





# The squad

Frank Burrows (Manager). Frank is currently enjoying his second spell as Pompey manager, having been officially appointed again in May 1990 after five months in which he had been acting as caretaker/manager following the dismissal of John Gregory. As a player he appeared for Raith Rovers and Scunthorpe United before moving here to Swindon in 1968, where he teamed up with Stan Harland (later to become his assistant at Pompey between 1979 and 1982) in the centre of the Town defence. During his years at the County Ground, Frank won promotion to the Second Division and a League Cup winners medal. In January 1978 Frank was appointed coach to Pompey manager Jimmy Dickinson, and was appointed manager in April 1979 when Dickinson resigned through ill health. During the next season, Frank built a highly entertaining side that not only scored 98 goals in all competitions, but which regularly attracted 20,000 plus crowds. On April 1st, 1982, despite having laid the foundations for Pompey's eventual return to the First Division in 1987, Frank was dismissed. After coaching spells with Southampton and Sunderland Frank returned to soccer management in June 1986, when he took charge of Cardiff. He steered Cardiff to promotion from the Fourth Division in 1987/88

Warren Aspinall (Forward). Born Wigan. Warren missed almost the entire campaign last season after breaking an ankle during the first match of 1989/90 against Watford at Vicarage Road. Pompey's most expensive signing when he joined from Aston Villa in August 1988 for £315,000. Warren began his career at Wigan, making his League debut in March 1985. After joining Everton for £150,000 a few months later, he was loaned back to Wigan to score 21 goals in 41 League games. In 1986/87, Warren signed for Aston Villa for £300,000. He also gained caps as an England Youth International.

John Beresford (Full Back). Born Sheffield. Since moving to Pompey from Barnsley on the eve of the 1989 transfer deadline for £300,000, John has made the left back berth his own. John began his career as an apprentice midfielder with Manchester City where he won England Schoolboy and Youth honours. In the summer of 1986 John moved to Barnsley.

Kenny Black (Midfield). Born Stenhousemuir. Joining Portsmouth from Heart of Midlothian in May 1989, for £250,000, Kenny began his career at Linlithgow Rose before joining Glasgow Rangers and making his League debut in November 1981. In the summer of 1983 Kenny moved to Motherwell before joining Hearts a year later. During his five seasons with 'The Jam Tarts', Kenny helped Hearts twice finish as runners up to Celtic in the Premier Championship while also helping them to reach the quarter finals of the 1988/89 U.E.F.A. Cup.

Mark Chamberiatn (Winger). Born Stoke. Mark gained eight England caps between 1982 and 1984. Beginning his career at Port Vale after winning England Schoolboy honours, Mark made his League debut in August 1978. During the summer of 1982, Mark moved for 150,000 to Stoke City and after 112 League appearances moved to Sheffield Wednesday for £300,000. He joined Pompey for £200,000 in July 1988. Mark will be 29

Colin Clarke (Forward). Born Newry. Colin became Portsmouth's most expensive signing on May 23rd, 1990, when he signed from First Division Queens Park Rangers for £450,000. Starting his career as an apprentice with Ipswich Town, Colin soon moved to Peterborough United where he made his League debut in September 1981. After a loan spell with Gillingham during 1983/84, Colin moved on a free transfer to Tranmere Rovers and AFC Bournemouth, where he scored 35 goals in 1986/86. These goals earnt Colin an International call-up, and after starring for Northern Ireland in the 1986 Mexico World Cup Finals, he joined Southampton for £400,000, scoring a hat-trick on his First Divison debut. Colin was transferred to QPR in March 1989 for £800,000, after a loan spell with Bournemouth.

Andy Gosney (Goalkeeper). Born
Southampton. Andy served his apprenticship
at Fratton before making his League debut in
May 1982, but had made only 22 League
appearances prior to this season. Andy took
over from Alan Knight during September. He
scored four goals for the Reserves in
November 1988, while recovering from a
dislocated finger, which prevented him from
keeping goal.

Graeme Hogg (Centre Half). Born Aberdeen. Graeme was described as the "best old fashioned centre half in the Second Division" last season by manager Frank Burrows. A former Scottish U-21 International, Graeme began his career as an Old Trafford apprentice, making his debut in January 1984. He made 83 League appearances (plus another seven during a loan spell with W.B.A. during November and December 1987) in five seasons with United. During July 1988, he joined Pompey for £150,000.

Alan Knight (Goalkeeper). Born Balham, London. Last season Alan broke the Portsmouth club record for most League appearances by a goalkeeper, previously held by John Milkins. Currently the club's longest serving player, Alan was brought to Fratton by Jimmy Dickinson as a 16 year old apprentice in 1977, making his debut in April 1978. Since then, Alan has represented Pompey in every Division of the Football League and has won England Youth and U-21 honours and a 1982/83 Third Division Championship medal.

Martin Kulh (Midfield). Born Frimley, Surrey. Began his career as an apprentice at St

Andrews and made his League debut in March 1983. After 111 League appearances, Martin moved midway through 1986/87 to Sheffield United in a swop deal that took current Pompey team mate Steve Wigley in the opposite direction. He stayed with the Blades until February 1988, when he was transferred to Watford in a deal worth £40,000. In September 1988, after just four First Division appearances, Martin moved to Pompey for £125,000

Gavin Macuire (Defender). Born Hammersmith. Beginning his career as an apprentice with Queens Park Rangers, Gavin made his League debut for Rangers in December 1986. On New Years Eve, 1988, Gavin joined Pompey for £225,000 to become Alan Ball's last signing as Pompey's manager. A sweeper who can play in the centre of defence or in midfield, Gavin established himself in the Weish side last season.

Warren Neill (Full Back). Born Acton.
Arriving at Fratton Park from QPR for £110,000 in July 1988, Warren began his careers at Rangers as an apprentice, making his League debut for the London side in August 1980. Between then and his transfer to Pompey, Warren played in over 180 matches, winning a 1982/83 Second Division Championship medal and a 1982 F.A. Cup runners up medal.

Gary Stevens (Midfield). Born Hillingdon. Gary moved from First Division Tottenham Hotspur for £250,000 following an impressive two month loan spell on the eve of the 1990 transfer deadline. Beginning his career with Brighton, Gary made his League debut in September 1979. After four seasons with Brighton, Gary moved to Spurs during the summer of 1983, where he soon added to his eight England U-21 caps. Gary's career was temporarily halted in November 1988 following medial ligament damage to his right knee.

Guy Whittingham (Forward). Born Cheltenham. Guy completed his first year as a professional footballer by not only finishing as top scorer with 24 goals, but by also receiving the Portsmouth Player of the Year award. Arriving at Pompey during the summer of 1989, after buying himself out of the Army for just £450, Guy first began on the road that would lead to the Football League by occasionally playing for non-League Oxford City after returning from West Germany with the Army in 1986. During 1988/89 Guy scored 90 goals in 100 matches for Yeovil, Waterlooville, Pompey Reserves, the Combined Services and the Army. Guy scored his first League hat-trick at Oldham on December 30th, 1989. He celebrates his 26th birthday today.

Steve Wigley (Winger). Born Ashton. A £300,000 eve of transfer deadline signing in 1989, Steve began with Chesire amateur side Curzon Ashton. In April 1981, he joined Nottingham Forest where he made over 100 European and domestic appearances for Brian Clough. After moving during October 1985 to Sheffield United, Steve joined Birmingham City in March 1987 in a part-exchange deal.


### 1968/69

Danny Williams made three acquisitions for 1968/69. The late John Smith arrived in mid-June and both Frank Burrows and Chris Jones arrived at the end of July.

Smith, the midfield 'general', was a polished performer, cast in the West Ham mould and then finely honed at Tottenham. His transfer fee was just £7,000. Burrows, a rugged uncompromising centre-half, added steel at the back.

It was the defence who took the early honours. Not a single League goal was conceded until 568 minutes into the season – in the seventh game. Torquay, who had recorded the first goal in Swindon's opening League Cup tie, also claimed the first goal to be conceded in a home League match – but that did not arrive until October 19, again in the seventh game. A 2-1 victory that day took the Town to the top of the table for the first time.

The season may have opened in grand style for the Town, but not so for full-back John Trollope. In his 368th consecutive League and Cup appearance, at Hartlepool on August 24, he sustained a broken arm and was out for nearly five months. However, he celebrated his return to the number three shirt on February 1 with a goal after only eight minutes.




By then, Swindon had already booked a place at Wembley for their League Cup Final date with Arsenal. When it came, on March 15, the Town adapted quickly to conditions which were not unlike the beach at Weston Super Mare. Bobby Gould tried to ruin Swindon's day with a late equaliser to Roger Smart's 34th minute goal, but Don Rogers' two extra-time gems brought the trophy home to Wiltshire.

But Bradford City might have become the season's giantkillers had they held on to an early two-goal lead in their League Cup Second Round replay at the County Ground. They didn't, and the rest – as they say – is history. Swindon themselves tossed away a similar lead at Coventry in the Fourth Round. They survived to crush City 3-0 in a second game.

Two goals conceded in a minute cancelled out a fine Semi-Final First Leg performance at Burnley, but again the Town rallied to draw level. And once more they refused to lie down after seeing the First Division side equalise in injury time and go ahead with almost the first kick on extra-time. As the Daily Mail correspondent said at the time "... only an astonishing side would recover now, and Swindon were that side ...".

Quite apart from their Cup adventures, the Town attracted huge gates for Third Division football. No less than seven games were seen by crowds in excess of twenty thousand. Leaders, and eventual champions, Watford topped the list with 28,898 on the evening of Grand National day. The average for the season at the County Ground finished at 17,856.

Only 35 League goals were conceded all season – just seven at home – but Watford's goal average was superior, by 0.15, and so they took the championship.

# The World Cup...

Bitten by World Cup fever, with Italia '90 and Ossie Ardiles and Nestor Lorenzo at Swindon Town, let's consider the history of this most famous of all football competitions.

The sport had been played in the Olympic Games, but as it grew professionally, F.I.F.A., the Federation Interntionale de Football Association, formed in 1905, wanted its own equivalent tournament. At the Antwerp Congress in 1920 there was the first real proposal, the dream became a reality a decade later, masterminded by the President of the French Football Association, Jules Rimet, after whom the trophy was named.

It was solid gold, 32 cms high and weighing more than 4 kilograms. Designed by Le Fleure, it cost 50,000 francs.

At the F.I.F.A. conference of 1928, in Barcelona, it was decided that Uruguay (Olympic champions in the two previous Games) would be the host nation. The country was also celebrating one hundred years of independence.

Thirteen teams competed in that inaugural event, won by the South Americans. Home advantage has paid off in five of the fourteen series so far: Uruguay, Italy, England, West Germany and Argentina.

Now F.I.F.A. has 150 affiliated associations, 105 of which entered the most recent qualifying rounds. There's a new "World Cup", again solid gold, 36 cms high. It's 18 carat gold, cost £8,000 and was selected from 53 entries. It's been used since 1974. Brazil – the only country to have appeared in all the "final stages" and the first to win three times, were presented with the "original" four years earlier.

For 1986 there were more than one billion television viewers of what happened in Mexico City – a special centre was built for the media, eight floors high, half of them below ground level (!).

Back in the beginning, the opening goal was credited to Louis Laurent of France, v Mexico in Montevideo on July 14th 1930.

Pele, the Brazilian, is perhaps the greatest player, having made four appearances in 1958, two in 1962, two in 1966 and six in 1970. For the goalkeepers, Gordon Banks was beaten just three times in England's 1966 triumph, twice in the Final.

Two people have lined up in 21 World Cup Final internationals: Wille Scale from West Germany and Poland's Wladyslav Bonwda.

The United trainer hit the headlines in 1930, protesting about a refereeing decision, he ran onto the pitch, stumbled and dropped his box of medical supplies, which included a bottle of chloroform. It shattered and he felt the full effect of the fumes as he bent down to pick up the pieces. He collapsed and had to be carried

off!!

My personal memories are dominated by the "total football" of the Dutch in 1974. Holland were runners-up to West Germany – the "man in the middle" for the Final was an Englishman, Jack Taylor.

That tournament, 16 summers ago, had started with a spectacular opening ceremony—so impressive officials had forgotten to put in the corner and halfway line flags.

Brazil/Yugoslavia had a delayed kick-off, while matters were put right!!



Top: Duncan Shearer advances on Port Vale's 'keeper Trevor Wood.


Bottom: Fitzroy Simpson is challenged by ex-Town defender Tim Parkin.

Murray Fishlock, Dean Goble and Andrew Bates scored our goals, with many more missed and good possession wasted.



# HELPING THE GAME



The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Little-woods, Vernons and Zetters. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.
