

It seems ages since our superb victory over Manchester City here at the County Ground but this afternoon we finally return to First Division action with the visit of promotion chasing Barnsley.

The Tykes boast the best away record in the division as they have not yet lost on their travels this term.

But we will be out to dent that impressive run today as the Barmy Army go in search of precious points to push the Club up among the pace-setters.

#### **Double**trouble

Wayne Allison struck both goals as Swindon sank Manchester City 2-0 in our last league game here a fortnight ago.

Skipper Kevin Horlock missed a first half penalty but it didn't matter in the end as The Chief netted twice during the second half to clinch maximum points for Swindon.

#### Tykesturn it on

Barnsley prepared for this afternoon's clash with a fine 3-1 triumph over Norwich City at their Oakwell Ground on Tuesday night.

Adrian Moses fired Barnsley ahead with a stunning volley early in the second half and the home team took complete control when the Tykes former Middlesbrough connection combined.

John Hendrie's shot was blocked but Paul Wilkinson followed up to score his first goal in 11 starts. Hendrie put the issue beyond doubt with Barnsley's third.

#### Rearranged dates

After today's match, Swindon face three away trips in a row, two of them games which have been rearranged due to postponements earlier in the season.

On Tuesday Town travel to lpswich Town (7.45pm) after the original game was cancelled because of the Suffolk side's International call-ups.

Next Saturday we go to Trevor Francis' Birmingham City (3pm) who are sruggling to make an impact in Division One.

And the following Tuesday November 26th (7.45pm) we face the long trek to Sheffield United.

This game was scheduled to take place last Saturday but was called off at the last minute when United defender Roger Nilsen was called into the Norway squad.

He became the third Sheffield star to be on international duty with Gareth Taylor playing for Wales and Alan Kelly in the Republic of Ireland line-up.

Per haps it was a blessing in disguise as Swindon would have been without the influential Kevin Horlock who played a major role in Northern Ireland's 1-1 draw in Germany.



Barnsley come here after a superb 3-1 win against Norwich during the week so it is up to us to bring them back down to earth.



## today's visitors

One of the surprise packages of the season, Barnsley have confounded the critics by keeping their tremendous early-season form going right into November - and they are still among the division's pace-setters.

Five successive wins kickedoff the campaign and saw
the Tykes rocket to the head
of the First Division table. At
the time of writing they have
lost only twice in the League all
season, and are as yet undefeated away
from home.

When that first League loss finally came - at home to Queens Park Rangers in mid-September - many observers suggested that it was the beginning of the end for Barnsley, and the unfashionable South Yorkshire club was sure to start quickly sliding out of sight down the League ladder.

But a seven match unbeaten run, stretching from October 1st, has kept confidence high at Oakwell, although the Tykes have found it hard to kill off opponents in that time, with six of those games finishing as draws.

In the shape of Andy Liddell, Neil Redfearn and Clint Marcelle, Barnsley can boast three of the First Division's most dangerous goalscorers, while

recent signing John Hendrie will only add to that menace.

The Tykes have already played host to two of the top sides, forcing draws against both Bolton and Crystal Palace, while on Tuesday they recorded a 3-1 home win over third placed Norwich City.

Danny Wilson's attractive side have found goals fairly easy to

## Onetowatch Clint Marcelle

This highly-rated 27-yearold attacking midfielder has played a huge part in Barnsley's impressive start to the current League campaign.

With four goals in six games, Marcelle has proven a sound acquisition by manager Danny Wilson - and the signs are that the best is still to come.

Former Ipswich Town and England boss Bobby Robson recommended the midfield star to Danny Wilson during the summer, and the Oakwell club were quick to fork out the £200,000 required to secure Marcelle's mercurial services.

Robson, now manager at Barcelona but formerly boss of Portuguese Champions Porto, had spotted the player in action for League rivals Felgueiras last term and reckoned he was just what Barnsley were looking for. Marcelle was quick to

the faith shown in him, scoring the winner in Barnsley's opening game of the current campaign as a 2-1 victory over West Brom kick-started a five match, 15-point haul that shot the Yorkshiremen to the top of the First Division table.

## Danny Wilso

Danny started his career with his home-

town Club, Wigan Athletic, and also played for Bury, Chesterfield, Nottingham Forest, Brighton, Luton and Sheffield Wednesday before joining Barnsley as

Player-Coach under Viv Anderson in July 1993.

During his 18 year career he has made more than 740 first-team appearances, including 89 for the Tykes up to the end of last season, and also won 24 caps for Northern Ireland.

High points of this likeable young manager's playing days have been his contribution to two League Cupwinning sides - Luton (1988) and Sheffield Wednesday (1991) - as well as representing

his country.

A good all-round midfield player with an excellent work-rate, Danny

is an excellent striker of the ball who has the talent and vision to change the direction of play

> Middlesbrough as assistant to Bryan Robson in June 1994, Danny was appointed Player-Manager at Oakwell and he enjoyed a successful first season in the post, leading the Tykes to sixth spot in the League table and also being voted 'Player of the Year' for good measure.

## playerprofile

#### BARNSLEY

One of the big success stories of Barnsley's highly-rated Youth policy has been the emergence of goalkeeper *DAVID WATSON*, who represented England U21s and the Endsleigh League last season. A supreme shot-stopper, David missed just one League game last term and presents a formidable barrier in the Tykes' goal.

His understudy is Sheffield-born teenager ADAM SOLLITT who has been with the Club since his schooldays. A highly-rated youngster for whom the Oakwell coaching staff have high hopes, Adam signed professional in July 1995.

Now recovered from a serious knee injury suffered in February, *STEVE DAVIS* is an experienced central defender who loves to get among the goals, and cost the Club £180,000 when he signed from Burnley in July 1991.

He began with Stoke before moving to Crewe in 1983, where he made his Football League debut, and then joined Burnley in October 1987. Club captain at Turf Moor, he was voted 'Player of the Year' in his last campaign for the Club.

Happy playing in the popular wing-back role down the right flank is local Barnsley boy NICKY EADEN, who originally turned down the Club's offer of a YTS contract to remain at school and finish his 'A' levels. He was the Tykes' only ever-present last season, and likes to shoot from distance.

Often playing a sweeper's role at the back for Barnsley is Northern Ireland international

GARY FLEMING, now happily returned to fitness after a terrible knee injury which ruled him out for almost the whole of 1995/96. Formerly with Nottingham Forest and Manchester City, Gary moved to Oakwell for £85,000 in March 1990.

Young central defender *ADRIAN MOSES* is a highly-rated player who is particularly good as a man-marker. Strong in the air and in the tackle, he is a homegrown player who has quietly established himself in the first-team over the last couple of seasons.

PETER SHIRTLIFF could be termed the 'one who got away' from

Oakwell. After playing for Barnsley Boys, Peter opted to sign for Sheffield Wednesday and spent eight seasons at Hillsborough before moving on to Charlton. Returning to Wednesday in 1989 he helped the Club to its 1991 League Cup triumph before becoming captain - and for a time caretaker manager - at Wolves. A brave and committed player with great leadership qualities, Peter moved to Oakwell in August 1995 for £125,000.

Last season's 'Player of the Year' for the Tykes was popular Dutchman *ARJAN DE ZEEUW*. A strong and composed central defender, Arjan was signed from Telstar for £200,000 in November 1995, and made his debut against Wolves, where he snuffed out the twin threat of Don Goodman and Steve Bull. A strong tackler and good distributor of the ball, he looks a fine purchase by Danny Wilson.

Left-back MATTY APPLEBY

is a former Youth trainee at Newcastle who joined the Club from Darlington in the summer. His brother, Richard, is also a professional footballer.

SCOTT JONES

is an ex-YTS at
Oakwell who
signed

made his debut

Keeping up the Ipswich connection, Barnsley signed the former Portman Road favourite

## P. J. A. Y. F. B. P. B. O. F. J. J. F.

Highly-rated young midfielder **MARTIN BULLOCK** was a £15,000 snip from non-League Eastwood Town in September 1993. He made 45 appearances last season, but was often used as a substitute, with Danny Wilson bringing him on late to use his great pace and dribbling skills to terrorise tiring defences.

The experienced **NEIL REDFEARN** is a well-travelled central midfielder who was the Club's second highest scorer last season with 15 goals.

He has always looked the part during spells with Bolton, Lincoln, Doncaster, Crystal Palace, Watford and Oldham. Neil scored the vital goal which ensured promotion to the old First Division for the Boundary Park club in 1991, before almost immediately transferring to Barnsley for £150,000.

Whether performing as a toughtackling central midfielder, or a flying left-sided wing-back,

#### DARREN SHERIDAN

has come on in leaps and bounds since joining
Barnsley following a week's trial from HFS
Loans League side Winsford
United in the summer of 1993. Formerly an apprentice with Leeds, Darren was released from Elland Road and drifted into Sunday League football before being picked out by Winsford.

#### CAREL VAN DER VELDEN

joined Barnsley from Dutch club Den Bosch in March 1996 as a longterm replacement for boss Danny Wilson in the midfield. A good passer and shrewd organiser of the players around him, Carel made his debut against Port Vale in March 1996.

Continuing the foreign theme, JOVO BOSANCIC is a former Croatian U21 international who impressed during a two week trial at Oakwell during the summer of 1996 and was promptly signed up.

Barnsley-born **GLYNN HURST** eventually found his way to Oakwell after a roundabout trip that took him to South Africa, Tottenham and Derby County. Having emigrated to South Africa, Glynn was spotted by Spurs during an U16 match and signed as a YTS at White Hart Lane, He failed to make the grade there though, and after trials at Derby he returned to his native South Yorkshire in July 1994.

ANDY LIDDELL scored nine goals during the course of last season. Andy has come up through

the ranks at the Club, has represented Scotland at Under-21 level and is on the verge of a call-up to Craig Brown's full national squad.

Former Barry Fry disciple DAVE REGIS

moved North to Oakwell from

Southend in a deal which took Andy Rammell in the other direction towards the end of last season. A player under Fry at Barnet and Birmingham, Dave still finished 1995/96 as Southend's leading scorerdespite leaving the Club in February. Struggled for chances behind the free-scoring pair of Andy Liddell and Andy Payton (now Huddersfield) last term.

LAURENS TEN HEUVEL is a

young striker who followed Carel van der Velden from Den Bosch in March 1996, while the experienced

PAUL WILKINSON was snapped up from Middlesbrough during the close season. A proven goalscorer at the highest level, Wilkinson has also had spells at Watford, Nottm Forest, Everton and Grimsby.

Recent transfer market activity has seen the arrival of experienced ex-Newcastle, Leeds and Middlesbrough striker JOHN HENDRIE at Oakwell. A proven goalscorer at the highest level - and a former Scotland Youth cap - Hendrie had found first-team chances hard to come by at the Riverside Stadium following the arrival of Fabrizio Ravanelli and jumped at the chance of a move to South Yorkshire.

Today an F.A. Cup clash between Swindon and Barnsley would be a complete surprise but this was not so in the 1911-12 season. Only two years before, Swindon and Barnsley had both reached the semi-final stage.

The official attendance (for the semi-final at Stamford Bridge) was 48,057 but the papers estimated the real attendance as being between 60,000 and 80,000, despite the fact that a strike meant no excursion trains and few supporters from either side were able to see the match

Swindon won the toss and chose to play with the advantage of the cold wind in the first half. They had the better of the play but it soon became apparent that Harold Fleming, Swindon's international inside right, had been singled out for some

team, two of whose members always seemed to be on hand

harsh treatment by a muscular Barnsley

to trip or nudge the Town star.

The second half saw Swindon make a better show of playing against the wind than had Barnsley and a fine run by Bown saw him beat three players before hitting a shot which shaved the top of the crossbar.

The second half saw Fleming sustain an injury which was to keep him out of action for 10 months. There was some difference of opinion as to whether his injury was the result of deliberate foul play or merely "excess of zeal."

This phrase was used by one reporter under the name of DD who felt that although Fleming was kneed in the groin it was a pure accident.

A less charitable view was taken by the Daily Express which described Barnsley's treatment of one of the cleanest players ever to don a football boot as disgraceful and concluded by saying "To stop a clever opponent by maiming him is not football as understood in the South."

The Swindon Advertiser went further saying it was "impossible to believe a team could stoop to such vile and discreditable tactics."

Chambers and told "You don't take penalties Billy" and handed the ball to Archie Bown.



Parker, 32, has played in the Premiership this season and though he is initially on a short term contract with Sheffield United, it is with a view to a permanent move to Bramall Lane.





































Our lads were a credit to the Club and eventually ran out winners by the odd goal in nine but to be honest it was a shame one team had to lose because it was played in a great spirit.


The Under 13's drew their game away but unfortunately the Under 15's got an absolute drubbing against a very strong Southampton side, so we have got a lot of work to do in that

No disrespect to the Tykes but a club whose history is embroidered around the adventures and doings of heroes such as Skinner Normanton surely can't stimulate adrenalin in quite the same way as the **European Champions with** Klinnsmann, Möller and company.

There is no question last
Saturday in Nuremberg was the
greatest day of Kevin's
professional career and to come
off the field knowing that he
and his Irish colleagues had
matched the best in Europe, if
not the world, in a World Cup
qualifying tie, naturally filled
him with a warm glow of
self satisfaction.

But our intrepid hero has not been carried away. Barnsley this afternoon is the most important game in the universe as far as he is concerned, for young Kevin, who was only 24 a fortnight ago, is about as down to earth as you can get.

When I suggested to him that Barnsley would be somewhat of a come-down after the glamour of World Cup competition, his reply was firm, instant and unequivocal: "Not really," he insisted. "It is still a game of football and one I would love to win. at the end of the day league football is my bread and butter, Swindon is the club that pays my wages, so this is the football that I live on really.

"Internationals are the cherry on the cake and it is nice to be involved but it is quite nice to get back to the league programme." Kevin had not featured in Northern Ireland's opening World Cup matches which had proved devastatingly poor for them and consequently he travelled with more hope than certainty in his heart.

The first inclining he got that he might be in the team was when he was included in the set piece routines in training but official confirmation was not delivered by manager Brian Hamilton until four hours before the game.

"It was quite nerve racking," said Kevin, " as I thought I might have a chance of playing the butterflies were there during the week but the time between being told and kick-off flew along."

But how does one prepare for a game like this? You can't dwell on Germany and their reputation, to do so would frighten the life out of anyone, let alone an Irish side that failed to beat Armenia in Belfast. You would be tempted to catch the next flight home surely.

"We concentrated on our own game," said Kevin. "There is a great spirit in the Irish team, they are a great bunch of lads and at the end of the day we were laughing and joking. When it gets down to it, it is 11 against 11. Germany have great quality in their team but Northern Ireland has a reputation of giving 110 per cent and the lads certainly did that.

"The manager looked to us to soak up the pressure. We played with a sweeper and one up front. I played left back and was told to sit and hold my position and not bomb on too often; and that's what I did and the manager said "well done" after the game so I was more than pleased.

"You can't really man to man mark the Germans, their movement is that good. One minute Hassler is confronting you on the right wing, the next minute he is in the left back position.

"We hit them on the break to take a shock lead but unfortunately we couldn't hold onto it and they equalised just before the break. The second half was backs to the wall."

It was Germany's first home game since winning the European Championship at Wembley so it was a full house which expected their team to give Northern Ireland a right hammering.

They weren't slow to demonstrate their frustrations either as German technique failed to break down Irish resolve.

Kevin's lasting momento of this historic game in Irish football history is the shirt of Marco Bode. He said: "I was a bit disappointed actually

because during the game,

Hassler was out right and I was marking him, then Möller filled that role. "But for the last 10 minutes the manager switched me to midfield and neither of these players was in close enough range to swap shirts with at the end. But I'm more than happy with the one

I've got."

There will be no shirt swopping with Barnsley this afternoon of course and Kevin does not even know which number he will be wearing.


"I will just be satisfied to be selected," he grinned.

Reserves this season.


And on his arrival at the County Ground, who should Peter bump into - only his old school mate Alex Smith.



## Reading match rescheduled

1871

On the recommendations of the Wiltshire Constabulary, the forthcoming home fixture between local rivals Swindon Town and Reading has been rescheduled for the second time this season.

The match will now take place on the original date of Saturday November 30th and will not be shown live on SKY Sports.

Last month the game was selected by SKY for a live transmission which meant the fixture was brought forward to Friday READING F.C. November 29th.

But on the evidence of incidents involving rival supporters before, during and after the recent away match at Reading and on the basis of police intelligence reports, it was felt that there was a serious risk of public disorder if the game was played on a Friday evening.

Local derbies are traditionally high profile with a heavy police presence deployed to ensure minimal disruption to the local community. Away fans are escorted from the ground to make sure they leave the area after the final whistle.

However on Friday evening's this is more difficult to enforce with a greater risk of away fans staying in Swindon at the main areas of entertainment pubs, clubs and restaurants which of course would mean the potential for public disorder.

Following discussions between the Wiltshire Constabulary, Swindon Town FC and the Football League, representations were made by the police under the terms of a policy agreement between the Police Authorities and the Football League which provides for avoiding high risk fixtures on Fridays.

After serious consideration the recommendations of the police were accepted by the Football League and the Club in the interests of public safety. Steve Jones, Chief Executive at Swindon Town said:

> "It is extremely disappointing and frustrating that a small minority can spoil the enjoyment for the vast majority. We have a good record at the County Ground and are proud of our reputation as a family club.

"We are very unhappy about the circumstances surrounding this decision, but are not prepared to compromise this reputation or the safety of genuine supporters.

"Both ourselves and Reading will lose out financially now that the game is not being televised but at the end of the day the safety of the general public is more important."

#### Gloom At Bloomfield

Despite a convincing 6-0 win at home to Newcastle United in the 1966-67 season, Blackpool were to only draw five other games at Bloomfield Road that season with the rest of the games ending in defeat. A total of seven points was achieved at home. They did manage more success away from home with five wins and four draws but their total of 21 points was never enough to keep them safe from relegation to Division 2 at the season's end

**Bolton Wanderers opened** their 1902-03 campaign in Division One with only three draws from their first 23 matches, the other 20 games ending in defeat. The season ended with relegation despite the Trotters winning eight away fixtures.

#### Shaken Not Stirred

The chairman of Bury F.C. way back in 1891, is allegedly responsible for the club gaining its nickname The Shakers. Upon learning of the strength of his teams next opponents he remarked that 'they would shake them'!

### Don't Give Up

When Sheffield Wednesday signed Willie Lawson from Brechin City in October 1969 the club not only signed a forward to their side but also a part-time window cleaner. Scotland via St Mirren but Brechin were the more dejected, for had Willie played in three more fixtures for Sheffield Wednesday he would have earned Brechin a further £1,000 from their transfer negotiations.

Brentford recorded an historic 1-0 win over first Division Middlesbrough back in 1906-07. The London side were only in the Southern League and up against the might of household names: Steve Bloomer and Alf Common, who at the time was a record league signing of £1,000. Over 21,000 spectators saw this FA Cup 2nd round giant-killing act. The 'Boro's blushes were not spared after their Cup defeat when their coach lost one of its wheels as it passed through Brentford High Street.




