## WELCOME

This evening we are pleased to welcome to the County Ground the officials and supporters of Oxford United Football Club for tonight's Barclays League fixture, postponed last month at the start of the arctic weather.

## BARCLAYS LEAGUE

Our home League game against Notts County, originally scheduled for this Saturday, has been re-dated for Tuesday 23 April 1991, kick-off 7.45 p.m. This re-arrangement has been brought about due to the visitors continued involvement in the F.A. Cup competition. We are at home again next Tuesday evening when we entertain Oldham Athletic, again kicking-off at 7.45 p.m.

Following these two home games, we face two consecutive away fixtures. On Saturday 16 March we meet Millwall at The Den with a 3.00 p.m. kick-off. On Wednesday 20 March we make the short trip to Bath for our local clash with Bristol Rovers at Twerton Park. This game has an 8.00 p.m. kick-off and is all ticket. No seats are available for visitors. Any remaining terrace tickets are available from the County Ground ticket office priced at £5.50 each.

## WITH THE RESERVES . . .

Tomorrow evening the Reserves have a home Ovenden Papers Football Combination game with West Ham United at the County Ground, kicking-off at 7.30 p.m. This Saturday we meet Luton Town at Kenilworth Road with a 2.00 p.m. kick-off.

The much postponed Wiltshire Premier Sheild tie with Westbury United will now be played here on Monday 18 March 1991, kicking-off at 7.30 p.m. Please note that the home game with Fulham, scheduled for Wednesday 20 March, will now be played here on Thursday 21 March, as the first team have a game on the Wednesday.

# SEASON BY SEASON

We continue our look back  
at Swindon Town through the years . . .

## 1976/77

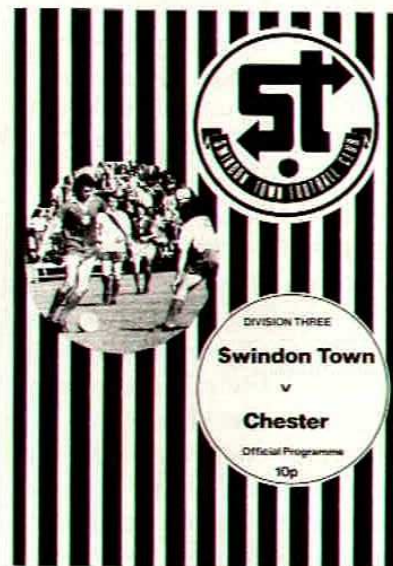
Swindon opened the 1976/77 season with a 1-0 home win over Port Vale and during the next nine months they had some impressive home wins. These included a 5-2 victory over Sheffield Wednesday and 5-1 wins over York City and Northampton Town. The latter included two penalty goals from Trevor Anderson, as referee Lester Shapter proved in generous mood. Despite these wins the side lacked the consistency needed to challenge for promotion and this was best shown by the heavy defeat Swindon suffered at the County Ground when they went down 4-0 to Peterborough. The previous season Swindon had flirted with relegation but in this season they finished in the respectable mid-table position of eleventh.

The leading scorers were Trevor Anderson and David Moss who had 14 goals each. Ray Mchale, who was signed during the season had, for a midfielder, the

very respectable figure of 9. Despite being in and out of the side, David Syrett, a product of the Swindon Youth team that had won the Midland Youth League, managed 8 goals.

The highlight of the season was the F.A. Cup run. In the Third Round a draw at Craven Cottage brought Fulham back to the County Ground. The Fulham team of this period was a star-studded one, containing those great entertainers George Best and Rodney Marsh. Swindon swept them aside, scoring five goals.

The Town could hardly have asked for a better reward than the home draw they received against Everton. Ray Mchale gave a typical battling performance. The match ended two all, with Kenny Stroud, a local born lad who won England International honours at schoolboy level, cracking home the final goal. One reporter described it as a shot 'being worthy of winning the Battle of Trafalgar'.



It did indeed win a regional ITV award for the Goal of the Season. The replay, as so often, saw Swindon snatch defeat from the jaws of victory. Trevor Anderson volleyed Town in front fourteen minutes from time only for two goals to be conceded in the last eight minutes.

The matches with this evening's visitors, Oxford United, proved typically close fought local derbys. A crowd of 13,500 were at the County Ground to see Colin Prohett score the only goals the two games produced.

# IN DEPTH

## “It’s a funny old game”

As reported thoroughly by the press, British soccer has had its dark days, but a unique sense of humour which is almost hereditary has always been apparent since the word go, straight through to the present day.

Many of soccer’s most delicious stories centre around its characters. The tales of Bill Shankley and his utterances are legion. One time, Liverpool were paying Manchester United a visit at Old Trafford, Matt Busby was puffing away at cigarettes and Shank observed: “Mat, you look worried – and our team hasn’t even broken sweat yet.” Replied Busby: “That’s what’s worrying me – that they might break sweat.”

Rasped Shank: “Listen, Matt – if I could get overcoats with numbers on, I’d put them on my players for the second half to keep them warm.”

Harmless mocking between players and officials always raises the spirits of a game and adds a friendly edge to an often tense game.

There’s a well known story about the famous referee who gave a penalty in the dying moments of a crucial match with the score at 0-0. As the penalty expert of the visiting team poised to take the vital kick, the opposing captain said quietly behind, within earshot of the taker “Bet you £20 you score”. Just as quietly, the referee observed to the captain “Bet you he takes it again if he doesn’t.”

Some events which have to be humoured are unavoidable, one of which happened at Ibrox some years ago in the ‘old Firm’ derby. On that day Charlie Tully was the only Celtic player to turn up at the start. So the game began with Tully

playing Rangers on his own, and at half-time there was no score! Then the other Celtic players arrived for the second half – and Rangers won.

Believe it or not, humour is also blooming in the money-spinning no-joke world of International football; alas though it tends to be more ‘cynical’ but still funny.

In South America three clubs admitted in public that they’d paid 60,000 dollars to rig the semi-final draw of the Copa Libertadores – a competition where no holds are barred, and home teams are not beyond doctoring the visitors’ food or spiking their drinks with laxatives so that they’ll run for the full 90 minutes!

Unfortunately, rigging and bribery can be common-place abroad, referees are regularly brought under the microscope for possible fixings.

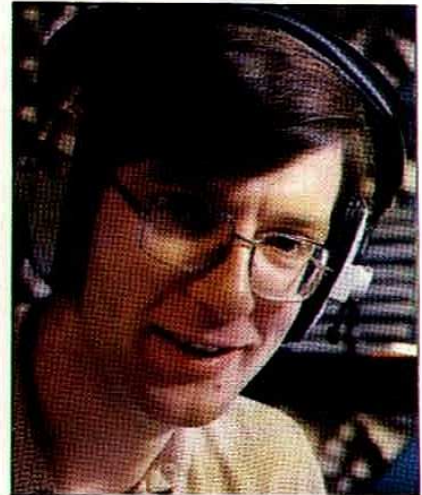

In Greece, British coach Les Shannon was hauled across the coals for calling an official a “drag artist”. Rumour has it that the referee then hit him with his handbag in the dressing-room.

In fact, if goals are the life and soul of football, David Coleman’s nonchalant “One-nil” must have been inspired by an undertaker.

He could take lessons from the Colombian radio commentator at the Atletico Junior – Nacional game. When Junior scored, the



threw back his head, shut his eyes and launched himself into a shout that lasted 36 seconds. When he opened his eyes, he was aghast to find that the goal has been disallowed, and listeners then heard sounds of the microphone being hurled to the floor and heavy footsteps storming out of the cabin, never to return.

Liverpool better watch their backs if Mr Major decides to follow the West African Government’s policies, everybody got so fed up with the champions, ‘Police F.C.’, winning the League year after year, the government finally declared them illegal!

As long as football continues breeding humour there will be more characters like Paul Gascoigne, and colourful antics from World Cup hero’s Cameroon to bring back the fun to football.

# HELPING THE GAME



The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettors. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.

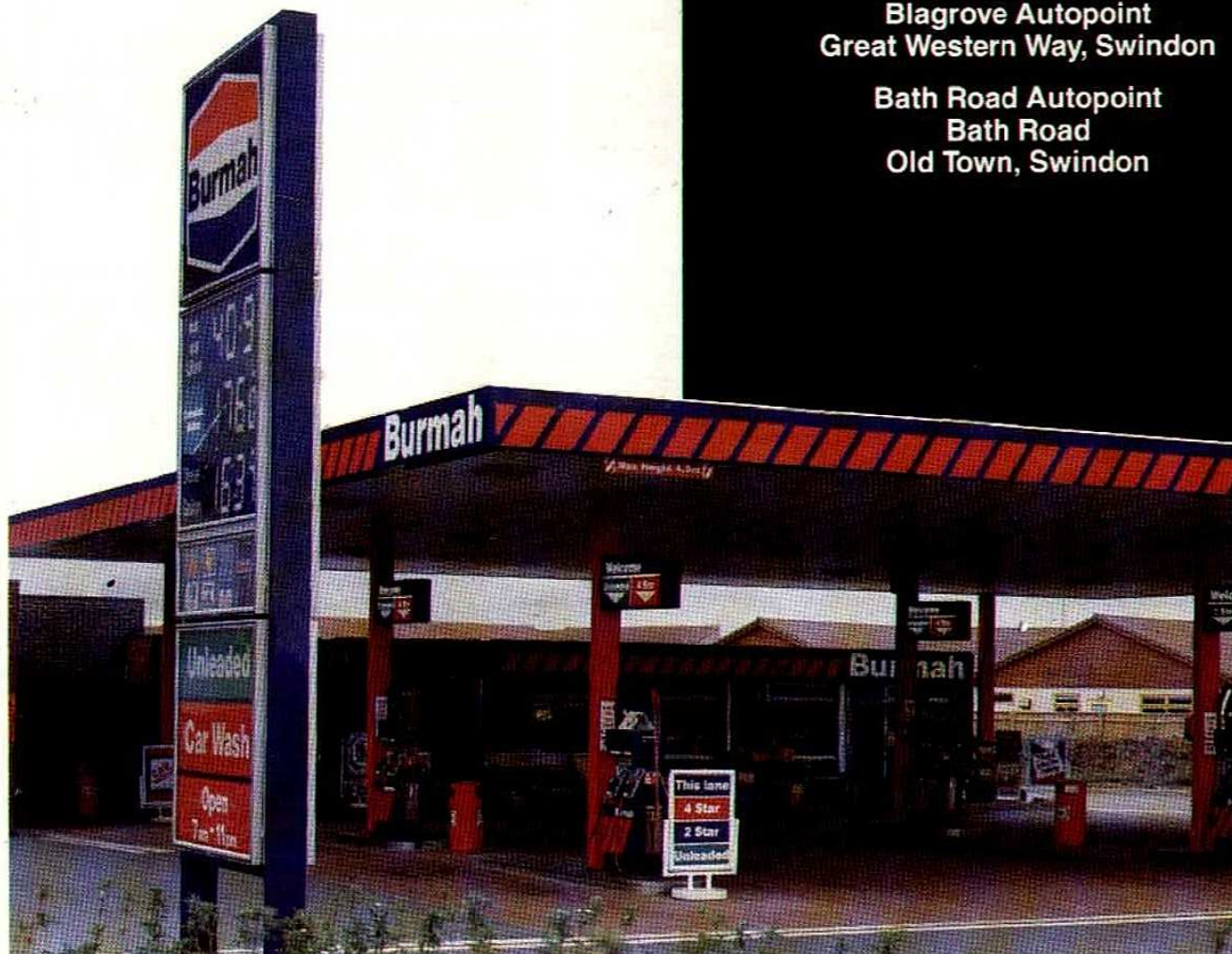

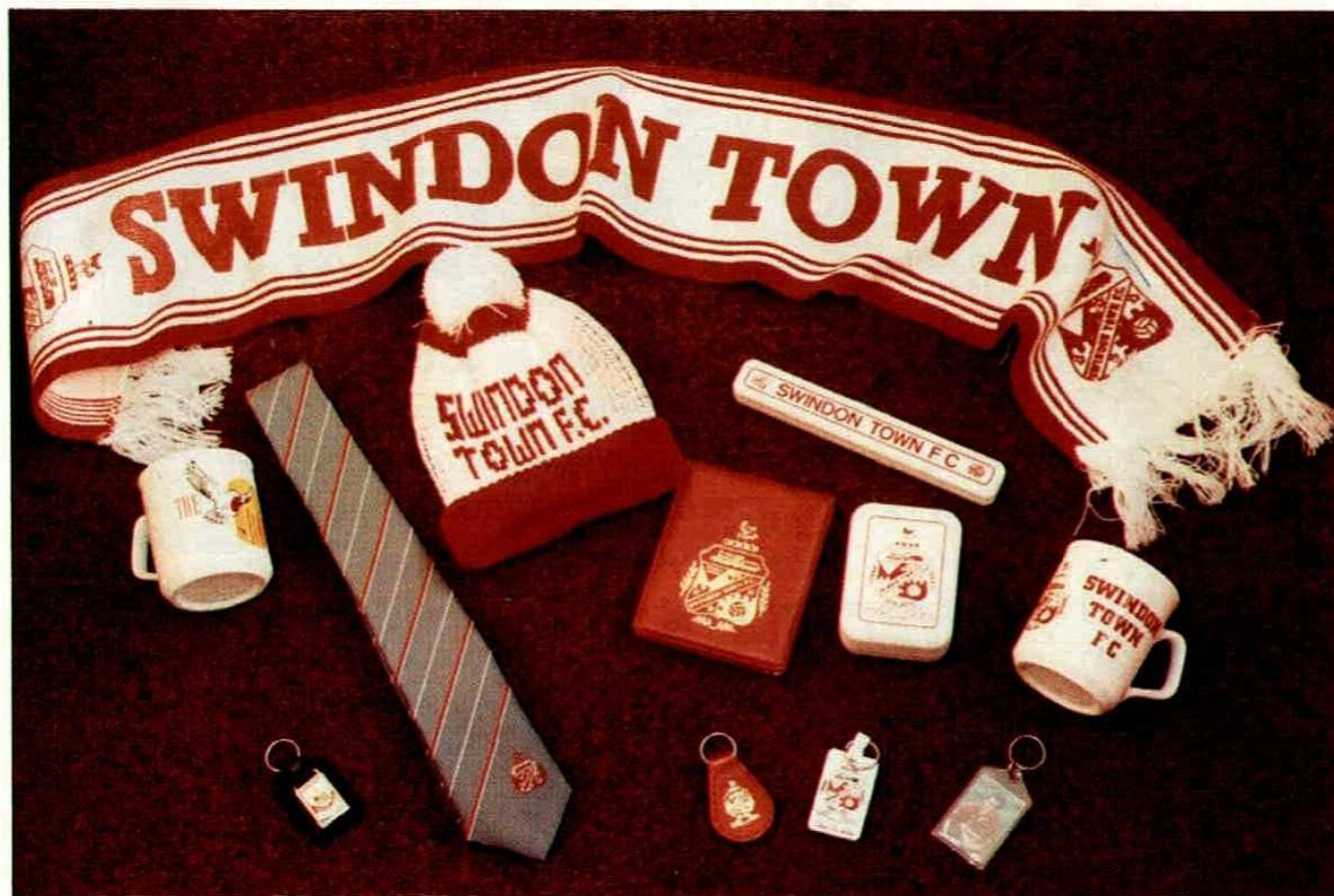

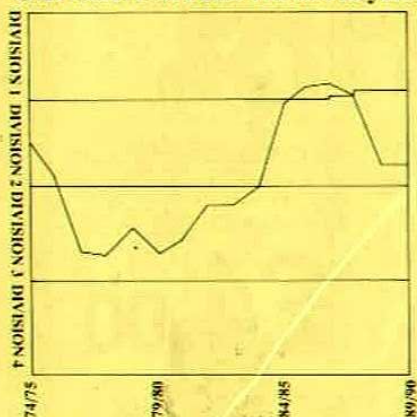

United recorded their best win of the season, 5-1, recently against second-placed Oldham Athletic. Swindon's visit to Oxford in September was also a six-goal thriller, with the Town fighting back after going two goals down in the first five minutes.

Goalkeeper Kenny Veysey was signed from Torquay following a spell at the Manor Ground. He made his debut at the end of November following Oxford's heaviest defeat of the season, 5-2 at home by Middlesbrough. The 23 year old began his career at Plainmoor as understudy to former Town 'keeper Ken Allen. Veysey took over from Northern Ireland 'keeper Paul Kee, who has recently recovered from injury. Kee, 21, was signed for a bargain £15,000 from Ards.

Full-back Les Robinson was a £150,000 signing from Doncaster almost a year ago. He

has spent most of his career in midfield and made his League debut at Mansfield, in the same side as Colin Calderwood. Mike Ford began this season in the left-back position, but this has been filled recently by Garry Smart. Ford is the son of Tony, who played for both Bristol clubs in the 1960's. Mike was signed from Cardiff for £150,000 in 1988 and was previously with Devizes Town. Devon-born Smart arrived from Wokingham Town, also in 1988.

Centre-backs Steve Foster and Andrew Melville cost United almost half a million pounds. tribunal decided £275,000 and is a Welsh international.

In midfield, Les Phillips is the longest serving player on Oxford's books, having arrived from Birmingham almost seven years ago. Jim Magilton, 21, is a former captain of Liverpool's Central League side. He had not made his Football League debut before joining United for £100,000. Mickey Lewis came from Derby County, as did David Penney who has also featured in midfield. Penney scored one of those early goals against the Town back in September and was also on target in United's 3-0 Combination win recently. Mark was born in South Africa and began his career at Luton. Former Manor Ground apprentice Lee Nogan made his League debut while on loan to Brentford in April 1987. After another loan spell, at Southend, he made his First Division debut for Oxford a year later.

## MARCH 5

On this day in 1980 Oxford United drew at West Ham but could only take five more points from their remaining twelve games and were relegated to Division Two at the end of the season.

March 5th 1987 the Football League announced a £3,000 payment to Argentine's International Diego Maradona to lead the Rest of the World side at Wembley in the League's centenary celebrations.

March 5th 1988 Liverpool win 1-0 against QPR to go 17 points clear at the top of Division One and on March 5th 1984 Swansea City sack John Toshack as their manager. Could he be on his way back to Anfield as the new Liverpool manager on 5th March 1991?

March 5th 1905 two Colin Gordon goals give Swindon a 2-0 home win against Exeter City. Line-up: Endersby, Ramsey, Baillie, Macari, Gray, Cole, Hockaday, Rowland, Gordon, Caldwell, Nelson.

5th March 1983 Swindon lost 1-0 away to Mansfield Town.

5th March 1977 a rare away draw at Gillingham for Swindon Town. Goals from Ray McHale and David Moss take a point.

5th March 1969 Swindon lost 2-0 at Gillingham, ten days earlier the Town had beaten the Gills 1-0 at the County Ground with a Peter Noble goal in the last minute, in front of 17,489 spectators.

Ten days later Swindon Town went on to complete the first half of their double that season. The never-to-be-forgotten 3-1 League Cup win over Arsenal at Wembley followed by promotion to Division Two.

5th March 1966 Swindon defeat Brentford at Griffin Park 1-0 thanks to a Roger Smart goal. Line-up: Downsborough, Dawson, Trollope, Morgan, Nurse, Shergold, Weaver, Smart, East, Brown, Rogers.

5th March 1960 Swindon were defeated 3-0 at Elm Park by Reading, the Town's second successive 3-0 defeat, having lost at home to table topping Southampton a week earlier.
