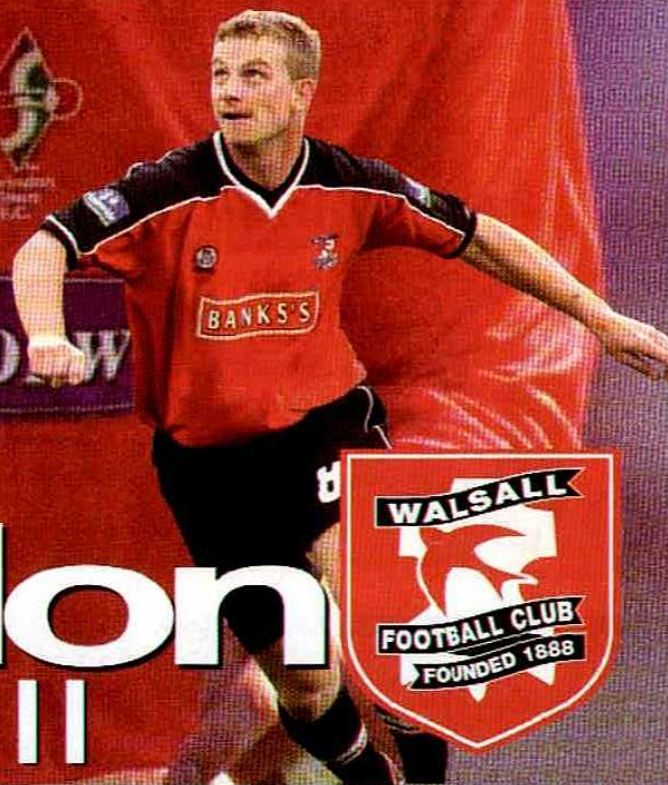

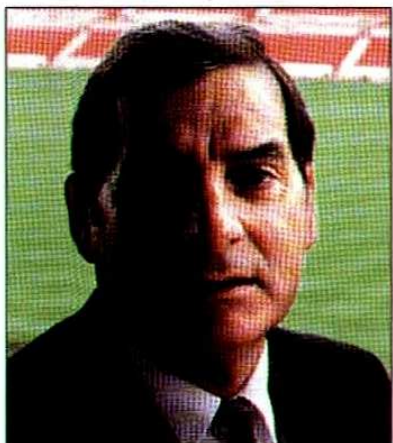

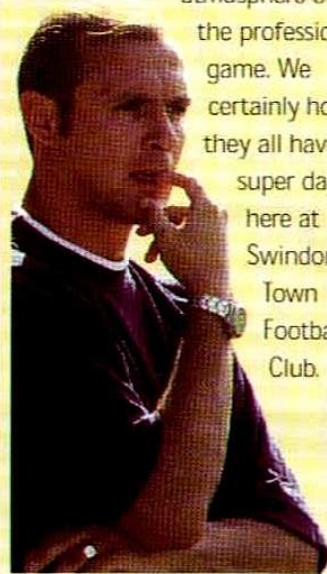

# today's visitors

It took Mohammed Al Fayed's millions to help Fulham clinch a place in the First Division this season, but Walsall only needed a paltry £30,000 to follow the same route as the Cottagers.

That's how much Ray Graydon spent last season in strengthening the squad he inherited when he took over the top job at the Bescot Stadium in May 1998. Instead of running up further debts, boss Graydon relied largely on free transfer acquisitions, as well as the existing players at the club. He did so with startling results as The Saddlers clinched the runners-up spot in the Division Two title race, having begun the season as many people's favourites to suffer relegation to the basement of the Football League.

Graydon's men finished 14 points adrift of Al Fayed's powerful Fulham line-up but five clear of their closest challengers Manchester City - a remarkable achievement that the Walsall boss can be justifiably proud of.

Their first season back in this tier for 10 years has naturally been tough with so many teams able to rely on finances that the saddlers can only dream of. But

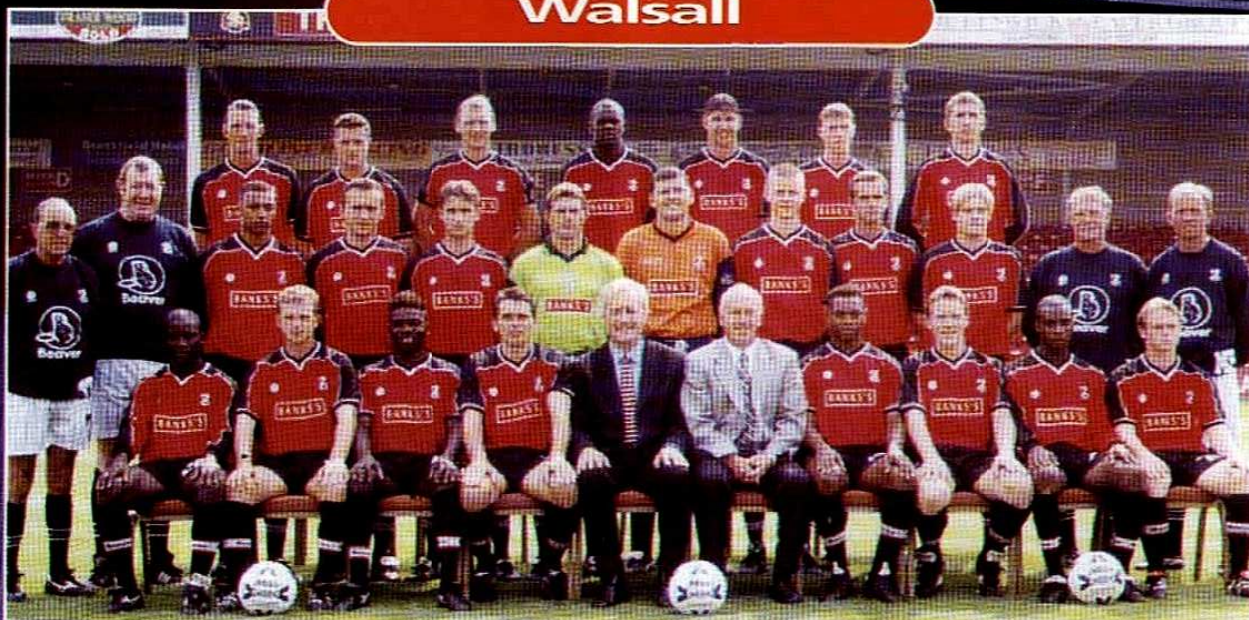
even if this season does end in glorious failure and Walsall do return from whence they came (by no means a certainty of course) they can take enormous

pride in the three league victories secured so far this season. It is often said by the most loyal of fans that success is of secondary importance to getting one over on local rivals. If that is the case in the West Midlands then Walsall can dine out on this campaign for years to come! Birmingham, West Brom and Wolves have all been beaten in glorious style, handing this little club the local bragging rights thus far. It is almost as if they are capable of raising their game to a new level when the big local bullies are in town and on each occasion, they have had no answer to Ray Graydon's team.

Of course the trick now is to transfer this local passion to a national stage and if they can reproduce this form against the rest of the division they have every chance of staying up. It will be tough, very tough, but this is a team with spirit in abundance and anyone who dares to take them lightly could be in for a surprise.

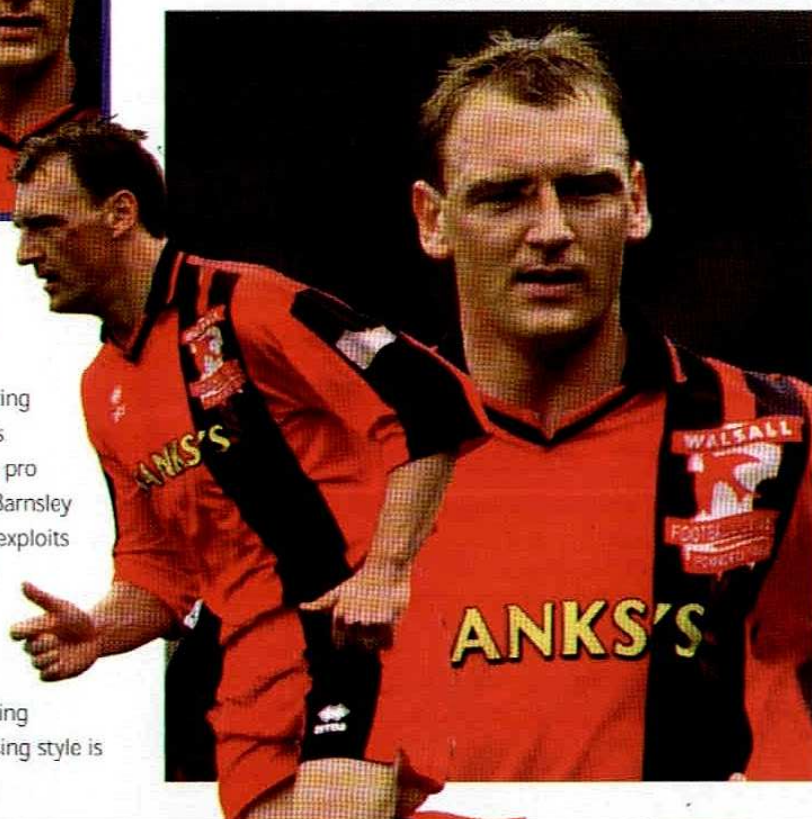

Having begun his pro career at Manchester United, he moved to Barnsley and then Southend where his goal-scoring exploits took off. A cheap move to Walsall followed where Ray Graydon's faith was immediately repaid. There are few more whole-hearted players in football and no-one could ever accuse this player of not giving 100%. Nicknamed Rambo, his uncompromising style is already troubling First Division defences.

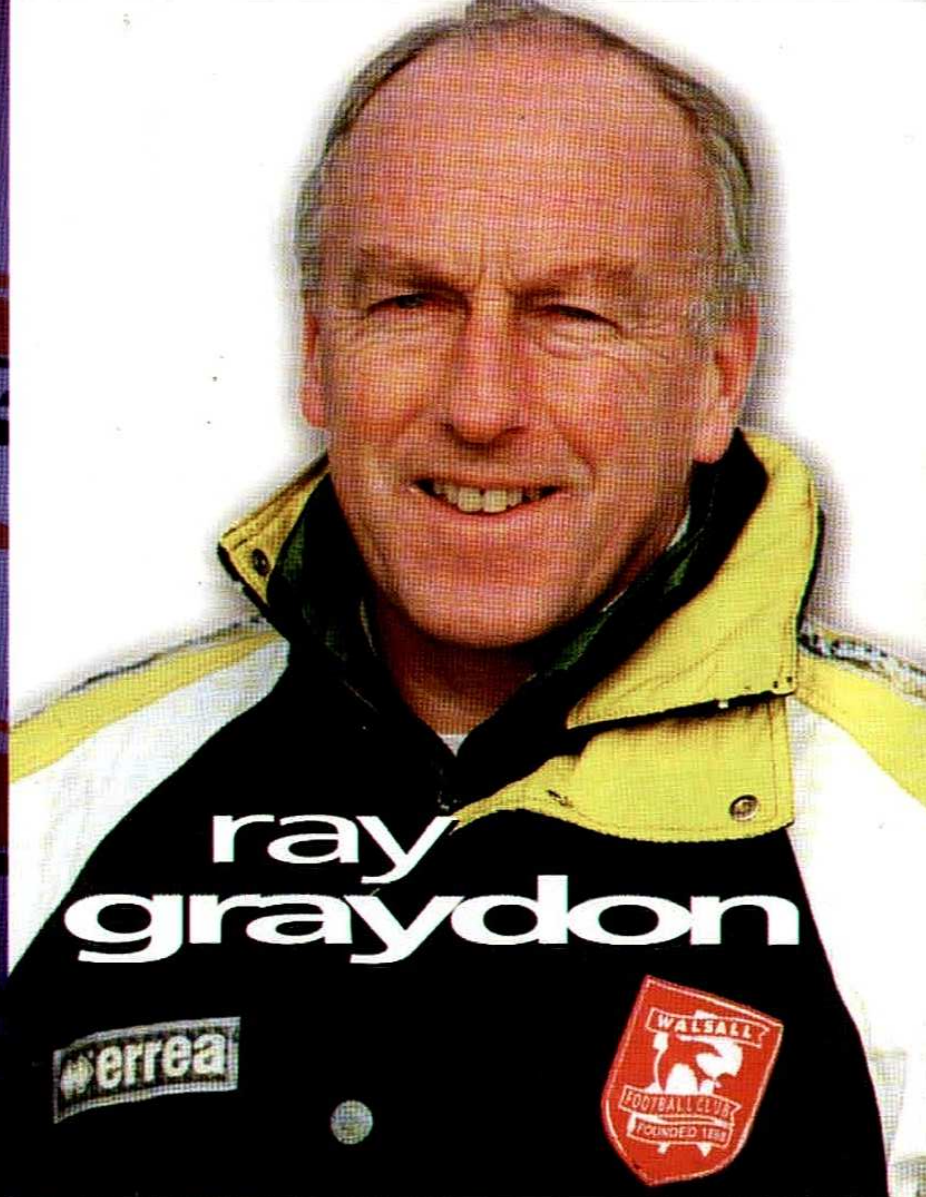

But he quickly dispelled any doubts over his managerial credentials - in the best possible style. By sticking to his principles of hard work and discipline, Graydon lifted his collection of locally-born players and free transfer signings to promotion to the First Division. What's more, his achievement is all the more remarkable considering the fact that along the way he spent just £30,000 in strengthening his squad.

As a talented winger he launched his career with his home-town club Bristol Rovers but really made his mark with Villa, scoring the winning goal in their 1975 League Cup victory over Norwich City. He also served Villa's West Midlands rivals Coventry and, after a spell in America with Washington Diplomats, he joined Oxford where he not only brought the curtain down on his playing days but also launched his coaching career. Southampton and of course QPR have also benefited from his coaching skills but it's Walsall who are now reaping all the rewards.

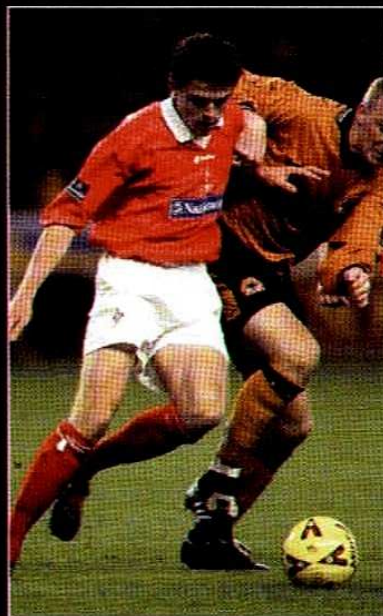

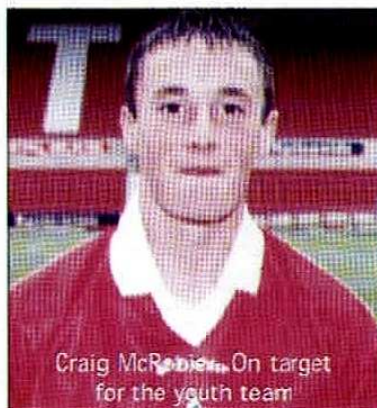


## focus on the with Tom Jones youths

We've had a bit of mixed fortune in our last two Cup ties. We won 5-4 against Torquay United in our final game of the round robin cup tournament.

This means that we have now qualified for the next round and will have to wait until January to find out who we meet. In the match itself we were very positive from the outset and powered into a 4-1 lead but then we let it slip which was very disappointing. It was a great experience for the boys but on the night we didn't really do enough in terms of attacking their final third and in trying to open them up. We had plenty of possession but didn't get in the right kind of positions where we could cause them problems. We did pass the ball extremely well but unfortunately they were a bit too solid for us at the back and we couldn't break them down.



## centre of excellence with Phil Cannon

The Centre of Excellence was involved in a series of matches against Cheltenham Town. The Under-13's and 14's were away and the Under 15's played at home.

The results went pretty well with the Under-13's and 15's both winning 4-1. The under 15's especially played very well which was great because they haven't been performing too well of late but there were much-improved performances from a lot of players.

The only disappointment of the day was that our under-14's, who we would regard as one of our strongest groups, lost 2-1. It was very disappointing to lose to a Centre of Excellence that has only just started up. I'm sure the players realise that they had the majority of the game but they have to beat teams. It was a very bad pitch with gale force winds but they didn't take it into account and it cost them dearly.

We're approaching the turn of the year again and it's always a good time to assess how much you have improved in the last 12 months. We're playing games all over the place and at times it's a problem because I can't be in two places at

once, which can make things difficult. We don't want to miss any games in the area because there are a lot of good quality players out there.

We have improved the scouting network by starting up new centres out in Bampton and Fairford which are rich areas of talent. We try to broaden our scouting network all the time and it's going well.

We are always keen to listen to anyone that feels they know of a young man that may be good enough for us to come and look at. I've had phone calls from managers apologising for ringing and that's not the sort of thing we want. We're always keen to listen to people but they must know what sort of standard we are looking for. They are more than welcome to come and have a look at our set up and then take it from there.



## the editor talks with youthplayer Kevin Halliday...

**Q** It must have been disappointing to go to White Hart Lane and lose 3-0 in the FA Cup, what did you think of the game?

**A** It was quite disappointing because we were in a good run of form before the game and we were hoping to do ourselves justice and get a draw. We certainly felt confident enough to do so going into the game but in the end Tottenham showed what a strong team they were and why they are a Premiership club. We found it quite difficult to cope with their strong running and they created good chances to score and took them well.

**Q** On the brighter side you beat Torquay Utd 5-4 in the Youth League Cup to progress to the next round, how did that feel?

**A** We did play well early on in the match and were 4-1 up. We were just a little disappointed that we gave away a few late goals and scrapped through 5-4. Saying that, the defence has been quite strong in recent weeks and when we concentrate for the entire 90 minutes we usually do OK.

**Q** You must have impressed Tom Jones with your performances for him to recommend you for the reserve team, how pleased were you to step up a level?

**A** I was delighted to get the chance and I'm happy to be there and getting involved with the rest of the squad.

**Q** How do you see your playing role developing?

**A** We were playing a 3-5-2 formation and I was playing as a left wing-back but with the recent formation change I now play as an orthodox left-back which I'm much happier with.

**Q** As a young player, how difficult is it to change the way you play?

**A** I'm now a lot more focused on my defensive duties and I prefer that. As a wing-back there is a lot to take on board and a variety of different jobs to do which can get confusing. Although I wouldn't mind having a go at left midfield because it is something that I feel I can work on.

**Q** By the end of this season what do you hope to have achieved?

**A** I would like to play well in the youth team and hopefully we can go on a run and finish well-placed in the League, as well as progress into the latter rounds of the Cup competition and maybe even get a trip to Wembley. If I continue to do well and get selected for the reserve team that will be a bonus but I'll just wait and see what happens.

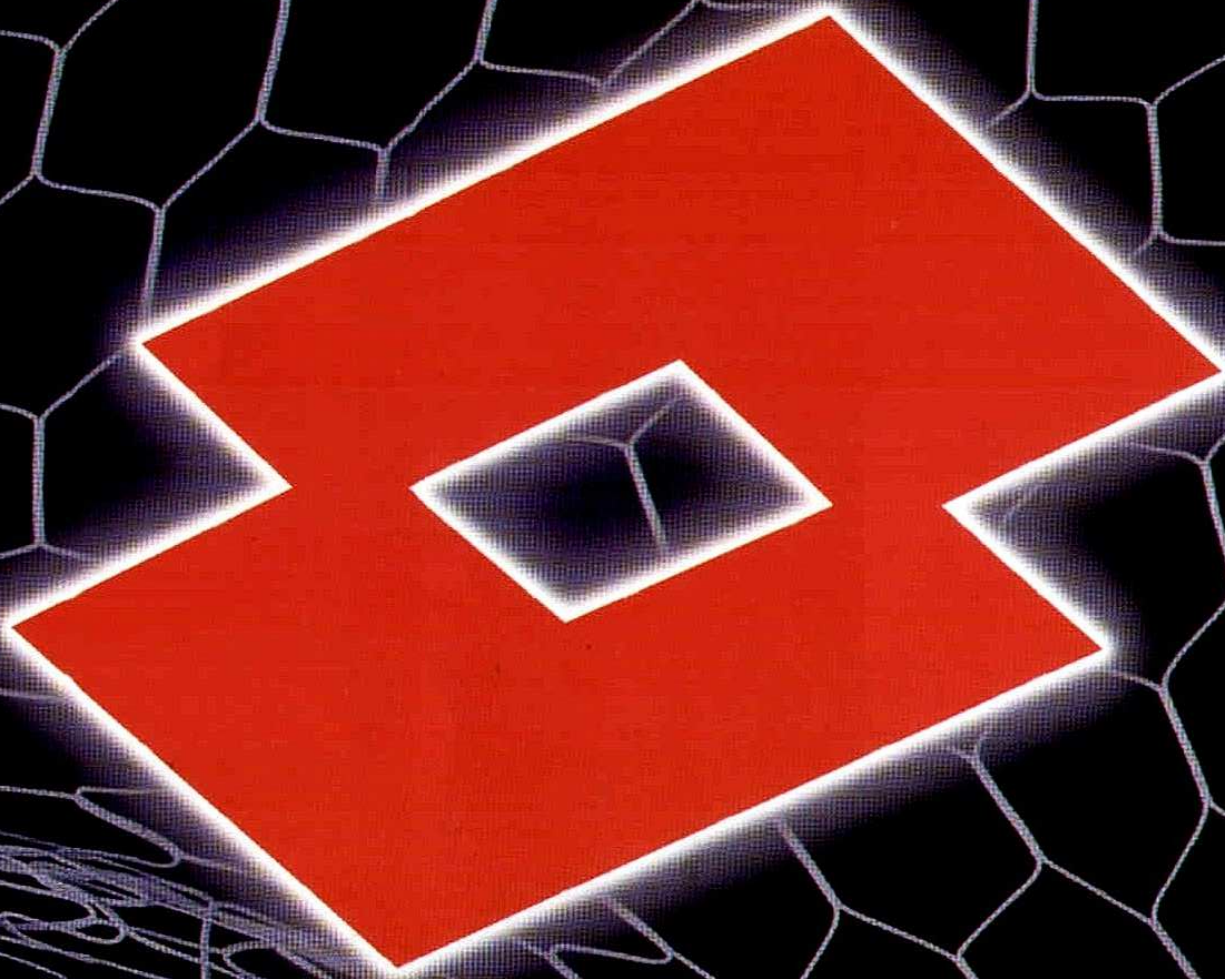

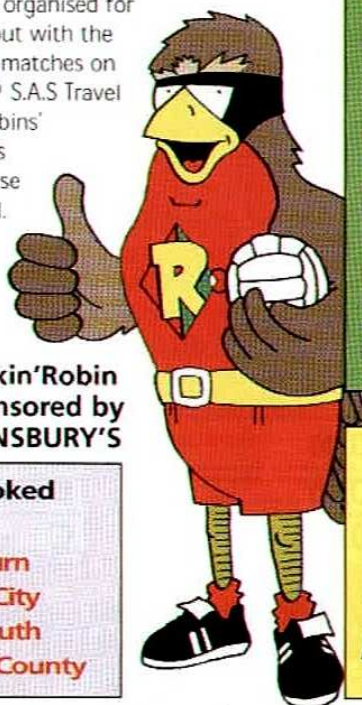

# walsh's world

with Mike Walsh

I think we hit the bar and post three times against a side that will be right up there at the end of the season and we gave them a real headache. We know we haven't got too many points but we certainly feel that, with the way we have played throughout the season, we deserve more. We're not saying we're the best side in the league but we feel we are much better than our position suggests.

We managed to get one on the night but I thought everybody that watched the match gave the lads a great reception when they left the field because of the effort and determination they showed. Over the coming weeks we're going to have to sustain that level of performance and hope results go our way. We've got a very intensive period coming up with Christmas and New Year.

We did carry on the spirit against Birmingham when we didn't perform as well as we have been of late but again, we could not question the commitment and desire, which is very pleasing from a coaching point of view. We found ourselves 1-0 down at half time so we knew we had to take the game to them which I felt we did very well, albeit without over-troubling their goalkeeper. It was the willingness of the players to get forward which was great and we need to keep doing that. Obviously we were delighted to score an equaliser in the last minute, as any team would be, but I can honestly say that amongst the players and staff we were not overjoyed about the way we had played because we know we can play better, as we did against Charlton, but we got no reward for that. It just



shows how football is unpredictable and can change from match to match. We're now looking to push on and get a good result against Walsall.

We're pleased with the way the 4-4-2 formation has worked for us and, for the last 20 minutes or so against Birmingham, it gave us the option to change to 4-3-3 to push for that equaliser, but the key to it all is that the defenders defend well - and they've been doing that.

Gareth Davies will hopefully train with the youngsters today (Wed 1st). He's had two days of hard work, running, movement and some kicking yesterday. We haven't had too much reaction so we are optimistic. We'll see how he is later in the week because it's been hanging around quite a bit but hopefully we can get him back in full training come the end of the week.



Philippe Cuervo had his hardest working week last week as he's been in training with the youngsters along with Gareth. He's had a little bit of reaction but that's to be expected and every couple of days he gets a bit of swelling on his ankle. We have to keep taking it steady with him but after the trauma he's had it's again to be expected which we were warned about by the specialist. We're really starting



to push him on now and he is football training albeit with the youngsters and working very hard. It's now just a question of when we can put him in with the bigger lads so to speak. We have to be absolutely sure that he's confident in himself from a psychological point of view which means that he's comfortable making tackles etc and I don't think that's too far away.

Graz goes to see the specialist today (Wed 1st). He's had his clips out and the scar is nice and clean. I'll have to talk with him after that about where we go, with the acquiescence of the consultant, and when we can get him in the water.

Obviously the sooner we get his foot moving the better. However, we do have to be careful because the healing process is slow. His injury is at an extremity of the body which does not heal quickly, so we need to know that is right before we kick him on. It won't be weight-bearing exercises for a while but we're certainly looking to get him in the water.

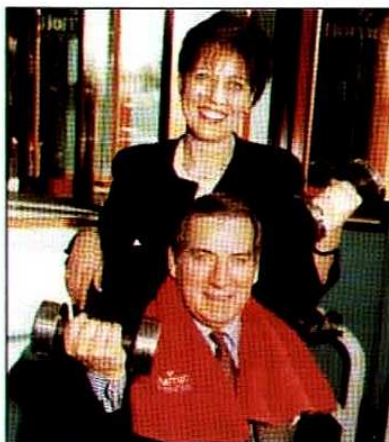

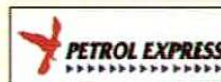

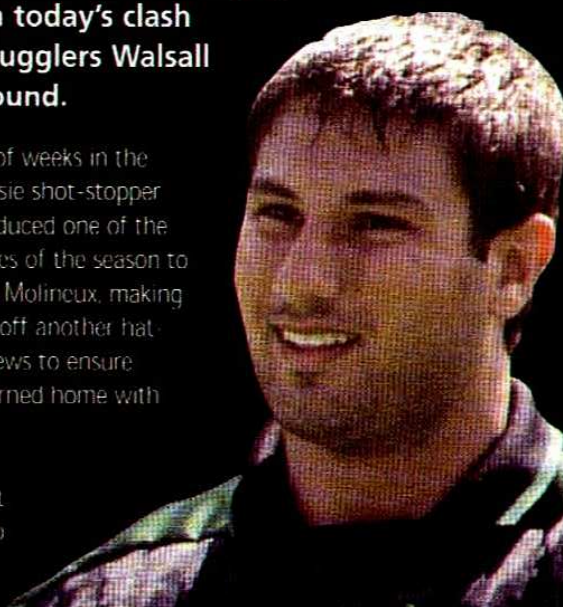

He's pulled off 85 stops already, including 41 from shots and headers inside the penalty area. That means he has kept out more than three-quarters of all shots on target.

Talia can't quite match that, but he has still made almost a half-century of saves and kept three clean sheets. The Australian has also proved more efficient with his distribution, conceding possession far less than his Walsall counterpart. On the downside, he hasn't always been particularly assured when coming for crosses, dropping the ball three times.

Having said that, he's much more likely to catch the ball than punch it, whereas Walker has been more inclined to use his fists, which can sometimes cause his supporters to panic!

Both men will be keen to add to their slightly disappointing tally of clean sheets this afternoon - but recent results suggest a 0-0 draw is most unlikely!

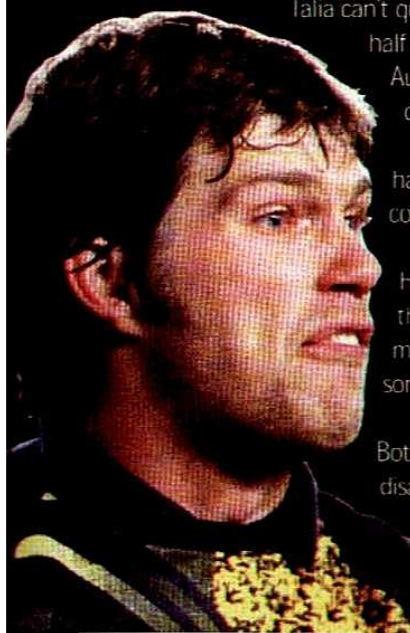

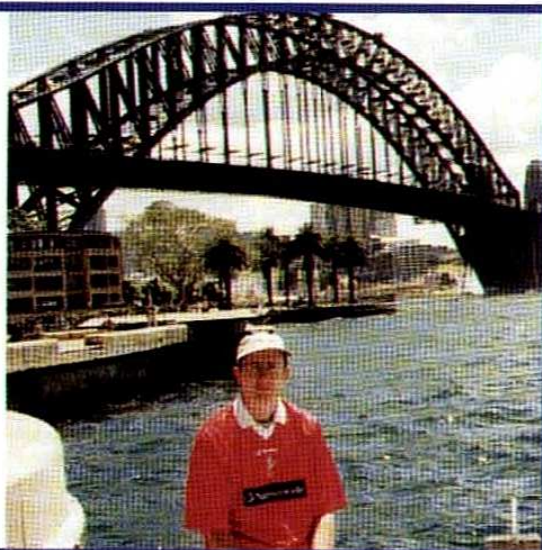

**'If only' must be one of the most commonly-used phrases in all walks of life and was the one that immediately sprang to mind as I walked into the office on Thursday morning.**

I had barely been able to contain myself on the tube and for once the journey passed in the blink of an eye as I awaited news from Johannesburg where England were playing South Africa in the first of the five-match test series.

The first thing I did when entering the office (and whisper this quietly if you're ever in the Farringdon area) was to log-on to the cricket website to check progress. It took about five seconds for anticipation to give way to despair. 'If only we'd won the toss and bowled first' I thought as I reclined in my extremely comfy chair and prepared myself for another day of toil. I then began thinking about the concept of luck and the part it has played in my sports-supporting life. Once again the phrase 'If only' was at the forefront of my thoughts.

Most of my life as a supporter of football, cricket and all things sporting has been blighted by near-failure with only the briefest glimpse of success. If I think of the effect many of these near misses had on me I cannot begin to imagine the toll it took on those involved. The most obvious examples are those of Stuart Pearce, Chris Waddle and Gareth Southgate. Watching the World Cup semi-final in Turin I can still vividly recall the disappointment as, first Pearce, then Waddle ballooned their penalties over the bar and then, when the chance of redemption eventually arrived in the shape of Gareth Southgate, the disappointment doubled. Things didn't improve when World Cup 1998 came round. Once again an epic match against Argentina when England, down to ten men and with their backs to the wall, turned in one of the bravest performances of this, or any other, decade only to once again lose out on penalties. Strangely, after this particular performance and another defeat by the cruelest of means, the disappointment was all the more acute although after a decade of unprecedented penalty disappointment, it should have come as no surprise.

So, after another weekend of test cricket disappointment, I found myself feeling extremely deflated. Still, I mused, I could console myself with the thought that this feeling wouldn't match the disappointment I will feel next summer when England get knocked out of the European Championships. In fact I may even go and place a bet this morning (again whisper this quietly in the Farringdon area) on that defeat being by the most unlucky of means - penalties.

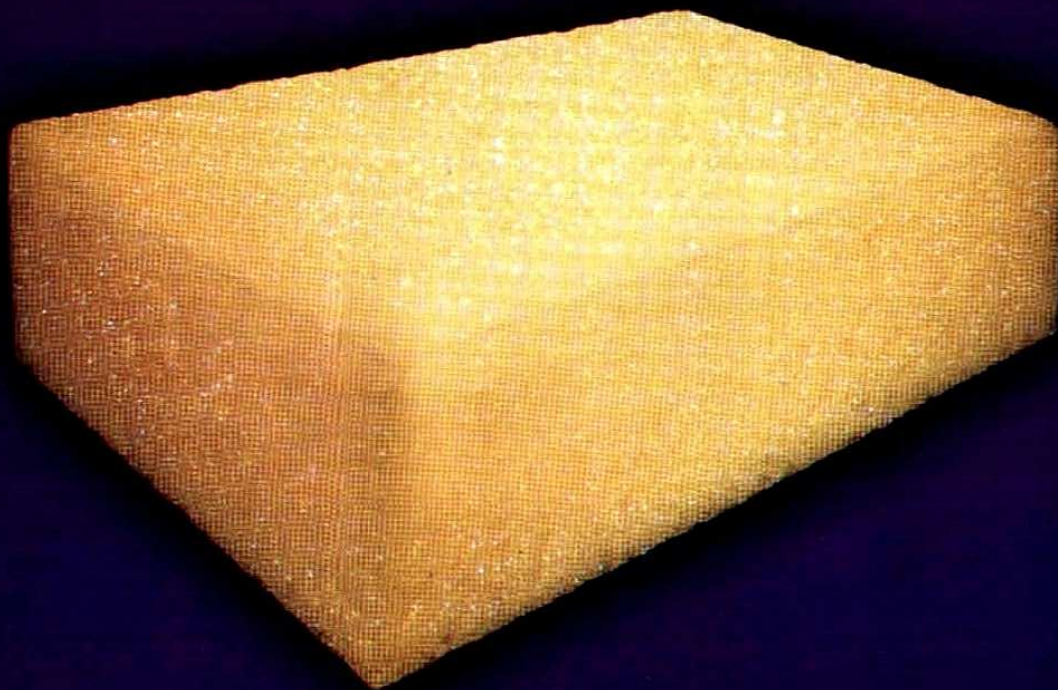

A 51st minute header from Chris Beech gave Huddersfield Town a morale boosting victory at Maine Road last weekend. That win puts the Terriers into second place, only two points behind City in the race for the Division title. He added: "Obviously I have got the reins until further notice but whether the directors decide to give me the job is up to them. I'm just doing my best for United as I have always done."

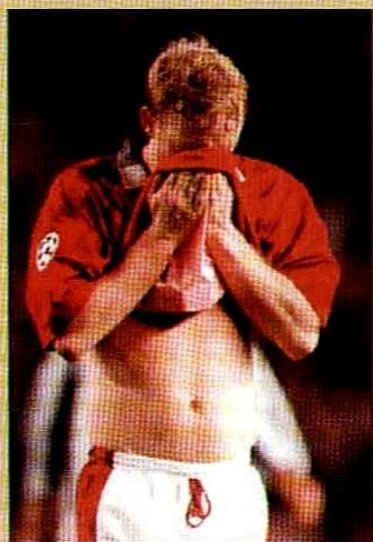

**Paraguay's Jose Luis Chilavert scored what is believed to be the first hat-trick by a goalkeeper in the professional game and hopes that it will be the catalyst for his move to the English Premiership.**

Chilavert's three penalties during Velez Sarsfield's 6-1 win over Ferro Carril Oeste last Sunday brought his total to 46, scored for his country, Velez and Real Zaragoza.

Chilavert, who nearly signed for Liverpool after the World Cup, isn't happy that he is yet to make the move to England. "These three goals are great because the only thing I still really want to do is take my career to England," he said.

"People always ask me if I am a special player because of all the goals I score but I don't feel special. The type of player I am, on the other hand, is someone who would really fit in with the style of playing in the English Premiership.

"Everyone who writes about me can put the headline on their story that I want to go to England. But while I'm in Argentina, and now that I have scored a hat-trick of penalties, I can say to my enemies that I suppose Martin Palermo will still be your hero because he failed to score three penalties in a game."

Chilavert is well known for his outspoken nature and is never one to shy away from controversy. The 34-year-old who kisses his trademark gold medallion before he takes up his position between the sticks said:

"A lot of people try to criticise me for my polemic words but all I do is try to live my life as a good example to everybody."

"We will have to wait and see if the flamboyant Paraguayan graces the Premiership but I can't wait to hear Alan Hansen's comments when the big goalie goes up for free-kicks, penalties and corners."

# a fan's stfc history

## Part three

**As we approach the Millennium, Daniel Fylan-Smith looks back at the ups and downs of Swindon Town F.C.**

In 1951 the first set of floodlights were installed at the County Ground for the then-princely sum of £350. Bristol City were the Town's first opponents under them and a crowd of over 3,000 saw the Town win 2-1. However, the 1951-52 season saw an inconsistent Town finish 16th in the league. This inconsistency was epitomised by two consecutive games against Watford - the Town won 7-1 at Vicarage Road and, a week later, lost to them 1-0 at the County Ground. Later in the season the Town travelled to Torquay and suffered their worst-ever defeat: 9-0.

The dangers of the principles enshrined in Company Articles of having one vote regardless of the number of shares you owned was illustrated at the start of the 1952-53 season. Boardroom conflict surfaced and several Directors were pilloried for buying only the minimum \$2 worth of shares necessary to qualify. The club lurched through the following seasons achieving only mediocre results whilst its financial plight worsened. In August 1954 ninety per cent of the main grandstand's timbers were found to be rotting and only season ticket holders were allowed access. April 1955 saw the Town managerless with the team being selected by committee. Poor results sent attendances plummeting and in October the A and B sides were disbanded. The Town remained rooted to the bottom of the league table and were forced to apply for re-election and, thankfully, the 'old pals act' came to their rescue. However, in October 1956 the board appointed Bert Head as manager who

immediately set about to stabilise things on the playing side - a task in which he proved mightily successful as the Town finished in fourth place in the 1957-58 season, only three points behind the league champions.

In the early sixties Head introduced a talented group of young players, the majority of them products of the youth teams. These included Ernie Hunt, Bobby Woodruffe, Cliff Jackson, Keith Morgan, Don Rogers, John Trollope and Mike Summerbee. These boys were destined to become heroes and they went on to form the nucleus of the side that won promotion to Division Two in 1963 - after 50 years of trying! The following season started with the Town winning their first six games and topping the table. However, by the end of the season they had slumped to mid-table.

During the mid sixties Ernie Hunt, Bobby Woodruffe and Mike Summerbee were sold, the latter to



Manchester City from where he went on to play for England, and the Club were relegated to Division 3. Bert Head, like many managers before and since, became a victim of his own success and was sacked as a result of the demotion. He was replaced by Danny Williams, a shrewd Yorkshireman who set about building a new team. He bought players such as Peter Downsbrough, Joe Butler, Peter Noble, John Smith, Don Heath, Frank Burrows and Stan Harland at bargain prices and these players, along with the incumbent Roger Smart, Rod Thomas, John Trollope and Don Rogers formed the squad that went on to the Club's greatest achievement in 1969 - victory at Wembley in the League Cup Final, as a Third Division side!

In the next issue we will look back at the Club's progress from their Wembley success against Arsenal to achieving Premiership status in the early 1990's under the managership of Glen Hoddle.

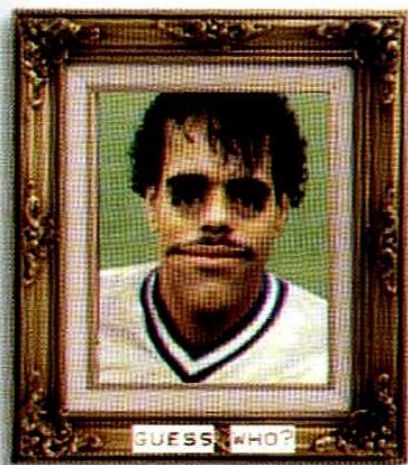

# TURNING BACK the clock

## Chris **K**amara

Welcome to our A to Z of former Swindon Town players.  
This week we take a look back at Chris Kamara.

Chris Kamara was born in Middlesbrough on Christmas Day in 1957. He began his career with Portsmouth scoring seven goals in 63 appearances. Danny Williams signed him for a fee of around £14,000 prior to the start of the 1977/79 season. "It's a little bit of a gamble signing a lad of 19 but if it comes off he could be a great player" said Danny, who used Chris on the right side of midfield.

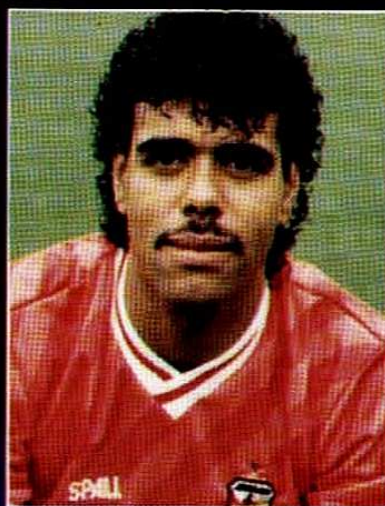
Kamara made his debut in a 3-1 League Cup match at Swansea but his first League game was at Hillsborough a week later. A target for racial abuse from a small section of the Wednesday crowd he gave them the best possible answer by robbing a Sheffield player just outside the box and racing in to beat the keeper from an acute angle. This goal was enough to earn Town a point and was the first of 10 League goals Chris scored during the season during which he also netted twice during a 3-0 home win over Cardiff in the FA Cup Third Round.

During the following season he fell out of favour with new manager Bob Smith and was placed on the transfer list. In November 1979 he re-established a regular first team place and took part in the latter stages of the League Cup run which saw Swindon go down 4-3 on aggregate to Wolves in the semi-final. The start of the 1981/82 season saw Kamara unable to agree a contract with Swindon and he

returned to his old club Portsmouth for a fee of £50,000 after having made 133 full and 14 substitute appearances for Swindon.

Kamara's second spell at Portsmouth was a brief one. He made just 11 appearances before moving to Brentford in an exchange deal. It was from here that he re-signed for Swindon on the opening day of the 1985/86 season for a fee of £12,500. Although the season was to be one of great success for Swindon, Chris failed to hold down a regular place. He did however appear in the match against Chester City which saw Swindon clinch promotion to Division Three. In this match it was a foul on Kamara which led to Steve Johnson of Chester being booked before the ball had left the centre circle, probably the quickest booking in any Town match.

It was in a match at Shrewsbury during the 1986/87 season that the incident which marred Chris



Kamara's second period with the Town took place. As the players left the pitch, Kamara elbowed an opponent, breaking his jaw. He was suspended by Swindon and eventually fined by the Shrewsbury magistrates. Although his long legs would often go sliding into tackles from a distance, Kamara had never been a vicious player and it seems that racial taunts had led to this uncharacteristic loss of temper.

Swindon again won promotion but the close season saw an exodus of stars from the County Ground with Jimmy Quinn and Dave Bamber leaving. Kamara also left, refusing a pay rise and taking up a two-year contract with Stoke City. He retained links with Swindon for a while, running an off-license in York Road. He has since spent a period as manager of Bradford City and now commentates for radio.

## the italian job

Like Manchester City, Italian giants Napoli play in sky blue. But the similarities don't end there. Like City Napoli have fallen on hard times in recent years and are currently languishing in the Italian Second Division - Serie B. A period of heavy debt which saw the once proud club drop out of the top flight and lose star players such as Gianfranco Zola contrasted heavily with the 1980s when Diego Maradona starred in a Scudetto league championship winning side.

Now though help may be at hand. Apparently a British based consortium, poised to take over this great club in a deal believed to be worth around £50 million. It appears that with debts now at a more manageable £2 million, the consortium believe the time is right. The club still attract crowds of around 40,000 and as the only major club in the region have a large catchment area. The consortium known as Finbury Sports International has stated that promotion back to Serie A is a priority and will invest transfer funds to aid the task.

## pulses racing

Former Tottenham captain Steve Perryman has recently been lured across the other side of the world. He has just led Japanese side Shimizu S Pulse to the J League second stage title and will now lead them into a play-off with first stage winners Jubilo Iwata to decide the overall league title. Perryman has been in charge of Shimizu ever since former boss Ossie Ardiles joined Jubilo in Zagreb 12 months ago. Perryman had previously worked under his former Tottenham team mate and paid tribute to the former boss by saying: 'I was grateful for my way to inherit Ardiles' team. Ardiles was present to witness the triumph having been sacked by Zagreb two months back following their premature exit from the UEFA Champions League.

## waiting for the metro

Lothar Matthäus has put his decision to join MLS side New York/New Jersey MetroStars on hold. The 36 year old German international was supposed to join in January but was persuaded to stay at Bayern Munich until March. Now, to the American club's fury, he is saying he may stay until the end of the season. The lure of the Champions League is clearly too much for him to honour his word and the fact that a few good displays in front of Germany's head coach Uli Ribbeck may increase his chance of playing in Euro 2000 means that New York may have to wait some time before their promised signing materialises.

Cedric Roussel, Coventry's on-loan Belgium striker is desperate to win a permanent deal at Highfield Road. The Belgium U-21 international was brought in from Ghent until the end of the season. Sky Blues' boss Gordon Strachan needed cover for injured front men Noel Whelan and John Aloisi.

Roussel, who hit the winner against local rivals Aston Villa last week, said: "I want to sign for Coventry. I love this club and the city. The atmosphere at the stadium and the supporters are fantastic."

Sky Blues chairman Bryan Richardson has already talked about his desires to land the Ghent ace on a permanent basis, so the deal will hinge on whether his club will allow the player to leave on a permanent basis.

## shifting sutton

Chris Sutton is considering a change of position to show Chelsea that he is no big-money misfit. After another barren month in front of goal Gianluca Vialli is fast losing patience with the man he brought in for £10 million last summer. Sutton began his career at Norwich City as a centre half and it may provide the answer to Vialli's impending problems in defence. Frank Leboeuf has been the subject of transfer rumours with one bid of around £10 million reportedly refused. At 29 he's not getting any younger and Vialli may try and recoup the cash he laid out on Sutton five months ago to try again for a goal-getter. Furthermore, Marcel Desailly is 32, and will not go on forever leading to speculation that Sutton will fill in at the back or move on to resurrect his goal-scoring fortunes.



## bridge ban

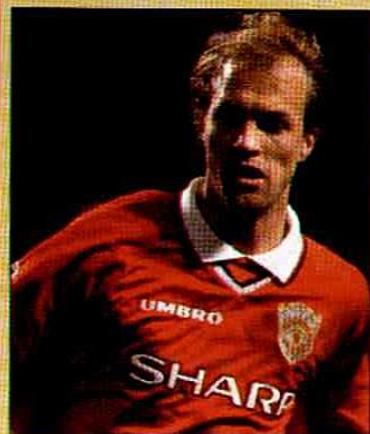

## jordi oyff!

Jordi Cruyff has finally given up hope of holding down a regular place in the Manchester United line-up and confirmed that he will be leaving the Red Devils in the summer, when his contract expires.

The son of Dutch footballing legend Johan has been at Old Trafford for four seasons and his yet to win over Sir Alex Ferguson in his attempts to claim a regular first team place, despite emphasising that he would fight for his place only five months ago, but his patience could seemingly only stretch so far.

He said "In four seasons here I've only made 48 appearances in the first team - 23 as substitute.

During the past couple of seasons I've just not made enough progress and I can't see my situation changing.

"But I've gained tremendous experience here and I'll leave with happy memories."

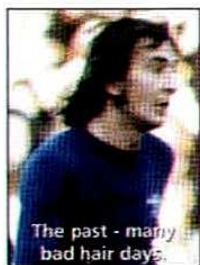
# False Memory Syndrome

## Following Football - Lesson 3

Despite popular opinion, anglers are not the biggest liars in sport. All they do is manipulate the size of their catches and of 'the ones that got away'. Soccer fans on the other hand stray away from the truth almost as often as a young Pinocchio. I can, of course, categorise the main areas of footballing falsehoods.

I'll start with the 'Past glories re-visited'. Not only did we all have a better side than today but we had 'characters' in our teams. What this really means is that, when we were younger, we were less critical and we had, as did most football teams, a 'clogger'. A man who took out his teeth before the game and anyone who strayed into his lumbering path during it. Usually older in appearance, balding, grey-skinned, wiry and with a nickname which announced his intentions e.g.: 'Cruncher' Hicks, 'Skinner' Normanton or 'Chopper' Harris. But, despite what your dad says lads, they were not 'characters' they were hit-men and, had they been born in the Argentine instead of Hartlepool, the Sun newspaper would have been baying for the firing squad.

Another area where imagination distorts the truth is 'How much better and cheaper it all was in the past'. Then, you could go to football with your mates, have a couple of pints on the way, stand on the terraces, buy a programme, a Bovril, and a pork pie (leftovers of which could be used to feed your dog who entered the ground with you) have a bag of chips on the way home while you waited for the 'Pink' to arrive at the news-stand and still have change out of 7/6 d (but you were only earning £8 per week!). The truth is that many people worked on a Saturday morning during this era, they didn't get a pre-match build-up on local radio or a summary of their team's league on lunch-time TV. They drank two quick, flat, warm pints in a four ale

bar in an atmosphere heavy with stale sweat and nicotine and then hurried down to the ground hoping there were enough of the aforesaid pork pies to go round. Nowadays you can have a drink at the ground, choose from hot or cold buffet selections (but you still have to take the pork pie for the dog home with you). No one will stop you and your mates standing up to clap and cheer should you feel the need, you can still get a programme but you don't need to use it as a makeshift funnel for a DIY commode, as you did then, because of a combination of fear of losing your vantage point on the bank (i.e. somewhere where you could see one goal and 25% of the rest of the field) and fear of using the public urinals - the earliest form of 'black hole'. And, furthermore, you can eat your chips with a glass of Riocca in front of the T.V. at home and see the goals within minutes of the end of the match.



Glad to be dumped out of the cup?

Then there are the little fibs we all tell ourselves, and others, such as 'We are glad to be dumped out of the Cup so we can concentrate on the league'. Then there is the ever-popular

'We're playing too well to go down' and the evergreen 'We have a very good team - we just leak goals at the back'. The list of these self-delusions is endless and, in truth, mean exactly the opposite. 'We are not worried about being bottom of league as nothing gets sorted before Christmas.'

These little white lies are not for supporters alone, they also come from the boards and managements. Here are a few little gems: 'The manager has our full backing', 'I'm not motivated by money alone - there is such a thing as loyalty in my book'. These are usually muttered by a player, or manager, as he clears his locker or desk and, of course the 'I am, at the end of the day, a fan just like everyone else'. (Yes Mr Fayed, or any other league Chairman, of course you are!).

Another twilight zone is that of total delusion, as in the very popular 'I was there when .....'. This is a similar phenomenon to the one whereby anyone now over 50 and born in Liverpool either went to school with, or was a personal friend of, one (or all) of the Beatles. I have known Swindon supporters to whom an away game at Portsmouth required weeks of intense planning with military precision, but whose recollections of 'those days', over the years gradually mutated into tales of how they, during the same period, travelled extensively across Europe watching British clubs win trophies and England lose World Cups. They saw Jimmy Greaves score his best goals, watched Stanley Matthews finish his career, they drank with Dave Mackie and played bowls with Don Rogers. Maybe I'm too cynical. Maybe they did. After all, supporters were all characters then.

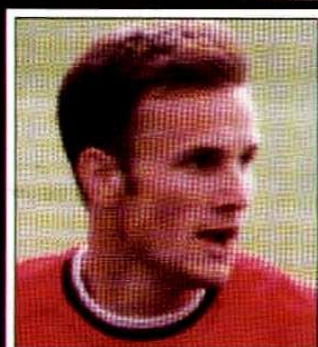
