



Our aim is to grab a late Christmas present with a home win but it won't be easy against George Burley's side who had a rough start to the season mainly due to injuries. They are now picking up a bit and I'm sure they will continue to climb the table, although today of course we'll be doing our best to send them home with nothing.

Lack of form

With this being our final game of the year, it seems appropriate to take a look back over the last 12 months and see how far we have progressed. We struggled badly at the end of last season, this after being outsiders for a play-off place just after Christmas. There was a lack of form, too many players were out suspended, and basically we lost it at the back

win and one draw in our last 10 matches but I'm sure we won't let that happen again this season. Inconsistency was our main problem at the tail end of last season although the catalogue of injuries and suspensions certainly didn't help.

Encouraging signs

During the Summer we increased the size of the squad, brought in some fresh faces and put the disappointments of the previous campaign behind us by

starting this term in fine fettle.

We've slipped a bit of late but we've shown encouraging signs. The performance against Middlesbrough was good although we lost 2-1 and the same was the case at Sheffield United where we were unfortunate to go down.

What we must do is start turning those close defeats into draws and our draws into wins and if we can do that then I think we have still got a chance of making the play-offs.

Looking at the new players we've brought in, all of them have settled in well. Alan McDonald and Craig Taylor have been strong at the back, Philippe Cuervo was magnificent until he picked up that injury, George Ndah is going to be a real star and Chris Hay is in a different class in terms of goalscoring.

And don't forget Brian Borrows - who has been doing the right things for over 15 years and he is now doing the same for us. Brian is a great asset to the team.

#### **Hard** work needed

Looking ahead to 1998, all I want is for everyone to continue putting in the hard work and dedication to the cause and by doing that I'm sure we will be in the play-offs.

It will be a big disappointment if we don't make it to the top six, particularly after our flying start. The players deserve it for the amount of effort they have already put in this season.

Finally, a big thank you to our fans who deserve a lot of credit. To be honest I was bitterly disappointed when only 7,000 turned up for the game against Tranmere - even though we were second in the table at the time. Since then it has steadily picked up with the help of everyone at the Club and if we can continue to bring in more fans, who knows, we might have a few more quid in the kitty and be able to bring in more players!

# I PSWICH TOWN

This afternoon we welcome the players, supporters and staff of Ipswich Town Football Club to the County Ground.

We hope you all enjoy your trip to Wiltshire and that you have a safe journey home after the match. The Christmas period is a time of good cheer, and lpswich fans will be hoping that is as true in 1997/98 as it was last season. In 1996/97, Town had made a stuttering start to the League campaign before beginning a tremendous run in December which saw them defeated just four times in 25 games and eventually carried the Portman Road club to fourth place in the First Division table and a Play-Off Semi-Final with Sheffield United. This year, riddled with injuries, Ipswich have again struggled to make headway in the early stages, although a recent 4-0 thrashing of Reading served notice of their intentions. At one stage,

manager George Burley had as many as 16 first-team squad members unavailable, and he has already called on the services of two loan players -Mark Stein (Chelsea) and Andy Legg (Birmingham) - as well as Jason Dozzell and David Whyte, who were both on short-term contracts and have now been released. Like most clubs in this country outside the Premiership, Ipswich are by necessity an outfit that relies heavily on its youth policy. While the likes of Steve Sedgley (Wolves), Craig Forrest (West Ham) and Tony Vaughan (Man City) have had to be sold to help balance the books, several promising youngsters have emerged from the Youth ranks to take their places. Remarkably for a lower division club, Town boasted four players in the most recent England U21 squad, with three of those - James Scowcroft, Richard Wright and Kieron Dyer - being 'home grown'. The fourth, David Johnson, was the


club's record signing, at £1 million from Bury in November.

The pick of the bunch are probably Wright - tipped as a future England international and already called-up for training with the Full national squad - and Dyer, who was reportedly a £4 million subject of interest from Arsenal recently.

There is the nucleus of an excellent young side emerging at Portman Road, to carry on the traditions of the late 1970 and early 1980s when, under the aegis of Bobby Robson, a largely home-grown Town were one of the country's leading sides.

The last time Ipswich came to the County Ground they won 4-0, although three of the scorers that afternoon are no longer with the club. Chris Swailes, Steve Sedgley and Niklas Gudmundsson have all moved on, and only the veteran Mick Stockwell remains.

Steve McMahon's high-flying Robins will be anxious to avenge that defeat today.



### George Burley the manager

George Burley was born in Cumnock, Ayrshire on June 3, 1956.

He joined Ipswich as an apprentice in 1972 and made his senior debut the following year against Manchester United at Old Trafford, marking a player called George Best.

He was an integral part of the Town side that became a force in the game in the late 1970s and early 80s, tasting FA Cup glory in 1978 and also playing a part in the run to UEFA Cup glory in 1981, although he missed the Final.

George made 500 senior appearances for the club as well as picking up 11 caps for Scotland at Full level.

In 1985, he headed North to Sunderland, a move that started a mini-tour of Britain for the leftback. He moved south again for a brief spell at Gillingham, then packed his bags for Motherwell in 1989.

In 1990 he was appointed player-manager of Ayr Utd, three years later he moved to Falkirk as a player and then returned to Motherwell as player-coach.

He hardly had time to settle, though, and 12

months later he was on his way across the border again - this time to Colchester, where he was appointed player-manager in June 1994.

A fine start at Layer Road soon brought him to the attention of Town and he resigned at Colchester on December 24th 1994 before being appointed Ipswich boss four days later.

The full circle was complete and now Burley looks set to remain in charge until at least the year 2000, having signed a new three-year contract in the summer of 1996.

He has built an attractive, attacking team at Portman Road that topped the divisional goalcharts in the 1995/96 season, missing out on the Play-Offs by one point.

Town went even closer last season, only to be cruelly denied a place in the Wembley Final on away goals after drawing with Sheffield United home and away at the Semi-Final stage.






#### how goals went in




#### how goals conceded





FLASH-BACK

F.A. Cup Third Round day in 1965 gave Swindon the chance to forget the struggle against relegation. Ipswich Town who had never won a Cup tie at the County Ground were the visitors and Swindon took hope from the fact that they had already defeated Ipswich in the previous October's League fixture. The first half was one way traffic with the Swindon forwards piling on the pressure. Ernie Hunt, Mike Summerbee and Don Rogers all went close but were

What a side! One of these is the answer to a trivia question that I will sign off with:



# January

#### One minute into the first game of 1997 and you get sent off.

The new year didn't get off to the best of starts for lan Culverhouse when he created a piece of unwanted history by being sent off 52 seconds into the game at Everton, making it the fastest red card in the FA Cup. To make matters worse Swindon went on to lose the game 3-0.

> In the League Swindon were having an indifferent season sitting in 13th place. Consistent home wins were being let down by poor away performances.

> > January was the month that saw Keegan resign from Newcastle but Town boss Steve McMahon was making headlines of his own by putting some of his players up for sale. Peter Thorne, Wayne O' Sullivan, Kevin Horlock and Frank Talia were all put on the transfer list. And so Swindon went to face Tranmere Rovers at an icy Prenton Park in an attempt to regain away form. But it was the home team that took the advantage with two goals from

Pat Nevin. Kevin Horlock threw Town a life line with a 64th minute goal but after that the Town never looked like scoring: Tranmere 2 Swindon 1. On the back of this result Swindon needed a morale boosting win but could only manage a 1-1 home draw against Chris Kamara's Bradford City.


Steve McMahon brought in Blackburn Rovers' Marlon Broomes on a month's loan. The 19-year old former England Youth International was signed to bolster a defence that was severely hit by suspensions and injury. Defender David Kerslake was also brought in on loan from Spurs.

> This latest recruit wasn't enough. Swindon could only manage a 3-3 draw with bottom of the table Grimsby Town, with goals from Horlock, Wayne Allison and Mark Walters. Next came the trip to Molineux to face Wolverhampton Wanderers. Even a string of brilliant saves from Fraser Digby couldn't stop the run of poor results

> > 0. At the end of the month were now lying in 16th position in the league.

Some people were to mention relegation.





## March

There was little time to reflect on the season so far as Swindon had to pack in seven games in March.

Things started well with good wins against Charlton Athletic(1-0) and a useful draw against title-chasers Barnsley (1-1). These results moved the Club up to 12th in the league.

But with these games barely over it was clear **Steve McMahon** would be forced to reshuffle his pack after his squad was hit by suspensions and injuries. This was hardly the sort of news the Gaffer wanted as he prepared to travel to top-of-the-table. Bolton Wanderes.

The gap between mid-table and those at the top was telling, Bolton thumped Swindon 7-0. After the game *Steve McMahon* was left to remark:

"It was men against boys out there and I've got to get a few more men".

Swindon emphasised their inconsistency by returning to the County Ground to beat Stoke City 1-0 and then losing away to Port Vale (1-0). With nine games remaining in the

96/97 campaign there seemed to be little to play for as the Town floated mid-table. Off the pitch former champion jockey *Willie Carson* joined Swindon Town as a Non-Executive Director, riding into his first press conference on *Steve McMahon's* back. But even *Willie Carson's* bubbly personality couldn't raise a smile at the

County Ground as Swindon suffered another defeat at the hands of Norwich (3-0), before going down 5-1 at Oldham.





As one player came in, so another left, as Wayne O' Sullivan joined Second Division German team the Stuttgart Kickers on a month's trial- only to return one day later after playing in a 15 minute practice game.

More excitement was generated around the Club when rumours were abound that Swindon were trying to sign lan Rush, Peter Beardsley and John Barnes in an attempt to get crowds flocking to watch the Town.

# September @

There was a mixed bag of results during September with Town starting the month on a downer as they suffered their first league defeat of the season with a 2-1 reverse at Ipswich Town.

The death of Diana Princess of Wales meant a sombre pre-match atmosphere prior to the visit of promotion favourites Nottingham Forest but both teams showed their professionalism as they put that tragedy to the back of their minds and thrilled the 14,000 fans with an entertaining spectacle.

Swindon were pleased with the 0-0 draw and rightfully so, as they had matched Forest in every department.

Manager Steve McMahon was bitterly disappointed with the crowd of just 7,000 for the next home game as second placed Town overcame Tranmere 2-1 thanks to goals by Mark Walters and loan signing Chris Casper from Manchester United.

Another player on loan was the experienced *Brian Borrows* from Coventry with the Gaffer bringing both in to ease a defensive injury crisis which had seen the loss of skipper *Mark Seagraves*, *Mark Robinson*, *Ian Culverhouse* and *Craig Taylor*.

Swindon's battling qualities were again in evidence as they returned from West Brom with a point following a

0-0 draw but disaster struck in Town's next trip with the team being hammered 6-0 at Manchester City.

But there was hope for the future with youngster *Robin Hulbert*, an England Youth International, signing a three and half year contract at the County Ground.





#### Novembe Remember, Remember the 5th of November! Well Town fans won't forget Bonfire Night in a hurry as there were some fireworks both before and during the home game against Queens Park Rangers. Before the game there were some strong words from Town officials towards the Football League who would not give them the go-ahead to play loan keeper Tony Warner because he had not been signed in time. With all three of Town's recognised shot-stoppers on the treatment table, it looked as if the Club would have to put an outfield player between the posts until Fraser Digby answered the emergency call and played with a pain killing injection. Digby was inspirational as Town stormed to a 3-1 victory with goals from Mark Walters, Craig Taylor and Chris Hay. This proved to be the "Chief" Wayne Allison's last game in a red shirt as he joined Huddersfield in an £800,000 deal. His replacement up front for the visit of Bradford was Steve Cowe and he scored a terrific winner in a 1-0 win which kept Town on top of the table. With Steve Finney back from a loan spell at Cambridge, the battle for positions up front was hotting up, while at the back the permanent signing of Brian Borrows kept competition for places on the boil. However Town were knocked

Although Oxford drew first blood with an early goal. By half time Swindon were back in control and two second half strikes sent the Town fans home happy.






Bury are another team who have done well over the year but of course they were in a lower division last season as were Crewe.

# chairman's EKKHURES EKKHURE

It has been a very interesting year because it has been one of a lot of change at the Club.

Not change in personnel in particular, but more in the structure of the Club and the way we work.

Since I took over as Chairman we have had much to do in terms of getting the Club to run a different way than in the past.

That is having Steve Jones and Steve McMahon as the drivers for what's going on in the Club day to day, with the Directors taking a more consultative role.

This has been the biggest change that has gone on locally at the Club but clearly there have been lots of things going on in football during that period and here we are at the crossroads of the Football League with some of the biggest decisions in the history of football to be made in the next couple of months, with talk of a Football League "Super League" and six or seven divisions of different sizes.

With all this going on it has turned out to be a far busier vear as Chairman than I expected but I've enjoyed every minute of it. As far as we are concerned it has been a great year on the pitch and I couldn't have wished for a better start. I think if we had been at the bottom there would have been calls of "sack the Chairman" but we've had a fantastic start with Steve Jones and his team doing marvellously behind the scenes and what's gone on on the pitch is just a reflection of that.

To be up there at number one

or two makes me very proud as Chairman of the Club. It makes you proud as a fan and proud as a Director, but as Chairman there is something special about that and people talk to you a lot more about it.

I can't go anywhere in the town without somebody commenting to me about Swindon Town and certainly sitting up at the top of the league has raised our profile, as we saw when the national press were down here in force doing features and interviews.

It's a far cry from the end of last season when we had that miserable run but even at that stage, we knew it wasn't terminal. We knew we needed players, we said we were going to strengthen the squad with more players and we've changed some along the way aswell. As yet we haven't quite got the number we want as far as the size of the squad is concerned, but that is balanced by the fact that what we have brought in has been real quality.

George Ndah is a class act and Chris Hay is a player people will be talking about forever at Swindon I think. But there have been other players coming in that have done great jobs for us, including some of the youngsters like Robin Hulbert, Michael Pattimore and Sol Davis who have been thrown in at the deep end and done brilliantly.

We are always on the lookout for new faces. Steve has the view that you have to keep culling the team, changing maybe two or three a year and keeping things fresh, rather

than getting a good team and sitting with it forever because football doesn't allow you to do that anymore.

Clearly, more recently, we've spent a lot of time talking about promotion and we said at the beginning of the season that we expected to be in the play-offs. When you say that, you have got to expect if you are Swindon Town to win the play-offs. We've done it twice before and then you start to think about how we would cope in the Premier League this time and we've started planning for that from a playing perspective and a financial point.

Purchasing the freehold of the County Ground is a big part of our future plans and the response from the Council has been very positive and no matter what happens now, the Council are trying to look at the options for the Club and I feel quite encouraged by that.

I'm sure if anything happens it will do before the end of the season and if that is the case it would be a great way to end my first year because the freehold is vitally important to our long term security. We need that freehold if we are to push forward.

If we did get it it would be the single most important thing this Club has done in the last 10 or 15 years - there is no question about that.


