From the first with Manager Steve McMahon
I was bitterly disappointed

I was bitterly disappointed with our display on Wednesday night. There we were with a couple of games in hand, and more importantly eight points clear of Crewe and we failed to ram home our advantage.

We had enough chances against Brentford but I don't think we were consistent enough throughout the game. I think on the night we had only three, maybe four players, who could maybe be satisfied with their performances.

The others just did not do well at all and you can't have that. You must have at least seven or eight on their game. But we didn't see that on Wednesday, we had it the other way around.

I don't know about there being a reaction after the big glamour Cup tie with Southampton. We are professional and like to think we are not so affected but with all the press we attracted and everything else that surrounds such events you have to be careful because at the end of the day the League is our bread and butter.

The Cup games are fun to be involved in, particularly when you are up against Premiership opposition, but really they are just a special bonus for us. At the moment anyway. It is our League situation that is our main concern and I can't emphasise too much how important it is.

The results the day before had gone so well for us but that doesn't matter so much. As I said to the players before the game, it is no good saying the results have

gone well for us if we don't go out and get a result for ourselves.

We are making it hard for ourselves. We keep shooting ourselves in the foot. When we get an opportunity to stretch our lead we come up with performances such as that on Wednesday.

It is not a case of putting more pressure on us this afternoon. All games are important to win. We need to win all our games if we can. We just have to start again this afternoon. It is a matter of getting consistency. We can do it for fifteen minutes - we look brilliant. Then we stop doing the right things and give silly goals away, if we score two goals at home we should win the game.

We are drawing towards the latter part of the season now and we have to kick on and get ourselves together.





Bristol Rovers By John Nolan Rovers The Visitors

There is no doubt 1996 has been a good year so far for the men from Twerton Park, who ended 1995 in 15th position in the Second Division table with 27 points.

While many were involved in the FA Cup Third Round, Rovers got their New Year League programme under way with a 2-1 home win over Hull City; and the Rovers went to Wrexham in midweek still boasting an unbeaten record in 1996, after five wins and two draws.

In those seven games Rovers have scored 13 goals and conceded five, with Marcus Stewart responsible for six goals, his winner against Rotherham United last Saturday (1-0) his 21st strike of the season.

Six-foot striker Peter Beadle has also been prominent after a settling down period following his arrival from Watford last November. The former Tottenham man had netted five, including both goals in a rousing 2-0 victory at Ashton Gate against Bristol City.

A sixth away win of the season was recorded at Hull (3-1) with Stewart, Browning and Beadle the marksmen while at home this year points have been gathered from Hull City (2-1), Carlisle United (1-1), Walsall (2-0) and Rotherham (1-0).

It all added up to Rovers moving up to sixth place last Saturday with 44 points - they are indeed the form team of the division at the moment - and such is the confidence sweeping Twerton Park that they are now looking beyond just the play-offs to making a strong challenge for one of the two promotion slots.

The team was strengthened last month when Damien Matthew was signed on loan from Crystal Palace. The 25-year-old former Chelsea midfielder has only been on the fringe of the Palace first-team this season, sitting most games out on the bench, having made just four Premiership appearances in Palace's relegation season last year.

Peter Beadle

- FORWARD. Signed from Watford in November 1995, he had struggled to establish himself in the Hornets team this season after forming a promising partnership with Kevin Phillips in the latter stages of the 1994-95 season. Had joined Watford from Tottenham Hotspur in September 1994, for a nominal fee. At six-feet-six he has the ideal stature for a target man. Peter joined Gillingham from school and made 46 (30) appearances in their colours before his potential was snapped up by Spurs who paid £350,000 for his transfer in 1993. Born: Lambeth 13-5-72.

Marcus Browning


- MIDFIELD. Has been with Rovers since he was a schoolboy working his way to full professional status in 1989. A consistent goal-scorer at Youth and Reserve Team levels he always considered himself as a forward but he was not able to produce this form in the senior side and was loaned out to Hereford United during the season of 1992-93 to gain experience in the Third Division. It worked well for when he returned he snapped up five goals in seven appearances. But it was caretaker coach Malcolm Allison who was to have the most profound effect on Marcus's career. He switched him to midfield and gave him an extended run in the first-team in this position. John Ward then continued to guide him and Marcus is now firmly established in midfield where his powerful running and forceful tackling has made him an influential figure. Born: Bristol 22-4-71.

Justin Channing

 MIDFIELD. Was one of Queens Park Rangers' promising young starlets with an England pedigree at Youth and Under-21 levels. With opportunities restricted at Loftus Road he joined Rovers on a two month loan agreement and impressed so much that they dug deep to come up with £275,000 to secure his services in January 1993. Equally at home in defence or midfield he has remained a first team regular ever since and chips in with the odd breathtaking goal. Born: Reading 19-11-68

Billy Clark

- CENTRAL DEFENDER. Over the past two years his partnership with Andy Tillson at the heart of the Rovers defence has been the backbone of their promotion quest. Billy was signed from AFC Bournemouth in 1988 and chalked up 100 games for the club during the 1992-93 campaign. A model of consistency he is effective in both boxes and in the early part of last season was a serious contender for leading goal scorer with four strikes in the opening dozen League games. He finished the campaign with 7 goals. Born: Christchurch 19-5-67



Andy Collett

- GOALKEEPER. Was signed from Middlesbrough on transfer deadline day in March 1995. having already spent two loan periods with the Bristol club. Last season his opportunities were limited by the excellent form of Brian Parkin to just five League outings but is now enjoying a successful run in the team as Rovers' last line of defence. Height: 5' 11"

Born: Middlesbrough 28-10-73.

John French

- FORWARD. Local lad signed on as a professional after two years on the YTS. An adaptable young man who has played centreforward, centre-half and in midfield for the Youth Team and Reserves he has the ability to fill a number of roles and has proved an ideal man to have on the bench.

Born: Bristol 25-9-76.

Andrew Gurney

- DEFENDER. Made the step up from YTS to full professional in July 1992. Andy, like John French, can operate in a number of defensive or midfield roles. Made his League debut towards the end of the 1993-94 season and established himself as a regular choice in 1994-95. A sweet striker of the ball with a thunderous shot he loves to have a go from long range.

Shane Higgs

- GOALKEEPER. Hails from Oxford and was awarded a professional contract after just one year on the YTS. At six-feet-two he has the stature to make the grade and is now a regular on the Rovers substitute bench though still awaiting his first chance in League football. Shane is still only 18. Born: Oxford 13-5-77.


STRIKER. Paul made his debut for Rovers on August 17, 1994 and registered his first goal three days later in a home game against York City. As a schoolboy he was on the books of Wimbledon, making his League debut in a 1-0 defeat at Watford in August 1987. That season he also made six Fourth Division appearances for Newport County while on loan netting twice his first League goals. He made 80 League appearances for the Dons as well as further loan spells spent with Bristol City and Yeovil Town. Paul proved a great success with Rovers finishing his first season (1994-95) as top scorer with 22 goals in 54 appearances. Born: Bisley 31-1-68.

Martin Paul

- STRIKER. Was recruited to the Rovers YTS in July 1991 having previously played in local football for Queen Camel. Castle Cary and Somerset. Gained professional status in 1993 and became a regular scorer in their Reserve side. Martin's first full League appearance came in a goalless draw at Peterborough on the opening day of the 1994-95 season and he finished the season with four starts and three substitute appearances. Born: Lancashire 2-2-75.

Worrell Sterling

- WINGER. On his day can bring a new dimension to the team, a pacey individual whose tight control and balance can upset the tightest defences. Came into top class football with Watford as an apprentice and made his League debut for them in a 2-0 defeat at Manchester United in April 1983. It was the first of 100 appearances for the Hornets. Turned out in another 250 games for Peterborough United proving a durable competitor, missing just half-a-dozen games in four years at London Road. Has also been a virtual ever present for the Rovers since signing in July 1993 from Peterborough for £140,000. Born: London 8-6-65



Marcus Stewart

- STRIKER. Former England
Schoolboy International who went
on to win England Under-21
honours who is another homegrown talent, though he was on
Associate Schoolboy forms with
Southampton until joining the
Rovers YTS. Made his full League
debut against Grimsby Town in
September 1992 and has
established himself as a regular
goalscorer. Netted 24 goals in 36
starts last season, when he set a
new Club record by scoring in nine
consecutive appearances. "Stewi"
is a great favourite with the fans.
Born: Bristol 7-11-72.

Justin Skinner

- MIDFIELD. Was a Club record signing when he arrived from Fulham for £130,000 in the summer of 1995 and quickly established himself with four goals in 50 appearances in his first season with Rovers. A fine play-maker whose precision passing is a feature of his skilled technique. Justin has also captained the team on occasions.

Born: Hounslow 30-1-69.

Ian Wright

- DEFENDER. Signed from Stoke
City for £25,000, in October 1993,
after a loan spell in which he
impressed greatly. Ian had joined
Stoke City straight from school and
whilst there Lou Macari have him a
dozen senior appearances in League
and Cup. Since his arrival at Twerton
Park the six-footer has been a
regular member of the first team
squad and scored one goal in eight
appearances last season.
Born: Lichfield 10-3-72.



John Ward hails from Lincoln, and he started his playing career with his home-town club, signing professional for the Imps in March 1971, six months after making his debut against Reading.

A forward, he spent three months on loan with Workington in 1972 but returned to Lincoln where he finished top scorer in three seasons in the mid-70's scoring 24 goals to help Lincoln win the Fourth Division title in 1976. In all he scored 91 goals in 240 League appearances.

In July 1979 he was taken to Watford by Graham Taylor, who had been a team mate of his at Sincil Bank, and contributed six goals in 26 League outings. Then, at 31, John turned his attention to coaching as Taylor's assistant.


First Division football and an FA Cup Final with Everton were the rewards and when Mr Taylor went to Villa as manager John went with him. Promotion to Division One was secured in their first season: then in 1990 they finished runnersup in the Championship. Taylor then left to become England manager and Ward carried on at Villa Park, later taking on the role also of England Under-21 manager. In November 1991 John was installed as manager of York City and guided them to the top of Division Three. On March 12, 1993 he was offered a three year contract at Bristol Rovers.

In 1995 Rovers won through to the Play-Off Final but lost 2-1 to Huddersfield Town at Wembley.

Under the Spotlight

Central defender Andy Tillson cost Rovers a Club record £375,000 when signed from Queens Park Rangers in November 1992; it proved money well spent. For Andy has forged a great partnership with Billy Clark and together they have formed the rocks upon which many opponents have floundered.

Born in Huntingdon, in June 1966, his early football experience was gained with Peterborough United and Kettering Town but his first real break came in July 1988 when Grimsby Town snapped him up. He was two-and-a-half years at Blundell Park; and made 105 appearances.



Such was his form with the Marines that Queens Park Rangers paid them £500,000 for his transfer in December 1990 but he found his opportunities very limited at Loftus Road - he played in only 29 games (2 goals) and jumped at the chance of regular first team football with Bristol Rovers.

Suffered a few injury problems during the campaign of 1993-94 but has overcome his troubles and came back as captain to dominate the Rovers defence in the season of 1994-95, during which he scored three goals in 53 appearances.

Crowned a magnificent season by clearing the board in the Player of the Year honours winning the honour with the Supporters Club. Young Pirates and Presidents Club.

Our thanks go to the seaside clubs of Brighton and AFC Bournemouth who both assisted our Championship cause last week by taking points from our immediate rivals and strangely we will be looking to them again this afternoon for a similar response.

Brighton came from behind at their Goldstone Ground to draw 2-2 with Crewe - Ray Wilkins' younger brother Dean scoring Brighton's first - while Bournemouth took all three points from Blackpool at Dean Court, thanks to a 70th minute goal from sweeper Matt Holland, to end Blackpool's 11-match unbeaten run. Today, Brighton are at Blackpool and AFC Bournemouth at Crewe!

Of course everyone has been in action in midweek but last Saturday, while our attentions were focused on the FA Cup, we emerged still five points clear of Crewe with the same number of games played so we tackle Bristol Rovers this afternoon as clear leaders.

Crewe will play hosts to AFC
Bournemouth, an interesting one
this though the odds obviously
favour the Railwaymen.
AFC Bournemouth don't travel too
well and have only scored 12 goals
in 13 trips, three of which have
been won and two only drawn, but
it is the second home game this

Blackpool's home record is second to none and one can't imagine that they will collapse again so they should account for struggling Brighton who had their game at Notts County postponed midweek.

Two goals in the last four minutes at Stockport sent Notts County to their first League defeat in two months. Notts boss Colin Murphy claimed: 'It's ironic that we lost because that's the best we have played in recent weeks.' Oh well. that's how it goes, and today they will have home advantage over Shrewsbury Town. It will be interesting to see what reaction the Shrews show following their 4-0 defeat by Liverpool in the FA Cup last week.

Chesterfield, 3-1 winners over Wycombe are not such a force away from home and might well be satisfied with a draw at fast improving Rotherham United. The Yorkshire side lost 1-0 at Bristol Rovers last Saturday but have scored 23 goals at home as they begin to climb away from the relegation zone.

Bradford City were without a game last Saturday - they should have been home to us - and after a tricky trip to Wycombe in midweek travel to Ashton Gate today. Bristol City, like Rotherham, have been improving of late and don't concede many goals on their own patch. A win today will really give them a boost.





Even with the bad weather we have experienced over the past few weeks we have been very fortunate and have not picked up any further injuries to the First Team squad.










CB: First of all Kevin congratulations on a brilliant goal against Southampton. Was that one of your best finishes ever?

CB: You must have glowed inside as soon as that ball hit the net. Tell us how you felt?

KH: Yes I was over the moon, as they say, and I think that showed in my celebrations. I went a bit mad. But yes it is nice; it is just a great feeling to score and I am getting a taste for it this season. Let's hope it continues

CB: Well Kevin last time we played Bristol Rovers you got that scoring feeling on no less than three occasions. Now that was your first ever hat trick in senior football so Twerton Park is surely going to be mentioned in your memoirs?

KH: That's right. It was obviously a good day for me and we played particularly well that day as well. It all fell together for me. I had three chances and scored three goals so remember that game for the rest of my career.

CB: Which of the three goals gave you most satisfaction?



CB: Those are the sort of goals strikers make their reputations on.




As I mentioned in the programme on Wednesday. the second year trainees who have been released have shown excellent commitment and have continued to train and play.





We hear time and again the comment from our stars that they would rather play than train but if we had a shut-down for a month or less you can bet they would not be free to put their feet up and relax. They would be in training for at least three weeks and to make sure they were match-fit they would be playing friendlies.

If such a move does transpire I can see the likes of Tottenham, Manchester United, Liverpool and Leeds jetting off to Saudi Arabia and other such venues to play exhibition matches and reap in the dosh. Such opportunities would not be on offer to the likes of us of course.

We all become frustrated when games we have built-up for and looked forward to are wiped out by inclement conditions but really there is no simple answer to the problems. In many European countries they have no alternative but to close down because of the weather but in most of these places it is possible to forecast pretty accurately the periods of bad weather. Here, it could be any time - there is even on record snow affecting a cricket match in August!

The irony of it all is that postponed matches affect the successful clubs, such as ourselves, more than the others. Because of our success in the FA Cup we are involved in more fixtures and consequently any deviations such as postponements or replays makes our schedule that more difficult to re-arrange.

The only real solution is to cut down the number of games played in a season and that means reducing the size of the League which in turn reduces the revenue through the turnstiles. Perhaps it would be better to leave it as it is after all.

Fraser Digby has blamed himself for Southampton's equaliser. He feels he should have come off his line to punch away the cross and so deny the Saints the chance to equalise. No one else though has pointed the finger at our masterful custodian who like all good goalkeepers hates to be beaten. No doubt a clean-sheet this afternoon will help him feel better; and he can still make his point by helping us win at The Dell.




The idea of the Soccer Centres is to be in touch with the local talent and monitor new and exciting ability and prepare them for greater heights if possible.


We now have over twenty F.A. coaches working at the Soccer Centre all feeding me useful information and coaching boys and girls of varying abilities.
