







everyone a belated Happy New Year on behalf of myself and all the staff at Tranmere.


Tonight we welcome a good friend of mine in Steve McMahon to Prenton Park and I am certain his Swindon side will provide us with a very stern test.

We went along to watch Swindon at Goodison last Sunday and they were very unfortunate. The referee effectively killed off their chances in the first minute with the sending off of Ian Culverhouse and it was always going to be difficult for them after that.

Now we just have to ensure we don't suffer from the backlash of their disappointment. Any side managed by Steve will mirror his style of play - and that is one of total commitment, so we'll have to be on our toes. From our point of view, the injuries to Danny Coyne and Eric Nixon were a bolt from the blue. Danny is likely to be out for a few weeks but Eric may be back tonight.

If not, I have every faith in young Steve Simonsen. He's a competent keeper and, importantly, a very confident one - so I have no qualms about giving him his debut. We're fortunate to have three good goalkeepers.

Meanwhile, the FA Cup draw gave us a very big incentive with the chance of a home tie with Sheffield Wednesday if we beat Carlisle. While that has its obvious attractions, it would be unprofessional of us to think of anyone else but Swindon and then Carlisle on Tuesday. We got a very good result at West Brom, with an excellent performance at a venue where we have often come unstuck in the past. So

John Gorman has gone (to England no less!) along with the likes of Paul Bodin, Martin Ling, Jan Aage Fjortoft, Andy Mutch and Keith Scott, to name but a few.

After sliding down football's greasy pole from Premiership to the Second Division, Steve McMahon has

hauled them back up one rung.

Long forgotten are the things that once divided us. This is a new team, a new board and management. Time for a fresh start and old wounds to be healed forever.

Considering the distance between us, there are quite a number of connections on the playing and managerial front. Rovers favourite lan Muir had a somewhat unproductive time at the County Ground, while Gary Williams and John Kelly enjoyed their spells in Wiltshire. Kenny Beamish and Bryan Hamilton meanwhile had management experience at Swindon which sent their respective careers in differing directions. Kenny went into the commercial world at Blackburn and Bryan eventually became Northern Ireland boss! Others to play in both red and white include Scott Endersby, Steve Peplow, Stewart Williamson, Pat Jackson, Abe Rosenthal, Alf Day and Arthur Briggs. Last, but not least, Steve McMahon and John Aldridge were teammates at Liverpool.

FACE TO FACE

Two heroes of Liverpools' recent past come face to face today when John Aldridge pits his wits against ex-teammate and pal Steve McMahon, who was the provider of numberous goals for the boss in their Anfield days. So far this season, it is 1-0 to Macca with Aldo acknowledging his opposite number has done well at the County Ground. "Macca has done brilliantly at Swindon after a difficult start. He's rebuilt the team completely in his own style and we know any side managed by him will be competitive and hard to beat. It will be good to see him afterwards.



Boardroom Briefing

I extend a warm Friday night welcome to our friends from Swindon, in particular the Chairman, Directors, Steve McMahon and the players and those involved in the decision making process of agreeing to a Friday night fixture at Prenton Park. Sadly this type of co-operation is not universal throughout the Division but Swindon are one of those clubs who understand the harsh realities of commercial life outside the Premiership. Their exit from the FA Cup must have been an acute disappointment and I fully understand Steve McMahon's frustration that within minutes of the kick-off, he was suddenly faced with a penalty and one of his players sent off. Playing Premiership sides is difficult enough and one can imagine the preparation that went on beforehand, only to end in an impossible uphill battle. Of course we know the feeling only too well having experienced it at Swindon's County Ground some years ago in a play-off for promotion.

Hopefully the worst of the Winter is now behind us and the prospect of snow covered and frozen pitches has abated. The postponement of our Third Round Cup tie following a pitch inspection now comes into sharp financial focus when one appreciates victory there would result in a lucrative Fourth Round tie against Sheffield Wednesday at Prenton Park at a date to be confirmed. Without wishing to add additional pressure, this would be a much needed boost and we are due a slice of Lady Luck in the FA Cup, for this has eluded us now for several seasons. Nevertheless, the League remains the all important factor and both Swindon and ourselves are well aware that two good footballing sides can acquit themselves well at a higher level.

As we embark on our first match of 1997 we recognise the various challenges that face the club during the New Year and whilst the broader issue of financial restructuring is under consideration, we are nevertheless conscious of the need for day-to-day economies wherever these can be achieved. We have appointed two sub-committees to have an in-depth look at ourselves, one on the commercial and administration side and the other on the administration of the youth development, training scouting and

the youth development, training, scouting and playing staff, for while these will not cope with day to day trading losses, one must be careful that demands on the transfer market are not too radical and counter productive.

Tonight's game promises to be an exciting affair. We will ensure the floodlights remain on! We expect both sides to provide an entertaining game which I trust you will enjoy.

Amorning start from Prenton Park for Oakwell.




New signing Kevin McIntyre was first spotted by Tranmere's scouts as a dashing left winger playing Sunday football in Liverpool.


will be looking at the team sheet anxiously.



CANCEL CHRISTMAS!

ACOUPLE of years back Dave Bassett, then in charge at Sheffield United, organised the clubs' Christmas Party for August after saying: "We're always crap until after Christmas, so I thought we'd get it out of the way early and hopefully we'll have a better season!"

Such a stunt made little impression on the Blades' players; they got relegated anyway, but when you look at the way Rovers have fared over the past six or seven seasons, you can sympathise with his view that Christmas should be a moveable feast!

Management, supporters, and the players themselves, would love to know just why the Rovers undergo an apparent metamorphosis from confident promotion seekers to nervous wrecks inside a few weeks, either side of Christmas - and that despite the fact we have traditionally enjoyed a home match

on Boxing Day with a packed house. Back in 1989-90 season, it all started to go wrong with a 4-2 home defeat by Bury on December 2nd which was followed by draws against Chester and Preston. On December 30, we went down 0-2 at Bristol Rovers and the

following week 1-3 at Bolton.

The following campaign, Rovers registered just one victory in December with defeats by Bolton (again!) Scunthorpe in the Cup and Cambridge, with draws against Reading and Rotherham. Only Birmingham were vanquished 1-0 on December 21st, before Tony Thomas' goal after 7.7 seconds changed our fortunes on New Years day and set us up for a 3-1 defeat

In 1991-92, Rovers celebrated Christmas with a Boxing Day victory over Sunderland by a single goal, but there after it was all down hill. Two days later John Aldridge was sent off along with Paul Futcher, in a frustrating 1-1 home draw with Grimsby and after a no score draw at Watford, defeats at Oxford, in the FA Cup, and Bristol Rovers followed.

In the three successive seasons we reached the Division One play-offs between 1992-3 and 1994-5, our form up to the Christmas period was always good, but the sound of jingle bells and Christmas party poppers brought us tumbling down the league table.

In 1992-3 rovers had the chance to go top over the festive period but drew 1-1 against Millwall. Five games without a win thereafter, and injury to John Aldridge, saw us plummet to 6th by February on the back of humiliating defeats such as the 1-5 thrashing at Notts

Though we recovered in March and April, the damage had been done and once again we had to settle for a play-off place when automatic promotion was in

our sights.

The same scenario was re-enacted 12 months later. On December 19th, Palace won 1-0 at Prenton Park, and though we beat Watford 2-1 on New Years Day, our challenge collapsed around our ears in the next few weeks, though strangely, the only chink of light came as we progressed to the Coca Cola Cup semifinals with a replay success over Nottingham Forest. Draws against Wolves and Middlesbrough plus defeats at Derby (0-4), Oxford (0-2), Forest (1-2) and Bolton (1-2) and Bristol City (0-2) saw us tumble from second position over Christmas to 7th by the end of January.

Once again, the ship was steadied, and Rovers came strongly towards the end of the season, but the

disappointment of the narrow Aston Villa defeat in the Coca Cola semi's seemed to knock the heart out of the team, and the play-off was lost to Leicester.

Christmas and New Year 1994-5 may have brought welcome home victories against Derby County (3-1) and Bristol City (2-0), but other than that the whole festive period told a familiar story. Notts County, Swindon, Stoke, Bolton and Port Vale all took points off us, as our form nose-dived without the injured Aldo.

However that season, we were lucky that others were equally inconsistent somehow maintained our play-off position of fourth.

The only saving grace from Rovers' traditional Christmas failings was that we usually got our act together by March and April to clinch a Play-Off place but last season the slide was irreversible and by April had cost John King his job as we hovered near the relegation zone.

Only a vital 2-0 victory over Oldham on Boxing Day brightened the gloom of a December and January nightmare which saw defeats by Luton, Portsmouth, Watford, Birmingham, Reading, QPR and Wolves with just one point at Bramhall

But for Ged Brannan's late, late goal against Huddersfield on Boxing Day you suspect 1996-7 may have followed the usual pattern coming as it did on the back of four straight December reversals. Hopefully, the victory engineered by Higgy and the boss at West Brom will have broken the mould that has been cast over the past seven years.

So what can be done to change things? Firstly, you have to recognise there IS a problem. Secondly, change the Christmas routine in some way. And if all else fails, we'll have to cancel Christmas! Think about it. One half decent return over the Christmas-New Year period in the last five years would have surely seen

us promoted ...
