Dario Writes

The first home Saturday game

I don't think we have yet played the kind of football which should grace our new stadium. However, as we see improvements to the furbishing under the new stand every time we come here, so I hope we will also see small but steady improvement to the quality of our play. There were certainly encouraging signs on Tuesday against Ipswich.

Jermaine Wright, Danny Murphy, Seth Johnson, Dave Walton and Rodney Jack are all missing from the team which did so well at the end of the last season, so I do not expect our play to be quite the same. That should not particularly

affect our defending though, and that is still something we have to work on. I thought that Steve Macauley and David Wright both had excellent games against Ipswich. I am trying to play with a 4-2-4 system with one of our wingers (Kenny Lunt) pulled into midfield a bit. The advantage of 4-2-4 is that we play with two central attackers and have more goal threat especially for home matches. That does seem to be the case, though I might wish to rethink the Kenny Lunt role.

Rodney Jack doesn't seem to be able to get going this season for one reason or another, and


obviously a fit and in-form Rodney would make a difference to us. I think we will get better as I get a better idea of who is best suited to which role, and also as we spend more time on the training ground working on our style of play. I am not expecting us to carry the ball through the midfield quite as much as we did in the past few seasons, but again I think we will improve on that aspect as we go along.

At the moment we are hitting more high balls to the front line than we would like, but we do have some pace up there so we must just work on improving the quality.

Unfortunately, Rodney goes back to the treatment room along with Steve Wright to join Dave Walton. I really don't have any idea of when any of the three will be fit again. Marcus Bignot was ill and should not have started the game on Tuesday. By today I should know more about him, but at the time of writing these notes I do not have any more news.

I haven't tried yet to borrow or buy anyone else before today's game, but that may become an option!



Last season saw Steve McMahon leave the County Ground and be replaced by Jim Quinn. The former Reading and Robins player quickly transformed the club's fortunes and they finished in a comfortable 17th spot. Ironically Quinn took over just before his side visited Gresty Road in November 1998 and they left with a morale boosting 2-0 win. That day the physical presence of Ifem Onoura was the difference. 'Iffy' helped himself to a brace as the alarm bells started to ring rather loudly at Gresty Road.

Later on in the season Crewe earned a valuable away win at Swindon. Phil Charnock and Rodney Jack grabbed the goals in a 2-1 win as Crewe began their late revival.

Without a huge amount of money to spend, Quinn has to be careful in the transfer market and has spent wisely in bringing in Peterborough's Giuliano Grazioli under the Bosman ruling. The striker, who once shocked Newcastle United in the FA Cup while at non-league Stevenage has already proved he can score goals at this level.

Grazioli will have to compete with Chris Hay and George Ndah for the right to partner Onoura up front. The powerful

striker is always a threat and Dario Gradi is a keen admirer of the former Gillingham and Mansfield man. Scoring goals does not appear to be a problem for the Robins. Keeping them out is another matter. They finished last season with the worst defensive record in the First Division and have hardly looked secure so far this campaign. An impressive 2-1 win at Crystal Palace indicates that Quinn's side are more than capable of upsetting the odds.

The experienced Alan Reeves and Gareth Hall should in time sort out Swindon's defensive frailties. Frank Talia is a former Australia U-21 goalkeeper, Sol Davis is an impressive left-sided wing-back and Mark Walters has previously played for Liverpool, Glasgow Rangers, Aston Villa, Southampton and Wolves. The Robins also have high hopes for 16 year-old midfielder Robin Hulbert, who has represented England at Youth level.

Of course without the financial backing of the bigger clubs Swindon, like Crewe, must be looking to consolidate in this division. It is a tough League with the expectancy levels increasing every year, but with Quinn's ability to motivate his players Swindon will always be a difficult side to break down.

Frank Talia

Goalkeeper

Spotted playing for Australia's Under 21 team and after trials with several English clubs, eventually signed for Blackburn Rovers in August 1992. Failed to make a first team appearance and was brought in on loan at Swindon before signing in November 1995. He was back-up to Fraser Digby until he broke through with some terrific displays to earn him a regular place and the No. 1 shirt. Frank has an infectious character with plenty to say both on and off the field.

Jimmy Glass

Goalkeeper

Joined from Bournemouth under freedom of contract following the Bosman ruling. Started his career as a trainee at Crystal Palace and went out on loan to Portsmouth before grabbing the chance of first team football at Dean Court. He only started three games for Swindon last season, but his heroics for Carlisle on the final day made it a season to remember. Jimmy scored in the dying seconds to keep Carlisle in the Football League, making him a hero with the 'Blues' faithful and instigated a sell-out of Carlisle goalie shirts.

Steve Mildenhall

Goalkeeper

One of Swindon's home grown talents, Steve is in his third year as a professional after successfully coming through the Club's YTS system. Made two first team appearances in 1995/96, came off the bench to play as an outfield player in 1996/97 and made his full league debut between the posts for Swindon in October 1997. In this match he suffered a terrible groin injury but, with no keeper on the bench, he bravely played on to earn the Man of the Match award and put Swindon on top of the 1st Division for 24 hours.

Gareth Hall

Defender

Signed from Sunderland under the Bosman ruling, 30-year-old Hall has a wealth of experience. Best known as a full-back, he's versatile enough to play anywhere across the back line or in midfield. Started his career at Chelsea where he flourished under ex-Swindon Boss Glenn Hoddle. Moved to Sunderland in 1995 and was a regular in the Premiership for the Weariders. Capped nine times for Wales.

Alan Rees

Defender

Quit Wimbledon's "Crazy Gang" in search of first team football with Swindon. Tall central defender, who cost the Dons £300,000 from Rochdale five years ago when he was signed as a replacement for John Scales. Excellent header of the ball, 31-year-old Reeves can be an asset in attack on set pieces, scoring 2 goals in 24 appearances last season, as well as adding experience at the back.

Mark Robinson

Defender

Started his career at West Bromwich Albion, joined Barnsley on a free in June 1986 and such was his form there that Newcastle snapped him up for £450,000 in March 1993. After losing his place in the first team through injury, Swindon paid a Club record £600,000 for his services in July 1994 and he has been a regular and consistent performer ever since. Mark can play at full-back, central defence and was also a success as a sweeper.

Craig Taylor

Defender

Younger brother of former Town favourite Shaun, Craig signed a three-year deal in April 1997 after impressing during a trial period. Town paid non-league Dorchester Town £25,000 to bring him in and despite a pre-season injury set back, he made a dream debut against Port Vale in October 1997, scoring a wonder goal from fully 35 yards. Strong in the air and determined in the tackle, Craig has certainly carried on where his brother left off.

Gareth Davies

Defender

Was signed on a free transfer in March 1999, Gareth made the short trip down the M4 from Reading, despite being a firm favourite with the fans, he did not figure in Tommy Burns' plans. Gareth is well known for his commitment and aggressive style, but the Town fans only caught glimpses of him in action due to several injuries wrecking the end of his campaign.

Sol Davis

Defender

Left-sided fullback/wing back who was offered his first pro contract in the summer of 1998 after a series of impressive performances in the reserves. Made his league debut as a substitute at home to QPR, shortly after his 18th birthday. First start in a Swindon shirt came six months later in the heat of a local derby clash away at Oxford United. Last season he established himself as reliable first team player making 23 appearances.

Ty Gooden

Midfielder



Signed by John Gorman in 1993 having been released by Wycombe Wanderers. Made over 30 appearances in Swindon's Second Division Championship season but was hindered by injuries in 1996/97. He is now the Town's longest serving player entering his 6th season. A natural wing-back who likes to get forward. He can deliver dangerous crosses for the forwards and is reliable at the back.

Scott Leitch

Midfielder



Former Dunfermline and Hearts midfielder signed for Swindon in the Summer of 1996 for a bargain price of £15,000. Enjoyed a successful loan spell at the County Ground during their Second Division Championship season and former manager Steve McMahon was quick to bring him in on a permanent basis. Scott was named Club Captain by Jim Quinn in the summer after the retirement of Brian Burrows. He acts as the Town's engine room, possesses a strong tackle and is capable of spreading the play.

Mark Walters

Midfielder

A former England International, Mark signed for Town in July 1996 after being released by Southampton and immediately showed the silky skills which had made him such a hit at Aston Villa, Glasgow Rangers and Liverpool. He is easily the Town's most experienced player and he is still capable of tormenting opposition defences. His trademark 'Lollipop' step-over takes him into dangerous positions. Last season he scored an impressive 11 goals from midfield in 34 starts.

Robin Hulbert

Midfielder

Gifted young midfielder. He made his first team bow as a substitute against QPR in the Coca-Cola Cup tie at Loftus Road in September 1996. He gained Premiership experience on-loan with Newcastle Utd and showed much improvement last season. Six full starts last season gave him added experience and incentive. This season Robin will be looking to become a regular in Jimmy Quinn's side.

Lee Collins

Midfielder

Joined Swindon from Scottish Club Albion Rovers for £15,000 in November 1995. Lee was probably Swindon's most improved player in 1997-98. After being banned for seven games and told to clean up his act, he successfully channelled his aggression and energies into developing as a player and his tough tackling remained but with control. A terrible shoulder injury forced him to miss all but two games of last season.

Phillipe Cuervo

Midfielder

This gifted Frenchman impressed during a trial period and was quickly signed on a three year contract from Sochaux (free transfer) just before the start of the current campaign. He was a revelation during the first two months of the season but then spent several months out with a hip problem. He has not had the best of luck with injuries and again missed all but two games of last season due to a broken ankle.

Stephen (Bobby) Howe

Midfielder

Stephen who likes to be known as Bobby, is an attacking midfielder who signed for Swindon in January 1998 from Nottingham Forest, where his first team opportunities had dried up. He made 17 appearances for Forest and has had loan spells at Kettering and Ipswich Town. Bobby made 23 appearances last season scoring three valuable goals.

Chris Hay

Forward

This pacy young striker was drafted in from Scottish giants Celtic for £330,000, and quickly made a good impression scoring 13 goals in 18 appearances before Christmas 1997. A number of niggling injuries hampered his last campaign but he will be raring to go this season. He still managed to notch six goals in 18 starts.

George Ndah

Forward

A versatile midfield/forward uses his skilful close control to go at the heart of opposition defences. After the departure of Wayne Allison to Huddersfield, Swindon moved quickly to find a replacement and were delighted to pick up the lightning quick Ndah from Crystal Palace in a £500,000 deal in November 1997, he then scored a stunner on his debut against Middlesbrough. George was magnificent last season, scoring 13 goals, mainly from midfield, and picked up the 'Player of the Year' award.


Ifem (Iffy) Onuora

Forward

Ex-Huddersfield, Mansfield and Gillingham striker, who was signed in a £100,000 deal in March 98. He made the perfect start for his new club, heading the winning goal on his debut v QPR. He leads the line and his impressive tally of 20 goals last season was enough to make Iffy Town's top marksman.

Giuliano Grazioli

Forward



Signed by manager Jim Quinn in June 1999 on a free transfer from his former club Peterborough Utd. Giuliano's last visit to the County Ground was in 1997 with Stevenage Town in the FA Cup 3rd round. His winning goal dumped Swindon out and handed Stevenage a money making 4th round tie against Newcastle Utd. He scored 15 goals last season for Peterborough and Jim Quinn is certain that his former strike partner will continue his good form with Swindon.

Charlie Griffin

Forward

Like manager Jim Quinn, Charlie started his career in non-league football. He was signed for £10,000 from Chippenham Town where he was top scorer in the Screwfix League with 30 goals. At nineteen years old he is a prospect for the future and the coaching staff believe that with a handful of reserve games under his belt he will be ready to step into first team football. His first start in the first team came in the final game of last season against Barnsley, where he opened his account after only seven minutes.

Jimmy Quinn (Manager)



This former Town player and fans favourite has gathered a wealth of experience over his career playing at the likes of Blackburn Rovers, Leicester City, West Ham, managing Reading and picking up 48 caps for Northern Ireland. During his time as a player at Swindon he scored 43 goals in 86 appearances and went on to score 94 goals for Reading. Since his arrival Jim has turned the club's fortunes around and Swindon are looking forward to a successful full season under their new manager.

Facts about the Robins

- John Trollope holds the cup record for League appearances with an incredible 770 between 1960 and 1980. He also managed the club from 1980-83.
- The oldest player to play for Swindon was none other than Alex Ferguson. Fergie was 43 years and 103 days old when he appeared for the Robins against Bristol City in 1947. (It wasn't Sir Alex)
- Former Everton, Aston Villa, Rangers and Bari striker Paul Rideout is the youngest player ever to represent Swindon. Rideout, who scored an FA Cup winner in 1995 was just 16 years and 107 days old when he made his debut against Hull City in 1980.
- Following financial irregularities in 1991 Swindon were demoted two divisions after securing a place in the top flight. After appeal they were re-admitted to the old Second Division, Sunderland, who the Robins beat 1-0 in the Play-Off Final took their place in the First Division.
- Swindon's first league game was against Luton Town in 1920. They won 9-1 and the result remains a club record.
- Swindon used to be known as the 'Moonrakers' after an old Wiltshire legend but changed their nickname to the Robins because of the club colours.
- Swindon Town caused one of the biggest League Cup upsets of all time in 1969 when they defeated Arsenal 3-1 at Wembley. Two years later Arsenal won the domestic double.
- The County Ground always seems to attract top-class names. Scottish legend Dave Mackay, Les Allen, Lou Macari and Steve McMahon have all managed the Robins. The impressive list also includes former World Cup winner Ossie Ardiles and former England boss Glenn Hoddle
- Swindon Town scored 100 League goals in season 1926-27. They also acquired a staggering 102 League points in season 1985-86. They achieved this record-breaking feat in the old Fourth Division.
- In August 1948 The Swindon Town pre-season trial match attracted 11,882 to the County ground.
- Midfielder Mark Walters' middle name is 'Everton'. The Liverpool fans must have loved that.


FANTASY IRELAND - CREWE YOUNGSTERS MILK SUCCESS


Land of Hope, But Not Much Glory

With the qualification stages of Euro 2000 drawing to a disappointing close, just where does British football go from here?

England will now have to rely on Sweden defeating Poland on 9 October to confirm a place in the play-offs, where we could face anyone from World Champions France to near neighbours Scotland. It seems that when it comes to our national side our expectation levels are just too high. At times we think we have a divine right to qualify for European Championships and World Cups, but to be honest we are not as good as we think. Our results in Group 5 certainly reflect that. England have failed to defeat Bulgaria and Sweden and the dismal draw in Warsaw leaves us in a rather perilous position. Three wins out of eight is simply not good enough.

Sweden have walked the group and on paper should beat Janusz Wojcik's side (they won 1-0 in Poland) but we should not expect any favours from the Swedes. Poland need a single point and have shown that they are more than capable of achieving it.

So we will just have to sit tight, become Swedish for a night and pray that the result goes our way. It is a position we deserve to be in because our qualification campaign has been nothing short of a disaster. Inept displays at Wembley against Bulgaria and Sweden combined with our disappointing away form has everyone evaluating our a national game. Hoddle's sudden departure obviously did not help matters, three red cards for rash tackles and injuries should not serve as any excuses. We should have cemented a play-off spot at least and we haven't.



It seems extraordinary that England do not have a natural successor to Paul Gascoigne. We evidently miss his invention and creativity but his continued absence through injury and his age should rule out any hopes of a return to the international stage. Beckham is a fantastic young player but going past people has never been one of his major attributes. Maybe the emergence of Kieron Dyer or West Ham's Joe Cole provides hope. England certainly lack world class players. We have good/great players in Beckham, Scholes, Owen and Campbell but they are not world class performers. We just don't have a Charlton, Moore, Banks or Greaves. In fact we are even lacking a Robson, Shilton, Lineker or Waddle.

Maybe the influx of creative foreign players has restricted our own imaginative youngsters. We can produce the Batty's and Ince's but where are our Zola's and Bergkamp's? The answer is probably in the reserve sides of the bigger clubs or even at a lower level.

It is also claimed that England lack quality left-sided players. Do you not find it amazing that professional footballers who earn vast amounts of money each week are incapable of being comfortable with both feet? In Poland we had to recall 37 year-old Stuart Pearce, Graeme Le Saux is usually first choice left back and Nigel Winterburn is prominently right-footed. It is the same with the left wingers - Ray Parlour is right footed, as is Anderton and McManaman but Keegan insists on playing them out of position. How about Steve Guppy, Darren Eadie, Michael Ball or even Seth Johnson?

England also lacked the spirit and team work of the Irish, Welsh and Scots in Warsaw. They do not have a vast selection of players to choose from but they possess a determination to succeed. The Welsh really seem to want to prosper under Mark Hughes. The Scots will always be a difficult side to break down and the Republic of Ireland have been the best of the bunch this time around. Their 2-1 win over Yugoslavia showed what it is like to play with passion and pride. Something England alarmingly did not have in Warsaw.

a personal view

Following the draw by England in the qualifying round of the European Championships, we were to read that one of the reasons for the dismal performance was due to the excessive number of games they play each season. As virtually every player representing England comes from a Premier League side, their season is already eight games shorter than those in Division One, Two and Three, additionally those in European competitions do not enter the Worthington Cup until the third round. By which time many clubs have already played a further four games - the margin is now increased to twelve.

Clubs and players alike enjoy the challenge and media attention of European competitions, those who progress to the later stages benefit greatly on the financial front. For those who advocate a reduction in games played, the one thing they never advocate is the precise number of games that players should play before it could be suggested that performances could be affected at International level.

Naturally there will be those who will disagree with me on this point, but it is after-all - 'A Personal View'.

The media provides us all with many pieces of information, either immediate use or to be stored for later use. The transfer of Massimo

Taibi to Manchester United was duly completed but the one day difference in the registration dates in England and Italy now means that he is unable to play in the first stages of the European Cup. Despite the appeal by United that

they had fulfilled correctly the requirements, the appeal was turned down. Still with the same player, it was reported in one of last weekends papers that he had an interpreter behind his goal at Anfield. What comes next, an International phrase book? 
Queens Park Rangers had to postpone games at every level last weekend on medical advice after



Iffy Onuora is one of the most powerful forwards in Division One, with his robust style and battering ram technique that sends opposing defences reeling. The Alex's Mark Rivers mesmerise defences with his tricky technique, and this afternoon's game will throw up an intriguing encounter between the two potential match-winners.

Rivers' neat passing is a key part of his game, and thus his accuracy level is higher than Onuora's. Iffy's body strength means that his asset is his running with the ball, hence his 17 dribbles and runs and two goal assists. He could do with improving the accuracy of his distribution as he has only a 35 per cent completion rate, compared to Rivers' 90 per cent.

Rivers has conceded more fouls per game than Onuora, and his tenacity and willingness to attack are evident in the 12 offside decisions against his name.

Sports Scientist freelance Andy Franks is Crewe's latest addition in their search for ultimate fitness. The former Liverpool University student has set up his own Advantage Football Consultancy and works with the Alex players at Reaseheath two or three days a week and also looks after Everton and Chelsea during the hectic schedule.

Franks also works for the FA with the England Under 16 set along with Craig Simmons, who is a familiar figure with Alex players with his regular fitness assessments.

Having a fitness advisor brings the Alex into line with other clubs such as Birmingham and Andy, who uses his pre-match routines at home games, expects to travel away as well.

He says: "It is now acknowledged that players should have scientific warm-up sessions and specific drinks to get their muscles toned up and be fully prepared for the games. We will also have cooling-down routines after games while the substitutes, who may not have been used, will also be given specific work."

Crewe's training also takes in aerobic-like dance sessions at the start of the week and regular power work with weights under Coach Barry Beesley.

Young Welshman Peter Smith, 21 this week, has set his sights on a regular first-team place this season after deciding against a permanent move to Macclesfield. He had a set-back during the summer when some metal from a recovery vehicle on the A55 forced his car to

veer off the road down an embankment, luckily emerging with just cuts and bruises. Smith missed 10 days of training, but a hat-trick in a practice game against a Cameroon side pushed him up to a place on the bench. He scored three goals in 12 games on loan to Macclesfield last season and had the chance to join the Silkmen full-time.

"I wanted to try to break into Crewe's team once they offered me a new contract. Now I have to do well in training and take the chance when it comes."

Former Crewe favourite Rob Jones has been forced into early retirement after undergoing four knee operations and a whole year on the sidelines. Jones, who was on trial at West Ham is just 27 years of age. The Welshman who chose to play for England (he won 8 caps) could hardly believe it when Dario told him Liverpool wanted him back in 1991. A week later he faced Ryan Giggs at Old Trafford on live television.

Dario Gradi has admitted that he was surprised by Neil Sorvel's development following his transfer from Macclesfield in the summer. The boss has been impressed with his stamina and now wants him to develop into a playmaker. He also believes Neil can add more goals to the one he struck against Grimsby.




The match takes place on Wednesday 22 September with kick-off at 7.30pm. Only the Railtrack Stand will be open for this encounter.
