### Now in their third season under manager David Webb, Brentford's rapid progress has been somewhat curtailed after two glorious seasons.

After gaining promotion to Division Two the Bees looked likely Second Division Champions for much of last season with the striking duo Nick Forster and Robert Taylor netting 51 goals and goalkeeper Kevin Dearden producing 25 shutouts. But in the final run-in they lost their way and finished runnersup to Birmingham City.

The momentum gone they lost out too in the Play-Offs to Huddersfield Town - 5-4 on penalties after two 1-1 draws - but none the less were well backed to be up the challenging positions again this season.

Alas. for West London fans, their form this season has not been so consistent and they went into last Saturday's home game with Bristol City in 19th place, with 30 points from 27 games played.

They kicked off well enough with a draw at York City, Smith and Forster the scorers; and a 1-1

home win over Oxford United but defeats at Burnley (1-0), home to us (2-0), and a Rotherham (1-0), left the Griffin Park side trailing in 17th position.

Though they managed to improve their position on occasions they have never really managed to make up for that disappointing start to the season though they are still in a position whereby a consistent run of wins could haul them towards a place in the play-offs

- FORWARD. Signed from Colchester United shortly before the transfer deadline in March 1995 and made a scoring debut for the Bees against Rotherham United, and finished last season with impressive figures of three League goals in seven starts and three substitute appearances. Had joined Colchester as a trainee and made his League debut with them in the season of 1993-94. Born: Colchester 31-10-73.

### ljah Anderson

-LEFT-BACK. Former Tottenham Hotspur hopeful signed from Southend United on a free transfer in July 1995; Ijah was introduced to the team in a pre-season friendly at Barnet. Made his League bow, in midfield, in a 2-2 draw at York on the opening day of the season (12-8-95) and played in the opening eight games, scoring in a 3-2 Coca-Cola Cup win over Walsall. Born: Hackney 30-12-75.

### Darren Annon

- FORWARD. A diminutive winger he stands five-feet-five - picked up from Diadora League side Carshalton Athletic for £20,000 in March 1993. He quickly adapted to League football, scoring in his second appearance in Division Two, at Stockport. Scored twice in ten League outings last season. Born: London 17-2-72.

### Carl Asaba

- CENTRE-FORWARD. Impressed manager Dave Webb so much when he played for Dulwich Hamlet against Brentford in a preseason friendly that he went out and singed him. That was in August 1995 and Carl responded with a scoring debut vs Gillingham in the Auto Windscreens Shield. Made his League debut in Colchester United's colours, netting two goals in nine (3) League appearances while on loan

to the Third Division club. Made his Brentford League bow at Rotherham on September 9, 1995 and has been in the first team squad ever since. Born: London 28-1-73.

### Barry Ashby

CENTRAL DEFENDER. Arrived at Griffin Park from Watford in March 1994 as part of the exchange deal which took long serving Keith Millen to Vicarage Road. Netted once in 40 League games last season and grabbed two goals in the Play-Offs. Joined Watford from school and was in the same Hornets youth team as Jason Drysdale which won the FA Youth Cup in 1989. Established himself in the Watford first team in the season of 1990-91. Bom: London 21-11-70.



### Marcus Bent

- FORWARD. An outstanding youngster still serving his time on the YTS who made the big jump from South East Counties League football to the Second Division while still only seventeen. Scored twice in his first four senior appearances.

### Kevin Dearden

- GOALKEEPER. Former Tottenham Hotspur trainee he eventually signed for Brentford in September 1993 after spells on loan with nine



different clubs. Quickly displayed the form and assurance to establish himself as Brentford's first choice custodian and finished his opening season at Griffin Park with the Player of the Year award. Set a record in 1994-95 when he kept 25 clean sheets. Made his 50th career appearance in November 1995, Height: 5'11". Born: Luton 8-3-70.

### Tamer Fernandes COALKEEPER. Joined the club as

COALKEEPER. Joined the club as an associate Schoolboy and was rewarded with a professional contract in 1993, after two years on the YTS. Gained England Under-18 honours and made his League debut in the final away game of the 1993-94 season, at Burnley, when he came on as a substitute for the injured Kevin Dearden. Made three appearances in 1994-95. Stands 6'3". Born: Paddington 7-12-74.

### Nick Forster

- FORWARD. Cost a six figure fee when transferred from Gillingham in June 1994. but Brentford gained a quick return as Nick topped their hit list, rattling in 26 goals - 24 in the League and one in the Play-Offs - in 1994-95; and also won England Under-21 recognition. Seemed to have carried on where he left off when he scored in the opening two games of this season but has subsequently found life a little harder in front of goal. Born: Oxted 8-9-73.

### Martin Grainger

- LEFT-BACK. Another recruit from Colchester United. Martin cost Brentford £60,000 to secure in October 1993. Had impressed boss David Webb after "Guesting" for the Reserves in a 7-0 win over Barnet. Proved to be an outstanding signing and has now established himself as a big favourite with the home fans. Made 46 appearances for Colchester and is approaching the 100 games mark for Brentford. Born: Enfield 23-8-72.

### Lee Harvey

- MIDFIELD. Missed most of last season through injury but was back in the "Bees" line-up for the opening games this season. Joined the club in November 1993 after a trial period. Was no rookie though having played over 150 games for Leyton Orient for whom he made his League debut in a 6-3 defeat at Sheffield United, in March 1984, and having spent three months on trial with Nottingham Forest. Operates on the wing or as a central attacker. Born: Harlow 21-12-66.

### Jon Hooker

FORWARD. Signed from non-League Hertford in November 1995. Jon made just one substitute appearance last season. Got his first League start for Brentford at Bristol City on September 12. 1995 and maintained his position for four games. Has had previous experience with Gillingham. Born: London 31-3-72.

### **Carl Hutchings**

- MIDFIELD. A real all rounder who has operated for Brentford at fullback, centre-back and in midfield, since graduating from the Youth Team he graced in the 1992-93 campaign. Was awarded a professional contract in the summer of 1993 and soon after made his League bow in Division Two. Made 39 League appearances last season. Born: Hammersmith 24-12-74.

### **David McGhee**

- FORWARD. Not the tallest of players though he is effective both in the centre-forward and centrehalf berths. It was as a striker that he really impressed though being a regular scorer in the Youth (a former Youth Player of the Year) and Reserve sides. Was given a professional contract after two years on the YTS and last season he made one start and played six times as a sub in the League side. Born: West Sussex 19-6-76.

### Dean Martin

- STRIKER. Have boots will travel seems to be Dean's motto. Began his career with Fisher Athletic but then quit his job installing air conditioning units when West Ham United paid £20.000 for his signature in May 1991. Made his senior debut as a sub in an FA Cup 4th Round replay at Wrexham in February 1992 and came into League football as a sub at Coventry in the last away game of the season. Failed to establish himself at Upton Park and went to Iceland to play. Wrote to Dave Webb for a trial and was signed in October 1995 after a Reserve game at Crawley. Made his Brentford League debut four days later. Born: North London 31-8-72

### Paul Smith

- MIDFIELD. Was at Roots Hall under manager David Webb and followed the boss to Brentford in the summer of 1993. An ankle injury delayed his introduction to the team but since October of that year he has been a regular and is just set to make his 100th League appearance for the club. Played 98 League games for Southend United. Born: Lenham 18-9-71.

### **Robert Taylor**

- STRIKER. It took Robert just tenminutes in a Brentford shirt to score, on his debut for them against Cambridge United after a £100,000 transfer from Leyton Orient on transfer deadline day in March 1993. Was previously top scorer for Leyton Orient, netting 18 goals. Forged a great partnership with Nick Forster last season claiming 25 goals himself.

# man in charge





David Webb - Manager

David Webb was voted the Second Division's Manager of the Year last season, a tribute to his managerial skills after hauling Brentford from the depths of relegation to Champions (Division 3) and Runners-Up (Division 2) in the space of two years. His granite face and amiable charms seem to have been with us since football began but David was born in Stratford, in London's East End, on April 4, 1946.

A six-footer, and football daft, he joined West Ham United as an amateur but did not seem to be making an impression and moved up the road to sign for Leyton Orient.

A tough, uncompromising competitor, he then went on to play for Southampton before, in February 1968, he moved to Stamford Bridge in a part exchange deal that cost Chelsea £40,000 and Joe Kirkup. David developed into a polished defender with the Blues but it was his passion and enthusiasm, which was so contagious, that left a lasting impression on his most glorious years as a player.

Is forever remembered as the man who scored the winning goal against Leeds United in the FA Cup Final replay at Old Trafford in April 1970, when he lunged in for a ball that he had no right to get. But he had other moments too, such as the hat-trick he netted against Ipswich Town in 1968-69, although playing in the back four.

A versatile player he wore every shirt but number eleven for Chelsea - his emergency appearance in goal against Ipswich Town on Boxing Day 1971 (when he kept a clean sheet) typifying his value to the club.

In May 1974 Dave signed for QPR (£100.000) and went on to play for Leicester City, Derby County and Bournemouth where he became player-manager. Made over 600 senior appearances and besides that FA Cup Winners' medal collected a ECWC Winners' medal in 1971 and a League Cup Runners-Up trophy in 1972.

Enjoyed a very successful time as manager of Southend United before taking over Brentford in June 1993.



Jamie Bates has experienced the highs and the lows in his career at Griffin Park which started way back in 1985 when he signed on the YTS after leaving school.

Developed well in the Youth and Reserve sides and got his big break on September 15, 1986, when he made his debut in a goalless draw at Carlisle United. Went on to play a further 23 Third Division games that season and has been a regular senior squad member ever since.



A versatile performer he filled every defensive position in Brentford's Championship winning season and in doing so became a warm favourite of the Griffin Park fans.

Club captain, and Player of the Year, Jamie is now enjoying a testimonial season, but there are no thoughts of reaching the end of his career. he only celebrates his 28th birthday on the 24th of this month.

Chalked up his 300th senior appearance for Brentford in their 2-0 home defeat inflicted by us on Saturday September 2nd, and could, with luck, go on to surpass Ken Coote's all-time Club record of 559 games.

It's back to Second Division football after the glamour of Saturday's exciting FA Cup contest with Southampton and a busy week all-round for Second Division sides with no less than 22 clubs from this division in action last night.

Blackpool took advantage of Crewe's FA Cup commitments to edge them out of second place last night, they played hosts to Shrewsbury Town whose away record was dented by a 2-0 defeat at Bristol City - their seventh away defeat. It could have been a good night for the Tangerines.

Crewe though remain our toughest opponents, however they could only manage a 2-2 draw at Brighton last Saturday. Having been eliminated from the Cup by Southampton, they will certainly have expected to gather another three points last night from their home date with Stockport County.

Crewe might have slipped up slightly at the Goldstone Ground at the weekend but with games now coming twice a week it just emphasises that there is no room for slip-ups in the title race.

Brighton have been very much involved in the promotion battle this week for last night they travelled to Notts County. the men from Sussex are not the push-overs they were earlier in the season, as their 1-1 draw at Oxford United suggest, and they might just have been able to dent County's home record of 8 wins, 2 draws and 3 defeats.

Chesterfield surely improved their case with a win at Hull City. The Tigers had scratched only one victory at home in 13 previous attempts while the Spireites were hunting a fourth away win.

Bradford City's hopes took a big dip when they were beaten 1-0 at home by Stockport County. They had Saturday off because they should have been entertaining us and were unlikely to get anything more than a point, if that, from last night's jaunt to Wycombe.

Bristol Rovers crept almost unnoticed into the top eight but will have found Wrexham a difficult team to exploit. If last night's game was on the pools coupon you would plump for a home win.

Bristol City should make home advantage tell against Peterborough United whose form is so uncertain. But after their 6-1 demolition of Carlisle United at London Road, the Posh will certainly have been buzzing when they came to the West Country and Jimmy Rimmer, back in charge again of Swansea as caretaker manager following the departure of Kevin Cullis after just seven days, could well have inspired his team to a draw at Carlisle.

Walsall, tipped out of the FA Cup at First Division Ipswich by just a single goal, are looking strong defensively with former Town defender Adrian Viveash playing a leading role at centre-half. They should have accounted for Burnley last night.

In addition to the Division 2 games this week there are some other important games in both the Coca-Cola Cup and F.A. Cup.

In the semi-final of the Coca-Cola Cup 2nd leg Aston Villa and Arsenal battle it out at Villa Park for the right to appear at Wembley on 24 March. The honours were even after the 1st leg at Highbury when Dennis Bergkamp saw his two goal lead wiped out by Dwyte Yorke. #### Talks to Colin Benson

### CB: You were the hero of our victory over Oldham Athletic in the FA Cup last week. Have you ever scored a more spectacular goal Martin?

ML: Not for a long time. Scoring goals has been a bit of a problem for me over the last couple of seasons. I have not got enough. But that one makes up for a few of the misses I have made and it got the club a nice fifth round draw against Southampton.

CB: Oldham had saved a penalty and looked like pinching a draw they did not deserve. There was a lot of tension on the game at that stage wasn't there?

ML: Yes. We were into the last couple of minutes and had not been able to put any away despite creating a lot of chances and being by far the better side.

Maybe we felt it was getting away from us with Kev missing the penalty so to come on and get a goal in the last couple of minutes was a lovely feeling really.

It makes it even better of course when it proves to be the winning goal and the importance of the match gave it added significance as well I suppose.

CB: It surely was a stange day for you Martin. You must have been so disappointed when you realised that Steve McMahon was coming back and taking your place in midfield. Then you come on as a substitute and end the day as the hero of Swindon?

ML: Yes it was. I was as low as can

be before the kick off. I've got to be honest with people. I didn't think I deserved to be dropped. You know what I mean. But I was and the manager is paid to make these decisions: he has got a big squad here and you have got to take a few of these on the chin I suppose.

Then I went on and as we know it went well for me and I finished the night as high as a kite.

As they say it's a funny old game and it certainly proved that to me.

CB: The goal which saw us through to the Fifth Round of the FA Cup obviously claimed the headlines but just after that you made a vital clearance at the other end which could have been just as decisive in ensuring our victory.

ML: Yes, I ended up in our box. I went on there to play in the Gaffer's position which is a sitting position in midfield. I have been playing in behind the front two before that and not managed to get on the scoresheet. This time I was able to get into their box from a sitting position.

I'm sure if they had gone up the other end and scored against us the Gaffer might have been in on the case. But this time it broke kindly for us.

It was a game we needed to win on

the night. I felt. so when the opportunity to get forward came I just went and we scored. When they did try and get back into the game we were able to marshall our defence well enough and had everything under control. If I had not made that interception I'm sure someone else would have.

CB: Tell us about the goal. It came from a cross from the left and was headed back towards you. It was a spectacular strike but how did you see it?

ML: Yes, I wasn't sure who crossed it from the left. I think it was Paul. It's gone to Peter and he was stretching a little bit. I could hear Steve Finney behind him shouting at him to leave it. Steve fancied his chances.

Pete says he saw my run - I believe him many wouldn't - and he put it between two defenders. The ball dropped behind me a little bit but I couldn't have caught it sweeter



and I think it was in the net before the goalkeeper had moved.

> CB: If the manager had not been struggling with his hamstring it would have been quite a problem for him to select the side to take on Southampton last Saturday no doubt.

ML: That's right. But as I said it is his job to pick the team. I am obviously as disappointed as can be if I'm not selected but he is there to make these decisions and I suppose the harder we make it for him the better it is all round for the club.

I wanted to be out there in the Fifth Round of the FA Cup against Southampton. I want to be out there tonight against Brentford, next Saturday against Bristol Rovers. I want to be out there every time.

We can only make it as difficult as we can for him. It is hard when you get kicked in the teeth - not literally - but when you are dropped like that. you need to go out and prove a point and I think I did that against Oldham - even if I was only on for ten minutes.

CB: It has not been a happy season for you with regard injuries. Do you feel you are past all those problems now?



ML: Yes. obviously being injured at the start of the season was a big setback because I was not able to make my claim for a place in the side. The fact that the boys have been so successful too has made it that much more difficult to get back into the team and at the moment. I have to be honest. I am still trying to re-establish myself.

It just means that you have to work as hard as you can and when you do get an opportunity make sure you take it. But there is great competition for places at the moment which of course is a healthy sign as far as the Club is concerned though it can be very frustrating for those of us on the edge.

The Government suffered one of its heaviest defeats since coming to power when the House of Lords voted to deny subscription television channels exclusive rights to broadcast top sporting events such as the FA Cup and the Grand National.

The whole thing puzzles me enormously for I am right in thinking that the Tories are the champions of free enterprise, the sponsors of the can do's!

The campaign, which is a crossparty alliance, to ensure that eight listed sporting events are kept on either BBC or ITV screens seems to go against that conviction and is, in my view, the first step to turning back the clock to the bad old days when 'Match of the Day' was our main football diet - edited highlights screened on a Saturday night.

Sure we love it because we knew none better but then football, starved financially, inept commercially, suddenly woke up and realised that for all those years the Beeb had been ripping off our national game. They were getting an hour of prime time television every week for peanuts. It really was a scandalous situation. A corporation that would willingly invest £250,000 in a one-hour variety production was unwilling to pay more for a whole season of League coverage. They pleaded they didn't have the funds.

Give ITV their due they did step in to pinch the contract with a more lucrative offer leaving the BBC crying foul play as always but it was the initiative of SKY Sports that really brought the game the rewards its exposure on the box deserved.

Not only have SKY coughed up the money but they have done the game proud with their coverage. They brought vision and excitement to their production. Where three or four cameras were seen as enough SKY have flooded a match with up to 14, covering the action from all angles with super-slow-motion replays that are so penetrative you feel you are crashing in the shot yourself.

The viewer has been brought into another dimension while the spectator at the ground has also had his life enriched by better facilities, many of which have been financed by the SKY money.

So what are these people in the Lords up to? Is it another case of politicians jumping on the band wagon, trying to appease the electorate and get them on their side, never mind the consequences. Have they really examined the issues and will they if football loses out financially, as it surely will, make up the deficit from government sources. Will they heck.

If SKY, or whoever, cannot attain exclusive rights to an event then obviously it is not worth as much to them. That can only be BAD news for our game. The whole thing has been worsened by the intervention (this is a quite separate issue) of the Office of Fair Trading into the current TV deals with unthinkable implications. It threatens to put football back 25-years or more.

The OFT evidently fear that in the FA negotiating a package deal for the whole Premiership they have created a cartel that contains "significant restrictions on competition."

I tell you, back in the seventies when I was a Football League Club Secretary I tried my hardest to get League clubs to bury their feudal differences and unite under one banner for commercial negotiations. We never had a chance because the likes of Manchester United, Liverpool and Arsenal didn't need us. The formation of the Premiership united the clubs commercially for the good of the game generally. Then along comes this fellow Bridgeman (the OFT Director General) to try and destroy the lot.

It makes your heart break. When the football industry, which incidently helps fill the treasury coffers considerably, was down on its knees the Government refused to help by reducing its cut from the pools etc... Football was told to get its own house in order. It has done that, and done it well, and then along comes Bosman and Bridgeman to try and bring it all down. Hope there aren't any more B's lurking in the woodwork!
