



We welcome today the directors, players, staff and supporters of Norwich City.

Currently residing just below the playoff region of the table, City are well
placed in the run up to Christmas in their
promotion push. Despite our recent
strong form at home, City are sure to be
stern opposition. The arrival of manager
Bruce Rioch has heralded a turnaround in
City's fortunes and has made a top six
spot a very realistic ambition. Rioch has
channelled his successful formula of
strong discipline and fluid football into a
rejuvenated Norwich squad, assisted
greatly by Director of Football and former
Swindon player Brian Hamilton.

Rioch and Hamilton have brought a tremendous knowledge and experience to Carrow Road since the summer. Both are highly-regarded figures in the game and have ensured Norwich is a respected team on their travels and at home. However, as last week's defeat at the hands of Oxford showed, they are far from invulnerable and, with Town's good track record at the County Ground, both sides will be confident of obtaining a result today. Our lowly position in Division One is largely the result of our away form

as we have won three and drawn one in our last four home games. During those matches we have notched up an impressive 11 goals; more pleasing to Jim Quinn will be the defence, which has shown signs of tightening up despite a spate of injuries and suspensions.

Town's rear-guard will have to be on top form this afternoon if they are to withstand the pressure from the likes of Craig Bellamy and Iwan Roberts, Craig made his debut in the first team last season and went on to become Norwich's top scorer (13). He has gone on to earn the call up to Wales' U21 squad and become a favourite with the Canaries' faithful. With one £1m bid already turned down, Norwich will be trying to hold on to the young striker, who looks sure to be the spearhead of their 1998/99 campaign, Iwan Roberts likewise is a precocious forward, the target man for many of City's moves and has already achieved 100 League goals.

Attempting to keep Norwich's strikeforce at bay, Jim Quinn has the remaining headache of injuries to Alan Reeves and David Kerslake, although Craig Taylor comes back into contention after suspension. George Ndah also misses out today after picking up five

yellow cards this season. On a brighter note, Scott Leitch and Darren Bullock are now fully fit and will join Kevin Watson in competing for midfield selection.



With Robin Hulbert and even YT Fraser McHugh making ever-stronger inroads, these positions look as if they will be increasingy competitive. One midfielder who looks certain to be waiting a while longer to return to first team action is Philippe Cuervo, who is currently undertaking what Assitant Manager Mike Walsh has termed a "mini pre-season". Philippe is joined by Phil King and lately Alan Reeves as part of Jim Quinn's focus on improving players' fitness. As Town today take on one of the fittest and most disciplined teams in the Nationwide League, we wish Philippe and his cohorts a speedy recovery into first team contention.

Jim Quinn gives his view...

Welcome to the County Ground for this tough encounter with Norwich City.

It will undoubtedly be a real test for the players but I'm sure they'll want to bounce back from last week's defeat.

I was bitterly disappointed for those fans that made the long journey to Grimsby. I only wish we could've got the result you wanted. We battled well in the second half but never really got going.

Perhaps I was a bit harsh on the players directly after the game. Looking back at the encounter we played some nice football and could have at least got a draw from it. Grimsby were there for the

beating, if we could've just raised our game a bit, kept the started passing it, we would've murdered them. It was the first 10 to 15 minutes that cost us. We seemed to take a long time to get going and then they got the free kick. Frank Talia saved it well but they followed in the rebound while we were still napping.

There were some stern words said during the break and in fairness to the players they came out for the second half with a lot more purpose. We knocked the ball about and started to get at Grimsby as the lads forced their keeper into making a couple of world class saves.

Overall, it was a very frustrating day as I watched us get beat by a side that were simply not as good as us. We had it in us to turn them over but we never got out of second gear.

By contrast I don't think I could have asked any more from the side that beat Crystal Palace 2-0. We defended well, attacked with confidence and created a number of chances. The script was

written for George Ndah when he came on as a sub against his old club. He came back from injury, played a full game out of position and scored a fine headed goal.

When you look at the teams we've played recently you can

see they have spent fortunes. We have not got the money so we have to go forward with what we've got. The lads have worked hard, they are enjoying what they are doing, and I think I am getting my message through to them.


We are a decent side with good players and when we're doing well the confidence of the lads is clear for all to see. We need to see that week in, week out. With our squad of players we should be up there with some of the better sides in the First Division. I'm not looking at the bottom of the League; I'm looking at the other end because that is where I want to get us.

This is where credit has to go to the players. It is all very well me putting them through the coaching sessions, but it is down to them to produce it on the park. To be fair, every player has done that and we look a more solid team.

Today's match is the perfect chance to show the rest of the League what we're capable of doing. Last week was a missed opportunity, now we can get the all-important result and climb the table.

Your support really lifts the players, so make plenty of noise and help Swindon go for the win.

Appointed to the manager's chair at Carrow Road in June 1998, Bruce Rioch has immediately set about instilling the discipline and good organisation for which he is well known into the Norwich players.

After a disappointing 1997/98 campaign, previous incumbent Mike Walker parted company with the Canaries for the second time, and it was to Rioch that the Norwich board turned in their attempt to bring the good times back to Norfolk.

One of Rioch's first moves - and one that could perhaps be considered a masterstroke - was to tempt the man-management skills of Bryan Hamilton across East Anglia from fierce rivals Ipswich Town to Carrow Road. The results - particularly an early season run of four wins in their opening five games - speak for themselves.

The son of a regimental Sergeant Major, Rioch was a powerful and graceful player with a highly-competitive streak running through him. Despite being born in Aldershot, he is a proud Scot and captained his country in their ill-fated 1978 World Cup campaign.

A midfielder, he turned out for Luton, Aston Villa, Derby County (twice), Everton, Birmingham City (loan), Sheffield United (loan) and Torquay United, as well as enjoying a brief spell on loan at the Seattle Sounders in the USA.

> Previous management experience has included Torquay United, Middlesbrough, Millwall, Bolton Wanderers and Arsenal and, prior to taking the reins at Carrow Road, he was assistant to current Ipswich coach Stewart Houston at Queens Park Rangers.

> > He has already endeared himself to the Norwich faithful by presiding over the club's 1-0 local derby victory over lpswich in mid-October - just a few short months after the Canaries were humbled 5-0 on the same ground.

Sadly, we let the Canaries back into the game, Mike Turner failed to hang on to a shot from Rob Davies and Tommy Bryceland followed up to score. Minutes later Davies himself scored and we found all our hard work of the first half undone. Most neutral observers would probably have agreed we deserved a point, especially as only a few minutes before Jim Oliver got a last minute winner for City, John Stevens beat the keeper only to see the ball stick in the mud on

Whilst most people and teams dread the hard, the goal line. frosty grounds we welcome them, so we shall have no fears about playing on what is likely to be a hard surface today. When the ground is hard it requires real skill to get the bouncing ball under control. Real ball players come out on top. It is ball players who can control a ball and pass accurately that I am always aiming to bring here to the County Ground.

Negotiations are continuing with the Swindon Corporation over the New Stand we intend to build on the North side of the ground. Given the fact that the Corporation own the site it means we have to pay for the building of the stand, but they will be entitled to collect an increased rent. This is likely to be in the region of £12,000 a year so we are anxious that we build a facility which will be appreciated by spectators and bring full benefit to the club. At present the Board feel that the designs of the architects need to be changed to provide more protection from the elements for spectators and to avoid having terracing below pitch level.

With the larger crowds produced by Second Division football many people are very sensibly arriving early to get a good vantage point. In order to entertain you while you are waiting for the match to start, a Record Request programme will be broadcast






First Team Latest

Our inconsistent pattern of results this season continued last week as we followed up an inspired victory against the much-fancied Crystal Palace with a disappointing loss away at Grimsby.

The recent improvement in first team performances made our 1-0 loss the more frustrating, and extended our unhappy run of matches away from home. In fact, the emerging sequence of results reveals a startling difference between our home and away fixtures. When Mark Walters sealed the points against Palace he also helped to chalk up our sixth home win of the season. with another three drawn and only two lost. On our away travels, however, we have managed just the one victory against two draws and a crushing nine defeats. This is just one of the mountains faced by manager Jim Quinn as he tries to lead Town up the table.

In spite of last Saturday's disappointing result there was also a few heartening aspects, not least the return to action of Scott Leitch. Scott came back as a second-half substitute and, as expected, put a strong case for his

reselection in today's starting line-up. Perhaps more noteworthy was the inclusion of Bobby Howe in the team and Frazer McHugh in the travelling party. Frazer received a last minute call-up after Darren Bullock pulled out through illness on the morning of departure. Bobby, meanwhile, enjoyed his first appearance in the Nationwide League this season, following his impressive display at Cambridge in the Reserves. Both selections are further clear signals of Jim Quinn's intention to open up the squad to all his players, adding a new dimension to those playing in the Reserves and Youth teams.

Beyond these individuals it's been a combination of encouraging performances and mixed results for our youth teams.

Last week started off with a thumping 14-1 win over Bremerton Heath for our 'C' team in the Mid-Week Wilts League, in which we look safe bets as champions already. The 'B' team, despite some excellent displays, went down 2-1 to local rivals Bath City. Les O'Neill, currently taking charge of the side, was forced to make a last-gasp alteration to his line-up when David Ratcliffe got injured in the warm up; his replacement was lan Farley, who promptly went on to score for Town. As is often the case with our 'B' team, over half the side were under 16's whereas our opponents play mostly under 18 players. O'Neill admitted after the match that one or two of his players were intimidated by their opponents, commenting "Of course we want to win but at this level it's mainly about bringing the youngsters on to develop their mental and physical strength. They're learning that they will need to do a bit more to impose themselves".

One youngster Les picked for special mention was midfielder Nathan Edwards. Currently finishing school, 15-year-old Nathan has impressed so much this season in both the 'C' and 'B' teams that Tom Jones last week promoted him to the 'A' team in the South East Counties League, where he came on for the last 25 minutes against Brentford. Les reported to youth team Manager Tom Jones that, "The lad's got everything - although that's at 15. Nathan has the potential to be a very good player for Swindon Town". Recalled for the 'A' team was goalkeeper Alan Flanagan, after a string of fine performances under Les O'Neill. The genial Irishman had another good game but it was not enough to prevent a 2-0 defeat to the London club.


Tom Jones put the defeat down to giving away 'sloppy goals' as well as several individuals playing above their natural age-range. "Physically we're losing out a bit at the moment," said Tom, "A lot of these teams play their 2nd years whereas we're trying to promote our 1st years and even our under 16s. At the same time the gaffer (Jim Quinn) is pushing the second years up into the reserves and the first team. It can be tough for them but they'll get there because they'll grow physically as they get older. If they're learning the

right things technically then physically it'll fall into place".

Centre of Exellence

There are some Swindon Town players with even more growing to do than our youths, though.


Phil Cannon, Director of our Centre of Excellence, looks after over 100 youngsters aged 7-15 who play officially for the club. Phil attempts to cream the talent of Swindon and beyond, searching for our future youth trainees. Last week the under 15s (home) and under 14s (away) played against Exeter. Phil was disappointed by the overall under-15 team effort, which he described as "not one of the best," although he did note several good individual efforts. He was encouraged, however, by some improved performances amongst the under 14s. Overseeing the Centre last week was Swindon legend John Trollope, now an assessor for the Football League. Good news for the long-term is that John was said to be delighted with the quality of work put in by all the coaches and players.



Seeing images like this make us all the more determined to get the rest of the injured players back in action. *Ty Gooden* has been working hard over the last two weeks to overcome his hamstring strain. We have built him up from steady jogging to a long run, then on to speed work and then functional work with a ball. At the time of going to print it is unclear whether *Ty* will be back in time but we certainly hope so.

Ex-Wimbledon veteran *Alan Reeves* has had to endure a slower recovery to his ankle injury, which was picked up in the tough game with QPR. Ankle injuries often become complicated and time consuming so we have had to take it steady with *Alan*, but he is making good progress with striding, short sprints, and lapping. We don't like to put time scales on recovery but we are certainly getting there. Like any professional Alan doesn't like to be injured, but he has worked very hard to get himself back to fitness.






'Chipper' was brought into the side to spread the play wide with his precision passing - this was exactly what he did.

Using Swindon Town F.C. as our central theme, 'TOTT' covers all aspects of the game. To date, we have discussed issues like refereeing and players' agents, and last Friday our topic was the role of the Professional Footballers' Association. In keeping with our basic theme, our guest was former Swindon player, Garry Nelson, who, after a season as coach at Torquay, became the Commercial Executive of the PFA 18 months ago. Garry, who I have known for many years, was extremely interesting and he gave an excellent insight into the work of the PFA, most of which goes largely unnoticed by the general public. Think of the PFA and you think of people like Gordon Taylor and Brendon Batson, you think of super-rich members like the mega-stars of the Premier League, you think of the power that players have under the Bosman


ruling and, if you have listened to 'Talk of the Town', you might also think of Rachel Anderson's battle for women to attend the PFA's annual Awards Dinner, but that's a different story! What you would be forgiven for not thinking about are the issues that Garry has highlighted and is actively addressing. Such as the 100 or so players released on free transfers last close season who are still not fixed up with new clubs; of the thousands of ex-players who played at a time when footballers didn't earn fortunes and who have now fallen on hard times and, moving right up to date, of the life-saving payments paid by the PFA to those clubs in financial difficulty to enable them to pay the wages.

I suppose it is easy to understand why the public's perception of the PFA is just centred around the privileged lifestyles of a relatively small amount of players and, as I said to Garry, perhaps it is time that the PFA addressed this misconception. However, Garry and his colleagues, whilst realising the extent of this problem, are concentrating their efforts on the welfare of their members. To this end they have embarked on a programme of commercial

activities which has provoked criticism in some quarters, with conflict of interest accusations being levelled at them. However, as Garry pointed out, the average length of a footballer's career is just eight years and so anything that the PFA can do to ensure the security of their members they will do. Garry also contested, arguably unrealistically but I took his point, that the Clubs do not look after their ex-players when they fall on hard times.

'Talk of the Town' is only an hour long and the interview with Garry could easily have taken up the whole hour. Garry highlighted the fact that there is far more to football than just what you read in the papers, see on the television or hear on the radio. The interview also graphically showed that far more attention needs to be given to the plight of less fortunate clubs and players by the relative powers that be, possibly by fairer distribution of the television and sponsorship monies for instance, but that's for another article!







It's Your Call

Andy Harris: Producer of Sky Sports Popular 'Soccer Arn".

I've got real problems at the moment - problems at home that I'm finding very hard to explain rationally to anyone who doesn't live football.

You see, my wife isn't a football fan, nor is she particularly fond of the game. Don't get me wrong, I know

many of you have similar difficulties, but I'd like to think that the fact that I work in football makes this situation all the worse.

When I worked on programmes like the Big Breakfast or the Frank Skinner Show, this wasn't so much of a problem. In those days I'd have three lives - my work life, my home life and my football life.

It was only when I began working on Fantasy Football, that this dark cloud of football wars descended on me. Then my three lives became two - my work life had merged with my football life - and my wife was having none of it. I could understand her angst, but there was nothing I could do about it. I tried explaining how football wasn't just my hobby. It wasn't just a job. It was just another part of me, like a limb. It was just here. She didn't understand it because people who don't 'have' football, just don't get it. They don't know.

Yes, she'd pretend to understand, but my strained protestations that "I have to watch that live match" for the show preceded by the most pathetic and lame excuse "I have to get Sky - I have to watch the games we're doing gags on".

To many I'm the luckiest bloke in the world.

First Fantasy Football then Soccer AM. Actually meeting footballers, singers, actors, comedians etc and the like. And do you know what? I am. This is simply the best job in the world - but listen to me, this battle with a football hater is really getting to me.

It got to the stage where I went out and rented a copy of Fever Pitch for my beautiful wife. "Watch this," I said. "Watch it and understand. It says it all about me."

So we watched it together. I cried at the ending. She looked at me and said, unconvincingly: "Err, yes darling I understand now." She didn't. I could see that. No-one does if they're not brought up with the game in their hearts.

I feel such terrible, horrible guilt whenever I meekly, pathetically say the words: "There's a match on telly this afternoon, but I'll watch it with the sound down", or "it's a really big game, I have to watch it", or the most pathetic: "I really don't want to watch it, but I have to. It's the job, y'see".

Do you understand now?

When my first child, Thomas, was born - my father immediately enrolled him in the Junior Gunners club. The same happened with my second child, Joseph, two years later. My wife thought it was "all right" to do such things. So, taking that as the go-ahead to bring football into our homelife (seeing as it had already taken over my work life), I started buying those

little footballer figures of Arsenal players, and putting them all round the house.


"That's Vieira.

"I'm walking along, singing a song,





The Town Ladies beat Bristol City 4-1 but lost to Saltash Pilgrims 4-3 and still kept second place in the League.



Saltash scored a fourth and deep into injury time Nadine Lloyd latched onto Clare Wheeler's through ball to reduce Saltash's lead.








FRANCIS MANAGER OF THE MONTH

Gerry Francis has completed an incredible turnaround at Queens Park Rangers by being named as the Nationwide League's First Division Manager of the Month for November.

Francis will collected his award at a special presentation on Tuesday after seeing his team win four out of their past five games. It is an amazing achievement because, before he returned to Loftus Road, Rangers had won just once away from home in 14 months and had not won back-to-back matches since September 1997. He said: "They say these things are the kiss of death but all I can say is that the players have had a magnificent November. They have really put it in for me and been outstanding all month. It took a couple of weeks to get things sorted out and get some spirit and pride back into the blue-and-white hoops. November has finished now but I wish it could be November every month." Francis's impact at Loftus Road was highlighted by Saturday's 3-0 victory at Bradford. It was QPR's first win at Valley Parade and meant Rangers have won more away games in five weeks under Francis than in a whole year under previous manager Ray Harford. They have also scored more League goals since Francis arrived than in the first three months of the season under Harford. Francis said: "Things are going well, It's not over yet, obviously, and we have a long way to go to really turn the corner. But I am very pleased that we are finally scoring goals. We were the lowest scorers in the League before I arrived and struggling to keep clean sheets. Now we have changed that."

VENABLES DENIES BLACKBURN RUMOURS

Crystal Palace manager, Terry Venables, today denied that he is unhappy at the First Division club and is on the short list for the vacant job at Blackburn.

There has been speculation that Venables, who is in the first year of a five-year contract at Selhurst Park, has been frustrated by the financial problems which have beset the club this season, and that he and chairman Mark Goldberg attended a crisis meeting last week. Goldberg, who bought the club for £22million from Ron Noades last summer, has had trouble meeting some interest payments on loans bu Venables said today: "It's absolute rubbished am very happy at the club. We did have a meeting last week at Selhurst Park but it was simply to discuss strategy. The truth is I am enjoying myself. We have a good bunch of players here now and a good enough squad so that I don't feel I have to go out and spend. We are moving in the right direction and I just want to get on with things," Venables has a clause in his contract which could enable him to leave in the first and third year and the former England coach is still highly regard within the game. He has admitted the he has missed the England job which left following Euro '96 but, following a spell at Portsmouth and then as coach to the Australian national team, he has settled in well at Pala despite the financial restrictions imposed upon him. Blackburn. meanwhile, continue to look for a successor to Roy Hodgson, with West Ham manager Harry Redknapp, former Liverpool manager Roy Evans, the FA' director of coaching Howard Wilkin and Charlton's Alan Curbishley, amo those linked with the job.







Q. Presumably you have more time on your hands now?




Q. You're coming back from injury about the same time as several other players are returning to the frame...

Q. You're the longestserving member of the Squad - might you consider yourself almost a veteran now?






