



LENN Hoddle made his long-awaited comeback after five months on the injured list in Swindon's 5-3 defeat at Oxford last Saturday.

"Must do better" was the verdict on his own and his team's performance.

But the man who won so many of his 53 England caps alongside Kevin Keegan remains optimistic that Swindon can grab one of the promotion play-off places.

"However, we have to start winning away from home," concedes the 34-year-old son of a printer who once made so many headlines with Tottenham and Monaco.

Swindon, with Hoddle orchestrating the beautifully from his role as sweeper, won 4-1 at Ipswich in September, followed by victories at Brighton the following month.

Since then, despite outstanding victories at Huddersfield in the Rumbelows Cup and Cambridge in the FA Cup, their league form has been indifferent away from home.

"It's five months since we took all three points from an away match and I'd be happy to end that sequence at

Newcastle," says the Middlesex-born manager, who is a close friend of Ossie Ardiles.

"He's a great guy and it hurt him to leave Newcastle, but he will bounce back," said Hoddle. "Mind you, Newcastle pulled a beauty out of the hat when they appointed Kevin.

"I've spoken to him and I know how much he wants to build a really super side for the fans in the North East."

Hoddle, appointed just over 11 months ago, insists that he never tires of hearing so many people say Swindon are the best passing team in the division, even though their results have often left something to be desired.

"I won't change," he says. "I have a deep seated belief in how the game should be played and there will be no compromise. I'm as keen as anybody to give Swindon a First Division platform, but not at the expense of my principles."

His skipper Colin Calderwood, the only survivor from the side that won the Fourth Division title in 1986, is a huge admirer of his manager's approach.

"Playing with Glenn Hoddle is a terrific experience and it's obvious we would have had more points if he hadn't missed most of this season with injuries."

"We're disappointed not to have done better. When we are good, we are very good, but then we turn in a performance like last Saturday's at Oxford and we know why we haven't done as well as we should."

A man to watch is Swindon's top scorer Duncan Shearer, who is on course to finish the season with around 40 goals to add to the 23 he scored last time round. Now 29, Shearer was playing for Inverness in the Highland League when John Neal took him to Chelsea for £10,000 in 1983

From working in a sawmill and playing part-time, the Scot was suddenly sharing a dressing room with

the likes of Kerry Dixon and David Speedie. He recalls: "It wasn't the best time of my life.

"I couldn't understand why we finished training at noon, just a couple of hours after we started. I was so naiive I expected us to have a short break and train again in the afternoon."

Shearer made only two first team appearances for Chelsea, went to Huddersfield on a free transfer and hardly stopped scoring in two and a half years before joining Swindon for £230,000 four years ago.

"It's been a good move for me," says Shearer. "Last season was the first time we weren't involved in promotion, but I think there was a reaction to the previous season when we won the play-off final and weren't allowed to take our place in the First Division.

"I still believe we can go up this season, although we are long overdue an away win - and it's about time I put together a decent scoring run after getting only one in February."

It would be a nice time for him to score. "Angus Farmer, who comes from Fort William, was the best man at my wedding and now lives in Blyth," explained Shearer. "He'll be at the game, so I'm desperate to get him a

#### FACT FILE ON SWINDON TOWN

COLIN CALDERWOOD: Born in Glasgow, this 26-year-old defender is the only surviving member of Swindon's Fourth Division championship-winning side of 1985-86. Colin has made more than 250 League and Cup appearances since being signed from Mansfield for £27,500. Restricted to just 23 games last season after suffering a knee ligament injury. Now fully recovered.

SHAUN CLOSE: Has made just eight League appearances since a £70,000 move from Bournemouth almost two years ago and has scored only once - in a Rumbelows Cup match against Darlington last October. Went to Dean Court from Tottenham where he began as a trainee. Now 24 and establishing himself in the side.

FRASER DIGBY: Born in Sheffield, the former England under-21 keeper has missed only a handful of games in the last three seasons passing the 200 milestone on the way. An ex-Manchester United apprentice, he first arrived at the County Ground on loan in March 1986, but signed in December that year.

NICKY HAMMOND: The consistency of Fraser Digby has kept Nicky in the shadows for much of the four years since he arrived on a free transfer from Arsenal. His six outings last season were the first since 1987-88, during which time he has twice recovered from a broken leg.

MICKY HAZARD: Sunderland born Micky signed from Portsmouth and inherited the shirt vacated by Alan McLoughlin. Now 31, the midfielder made 38 League and Cup appearances last term, scoring eight goals. Won FA Cup and UEFA Cup medals with Tottenham before joining Chelsea for £300,000.

TOM JONES: Has been a virtual ever-present since joining Town

from Aberdeen for £80,000 in September 1988. Formerly an apprentice at Chelsea, he was released in 1983 and joined Farnborough Town, moving to Weymouth in 1986.

DAVID KERSLAKE: Subject of a bid by our manager Kevin Keegan this week. A £110,000 signing from QPR in November 1989, David had struggled to command a regular spot in Shepherds Bush for six years. He gained England honours at schoolboy, youth and under-21 levels and has made all his Swindon appearances at rightback.

MARTIN LING: This slightly-built midfielder is in his second spell with Town, having signed from Southend for a small fee during the summer. Began his career with Exeter City before joining Swindon in July 1986. But after just two League appearances he moved on to Southend.

ROSS MacLAREN: In his 12th season as a professional and his fourth at Swindon. Missing only once during the last two campaigns through suspension, he normally plays just in front of the back four. With Shrewsbury for five years, he joined Derby in 1985 for £67,500 and picked up a Second Division championship medal there two years later.


DAVID MITCHELL: A return to St James' Park for David who had two matches on loan here last season. Capped 34 times for Australia he signed from Chelsea during the summer, the London club having spent £200,000 to bring him from Feyenoord. Also played at Glasgow Rangers.

**DUNCAN SHEARER: Has** maintained an impressive record of a goal every other game since making his debut for Chelsea in 1986. A club record £230,000 signing from Huddersfield in 1988, Duncan has notched 16, 27 and 23 goals in the last three campaigns. NICKY SUMMERBEE: Son of Mike, Nicky started a game for the first time in the final fixture of last season and is reckoned to have a bright future. His football pedigree not only includes his father but also his grandfather and great uncle who both had Football League careers. SHAUN TAYLOR: A £200,000 signing from Exeter in July, Shaun was their captain and Player of the Year in the Fourth Division championship-winning side two seasons ago. Strong and durable central defender who has missed just two games in the last three seasons


STEVE WHITE: Veteran striker who was a free transfer signing five years ago from Bristol Rovers where he began his career in 1977. Moved to Luton and Charlton for fees totalling £350,000. Troubled by injury last season, but still claimed 11 goals.

GLENN HODDLE: When Ossie Ardiles became our new manager, Glenn was the man Town turned to. An impressive pedigree of 370 League appearances and 88 goals in a 12-year career at Tottenham paved the way for a move to Monaco. Played his first game for Swindon last Saturday at Oxford following a spell on the sidelines through injury.



Now Stuart has written to tell he would love to obtain a copy - but we can't trace the photographer, who might have been a patient or a member of staff.



A further £15,000 will go to the overall winner chosen by a panel which includes Bobby Moore



# Three years of ups



ARK Stimson received another reminder on Tuesday night that his New-

castle United career is destined to be one of highs and lows.

The blond defender was left out of the side which won at Cambridge only weeks after regaining his place.

And that's typical of what has happened to Stimmo since he arrived at the club.

"I've had my share of ups and downs," admitted the player who waits to find out if he will be lining up today against Paul Bodin, the left-back who looked to have ended his St James' Park career two months ago.

Stimson takes up the story: "Ossie Ardiles had told me I was his No.1 left back

"He said I'd proved him wrong. He wasn't going to sell me and I wasn't going to Oxford.

"Then ten days later he was trying to sign Bodin, so I went in to see him and he said I had no future at the club. It was like a kick in the gut.

"I had been in the team and playing well, then suddenly I had no future.

"I asked to go on the transfer list and he agreed it was the best thing for me and the club.

"I have to say that was the lowest point of my career.


"I was never convinced that Ardiles rated me. I thought 'that's it.'

"In the end Bodin didn't sign and a few weeks later Kevin Keegan arrived and things began to look up again.

"That's football. Down one minute, up the next - as I discovered again at Cambridge. It has certainly been the story of my three topsy turvy years at Newcastle."

Stimson, in fact, returned for the game at Oxford that signalled Ardiles' departure.

And he figured in Keegan's early

teams before the manager's reshuffle at the Abbey Stadium.

The 24-year-old defender's target now is to win a new contract and be a part of the new regime at St James Park next season.

Certainly life hasn't been dull for the Eastender who must feel he's been caught up in a soccer soap since Jim Smith brought him to the club from Spurs in a £150,000 deal in 1989.

He's been in the side, out the side, a target for the boo boys, a matchwinner and - a fortnight ago - a dad!

Wife Julie presented Mark with the couple's first child - Charlie - after Stimmo had celebrated prematurely with an outstanding performance against Port Vale that had the fans firmly on his side.

Just a week later, the critics were on his back again in the defeat by Brighton.

But this cockney character is nothing if not resilient. He says: "Somebody always gets it at a club and for some reason it's me.

"I would prefer the fans to be on my side. But whatever they think I still believe in my own ability and I'll keep smiling.

"I've had my good times and my bad times at Newcastle but I'm still here and I'd love to be here a bit longer.

"I like it here and I intend to give it my best shot to win another contract. There's been a lot of talk about an end of season clearout and players' futures being on the line. But that's nothing new to me.


"Whatever happens I'd like to be able to say I've done my best. If it's not good enough at least I would know I've put everything into it."

Talk of a return for Chris Waddle is another reason why Stimson wants to stay. The pair were good pals at Spurs and Stimson would welcome the

chance of linking up again.

In the meantime he's got a new baby to enjoy and the daddy of an ambition - to help keep United in the Second Division.

"I think we'll do it," he says. "It'll be a battle but we are good enough to stay up. Things can change in weeks or even days - and nobody knows that better than me."

# A memorable end to Fairs Cup fairytale

EWCASTLE looked to be on their way to a second European Fairs Cup Final exactly 22 years ago.

Having won the old Inter Cities Fairs Cup in 1968-69, United eliminated Dunde United, Oporto and Southampton in the 1969-70 competition before coming up against the Belgian giants Anderlecht.


It was a quarter-final tie which was to reach a peak of excitement and emotion before United finally went out on an incredible night before 59,309 fans at St James' Park.

It all started on March 11 with the first leg in Brussels - and United, as usual, had done their homework.

Coaches Dave Smith and Keith Burkinshaw had travelled to Belgium to spy on Anderlecht...and watched in admiration as the Belgians thrashed Lierse SK 6-1.

With full-backs David Craig and Frank Clark sidelined through injury, manager Joe Harvey knew he had his work cut out.

But ever the optimist, Harvey said: "The ideal result would be a score-draw, for I fear no-one in this

United took a cautious glimpse at soccer's future while out in Belgium, too. For while the squad of 18 players was training hard, United officials arranged to inspect an American-produced artificial pitch.

Representatives of the American Monsanto Co were, by coincidence, in Brussels, and with Newcastle interested in laying a £150,000 artificial pitch at Gallowgate, arranged a meeting in the Belgian capital.

Secretary Dennis Barker brought a

sample of the plastic turf back to Newcastle to put before a board meeting. And the idea never got past that stage, with United unwilling to pioneer the change later made by QPR.

On old-fashioned grass, meanwhile, Anderlecht taught under-strength United a football lesson and it was onl the goalkeeping heroics of Willie McFaul which kept the Belgians down to 2-0.

Desanghere and Puis scored a goal in each half to give United a secondleg mountain to climb, but the defiant Harvey declared: "Let's see how big the hearts of Anderlecht are when they come to Newcastle."

They proved to be big enough seven days later on March 14, 1970 when two early crackers from Pop Robson levelled the scores on aggregate.

With the crowd at fever-pitch, the match developed into one of epic cut and thrust...but with five minutes to go, the scores were still level.

Then a Bob Moncur free-kick dropped for Keith Dyson to sweep the ball past Jan Trappeniers from six yards and United seemed home and dry.


But Anderlecht had other ideas and, when the magnificent Jan Mulder took a hand in the 88th minute, the glory run was over.

Mulder moved forward to pick out the Swede Thomas Nordahl on the left edge of the box and with one swing of his left boot, the ball soared past McFaul and into the far corner of the net.

United were out of Europe for the first time. But what a glorious way to



#### **BILL THOMPSON**

1957-67

BIG and powerfully built, Bill Thompson served United for 10 years in a career that promised much, but which never really took off as it should have because of injury. The centre half was thrown into Newcastle's relegation threatened team in 1960 and matured sufficiently to be picked for England's under-23 side, only to be robbed of a cap as injury struck again. The Bedlington defender was in and out of the side for the next few years and eventually saw both Ollie Burton and John McNamee jump ahead of him for a first team place. He joined Rotherham United in June 1967 and also played for Darlington before returning to Tyneside to sign a contract with North Shields. (89 apps, 1 goal).

#### JIM THOMSON

1968-71

SIGNED By United from Scottish junior side Petershill in August 1968, Jim was a stocky competitor in midfield, whose first team opportunities were limited. After making his debut against Burnley in November 1969, the Glasgow-born player moved on to Grimsby Town in June 1971 after a loan period at Barrow. He won a Fourth Division championship medal the following year before

having a brief spell with Scottish club Morton. Then Thomson began a long and successful stint in local non-League soccer appearing for Gateshead, Evenwood and Blue Star, where he won an FA Vase winners medal in 1978.

#### ANDY THORN

1988-89

ALONG with former Wimbledon colleague Dave Beasant, Andy Thorn remains United's most expensive signing at £850,000. Bought in July 1988 as part of Willie McFaul's multi-million pounds spending spree, Thorn arrived at Gallowgate as an England under-21 international and with the potential to become a top defender. Perhaps the pick of McFaul's big-name deals, Thorn also stayed the longest, albeit a brief 16 months. Tall and quick, he was skipper for a period before heading back to London to join Crystal Palace in November 1989 for £650,000. Born in Carshalton, he started his career with Wimbledon and took part in the Dons' rise to the First Division, including their shock 1988 FA Cup win against Liverpool. (40 apps, 3 goals).

#### **BRIAN TINNION**

1985-89

A Newcastle lad, he signed as an apprentice professional and edged

his way into the first team reckoning during season 1986-87. At 6ft tall, he was a powerful fullback who liked to link up with the attack down the left. At times Tinnion looked an excellent prospect, good enough to join the England under-21 squad for a summer tour to Brazil in 1988. Injury forced the Tyneside youngster to pull out. Newcastle's decline affected his form and Brian moved to Bradford City in 1988 where he has since clocked up more than 100 appearances. (37 apps, 2 goals).

#### **KEVIN TODD**

1981-83

ANOTHER local player who never quite made it in the famous black and white stripes. Striker Kevin Todd burst onto the scene by netting twice in his first full outing against Watford. He arrived at Gallowgate on trial after netting almost 200 goals for local club Ryhope. Stocky and quick, Todd homed in on goal when he got the ball in his early days, but matured into a far more composed striker. Played alongside Kevin Keegan for a brief spell before dropping to Fourth Division football with Darlington in 1983. Since then, Kevin has given fine service to a number of local clubs - Blue Star. Whitley Bay and Berwick Rangers included. (11 apps, 3 goals).




