

THE JORDAN REPORT

"I'm looking forward to the match and the job tremendously."

It's in at the deep end for me today with a West Country derby to kick-off my second spell as manager of Bristol City.

But I'm looking forward to the match and the job tremendously. There is a lot of hard work to be done to improve the disappointing League position, but I hope the team can soon start producing the commitment and entertainment that you, the supporters, want to see.

Although the match is being televised, I am sure there will be a decent sized crowd, and it is up to the players to give the fans reason to get behind them.

Our current position is precarious and we have to set about getting clear of the bottom of the table as soon as possible. To do so, we have to compete in all areas of the pitch.

In football you have to make your own breaks. I require my teams to work hard, play good football and entertain. Without the first of these qualities, the others are difficult to achieve.

Our opponents Swindon have a reputation for playing attractively and have some very dangerous players. Jan Aage Fjortoft is having a good run in front of goal and Joey Beauchamp is another lad we will have to keep a close watch on.

But my main concern is how Bristol City play as a team. While I know some of the players and staff from my previous time here, the next few weeks will be a time for assessing the strengths and weaknesses of the squad I have inherited.

I am not looking to make drastic changes overnight. The current squad will be given first opportunity to improve results, but we

cannot afford to wait long and I do have some players in mind that I would like to sign if necessary.

It is always important to supporters, as well as the manager coming in, to know what money is available for new signings. It has been made clear to me that there are problems in that direction.

But it is up to me to persuade the directors to make cash available if I need it. And I can assure you that I shall make every effort to do so.

I am really delighted to be back at a club where I had such an enjoyable first spell in management. I have learned a good deal since I left, mainly from my period at Hearts in which I tasted European competition as well as life at the top level in Scotland.

Hopefully, these experiences have made me a better manager. This is a club of great potential and my task is to give you a team to match the excellent facilities at Ashton Gate.

With your help, I shall do my utmost to bring the good times back to Bristol City. Let's hope we can start the ball rolling this afternoon.

Although generally accepted that the club was founded in 1881, it has to be said that there is no evidence that the name "Swindon Town" was used by founder, the Rev. William Pitt, until two years later on the amalgamation with another local side.

Old Rivalry

What is certain is the old rivalry between the two clubs both known as "The Robins". It was on the 1st September, 1894 that the clubs first met. That

meeting, played on City's former ground at St. Johns Lane, was the first ever match for City and resulted in a 4-2 defeat.

Original members of the Southern League in 1894, Swindon made a calamitous start, finishing bottom after taking only nine points from their eighteen games.

Successes


From those humble beginnings, there have been notable successes along the way. Two seasons ago, under the managership of Glenn

Hoddle, the Wiltshire club finally made it to the top flight for the first time in their history. Promotion to the F.A. Premiership was achieved after a thrilling 4-3 victory over Leicester City at Wembley in the Play-off Final.

That achievement made up for the profound disappointment experienced two years previously when the club thought they had secured a First Division place following a 1-0 win over Sunderland at Wembley. On that occasion, Swindon did



MAN AT THE TOP



Although there was immense disappointment when Glenn Hoddle left the County Ground for Chelsea in June 1993, the appointment of John Gorman on the same day as Hoddle left delighted the Swindon fans.

John was a ready made replacement having served two years as Assistant Manager to Hoddle following spells at Gillingham as Youth Team Coach and then Assistant Manager, and then at Leyton Orient where he ran the Youth and Reserve teams.

After a difficult first year in charge, Gorman saw his side relegated from the Premiership after only one season - but even in adversity his team won many accolades for the attractive football they produced.

Having experienced the top flight, Gorman will be anxious for his to get back there at the first attempt, and his philosophy of playing attacking football ensures that his side regularly finds the net.

Consistency is the key to that quick return to the Premiership - along with a need to concede fewer goals. One thing is sure, the hard working German will certainly give it his best shot.

not get the chance of kicking a ball in anger amongst the country's best - they were demoted by the Football Association following financial irregularities.

Previously, their most memorable moment also came at Wembley, way back in the 1968-69 season. Then, as a Third Division club, they lifted the League Cup with a 3-1 extra-time victory over mighty Arsenal. Even then there was disappointment. The club were not able to take their place in

Europe in the Fairs Cup because they were a Division Three club. They did, however, get a chance to play in Europe in the following season. they were entered in the newly-organised Anglo-Italian Cup, and won the tournament, defeating Napoli 3-0 in the Final in Italy.

Stable Fortunes

JOEY BEAUCHAMP

All's well that ends well! That surely is true in the case of talented midfielder Joey Beauchamp.

Last summer, the Oxford-born Beauchamp looked destined to move from the Manor Ground, where he made 151 first team appearances, to Swindon. At the eleventh hour, however, he changed his mind and chose West Ham - a move he regretted from the moment he signed.

It was just after the start of this season that he finally arrived at the County Ground - just one month after that disastrous move. Joey gets his fair share of goals, and Swindon will be hoping that trend will continue for them.

the Wiltshire club stayed in the section throughout, winning a place in the newly-formed Third Division in 1958.

Promotion

Five years later, Swindon experienced Second Division football for the first time, and from then on, they yo-yoed between the two

divisions for the next twenty years.

In 1986, there was a brief dalliance with the Fourth Division, but from then on, the fortunes of the club took a turn for the better.

The revival was started by Lou Macari, taken on by Ossie Ardiles and

then by Glenn Hoddle. Hoddle's untimely departure to Chelsea left John Gorman cutting his managerial teeth in the F.A. Premiership. He and his players found it a frustrating experience, but Swindon won many friends for the football they produced.

Struggle

True, they struggled at the bottom for the majority of their time in the top division, but they fought right to the end, always hopeful that they could play themselves out of trouble. It was not to be but with many of the players still at his disposal, Mr Gorman will be hopeful that his side can be amongst the main challengers for a rapid return.

who's who...

Former Manchester United apprentice **Fraser Digby** is the first choice 'keeper, and has made over 350 first team appearances since joining the club in September 1986.

His understudy for much of that time has been **Nicky Hammond**. Nicky was signed on a free transfer from Arsenal in July 1987.

Record-signing **Mark**

Robinson moved to Wiltshire in the summer from Newcastle United for £600,000. Mark made his League debut while still an apprentice at West Brom, but was not offered a contract there and moved on a free transfer to Barnsley. He had six years at Oakwell before his transfer to Newcastle.

Welsh international **Paul Bodin** is now in his second spell at the

club. An attacking full-back, he has been amongst the goals - from open play as well as from the penalty spot.

A broken arm has cost Swindon the services of **Shaun Taylor** recently. A late entrant into League football at the age of 23, he joined Swindon from Exeter City. An ever-present for the past two seasons. In the absence of broken leg casualty,

Adrian Viveash, the experienced **Brian Kilcline** has featured in central defence. A £90,000 signing from Newcastle United last January, Brian captained Coventry when they won the F.A. Cup. A big powerful player, he is also as brave as a lion.

Twenty-year-old local lad **Andy Thomson** forced his way into the side at the end of last season, and has been a



regular throughout this campaign.

Former trainee **Wayne O'Sullivan** made his League bow earlier this season. A twenty-year-old full-back, Wayne was born in Cyprus.

Dutchman **Luc Nijholt** had three years with Scottish League side Motherwell, and has also played in Switzerland as well as his native Holland. He has played in midfield for Swindon, but can also play at the back.

Midfielder **Martin Ling** is another player in his second spell at The County Ground. The first lasted only 93 days. Formerly with Exeter, Southend and Sheffield United, Martin returned three years ago.

Sideline through injury for twelve months, the experienced **Ross MacLaren** is now combining playing with his role as Reserve Team Manager.

In recent weeks, Swindon have been able to call on the services of the experienced **Neil Webb** who came on a month's loan from Nottingham Forest. He has now returned to the City Ground, and it is likely that manager John Gorman may have to look to one of his promising youngsters to fill the gap.

21-year-old **Austin Berkley** was snapped up by Gorman when he was released by Gillingham in 1991. He scored on his debut for the club in the Anglo



DANGERMAN

It may have taken a little time to get into his stride but Norwegian international striker Jan Aage FJORTOFT is now proving just how prolific a goalscorer he is.

When Swindon signed him from Rapid Vienna for £500,000 in July 1993, there was great hopes that he would score the goals to lift his side into the comfortability of a mid-table position in the premiership.

Unfortunately, it took him time to settle and after eleven League games, he was still looking for his first goal. The forward, who has made over 50 appearances for Norway and who scored against England to end their hopes of qualifying for last summer's World Cup Finals in America, has not looked back following his first goal.

Quality shone through and to Jan's credit, he finished with 13 goals in 27 League and Cup appearances. This season, he has regularly found the net and recently signed a new contract tying him to the County Ground until 1999.

Italian Cup at Oxford in September 1992, and also made a substitute appearance in the League in the same season.

Ty Gooden was released by Wycombe Wanderers and signed by Swindon in December 1993 after a successful trial period. He made his Premiership debut as a substitute in March this year.

Yet to make his debut,

Lee Middleton is a quality passer of the ball. Lee signed for Swindon after being released by Coventry City in July 1992, but received a set-back after breaking a leg last season in a reserve game.

Another yet to claim a regular first team place, 21-year-old **Marcus Phillips** hails from Bradford-on-Avon. An attacking midfielder, he made his debut as substitute in the home

game against Watford in 1992, and started the game which saw the end of Torquay's Coca-Cola Cup ambitions.

Forward **Andy Mutch** arrived at Swindon in August 1993 for a £250,000 fee - so ending a prolific goal-scoring partnership with former England forward Steve Bull at Wolves. Andy, himself capped at Under 21 and 'B' levels by England is renowned for celebrating his goals with a handstand.

Keith Scott has just completed his first year with the club after his £300,000 move from Wycombe Wanderers.

Previously with Lincoln City, Keith had scored 60 goals in 112 appearances while with Wycombe in their non-league days, and fifteen in 23 starts in their first year in the League.

Jersey-born **Chris Hamon** came to the club on the recommendation of former Spurs star Chris Jones. He signed a two-year contract in 1993, but has yet to establish himself as a first team regular.



KEVIN HORLOCK

Twenty two years of age, his birthday was earlier this month, the former West ham United defender has been a more than useful acquisition since his free transfer to Swindon in the summer of 1992.

A Northern Ireland Under 21 international, Kevin proved a more than capable deputy for regular full back Paul Bodin when the Welsh international was sidelined through injury and has also filled other positions on the left side of the team.



Looking Back

May 9th, 1987 Bristol City 1 Swindon Town 1

The chances are that Gordon Owen is still haunted by the events of May 1987.

In the space of 15 days, the little winger missed two penalties. Nothing particularly unusual in that - except that these were two of the most important spot kicks in Bristol city's history.

When Swindon Town visited Ashton Gate for the final League game of City's 1986-87 campaign, the stakes could hardly have been higher. Victory would enable Terry Cooper's team to join our west Country neighbours in the Third division promotion play-offs.

a crowd of 19,201 packed into Ashton Gate. City were in confident mood after a run of only two defeats in 14 League games. As Joe Jordan took his famous front teeth out in the dressing room and prepared for battle, the mood was determined and optimistic.

After 12 minutes, the expectations were fulfilled. Trevor Morgan timed his run perfectly to meet Owen's chipped free kick and beat Fraser Digby with a neat glancing header.

Cheered on by the magnificent crowd, City desperately sought the

second goal which would clinch their play-off place. Gary Marshall hit the crossbar, Rob Newman had a volley palmed wide by Digby.

But in the second half, Swindon gradually began to have more of the play. The equaliser all City fans were fearing came in the 66th minute when Andy Llewellyn conceded a free kick.

Jordan misdirected his headed clearance to Peter Coyne who swung a boot and deceived goalkeeper Keith Waugh with a volley he later admitted was "completely mishit."

Now the pressure was back on City. With 15 minutes left, Cooper took a logical gamble, sending on Keith Curle for left-back Brian Williams in a bid to add some pace on the flank.

It proved to be a fateful decision - Williams was the team's regular penalty-taker. Just two minutes after he went off, Jordan went down in a goalmouth scramble and, despite Swindon's protests, referee Darryl Reeves pointed to the spot.

John MacPhail was an experienced penalty-taker. But when Owen confidently picked up the ball and placed it on the spot, the defender stood back and let him get on with it.

Never had a 19,000 crowd been more hushed. Up stepped Owen.... and his

right foot sent the ball wide of Digby's right-hand post. What agony! In the 13 minutes remaining, Marshall had a shot cleared off the line by Mark Jones and Digby produced a miraculous reflex save from Newman. At the other end David Moyes appeared fortunate not to concede a penalty for handball.

The final whistle brought despair for Owen and utter dejection for his teammates. The Evening Post headline the following Monday summed it all up - CITY MISS THE BOAT.

At least there was the consolation of another Wembley appearance in the Freight Rover Trophy. But

on May 24th, City lost to Mansfield town in a penalty shoot-out after a 1-1 draw and extra time.

Owen missed from the spot when scoring would have brought the trophy back to Bristol for a second year. It just wasn't his month!

Keith Welch

With a beautiful five-month-old daughter, Megan, his family happily settled at Clevedon and his form the best of his career, life at Bristol City is pretty rosy for Keith Welch.

But that hasn't always been the case. Keith gives a rueful smile when he recalls his early days at the club after a £200,000 transfer from Rochdale in the summer of 1991.

"I'm still trying to forget that period," he says. "For some reason, I didn't perform anywhere near my best. I've never been able to put my finger on quite what went wrong, but there were a few choice comments from the supporters at that time!"

In fact, Keith was dropped after just 13 appearances. Jimmy Lumsden's contention when signing him that here was a keeper who would serve City for years looked more than a trifle over the top.

Since then, however,

Keith has won over the fans in a big way. Last season, he missed only the final match and kept 25 clean sheets in all competitions. "I've never played better. Perhaps it just took me longer than expected to adjust to the faster pace after spending so long in the old Fourth Division," he says.

But let's go right back to the start. Like so many goalkeeping careers, Keith's began by accident while he was at school.

"I had been playing as a striker for a couple of years, wanting the glory of scoring goals like all youngsters. Then our goalkeeper failed to turn up for one match and I agreed to stand in for him. I quite enjoyed it and stayed there from then on.

Bolton Boy

"I was selected for Bolton Boys and signed for Bolton Wanderers as a 14-year-old associate schoolboy. They offered me a Youth Training scheme place, but after the first year when I didn't get many games, it was obvious they would release me.

"I sat down and wrote to as many clubs as I could think of asking for trials.

Rochdale were the first to show interest and after two trials there, I signed as a second year trainee."

Keith's first team debut came in inauspicious circumstances of a Freight Rover Trophy tie against Chesterfield at Spotland. "I think the crowd was about 300," he jokes. "Our first team goalkeeper, Dave Redfern was injured and I took over. From then on, I was in the side for the best part of five seasons. I'm not too sure what happened to Dave."

Highlight

Asked for the highlights of his Rochdale career, Keith's mischievous grin surfaces again. Highlights and Rochdale, he concedes, don't really go together.

"We reached the F.A. Cup Fifth Round once. None of the lads could believe it. But we only lost 1-0 to Crystal Palace and played at Anfield in the first round, although it was only against Marine!

"Actually, I loved it at Rochdale. We were one of the joke sides of the League, but it is a very close knit and friendly club. I still keep an eye on their results, and I'm glad to say they are

winning a few more games these days."

Keith's form at Rochdale earned him a place in the Fourth Division XI selected by the Professional Footballers Association. It was while at Spotland that he first met Jimmy Lumsden, who was assistant manager there to Eddie Gray.

"Knowing Jimmy made it easier to move when Bristol City came in for me," says Keith. "I've never had cause to regret it and my wife Deborah and I love the area.

"Little Megan has changed our lives a bit, but it's great being parents. Fortunately, she now sleeps right through the night!"

What Keith needs now to complete the happy picture is a few more clean sheets and an improvement in City's League position. "I'm confident it will happen. We haven't been helped by a load of injuries which have meant changes almost every week.

"With a more settled side, we are capable of making up ground in what is proving a very tight division."


