

TALKING WITH TURNER

LIVE TV - OUR CHANCE TO SHINE!

TODAY WE PLAY ONE OF

the best footballing sides in the country at home in front of the live TV cameras.

There should be no more incentive than that to show the armchair fans just what we can do.

It's the perfect opportunity for our players to give the watching TV audience a glimpse of their talents against a side many have tipped for the top this season.

But it's no good being frightened of teams like Swindon, if we are, then we shouldn't be out there. It's as simple as that.

Yet having said that, we also face a player who, in my opinion, is one of the greatest England has produced, certainly in my time.

Glenn Hoddle won 53 England caps, that was just 400 short of how many he really should have won.

With the greatest respect to current England idol Paul Gascoigne, I personally think Hoddle was a better player at his peak.

He was, and still is, one of the greatest passers of the ball the game has seen. Perhaps the one thing he was criticised for at international level was that he didn't score as many goals as he should have done, and that's where I think Gascoigne is slightly ahead of him.

However, we must get on with the job of earning another three valuable points today. We slipped up at home to Bristol Rovers last weekend when lan Bennett unfortunately made a mistake which allowed them to equalise in the last minute.

But you have to remember that he saved us three or four times in that game and everyone makes mistakes.

The man who has never made a mistake, has never made a decision in his life. Overall, I have to say I enjoyed last Saturday's game, despite the result and the conditions. We played well and I thought Rovers did their bit to contribute to the game.

But I must not let these notes pass without saying how much I admired our supporters last week.

They stood out in what was near-torrential rain for almost four hours and gave us all the support



they could. It couldn't have been comfortable for many of them and I am full of praise for them.

Today, with the live TV cameras here, I'm sure our real supporters will once again turn out in their numbers

It promises to be a great game and with the live TV cameras now part and parcel of our game, let's hope we can rise to the occasion like we did at Leicester.

ONE ON ONE!

WELCOME TO LIVE TV!

SINCE the deal to show Premier League games was handed to Sky Sports, the various regional TV companies have snapped-up the opportunity to show live action on Sunday's from the new First Division.

Today is our first time on live TV this season at home. We've appeared once before, of course, against Leicester at Filbert Street. But today we welcome the cameras from Central TV to London Road for the first time.

We got off to a fine start against Leicester with a 2-0 win - goals from Tony Philliskirk and Worrell Sterling doing the damage in front of the cameras.

It was a big gamble by the regional companies to try and televise live soccer outside the Premier League, but so far the decision seems to have paid off. But do you know just how many armchair fans have sat down after their Sunday lunch to watch a great game of football on regional TV?

No? Well if we told you that a viewing audience of 807,090 people watched us beat Leicester earlier this season, that will give you some indication of how successful regional live soccer has become.

It wasn't the biggest live TV audience for Central up to the end of October though. No, that honour belonged to the Wolves v West Ham clash on October 4th.

Even that may have been beaten by now, but unfortunately the latest viewing figures were not to hand when we went to press this week.

However, while Central almost hit the magic one million mark up to the end of October, some regional TV firms had already surpassed that barrier.

Not surprisingly, London Weekend and Tyne Tees TV regions have both claimed audiences over one million.

The biggest game shown by LWT up to the end of October, was the West Ham v Sunderland clash which attracted no less that 1,299,000 viewers.

It was a cracker too, with the Londoners winning 6-0!

Not surprisingly, that game was also Tyne Tees' biggest audience up to the end of last month.

The poorest audiences for live TV in regions is from Yorkshire where as few as 324,000 watched the Huddersfield v Bradford clash on September, 6th.

But on the whole, live TV football from the regions has been a huge success, especially when you compare their performances against those of BBC and Channel Four plus Sky Sports.


For instance, Sky could

only muster 900,000 viewers for their Premier League live action between Southampton and Manchester United on August 24th.

Their top audience up until the end of October, when these figures were published by MATCH magazine, was 1,700,000 for the England v Norway World Cup qualifying game on October 14th.

Channel Four's coverage of Italian soccer has been an equally successful move with their top audience being 2,900,000 for the Sampdoria v Lazio game on September 6th - and Gazza wasn't even playing!

That audience may have even been beaten since. The most popular TV football remains 'Match of the Day' with an auidence of 5,500,000 for the August 29th programme involving Leeds, Liverpool, Coventry, Blackburn and Arsenal and Sheffield Wednesday.

It was a game which started with Hoddle making our Micky look like a schoolboy player, and ended with the Posh ace smashing home his firstever league goal in Birmingham's 2-0 win over Spurs at St. Andrews.

That was way back in May 1983 and another game played out before TV cameras as 'Match of the Day' were there to capture Micky's memorable moment.

It's no wonder the likeable scouser has fond memories of the last time he came up against the talents of Hoddle but the former Liverpool player keeps a tape of the game at home just in case the memory fades a little.

Says Micky: "I remember the last time I played Glenn very well. We were on 'Match of the Day' and Birmingham were struggling to stay in the First Division at the time.

"In the first minute of the game Hoddle got the ball and swerved to go one way before changing direction and going past me as if I wasn't there. He left me for dead and made me look such a pratt.

"But I got my own back later in the game by scoring my first-ever league goal. It was a very special moment for me, especially as the cameras were there to record it all."

"He was in his element at the time and in a class of his own."


Micky's back at the heart of the Posh midfield after finding himself out of the side for a while at the start of the season.

"I'm also relishing another chance to play against Glenn again - let's hope it turns out as good as the last time!"

HODDLE THE HERO



MEET THE SQUAD

■ DAVE BENNETT (Midfield)

Age 33. Former FA Cup winner with Coventry in 1987. Broke his leg in only his second appearance for the club after signing from Sheffield Wednesday. Has suffered two further breaks since. Brother of Sunderland defender Garv.

■ PAUL BODIN (Defender).

Age 28. Welsh international full-back signed for £25,000 from Newport in March 1988. Joined Crystal Palace for £550,000 in March 1991, but never settled and returned to Swindon ten months later.

■ SHAUN CLOSE (Striker).

Age 26. A £70,000 signing from Bournemouth in September, 1989. Was top scorer in the Combination side last season with 25, but has yet to establish himself in the first team.

■ FRASER DIGBY (Goalkeeper).

Age 25. Former England Under-21 'keeper who has had to share first team duties with Nicky Hammond last season. He's a former Man. Utd apprentice who has clocked up more than 270 appearances for the club.

■ NICKY HAMMOND (Goalkeeper).

Age 25. Made 31 appearances for the club last season. It was his best season since signing for the club five years ago. Has twice recovered from a broken leg and has previously had a loan spell with Posh as well as Aberdeen and Bristol Rovers. Began his career with Arsenal.

■ MICKY HAZARD (Midfield).

Age 32. Signed from Portsmouth in September, 1990. Spent eight years

at White Hart Lane where he won UEFA and FA Cup winners' medals. He moved to Chelsea in 1985 before going on to Portsmouth. Now playing some of the finest football of his career and missed just two league games last term.

■IDAVE KERSLAKE (Defender).

Age 26. Signed for £110,000 from GPR in November, 1989. He has represented England at schoolboy, youth and Under-21 levels. A fast, attacking right back.

■ MARTIN LING (Midfield).

Age 26. Re-joined Town a year ago after almost five years with Southend. A former Exeter apprentice, Martin was at the County Ground for just 93 days in his spell.

■ ROSS MACLAREN (Defender).

Age 30. A £140,000 signing in 1988 from Derby, where he won a Second Division title medal. Underwent a hernia operation in the spring.

■ DAVID MITCHELL (Striker). Age 30. Capped 17 times for Australia, David joined the Town a year ago from Chelsea for a nominal fee and found the net eight times in 28 full appearances.

■ JOHN MONCUR (Midfield) Age 25. A transfer deadline £80,000 signing from Spurs last season. John spent almost eight years at White Hart Lane after completing his apprenticeship. He made his league debut while on loan to Doncaster in 1986 and further loan spells took him to Cambridge, Portsmouth, Brentford and Ipswich. Now hoping for an extended run in the Town set-up.

MEET THE MANAGER

GLEN HODDLE. ONE of England's most gifted midfield stars who has had a glittering career with Spurs, Monaco and now in a player-manager role with Swindon. Spent 12 years at White Hart Lane and won 53 England caps. At White Hart Lane he won FA Cup and UEFA Cup honours as well as being a hero at the North London club. Left Spurs to play in



France with AC Monaco for three years but returned to England with a serious knee injury and took up his career again with a short spell at Chelsea. Joined Swindon as player-boss in April, 1991 and now operates as a 'sweeper' or in midfield. Out with injury for most of last term, he's now back to his gifted best.

STAR MAN



CRAIG MASKELL

(STRIKER). Age 24.

Craig Maskell joined Swindon from Reading in a £250,000 deal in the summer with Town's Tom Jones (no, not the singer), moving in the opposite direction.

It's been a tremendous move for the Aldershot-born striker who has taken over from Duncan Shearer as the club's hot-shot.

Already in a rich vein of form and scored against Bristol City last weekend. He was top scorer with the Elm Park club last season when he banged home 15 goals.

Craig was also top of the striking charts in the two seasons that he spent with Huddersfield Town.

He rattled in six goals in four reserve games and now Hoddle has broughthim to the club on a permanant basis to fire the goals which he hopes will bring promotion.
