

will obviously be missed, but as I stressed earlier in the week, no matter who wasn't here they would still be missed, whether it be Dion or the





The football league computers choice of Swindon Town as our first visitors in the second division means a real touch of irony for Colin Bailie, for it was with the Robins that he started his professional career.

Colin recalls: "I started playing for a very good boys club in Belfast at the age of 14, and in 1980 Swindon offered me a contract. After five years and about a hundred appearances for them I moved up the M4 to sign for Reading, and then in the summer of 1988 came the move to Cambridge".

In his three years here, Colin has made the transition from right back to midfield, and has played his full part in the clubs double promotion. He says of the clubs success "The exceptional work rate, organisation and all round ability have been key factors. We all work for each other".

27 year old Colin has built up a reputation as one of the most articulate members of his profession. He is one of the few members of the squad with second division experience, and says of the months ahead "It's a special feeling for me to be back in division two. For most of the players, it's the great unknown, and we are very much looking forward to it".



Due to the Police only being able to control just the standard Football programme, there apparently isn't the necessary manpower available for a Second Replay. In other words, if an F.A. Cup tie is still a draw after a replay, and extra time has been played, it goes to a penalty shoot out. It means that our thrilling 5th Round Second Replay against Bristol City would not now ever happen. It's a real shame, that for over a century, this historic competition now has to make such a fundamental rule change, what next?

UPDATE

UPS AND DOWNS IN THE YEAR AHEAD

Despite the current uncertainty surrounding the future structure of the oldest League in the world - that is why it is called The Football League - the promotion (and relegation) places that all teams are playing for in the coming season are shown below.

DIVISION ONE - (Three down) Bottom three clubs go down.

DIVISION TWO - (Three up and three down) Top two clubs gain automatic promotion together with one from next four placed clubs via the Play-Offs. Bottom three clubs go down.

DIVISION THREE - (Three up & four down) Top two clubs gain automatic promotion together with one from next four placed clubs via the Play-Offs. Bottom four clubs to down.

DIVISION FOUR - (Four up but no one down) Top three clubs gain automatic promotion together with one from next four placed clubs via the Play-Offs. No club is relegated but Football Conference Champions promoted to The Football League.

ODD SEASON FOR THE FOURTH DIVISION

For the first time in its thirty-three year history, Division Four will consist this season of an odd number of clubs, with twenty-three sides competing for the four promotion places on offer. Each week, therefore one club receives a 'bye' with a full Fourth Division fixture programme consisting of only eleven games.

The situation has arisen as a direct result of the decision to expand the First Division to 22 clubs which was taken at an EGM in August 1990. As a result of this amendment (which only three First Division Clubs voted against at the time), the number of clubs in membership of The Football League would thus be increased (over two seasons) by two, this change being facilitated by no relegation to, but promotion from, the Football Conference during this period. So again this year, the bottom club in the Fourth Division does not face demotion to the Conference.

A RETURN TO NATURE

For the first time in ten years all First and Second Division games this season will be played on a natural grass pitch. Both Luton Town and newly promoted Oldham Athletic have replaced their synthetic surfaces during the close season, leaving Third Division Preston North End as the only club amongst the 93 members of The Football League with a plastic pitch.

Under League regulations the Deepdale club have until 1995/6 to return to grass unless in the meantime they gain promotion.



Matches to Remember: United v Scunthorpe, 28th October 1989

I'm sure I've seen better games in my time of supporting United, but I still feel this game was unique, it had just about everything.

On arriving at the ground the most noticeable thing was the force 10 gale blowing straight down the pitch. The rain merely ensured the match was witnessed by only 2395 (a real bygones attendance I). United won the toss and put Scunthorpe into bat, defending the Newmarket Road end. Each goalkeeper's first goalkick was a pointer of what was to come. John Vaughan's was saved by his opposite number, whereby Peter Lichfield's first just got out of his own penalty areal It was from one of these goalkicks that Gary Clayton was presented with an open goal - just 50 yards out with only eight defenders to beat, but Gary coolly side too ted the ball into the net, one bounce over the 'keepers head.

A goalkick by Vaughan helped set up the second goal. Dion Dublin managed to get a touch, for John Taylor to run onto and slot the ball past the advancing keeper. Next came one of the most spectacular goals ever seen at the Abbey Stadium. Maybe Chris Leadbitter will tell us what was going through his mind as he beat an opponent to a loose ball, just in his own half. Personally I think he spotted Lichfield two yards off his line and decided to launch the ball upwards. For everybody in the ground the ball just disappeared. Nobody knows how high it went - not even the met office. When the ball re-appeared it was heading at 890 towards the Scuntherpe goal, poor Lichfield didn't

stand a chance, but his horizontal backwards dive did succeed in making the goal look even more spectacular.

We all knew United needed a good half-time lead to defend in the second half and the fourth goal came in the 35th minute, this time nothing to do with the conditions, a good run by Lee Philipott was converted from 4 yards by Dion Dublin. Scunthorpe pulled a goal back before half time when everybody missed a swirling cross except Gary Marshall at the far post.

United needed to weather the early second half storm, but instead managed to concede two goals in the first eight minutes. A wind assisted corner tapped in by Ian Daws and a penalty converted on the rebound by Ian Hamilton. The pressure was on.

Scunthorpe were a good footballing team and let United off the hook by playing some nice, short passing football, instead of using the conditions to their advantage. United, indeed had ridden the storm and eventually made the game sale with 15 minutes to go. Another good run by Philipott again found Dublin free to make the final score

'PERSONALLY'

Throughout the Summer football has done battle in the High Court, but this time it's not the terrace fans in the dock, but groups possible that set to do the game more damage than hooliganism - the F.A. and the Football League as they battle out plans for the formation of the "Super League".

The clubs quitting the Football League to join the "Super League" have been promised mega bucks, although it is far from clear if any T.V. company is prepared to pay this sort of money (remember ITV's reluctance to pay for Arsenal's potential championship decider last season).

The whole Super League Scheme has been brought in on the back of helping the England team (that reached the semi-finals of the last World Cup!), and falling into line with the rest of Europe. The French have recently closed down some of their teams owing to bad debts, whilst one of our "big five" is embarrassingly in debt yet still spending millions in the transfer market! (Are Super League teams expected to meet any financial standards?)

The Super League plan suggests regionalisation for

the lower Leagues, a totally unnecessary measure in these days of improved roads and travel, besides a line drawn halfway across the country does a negligible amount to cut down travelling. (Would regionalisation mean local games at holiday time?)

It was uncertain what rewards we in the Second Division were playing for this season, even before Sunderland Chairman, Bob Murray, took his brave stance of isolating the breakaway clubs. How the cups will be affected under the F.A.'s proposals, is anybody's guess, as their intentions have been kept under wraps, further grounds for scepticism I would suggest.

I believe we need one body to take our game into the twenty first century, a coalition of the F.A. and Football League, looking at reducing the amount of games played, starting with the abolition of two legged cup ties. As football clubs everywhere become more and more greedy let us not forget the goose that lays the golden eggs - the fans.

THE CLIMB TO THE TOP by David Scanes

The end of the season again saw the surge of Cambridge United. This time twenty six points were earned in just five hecks weeks and eleven games. The next best run was from Brentford which moved them up from 9th to 6th and a piace in the play offs. Their last game and win at Southerd gave Cambridge, not just the automatic promotion they were seeking but the Championship. This had only been a dream for Cambridge who had had two hours at the top after beating Wigan in a noon kick-off.

The table below will show you the consistency of the two clubs below Cambridge. Also the fall off of Leyton Orient and Stoke, who at the beginning of December, could both have hoped for promotion. In the run in Stoke and Exeter gathered only 4 points whereas the struggling clubs Crewe and Rotherham gained 14 points but as Fulham got 13 it was not quite enough to save those two from relegation.

Shrewsbury with 33 points since the beginning of February saved themselves and they climbed from 23rd to a more respectable 18th. The bottom four were always likely to be the ones in danger and Bolton were the only likely contenders for automatic promotion who were unlucky at the very end caught by Cambridge's sprint.

Tottenham, prior to leaving for Monaco in the summer of 1987. Made a number of appearances in Swindon's reserve side last season - at sweeper.

MICKY HAZARD

(age 31, Midfield)

Born Sunderland. Signed from Portsmouth for £130,000 last September. Micky inherited the Town's number four shirt from the transferred Alan McLoughlin. Made 38 League and Cup appearances, scoring eight goals - his best tallies since 1981/82 when he was an up and coming star at White Hart Lane. He won both FA Cup and UEFA Cup medals withTottenham before joining Chelsea for £300,000.

DUNCAN SHEARER

(age 28, Striker)

Born Fort William. Has maintained an impressive "goal every other game" average since making his Football League debut for Chelsea in February 1986. A clubrecord £230,000 signing from Huddersfield Town in June 1988. Duncan has recorded tallies of 16, 27 and 23 for Swindon. Arrived in London from Highland League club Inverness Clachnacuddin in November 1983.

CLUB HISTORY

The club was founded in 1881 by the Reverend W Pitt as an amateur organisation, not adopting a professional status until 1894. Original members of the Southern League on its formation in 1894 the club won the championship in 1911 and 1914 and during the period 1907-14 never finished lower than fifth in the table. The club reached the semi-finals of the FA Cup in 1910 but were beaten by Newcastle United.

In 1920, Swindon became founder members of the Football League Division 3 and had to wait until 1963 until they gained promotion to the Second Division. The club dropped into the Fourth Division for the only time in its history in 1982 but underwent an amazing revival under the managership of Lou Macari. Macari gained promotion to the Second Division in successive years although after his departure to manager West Ham was the target of an Inland Revenue investigation. Found guilty of financial irregularities the club were demoted from a place in the First Division which had been achieved under Macari's replacement Ossie Ardiles. The club are probably most famous for their League Cup victory over Arsenal in 1969 whilst a Third Division club, however they have also won the Anglo Italian Cup in 1970.





NEWS ON TWO

The largest crowds in the Second Division on the opening Saturday was attracted to Roker Park where 20,509 fans saw the two clubs relegated from the First Division last season, Sunderland and Derby draw 1-1. It was the visitors, minus Saunders and Wright who took the lead in the 65th minute through Ray Harford. However Sunderland equalised a minute later with a goal from Armstrong. On Tuesday, however, Sunderland had a comfortable 3-0 win at Barnsley with goals from Gary Owers, Gordon Armstrong and Colin Pascoe. North East rivals, Newcastle, now under the leadership of Ossie Ardiles, did not get the season off to a good start going down 2-1 to Charlton on Sunday at Upton Park. Although United scored through Franz Carr who was making his debut since joining the club from Nottingham Forest, Charlton took the points with goals from Robert Lee and Carl Leaburn.

John Aldridge, playing his first game for Tranmere Rovers following his £250,000 move from Real Sociedad, netted twice to give Rovers a winning start down at Brighton. Another debutant to please his new Manager was Martin Foyle who scored twice in the second half for Port Vale against his old club, Oxford United who had taken an early lead. There was also a good start for Plymouth striker, Dwight Marshall who had been signed from non League Grays Athletic when he scored for Argyle in the 19th minute. Another goal from Robbie Turner was enough to beat visitors Barnsley although they did manage a consolation goal scored by John Pearson who joined the club from Leeds in the Summer.

Last seasons Third Division champions, Cambridge United began where they left off last year with a last gasp victory at Grimsby Town. Defender Danny O'Shea scored in the last minute to earn a 4-3 victory for the visitors who had earlier scored with goals from ace striking partnership, Dion Dublin and John Taylor and a goal from Richard Wilkins. Grimsby, who were badly depleted with injuries, scored their goals though Watson and two for Rees. Another lethal partnership who are back in business. Wolves pair Bull and Mutch, scored a goal each to give the Wolves a 2-0 victory at last seasons escape artists, Watford. Although Watford displayed their new signing, Trevor Putney, who was part of the deal that took Paul Wilkinson and Willie Falconer to Middlesborough, they had Captain Joe McLaughlin sent off for a professional foul. Wolves Manager, Graham Jumer, said after the game "Ask me if Bull and Mutch are the best strikers in the Second Division after they have scored 50 goals between them this season, as that is what I want".

Two of the clubs expecting to be challenging for a promotion spot at the end of the season, Middlesborough and Millwall, met at Ayresome Park with Boro running out winners by the only goal of the game from Robbie Mustoe. Another club hoping to challenge for promotion is big spenders, Blackburn Rovers, who clinched the signing of David Speedie from Liverpool for £500,000 just before the start of the season, could only manage a draw at home to Portsmouth. It took a last minute equaliser from former Manchester United favourite, Kevin Moran to salvage a point for Rovers after Darren Anderton had given Pompey a second half lead.

Promoted Southend United drew 1-1 at home to Bristol City who many are tipping as an outside bet for a promotion place. City opened their home programme on Tuesday against Brighton with a 2-1 victory over the Seagulls. Defenders Martin Slott and Matt Bryant scored for City with Brighton replying through Nicky Bisett. New Manager Brian Little saw his Leicester City side gain a scoreless draw at Glenn Hoddle's Swindon Town whilst last seasons draw experts Ipswich are at it again. Manager John Lyall however will not be pleased after goals from Jason Dozzell, Paul Goddard and Micky Stockwell gave Ipswich a three goal lead over Bristol Rovers at Twerton Park only to see three late goals for the home side even the score.

Rovers new Manager, Martin Dobson, enthused after the game "Ipswich play the way I'd like us to play. I want pressure football, however the spirit right through the team got us the result". Ipswich recorded their first win of the season at Portman Road in midweek beating Port Vale 2-1 although it took a 50th minute penalty to secure the points. Ipswich opened the scoring through striker Chris Kiwomya although Port Vale had equalised with a penalty scored by Captain, Ray Walker.
