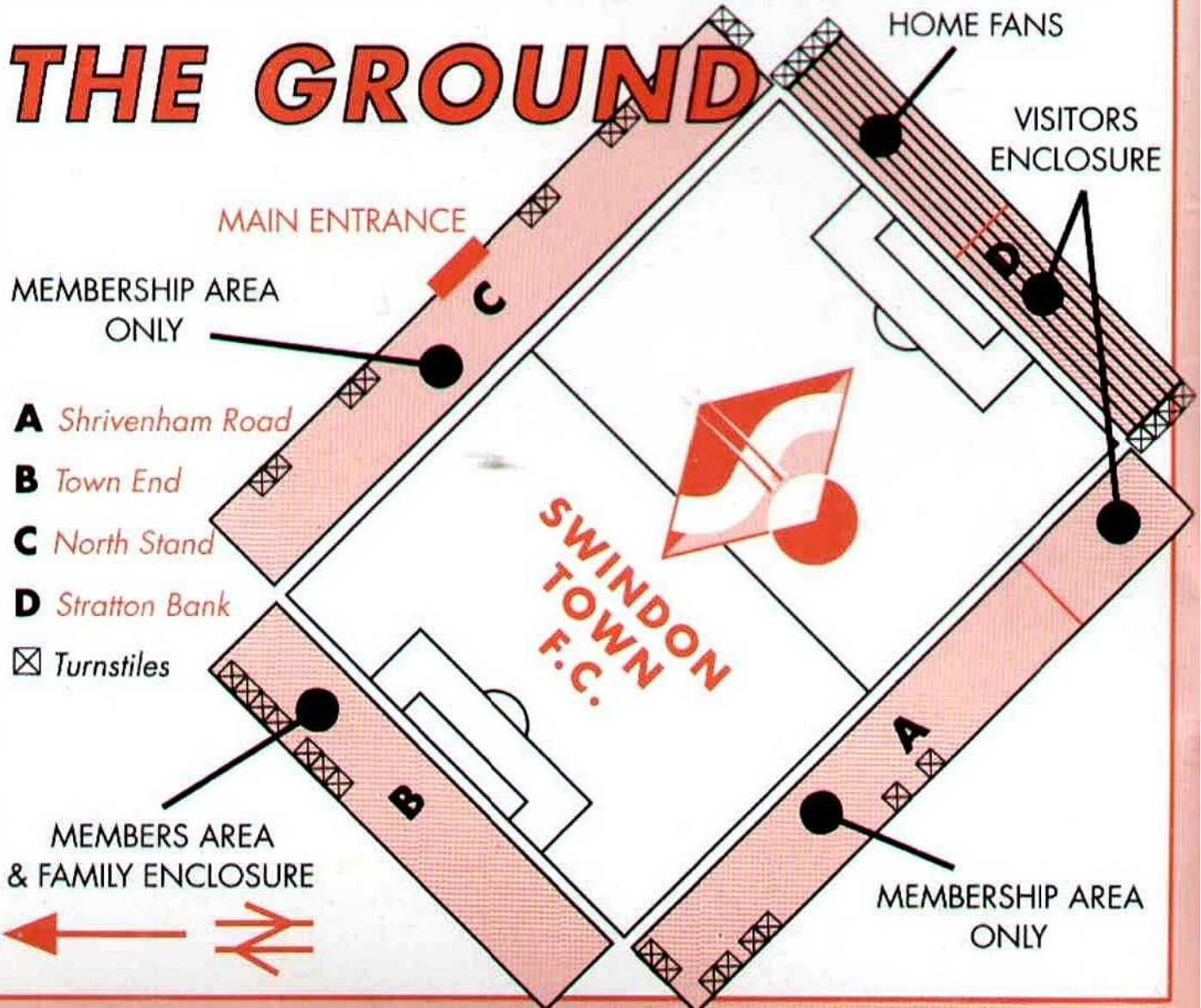


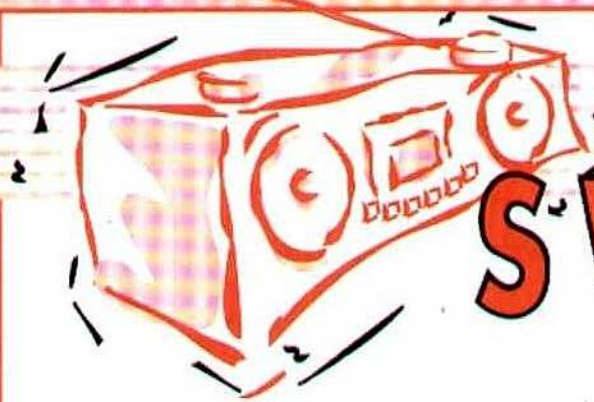

Our next home game is vs Luton Town which is being played here on Wednesday 19th February kicking off at 2.00pm.

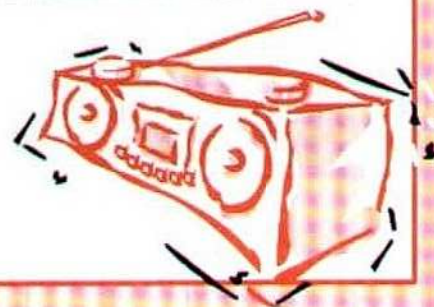

Our FA Cup win at Cambridge United will go down as one of our best performances of the season. It is no secret what I think of the Cambridge style of play and for me there was much more at stake than a place in the Fifth Round. Our victory was not only a great boost for us but a triumph for football.

After losing twice to Cambridge in the League, the last time quite recently, I doubt if few people gave us a chance. But on the morning of the match I was very confident. Sometimes you get strong feelings like that and in this case they proved positive.

We did everything we had planned to do on the day. We changed things around, playing short corners, taking free-kicks as quickly as possible and generally bossed the midfield where we kept the ball down on the ground.

It all came off on the day and as I say that was good for football,

Oxford United presented us with several problems last Tuesday night. In the end I felt they had probably done enough to earn a point - they certainly deserved it but goals from David Kerlake - his very first for the club - and Duncan Shearer were enough to win us the game.

That is how football goes, you have to take what is on offer when you can. I thought we played much better at Leicester the other week, yet we got no reward for our efforts. This time out we probably got more than we deserved. I think over a season these things tend to work out evenly in the end.

But full marks to Oxford for sticking to their beliefs. They played very well on the night. Having said that I also thought that we played well in patches then very poorly in patches. So it was an indifferent show for us.

Two straight wins can do a lot for confidence and

we travelled to Blackburn last Saturday full of optimism and why not? We know that on our day we are capable of beating any side in this division. Tonight's visitors, Bristol City, on their day can also live with anyone in Division Two so we are in for a tremendous night of football. Dziekanowski looks very good and is bringing the best out of the players around him. It is going to be a titanic struggle much different from our meeting on Boxing Day.

Bristol are another footballing side, in fact most teams in the Second Division play a passing game; far more than in Division One. There are about five or six sides who rely on such skills that is all. I think our mate Greavsy was a little rash when he branded this 'a poor Second Division' earlier this season.

Apart from Cambridge, teams at this level are not humping the ball forward and charging after it. Oxford and Newcastle United, despite their problems, still produce quality, and the emphasis of sides throughout the division is on controlled football.

This is why we are so pleased with the Cup draw. Derby County or Aston Villa here is an exciting prospect. You have to be satisfied with a home draw but to pull a side of this calibre means it is an ideal tie for us. We certainly would prefer Villa or Derby to Southampton or Chelsea say.

The Cup is a great stimulator but our eyes are fixed on Division Two at the moment and the quest for points to lift us higher up the ladder.

Finally, just a mention that Steve Foley is currently on loan to Stoke City. They asked for his services and I saw it as a good thing. If we need to call upon him we know that he is tuned to first team football.

Former Sunderland Reserve Team Manager Malcolm Crosby, currently in charge of the Roker Club in a caretaker capacity, is enjoying a honeymoon period with the club winning all four games under his charge. A former supporter of the club, Crosby would like to maintain his position but is quite happy at present "I do not know what is happening on a day to day basis but I'm quite willing to go along with that because obviously I've just got to try to keep winning games for Sunderland. If I can do that then maybe I'll end up with the job". Former Everton player and now captain at Roker Park, Paul Bracewell believes Crosby may land the post on a more permanent basis "At the minute Malcolm has come in and done very well and he'll probably get caretaker Manager of the Month! At the minute we're on the crest of a wave and hopefully we can just keep that going."

Neighbours Newcastle continue to have a poor season following their exit from the F A Cup to Third Division AFC Bournemouth on penalties at St James' Park. Despite this latest set back boss Ossie Ardiles remains committed to the task. "I won't quit. I have never contemplated walking away and I never will. Our present situation is painful, and more painful to me than anybody else. But, I am still convinced that I am doing the right thing and I have no regrets about coming to Newcastle."

In contrast the fortunes of Blackburn Rovers look set to improve with every game the club plays. Former Leeds United Midfielder Scott Sellars is quick to praise the transformation achieved by Kenny Dalglish "There is so much respect for what he has achieved as a boss and a player and having someone of his stature around the place gives us a real buzz. He's caught the imagination of the Town, increased the gates and put self belief back in all of us. Quality players are now saying yes to a move to Rovers. Before, we were getting close

to promotion for a few years and players like Gary Lineker and Teddy Sheringham were approached but nothing came of it. Since the boss arrived that has all changed. Having players like Gordon Cowans, Alan Wright, Mike Newell and Colin Hendry around has made a vital difference. It has given us that extra quality we so desperately needed."

Two goals by Darren Anderton against Leyton Orient last week were enough to put Pompey into the fifth round of the FA Cup where they look forward to a tie against either Sheffield Wednesday or Middlesbro' at Fratton Park. Anderton, an England U21 International is highly regarded by Pompey boss Jim Smith "He played against Newcastle last year just before I resigned and they were all talking about him. Since then his progress has been remarkable. He's matured, he's stronger and, though he's still got a way to go, he has made a great contribution to our success this season". Smith believes that Pompey could go all the way in the Cup "It might be the year of the underdog. If we can keep playing at home, winning and producing good football, I honestly believe we've got a great chance.

But we need what everybody needs in the Cup and that's a bit of luck". Portsmouth have reached Wembley on three previous occasions, 1929, 1934 and 1939 when they beat Wolves 4-1.

BRIGHTON, without an away win for nearly five months, gained a valuable point last time out at Tranmere.

Raphael Meade's goal 10 minutes from time earning the 1-1 draw which was good enough to move them out of the Second Division's bottom three.

The former Arsenal and Sporting Lisbon striker is in devastating form despite the Seagulls' predicament at the wrong end of the League ladder. He scored again, at Bolton in the Fourth Round of the F.A.Cup. That looked good enough to force a replay until Paul McCarthy, a Republic of Ireland Under-21 International had a rush of blood to the head as he handled needlessly in the penalty area to concede the penalty that ended Brighton's Wembley dreams.

Manager Barry Lloyd was sympathetic but he hoped to be able to cash in on his team's Cup run in their fight against the drop. It was all so different earlier in the season when the Seagulls were looking to take wind towards the Premier Division. Now survival will be success.

Brighton's commitment in the Cup cost them ground in the League and they went into Saturday's home game with

Charlton Athletic back in 22nd position, edging Newcastle United on goal difference.

Following the departure of John Byrne to Sunderland Mr Lloyd propped up his forward line by introducing Mark Gall, a £45,000 signing from Maidstone United. Gall made his debut against us at the Goldstone Ground in October but it was Duncan Shearer who stole the show, netting both goals in a 2-0 victory.

On Saturday we will be looking to do the double over the Sussex club whose fans, if not brightened by their team's results, have certainly been awakened by their garnish strips.

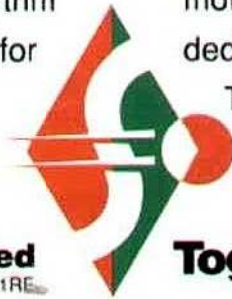

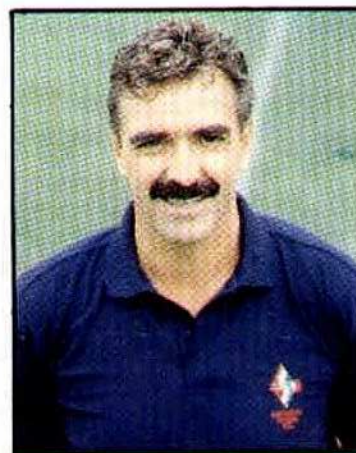

FITZROY SIMPSON



FITZ'S FIZZ COSTS HIM HIS PLACE

FITZROY SIMPSON was on Associate Schoolboy forms with Bristol City but when it came to handing out the apprenticeship places he was shown the cold shoulder. The rebuff hurt him deeply and he is only sorry that he will not be able to show his old club just what they have missed tonight. Fitzroy, you see, is grounded by a two-match suspension that also ruled him out of the game at Blackburn on Saturday.

Recalls Fitzroy: "there was one place left and it was either me, or the centre-half who is now at Birmingham, Paul Marden, and they gave it to him leaving me to go to college for a year."

"I suppose in hindsight this was beneficial to me. I studied business and recreation before John Trollope invited me to Swindon for a trial. Lou was the manager at the time and I played some fifteen games under him. But it was really Ossie who gave me my head."

"I played 35 games last season but I was in and out, whereas this season Glenn has shown great faith in me and given me the opportunity to really establish myself in Second Division football. Last year I wore every shirt but the goalkeeper's - it was a matter of filling in. It is not a bad thing to have more than one string to your bow."

"I found myself all over the place. Left back, left-wing, centre-midfield, even right side of midfield on one occasion. Centre-forward, scoring three goals in three games, though I don't fancy myself in that role. They looked at me and did not feel I was strong enough or mature enough. But having played there since a kid I found it all totally foreign when I was out on the left wing hugging the touchline."

During the summer I discussed my feeling with Glenn and stressed that if the opportunity ever came along for me to have a go in the centre of midfield I felt I could do the job. He played me there in pre-season and I have held my own alongside Micky Hazard."

"Micky is a great help. I watch his game and then go home and think about my own performance and analyse the two... If I could just stop for a second, like he does sometimes, to get himself together then I'd be a better player still."

"Ross MacLaren has also been a great help. He is a good talker and I have learned from him. Being the youngest, I never used to say a lot but now I'm more mature, and responsible, and feel I can contribute my views without feeling embarrassed or intimidated by the older players."

I suggested to Fitzroy that his Barclays Youth Eagle award must have boosted his ego?

"Not so much my ego," he stressed. "It makes you smile and it is nice to know that you are receiving recognition but as Glenn is quick to point out we will probably get a lot more success as things progress and we are also going to get knocks. So just take it in your stride."

"Any rave reviews I have had is basically down to Micky, Ross, Glenn and John. Ross's talking, Micky's skills and the encouragement I have received from Glenn and John and everyone around me has rubbed off on me."

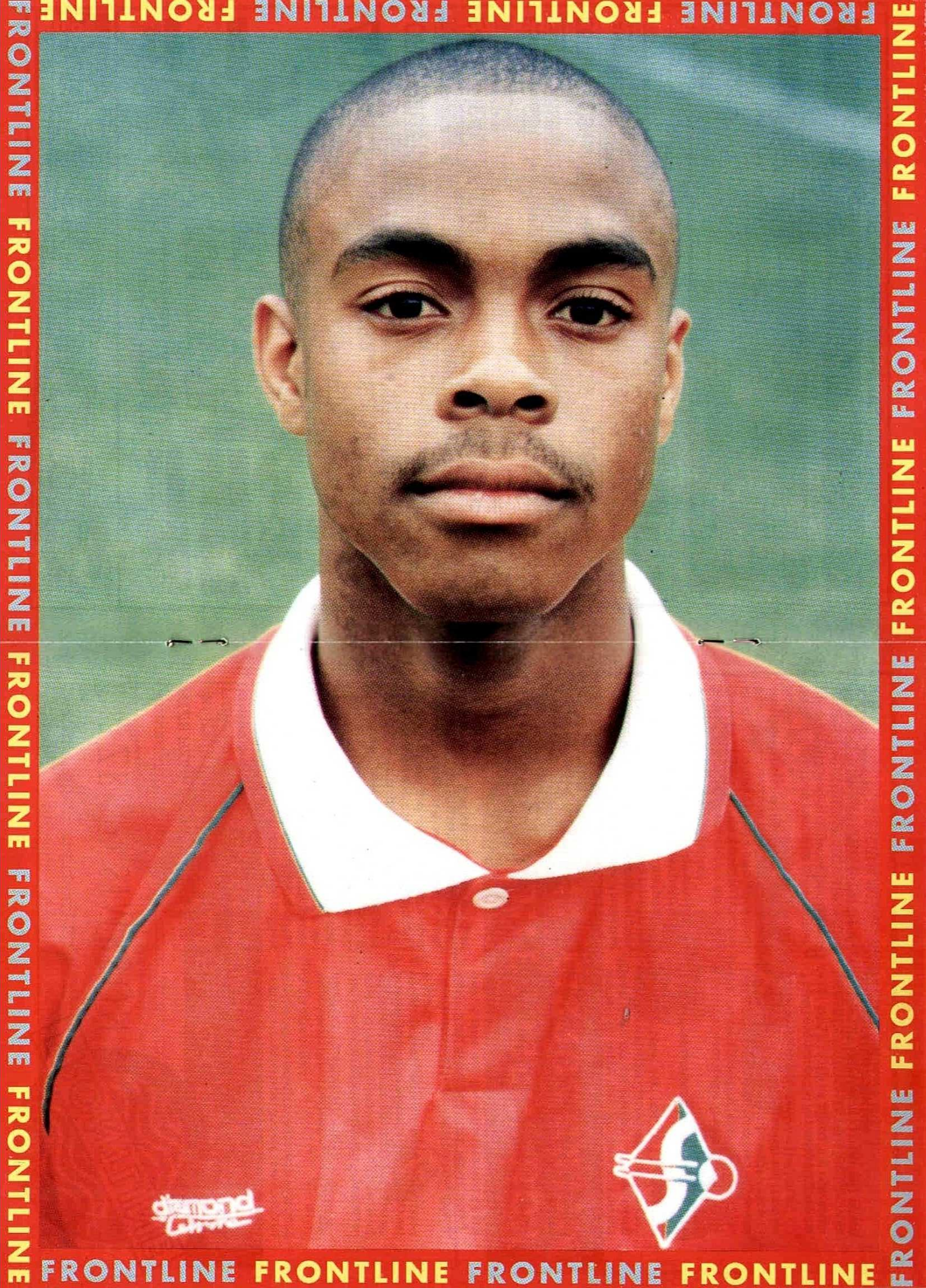
Is Fitzroy affected by press speculation and links with clubs such as Manchester City?

"No. It is nice to know you are being noted but it does not unsettle me or make me dissatisfied with what I have got. Obviously as a career move it would be beneficial to play in the top division but at the moment I'm happy here. We have an excellent team and I am still learning... We are talking about working under Glenn Hoddle here. You can't get much better than that. So I have no wish to leave."

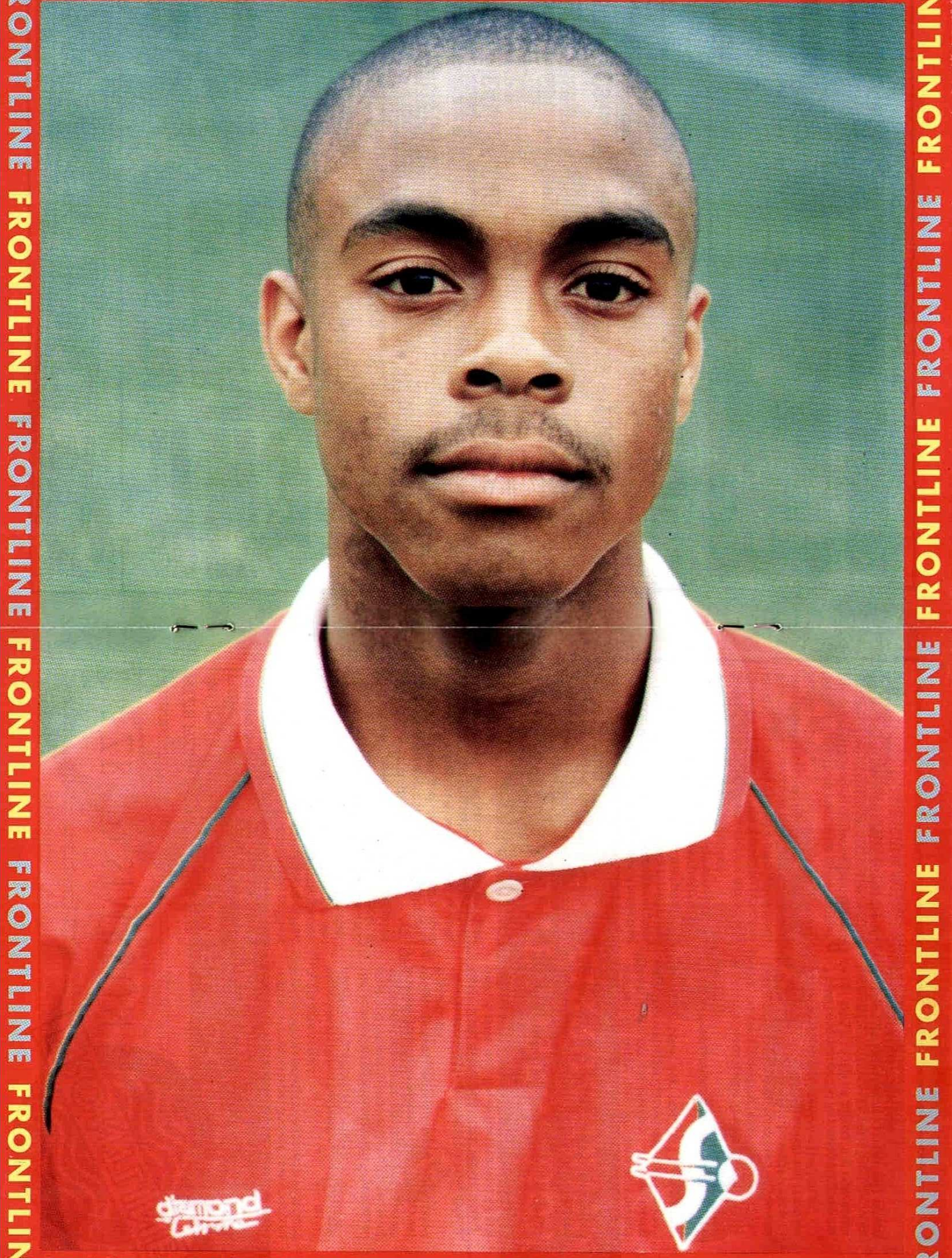
Tonight Fitzroy sits this one out - a lesson learned no doubt?

"It's a blow," he concedes. There is a pause... "Every day you learn something, even in training. If you take the competitiveness out of me then you take half my game. I haven't been booked for dissent. I just play the game whole-heartedly and if I feel the ball is there to be won then I won't tell him so."

"I have been suspended for playing the game the way I think it should be played. It is unfortunate because I haven't missed a match and to be out for Blackburn and Bristol City, two games I really wanted to participate in, is a bitter blow."

It is now eleven years since Bristol City participated in the First Division and Ashton Gate is winding itself up for a concerted effort to recapture those golden days.

City missed out on the Second Division promotion play-offs last season by only two points. This season they believe they can at least go one step further in the quest for top class competition.

Manager Jimmy Lumsden kept faith with the players who went so close last year, his major summer signing being the highly-rated goalkeeper Keith Welch, who moved from Rochdale for a down payment of £200,000.

The team hit a sticky patch in September prompting Mr Lumsden to recruit. He signed former Arsenal hard-man Gus Caesar from Cambridge United, and secured the services of another former England Under-21 International, striker Terry Connor, from Swansea City.

Further transactions saw former England pivot Russell Osman arrive from Southampton and in December forward Mark Gavin returned to Ashton Gate from Watford. But the signing that has set the West Country a buzz is that of Polish International Dzarius "Jack" Dziekanowski, a world class striker who has already proved his class with goals in his opening two games for the club against Southend United in the League and at Leicester City in the F.A.Cup.

Dziekanowski could prove the bargain of the decade at £250,000 from Celtic. He leads the attack with flair. His technique is almost flawless, his vision supreme. Nicky Morgan has partnered him in recent games but the former West Ham and Stoke striker has competition from leading scorer Wayne Allison and Bob Taylor, who was a prolific marksman in City's promotion winning side the season before last.

Andy Llewellyn is keeping Caesar out of the side in

a back four that reads: Llewellyn, Osman, Bryant and Scott. Mark Aizlewood and Andy May prompt from midfield in a 4-2-4 formation which features the pacey Junior Bent on the right of an attack supported by Morgan and Mark Gavin and led by Dziekanowski.

Andy Leaning, who lost his place at the start of the season, has been back in goal for the past four months.

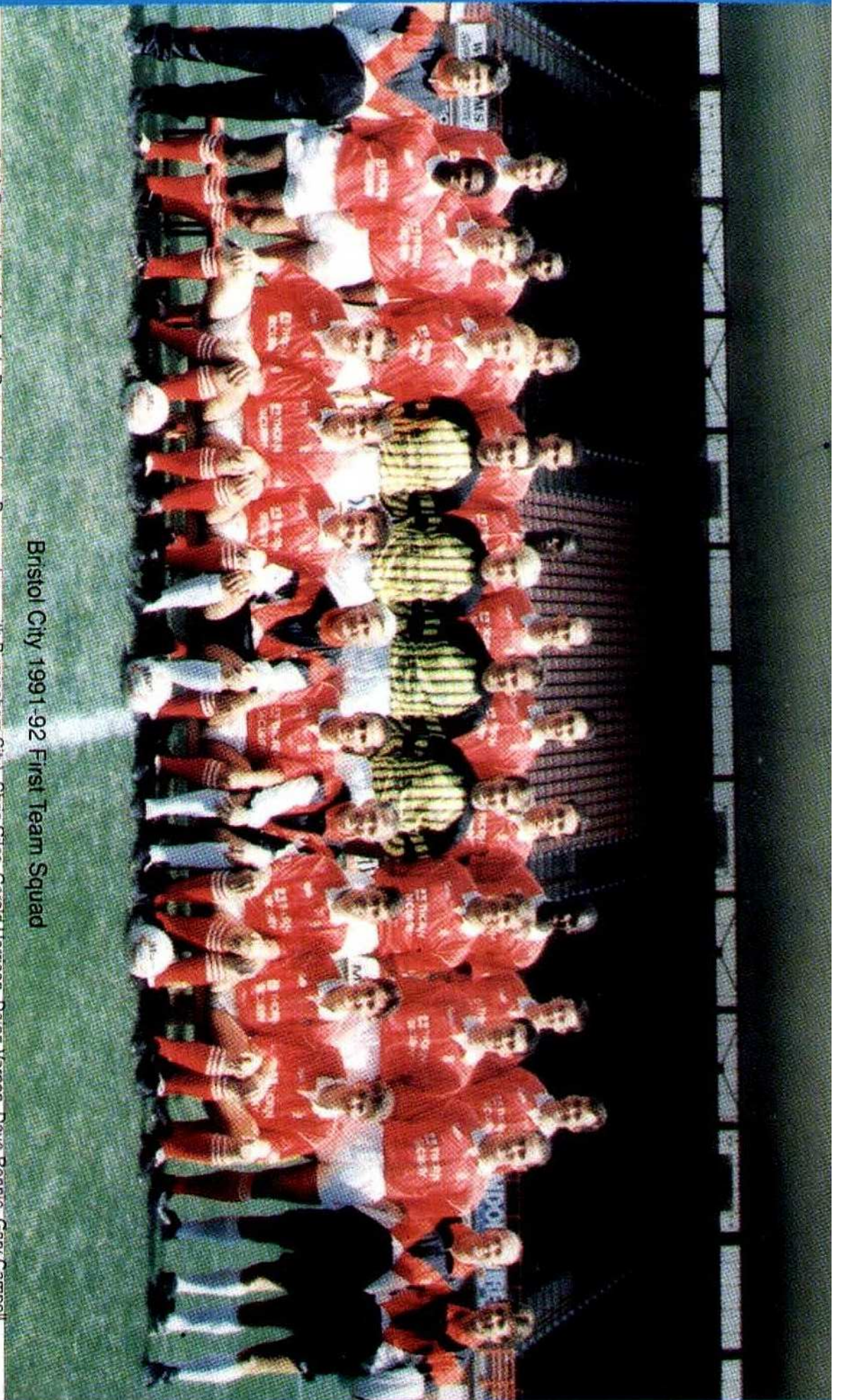
Bristol, who so convincingly tipped Leicester out of the Cup at Filbert Street, to earn a fifth round trip to Nottingham Forest, have not been so successful in the League, managing just one win in 13 away games in the Second Division. But that was before the arrival of Polish "Jacky" who could transform City's season.

Jimmy Lumsden, who took control in 1990 following the departure of Joe Jordan, is beginning to see his team take shape.

When the two sides met at Ashton Gate on Boxing Day it ended 1-1; Duncan Shearer shooting Swindon into a ninth-minute lead, Bob Taylor - formerly with Leeds United - netting the equaliser just after the break.

THE ABC OF BRISTOL CITY

MARK AIZLEWOOD - Defender/Midfield. A regular in the Welsh squad Mark joined City from Bradford City in August 1990 for £110,000. Started his career with home town Newport County and has had spells with Luton Town, Charlton and Leeds United. Born: 1.10.59.

WAYNE ALLISON - Striker. Started his career with Halifax Town in 1986 making his League bow against Wolves in March 1987. Scored 19 goals in 46 games in 1988-89 prompting Watford to invest £250,000 in his transfer. Moved to Bristol at the start of last season. Scored 7 goals in that campaign and had netted nine goals this season prior to Saturday. Born: Huddersfield 16.10.68.

JUNIOR BENT - Forward. Another native of Huddersfield he cost £30,000 to sign from his home town club in March 1990. Has a blistering turn of pace, good control and balance. Plays wide on the right and is a real crowd pleaser. Was introduced to League football in October 1987 by Huddersfield, against Middlesbrough. Born: 1.3.70

MATT BRYANT - Central Defender. Joined the club on the YTS breaking into the first team last season when he made 22 Second Division appearances - scoring one goal. Made his debut at Plymouth in January 1991 having already appeared for Walsall on loan. Born: Bristol 21.9.70.

DZARIUS DZIEKANOWSKI (pronounced Jackonovsky) - Striker. Signed just over two weeks ago from Celtic for the amazing price of £250,000. A Polish International with over 60 caps he joined Celtic in 1989 for £540,000 and was their top scorer with 16 goals in his first season. That included four in one game against Partizan Belgrade in the European Cup Winners Cup. Started his career with Polonia and played for Gwardia, Widzew Ledz and Legia with whom he was the Polish League's top scorer with 20 goals in 1987-88. Scored on his Bristol debut vs Southend United.

ROB EDWARDS - Midfield. A Welsh Youth International signed from Carlisle United in March 1991. Made 36 Fourth Division appearances in 1990-91 but did not make the Bristol team last season. Can play at fullback. Born: 1.1.73.

MARK GAVIN - Midfield. Was introduced to League football by Leeds United v Cambridge in October 1982 but made only 30 League appearances in four seasons with the Yorkshire

club. In 1984-85 he had a loan spell with Hartlepool before signing for Carlisle. Moved on to Bolton that same season making 49 Third Division appearances. Rochdale, Hearts and Bristol City were the next stops. Left for Watford in 1990 rejoining Bristol in December. Born: Bailleston 10.12.63.

ANDY LEANING - Goalkeeper. Lost his place at the start of the season - his fourth at Ashton Gate. Began his pro career with York City who picked him up from Rowntree Mackintosh in 1984. Made the first of his 69 League appearances at Newport (6.11.85); joining Sheffield United on a free transfer in 1987. Had a loan spell with City prior to the £12,000 transfer in November 1988. Born: York 18.5.62.

ANDY LLEWELLYN - Fullback. City's Player of the Season last term, he is now the longest serving player on the books. Capped by England at Youth level. Made his debut at Millwall in October 1984 and has been a regular since. Strong tackler. Good cricketer - had trials for Gloucester. Born: Bristol 26.2.66.

ANDY MAY - Midfield. Industrious play-maker he served his apprenticeship with Manchester City, making the first of 150 Division One appearances at Ipswich (25.4.81). Moved to Huddersfield Town in 1987 and had a spell on loan with Bolton before signing for City in 1990 for £90,000. Capped by England at Under-21 level. Born: Bury 26.2.64

NICKY MORGAN - Striker. City's top shot with 17 goals last season. Made 21 appearances for West Ham before joining Stoke City in 1986. Transferred to City, for £30,000, in March 1990. Born: East Ham 30.10.59.

RUSSELL OSMAN - Defender. Essentially a centre-half but can operate in Midfield. Made his League bow for Ipswich v Chelsea in September 1977. Made over 300 appearances and won 11 England Caps before joining Leicester in 1985 for £240,000. Three years later Southampton paid £325,000 for his services. Bristol recruited him in December for £60,000. Was in Ipswich's UEFA Cup winning side in 1981. Captained the England Schools rugby team. Born: Repton 14.2.59.

MARTIN SCOTT - Defender. Signed from Rotherham for £200,000 just over a year ago. Initially a midfielder he served his apprenticeship with Rotherham and had a spell on loan with Nottingham Forest in 1987-88 but did not get a game. Was 23 last month. Hails from Sheffield.

BENNO'S BRIEF



THE ANTICIPATED appearance this evening of Polish International Dariusz "Jacki" Dzieszkanawski prompts one to look at the changing face of English football. Once dominated by Scots, Welsh and Irish players, the arrival of the European Common Market has opened the door for an influx of foreign stars.

Just checking the line-up in the top Two Divisions the other week I noted 18 foreign imports on duty and there are still others who were not selected.

The use of foreign players in our domestic game is not a recent departure. Indeed older Bristol City fans will recall winger Albert Eisentrager, who became the first foreign outfield player to appear in the Football League after the Second World War. A prisoner of war, he elected to stay in England when hostilities ended and joined Bristol City from Trowbridge in 1950 - going on to make some 228 appearances for the club.

Others to come here shortly after were Karl Aage who played some First Division matches for Huddersfield Town and Viggo Jonson who helped Hull City gain promotion to the Second Division. Aage was a strong constructive inside right. Viggo played fullback, wing-half and inside-forward. Both had been members of Denmark's 1948 Olympic team.

Town boss Glenn Hoddle believes it is a good thing for the English game to introduce players from abroad. He says: "They bring with them different skills and habits that can be beneficial to our players."

"When I was at Spurs the arrival of Ossie Ardiles and Ricky Villa was a tremendous boost, particularly for me. I realised we were on the same wavelength with regards to our interpretation of the game and that re-assured me. Convinced me I was on the right lines."

"I think it is very encouraging when a club like Bristol City can acquire a player of Dziekanawski's

quality. It shows that the belief in skillful football is spreading."

"I had a very happy time in French football but I think it is harder for foreign players to adapt to our game than it is for us to fit into theirs. Physical commitment is all important here. That is why you don't see the likes of Platini and Maradona rushing to the Football League. But I feel that our attitude is changing slowly, as it must, if we are to develop." It is true of course that more imports have failed to establish themselves in our game then have succeeded. Ex German paratrooper Bert Trautman was the first real success after the war in goal for Manchester City. But apart from Ossie and Ricky Villa few have made a real impact on our game. I recall Ossie sweating one May; "When you come to the spring in England you are tired in a way that sleep doesn't take away," he said, adding: "I don't think any footballer works so hard as the Englishman."

Possibly true but whether we work in the right directions is debatable. That famous Danish International Alan Simonson told me after he had failed to revive Charlton Athletic's fortunes: "The English have been playing the same way for many years and everyone that plays them, be it at International level or club level, knows exactly what the tactics will be."

"I think you need to change it a little more and play more football on the ground. Use midfield and make use of space. In general English Clubs do not use the whole of the field. On the other hand English players are very good with their heads. But this is a very limited strength."

"If you are to bring something now into the game then it is down to the managers. They must drill it into young players at the learning stage."

In Glenn and Jimmy Lumsden we have two bosses who are playing their part.

City have been regular visitors to The County Ground for almost a hundred years - in fact they came to The County Ground in search of a Southern League victory 93 years ago today.

But tonight we return to an October evening in 1960, when a young Town side took on City - just relegated after six years in the Second Division. Four of the Swindon side had already tasted success against City earlier in the month, having helped the Town to a 3-1 F.A. Youth Cup win. Two of the goals came from the penalty spot, scored by 'Ernie' Hunt - who would eventually sign for City thirteen years later.

Having failed to score in the previous two League games Swindon recalled David 'Bronco' Layne at centre-forward. Mike Summerbee, another member of the Town's Youth Team, moved back to the right-wing, taking the place of the injured David Corbett. The other two Youth stars were 17 year-old full-back Terry Wollen and Norman (better known as John) Trollope. Behind them was the old campaigner Sam Burton, who had been between the sticks off and on for the last fifteen years.

Layne scored the only goal in a quiet first-half, following a 20th minute corner.

City's former England international John Atyeo, born in Wiltshire, equalised with a 64th minute header and the visitors then threatened to go in front on more than one occasion.

But Swindon refused to concede ground and were rewarded with two strikes in the final four minutes from Bronco Layne.

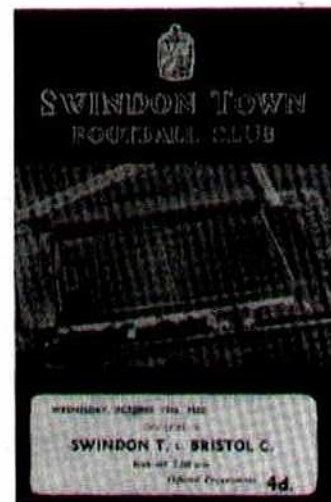
He completed his hat-trick when keeper Tony Cook failed to hold a Summerbee header and the ball was scrambled home. Strangely, all four goals in the game came as a result of corners.

Two months later Layne, who had scored 35 goals in just 46 games, was sold to Bradford City.

The Town fans amongst the 16,618 crowd (whose admission money totalled only £2,000!) went home happy, but they had to wait a long time - until mid-January - before seeing their side secure another League win.

SWINDON TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB PLAYER IDENTIFICATION



The identification of young players with the potential of becoming future professional footballers, normally falls within the duties of the Youth Staff at most Football League Clubs. At Swindon Town this is certainly the case, with the responsibility of co-ordinating this work being undertaken by the Youth Development Officer.

Here at Swindon Town we have recruited a small army of people who either alert the Club of players who have come to their notice, or are requested to watch a player who has written asking for a trial. If the report from the Scout is positive then arrangements are made for the player to visit the Club for further assessment via coaching and game situations.

Swindon Town Football Club is committed to producing players of the ability to be able to adapt to the type of football played at the Club. All the teams, at what ever age or development, have to play the same way, so this means the Coaching Staff ask Scouts to identify players who have outstanding ability in the following skills:

1. Technical - complete mastery of the ball via

- a) First touch
- b) Running with the ball
- c) Accuracy in passing - short or long - when to pass
- d) Confidence on the ball to be able to take on opponents
- e) Pace - in short bursts and sustained pace
- f) Vision - ability to read the game and make decisions accordingly

2. Attitude to the game

- a) The desire to play and be successful
- b) Mental toughness

3. Physical Attributes

These will eventually be important but the physical developments in young people can vary so much that at this stage it becomes of secondary importance.

Once young outstanding players are identified it is then important to develop their talents and monitor their progress. At the earlier age, 9-14, via the Centre of Excellence Scheme, where the importance of technical practice is stressed and for the older boys via the weekly coaching and match sessions. The Club run teams in each of the age groups from under 14 to under 18. Continual assessment of each youngster plays a very important part in the final selection for an invitation to a player to join Swindon Town Football Club.

Over twenty letters a week are received from boys dreaming of becoming Professional Footballers so it is important to stress that invitations to attend trials are only issued to players recommended by the Club Scouts and only a very few of those invited ever make the grade.

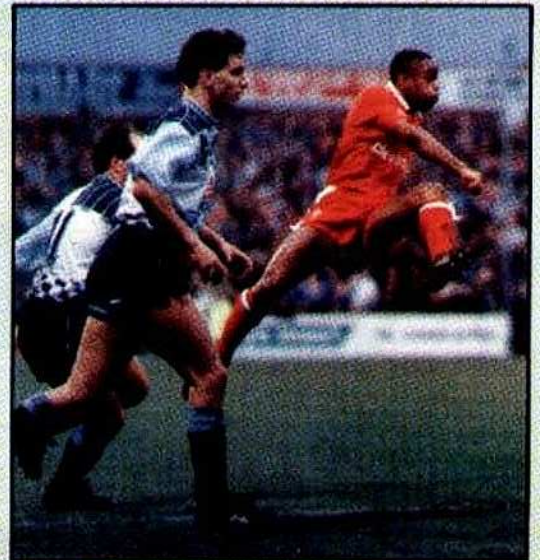
