

This afternoon we welcome the players, supporters and staff of our near neighbours Oxford United Football Club to the County Ground.

We hope you all enjoy your trip to Wiltshire and that you have a safe journey home after the match. United come to Town today lying in 19th place in the First Division table, having last Saturday finally brought to an end a dismal run of seven games without a victory. A 2-0 triumph over Port Vale - accomplished thanks to goals from Nigel Jemson and former Swindon player Joey Beauchamp - was their first three-pointer since a narrow 1-0 victory over Ipswich back in mid-October.


But for a club battling with big debts - the U's are reported to be around £10 million in the red - and little money to pay them, a hiccup in League form could be seen as the least of their worries. United's recent Coca-Cola Cup Fourth Round defeat at the hands of Ipswich has already cut off one potential for a money-spinning season, and manager Denis Smith was recently put in the position of having to make his entire squad available for sale to help balance the books.

"If a good offer comes in for a player at this club, we are not in a position to turn it down," Smith has been quoted as saying. "The future of the club is our priority but we aren't panicking and everyone is working hard to ensure we can carry on." In addition, Oxford were set to move to a 15,000seater new stadium at the start of this season but funds appear to have dried up and only the external structure had been erected before work came to a sudden halt in January 1997.

Despite all the uncertainty, and

the fact that their only significant summer outlay was £170,000 spent on ex-England U21 defender Phil Whelan from Middlesbrough - who promptly broke his leg - Oxford kicked-off 1997/98 with a morale-boosting 2-0 victory over Huddersfield.

Unfortunately, the U's followed that with four straight defeats before steadying the ship thanks to a resounding 3-0 win over, of all clubs, mighty Wolves. It is encouraging to see that, even with their well documented problems, United could still turn the tables on a club dripping with cash. Since then, though, the celebrations have been sporadic. Just three more wins v West Brom, Ipswich and Port Vale - have left Denis Smith's side looking worriedly over their shoulders at the relegation places. Perhaps not as worriedly, though, as their supporters may be thinking of what the future may hold.

Denis Smith the manager

Born in Stoke in 1947, Denis Smith was a tough, no-nonsense central defender who was the linchpin of his hometown side for many years.

He played more the 450 games for the Potters and helped them to the League Cup in 1972 and also to promotion to the top flight in 1978/79.


He had a brief loan spell at York City in 1982 and was subsequently appointed player/manager there for 1982/83 - his current assistant at the Manor Ground, Malcolm Crosby, was a player under Smith at Bootham Crescent.

In his first season in the York hot-seat the Club finished seventh, but by the end of the following campaign they had won the old Fourth Division Championship with a then record 101 points (superseded, of course, by Swindon's 102 points two years later).

Sunderland paid York £20,000 in compensation when Smith moved to Roker Park in June 1987 and he was the man who led the Wearsiders back from the dead with two promotions, from the old Third Division to the First, before being replaced by Crosby in December 1991 following a poor run of results, culminating, ironically enough, in a 3-0 defeat at Oxford.

After a brief spell at Bristol City he moved to the Manor Ground in September 1993, following the departure of Brian Horton. Relegation followed in his first season with Oxford, but 1995/96 saw the Club regain their First Division status after clinching the second automatic promotion spot.


Last season, despite operating on a shoestring budget, Smith kept his side in play-off contention for much of the campaign, before they eventually finished in 17th spot.


how goals conceded

Oxford's 10 year league and cup record





Looking back Books back

5 YEARS AGO

Not defending well and being too anxious to go forward after falling behind were the criticisms that Glenn Hoddle made of his Swindon team after they went down 4-2 at home to Derby County giving the Rams their sixth successive away win.

Tommy Johnson and Mark
Pembridge had put County two
up by half time. Martin Kuhl put
the visitors further ahead with a
left foot shot from 25 yards.
Micky Hazard pulled one back in
the 88th minute but Derby
substitute Ted McMinn made it
4-1 so that Craig Maskell's 18th

goal of the season did not effect the result. First Division Oxford were without a game so had time to ponder their 1-0 defeat at Brentford. It turned out to be a mediocre season for the U's with John Durnin and Jimmy Magilton (eleven goals apiece) their joint top scorers.

JO YEARS AGO

Swindon went down 2-1 at Aston Villa with all the goals coming in a five minute spell early in the second half. Kevin Gage scored two headers for Villa, the second following a Mark Walters free kick. Jimmy Quinn reduced the arrears a minute later after Dave Bamber was bundled over in the box but their were no further goals. Among the scorers for Swindon Youth was Fitzroy Simpson one of the heros of Jamaica's recent World Cup victory. A penalty by Dean Saunders couldn't stop Oxford slipping to a 3-1 home defeat at the hands of Newcastle United. Normally a difficult team to beat at the

Manor it was one of eight home defeats in a season which saw Oxford finish bottom of the old First Division with just 31 points. Robert Maxwell agreed to dispose of his family holdings in United to free the way for him to take over from Elton John at Watford. Former Town manager Dave Mackay took over as manager of Doncaster.


15 YEARS AGO

Cecil Green announced the Board was intending to increase its size to 12 and that Nick Arkell of Arkell's Brewery would be standing for election. Paul Rideout's penalty was enough to give Town a home win over Peterborough to lift them into third place in the Fourth Division table. England Youth International, Peter Foley (now with Port Vale) scored twice as United defeated Orient 5-1 in front of a disappointing crowd of just 2,242. Swansea in the old First Division also had a poor crowd with 9,556 turning up to see them beat Luton 2-0. George Graham took over as manger of Millwall.

FLASH-BACK

Local derbies can be tight affairs with just one goal enough to earn the points. When Swindon met Oxford at Manor Ground on March 7th 1992 though, it turned out to be an eight goal thriller. Swindon had a flying start with Shaun Close putting them in front after just 33 seconds. Just forty minutes later though the game had swung round completely with a shot from John Durnin, a penalty from Jim Magilton and a mazy run finished with a left foot shot putting United in a commanding position . Oxford's joy was dented when Dave Mitchell slid home Dave Kerslake's cross. Hopes of a

Swindon revival were short lived however for early in the second half Chris Allen out-paced Nicky Summerbee and set up John Durnin who scored his second goal of the game. After 64 minutes Joey Beauchamp got through the Swindon defence to score the home side's fifth goal. Even Colin Calderwood seemed unable to stop the flood of goals and at this point Argentinian international Nestor Lorenzo was sent on to replace Summerbee. Mitchell netted a half cleared corner with a fine volley but Swindon failed to reduce the arrears further. Dick Tugwell in the Oxford Times described it as United's "finest hour for some time" while Town fans still smarting from the sale of Fitroy Simpson to Man City must have thought it the worst.

December 2nd




December 3rd



Swindon slumped to their third successive defeat after a dismal display at the Valley to leave manager Steve McMahon bitterly disappointed.




The final stage of the course is a three hour emergency injury course to be run by our very own physio Jonathan Trigg. It will be held here at the County Ground on a date to be arranged.

So England did not make the top eight in the seeding for next summer's World Cup Finals in France.

We missed out because of a combination of archaic and almost unfathomable criteria by which FIFA deliberate their rankings.

France and Brazil, as the host nation and the holders were automatic seedings leaving six places to be filled. The fact that England's recent form has lifted them from the 12th position they occupied in the FIFA/Coca Cola World Rankings at the end of 1996 to sixth position, suggested logically we were in with a shout.

But FIFA have always based their World Cup listings on the results of the previous three tournaments, thus the form guide has been influenced by results spanning 12 years. How ludicrous. How can what transpired a dozen years ago be related to the current form?

Bring it down to club level. I bet you will struggle to name the Swindon Team that were in our colours in the first December fixture of 1985. Let's face it, none of those players are on duty today. And the manager is different too. Do you recall who was in charge then? It was Lou Macari. Of course. But in all honesty what baring does that all have on today's team? None at all.

Glenn Hoddle expected this outcome but made a salient point before the FIFA committee announced their final ruling. The *England* coach

said: "If World rankings are to mean anything they've got to be used for something".

Inside the inner sanctum they have obviously taken note of the rumblings outside. Joseph Blatter, the General Secretary of FIFA, advised that the seedings had been calculated on the basis of 60 per cent of past World Cup results and 40 per cent of the present world

rankings.

How on earth did they arrive at that? They must have played around with an abacus. The whole thing is a total farce and one can only assume that they if they did take into account current form - and how the devil can you check it out - then it is only to appease those who have challenged the current outmoded system.

Glenn, forever the diplomat, pointed out: "Seeding isn't the advantage it used to be when you played all three group games in the same place."

How true and did you know I think in the long run it could work to our advantage. Being the top seed in the group does put you under pressure. With two teams to qualify from the initial rounds we should be okay.

I suppose we have to be grateful that the rumour circulating Marseilles that an African nation would be seeded proved unfounded. At the time it seemed plausible, given the fact that Joao Havalange secured his office on the back of his promises to the third world nations of international soccer.

One important decision that everyone applauded was the one which wiped the yellow card slate clean. In other words those players who had already accumulated bookings in the qualifying rounds would not carry the burden into the Finals. Both individually and collectively the record was expunged and everyone starts with a clean sheet.

No doubt every nation has benefited from this and in England's case it means that central defender Sol Campbell, who was on two yellow cards, will be available for our opening tie. Likewise John Collins, whose experience with Monaco will be invaluable to Craig Brown, has benefited from the amnesty and will be okay to represent Scotland.

'World Cup 98' is also guaranteed to be a rewarding event financially for the competing nations with each country picking up 750,000 Swiss Francs immediately, just for qualifying and a million Swiss Francs for every game played in the Finals. Add to that 375 Swiss Francs each a day for 40 members of each delegation and you can see the likes of Jamaica and Iran are going to have a bit of pocket money to throw around this summer.

It's going to be tough for England, Scotland, and the rest, but then that's how it should be in the World Cup Finals.

It's derby day here this afternoon as we prepare to take on an Oxford United side that has lost seven of its 10 away fixtures in Division One.

Not that statistics count for much on these occasions as we well know. The U's welcomed back goalkeeper Phil Whitehead, midfielder David Smith and Joey Beauchamp against *Port Vale* and our former winger scored one and made one in a 2-0 victory that hoisted them out of the bottom three. It will be up to our lads to snuff out his ambitions this afternoon.

We have lost ground in the championship chase for having lost at Charlton - Nottingham Forest, Middlesbrough and Sheffield United all won last weekend. Forest are home to Bradford City today and on paper should be good enough to chalk up a 9th home win against Chris Kamara's boys. The Yorkshire side were somewhat fortunate to beat Norwich City 2-1 - their first win in seven games; out-of-favour Swede Robert Steiner, who unexpectedly replaced Brazilian Edinho after being dropped from the starting line in the five previous games, was the hero with both goals.

Bradford are also cheering the signing of goalkeeper Gary Walsh. Before his arrival from Middlesbrough they had conceded 16 goals in 10 games. Walsh has been beaten only six times in 12 consecutive appearances. He could be good enough to win them a point.

Middlesbrough knocked West Brom off the second perch with a tight 1-0 victory. They were away at *Ipswich* in mid-week where they drew 1-1. Bury away is no forgone conclusion. There is a familiar name in the Bury pack, that of Dalglish; Paul Dalglish to be precise, the son of Kenny and currently on loan to the Shakers. But Boro, unbeaten in seven league and cup games six of which they had won - at the start of this week, should be good for all three points.

Interesting developments at Bramell Lane saw Mitch Ward and Carl Tiler move to Goodison Park with Graham Stuart moving the opposite way in exchange plus £500,000. So the Blades inherited a forward for a defender and a midfield man but it was Town's former hero Jan Aage Fjortoft who grabbed the headlines with his ninth goal of the season - and the winner



against Crewe. Today they are at Norwich which has been a very happy hunting ground for visiting sides. The Canaries have lost four and drawn three of their 10 home games so far and still have to get into double figures in the goals for a column while the 16 they have conceded at Carrow Road is by far the worst record of the top 17 clubs. Logic says a United victory but this is football and Norwich are not as bad as their record suggests. The West Brom V Stockport game is an interesting one. Personally I don't appreciate Albion's cautious tactics of hanging on to what they have a got. Just one striker up front at home seems a negative ploy but it is successful as their position and the 1-0 victory over a Birmingham City side that outplayed them confirms. They have only conceded four goals at the Hawthorns and another 1-0 win looks on the cards. Huddersfield Town hauled themselves off the bottom with a 2-0 win over Bury. Wayne Allison had a good game but Paul Dalton scored

both goals to take his tally to six in his last 10 games. It confirmed the marked improvement since Peter Jackson and Terry Yorath took charge of the Terriers who will be expecting at least a point at Crewe. The Railwaymen have been off track despite their sweet passing football - seven defeats in the last eight games now. Another side off the rails is Manchester City. Beaten again at Stockport where they were three down in 30-minutes and fourth from bottom with just four wins in 19 starts. They entertain a Wolves side who have also underachieved though not so startlingly poorly. Wolves are 12 points adrift of the leaders and probable play-off qualifiers. This is a battle between two big and powerful football institutions and if confidence is the factor it looks like another horror show for City's nervous side.

Sunderland turned Tranmere over 3-0 but expect Rovers to bounce back against Ipswich today. OPR (home to Sunderland), a little unfortunate at Molineux, are a changed side since Johnny Hollins took charge and are due a win.

Birmingham City got their first win in 10 games last Saturday 2-0 against Portsmouth. The Blues had been frustrated by their own inability to turn good performances into wins but is this the turning point? We shall get a better picture after today's trip to Port Vale.

As for Pompey, they are truly suffering. This defeat left them three points adrift at the bottom. Former Town midfielder Fitzroy Simpson said: "We are a good footballing side but we have to make ourselves more resilient." Stoke City provide the test today. Finally, the Reading v Charlton game suggests a few goals.

The Valiants have netted 17 on their travels - while Trevor Morley is back to his blistering best for the Royals.

It took new striker
George Ndah just 14 minutes to make his mark for Swindon as he gave Town the lead with a superb strike against Middlesbrough.

Unfortunately it wasn't to be a winning debut for 22 year old marksman but the Dulwich born front runner showed immediately why Steve McMahon was quick to pounce on the former Crystal Palace player and bring him to the County Ground in a £500.000 deal.

His skill on the ball and blistering pace make him a real eye catcher out on the pitch and there is no doubt that he will prove to be a more than adequate replacement for the Chief Wayne Allison.

His introduction was another bit of good business by manager Steve McMahon and George is now keen to relight a career which had been somewhat blown out at Palace.

"The problem at Crystal Palace was that they had money to buy in a lot of players. With me coming through the youth system it seemed that much more difficult to hold down a regular first team place.

"I was getting a few games here and there but never a good long run in the side and it got to the stage where the Club was buying so many centre forwards my future was looking very bleak. So when Swindon came in for me I was just glad to be able to accept the opportunity of coming here."

But George admitted that it did come as something of a surprise.

"One minute I was a Palace player, the next I had spoken to Rikki Hunt and Steve McMahon and I was suddenly on my way to Swindon.

"It was all very sudden but after speaking to Rikki and Steve I can see that Swindon are going places. The Club is very ambitious and I want to be part of their future plans."


After six years as a professional at Selhurst Park it was quite a shock moving to a new club but George didn't take long to settle in and made a dramatic start.

"It was a big game for me to start with against Middlesbrough and that is often the best way to start by being thrown in at the deep end. It was great to score on my debut but sometimes goals don't mean anything at the end of the 90 minutes and I would definitely have traded that goal for three points." he said.

At Charlton last Friday, George hardly got a sniff of goal as Swindon struggled in all areas of the pitch but he and the rest of the team are keen to put things right.

"We didn't play the sort of football we know we are capable of and after three defeats in a row we need to get a win under our belts. One win and we'll be right back up there and we need to bounce back against Oxford.


