WE WERE all delighted with the three points at the end of the game against Newcastle on Saturday.

At Newcastle he has taken with him the same philosophy but is having to try to achieve the same outcome with less resources in terms of experience.



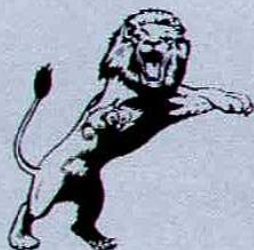

Tonight we entertain Ossie Ardiles' former club, Swindon Town, now managed by Glenn Hoddle and I can imagine that the philosophies from Glenn will be very similar to those of the former manager.

"It's good to have him back in the side, and I'm just keeping my fingers crossed that this time he'll be able to get an extended run."

It was Mick's first Football League goal since October 26, 1986 when he earned Manchester City a 1-1 draw in their First Division showdown with arch rivals Manchester United.

In fact his 431 League appearances have produced just 10 goals, so you can understand why he was so delighted to open his Millwall account during our 2-2 draw with Bristol City.

FLASHBACK

5 YEARS AGO: With a 1-0 lead from the first-leg of our second round League Cup tie at Walsall, the tie looked safe when Teddy Sheringham converted a 12th minute penalty at The Den.

The game was 10 minutes into the second-half when David Kelly pulled one back for Walsall, then in the 68th minute Craig Shakespeare (Walsall) and Alan Walker scored in quick succession but the result was put beyond doubt six minutes from the end when Walker scored again to make it 3-2 on the night and 4-2 on aggregate to the Lions.

Swindon held First Division Southampton to 0-0 at the County Ground but, having lost the first-leg 0-3, they went out of the competition.

10 YEARS AGO: After being held to 3-3 in the first-leg at The Den, we travelled to Oxford for the return game. The only goal went to Oxford when Keith Cassells converted a penalty in the opening half.

Swindon had been beaten 2-5 on aggregate by Wrexham in the first round.

15 YEARS AGO: Goals from Phil Summerill and Phil Walker gave us a 2-1 win at Rotherham. We even scored the Rotherham goal – an own-goal from Ray Evans. Second round ties in those days were a sudden-death affair.

Swindon had been eliminated by 3-4 on aggregate by Northampton in the previous round.

20 YEARS AGO: A Ken Skeen goal was enough to put the Lions out of the League Cup at Oxford. Swindon crashed out by 1-4 at Colchester. Arthur Horsfield scored their goal.

25 YEARS AGO: Our interest had ended in the first round. Following a goalless draw at Brentford, we were beaten 0-1 in the replay at The Den. A certain John Docherty was the Bees' scorer!

But Swindon continued to make progress with a 4-1 home win over Portsmouth. Dennis Brown, Keith East (2) and Don Rogers were all on target for the Robins.



INTO THE LIONS DEN

Player boss Hoddle boosts Swindon's top flight hopes

For the past 15 months Swindon Town have been intent upon winning back what they believe to be rightfully theirs – a place in the First Division.

Their First Division status was taken from them after they had won the play-off final at Wembley in 1990, when the club admitted to breaches of League regulations.

Then manager Ossie Ardiles immediately vowed "to do it all over again" last season.

Sadly, the effect upon the club, its supporters and the entire town was so devastating that there was never any realistic chance of recovering last term.

Swindon, in fact, were close to relegation and it was no real surprise when, having been offered the plum job as manager of Newcastle United, Ardiles left last March.

Glenn Hoddle was thrilled to get the chance to move into management and, with the scars slowly beginning to heal at the County Ground Swindon have a team good enough to make sure of a place in the First Division next season.

Tonight, of course, they come here in the second round of the

Rumbelows League Cup, and, whilst promotion is undoubtedly their major objective at the moment, Hoddle appreciates that a good Cup run would be an additional boost to morale.

Because they finished close to the bottom of the Second Division last season, Swindon had to start in round one.

They set themselves up for victory by defeating W.B.A. by 2-0 in their home-leg, David Mitchell and Micky Hazard getting their goals.

They went a goal down in the return at The Hawthorns but Duncan Shearer ensured their passage into the next round by equalising seven minutes from time.

Though W.B.A. then regained their lead, Shearer scored again to make it 2-2 on the night and 4-2 on aggregate.

Mitchell was one of three players signed by Hoddle during the summer.

He is the Australian international forward who played in the Seoul Olympic football finals.

He came across to Europe to play for Glasgow Rangers, Eintracht Frankfurt, Feyenoord and Chelsea.

But, during his three-year stay at



IN THE HOT SEAT

WHEN it seemed his playing days had been ended by injury, Glenn Hoddle took over as Swindon's manager last March, but he has made such a successful come-back as a player this season that some people are even suggesting he could pull

on an England shirt again.

During his great days at Tottenham in the 'seventies and 'eighties, Glenn played for England on 53 occasions.

He left White Hart Lane in 1987 when Monaco signed him for £800,000.

Stamford Bridge, he got only seven League outings so he was happy to make a fresh start with Swindon.

Centre-back Shaun Taylor was acquired from Exeter City whilst midfielder Martin Ling arrived from Southend to start his second spell at the County Ground.

Swindon started the season with new man Mitchell partnering

Duncan Shearer in attack but Steve White later returned to resume his successful old partnership with Shearer.

Shearer had netted five times prior to the weekend whilst White was on four.

Micky Hazard, Glenn Hoddle, Ross MacLaren and Fitzroy Simpson have been operating in

midfield with new man Ling often being one of the substitutes.

Shaun Taylor has slotted in alongside Colin Calderwood in the middle of the defence with Tom Jones and Adrian Viveash filling the full-back positions in recent weeks.

England under-21 goalkeeper Fraser Digby opened the season

WITH five goals prior to the weekend, DUNCAN SHEARER looks poised to become Swindon's leading scorer for the fourth season in succession.

Since joining the club from Huddersfield for £250,000 in 1988, his annual tallies have been 16, 27 and 23 last term.

When he looks back now Duncan must be pleased that he was once surplus to

Chelsea's requirements. Since leaving Stamford Bridge in 1986, he has become one of the game's most successful strikers.

Duncan scored on his League debut for Chelsea in February 1986 but he got only one more game before moving on to Huddersfield

and scoring a hat-trick in his first full game for them.

In 1986/87 he was Huddersfield's top scorer with 25 goals - including four in one game against Bradford. He led the way with 16 at Huddersfield the following season and then moved on to Swindon.

Lions out to end Cup jinx

Swindon come to The Den defending a 100 per cent record against the Lions in senior Cup football.

All our four previous Cup games against them ended in a Swindon victory.

This is only the second time we have clashed in the League Cup.

Back in August 1975 we travelled to the County Ground for the first-leg of round one.

Phil Summerill scored for the Lions but the Robins came off best, goals from Ken Stroud and a John Trollope penalty giving them a 2-1 cushion to bring to The Den a week later.

Swindon were awarded another penalty in the return game. This time the kick was entrusted to David Moss who made the score 1-0 on the night and 3-1 to Swindon on aggregate.

Our only meeting in the F.A. Cup came in December 1983 when Swindon came to The Den in round two. Steve Lovell put the Lions in front with a 23rd minute penalty but Jimmy Quinn equalised almost immediately.

Though David Martin restored our advantage in the 63rd minute, the visitors hit back quickly again with Paul Batty making it 2-2 three minutes later. Quinn netted what proved to be Swindon's winner a quarter-of-an-hour from time.

In December 1989 we came together in the Zenith Data Systems Cup at the County Ground where we slipped behind to a Steve White goal in the 31st minute.

David Thompson had the misfortune to turn a cross into his own net in the 47th minute and, though Gary Waddock pulled a goal back in the 71st minute, we could not complete our recovery.

but Nicky Hammond was called up for the game against Port Vale and Sunderland.

Swindon, of course, have a special place in League Cup folklore.

Back in 1969, when they were a Third Division side, they defeated mighty Arsenal 3-1 in the final at Wembley.

Since then Swindon have pulled off several other shock Cup victories. They reached the League Cup semi-finals in 1980 though since then they have not managed to survive beyond the fourth round.

Swindon are currently enjoying the most successful era of their history.

Until 1986 they were a Fourth Division side but, just four years later, the Robins played their way into the First Division - only to have their prize taken from them.

It has certainly been a remarkable period for the club.

Swindon's revival began under Lou Macari. He led the club to the Championship of Division Four in 1986 with an all-time record of 102 points.

Twelve months later they qualified for the Third Division play-off and won the series to secure a return to Division Two.

In 1989 they qualified for the Second Division play-offs but were beaten in the semi-finals.

It was then that Mr. Macari left to take up a new challenge with West Ham and Swindon appointed former Spurs and Argentina midfield player Ossie Ardiles as player-manager.

In his first season, Mr. Ardiles led the club to promotion to the First Division for what would have been the first time in their history.

Now another ex-Spurs international is at the helm and Hoddle believes the Robins can make it to the First Division by next season..... and, maybe, enjoy a little Cup success to go with it!



Focus on Micky Hazard

MICKY Hazard has added a new dimension to his play this season. For the first time in his career he is becoming a scorer as well as a creator.

True, he now takes Swindon's penalties and his second goal against Sunderland recently came from the spot, but that took his tally this season to five, precisely half of what he has ever achieved in a complete season before!

Micky started his career with Tottenham and, strangely, his most successful campaign as a goalscorer was his first full season in the side.

He scored 10 times during 1981/82, but, of course, his main function was to set up attacks, rather than round them off.

He won an F.A. Cup winners' medal and a UEFA Cup winners' medal before joining Chelsea for £300,000 in 1985. Portsmouth signed him in January 1990 and he moved on to Swindon during the early weeks of last season.

Hoddle's men hit top form

AFTER a slow start, Swindon have run into exhilarating form, inspired from midfield by former Spurs and England star Glenn Hoddle, who is now their player-manager.

The Robins became the first side this season to defeat the then leaders Ipswich - and how - and they then ran riot against Sunderland.

Goals have been coming from all over the team, 10 of the 13 outfield players who have started a game for them having scored at least once so far.

Duncan Shearer and Micky Hazard were joint-top scorers with five goals each prior to the weekend whilst Steve White had netted four times.

Swindon's victory over Port Vale last

week lifted them into third place in the Second Division.

With Tony Parkes acting as caretaker-manager, Blackburn went into their game at Derby with new resolve and goals from Jason Wilcox and David Speedie did wonders for morale as they came away with a 2-0 victory.

Another Speedie goal earned them a 1-1 draw at Sunderland and, after that, confidence was beginning to rise again. Speedie – who had also found the target in their home defeat by Ipswich – scored in his fourth successive game, hitting the winner at home to Port Vale (1-0).

Blackburn's rise up the table continued with a 1-0 home victory over Watford.

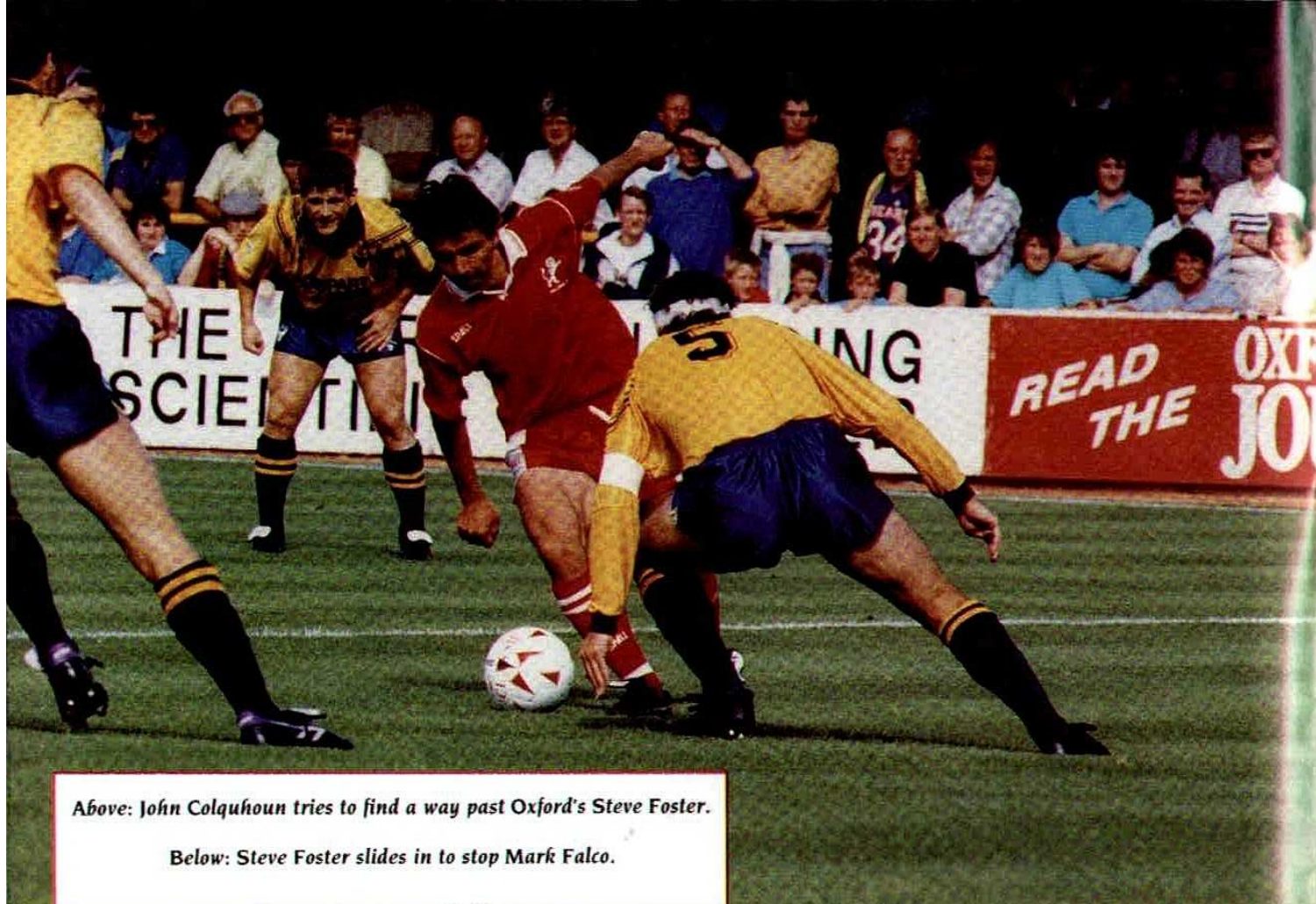
During the summer Mr. Mackay had smashed the club record when paying Barnsley £750,000 for mid-field man Steve Agnew.

He then paid Glasgow Rangers £350,000 for left-back Stuart Munro and then, only days before the new season kicked-off, invested another £500,000 in Liverpool and Scotland striker David Speedie.

Steve Livingstone, Simon Garner and Lennie Johnrose all took turns to partner Speedie in attack as Rovers strove for a winning combination during the early weeks.

In fact no fewer than 22 players were used in their opening eight League and Cup games.

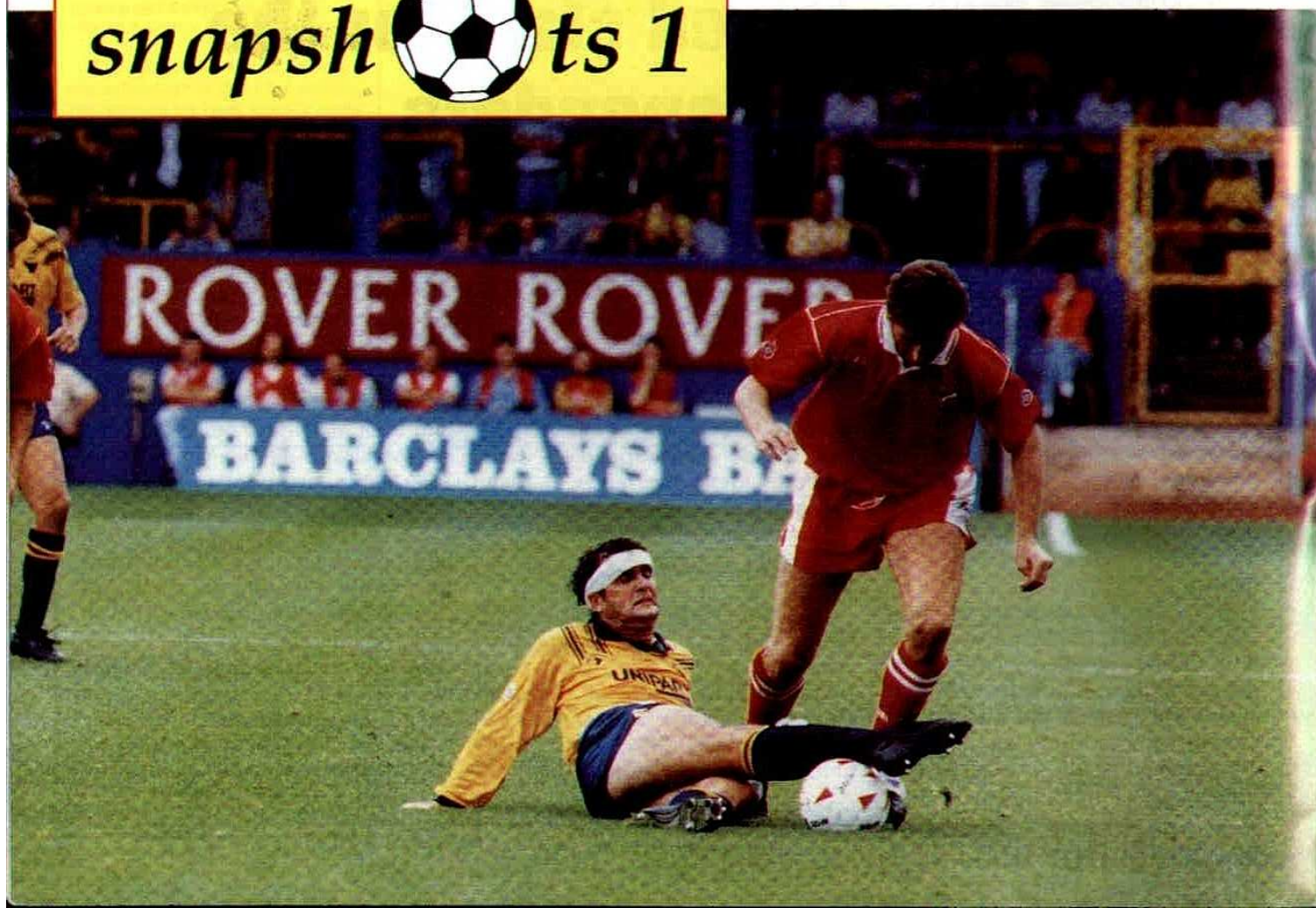

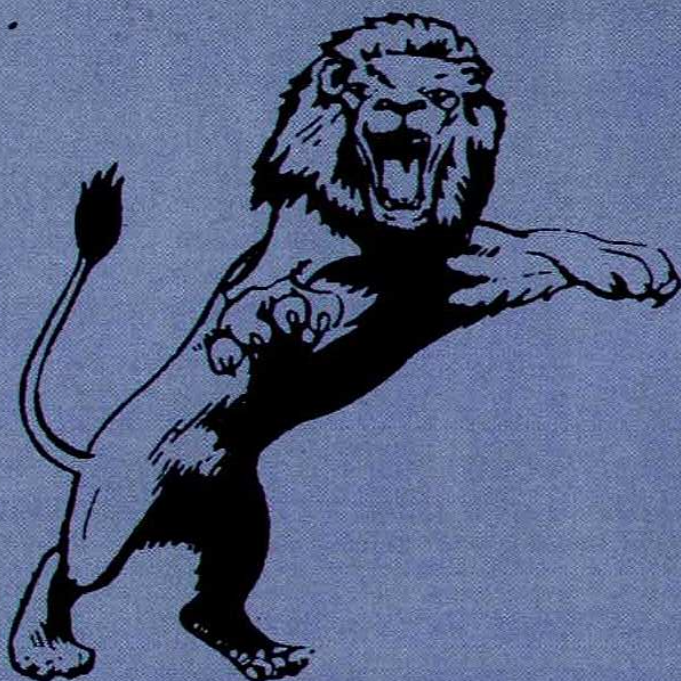

Back in the League it's the long trip to Barnsley on Saturday, and unfortunately

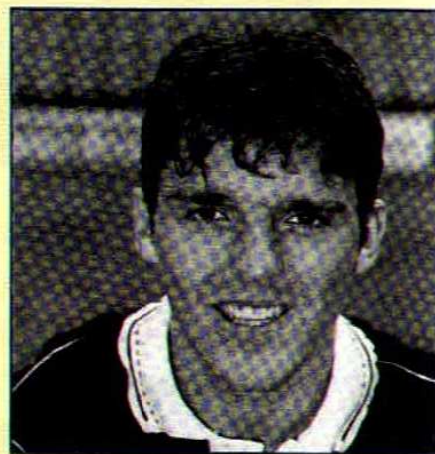


the Travel Club have been unable to lay on a special train.

John gets off the mark in super style

LIVEWIRE Lions striker John Colquhoun opened his goalscoring account in spectacular fashion during our 2-2 draw at Oxford recently.

And despite his side's disappointing start to the season, Colquhoun is confident that Millwall can claw their way up amongst the Second Division promotion pacemakers.

"I think we are a lot better than our current League position indicates," he stressed. "We've played some pretty good stuff, but we just haven't been getting the results.

"Letting two goal leads slip during our away games at Oxford and Bristol City was bitterly disappointing – we were so close to six points, but we only ended up with two.

"That hurt a lot, but the fact that we can go away from home and play so positively has got to be encouraging.

"There's an awful lot of new faces at the club and it was always going to take time for us to blend together, but despite the start we've made I'm confident that we can do well."

Persistence paid off for Millwall manager Bruce Rioch when he signed Colquhoun from Scottish Premier League

Hearts during the summer – six months after making his initial inquiry.

"I felt the time was right for a new challenge and I wanted to come and play in the Football League," explained John.

"So far, despite the results, I've thoroughly enjoyed it. I've been pretty pleased with my own performances and it was nice to get off the mark against Oxford.

"That one flew in nicely, but I was actually more pleased with the one I scored against Bristol City, that was a real striker's goal."

Rioch, who had to splash out £400,000 to secure Colquhoun's services during the summer, has certainly been happy with the former Scottish international's form.

"He wasn't 100 per cent match fit when he joined us, but he's worked hard and he's started to look really sharp," explained the Lions boss.

"His close control is particularly good and he's deceptively strong. He's taken quite a battering in some of our matches but he keeps coming back for more."

"But City got back into the game on half time when David Smith's cross was turned back for Matt Bryant to volley in."

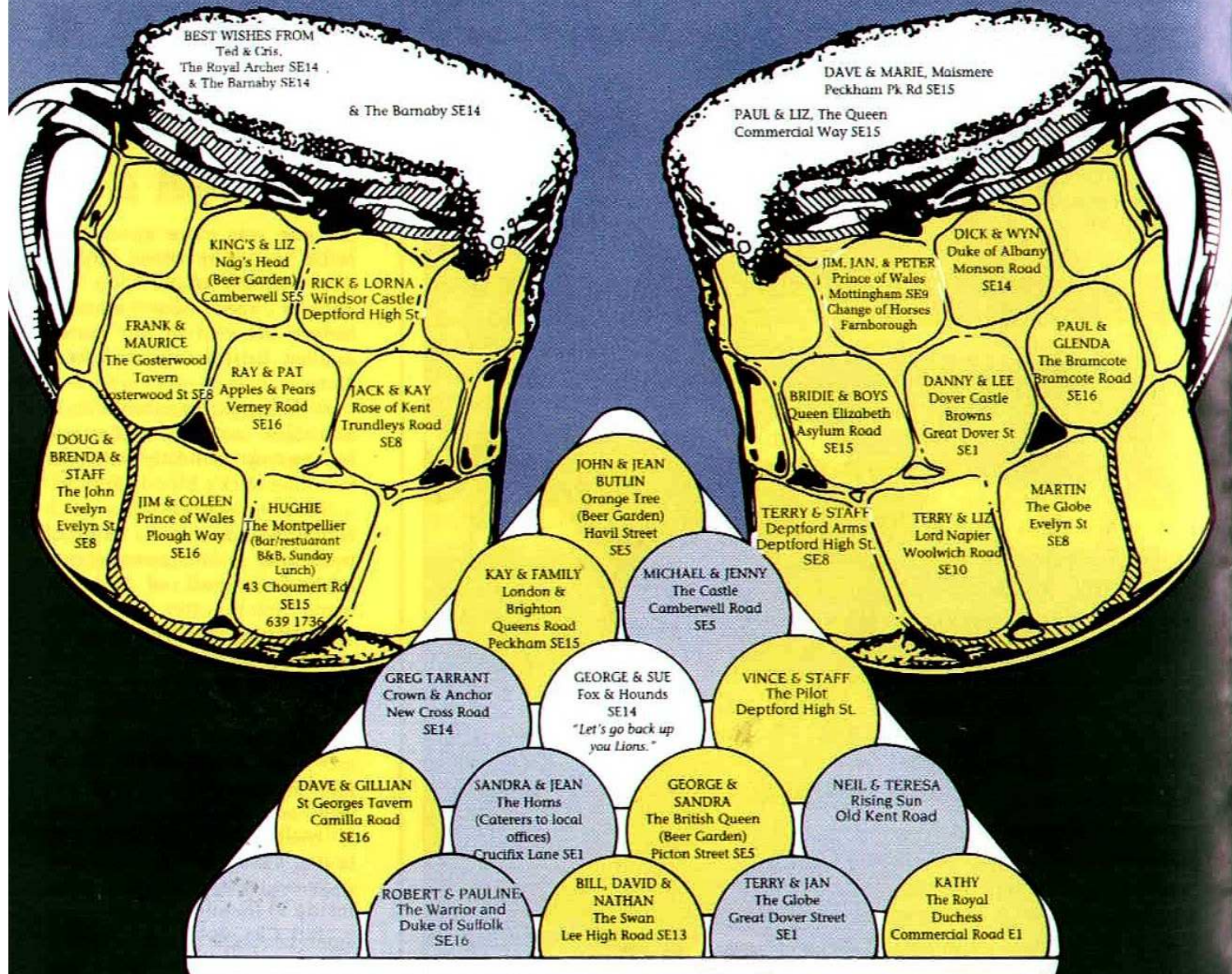
Despite seeing a two goal lead disappear for the second match in succession Millwall striker Colquhoun struck an optimistic note in the South London Press.

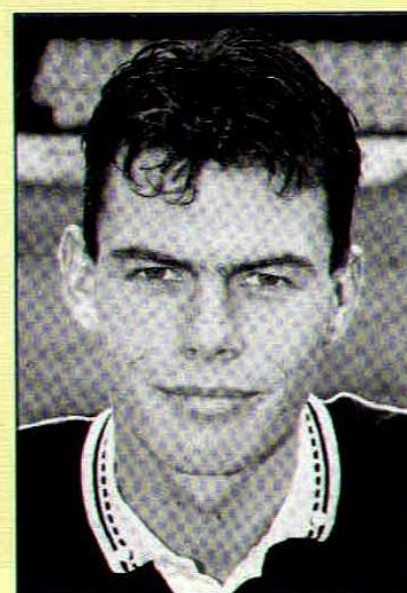
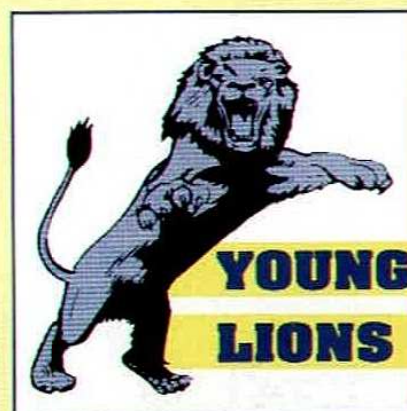
YOUTH PROFILE

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Tonight Alan Kirk looks back at

KEITH WELLER

Keith Weller was born in Islington, North London on the 11th June, 1946. At the age of 18 he signed professional for Tottenham Hotspur where he could watch at close quarters his idol Jimmy Greaves. After making just nineteen League appearances for them he was transfer listed and had the choice of joining Millwall or Brighton & Hove Albion. After a chat with Spurs Manager Bill Nicholson, who believed in his ability but was unable to give him regular first team football, he took his advice and signed for Millwall in June, 1967 for £18,000.

Keith made his debut at home to Blackburn Rovers in the opening fixture of the season 1967-68. The 41 goals he scored from 135 League and Cup appearances made him a great favourite with the Millwall fans. They were disappointed when he moved across London to Stamford Bridge to sign for Chelsea in May, 1970 to play First Division football.

During the sixteen months at Chelsea he helped them win the European Cup Winners Cup against Real Madrid 2-1 in Athens after a replay. In September, 1971 Leicester City convinced Keith to leave London and move to the Midlands where the Filbert Street crowd appreciated his footballing talents. In 1974 Keith made four consecutive appearances for England making his debut in a 2-0 victory over Wales in Cardiff on the 11th May. In his next match he scored the only goal in a victory at Wembley against Northern Ireland, a memory he will always treasure.

Keith made over 300 League appearances for Leicester City before in 1978 he moved across the Atlantic to the United States. During the last thirteen years Keith has been associated with seven teams, the New England Teamen, Fort Lauderdale Strikers, Tulsa Roughnecks, Fort Lauderdale Sun, Dallas Sidekicks, San Diego Sockers and for the last two years has been Head Coach at Tacoma Stars. During this time he has helped teams win three championships in the U.S.A. (two indoor, one outdoor).

Keith and his wife Terry live in Seattle, they have two daughters Lee and Kerry. He enjoys playing golf, tennis, watching most sports and is one of the few footballers to hold a pilot's licence. He continues to watch English and German football via satellite television and enjoys watching Liverpool when they are featured. Friends from the past that he keeps in touch with include Steve Earle (Fulham and Leicester City), Dennis Burnett (Millwall) and Dave Watson (England).



He has been associated with football all his life and is thankful that he has been able to do what he loved most. Looking back over his playing career he has some great memories, two of which are scoring the goal of the decade for Leicester City against Luton Town at Kenilworth Road in the Fourth Round of the 1974 F.A. Cup and the hatrick he scored, again for Leicester City against Liverpool, a record that was to stand for 11 years.

JOHN BLYTHE *Defender*

Born Berwick.

John started his football career in the north-east before joining Everton in 1899. He spent four seasons with them, playing 32 League games and scoring one goal.

In May 1902 he joined West Ham United, in the Southern League. He made 53 Southern League appearances in two seasons, playing against Millwall. In matches he soon caught the Lions eye and they signed him in May 1904 only to play against his old club at their new ground of Upton Park in his first game. This stocky left-half, weighing 12½st. and being 5ft 8ins tall, was a tough tackling and hard working defender, who won two Western League Championship Medals in 1907-8 and 1908-9 and a London Challenge Cup Winners Medal in 1908-9.

Blythe played a total of 341 games for the Lions, scoring 3 goals.

He left Millwall for Watford in September 1911 and moved back to the north-east to become Blythe Spartans manager in 1913.

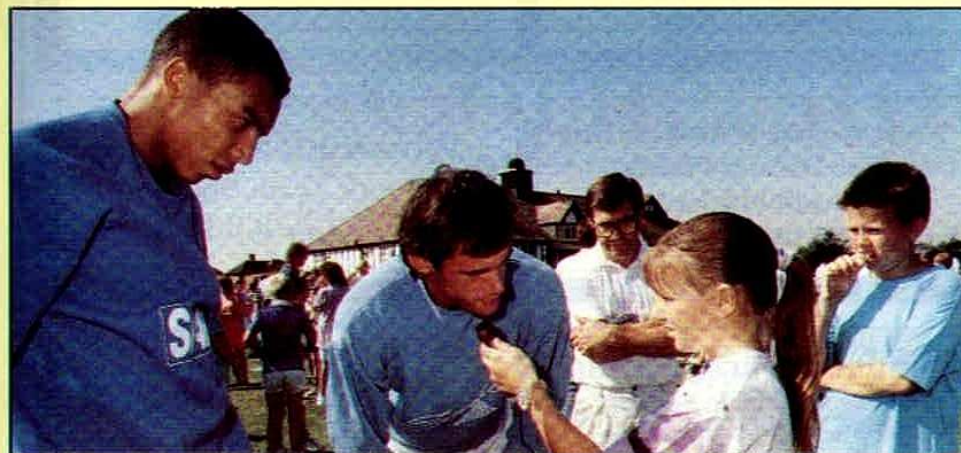

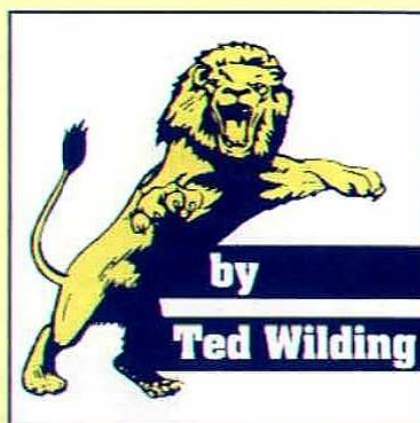
FOOTBALL LEAGUE CUP.

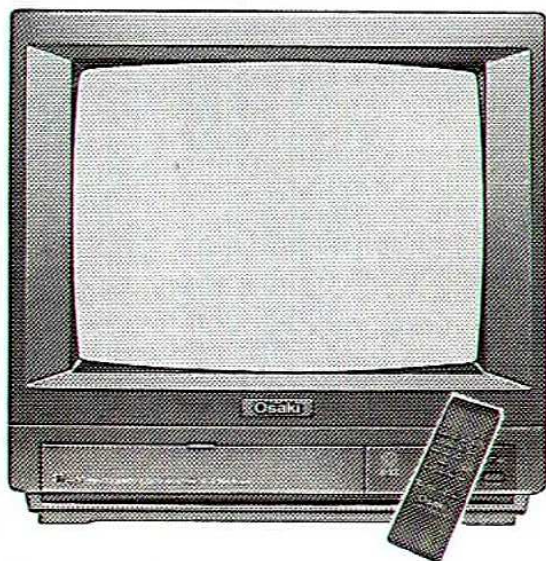
Above: Alex Rae powers us into a 2-0 lead at Oxford.

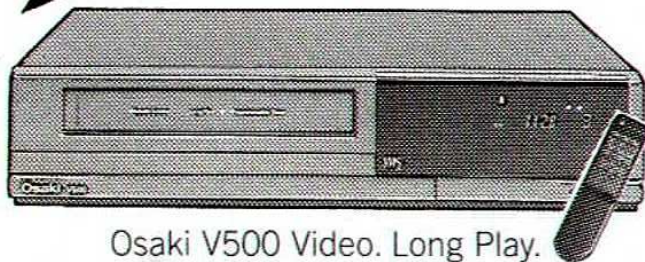
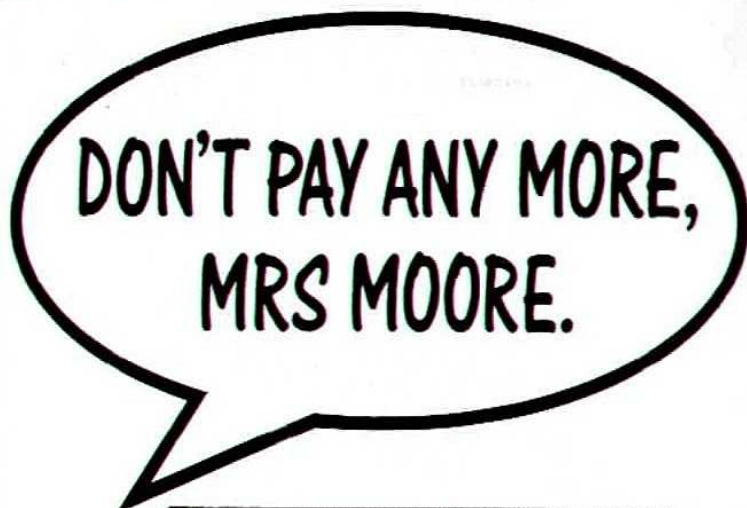

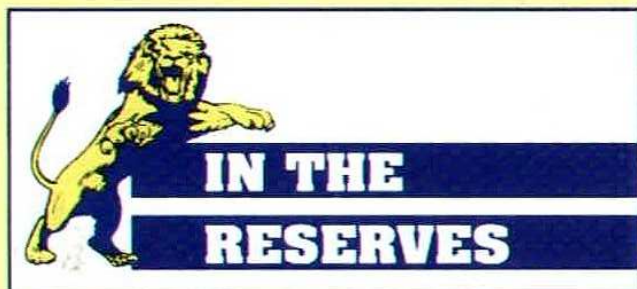

One of the features of the Reserve side already this season has been the number of Tom Walley's youngsters who have progressed to this level and more than held their own. Ian Evans explains, "It's important for young players like Dolby, Roberts, Manning, Foran and others to get the opportunity to play Combination football where they find themselves playing alongside and up against full-time pros. It is all part of the learning process for them, and although their naivety shows through at times so does their game-ness and will to win.



Naturally I have a particularly close association with Tom Wally. I need his players to make it into my team and so I'm in touch with him constantly to see how they are progressing. I always try to get along to Youth team games to keep an eye on his lads so Tom and I regularly share ideas and opinions and no doubt some of you have seen us up on the terrace together watching a game. I know it seems a little strange to some people but I really do get a better view of the game from up there than in the dug out.

Sitting down you don't appreciate so well when, for example, a player should get his cross in or who might be in a better position in a given situation. As those of you who watch your football right down at pitch level will know, you get a great view of the action but it is impossible to judge distances. Apart from that, at a Reserve or Youth game you are away from the noise over on the far terrace which means I can concentrate better and perhaps get my instructions across even if I do shout too much."
