



A quick glance at the Second Division table can be misleading for Shrewsbury Town, nestling in eleventh place with 23 points from 17 games. On the face of it should not present too much of a threat to the League leaders... yet statistics can be misleading when not viewed in perspective.

The truth is that Shrewsbury got off to a terrible start at the beginning of the season, opening their schedule with a 3-1 defeat at Swansea City, followed by a 2-0 loss to Walsall at Gay Meadow and then another 3-1 defeat at Bradford City.

In between the Shrews squeezed through to the second round of the Coca-Cola Cup by overcoming Doncaster Rovers on the away goals rule - the ties ended up 1-1 on aggregate but apart from a convincing 4-1 victory over Bristol City, when lan Reed, Dean Spink, Mark Dempsey and Darren Rowbotham were the scorers, there was not much joy for Shrewsbury supporters.

Blackpool then beat them 2-0 at home, they lost at Crewe 3-0, drew at Wrexham 1-1 and lost the following three games, all at home, to Notts County 1-0, Derby County in the Coca-Cola Cup 3-1 and Stockport County 2-1.

It was the end of September that a change in fortune seemed to materialise. Peter Whiston and Rowbotham scored in a 2-2 draw at Brighton - they had led 2-1 and

Rowbotham was on the scoresheet again in a 1-1 draw at the Baseball Ground. It wasn't enough to see them through though against Derby in the Coca-Cola Cup it was a great boost to morale.

The Cardiff born striker hit two more goals in a 3-2 win at Hull to make it four goals for him in the three games; York City were beaten 2-1. Rotherham United 3-1. Oxford United 2-0. Brentford (away) 2-0 and Burnley 3-0 last Saturday.

It is now four straight League wins for Shrewsbury Town, the best current form in Division Two, so any thoughts that they are an easy touch are now permanently shelved. The only hiccup in their last ten outings being a 1-0 defeat at Chesterfield.

Indeed, the Shrews have hammered in no less than 21 goals in their last five games in major competitions, a figure boosted of course by their massive 11-2 eclipse of Marine in the FA Cup. It was Shrewsbury's highest ever victory. Re-writing the history books were skipper Dean Spink with a hat-trick, Peter Whiston (2),

Paul Evans, Ian Stevens, Curtis Withe, Richard Scott and Mark Dempsey. And it was all started by Marine's Keith Proctor with an own-goal in the third minute!

Two goal Paul Evans was the hero against Burnley, his first effort coming from an eighth minute penalty which he blasted home after Gerry Harrison had been sent off for hurling himself to palm away lan Stevens goal-bound shot - Evans netted the second in the 35th minute. Richard Scott calmly slotted in a third goal to leave Burnley well beaten.

The winning combination last Saturday was: Edwards, Seabury, Withe, Evans, Whiston, Scott, Woods, Stevens (Rotherham 33), Spink, Anthrobus, Berkley, Subs not used: Dempsey, Reed.

Richard Scott has scored in each of the last three games: Dean Spink is the Shrews top shot with eight goals in League and FA Cup; Darren Rowbotham has five.

Tommy Lynch has four - all from the penalty spot and three of them netted in the last six Division Two encounters.


Tim Clarke

- GOALKEEPER. Made 16 Second Division appearances last season one as a sub - but still has not been able to dethrone Paul Edwards. Tim came into League football as an understudy to the consistent Steve Ogrizovic at Coventry City then moved to Huddersfield Town to play first team football. Has a loan spell with Rochdale before signing for the Shrews during the 1993-94 season. Tim is 6'3".

Mark Dempsey

Born: Stourbridge 16-5-65.

- FORWARD. Another who learned his trade with Gillingham, Mark was given his League baptism with the Gills when he came on as a substitute at Scunthorpe in October 1990. Failed to impress on a regular basis however and moved on to Leyton Orient. Scored one goal in 43 League appearances for the O's last season and Shrewsbury signed him in May 1995. Mark has won honours with the Republic of Ireland at Under-21 level. Born: Dublin 10-12-72.



Paul Edwards

 GOALKEEPER. Was playing for Leek Town when Crewe Alexandra spotted him. Dario Gradi playing him 37 times before allowing him to join Shrewsbury in September 1992 after a period with them on trial. The "Eagle" proved himself a most reliable custodian and had 31 League outings last season between the posts. Stands 6'2". Born: Liverpool 22-2-65.

Paul Evans

- MIDFIELD. A craftsman at creative play Paul graduated from two years as a trainee at Gay Meadow to sign pro in 1993 and establish himself as a regular. Made 32 League appearances last season and scored five goals but the goal Shrews fans recall most vividly was his spectacular effort against Scunthorpe United that ignited a memorable Coca-Cola Cup run in 1993-94. Capped by Wales at Under-18 and Under-21 levels. Born: Oswestry 1-9-74.

Tommy Lynch

LEFT-BACK. A wholehearted player loved by the fans, he has been with Shrewsbury since moving from Sunderland in February 1990. A versatile performer - he can operate in midfield - who has scored many vital goals, he came into football with Limerick and while there represented the League of Ireland and was in the Republic of Ireland Olympic side. Made his League debut for Sunderland at Chelsea in the season 1988-89.

Born: Shannon 10-10-64.

Darren Rowbotham

- STRIKER. In his first season with Shrewsbury having signed at the start of the season. A YTS lad with Plymouth Argyle he made his League debut in a 2-0 win over Cambridge United in December 1984. Made 46 League appearances (1 goal) for Argyle before signing for Exeter City in 1987 after a loan period. His career was furthered at Torquay United, Birmingham City then Crewe. Born: Cardiff 22-10-66.

Richard Scott

- MIDFIELD/DEFENDER. Joined Birmingham City as a schoolboy but failed to establish himself as a regular under Barry Fry and made only five starts in the Blues promotion run last season, before transferring to Shrewsbury in March 1995. Played eight times for his new club before the close of the campaign and impressed with his performances.

Born: Stourbridge 29-9-74.

Kevin Seabury

 DEFENDER. Local lad who has worked his way up through the ranks. Can play virtually anywhere and established himself in the side during the 1994-95 season when he played in 30 Second Division games. Born: Shrewsbury 24-11-73.


Dean Spink

- STRIKER, Grabbed a hat-trick in the Shrews epic 11-2 FA Cup win over Marine. Made a big name for himself with Halesowen Town and had his first experience with a League club when he was signed by Aston Villa, but competition was hard there and in March 1990 he joined Shrewsbury for £75,000. Came as a centre-forward but was later played at centre-half then reverted back to the striking role. Since then he has been crowned Player of the Year in 1992 and two years later won the Sunday People "Third Division Player of the Year" award. Was Town's top scorer in 1994-95 with 14 goals - 11 in the League.

Born: Birmingham 22-1-67.

Mark Taylor
- FORWARD. Introduced to League football by Walsall in the season of 1984-85 he progressed well enough to persuade Sheffield Wednesday to sign him on in 1989. However opportunities were limited to just nine appearances in the old First Division and the Owls let him join Shrewsbury Town on loan. Here Mark demonstrated his versatility, operating in five different positions in a 19 game run, before a transfer was completed in September 1991. Was voted Player of the Year for 1995, during which he made 44 League appearances. Born: Walsall 22-2-66.



David Walton

DEFENDER. Formerly with Sheffield United he moved to Gay Meadow in 1994 and made his full debut for the Shrews at Northampton. A big solid defender, strong in the air, he is always a threat from set-pieces and scored his first goal for the club at Doncaster in a Cup replay. Scored three goals in 36 League outings in 1994-95. Born: Ashington 10-4-73.

Peter Whiston

- DEFENDER. Joined Shrewsbury on loan in September 1995 and a month later completed a transfer from Southampton. Peter opened

his career with Plymouth Argyle (10 appearances), then joined Torquay United after a loan spell but enjoyed his best times with Exeter City for whom he played 85 League games. His move to the Dell promised much but just one sub appearance in a 5-1 defeat by Newcastle (27-8-84) was his only experience in the Premiership. Scored twice in the 11-2 win over Marine. Born: Widnes, 4-1-68.

Chris Withe

- FULLBACK. The joker of the dressing room, Chris has been around the Shrewsbury scene since August 1993. Served his apprenticeship with Newcastle United and actually made his League debut in a 1-0 win over Shrewsbury Town in October 1980. Was to make just one further Second Division appearance before signing for Bradford City in the summer of '83. Was a regular for over four years before joining Notts County in 1987. Bury then Mansfield Town were his other ports of call. Can play full-back or midfield. Born: Liverpool 25-8-62.

Kav Woods

- WINGER, A much travelled pro he opened his account with Tranmere Rovers in 1983 making the first of his 14 League appearances at Bristol Rovers, in January 1983. while still an apprentice. Was freed to sign for Bangor City in November '84 and then had spells with Northwich Victoria, Runcorn, Caemarfon Town and Colne Dynamoes - where he was lost in the Reserves - before his former boss at Tranmere, Bryan Hamilton, gave him a lifeline back to the League with Wigan in March 1989. Missed the entire 1989-90 season with a groin injury then turned on a stunning performance against Coventry in the FA Cup in January 1991. He was immediately bought by the Sky Blues for £200,000; but was back with Wigan, on loan, two years later having played just 23 times for Coventry. Born: Birkenhead 7-6-65.



It was May 1993 when Liverpudlian Fred Davies was persuaded to take charge of team affairs at Gay Meadow on a temporary basis following the resignation of John Bond from

the managerial chair. Bond had brought Fred to Shrewsbury from Birmingham City as his assistant when he took over from Asa Hartford in January 1991 and the partnership worked well.

The Board obviously were not too sure for they decided to see how things developed before confirming a permanent position but it did not take long for Fred to prove his worth and in January his title was changed from caretaker manager to manager.

It proved a wise appointment for by the end of that 1990-91 season Shrewsbury Town were celebrating the winning of the Third Division Championship and have subsequently consolidated their position at this level, finishing 18th last season.

As a player Fred had been a goalscoring forward in his National Service days but upon joining Wolverhampton Wanderers was developed into a goalkeeper under the eye of former England and Wolves star custodian Bert Williams.

In January 1968 Fred moved to South Wales to sign for Cardiff City and then finished his playing days with AFC Bournemouth. It was at Dean Court that he not only became involved in coaching but began his association with John Bond and when Bond became manager of Norwich City in 1973 he took Fred along with him to Carrow Road.

It was in the 1980's that Fred arrived at St Andrews to coach, at first handling the Birmingham City Youths and later the senior players.

Austin joined Gillingham as a trainee in October 1989 and made his Football League debut on Boxing Day 1991, in a 2-1 win over Hereford United at the Priestfield Stadium. It was the first of only six first team appearances for the Gills, all as a substitute, which was surprising, for the youngster showed he had skilful touch and read the game well.

While with the Kent club Austin had served under John Gorman, who was then their Youth Team coach, and John had no hesitation in offering him a contract at Swindon when Gillingham freed him in the summer of 1992, after just one year as a professional.

Made a scoring debut for us in a

3-1 victory over Oxford United in the Angle Italian Cup, in March 1991 and was a substitute in a 0-0 draw at Newcastle United that same season, but hampered by injuries he never seemed to progress beyond this and in our Premiership campaign a non playing sub role in the game with Southampton was his only involvement.

Lost in the shadows he jumped at the chance to join Shrewsbury Town on trial in August and made a successful substitute appearance against Swansea City on the opening day of the season. By the end of August 1995, Austin had established himself on the leftwing and has been playing very well in that position.

The trial spell became permanent in September and now the 22 year-old from Dartford is enjoying his first sustained run in League Football.

While we were drawing 1-1 at Stockport County last Saturday, Crewe Alexandra took advantage to claw back two points with a comprehensive 4-1 home win over struggling Swansea City. Two goals from Edwards helped them on their way.

Crewe are now just four points behind us with a game in hand and the amazing thing is that though they have scored 34 goals this season they do not have a single striker on the top ten scorers list. We have Steve Finney there of course with 12 goals so far to his name (Wayne Allison is now on 9).

Today we will be looking to Oxford United to put the brakes on the Railwaymen as they have home advantage but Dario Gradi's team show better form of late than that of the U's and this could end in a scoring draw.

Notts County kept up the pressure with an equally convincing 4-1 home win over Chesterfield last week. Former West Ham United and West Brom centre-half Garry Strodder netted their second goal and this afternoon the Magpies fly to Swansea City where they will be expecting to secure a fifth away win of the season, though the Swans home record of 3-3-2 suggests they could deny Notts all three points.

Wycombe Wanderers have climbed into fourth place in the Second Division table despite being held 1-1 at home by Bristol Rovers. The Wanderers are at Carlisle United tomorrow afternoon and will be favourites. They have only lost once on their travels and have scored 14 goals to 7.

Blackpool, having forced a draw here at the County Ground, must have been confident at home to York City last week. But there were a few red faces to compliment their tangerine shirts after Barnes gave York a third minute lead and the Yorkshiremen romped to a shock 3-1 victory. It will be a test of character for the Seasiders at Walsall though the Saddlers have drawn more than they have won on their own pitch.



have the doldrums and Brentford


could just seize on the opportunity. So far it has been win or bust for Brentford at Griffin Park - a fifth home win is likely.





We have now drawn our last three League games but must not start letting our heads go down.




It has been good news this week for Mark Seagraves who has returned to full time training after successfully completing his rehabilitation from his cartilage operation four weeks ago.

Another long term injury victim has been Jamie Pitman who has suffered a stress fracture of one of the bones in his left foot (3rd metatarsal).

Originally the fracture was not spotted on an X-Ray but with Jamie continuing to be in pain when exercising, it was decided to send him for a bone scan which revealed the site and problem.

Like Jason Drysdale's injury a stress fracture is a microscopic break in the bone not normally associated with a specific trauma,a kick or a twist.Instead it is caused by overuse or an increase in the quantity of a repetitive exercise. Andrew Thomson however is well ahead of schedule on his road to recovery after breaking his leg at the beginning of October at Millwall. It was initially thought that he would not play until Christmas or the New Year but is on course to have a run-out in the Reserve Team game at Brighton on 6 December if all goes to plan.

At the moment he has just commenced running work and should begin to increase the distance and pace of his work over the next few days.



Edwin Murray has also picked up a slight groin strain but should be fit again next week but unfortunately as he is under suspension he is in no hurry!





More home than away today with two more fixtures at The County Ground to play before we are on our travels again in a fortnight when we meet Rotherham United on Saturday 09 December at Millmoor.

Next Wednesday evening Hereford United are here in our Auto Windscreens Shield 2nd Round tie giving Steve White his first return to The County Ground after his transfer to Edgar Street. Another possible face in the Hereford line-up will be former Swindon trainee Murray Fishlock who after being released here drifted into non-League circles before being snapped up by Hereford.

We last played Hereford during this pre-season on Saturday 05 August in the Herefordshire Senior Cup and having won the trophy for the last two seasons were somewhat disappointed not to make it a hattrick when we went down 2-0.

For the last time both sides met in League action we have to go back to Season 1985/86. Hereford recorded an emphatic 4-1 victory over us at Edgar Street on 24 August with Colin Calderwood scoring our consolation goal. Revenge was gained back here at the County Ground on 22 December when Charlie Henry started the Christmas celebrations scoring the only goal for us in our one-nil victory.

Talks to Colin Benson

CB: First tell us about life for you at the moment Jason?

JD: At the present time I am just working at getting back to full fitness. It is a lot of hard work but hopefully I can keep injury free from now on.

CB: Are you satisfied the injury is fully healed?

JD: Yes. my broken heel is giving me no problem at all. It seems to be back to normal and I don't even need to have any physio on it so there are no worries at all in this direction.

CB: Have you had an injury like this before?

JD: No. I've never had any trouble with my feet. In fact this is the first broken bone I have ever suffered.

CB: So this is your first experience of coming back from a long term injury. How did it happen?

JD: That's right. This problem came about through wear and tear over a period. Evidently it was not as the result of a single blow on the foot or anything like that.

The exceptionally hard grounds during pre-season seem to have given me a compound fracture and of course the injury came at the wrong time for me. I have played just two games for Swindon and picked up two injuries which is not the best of starts. It can only get better.

I feel I am back nearly to a hundred per cent fitness within myself. It is now just a matter of getting games in. My appearance at West Ham on Monday evening was my third game in the Reserves and of course I played in the Auto

Windscreens Shield game against Colchester United as well, which is a first team game, so I am beginning to get in the honours.

CB: There is the possibility. no doubt, that you will get another run out this coming Wednesday in the second round tie with Hereford United?

JD: I don't know about that. It all depends on the manager. It is always nice to play and if the chance is there I will be ready. It is always nice to be involved with the first team. It is the only place to be.

CB: Were you apprehensive at all about coming back and going in for your first serious tackle with that foot?

JD: No. not really, no. It wasn't as if the injury came from a blow on the foot, it was just a culmination of stress on the bone, so once it was healed I had no worries about playing. I just wanted to get back in the action as quickly as I could.

It has been a frustrating experience I won't deny that. I have had an awful time of it really. I played two games and got two injuries but that's the way your luck goes sometimes and you have just got to come through it.

CB: Tell us a bit about your experiences before joining Swindon?

JD: Well I was with Watford until I was 23 then I went to Newcastle United for seven months before

summer.


CB: What was it like at St James' Park. You must have had high hopes of making the big-time?

JD: Yes. it was obviously a big opportunity. Going from Watford to one of the top teams in the Premiership was a great move for me. Yes. I was full of optimism but it never worked out and that's the way it goes sometimes. It was a big chance that never worked out for me unfortunately.

CB: Where do you think it went wrong for you?

JD: I just didn't make it there and obviously that is very disappointing, but that's life.

I can't put it down to playing badly because I never got an opportunity in the first team. I obviously did not show enough in Reserve games and in training to persuade Kevin Keegan to play me.







CB: Mind you the opposition for places is pretty tough there isn't it?

JD: Yes. I looked around and wondered why he bought me because there is so much talent at the club and the spirit is remarkable. It is a great place to be.

CB: Mr Keegan obviously saw something in your game which excited him enough to take you there. What did he tell you when he was persuading you to sign?

JD: He just said what a great club Newcastle was and that there was an opportunity for me if I went there and did well. He told me the training would improve me as a player, which I think it did.

He just said basically if you do well you will get your chance obviously I didn't do well enough.

But there is a great buzz about the town. It is the place to be really in football terms. They get four or five thousand fans there watching training. There is a waiting list of 12,000 for season tickets. It is a soccer hot-bed at the moment.

CB: So you have come down to Swindon, another sort of soccer hot-bed really if not quite on the same grand scale as Newcastle, but still there is a buzz about the town which is expecting great things.

CB: Obviously the fans are expecting us to go up and of course we are of a like opinion so there is a great feeling of optimism that we will make one of the two promotion spots. Hopefully the Championship at the end of the season. But there is still a very long way to go yet.

Obviously my main aim is to get myself into the team so that I can be part of it and contribute to the season. It is not going to be easy because the lads are doing so well. That is unfortunate for me because I started the season as a first team player then got injured in my first game and have now to prove myself again. I can't do anything about that

other than work hard and train hard

and will wait patiently for an

opportunity.

CB: Although you have only been connected with three clubs you have worked under a fair share of managers haven't you Jason?







Although the Town had most of the play Eastleigh packed their defence and the Town were restricted to few chances. Clare Wheeler and Kerie Garwood added two more before half time.





The AFC Bournemouth game was fairly even with both sides working hard but the quality of football could have been better. There were too many elementary mistakes and we wasted some good possession.


Bad defending from a corner saw us go behind midway through the first half and things looked ominous-not for the first time this season.

The second half was again even but neither side managed to find that winning goal.


The Bristol City game was again evenly contested and ended goal-less.

It's funny, or maybe not so funny depending which end of the stick you are on, how a single moment, a flash incident during a game, can sometimes make or break a career isn't it.

Take the careers of two famous managers, one the former England chief the other the current national team coach. In the space of less than a week their lives were totally changed through events which were way out of their control yet so influential to the immediate future.

Cast your minds back to the Sunday afternoon and Wolverhampton Wanderers playing Charlton Athletic in a First Division game at Molineux. Graham Taylor was the man under pressure, a set of poor results this season making him easy fodder for the tabloids to exploit as they did when he was in charge of the England team.

Now I have a lot of sympathy for Graham, a man of the utmost integrity, who in my experience has always been totally honest and straightforward. Sure he made mistakes while working out of Lancaster Gate but no man, particularly a person who has never been mixed up in shady deals or subterfuge, deserves the sort of persecution and ridicule he was subjected to by a section of our national media just because we did not qualify for the World Cup Finals in the USA.

It was my opinion at the time that we were not good enough to qualify anyway and the subsequent performances of our greatest club sides in European competition over the past three years seems to support this theory, but I am drifting from the point. Back at Molineux, Wolves simply had to beat Charlton. The match had been built-up to such a climax by the media who had put Taylor's neck well and truly on the block for this game.

The ninety minutes were up, the

score 0-0, when Wolves forced a corner. Charlton beat the ball out but back came Wolves and in a frantic melee the ball flashed across the box in the air. In powered Don Goodman, his head met the ball with a frightening thud flush on, and making the best use of his neck muscles he turned the shot goalwards. The goalkeeper was beaten, it seemed ten-men Charlton's gallant fight was over as the ball flashed towards the net. But as the crown rose to cheer the winning blast they were choked in full voice as the ball thudded against the underside of the bar and bounced out.

The cheers turned to jeers and at that moment Graham Taylor must have known the game was up as far as his employment at Molineux was concerned. A cruel and public execution for an honest man.

We will never know for sure but it is likely that had Goodman scored Graham Taylor would still be in work. It could have been the turning point for Wolves, who knows? But Monday afternoon he either jumped or more likely was pushed out of the managerial hot-seat.

Two days later, down at Wembley, Fleet Street's hacks were sharpening their pencils ready to stick into Terry Venables' back. A run of boring disappointing games was beginning to turn the men who had fought for his election as England coach against him it seems.

Now those regular readers of this column will know that I am not a Venables man. I want to see him succeed of course for the sake of English football, but he has shown nothing to persuade me that he has the vision, or the daring, to lead

England out of their current low standing in the world ranking. His selection for the game with Switzerland certainly did not inspire one with great enthusiasm and those who think Gazza is the man to revive our International prestige are sadly mistaken. Anyway, it was a fairly innocuous start to the game. Then in the seventh minute fate took a hand. Poor Jamie Redknapp pulled a hamstring and on came Steve Stone.

The little Nottingham Forest winger went home with the Man of the Match Award after a triumphant Wembley debut. Stone not only made the vital second goal with the perfect cross for Teddy Sheringham to head home but grabbed the third one himself. It was a tremendous performance from a man who might not have even been used had not fortune dealt that card in the seventh minute to Terry Venables. No wonder the England coach left Wembley with a smile on his face.

So we realise we now have to get back on a winning streak. Although we have only played 17 games we


know that as leaders we are here to be shot at and that every side we come up against is anxious to do well and so raise their efforts.

If you get it right as we did early on then the boys will develop in the right way. However if you get it wrong then the boys will find their energies will be channelled into chasing the ball.


Young Toby Clarke adapted well to his first game a sweeper. He is a boy who is comfortable on the ball but needs to toughen up if he is to progress to the top.
