

After the disappointments of last term, when Boro were losing Finalists in both major domestic cup competitions as well as being relegated, Bryan Robson was desperate to give his supporters something to cheer about in 1997/98. And judging by the way his team have flown out of the starting traps this season the players, too, are keen to make amends.

Boro are currently sitting in fourth place in the First Division table, three points behind ourselves and joint-leaders Forest and West Brom, but have two games in hand over us.

They are the second highest scorers in the Division, behind Charlton, and when you look at the performers they have turning on the style up front, that comes as no surprise.

Bryan Robson the manager

Former England and Manchester United star Bryan Robson is the most successful manager in Boro's history - even if he did unfortunately take them down last season.

In 1997/98 the man who inspired club and country for almost a decade is aiming to return his troops to the Premiership at the first time of asking. He certainly has the experience and quality of players available to achieve his goal.

Having captained Manchester United to League, FA Cup, League Cup and European glory during a monumental career, Robbo was granted a free transfer from Old Trafford in the summer of 1994 and was immediately appointed player-manager at Boro.

In his first season he led his team to the First Division title, and last year took the Boro to both major domestic Finals - the first in the club's history - as well as attracting several big name stars to the Cellnet Riverside Stadium.

The oldest man ever to appear in a senior match for Boro, Robson is still registered on the playing staff and has pledged to turn out if needed in 1997/98.

A natural leader on and off the pitch, he is sure to be one the Nationwide League's major celebrities this season.







5 YEARS AGO

Craig Maskell opened the scoring with his 16th goal of the season at Ashton Gate. Andy Cole drew Nicky Hammond for Gary Shelton to equalise just before half time but a sweeping movement ended with Nicky Summerbee restoring Town's lead in the 57th minute. A

minute later Rosenoir equalised and Cole nearly snatched a winner for Bristol City in the final minutes when his shot was blocked by Kevin Horlock. It was the first time in seven matches that Cole had not got his name on the scoresheet and the point kept Swindon in second place just in front of Tranmere and West Ham in the race to reach

the Premiership. John Hendrie and Chris Norris scored second half goals to give Boro a 2-0 win at Ayresome Park. It lifted them to 11th in the league but by the end of the season they had slipped to 21st spot and narrowly escaped relegation to Division One. Norwich topped the Premiership after beating Sheffield United 2-1.

10 YEARS AGO

With 19 year old David Batty making his debut, Leeds cruised to a 3-0 lead over Swindon inside 35 minutes. Two tap in goals in the 40th and 77th minutes by Bobby Barnes stunned the Elland Road crowd and set up a thrilling finish.

Sadley for Town, Peter Haddock

was allowed to slip three tackles before shooting past Town's on loan keeper, Tim Flowers, six minutes from time.

Middlesbrough's midfielder Gary Hamilton scored the only goal of the game against Plymouth Argyle at Home Park. It was one of seven away wins in a season which saw them just miss out to Aston Villa on an automatic promotion spot. Both sides had the same goal difference but Villa had scored more goals. Boro's efforts were rewarded though as they made it to the First Division via the play offs. Mark Walters scores a hat trick to help Aston Villa to a 4-1 win over Crystal Palace.

15 YEARS AGO

Swindon were frustrated throughout the first half of their FA Cup First Round clash with Wealdstone winning18 free kicks but failing to score. Wealdstone, who were members of the Allience League, which was later to become the Vauxhall


Conference, were finally overcome with two goals early in the second half. First, Charlie Henry headed home and then, Pritchard whose corner had produced the first goal, set Paul Rideout free and saw the young striker elude a challenge before driving low past Goddard the

former Orient Keeper.
MIddlesbrough got a goaless
draw at Elland Road in Division
One. Lack of fire power was
Boro's problem as none of their
players reached double figures in
terms of league goals. A record
twelve players were sent off in
the first Round FA Cup matches.

FLASH-BACK

In October 1970 Middlesbrough fell victim to one of the most devastating opening spells the County Ground had ever seen. Within two minutes Don Rogers had fired Town in front and three minutes later Butler's long range shot was deflected by the in-rushing Arthur Horsfield who notched his second goal of the afternoon. Boro must have been regretting omitting their Irish international Eric McNordie but they managed to steady the ship

and no further goals were scored. Indeed oddly, for a match with a scoreline like this, it was Roy Jones in the Swindon goal who was Graham Russell's Man of the Match thanks to a string of saves of which the one from his namesake Gordon in the 30th minute was the pick. It was a good day for Arthur Horsfield who not only scored two goals against his old club, but backed the Gold Cup winner at 25-1 and picked up a win bonus of £4.

November 12th

With the team flying high at the top of Division One there was an awful lot of media interest in the Club with the likes of Sky Sports, Channel 5 and several of the National newspapers coming down to find out the secret of our success.

Away from that our Reserves were in action against near neighbours Oxford United and it was great to see the second string emerge with a 5-1 victory.

Defender Gary Elkins, stole the limelight (and the matchball) with his first ever hat trick while Steve Finney celebrated his return from a loan spell at Cambridge with a goal and trialist Mark Quayle also netted. The other trialist on show was midfielder Chris Price who looked quite useful.

It was great to see Mark Robinson back in action after a long lay-off through injury. It was a case of re-introducing him to the players and no doubt the dog bit him when he went home! It is as if he hasn't been around and "Robbo" is a great character to have about the place so I was pleased to see him back.



November 13th

After a highly successful two month loan spell from Coventry City, defender Brian Borrows put pen to paper and signed an 18 month contract here at the County Ground. "Bugsy" has been a consistent performer during his time at the Club and I've no doubt he will continue to show that over the next season and a half.

Of course on the outgoing front, the Chief Wayne Allison had signed for Huddersfield Town earlier in the week and so the search was on for a replacement. With that in mind the Gaffer and

myself flew out to Holland to take a look at a potential new recruit.



November 14th

The lads travelled up to Stockport at lunchtime and we met them at the team hotel in the evening in readiness for what we knew was going to be a very tough test the next day.

I went to see Stockport two weeks ago against Sunderland the day after our game at Portsmouth and they were the better side by far. We knew we would be up against a well balanced and very well organised team and in my opinion they are one of the better sides in the division.



November 15th

As anticipated it did prove to be a very testing fixture and unfortunately we ended up on the end of a 4-2 defeat. It was a poor performance, particularly defensively where we made far too many mistakes and were punished for them. Too many players were off form and we didn't work as hard for each other as we had been in recent matches.



November 16th

A win for Notts Forest took them above us in the League table but we were still very much in contention and it was a case of quickly putting the things right that we had got wrong on Saturday in time for the visit of Middlesbrough.



November 17th


We had been impressed with Chris in last week's game and were keen to have another look at him but it will now be a case of monitoring his progress and then perhaps inviting him back another time.





Gary Elkins stepped up to send the keeper the wrong way and complete his hat trick. With a great night's work done, he was replaced by Paul McAreavey.



Stockport County was the first major hiccup of the campaign, though their league position suggests they may have been stiff opposition and worthy of three points.




For our chances, see the physio's weekly report, and then ask Macca if he has got eleven. If we get all the wounded back, this will be our best season for five years.


The boys got a taste of the big time at Swindon Town by getting changed in the first team changing room and this seemed to really inspire them, as they came out and played some excellent football.




The other team to take on Forest were the Under 16's who went down 2-1 away while the Under 14's and Under 15's faced tough tests against Portsmouth.


The Nest-Egg commenced on 22nd January 1994 at our Premiership fixture with Spurs. Since then, 189,667 tickets have been sold at £1 each. Our 110

winners (up to and including the Bradford City game) have shared in £82, 377! This gives an average pay-out of £748.88. This includes pre-season friendlies and poorly attended Anglo-Italian cup games at which the lowest pay-out was £237. £1000 has been the prize on 26 occasions. From the gross income, £28,039.44 has been appropriated on account of expenses. The remaining £79,250,56 has been donated to the Club's Development Fund for the benefit of supporters. The fact that prize money has fallen short of the maximum 50% allowance is due to the £1000 limit where applicable.

The average gross income during our Premiership season was £3,362.75. This compares with £1,976.48 in 1994/95, £1,572.06 in 1995/96 and £1,307.22 for 1996/97.

Swindon Town have very much been the First Division surprise package this season that few people anticipated.

Whilst the bookies were making Middlesbrough, Sunderland, Forest and Sheffield Utd the ones to watch, Steve McMahon's side have had a great start to the season and sustained it. Such a start has been a credit to Swindon and continues to demonstrate the unpredictability of football or does it?

One thing very predictable about the game is that you rarely get a great team without a great manager and that's what Steve McMahon has the

potential to be. Without doubt he is emerging as one of the most talented of the next generation of managers and this is a result of what he has experienced so far in his reign at Swindon. Relegation in his first season in charge was hardly a fairy tale transition from player to manager. McMahon has had to go backwards before he could go forwards and because of this he has gained invaluable experience of wheeling and dealing in the transfer market he's learnt his trade at the right end of football.

This season is demonstrating what the manager has learnt. When I interviewed him at the start of the season he

told me that he was delighted to have finally signed Chris Hay





after tracking him at Celtic for a long time. Well Chris Hay's strike record at Celtic last season may not have been deemed prolific by most (but he was hardly given a fair share of appearances to increase his tally at Celtic Park with Van Hooydonk and Di Canio leading the front line) however, McMahon saw potential in Hay and already with 13 goals this season he's repaying the manager's faith.


Another shrewd display of management was the on-loan signing of Chris Casper from Manchester United. Another one of Alex Ferguson's home grown young talents he has been a real asset and played a key role in the position the Club now find themselves.

Steve McMahon was certainly a winner as a player, a leader and one of soccers hardmen. He's still a leader, he can be a winner - but dare suggest that he manages a physical team of hardmen and quite rightly he becomes incensed. When you watch Swindon play the perception is that McMahon wants his team to play in an entertaining manner and he's put together a creative side which can this season challenge for promotion to the Premier League. Barnsley were the surprise package last year and Swindon can emulate them...

It couldn't be tighter at the top could it? Nottingham Forest, Swindon Town and West Bromwich Albion, all neck and neck on 34 points, all with 10 wins each and four draws; and Forest edging us by one single goal.


Then, three points behind come Middlesbrough, 3-1 winners at Norwich City last Saturday extending their record to just one defeat in their last nine games that reverse coming at Wolves 1-0. No wonder then we are staging the match of the day in Division One this afternoon. It should be a thriller as we defend our unbeaten home record against the team with the best away statistics with four wins three draws and just one defeat and 15 goals in the onion bag.

There is another top game at Nottingham where Forest entertain the overall highest scoring team in the Division, Charlton Athletic. But Dave Bassett's boys are no slouches at home, former Arsenal striker Kevin Campbell netting their 18th home League goal to beat Birmingham City last Saturday.

If you take the trend of the stats then this should be a high scoring game for the Vallants have netted 15 goals on their travels yet conceded 10, I still think Forest will win 1-0.

West Brom don't play until tomorrow when they take on Birmingham City in the big Midlands derby. Now common sense and logic tells you the Throstles should win. Everything seems to be in their favour. Six wins, one draw and one loss are their home returns and with hitman Andy Hunt in form - he scored his 10th goal to spark a winning comeback at Port Vale and Richard Sneekes tirelessly prompting in midfield, they are truly on song and chirping even happier now that manager Ray

Harford has allayed fears that he was going back to a Premiership club. The contrast at St Andrews' couldn't be greater. Manager Trevor Francis is really under pressure following the defeat at Forest which leaves them reflecting on a run that has brought just one win in 13 games; and luck just does not seem to be smiling on Birmingham. Substitute Michael Johnson thought he had equalised when he thumped in a late volley - it would have been the fullback's first ever goal in almost 200 games. But referee



Paul Danson ruled it out for a push by Furlong...Francis has now brought in former West Ham, Everton and England, striker Tony Cottee on loan from Leicester City to kick start the Blues' season and you know what? I think he might just do that at the Hawthorns.

Sheffield United have a tough assignment at Port Vale. The Blades were in action at Bradford in the only midweek fixture in Division One after being held 1-1 at home by struggling Manchester City, when by all accounts they displayed a touch of arrogant complacency after Brian Deane had shot them in front with his seventh goal of the season. Boss Nigel Spackman was not pleased and Vale could be on the wrong end of his reaction.

As for *Manchester City*, it was a super show by that little genius Georgi Kinkladze that helped ease the pain of a torturous season. There have been whispers that Joe Royle is lined up to replace manager

Frank Clark at Maine Road after City slumped to third from bottom - the lowest position in their history - and indeed our own maestro, Steve McMahon, has also been put in the frame by the northern press.

But a win over **Bradford City** at Maine Road this afternoon could blow the storm clouds away. Frank Clark is a good man and deserves a bit of luck.

As for City, are they slipping? Beaten here in our last home game, then losing 1-0 at home to *Tranmere Rovers*, with new striker John McGinlay still goaless. Although he sorted it against the Blades on Tuesday.

One new boy who did make good was David Johnson. Ipswich paid Bury £1 million for the striker, given a free by *Man United* two years ago.

He scored at Wolves and it could have been worse for lpswich missed a penalty. The Suffolk club are away again today, at Reading, but Wolves' game at Portsmouth is off as half the Pompey team are on World Cup duty with Austrailia. This gives Huddersfield the opportunity to claw themselves off the bottom rung of the First Division ladder. A draw at QPR would suffice and they could do even better. Three scalps from the last four games have the Terriers believing in themselves again. Meanwhile John Hollins is in the driving seat at the managerless Rangers. Niall Quinn led the rout of Pompey as Sunderland came from behind to win 4-1. They will find it tougher at Bury and will settle for a point. Finally, Chic Bates, one time assistant to Lou Macari here at the County Ground, is settling down as number one at Stoke and said last Saturday that he expected to be "doing a bit of business this week." Whoever it is will make his bow at Tranmere where teenage goalkeeper Steve Simonsen is expected to play after an ice

Close-up Brian Borrows

At the tender age of 13 two young schoolboys by the names of Steve McMahon and Brian Borrows were learning their trade at Everton.

They then moved in different directions but over 20 years later they have teamed up once again and Brian Borrows is delighted to be working once more with the Gaffer having signed an 18 month contract at the County Ground last week.

"We were together as schoolboys and young pro's at Everton before we went our separate ways. Steve went to join Aston Villa and I left to go to Bolton so it is good to meet up again after all these years" he said "I always watched Steve's career closely and having known him from such a young age he always had great desire, a will to win and his determination was second to none and that has never changed. The thing that comes through more than anything is his will to win and that's why he is doing such a good job here at Swindon.'

Brian was understandably pleased to team up with Steve by making his move from Coventry City permanent having had a successful two month loan spell.

"The two month loan spell went really well and now I'm looking forward to playing first team football for Swindon," he said.

"To be perfectly honest the main reason for joining Swindon in the first place was to get regular first team football because I had been at Coventry for over 12 years and I knew my chances there were going to be limited.

"I have really enjoyed being back in the thick of the action again so I had no hesitation in making the move permanent." he added.

Brian's wealth of experience has been in evidence at the heart of the Town defence where his reading of the game and perfect positioning has won over the hearts of the County Ground faithful.

And the 34 year old is hoping he can play his part in keeping Swindon up among the top teams in the Nationwide First Division.

"There is a long way to go yet but it is nice to be playing week in and week out and actually winning games - there's nothing better and long may it continue." he commented.

After joining Everton as a 13 year old, Brian left in 1983 to join Bolton Wanderers. In 1985 he moved on to Coventry City and during the next 12 years he made well over 400 appearances for the Sky Blues.

Brian's consistent displays at the back were rewarded with an England B cap and that, along with reaching the FA Cup final with City in 1987 were just some of the highlights.

Yet Brian didn't actually play in the Wembley final against Spurs which was one of the low points in his career.

"I played in every game to help Coventry reach the Cup Final but unfortunately I missed the final through injury after




