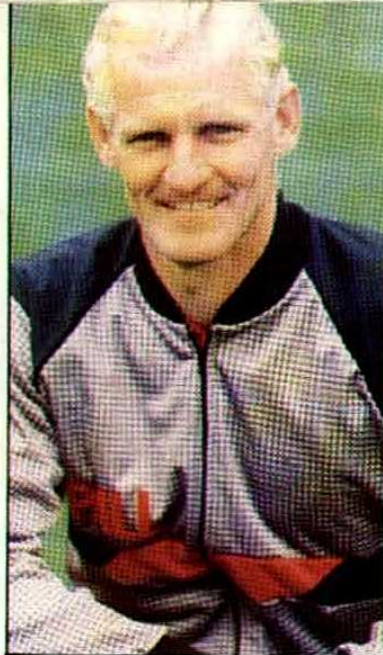

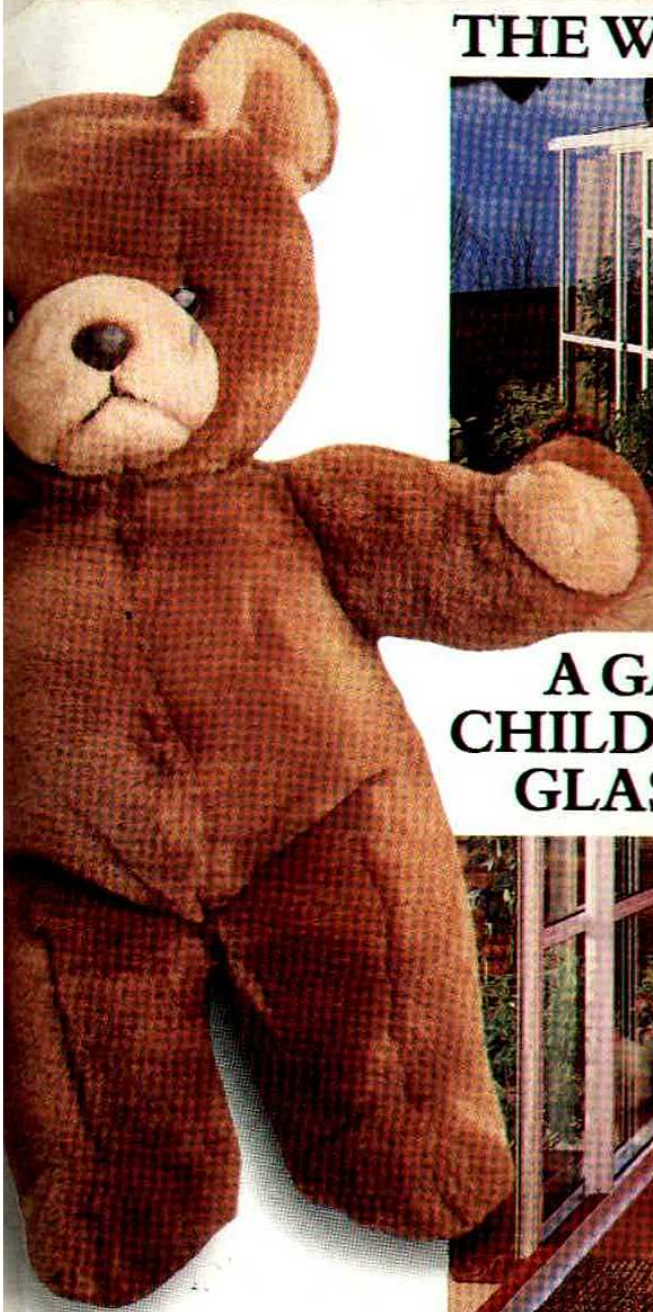
