





# Blackburn Rovers the visitors

*It is just four months ago that Alan Shearer and his colleagues were celebrating Blackburn Rovers' greatest triumph, the winning of the Premiership title - their first major prize since winning the FA Cup 81 years earlier.*

It was perhaps fitting too that they should achieve the honour at Anfield, a stage that in the past 25 years has acclaimed more League Championship successes than any other in our domestic games.

"It is what we are in football for - to win things and that is exactly what we have done. Winning the Championship was evidence that we are a good team. We proved we were a match for anyone and managed to get our hands on the trophy which was what we had all been striving for," said Shearer.

"Without a doubt it was certainly the best moment in my life up to now."

The euphoria of that memorable achievement now seems light years away however, as Blackburn Rovers have struggled this season to produce the form expected of their status. There have been changes at Ewood Park with Kenny Dalglish's decision to quit as manager more than a bolt out of the blue for Rovers fans. The canny Scot is still involved behind the scenes as technical advisor with former assistant Ray Harford taking over the hot-seat. However last

week Harford himself decided to take a back-seat as far as coaching is concerned bringing in Derek Fazackerley from Newcastle United to run things.

The new boss was relatively idle with the cheque book during the summer, the £1.2 million signing of midfielder Matt Holmes from West Ham United his only great indulgence, alongside the recruitment of young Darlington defender Adam Reed.

Having lost the Charity Shield, 1-0 to Everton at Wembley, all seemed to be going as normal when Alan Shearer scored from the penalty spot on the opening day of the Premier League season to beat QPR 1-0. If Blackburn weren't brought down to earth by a 2-1 defeat at Sheffield Wednesday they certainly were by Bolton, who won by the same margin. Then it was a third successive 2-1 defeat for the Champions - this time inflicted by Manchester United.

Alan Shearer's predatory talents produced the equaliser against Aston Villa, in a 1-1 draw at Ewood Park. It must be a worrying statistic however, for Ray Harford, that in

their opening five games, apart from Matty Holmes' goal at Bolton, it has been left to Shearer to find the net.

The new Rovers boss has consequently tried to bolster his squad but having failed to acquire the double transfer of Bolton's Jason McAteer and Allan Stubbs attention has focused on Newcastle winger Ruel Fox who, if he moved, would renew his old Norwich City partnership with Chris Sutton.

There is no doubting the quality at Blackburn's disposal with Internationals such as Tim Flowers, Graeme Le Saux, David Batty, and Colin Hendry to rely upon although the England goalkeeper, sent-off against QPR, has had his problems this season while Sutton was dropped to the subs bench against Aston Villa.

Spartak Moscow upset them in the Champions Cup at Ewood Park last Wednesday, then it was Anfield on Saturday and the County Ground tonight. These are crucial tests that will tell if Blackburn can cope with their new-won status as Champions of England!

# Blackburn Rovers



## Mark Atkins

- DEFENDER/MIDFIELD. Has appeared in 200 League games for Rovers since his £45,000 move from Scunthorpe United in June 1988. A versatile operator Mark has played mainly at right-back. Made his League debut 5-10-86 for Scunthorpe United against Wolves, when still only 16.  
Born: Doncaster 14-8-68.

## David Batty

- MIDFIELD. Tough tackling ball winner recruited from his native Leeds United for £2.75 million after over 200 appearances for the Yorkshire giants and winning a League Championship medal in 1992. Collected a second Championship crown with Rovers such has been David's enthusiasm and impact at Ewood Park that he was voted Player of the Year. Capped 17 times by England he is a current member of the national squad. Born: Leeds 2-12-68.

## Henning Berg

- DEFENDER. Enjoyed an outstanding season to help clinch the title making 38 starts. Kenny Dalglish signed him in 1993 from Norwegian Club SK Lillestrom, soon after making his International debut for Norway. Was an outstanding success for his Country in the World Cup Finals of 1994 and has now come to terms with English football after making his Premiership debut vs Crystal Palace in February 1993.  
Born: Eidsvoll, Norway 1-9-69.

## Kevin Gallacher

- STRIKER, signed from Coventry City on transfer deadline day in March 1993 in a £1.5-million plus deal that took Roy Wegerlee to Highfield Road. Scored five goals in nine games in his first season for Rovers and extended that to 7 goals in 27 Premiership games until a broken leg ended his contribution in 1993-94. A Scottish

international he started his playing days with Duntocher Boys Club.  
Born: Clydebank 23-11-66.

## Colin Hendry

- CENTRAL-DEFENDER. Spectacular defender who makes his presence felt in both penalty boxes. This is his second spell at Ewood Park having returned for £750,000 in November 1991 after 63 League games with Manchester City. Islavale was his first club, Dundee introducing him to top class football (41 Scottish League app.). Arrived at Blackburn in March 1987 clocking up 102 League games in his first spell with Rovers. Was impressive last season and won his first Scottish cap in May 1993, and has captained the Scotland "B" side.  
Born: Keith 7-12-65.

## Matty Holmes

- MIDFIELD. Small in stature but big in heart Matt was signed from West Ham United in August 1995 in a £1.3 million deal that involved Robbie Slater moving to Upton Park. Was a trainee under Harry Redknapp at Bournemouth but made his League debut while on loan to Cardiff City (vs Aldershot) in March 1989. In August 1992 Redknapp paid just £40,000 to take him to West Ham where he became a firm favourite with the fans. Born: Luton 1-8-69.

## Jeff Kenna

- FULL-BACK. Can operate either side though he does favour his right foot. A Dubliner, Jeff joined the trainee ranks at Southampton in 1987 and after making his League bow against Derby in May 1991 and quickly established himself. Had already been capped three times at Under-21 level by Eire and has subsequently achieved full International status under Jack Charlton. Arrived at Ewood Park in March 1995. Injuries limited him to 9 Premiership appearances last season. Born: Dublin 27-8-70.

## Graeme Le Saux

- LEFT-BACK. Looked an outstanding prospect when he broke into the Chelsea side as a left-fullback. Can virtually play anywhere on the left and has represented England at Full - he made his last appearance against Columbia a fortnight ago - "B" and Under-21 levels. Signed for Rovers in March 1993 for £400,000 plus Steve Livingstone after making 90 League appearances for the Blues.  
Born: Jersey 17-10-68.

## Bobby Mimms

- GOALKEEPER. Arrived at Ewood Park in January 1991 from Tottenham Hotspur - for £250,000 - after a rather unhappy stay at White Hart Lane. Bobby served his apprenticeship with Halifax Town but made his League debut after joining Rotherham United, in a 4-1 win over Blackburn (8-5-82). While with the Yorkshire club he was called into the England under-21 squad (3 caps) alongside David Seaman. Was snapped up by Everton and though performing brilliantly in 29 games - he covered for the injured Southall - he was dropped on the Welshman's return to fitness. Had loan spells with Notts County, Sunderland, Blackburn and Manchester City before transferring to Spurs in February 1988 - for £375,000. Played against Villa this season.  
Born: York 12-10-63.

# Blackburn Rovers



## Mike Newell

- **STRIKER.** Was on Liverpool's books as a junior but it was Crewe Alexandra who introduced him to League football giving him his debut in a 2-1 home win over Swindon Town (8-10-83), in the Fourth Division. Made only two more appearances before joining Wigan in 1983. His 16 goals in 24 League games in 1985-86 tempted Luton to sign him, then in 1987-88 he joined Leicester City. Later signed by Everton and in November 1991 he became Blackburn's first million pound signing in a £1.1m move. Has scored 32 goals in 75 League and Cup appearances by the start of the 1993-94 campaign, including the penalty winner at Wembley that saw Rovers promoted in the Play-Off Final of 1992. Strong in the air he netted 6 goals in 27 games last season. Born: Liverpool 27-1-65.

## Stuart Ripley

- **FORWARD.** Strong running athlete who thrives on space on either of the flanks. Played over 300 games for his native Middlesborough before joining Rovers for £1.3m in July 1992. Capped by England at Full (1) and Under-21 levels. Stuart failed to score in 40 appearances last season which was disappointing for him. Born: Middlesborough 20-11-67.

## Alan Shearer

- **STRIKER.** A strong powerful leader of the line he has a delicate touch and superb balance. No less a judge than Kevin Keegan branded him "world class". Alan was struck down with cruciate knee ligament trouble in his first season with Blackburn after scoring 22 goals in 26 appearances! It ruled him out until 29th August 1993. Was the League top scorer last season with 37 goals - 34 in the Premiership. Goals have been Alan's trademark since he scored a hat-trick on his league debut for Southampton. That was against Arsenal, at the

Dell, in April 1988 and he went on to register 43 goals in 150 games for the Saints, who received £3.6m for him in the summer of 1992. He also scored on his England debut and collected his 18th full cap against Columbia this month. Born: Newcastle 13-8-70.

## Tim Sherwood

- **MIDFIELD.** Started his career with Watford, making the first of his 32 League appearances for them in September 1987. Joined Norwich City in 1989 scoring 10 goals in 71 League games for the Canaries before his £500,000 transfer to Blackburn in February 1992. An inch over six-feet tall he has been a consistent performer and last season was in the standby squad for England. Born: St.Albans 6-2-69.

## Chris Sutton

- **STRIKER.** The football world was staggered when Rovers shelled out £5 million for Chris, in July 1994, after virtually just one season in League football with Norwich City. Originally a centre-half, it was manager Mike Walker who transformed him from a promising defender to a goal scoring striker. Made his League debut against QPR in May 1991. Hails from a footballing family - father Mike having played for the Canaries, Chester and Carlisle. Chris netted 21 goals last season. Born: Nottingham 10-3-73.


## Paul Warhurst

- **UTILITY.** Came into football as a central defender but is also a superb midfielder. Made his name as a striker with Sheffield Wednesday, netting 18 goals after switching from defence. Such was his form that he was called into the England squad and denied his international debut only through injury. Previously with Manchester City and Oldham (who paid City £10,000), he cost Wednesday £750,000 in 1991. Had just signed a new four-year contract when Blackburn negotiated his transfer to Ewood Park for £2.7 - million, on September 3rd 1993. A former England Under-21 defender he no longer sees himself in that position. Made only 4 appearances last season due to a broken leg in October. Born: Stockport 26-9-69.

## Jason Wilcox

- **FORWARD.** A former trainee he has been a professional since June 1989. Didn't really come into his own until the season of 1991-92 when development was dramatic. Playing a wide role on the left he has created many goals for Shearer and Newell and has scored 6 himself during his 36 games. Born: Bolton 15-7-71.

# the man in charge



**Manager - Ray Harford**

*Ray Harford is one of the most respected coaches in the English game and Blackburn's title winning season in no small measure owes a lot to him.*

Born in Halifax he started his playing career in London with Charlton Athletic but in two years there, as a half-back he made only three League appearances and moved to Exeter City. This was the start of a career which embraces 354 League appearances with Lincoln City (161 games), Mansfield Town, Port Vale and Colchester United his other ports of call.

At Layer Road, Ray came under the influence of Jim Smith (now Derby County's boss), who groomed him for management during his seven year association with Colchester.

It was former Luton player Malcolm MacDonald, then manager of Fulham, who offered him the coach's job at Craven Cottage and when the former Arsenal, Newcastle and England striker left

Ray was appointed manager. He relinquished this post two years later and was snapped up by Luton Town and after a year as coach succeeded John Moore as manager. In February 1989 Spanish giants Real Madrid sought his services after Hartford had steered them to a second successive League Cup Final.

His success on limited budgets was outstanding but Ray pursued his career with Wimbledon and also coached at International level before arriving at Ewood Park along with Kenny Dalglish in October 1991.


When Dalglish abdicated his position in May to become a Director of Coaching, Ray, who was on the verge of quitting to take on a managerial challenge, was quickly installed.

## Under the Spotlight

*England's goalkeeper has had a somewhat traumatic start to the new season after a few howlers for England last summer in the Umbro International tournament.*

The champagne finish to last season quickly lost its fizz when Tim was sent-off for a professional foul in the opening Premiership game of this campaign against Queens Park Rangers and there was no end to the gloom when he lost his International jersey to David Seaman for the opening International against Columbia.

But there is no harder worker than Tim who has earned his reputation through consistence. Came into football as an apprentice with Wolves, making his League debut for them in 2-2 draw with Sheffield United in August 1984.



**Tim Flowers - Goalkeeper**

During his time at Molineux, Wolves slipped down to Division Four but Southampton stepped in to sign him as Peter Shilton's understudy in 1986 at a cost of £70,000. Suffered a broken cheekbone in only his second

game - against Arsenal - then played seven League games for Swindon on loan in 1987 before returning to the Dell where he eventually took over from John Burridge in 1989.

Quickly became one of the best custodians in the business and in June 1993 made a spectacular debut for England in a 1-1 draw with Brazil in Washington. Has now been capped 7 times and is the most serious challenger to Seaman for that number one shirt.

In November 1993 Blackburn paid a record price for a goalkeeper to take him away from the Dell and he subsequently became a key figure in their Championship run last season. Born: Kenilworth 3-2-67.

The "Posh" earned their League status on the back of their Cup giant-killing acts and tradition dies hard. Peterborough might not have won away from home in the Second Division this season but when it comes to Cup-tie football they have remarkable fighting qualities as Swansea City found in the previous round. The Welsh side were 4-1 up from the first-leg yet it is the London Road outfit who contest the glamour tie with Villa.

Of course nobody will give York City a prayer against Manchester United at Old Trafford. The Minstermen are trailing woefully at the foot of the Second Division table with one win, just seven goals scored and 14 conceded in their League games.

Complacency on the part of the Red Devils is surely their only hope. Yet City netted six times in the previous round to beat Rochdale 6-3 on aggregate. Still nothing short of divine intervention will see them through this one surely.

The Millwall vs Everton tie suggests the possibility of some red faces for Merseyside. The Lions are roaring away at the top of the First

Division and the New Den is not the most hospitable venue for visiting teams. Prior to Sunday's trip to Nottingham Forest the Toffeemen, though unbeaten away, had won only two of their five games and if Millwall can edge a first-leg lead they could be in business.

Chester City too will be dreaming of prized scalps at White Hart Lane. The great Spurs machine has not been running smoothly this term with just two wins in the opening six Premiership fixtures. It has been games since the season started in a desperate effort to spend £7.5 million. And the Spurs boss moans:

"The problem is who can one get for this kind of money when one player today goes for £8 million?"


Aah... He will be shown no sympathy from the Chester Board that is for sure as the Third Division promotion hopefuls look to succeed where Leeds United failed.

Chelsea, Liverpool and Norwich City should all be good enough to see off their opponents Stoke City, Sunderland and Torquay United respectively but Coventry City, home to Hull, Leicester City who play hosts to Burnley and Sheffield United, who have just found their cutting edge but take on Bury, are all possible victims.







To be fair the performance the lads put in was out of place in Division




2. It would have graced any Premiership fixture.

The operation went well with Chris only being in hospital for six hours, showing the advancement in knee surgery over the last five years.


Chris will work alongside Jason in his bid to return to the Youth Team in October.



# From a small **Acorn** a **mighty COKE** has grown.

*The Football League Cup was launched in 1960 and was dismissed as another unwanted encumbrance on a fixture list which was already becoming overcrowded.*

It was an understandable reaction from the elite clubs who were more interested in the lucrative lure of European competition. The Football League Cup competition was the baby of the then League Secretary, the late Alan Hardacre and was intended as a means to bring in more income through the rapidly dwindling numbers coming in via the turnstiles.

The idea was right, the thought of Swindon entertaining Manchester United or Arsenal travelling to play at Torquay United could swell the smaller club's coffers.

However for the project to succeed it needed the backing of all the major powers. Sadly they had more profitable forms of income and were not too concerned about this new competition.

There was vocal opposition to the inauguration of the competition but it eventually went ahead after clubs voted and agreed by 31 votes to 15 to go ahead but advisably entry was initially made optional.

The format was quite simple in so much as the first five rounds were played on a knockout basis and the Semi-Final and Final would be played over two legs at home and away. In the first year five clubs - Arsenal, Tottenham Hotspur, Sheffield Wednesday, West Bromwich Albion and Wolverhampton Wanderers all saw fit not to enter.

The first ever League Cup games were held on the evening of 26


September 1960 when Fulham played Bristol Rovers at Eastville where over 20,000 saw the first ever League Cup goal scored by Maurice Cook of the visiting team. In the other game that night West Ham United beat Charlton Athletic.

Aston Villa and Rotherham United made it through to the first Final, which was held over to the start of the following season, with 12,226 spectators seeing Rotherham taking a 2-0 first leg lead to Villa Park, which they were unable to maintain going down 3-2 on aggregate. 31,202 fans witnessed Aston Villa take the trophy. The following season saw the number of non-participants double and a Second Division side win the Cup when Norwich City beat Rochdale 4-0 on aggregate.

In 1966 the competition progressed further when it was decided to have the final played at Wembley Stadium. This sparked a show of enthusiasm and all but two Football League clubs entered. A further carrot was the prospect of automatic entry into the U.E.F.A. Cup competition.

At last the Football League Cup competition was being taken seriously. It has created its own tradition with Rotherham United, Rochdale, Norwich City, Stoke City, Queens Park Rangers, Southampton and not forgetting Swindon Town all to savour the magic of playing in a major Cup Final. Over the years the competition has attracted sponsorship from the Dairy Council who named it the Milk

Cup from 1981/82 season to 1985/86. Littlewoods took over from 1986/87 - 1989/90 and then the trophy became the Rumbelows League Cup for what should have been four years but this was terminated two years early and as a result of amicable three way negotiations between the Football League, Rumbelows and Coca-Cola, the Coca-Cola Cup was born and the fizz was put back into Hardacre's Baby with a two year £2.25m agreement and a three year option period.

# Peter Thorn

## Talks to Colin Benson

**CB: Peter this is obviously a very exciting night for Swindon, taking on the Premiership Champions, but no doubt you are disappointed you are not fit enough to play against your former club?**

PT: It is certainly very exciting for me, it will be great to see the lads again. I just hope that I am fit enough to be involved.

CB: Yes, it has been a very traumatic time for you hasn't it?

PT: Yes, after getting in pre-season it was particularly annoying to pull my hamstring just two days before the opening game at Hull, it happened so innocently really.

We were having a bit of a training match and as I moved out to the right wing I just felt it go and had to pull up. It was just a bit of sprinting that is all, I wasn't stretching for a ball or anything like that. At first I didn't really think much of it. I thought it would go away in a minute, but when I tried to sprint again I knew that was it.

CB: Hard luck indeed, but you made your comeback in fact in the previous round of the Coca-Cola Cup against Cambridge.

PT: For forty-five minutes then I broke down again didn't I...I tried to rush it too quickly. I had pushed it before in a training session and it wasn't right. But I was so keen to get back I thought it would be okay but it wasn't really right and I shouldn't have played against Cambridge I don't think. I should have given it a couple of more days.

But that's the way it goes. You want to get back, you want to play, and in the end all it has done is keep me out longer. It really is annoying being injured.

CB: Obviously in the half you did play in the previous round you were alongside a new partner in Steve Finney. How well did you feel it was going for you before the muscle twanged again?

PT: Steve has done very well, scored a few goals. He got his chance because of my incapacity and that's the way things go. As long as the team is doing well that is the main thing. I had only ever played with Wayne Allison in the friendlies and obviously about ten or fifteen minutes with Steve. But I know he is all about and linking up with him is no problem. I know what they do and I am sure they know what I do. But I know with these two around I am going to have to get my head down to try and get back in the team.

CB: So what is the physical situation now. Is there a possibility that you could be fit to face Blackburn?


PT: No. I'm hoping to get maybe a half hour in the Reserves game on Monday and with a bit of luck that will go well but I am not fit anyway running wise, because I have been

out so long now, so I have a lot of work to do. There is just a slight chance I might be involved but that is up to the gaffer.


CB: So realistically Peter the most you can hope for is a place on the bench?

PT: Oh yeah. The lads are doing well anyway so they don't really need me at the moment. And there is no point me rushing it as I will only end up pulling it again, and that will set me back another four weeks.

I have rushed it twice now I just don't want to do that again. I think really I am looking more towards the second game at Ewood Park. Blackburn is a big game for us all but the League programme is the most important thing on our agenda of course though obviously with Blackburn being my old club it would be nice to play against them.

CB: They are the Champions - we couldn't be up against more formidable opponents but what is going to be the real danger for us do you think?

PT: Have you heard of Alan Shearer? They are all good players aren't they but he is the one who inflicts most damage.


Ray will be clued up about us. He is a great strategist and a terrific manager and he will make sure Blackburn give it their best shot whatever the game.







The first half was played at a fast and furious pace and with the descending sun over the stand at Witney making it hard for the players.




# Award for John

# Benno!

***FIFA have really been proved to be stretching a point with their ridiculous new edict on dealing with injuries on the field of play. You know what I'm talking about, the ludicrous sight of stretcher bearers rushing to remove the corpse every time a player trips over his boot laces!***

I mean it became a riot of ridicule when the game's governing body introduced this concept in the USA World Cup Finals. Of course the Americans had to go over the top with motorised stretcher units bombing on and off the field to take any grounded player to the sidelines whether he needed to go off or not. It reminded me of the old TV series "The Prisoner" in which people were carted around in little electric buggies against their will.

To be honest I never quite understood that series, I certainly don't understand the logic of this FIFA inspired legislation. If it is meant to speed up the game and keep the action flowing then it has failed, and failed miserably, for the opposite has been the outcome as little matters of impact are turned into major incidents.

The instructions from UEFA, who are acting under orders from FIFA, are that no players are to receive treatment on the pitch though the temporary incapacity of a goalkeeper through injury is, however, one situation "where a Referee may see benefit in exercising some discretion." Thus, for any ordinary knock the referee must order on a stretcher to remove the injured party to the sidelines if he requires treatment.

Now stretcher bearers, God bless them, are not exactly the fastest trained athletes in the world and usually by the time they get to the stricken player Jonathan Trigg, or his counterpart, has been on the scene and delivered the magic potion. Under normal circumstances the player could get

up and the game continue. But oh no, not now. If the stretcher has been called on, the player must leave the field, not necessarily on the stretcher - he can walk if he wishes - but he has to leave. In doing this of course we are wasting more time as he traipses off reluctantly, which is extended by the player then having to request permission to re-enter the game once he has reached the side-line.

The FA notified all clubs and referees to explain the "FIFA mandatory instruction," as they appreciated the value of "a standard procedure." Alas, it seems their words of wisdom have fallen on fallow ground.

Town physio Jonathan Trigg says: "Don't talk to me about stretchers. It changes on a weekly basis. Every referee who has come here this season has had his own interpretation of the instruction and none of them are the same. Some tell me I am allowed on the pitch to assess an injury, others have not allowed me on at all."

"The referee last week told me we should have four stretchers available in case there was a multiple collision of players."

Perhaps that official would be better employed working for the emergency services on the M5? "A multiple collision of players." I ask you. What's his intention. To get them all carried off and play nine-a-side? Now is this not all a nonsense? Of course it is and the Football Association should notify FIFA accordingly and tell them where to stick their stretchers.



**To win 4-1 away is a good result at any level. Our opening strike at Bristol Rovers was a really good goal, well worked by the manager and Kevin Horlock struck it very well. Then we gave a bit of a sloppy goal away just before half-time when we seemed to have slumped into a bit of a stroll.**

At the interval we agreed we could raise our game a lot more and in the second half we went up a gear, got the goal to make it 2-1 and after that we played some good football and the goals just flowed from there. We could have had a few more after that as well, so it was an impressive team performance.

Four goals and not one from a striker but they all played their part. With Wayne Allison injured the gaffer brought in Eddie Murray to partner Steve Finney and they both did very well up front.

But it is important that our midfielders and defenders contribute to the scoring side of the game. Forwards help defensively and in most successful teams you will find the goals are distributed around the side. If you are going to stand a chance of winning anything you have to be capable of spreading your goals around. You need somebody who is going to bag you 20-25 goals of

course but you also need a few others to nip in with five or six.

On this occasion Kevin got a hat-trick - which was good for him I am very pleased - it is probably as many goals as he usually scores in a whole season, but it was good for him to score. Actually he had a good chance just before half-time and was unlucky when their goalkeeper made a great save so he might well have had four goals on the day.

But as I say I am pleased for him. For a midfielder player to score a hat-trick is quite unusual. It is a real boost for the team. We had not changed anything either, Kevin was operating his normal position alongside Wayne, with the manager a bit deeper. Wayne was putting them in before, now it is Kevin. They just seem to be taking it in turns.

We wouldn't mind a couple from him tonight. It is going to be a great game I am sure with the



pressure more on Blackburn than us. We have tried to keep ourselves focused on our main objective, which is winning promotion, but now I won't say we can relax, because we want to do well, but we can let ourselves go a bit perhaps.

Alan Shearer is obviously going to give us defenders a tough night, but Blackburn is not all about the England centre-forward as I am sure you all know. They have Internationals in practically every position from goal to outside-left and it will be a good examination for us.

The Champions have not had a good start to the season but you feel they have to start clicking eventually. A good team does not become a bad one overnight and the quality of their players cannot be denied. The three goals Liverpool scored against them on Saturday were good goals, there is no doubt about that, and we know this is far from an easy task for us. But with the fans behind us it will help everyone to raise their game and we are going to give it a damned good shot.

We know that if we get a good result in this home leg then anything can happen. All the lads are in a confident mood because we are winning games but we know they are a top side and that one day they will click. We just hope it is not against us.

Devon was actually a good base to work from but it was certainly not the pinnacle as some of the boys might have thought.




The game against Oxford United was the first for the boys at this level and hopefully they can learn from it.


