



# today's visitors

This evening we welcome the players, supporters and staff of West Bromwich Albion Football Club to the County Ground. We hope that everybody enjoys the match and has a safe journey home after the game.

With Albion swiftly becoming the First Division's answer to the National Lottery, with a draw taking place every week, Alan Buckley's side are sitting in the bottom-half of the table - despite having lost only three times in the League all season at the time of writing.

Unfortunately for Baggies' fans they have also won only three in that time, although two of those victories have come against high-flyers QPR and Tranmere.

Buckley, the former Grimsby boss, has got his team playing the neat and tidy football which has become his trademark in recent years and he has recently extended the already large Mariners connection at The Hawthorns to eight by signing the highly-rated goalkeeper Paul Crichton from his old club.

Crichton's capture has been a bonus for Buckley, as he has seen the experienced Nigel Spink - picked up on a free from neighbours Aston Villa suffer a knee injury that required surgery and has resulted in the former England man missing six weeks of first-team action.

Last season's 'Player of the Year' was striker Andy Hunt, and he has started the current campaign in the same way he began 1995/96 - in blistering form.


After a disappointing 1994/95 season, when Albion finished perilously close to the relegation places in 19th spot in the First

Division table, they have recovered well under the stewardship of Alan Buckley and last year finished a creditable 11th, despite a disastrous League run that saw them win just once in 14 games between November and January.

Their biggest strength would seem to lie in attack, where they can boast some quality performers in the likes of Hunt, the experienced Bob Taylor and ex-Birmingham and Stoke player Paul Peschisolido.

But curiously they have struggled a little for goals this term - a record that Steve McMahon and Co will be keen to keep going this evening

Former Ajax and Holland Under-21 star Richard Sneekes was an inspired signing by manager Alan Buckley at a time when nothing was going right for Albion last season.

Picked up from Premiership Bolton Wanderers for a cut-price £400,000 after a bust-up with manager Colin Todd, the introduction of the long-haired Dutchman in the Baggies' midfield in March 1996 had a dramatic effect. Right from his debut in the Albion stripes, against Watford, Sneekes hit it off with both new team-mates and supporters, and his final tally of 10 goals in just 13 games went a long way towards boosting morale and ensuring the Club's First Division status after their mid-season wobbles.

A real cult-hero at the Hawthorns, Richard became - at 16 - the youngest player ever to appear in a League match for Dutch masters Ajax - a record he has since relinquished to Clarence Seedorf.

# Alan Buckley

Attractive and entertaining football has always been the aim for Albion manager Alan Buckley - and even though his nerves must have been stretched to the limit on occasions last season, he managed to keep the Baggies playing in the manner his principles demand.

Buckley has experienced the highs and lows of management during his years in the game: winning successive promotions with Grimsby and taking Walsall to the verge of a Wembley appearance, but also dropping out of the League to take charge of GMVC club Kettering.

He began life as a striker with Nottingham Forest, but managed only 16 matches for the City Ground club before moving to Walsall, where he notched up an impressive tally of 125 strikes in 241 League games over the next five seasons.

He was appointed caretaker manager at Fellows Park - where Walsall then played - but was later sold to Birmingham City when new boss Alan Ashman took over the helm.


However, when City were relegated to the old

Second Division, Buckley returned to Fellows Park as player-manager - for a club record £175,000 - and led the club to runners-up spot in Division Four at his first attempt.

Despite much success at Walsall - including a Milk Cup Semi-Final appearance in 1984 - Buckley lost his job when

millionaire businessman Terry Ramsden took over in 1986, and he moved on to non-League outfit Kettering Town. In his two years in charge the Town won the Bob Lord Trophy (1987), the Northamptonshire Senior Cup (1987 and 1988) and finished third in the Conference.

It was in June 1988 that Alan Buckley was tempted back into League football, when he was appointed manager at Grimsby Town,





The highly-rated former Grimsby Town goalkeeper *PAUL CRICHTON* has been drafted in to help shore up the last line of the Baggies' defence this season. Having begun with Nottingham Forest, Crichton never got a first-team chance at the City Ground and had spells on loan at Notts Co, Darlington, Peterborough, Rotherham, Torquay and here at Swindon before finally moving to Peterborough in November 1988. He became the eighth ex-Grimsby player to follow manager Alan Buckley to The Hawthorns when he transferred recently.

Other keepers at the Club include the experienced ex-England number one **NIGEL SPINK**, who had spent his entire 20-year professional career at Aston Villa before moving to Albion on a free in the summer, and youngster **GARY GERMAINE**, a Scotland Youth International who has come up through the ranks at the Hawthorns.

With **PAUL AGNEW** out injured for much of last season, the left-back position caused some problems for Albion, but it is hoped that the 31-year-old former Northern Ireland U23 cap will be back in regular contention before too long.

One of the outstanding performers in the West Brom defence last term was former Hawthorns apprentice **DARYL BURGESS**, who can operate anywhere across the back four and is also comfortable at sweeper possessing as he does pace, heading ability, strong tackling and the ability to read the game well.

STACEY COLDICOTT is another

ex-YTS to have come up through the ranks at West Brom. A determined and aggressive player who can perform equally well at right-back or in the midfield he struggled for a regular first-team spot last season and again seems to be on the periphery this time around.

Having failed to make the grade at Shrewsbury Town as a teenager, **GARETH HAMNER** is a strong-tackling left-back who drifted into non-League football before being spotted by Albion while playing for League of Wales Club Newtown. Alan Buckley duly paid £20,000 for his signature in May 1996, and Gareth is tipped to make a big impression over the next couple of seasons.

Former Everton man **PAUL HOLMES** added a new dimension to West Brom's play when he arrived on loan from Goodison Park last season, indeed he made such an impression that Alan Buckley quickly parted with the £80,000 needed to take him to the Hawthorns on a permanent basis. Eager to push forward from full-back, Holmes suffered a knee injury towards the end of the last campaign but is now back in action.

PAUL MARDON is an Ex-Bristol City and Birmingham man who enjoyed an excellent last season, broken only by a short-term knee injury. Strong in the air but calm and composed in possession, Mardon formed a sound partnership with PAUL RAVEN, who was one of

SHANE NICHOLSON

was signed from Derby County in February of this year in a bid to solve the Club's problematic left-back position, and he quickly justified his £150,000 transfer fee with a string of good performances coupling sterling defensive work with the ability to

get forward and hit accurate crosses into the opposing box.

**CRAIG HERBERT** is a 20-year-old who was signed from Torquay for £10,000 in March 1994 but missed practically the whole of last season after breaking a leg playing for Albion's Reserve side.

# West Brom



PIAYER PROFILE

In the midfield, Alan Buckley can call on the services of ex-Southend and West Ham United player **PETER BUTLER**, who combines terrierlike tenacity with good passing ability.

Butler joined the Baggies on loan last term and his presence played a big part in the Club's flight away from the relegation places. He was rewarded for his efforts with a permanent contract on 1st August 1996.

A member of the 'Grimsby Connection' is **SHAUN CUNNINGTON**, who will be hoping that the 1996/97 campaign brings him more joy than last season, when three separate comeback attempts were thwarted by injury. Having formerly played under Alan Buckley at Blundell Park, his aggression and leadership qualities in midfield were sorely missed during the Baggies' disastrous run between November and January, and this £220,000 signing from Sunderland in August 1995 will be keen to get back on track this term.

JULIAN DARBY joined Albion from
Coventry City in November 1995 for a fee of
£250,000 but after a bright start he faded into the
background slightly at the Hawthorns, particularly
after the arrival of Richard Sneekes from Bolton.

Right midfielder KEVIN DONOVAN is another Baggies star to have been forced onto the sidelines last term, with an ankle injury prematurely ending his season in March. A determined competitor, Donovan moved to the Midlands from Huddersfield for £70,000 in October 1992 and has also had a spell on loan at Halifax Town.

Another of the eight players to have followed manager Alan Buckley from Grimsby is winger **DAVE GILBERT**. Despite lacking a bit of pace, Gilbert's close control and clever wing play make him a handful for any defence.

It cost WBA £600,000 to tempt **PAUL GROVES** from, yes you've guessed it, Grimsby Town in May of this year. Groves was the Mariners' record signing, Club captain and top scorer last term and he didn't miss a single game for the Blundell Park Club between August 1992 and May

1996 - a remarkable level of consistency. Mainly operates as a ball-winner in the Albion midfield, but also packs a fearsome shot.

IAN HAMILTON enjoyed his best season to date last term, when his prompting and probing from midfield helped unlock some of the division's tightest defences. Signed for £160,000 from Scunthorpe in June 1992 he has proved a bargain for the Hawthorns' Club.

Unable to gain a regular first-team place with the Baggies, winger **DAVE SMITH** put himself on the transfer list in May after a disappointing season. Asked to fill a variety of roles in defence and midfield, this 28-year-old ex-Coventry and Birmingham player always gave a good account of himself on the occasions he was called up.

It is up front that Albion appear to be at their strongest, with last season's 'Player of the Year' ANDY HUNT among their star performers. It was a divided season for Hunt, who hit 16 goals in the first two-thirds of the campaign, but then found the net only once more in the closing

weeks. An unselfish and intelligent player, his strong running off the ball creates numerous chances for his fellow front-men.

**LEE ASHCROFT** is a 24-yearold who is equally happy on either flank and has won England Under-





The 1973/74 season saw West Bromwich Albion playing in the Second Division after 24 years in the top flight.

Don Howe's team had started well, winning 3-2 at Blackpool despite being without three international players; Ray Wilson, Asa Hartford and Jeff Astle.

Swindon had also had a promising start to the season, defeating Sheffield Wednesday 3-1 and taking a point at Preston thanks to a Ray Treacy goal.

The game against West Brom was the first home match for a new Swindon Chairman, Cecil Green and with the Club's young reserve team having achieved

a remarkable 7-1 victory over Arsenal Reserves the previous week, there was an air of optimism when a crowd of 11,583 gathered to see if either side could take the three points which might put them top of the table.

After 15 minutes
the Throstles nearly
took the lead when
their legendary
goalscorer Tony Brown,
fired over the bar when well
placed. It was an Albion
player who did score in the
34th minute but sadly for
David Shaw it came when
he headed a Dave Moss
corner into his own net.

The second half saw tempers flare but amid some unpleasant tackles, some good football was played with Brown and Legg both forcing fine saves from their opposing keepers.

How times have changed was shown by the fact that the booking of three Albion players; Hartford, Merrick and Wile was judged worthy of considerable comment.

Looking at pictures of the game, one suspects that the cap worn by Albion keeper Latchford would have warranted a booking for sartorial inelegance!

The final explosion in a game in which 56 free kicks were awarded came 12 minutes from time. Willie Johnston, later to be sent home from Scotland's ill fated World Cup campaign in Argentina when a cold remedy caused him to fail a drugs test, was sent off after becoming involved in a touch-line clash

between Wile
and Treacy.

top of the table as Aston Villa's 2-0 win over Oxford United gave them the edge on goal average.

Les Allen wisely refused to become over optimistic saying too few games had been played for a realistic picture to have emerged.

By the season's end it was the Baggies who had the last laugh - while Swindon finished stranded at the bottom of the table with just 25 points, the Midlanders finished in eighth position with 44 points.



So tight are things in the Nationwide Football League Division One just now that only eight points separated third placed Crystal Palace from Southend United in 18th spot prior to last night's programme.

Sixteen teams were in action last night including leaders Bolton Wanderers at home to Reading and Crystal Palace at Bradford City (whose on loan goalkeeper Eric Nixon frustrated West Brom with an inspired performance in a 0-0 draw at the Hawthorns on Saturday) but this evening's selection of games is possibly more signigicant.

Over in East Anglia, Norwich City play hosts to Sheffield United. The Canaries kept the pressure on Bolton at the weekend with an inspired 3-2 win at Birmingham City.

It was the first time the Blues had lost a home match this season, in fact they had only conceded one goal in the previous six games, so it was a bitter blow for Trevor Francis.

Birmingham equalised Andy Jones' header but further goals from Neil Adams (penatly) and former Town striker Keith Scott (making his first appearance of the season) saw Norwich thorugh.

Tonight the Blades, amidst rumours and counter claims that boss Howard Kendall is set to return to his old Ewood Park haunt, have to try and cut their way through the meanest defence in the Division.

Norwich, unbeaten at Carrow Road, have conceded just three goals on home soil and must be confident against a Sheffield side that stuttered to a 1-1 draw at home to QPR on Saturday. Substitute Gareth Taylor saved a crucial point with a late equaliser. Norwich to win.

Oueens Park Rangers will also be confident they can take full advantage of an Ipswich Town side that has sadly lost its way. The anticipated Suffolk challenge for promotion has not materialised and with last season's top scorer lan Marshall now in the blue of Leicester City and current top shot Alex Mathie out injured, George Burley's side are not even firing blanks.

Booed off the Portman Road field after their 2-0 defeat by Tranmere Rovers they have now won only once in their last seven games and can hardly expect to improve that record at Loftus Road tonight.

Wolverhampton Wanderers claimed the fourth rung on the First Division ladder when Steve Bull slammed in the only goal at Maine Road on Sunday. It was their fifth away win of the season.

The men from Molineux were highly backed for promotion last August but their campaign is following much the

pattern as our Second Division Championship run last season. Their home form disappoints.

Port Vale inflicted a fourth successive home defeat on Mark McGhee's men the previous week and tonight they will be put to the test by Huddersfield Town.

Ironically, Huddersfield too were beaten at home by the Vale on Saturday - and one is tempted to expect the Wolves to find their teeth tonight against the Terriers who have rather lost their bite of late.

There could be a place for Don Goodman in the starting lin-up. The Wolves striker was brought on as a substitute at Manchester City, just six months after a life-threatening injury sustained at Molineux against? Yes you've guessed it -Huddersfield Town.

It would be nice for him if he could make his first start since fracturing his skull against the team he failed to finish against in the corresponding fixture last season. Predicting football results is about as difficult as winning the lottery and when one gets to the bottom of the page and realises that you have forecast four home wins out of four games, notes of uncertainty begin to fill the air.

The English game is just not that predictable though Norwich City, Queens Park

Rangers, Swindon Town and Wolverhampton Wanderers look good bets on paper.



This group for a long time have passed the ball around very well but as all of us know, sometimes teams don't allow you to do so by closing down and tackling hard to win the ball back.


What was pleasing to see was our boys commitment to what we call the other side of the game.

The trip to Old Trafford last week was like a home coming for Town goalkeeper Fraser Digby, for it was with Manchester United that our popular custodian commenced his career.

As he walked into the arena, memories obviously came flooding back and he most surely was pricked by thoughts of what might have been. There was never ever any doubt about his potential but as in so many cases it is about being in the right place at the right time.

Old Trafford simply wasn't then the right place for a young aspiring custodian of Fraser's age because Gary Bailey and Chris Turner were in their prime and seemingly set to dominate for the next five years or so, while Gary Walsh, impressing in the lower reaches of the youth squad, seemed the natural successor by virtue of his age.

So Fraser came to Swindon to further his career. The drop down the league didn't harm his international prospects for in June 1987 he was one of the stars in the England Under 21 team that drew 0-0 with the USSR in the Toulon tournament.

Missed chances by Clough and Porter had cost England dearly and they now had to beat host nation France to secure a place in the championship final.

Manager Dave Sexton brought Tim Flowers back to replace Fraser and England lost 2-0, the second goal from Ginola, " a local player with Platini-like skills", a real classic. The Frenchman, now with Newcastle United, cleverly flicked the ball over Caesar's head and then beat Flowers in similar fashion.

Anyway, Fraser was brought back in for the play-off for fifth place and kept another clean sheet in the 0-0 draw with Portugal. He then emerged the

hero of the penalty shoot-out, saving from Portugal's first and third attempts. England won 4-1.

Ah, those were the days Fraser, when we were all a lot younger and when the world of football promised so much. It seems strange to think back to those days when we were all dreaming of fame and glory on the pitch and to see what actually happened.

It went well for Tim Flowers of course who has since gone on to play for England and win a Championship medal with Blackburn, Paul Gascoigne, who converted one of England's successful spot kicks against Portugal, was the outstanding product of that young England side down on the golden coastline of the Cote d' Azur. He showed 24 carat potential in this his first international exposure.

Other members of that team who made full international status are; Martin Keown, then with Aston Villa, Tony Dorigo (Chelsea - now Leeds) and Nigel

Clough (Nottingham Forest).


Division and soon after Mark was on his way to his next port of call - Barnsley.


"I really enjoyed my five years at Barnsley. I worked under several managers including Alan Clarke who was a real character.


Swindon Town Ladies kept in mid table following a victory and a defeat in the Southern Region League Division One.



# Namely Nowhere?

Nearly all League teams are named after a town, city, county or area, although Arsenal, originally Woolwich Arsenal, now bear the same name as an Underground station. Port Vale FC is not named after any district, town, station or even a bus stop. The name is taken from a house in the Burslem area.

Fulham's Craven Cottage was originally a hunting ground for Anne Boleyn. The original cottage was a hunting lodge and was situated around the centre circle of the present pitch and below the cottage was an underground passage which lead out to the Thames.

# Smoked Out

During World War II St Andrews was used as an emergency fire station. On one cold winter evening one of the firemen had

been warming his hands around a brazier, decided to douse the flames with some water but the container he used was full of petrol. Although 20 German bombs exploded or landed in or in close proximity to the stadium, the fire did more damage than all 20 bombs put together.

# **Club**Tribute

Birmingham City have a monument which pays tribute to Jeff Hall, a former player at the club. Hall played at right back for the Blues and England but died of polio in his late 50s. St Andrews have a scoreboard in commemoration of the player.

# **Weather** Vane

At Chelsea a weather vane was erected in memory of George "Gattling Gun" Hilsdon, who was crippled in the Great War by mustard gas. People said that as long as the tribute stood the club would have good luck, but

the stand was pulled down in 1972 and the vane put into storage, the club were relegated and found themselves in financial difficulty. Ken Bates took over the club, and the vane, which is the silhouette of a footballer was returned to public view and the club gained promotion as well as its debts recovering.

In 1967-68 Scilly Isles' League Championship was won by the Rovers FC. Rangers FC were the runners-up, which simply had to be as there were only two teams in the League. They made up he fixture list by playing each other twenty times in a season

The first Welsh Cup final was contested on October 30, 1877 between Wrexham and Druids, although there was no trophy at the time to present.
