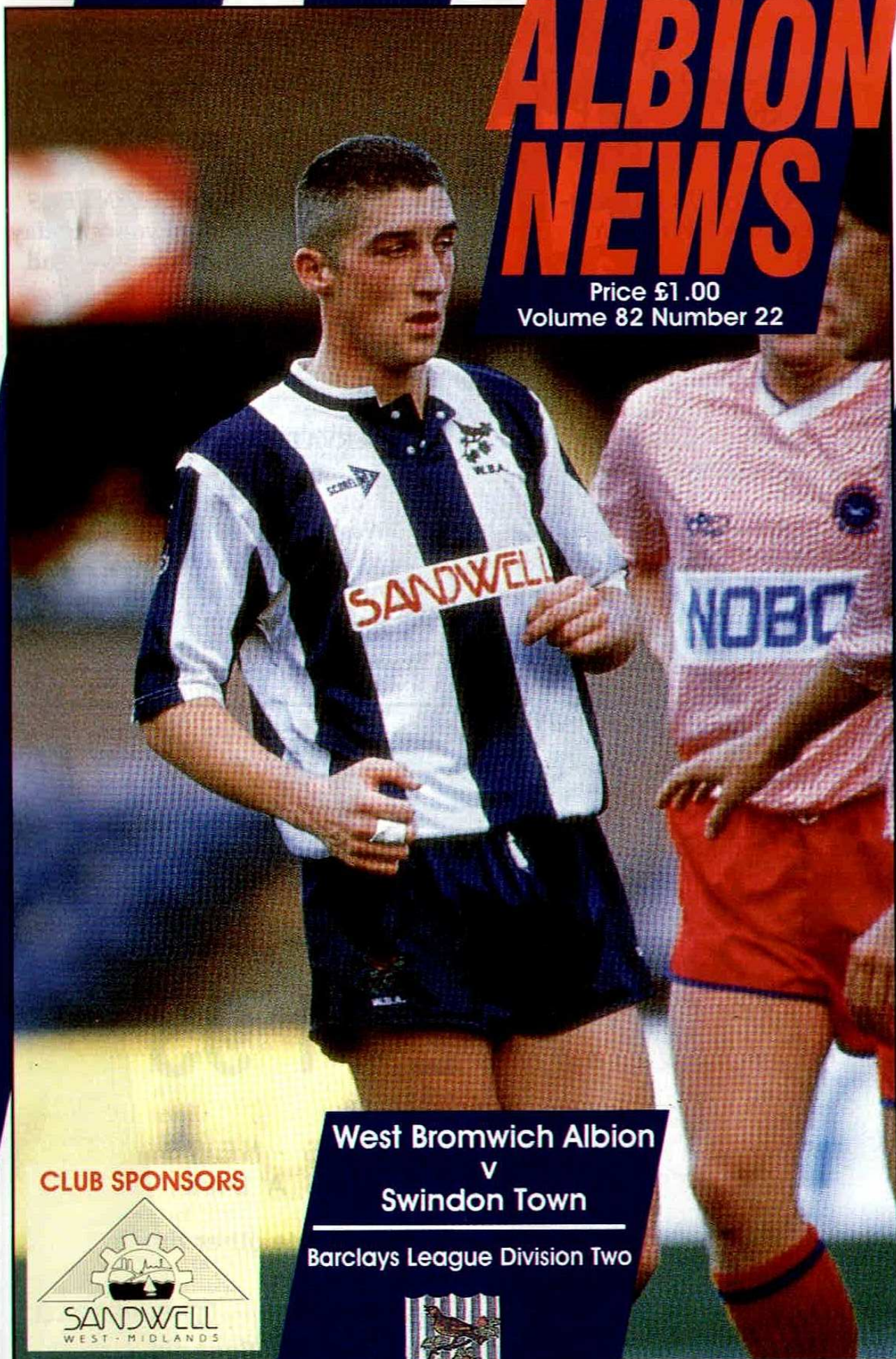

## PAST ENCOUNTERS

Albion have lost their last three League games against Swindon Town by the same scoreline - 2-1.

Of the previous nine encounters - all in Division 2 - Albion have won just twice, their last victory coming in season 1988-89, by 3-1 here at The Hawthorns. Swindon, in fact, have only failed to score in two of those past nine clashes!

## LOOKING BACK

*Ten Years - to 4th April 1981*

A rare goal by Brendon Batson helped Albion beat Championship-chasing Ipswich Town 3-1 at The Hawthorns in front of a 22,000 plus gate. Peter Barnes and Ally Brown were Albion's other scorers in a match the Baggies really didn't want to win - for it meant that the Villa eventually took the title!

*Twenty Years - to 2nd April 1971*

Over 43,500 fans packed into Anfield to see Albion take a point off Liverpool. Tony Brown scored our goal in the 1-1 draw, which saw the Reds snatch a point right at the death.

*Thirty Years - to 1st April 1961*

Big 'Shack' Lovatt, playing in only his fifth game for Albion, scored the goal which gave the Baggies a hard-earned 1-0 win at Blackpool where the turnout was almost 21,000.

*Forty Years - to 4th April 1951*

A penalty by Ray Barlow was not enough to save Albion from going down 3-1 at home to Blackpool in a First Division match which attracted a crowd of almost 40,000.

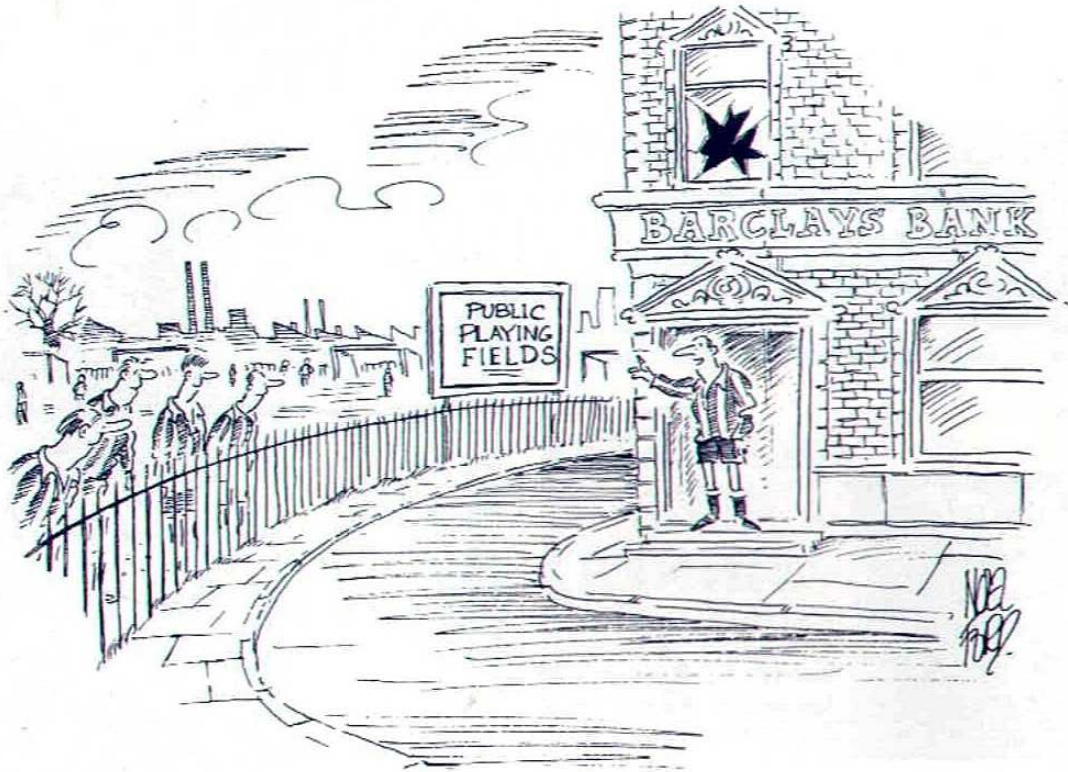

## PLAYED FOR BOTH CLUBS

JIMMY COOKSON had one of the best scoring records of any Albion player - 110 goals in 131 appearances.

He was a most deadly marksman, who in fact netted 255 League goals during a sparkling career which saw him play, in turn, for Manchester North End (1920), Manchester City (1921), Southport (trialist), Chesterfield (1925), Albion (1927), Plymouth Argyle (1933) and finally Swindon Town (1936), retiring in 1938 to become a Publican, although he still played non-competitive football right up until 1952.

Born in Manchester in December 1904, Jimmy cost Albion £2,500 in June of 1927 and when he left The Hawthorns, in August 1933, Albion received £1,500 off Plymouth.

Jimmy cracked in a double hat-trick when Albion swamped Blackpool 6-3 in a Second Division match at The Hawthorns in September 1927 - a record which still holds good today - and in fact he notched 92 League goals in just 103 outings for the Baggies in his first three seasons with the club.

His 100th League goal of his career came up in only his 89th match (December 1927) and it was surprising to everyone - certainly to the Albion fans - that he never won an England cap. He did, however, represent the F.A. XI in Canada in 1931 - the year he helped Albion achieve promotion from the Second Division, although he only figured in one F.A. Cup tie that season when the Baggies carried off that 'unique' double.

Jimmy topped the Third Division (N) scoring charts in 1925-26 with 44 goals and then he headed the Second Division list in 1927-28 with 38, the season he broke Freddie Morris's record for most goals in a season. For Swindon Jimmy claimed 30 League goals in two seasons.

This goalscoring genius died at Warminster in December 1970.

## THE SEASON SO FAR

Swindon kicked off the present campaign with wins over Charlton and Ipswich, but after two wins and a draw in their first three away games they struggled for a time on their travels though still managing to draw 3-3 at Brighton and 0-0 at Sheffield Wednesday. They pulled off a resounding 1-0 win at Bristol City in January, but since an FA Cup defeat at Norwich in which they had two defenders sent off after holding the lead they had another run of away defeats halted recently by a 1-1 draw at Bristol Rovers.

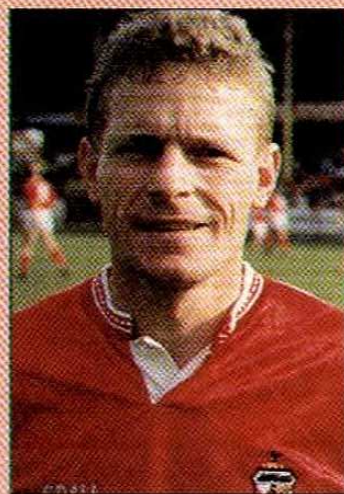
Since losing four home games in quick succession in October and November they have enjoyed a good run at the County Ground though after a thrilling 2-1 win over Sheffield

Wednesday there in February (thus avenging a Rumbelows Cup defeat) they slipped up in a 3-1 defeat by Brighton recently.

Duncan Shearer (ex-Chelsea and Huddersfield) is their leading scorer for the second successive season and Steve White (ex Bristol Rovers, Luton and Charlton) and a most valuable free transfer signing and up and coming Fitzroy Simpson have also been on the mark recently.

In midfield Steve Foley, who came from Sheffield United in 1987, is also a useful goalsnatcher and he is likely to be linking up today with Ross MacLaren (ex-Shrewsbury and Derby) Tom Jones (from Aberdeen last season) and Mickey Hazzard a vastly experienced player in his first season after extensive service with Spurs and Chelsea.

In defence Jon Gittens came from Southampton in 1987, David Kerslake came from QPR last season, Paul Dobri from Newport in 1988, and tall Adrian Viveash from the junior ranks. One-time Mansfield man Colin Calderwood who recently returned to the side after a 5-month absence may also come into the reckoning as may new defender Tony Finnigan (ex-Crystal Palace and Blackburn). In goal Fraser Digby a £32,000 signing from Manchester United in 1986 has been watched by at least one First Division club recently.

## SWINDON THROUGH THE YEARS

- Twins Alf and John Stephens both scored for Swindon against Exeter in a Division Three (South) game on September 21, 1946.
- In Swindon's game against Southend in November 1949, a total of six goals were disallowed for offside. The final score was 2-2.
- In February 1951 Swindon lost 8-2 at Southend after being two goals up.
- John Trollope made his debut at the age of 16 in August 1960 and went on to make 368 successive appearances for Swindon before being put out of the game for a spell with a broken arm.
- Fullbacks (who in those days rarely ventured upfield) Owen Dawson and John Trollope both scored within two minutes of each other for Swindon against Mansfield in April 1966.
- Swindon won the League Cup in 1969 when in Division Three - a distinction they share with QPR, who won it two years earlier.
- Swindon reached the semi-final of the FA Cup in both 1910 and 1912 while still outside the Football League.
- After losing their opening game of the 1985/6 season (their only home defeat of the season) Swindon went on to pick up 102 points from 46 Football League games.

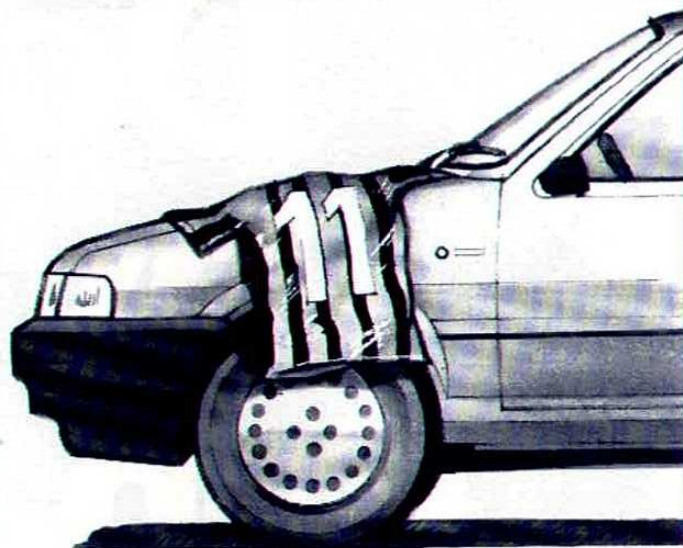

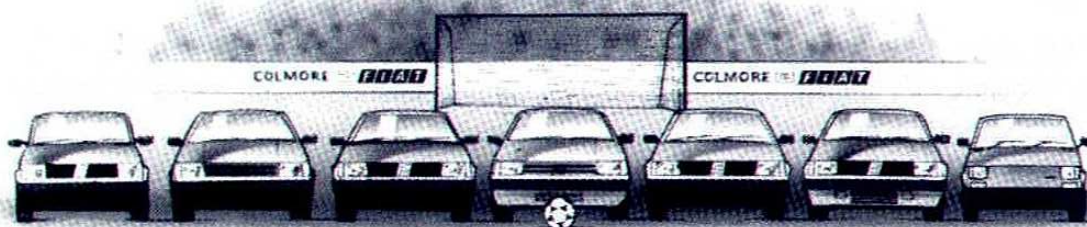

**AT** the top of the table things are really hotting up with Oldham and West Ham divided by goal difference, as the Easter programme commenced with Latics +3 ahead in that department before Saturday's games.

They went down 2-0 at Blackburn last Saturday though, where Steve Livingstone has found his scoring touch, grabbing both of the home side's goals to ease their relegation worries and consign Joe Royle's men to only their sixth defeat of the season.

**THE** Hammers could have taken an outright lead at the top if they had capitalised on Oldham's slip-up at Ewood Park but, whilst they kept yet another clean sheet at Hull, they could not pierce the weakest defence in the league to register a win and the Tigers moved level with us on points.

**SHEFFIELD** Wednesday were the only one of the top three to win last weekend, but they weren't too convincing. In fact it took an own goal by Bristol Rovers' Billy Clark and an 85th minute winner by Paul Williams, for them to earn all three points and close the gap on the leading pair.

**WOLVES** feint hopes of making the playoffs are rapidly diminishing. They were down to ten men at Ashton Gate last weekend when Paul Cook incurred the referee's wrath with something that he said, and was given his marching

orders. The penalty, which had so upset Cook, was missed, but Wolves looked to be out of it when they went behind to a Matt Bryant goal 9 minutes into the second half. However, a goal by Robbie Dennison gave them a point that kept their hopes glimmering. Cook will now miss our match at Molineux.

**WATFORD** still look favourites for the drop into division three. But they pulled off the surprise result of the weekend last Saturday, when they travelled up to Ayresome Park and came away with all three points from their encounter with promotion chasing Middlesbrough.

Boro looked to be home and dry through Ian Bairds 77th minute strike, but Gary Porter put the visitors level with eight minutes left, then Dave Byrne grabbed the winner on the stroke of full time.

Perhaps the Hornets have a sting in the tail after all.

**THAT** set-back for Middlesbrough gave Brighton

the chance to overhaul them courtesy of an impressive 3-1 win at Swindon that puts them at the top of the play-off places and shows they have rediscovered their form at just the right time.

**LEICESTER** City also pulled off something of a shock result with their 2-0 win at Notts County. Crowd trouble led to some injuries amongst supporters and a delay in this eventful game. County defender Dean Yates was sent off for a 'professional' foul on David Oldfield that conceded the penalty which enabled Kevin Russell to extend the lead City had taken through Gary Mills in the 12th minute. City keeper Carl Muggleton also had to face a penalty but he managed to save Mark Draper's effort. Steve Walsh was also sent off for a foul on David Regis, in addition to seven other players being booked.

**PORT** Vale snatched a late victory at Charlton last weekend. Fomer Albion keeper Mark Grew had pulled off a string of fine saves to keep Charlton at bay. Vale's Dutch signing Robin Van der Laan got the only goal of the game in the 86th minute.

**PORTSMOUTH'S** situation was not improved when Kevin Brock got the only goal of the game for Newcastle at Fratton Park last Saturday. But in spite of that win, which moved Newcastle up to 11th place, Jim Smith resigned as the Magpies manager in midweek.

# GOULD'S

## TEAM TALK

**A**s Albion fans will appreciate, these notes for today's game against Swindon Town, were written before our trip to Charlton Athletic on Saturday – but also after a run of five successive defeats.

Since the last of those reversals, against Millwall here at the Hawthorns nine days ago, I have entered the transfer market in order to try and stem the flow of defeats and stop our slide down the second division table. In

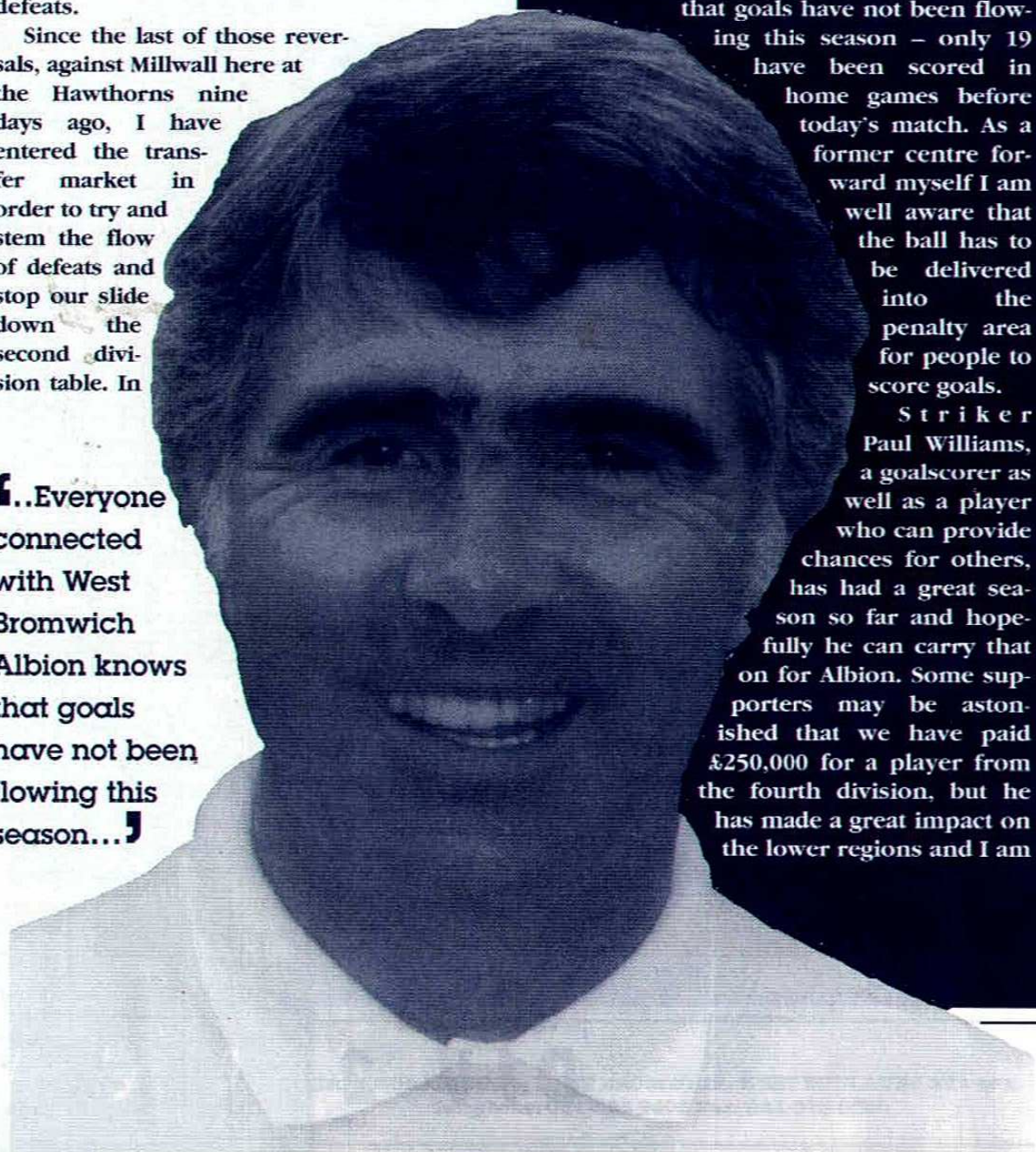

doing this I have the full backing of the board of directors, whom I would like to thank for their support in sanctioning these moves.

As supporters will by now know, I have brought to the club Paul Williams from Stockport County in a £250,000 transaction, Winston White from Burnley for £35,000 and – on loan until the end of the season – Kwame Ampadu from Arsenal. All three have been signed to help create opportunities for the goals we need to start climbing the table.

Everyone connected with West Bromwich Albion knows that goals have not been flowing this season – only 19 have been scored in home games before today's match. As a former centre forward myself I am well aware that the ball has to be delivered into the penalty area for people to score goals.

**S**triker Paul Williams, a goalscorer as well as a player who can provide chances for others, has had a great season so far and hopefully he can carry that on for Albion. Some supporters may be astonished that we have paid £250,000 for a player from the fourth division, but he has made a great impact on the lower regions and I am





confident he will do a good job for us.

He reminds me in some ways of Jeff Astle, particularly with his aerial prowess and his ability to knock balls down for colleagues in the box. In addition to scoring goals that's what he will be aiming to do here, and I'm sure you Brummie Road enders and the rest of our fans will give him your full backing.

'Winnie' White I have known for a long time - he was one of my first signings when I was in management at Hereford United. I signed him after watching him play for

Leicester City reserves. He has gone on from those days to build a good professional career as a pacey winger who gets the ball into the penalty area. He has matured a lot and, as well as making a good contribution on the pitch, he is also a good dressing room influence.

While Winston is a right winger, Kwame Ampadu is a left sided player who fits the bill for the 'Chippy' Clarke type of operator I wanted on our other wing. Kwame has had only a small taste of first team football at Highbury, but he is relishing the thought of

playing in the senior side here and sees it as a good opportunity to further his career.

The addition of these three players will provide added competition for places, an important factor at any club. I am hoping that the new men will not only make a worthwhile contribution to our side but also bring out the best in the players already at the club. A managers job is about mixing and blending players and my task right now is to get a blend that will bring us the points we are looking for in our remaining games of the season.

## View from the other side

Swindon Town arrive at the Hawthorns with a disappointing sequence of six successive away defeats behind them. Before going into the busy Easter programme with a home game against Newcastle United last Saturday, Ossie Ardiles' team were 18th in the second division table - a disappointing return after last season's exciting run to promotion.

The bitter blow of demotion straight back to the second division in unfortunate circumstances has seemed to weigh heavily on the club in the current campaign, though Ardiles has never looked in that direction for excuses despite his side failing to recapture last season's form on a consistent basis.

Part of the problems have been injuries, Dave Bennet having broken his leg in only his second game after joining the club and Colin Calderwood missing five months of the season after damaging knee ligaments against Wolves in September.

Due in part to the club's financial situation Ardiles has also had to begin breaking up last season's successful squad by selling players. Three men - Alan McLoughlin, Paul Bodin and Jon Gittens - have been sold for combined total of £2 million.

Midfielder McLoughlin has been missed for his goalscoring prowess as much as his skills in the middle of the park. He hit 16 goals last season and that kind of strike rate has been conspicuously lacking from the midfield area this time around, though up front leading goalscorer Duncan Shearer is still knocking in the goals - he had hit 18 before the weekend, having notched 27 last year.

The last of the big money trio to move away from the County Ground was central defender Jon Gittens, once of local non-League outfit Paget Rangers, who re-joined his first professional club Southampton last week for £400,000.

As part of the deal ex-Aston Villa striker Paul Rideout switched from Saints to Swindon on loan, with the possibility of the move being made permanent at the end of the loan period. Like Gittens, Rideout was moving back to his first pro club - he made his first debut for Swindon as a 16 year old, going from there to Villa then on to Italian club Bari before returning to England to join Southampton.

Rideout will be aiming to help his new side complete the double this afternoon, Swindon having won Decembers game at the County Ground 2-1 after Graham Roberts had put Albion ahead from the penalty spot.





# THE ROBINS

**T**oday we welcome a Swindon side still a little shellshocked after the traumas of last summer but they have still managed to hold their own in Division Two.

This was easily the most dramatic chapter in the history of the club that dates back to 1881. They were known at first as Swindon Spartans, becoming Swindon Town in 1883 and joining the Southern League in 1894. They finished bottom of nine clubs in their first season there but after being runners-up in 1909 and 1910 they topped the table in 1911.

Meanwhile they reached the FA Cup semi-final in both 1910 and 1912 and took Barnsley to a replay in the latter.

They were Southern League champions again in 1914 and together with other members of that league they became founder members of the new Division Three in 1920.

This became Division Three (South) a year later and they stayed there throughout its existence until 1958. They then qualified for the new Division Three and stayed there until winning promotion for the first time ever in 1963. Then although relegated two seasons later they got together one of the best Third Division sides ever with Mike Summerbee, Ernie Hunt, Bobby Woodruff and Don Rogers amongst the players who ultimately passed on to First Division clubs. Though Don Rogers was the only one of these stars remaining by then, they reached the semifinal of the FA Cup in 1966/7 and won promotion and the Football League Cup in 1968/9.

They stayed up this time until 1974, but then came a sudden slide that landed them in Division Four in 1982. Then after four seasons there they roared back to Division Three in 1986 and the momentum carried them up to Division Two a year later after battling through the playoffs. They finished twelfth, sixth and fifth in the next three seasons as they bid for a place in Division One for the first time ever. They lost to Crystal Palace in the 1988/9 playoffs but then beat Blackburn and Sunderland at that stage last season. At first the Football League demoted them to Division Three, but on appeal they were allowed to remain in Division Two.



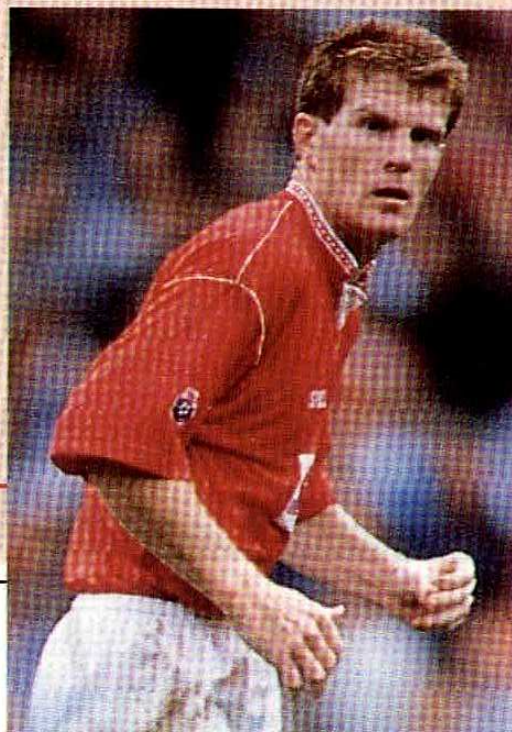

## Star Visitor Duncan Shearer

Swindon's ace goalscorer who got the winner against us at the County Ground this season is now well into his second century of league and cup goals.

Born in Port William in 1966 he joined Chelsea from Clachnacuddin in 1983, graduated to two first full games in 1985/6 in the course of which he scored one goal and then moved on to Huddersfield for £10,000 in March 1986. He got a hat-trick in his first full game at Barnsley and two more a week later against Stoke and averaged a goal a game until the end of the season. In the following season he played in every game and totalled 24 goals including one against us at Leeds Road and then in 1987/8 netted in the game here en route to a season's bag of 13 that included a League cup hat-trick at Rotherham.

He moved to Swindon for a £250,000 fee in the summer of 1988 and got 16 goals in his first season there. With the advent of Ossie Ardiles as manager there in the summer of 1989 his career gained a shot in the arm and his goals included one here in December 1989. That was his best haul to date though he could well be challenging it this season. His goals so far include his usual one against us at the County Ground and he has recently netted in the games against Bristol Rovers and Brighton. Not tall by traditional striker standards Duncan has what it takes in the danger zone and his career tally of 109 goals in around 230 games speak for themselves.

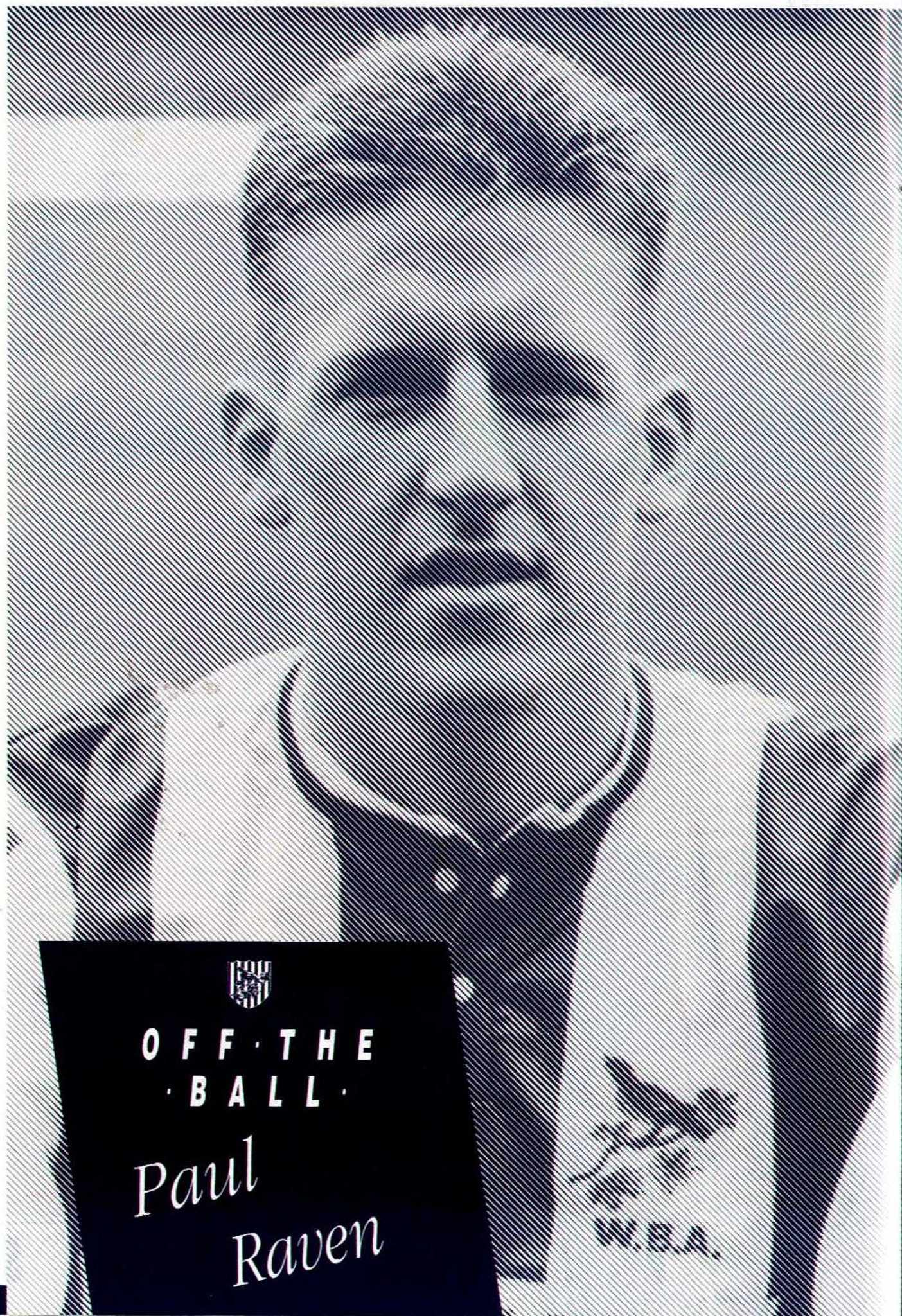
serving a number of clubs, including Luton Town and Charlton Athletic, and is now mighty close to the 150 mark in League goals alone.

**P**aul Raven is the first to admit that West Bromwich Albion fans have not seen him at his best.

Since arriving at the Hawthorns from Doncaster in a £180,000 joint deal which also brought Ronnie Robinson to West Brom, two years ago, central defender Paul seems to have been plagued by one problem after another.

"Admittedly, my own personal form has been very much up-and-down, but even taking that into consideration, it has been quite a frustrating time," he said. "I have been in and out of the team ever since I got here, what with injuries and suspensions and everything else. As I say, the fans haven't seen me anywhere near my best yet."

This season alone, highlights what an up-and-down time Paul has had since moving to the Midlands from Yorkshire. He only recently recovered from a troublesome thigh injury. That came after he had only just completed a suspension, and before then, he had managed only six full first-team games and five on the subs bench.

"It is awful for players to keep coming in and out of the team like this," he said. "It is much better if you can get into the team and then keep your place. You cannot expect to get any consistency in your play when you are not playing in the team on a regular basis," he added.

When former manager Brian Talbot signed Paul, he tagged the young defender as one of the brightest prospects around. "That meant I had one helluva reputation to live up to, and it has not been easy," he said.

"It puts pressure on a player when people start saying all these sorts of things about you. It is nice to be praised, but sometimes, the praise can bring you problems."

"Having said that, though, we are all professionals and we have to live with pressures."

Talking of pressure led Paul onto the problems facing West Brom following the club's

nosedive down the Second Division table. "Yes, it has been quite a worrying time," he admitted, but we are all confident we can battle our way out of trouble. If we did not think that, we might as well give up here and now," he said.

"But, despite results having gone against us in recent weeks, there is still a lot of confidence around the place. The smiles are still there, and I think a lot of that is down to the new manager, Bobby Gould. He has come in like a breath of fresh air. OK, results have been bad, but even so, training is going well under the new manager and coach Stuart Pearson."

So, what does Paul get up to when he is not either training or playing, or under treatment? "Oh the usual things," he said.

"Like a lot of footballers, I quite like a game of golf every now and then, and I also enjoy playing snooker. I usually play with Simeon Hodson and Steve Parkin - even though Steve sometimes struggles to reach the table. I don't know how many people have noticed, but Steve is not one of the taller players on West Brom's books!"

Apart from football, snooker and golf, Paul does not have too many other hobbies and prefers to spend the rest of his spare time relaxing at his Great Barr home. "When I first joined West Brom I moved into digs in Great Barr," he recalled. "Then I was able to buy a house in the area about a year ago," he said. "People always say put your money in property. That's just what I did."

"Mind you, I am useless at the old D.I.Y. stuff. So, as soon as anything like that is needed, I have to get on the phone to mom and dad and ask them to help sort things out."

# THANKS FOR THE MEMORY

**JOE KENNEDY, WHO  
WENT ON TO BECOME  
ONE OF THE GREAT  
CENTRE-HALVES IN  
ALBION'S HISTORY**



This week in April 1949, a raven-haired 23 year-old young man from Cleator Moor near Whitehaven, stepped out at Kenilworth Road, Luton, to make his Football League debut for West Bromwich Albion.

That day he lined up wearing the No.4 shirt in place of Ray Barlow, who had been switched to inside-right following an injury to Cyril Williams.

Albion beat the Hatters 1-0 and the two points gained helped set them up for promotion from the Second Division....and this same player, who did so well on his baptism, was a key figure in the run-in at the end of that 1948-49 season.

***....Wolves beat Leicester  
City 3-1 at Wembley to  
win the F.A. Cup***

His name was Joe Kennedy, who went on to become one of the great centre-halves in Albion's history - a player who surely deserved an England cap for all the magnificent performances he put in over the next 12 years or so for the Baggies.

Joe was so astute in everything he did. He was a player who never did a dirty trick - I don't think he was ever cautioned by a referee - and he hardly ever committed a foul in a crucial area.

***....North Atlantic

His coolness on the ball, his superb heading, his footwork, his general ability and positional sense and above all, his dedication to the cause, made him such a star in the famous navy blue and white stripes.

He made close on 400 League and Cup appearances for the Albion from April 1949 until February 1961.

In between times he acted as reserve to England on many, many occasions and each time he had to sit and watch the likes of Harry Johnston (Blackpool), Billy Wright (Wolves), Sid Owen (Luton) and a few others doing their duty on the international circuit which, I feel, he would have graced just as well, if not better!

***...Mao Tse-tung established  
Communist Regime in China***

Joe was born in November 1925 and after playing his early football in the north of England he came south and following unsuccessful trials with Millwall and Brentford, he teamed up with Altrincham from where he was recommended to the Albion by former Hawthorns winger Arthur Gale.

He came to the

Midlands for a fee of £750 in December 1948 and after a good spell in the Central League side, he was given his senior debut at Luton at a vital stage in the season just as the promotion race was hotting up.

Joe was an immediate success as Albion stormed through to regain their First Division status and to celebrate Joe actually scored a killer goal in a 3-0 win at Leicester which secured promotion.

***...Germany was divided -

For the next two seasons he played mostly at right-half, with Jack Vernon at '5'.

Jack left Albion in 1952 and into his centre-half shirt went Joe - and although Jimmy Dugdale was also in fine form and eager to grab his place in the heart of the defence, Joe held on.

***...Rangers did the treble in Scotland, pipping Dundee to take the Scottish League crown, beating Clyde 4-1 in the F.A. Cup Final and defeating Raith 2-0 in the League Cup***

Sadly a cartilage injury sidelined Joe from February to November 1953 and it was perhaps a surprise that he got back into the team following an injury to right-back Stan Rickaby. But there is no doubt that his inclusion in the 1954 Cup Final at Wembley was an important ploy by manager Vic Buckingham. Joe had a blinder that sunny afternoon and helped set up Albion's winning goal for Frank Griffin.

***....Comecon (Council for Mutual Economic Assistance) founded by Soviet Union and Communist States***

Jimmy Dugdale was eventually sold to the Villa and Joe went straight back into the No.5

slot, a position he held with pride and resilience right through until April 1958.

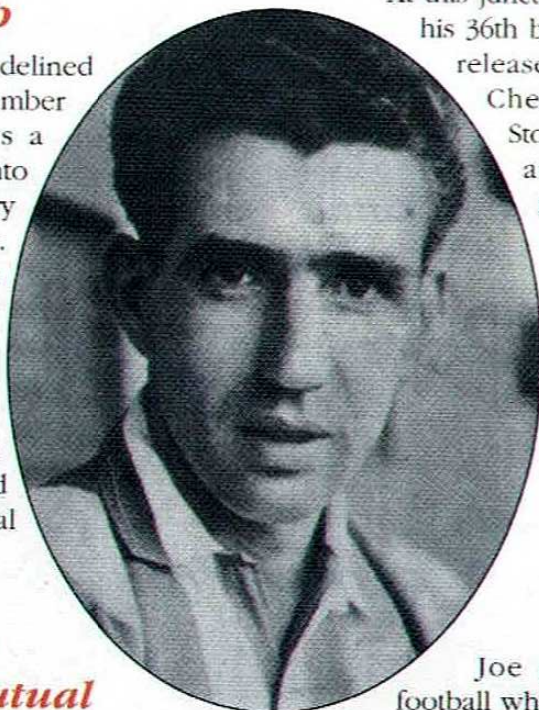
He then had another cartilage go and was out of action for a further eight months before coming back towards the end of the 1958-59 season.

***...England suffered her first home defeat from a foreign country when Eire won 2-0 at Goodison Park***

He successfully got through the 1959-60 campaign, missing only one League game (v. Blackpool) and indeed he was in good form for two-thirds of the following season before handing over his No.5 shirt to new-signing Stan Jones (from Walsall).

At this juncture Joe was heading towards his 36th birthday and Albion agreed to release him on a free transfer to Chester. He later served Stourbridge (as player-manager) and turned out occasionally for his work's team, Brockhouse F.C.

Joe played his last game of football when he was turned 40, and he was still working at Brockhouse's when he sadly passed away in September 1986, at the age of 60.

"Already, CCTV has had a major impact on the hooligan problem inside football grounds as well as proving extremely useful to monitor safety measures. If any trouble appears on the screen or is reported from any quarter of the ground, the CCTV can zoom in on the incident. The police can then record what occurs on colour video and on hard copy prints. Individuals can be picked out by facial appearance and the colour of their clothing. The evidential effect of such a video recording has proved formidable. It has persuaded hooligans, who would previously have sought to challenge oral evidence of identification, to plead guilty. Hooligans know cameras are keeping a roving watch and their activities in the ground are inhibited by that knowledge."
