

another layer of cover behind it. Once you do this you start to become very hard to beat and will win the type of game we played last Saturday.

At the other end I thought George Ndah did well considering he was carrying a slight knock to the arm. I was particularly pleased with Iffy's performance. He held the ball up well and scored a good goal; he always looks like a threat to the opposition.

Something else I want to do is change the mentality a bit. We need to get the players more relaxed, whether defending or attacking. Any player will tell you that you play your best when you're not tense. This is the type of thing we're already working on in training and the lads response has been absolutely terrific.

Looking closer at our last game I wasn't too disheartened by what I saw. If we had defended better and

kept a clean sheet we would have won 2-0 so that is what we've got to work on. I'm a big believer in working hard at what you're not good at and sooner or later the penny drops and you get better at defending.

And it is not about individual players not doing their job but the whole side defending as a unit. I just feel there are too many gaps at the back.

What we must do is have covering players that anticipate any

One thing I can't fault is the spirit of the lads. They are all very relaxed, but are working hard and enjoying the sessions.

Tonight we face Huddersfield and I'd like to welcome the fans, officials and players of a club that is doing so well at the top of the League. I know their manager Peter Jackson from my Bradford days and Terry Yorath is a very experienced number two. They always produce a hard working side with a good balance of ball winners and flare players.

It will be a great game tonight. I'd rather be facing a good footballing side like Huddersfield rather than some team from the bottom that will just produce a scrappy game.

Finally, I'd like to thank you, the fans, once more for the welcome you've given me. It was a very emotional day last Saturday but now I can get on with the job of getting us back on track and we'll start with three points tonight.





Dave said he resigned for personal reasons and we suspected an ulterior motive. This proved to be the case when he accepted the job of manager of

It should be remembered though that no one man, be he player, manager, or, dare I say, even Chairman, is bigger than the Club. Tradition is a great force in football. The lads were back in training today.


We took them out to the County Ground extension and worked on crosses, defending and finishing. We kept the session quick and always changing to keep the players sharp and on their toes.


Friday 2nd


We do everything possible to ensure that we develop the players in terms of technique and ability but they still have to be prepared for the physical side.







They say that just before half time is the best time to score a goal. Well we took that to the extreme as we notched up two goals five minutes before the break.


Phillips, who had been causing the Town defence problems all afternoon, managed to steer a cross to McIntosh whose lob-header beat Swindon's keeper.

The main topic of conversation in football recently has been that of the position of team manager.

Obviously our minds have been focused on this very subject over the past few weeks and I would like to take this opportunity to formally welcome Jimmy Quinn to the Club. But what do you make of the role of a team manager? Football is unlike any other business I know. It can be the most fantastic industry to work in and it can be the worst. I am not going to dwell here on the bad elements that surrounded our own recent managerial change but it never ceases to amaze me how a manager can be a hero one moment and public enemy number one the next! Take Ray Harford. The WBA Chairman Tony Hale made extremely strong efforts to stop Ray from joining QPR, only to finally have to admit defeat. Ray was then welcomed to Loftus Road as the man who was going to take them back to The Premier League. Less than a season later, Ray resigns from QPR after a series of disappointing results and growing crowd dissatisfaction. Ray is one of the most respected figures in the game; he has enjoyed success at Wimbledon and Blackburn and was doing a great job at WBA. So

Francis, the man hounded out at Spurs to
make room for Christian Gross! Talking of
Spurs, David Pleat, a manager with an
excellent track record in the game, was
the victim of supporter-power at
Sheffield Wednesday, yet David is the

steadied the ship for George Graham's
take-over.


The George Graham episode raised several talking points about the job of manager. How can he go to Arsenal's main rivals? How can he walk away from his contract with Leeds? Where is his loyalty? On David Mellor's '606' show last weekend, Mr Mellor was going on about contracts not being worth much and that something must be done to stop managers from walking away from contracts in order to protect the clubs. I'm sorry, but this argument doesn't wash with me. As I understand it, the George Graham transfer, because that is what it was, was handled correctly by all parties concerned and has been accepted by the League Manager's Association. The fact that Leeds had George under contract meant that they were entitled to compensation but that's about all. Once a person wants to leave to go to another job there is no point in keeping them tied to a contract. Who

take off their rose-tinted glasses. David Mellor and some of his callers were calling for the football authorities to lay down some regulations which enforce contracts to be honoured, thereby ensuring that managers stay to finish the job that they were hired for. Okay, sounds good, but what would the QPR, Spurs, Sheffield Wednesday and, dare I say it. Swindon fans have felt about such a regulation being in place? The term "you can't have it both ways" springs to mind! Also, would the clubs really want such a regulation? Prior to joining Brighton, my very good friend Steve Gritt was out of work for 18 months after losing his job at Charlton. He became a hero in Sussex for saving the club from almost certain relegation to the then Vauxhall Conference and he was rewarded with a new contract. He was sacked just a few months into that contract!

The simple fact is that, for a variety of reasons, managers will succeed at some clubs and fail at others and, in my opinion, contracts should just be seen as financial safeguards for clubs should their manager wish to join another club. Loyalty is commendable and every employee, whichever business they are in, owes his employer his total commitment. However, personal ambition and job enhancement is something each and every one of us strive to maximise and football people are no different.

First there was Petit (ironically of Arsenal) then David Batty (Newcastle) at Blackburn in the final game of last season. Admittedly theirs was only a hands on action compared to Di Canio's thrustful shove but Football must be seen to deal with such offenders in a strict and forceful way.

Why our football should suddenly be afflicted in this way is not clear-out. There is a school of thought that suggests that if we fill our game with foreign players then we must expect to inherit some of their bad traits as well as the good.

But in a general climate of lowering moral standards, a climate in which a failed politician can go live on Radio Five every Saturday and encourage football folk to attack referees.

A climate in which athletes can cheat and come back into the sport after

taking performance enhancing drugs. A climate in which a
Formula One driver can get away with deliberately shunting an
opponent off the track to win the world championship: and in
which Presidents can do virtually anything they want and get
away with it, there is a chance for English

to restore some moral fibre to ociety.

Q. Firstly Jimmy, welcome back to Swindon Town. How do you feel about coming back to your old club?

A. Obviously I'm elated, it has always been an ambition of mine to come back to Swindon. My wife and family are all happy about it, and my father in law was in tears when I told him the news. At the same time I'm sad because I had a terrific time at Peterborough under Barry Fry.


Q. What are the first things you want to change as Swindon manager?

A. There are a number of things I need to do straight away. I need to get to know the players - I think we have a good squad and it is my job to get the best out of them. In addition, we have got to stop leaking goals. We need to tighten up the defence and make ourselves a bit more physical at the back.

Q. What do you think that you, as a manager, can bring to Swindon?

A. I think one of my strengths is my ability to man manage the players. I can spot a players strong points and weak points and can hopefully get the most out of them. I'm not a ranter and raver, but if players don't respond to the way I do things, then I'll pick someone else.

Q. How do you think the club has changed since you were here as a player?



A. I've watched the club take massive steps forward over the years. We now have two physio's, which means the players will be getting the best possible treatment. In addition, the youth set has advanced leaps and bounds with the Centre of Excellence. What never changes is the type of players the fans like to see at the County Ground. They want hard working players who will die for the club they play for. This is the type of spirit I want to generate here.

Q. But won't it be difficult to put together a side like that when there is no money to buy new players?

A. I'm aware that there isn't a great deal to spend, but I don't believe you needs a lot of money to build a good squad. We don't have the money of a Bolton or Sunderland, but that is where good management comes into the equation. There are plenty of good players out there that are cheap, or that you can get through the Bosman Ruling as free transfers. As joint manager of Reading I think we brought in around 16 players and four of those that I signed are still in the team. I paid £35,000 for Mark Booth the rightback while the rest were all free transfers, so I feel I have valuable experience in hunting for the right players at the right price.

O. Speaking of good players, is there a chance we might see you put your boots on for Swindon Town?

A. No. I think this move marks the end of my playing career. At Reading I learnt

very quickly that being a player/ manager was hard work. I don't want to make that mistake again - managing Swindon is a full-time job and I want to focus my time on that.

Q. Is there more of an emotional attachment to Swindon because it was your first club as a pro?

A. Definitely. I've lived in Swindon for years now and this has always been the dream job for me. In this game you always have a soft spot for the club you start with. Over the years I have always looked out for the Swindon result on a Saturday afternoon, but now I can actually do something about it. The only trouble is that all my family are massive Swindon fans so if I don't start getting the results they'll kill me!

Q. And finally, Jimmy, what are your ambitions for the future?

A. Over the years I've seen some great times at Swindon. Under Lou Macari we climbed up from the lower Divisions and when Glenn was here he guided the side to the Premiership, which was an amazing achievement. I want to do exactly the same now. I want to restore the atmosphere at the County Ground, pull the crowds in and get people singing. In the short term we need to bag some points and move up the table. In the long-term I want to take Swindon to the Premiership - and with the help of the supporters and players I believe we can do it.


