Welcome back to planet earth - and wasn't it a heavy landing? They say that after pride comes a fall and we're now discovering how true that saving is.

From the glamour of an F.A. Cup semi-final to the harsh reality of life at the wrong end of Division Two, the last couple of weeks has been a tough lesson for all of us.

The cup run - especially our performance against Liverpool a magnificent achievement, but that's now history. Like a grieving relative, it's time to let go and get on with the rest of our lives.

We're in a tricky situation and there's no point in feeling sorry for ourselves. Everyone - players and supporters alike - needs to dig in and haul us across the finishing line to a position of safety.

We won't be getting any favours from our opponents just because we flew the Nationwide flag successfully in the F.A. Cup. We have to play three teams -Swindon, Bristol Rovers and Colchester - who need the points just as desperately as we need them.

Our games might not be pretty from here to the end of the season, but results matter far more than performances for a team in our position.

I thought our supporters were excellent in the last home game against Wrexham. It's not easy to go from the glamour of Villa Park to a dour struggle for survival, but you stayed behind the team right through to the final whistle.

Your patience understanding was rewarded with an 86th minute equaliser and after conceding so many late goals this season, it was satisfying that our opponents were on the receiving end for a change.

It was plain to see against Wrexham that the players had very little left "in the tank". The emotions of semi-final weekend followed by a disappointing midweek result against Swansea had clearly left them physically and mentally drained.

However, although they played well below par, the players never gave up and I'm certain that spirit will see us through.

Moving on, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Wycombe District Council for giving the club a civic reception, but I'd also like to issue them with a friendly challenge. To be feted by the town's authorities was a great honour, but we need their help on a long-term basis.

Previous town hall regimes have treated this club as an unwanted intruder. In the days when we were trying to relocate from the old ground at Loakes Park, we constantly met with an obstructive attitude.

Since moving to Adams Park we've encountered problems with regard to access, parking and safety matters. Previous councils have done little or nothing to help us.

So, this is a wonderful opportunity for our present rulers to show how much they appreciate what Wycombe Wanderers brings to the area.

You can't put a price on the positive publicity generated by our cup adventure. The name Wycombe been emblazoned across every newspaper in the land and been seen and heard on every television and radio station.

We've put High Wycombe on the map and given the whole community something to be very proud of. Now, surely, we deserve something in return.

One biggest of the headaches this club faces is the simple problem of getting to and from the ground and finding suitable parking places. Surveys have shown this to be a major factor in deterring people from coming to games at Adams Park.

But there's not much more that the club can do. We've tried our best to secure more parking places and we've worked hard with the police and local authorities to improve access to the stadium only to be frustrated.

Throughout the Football League there are many clubs who receive positive support from their local councils even to the extent of financial help in the form of sponsorship. That has never been the case for Wycombe Wanderers.

I believe that the present council has displayed a genuine interest in the club and they've already shown their appreciation in a small way of what we've achieved. If they could help us solve the problems of access and parking, it would be a popular and lasting testimony to their commitment the community.

As Lawrie Sanchez said after the semi-final, this isn't the end of the Wycombe Wanderers story, it's just the beginning. But to write the next chapter, we need all the help we can get.

After relegation from Division One last season Swindon Town must have wondered how they would fair in Division Two facing a financial crisis at the County Ground. Plans were put in place to get the club back on a sound footing but it did affect results on the pitch. Colin Todd, who had been appointed as manager at the end of the previous season, left to join Derby County former Evertonian Andy King was appointed. Since his arrival results have been up and down, a good run blunted by a string of defeats has been the pattern to date. Like so many clubs in this Division Swindon have had to work on a limited budget and although they are just on the edge of the drop zone, must be wondering if they will get sucked into the relegation places for a second term. Their current form puts them in the bottom half and with an average attendance of 6,125 they occupy seventh

position in attendances for the Division.

The signing of lan Woan on a free from Nottingham Forest has been a first class move by Andy King. The midfielder has brought stability and consistency to the side along with his vast experience. Australian striker Danny Invincibile has weighed in with a good share of goals and will be hoping to help lift the team to safety.

The Robins had not won for seven matches until last Tuesday evening when they beat Brentford 1-0 at Griffin Park. With two draws five defeats and just that one win the pressure is on for them to claim enough points to secure Second Division football for next season. Back in 1993-94 Swindon were enjoying life in the Premiership as Wanderers were finding their feet as the newest Football League club in Division Three. A brief

sojourn into Division Two back in 1995-96 lasted one season before regaining First Division status, that will not be happening this time. Last Saturday they lost 1-0 to top of the table Millwall at the New Den in a very tight match, on Monday they were at

home to Notts County and went down 2-1 after leading 1-0 at half time.

It is important we take something from this game as our league form has suffered during the magnificent journey to the F.A. Cup Semi-final. Over the last two months we have been dragged into the relegation battle going on just above the bottom four places, of which Swindon Town are very much involved.

COUNTY GROUND



Swindon Town moved into the County Ground after fifteen years at The Croft. Formed in 1881 Swindon turned professional in 1894 but did not join the Football League until 1920 when they were founder members of the Third Division.

The County Ground has been well established since the 1920's and various stages of development have taken place as the club have progressed through the Football League.

Not so long ago the Robins were members of the Premier League and brought the stadium into line with the all seater policy required for the Premiership. The current capacity is 15,728 with a playing surface measuring 114 x 74 yards.

ANDY KING

Andy King was appointed as Town's assistant manager by Colin Todd during the pre-season of 2000-01. He had previously worked as a scout for his good friend Peter Reid at Sunderland.


During his playing career he appeared for Luton Town, Everton, QPR and Wolves with a total of 92 goals to his name.

His first spell management saw him take charge of Mansfield Town in 1993 where he spent the next three years, which included a shock cup win over Leeds United.

Andy took temporary charge of the Robins when controversy loomed over Colin Todd's future that finally saw him move to Derby County. After three games without defeat, he took full charge of team affairs having convinced Chairman Terry Brady that he was the man for the job. Some astute buys and some good results in the league have kept Swindon Town in with a chance of Second Division football next season.

On the Pitch





STEVE MILDENHALL (22) One of Swindon's home grown talents, Steve is in his fourth year as a professional after successfully coming through the Club's YTS system. Made two first team appearances in 1995/96, came off the bench to play as an outfield player in 1996/97 and made his full league debut between the posts for Swindon in October 1997. Has recently come into the first team and has impressed, despite being pelted with missiles against Oxford! Has made the number 1 jersey his own for 15 of the last 16 games and is held in high regard by King.


BART GRIEMINK (29) The 6 ft 4 Dutch goalkeeper played second fiddle to England Under 21 international Mark Tyler Peterborough for the past couple of seasons. After only making 44 league appearances for The Posh he decided it was time for a new challenge when his contract expired during the summer. Held the number one spot until suspension allowed Steve Mildenhall the chance to impress.

IN DEFENCE

MARK ROBINSON (32) Started his career at West Bromwich Albion. ioined Barnsley on a free in June 1986 and such was his form there that Newcastle snapped him up for £450,000 in March 1993. After losing his place in the first team through injury. Mark is now the Town's longest serving player since Swindon paid a Club record £600,000 for his services in July 1994. He has been a consistent and versatile performer ever since.

GARETH DAVIES (32) Was signed on a free transfer in March 1999. Gareth made the short trip down the M4 from Reading and despite being a firm favourite with the Royals' fans, did not figure in Tommy Burns' plans. However, Town fans only caught glimpses of him in action due to several injuries. Has made a full recovery but as yet, has not played in the first team this season.

ADAM WILLIS (24) Released by the Sky Blues after failing to make the grade in the Premiership. Adam was called into action from the reserves towards the end of last season to cover for injuries and suspensions. Adam worked very hard in the gym after training to improve his physical presence and it paid off. His confident displays earned him a place in the starting line-up on merit and he was rewarded with a new contract under Colin Todd. Is now battling for a first team place with the arrival of Matt Heywood.



ALAN REEVES (33) Quit Wimbledon's "Crazy Gang" in search of first team football with Swindon. Tall central defender, who cost the Dons £300,000 from Rochdale. Excellent header of the ball, 32-year-old Reeves can be an asset in attack on set pieces, scoring 2 goals in 24 appearances last season. Despite being linked with several clubs in the summer, Reeves is working hard to command a first team place. Began this season as top scorer (with four) and has become a firm favourite of Andy King.

SOL DAVIS (21) Left-sided fullback back who was offered his first professional contract in the summer of 1998 after a series of impressive performances in the reserves. Made his league debut as a substitute at home to QPR, shortly after his 18th birthday. First start in a Swindon shirt came six months later

in the heat of a local derby clash away at Oxford United. Last season Sol made over 25 appearances for Town in both the fullback and positions and his wingback commitment was exemplified by some very tough tackling which has been continued this term.

JAMES WILLIAMS (18) burst onto the scene towards the end of the 1998/99 season. He was duly rewarded with the number 32 shirt at the start of last season and the young defender/midfielder became a very useful asset to the dwindling squad. James can be called upon to play in a variety of positions and although he made an impact on the first team his form dropped. Was given his chance in the LDV Trophy against Wycombe and impressed with his tough tackling and endless

JUAN COBIAN (25) joined Aberdeen from Sheffield Wednesday on a free transfer in November '99. Cobian, a rampaging right-sided defender, made a promising start to 1998-99 with the Owls having joined the club for a nominal fee during the 1998 close season. This summer he moved, again on a free transfer, to the County Ground despite offers from a number of clubs.

ANTOINE VAN DER LINDEN (21) Central defender whose composure on the ball has made him a vital asset to King's team. Looks to set up attacks from the back with his sweet left foot. Agile and solid. Has impressed in recent games and his attitude and desire to win is second to none. Has also had a spell up front, Andy King using his strength and pace in the final third.


MATTHEW HEYWOOD failed to break through at Turf Moor and, after being alerted as to his availability by Shaun Reid, Andy King snapped him up on a free transfer. Has signed until the end of next season and has shown in the few games that he's played, just how good in the air he can be. Strong in the tackle and good with the ball.



ANDY WILLIAMS (23) moved from Southampton in October 1999 in a £65,000 deal after an impressive loan spell at the County Ground. Andy is an extremely versatile player and has taken on a variety of defensive and midfield duties. Formerly a regular Welsh Under-21 international he became a strong candidate for Player of the Season last term which showed how well he settled into the side.

BOBBY HOWE (27) Stephen, who

likes to be known as Bobby, is an attacking midfielder who signed for Swindon in January 1998 from Nottingham Forest, where his first team opportunities had dried up. Bobby's confidence suffered last season and fell out of favour in the first team. However, after being told he could leave the club he has worked hard to re-establish himself in the side.



IAN WOAN (33) Arguably Town's greatest signing this season. After falling out of favour at Barnsley Woan decided to join the Town until the end of the season. Has been the club's most consistent performer since joining, orchestrating the proceedings in midfield. Seems to have an eternity on the ball and can thread damaging balls through to the forwards. Contains a venomous shot, Town supporters will hope that he signs a more permanent deal.

MATTHEW HEWLETT (24) An attacking midfielder that signed for Town on a free transfer in July 2000. A hot prospect at local rivals Bristol City in 1998/99. At the time a succession of injuries meant that he missed most of the season and failed

to live up to his potential. A fresh start was just the challenge he needed and impressed immediately at the County Ground. Started the season extremely well but has suffered through injury since. Has returned to the side and impressed in the centre of the park, most notably a superb game against Swansea.

DAVID DUKE (22) Another young player with a great deal of potential. A left-sided midfielder, he was unable to command a first-team start at Premiership Sunderland after joining them in June '97 from Redby. Impressed in several pre-season friendlies and signed on a free transfer in July and has played well at times this season. Has recently fitted the left-wing back role in the absence of Sol Davis.



DANNY INVINCIBLE (22) Andy King believes that midfielder Danny Invincible can become a real star after completing a deal to sign the Australian on a free transfer in July. Previous manager Colin Todd moved swiftly to tie up a deal for Invincible after spotting the 20-year-old playing for West Ham in a trial match. The former Marconi Stallions star scored on his Town debut in a 1-1 draw against West Brom at the Hawthorns.

Invincible, a former Australian under-20's star, plays predominantly on the right hand side of midfield, possess blistering pace and has already become a crowd favourite with his ability to run at defences. Town's top scorer with twelve goals.

KEITH O'HALLORAN (25) He made six starts for Middlesbrough where he came through the youth ranks before joining St Johnstone in March' 97 for £50,000. Keith went on to make over 60 appearances for the Saints but relished the opportunity of proving himself in England after a very successful period at McDiarmid Park. Despite being offered a new contract north of the border, he chose to join Swindon's new era. The Town fans will be delighted to see a natural right-sided midfielder at the club after it became a huge problem position last campaign...




GIULIANO GRAZIOLI (26) Signed in June 1999 on a free transfer from his former club Peterborough Utd. Giuliano's previous visit to the County Ground was in 1997 with Stevenage Town in the FA Cup 3rd round. His winning goal dumped Swindon out and handed Stevenage a money-making 4th round tie against Newcastle Utd. Missed most of last season through injury, but when he did play he was the shining light in a very dull season for Swindon, Following the departures of fellow strikers Chris Hay and Iffy Onuora, 'Graz' established himself as the Town's main threat.

STEVE COWE (26) is a nippy, darting forward with good vision and very quick feet. Rarely called upon under former manager Jim Quinn,

Steve tried to find another club after he was told he had no future with the Robins. However, Steve was another player that came in from the football wilderness to finish the season strongly and do well enough to warrant a new contract with Andy King. Two goals in the FA Cup against Gateshead were enough to establish a good run in the side and has played extremely well.

GARY ALEXANDER (21) Highlyrated 21-year-old who joined the Robins in early August from West Ham United in a Ω300,000 deal. Gary spent most of last season on loan at Exeter City where he made a big impression - scoring 16 goals in 20 appearances and keeping The Grecians out of relegation trouble in the process. A powerful and hardworking forward. Alexander has struggled to find the net but two goals against Wycombe in the LDV Trophy could be enough to kick-start his campaign.

MICHAEL REDDY (21) He was first spotted by Town boss Andy King when King was chief scout at Sunderland and joined the club as a trainee for a £50,000 fee. He signed as a professional on the 1st of August 1999, making his debut on Oct 12 1999 coming on as a substitute at Wimbledon in the Worthington Cup. Sunderland lost that game 3-2. Michael has made 14 appearances in Sunderland's colours, but only two of those have seen him start a game, both times being in the Worthington Cup. He has scored two goals for the Black Cats: one this season in the 2-1 away win at Luton in the Worthington Cup, and one last season in a 1-1 draw away to Middlesbrough. Has been in sensational form, scoring four in his first four games,



First Ever Meeting

FIRST EVER MEETING between Wanderers and Swindon town took place on December 26th 1995 at the County Ground when both were members of Division Two. At the time Swindon were top of the table under manager Steve McMahon while the Blues were ninth with Alan Smith in charge. The match was played on a very icy pitch in bitterly cold conditions and ended 0-0. Wycombe had the best chance of the game when Steve Brown was put clear in the closing stages only for goalkeeper Fraser Digby to pull off a great save. The gate was 12,976. At the end of that season Swindon won promotion back to Division One, the Wanderers finished in twelfth position.

PLAYGROUNDS

Part 7

Other outside work I found very enjoyable were visits to the clay pigeon range and the many angles to fire at the clay birds. We also visited the range on Kidwelly Flats to loose off a number of rounds on the Vickers and Browning Then came the real machine guns. thing, when we were introduced to the Blenheims for some air gunnery. Three of us trainees were virtually stuffed into the bowels of the Blenheim. Once the aircraft was airborne, one of us clambered through to the turret where a single Vickers K gun was fitted to which you fitted your pan of 100 rounds of .303 ammunition. The turret was worked hydraulically and controlled by a pair of handlebars which rotated the turret and twisting the grips elevated or depressed the gun and the seat rose and fell in unison.

After the first person had completed his 100 rounds he swapped places with the next trainee. I can tell you it was necessary to be very agile and mobile to keep transposing positions in a very small space. We had to fill our own pans of ammunition. One trainee used the plain ammunition: the other two had to dip the heads of their bullets in either red or blue paint. The reason being that we all fired at the same drogue target that was towed by a Lysander aircraft. It was therefore possible to define the accuracy of the various gunners by the colour on plain bullet holes in the drogue.

During a period of 9 days we completed 16 air shooting exercises – rather busy – several times flying twice a day and once, three times. We did not have much free time, although evenings were mostly free and usually all day Sunday. The nearest town was Llanelli (know to RAF personnel, for some reason unknown to me, as "Slash". Some of you who have visited the Chairman's office at Adams Park, which he allows me to use, now know the reason for the large coloured

print of a Blenheim which adorns one of the walls. Another place we visited one Sunday and found very interesting was Carmarthen. As you probably know, Wales is similar to Scotland and does not have any pubs open on a Sunday, but it is possible to get a drink if you are members of a Club. We were fortunate in Carmarthen to meet up with a very hospitable Welshman who was a Club member and invited us in as his personal guests. Two things about this – the beer was cheaper, and available – which was not always the case in the pubs in "Slash".

At the conclusion of the course we were presented with our AG Half Wing Brevet, to let the World at large know we were fully trained and qualified Air Gunners. Also, we were all promoted to the rank of Sergeant. The next five weeks were spent at Prestwick where we were introduced to airborne radar, known as ASV (anti surface vessel) and

carried out exercises in a hairy twinengined rejected operational aircraft called a Blackburn Botha. The big experience was flying back to base over the Irish Sea on one engine, which happened often and a few fell into the sea. The following month was spent at Hooton Park near Port Sunlight on the Wirral, flying radio, gunnery and other exercises in Airspeed Oxfords. All very pleasant.

At the end of the course we were allocated into groups of three, being one Wireless Operator Mechanic Air Gunner and two Wireless Operator Air Gunners, and all allocated to Flying Boats of Coastal Command. We had been asked beforehand what we liked to fly in Coastal Command and my pals and I had all asked for Bristol Beaufort Torpedo Bombers - mad fools that we were! True to form, having been asked we were then allocated to something entirely different. I had been allocated to Sunderland Flying Boats and my particular pal to Catalinas. We were allowed to swap and I had no difficulty rejoining my pal, as most preferred the four-engined Sunderlands. Then off to Invergordon, almost at John O'Groats, to join the Operational Training Unit which all went rather peacefully except when we were fired at by one of HM ships near the Orkney Islands because we were slow at flashing the letter of the day.

The next six weeks were at Lough Erne in Northern Ireland on the borders of the Free State, getting used to flying our new Catalina - uneventful except for the disappointment of finding an empty lifeboat in Mid-Atlantic following a U-boat attack on a convoy. On the Lough were a number of Lerwick twinengined flying boats (rather like a smaller version of the Sunderland) which were considered unsuitable for operations and were being ferried back to Strangaer to be broken up. A certain Flight Lieutenant Ogle-Scan had the job of doing the ferrying. He used to take off at Lough Erne, his big moustache drooping at the edges, his large kalabash pipe puffing out clouds of smoke, circle Castle Archdale the operational Headquarters, and offer a dignified two-fingered salute before setting course for Strangaer.






Pre match

As we had for the Leicester quarter final. we left unbelievably early. On this, the day of the biggest game in Wycombe Wanderers history. we were determined to leave nothing to chance. Inevitably there were no traffic problems. the car behaved especially well, and at approximately 11.30hrs (a mere 270 minutes before kick-off!) we had negotiated Spaghetti Junction and were nearing the ground on Aston Hall Road.

Amazingly, plenty Wycombe fans had arrived before us and the light and dark blue shirts, painted faces, and flags made a colourful sight on a sunny spring morning. The organisation in the area was excellent with clear signs directina supporters recommended parking areas. We paid £4 to park at the New Aston Social Club that was about a 10min walk from the ground. A £1 admission fee gave admission to the Social Club and by noon this was packed with Wycombe fans. It was a good place to pass some time pre match. Drinks were at reasonable prices and it was a chance to meet up with friends and watch Sky Sports on the huge TV screen.

The Stadium

On our way to the ground we stopped to watch the convoy of coaches arriving packed with our supporters. It was an amazing sight - coach after coach, from many a different company, all full of excited fars proud to be wearing the colours of the Wanderers. We gasped at the size of the Holte End, the largest end-stand in Europe with a capacity of 13,600. The rest of the stadium is also impressive. On one side is the

rebuilt and enlarged Trinity Road Stand, while the other two stands, the Doug Ellis on one side, and the North Stand behind the other goal, are both large two-tier cantilever constructions.

Matchday Programme

It was a typical "big match" production - 60 A4 size pages with a nice glossy cover. Programmes of this size of course are a nightmare to carry around with you on the day and to store when you get home. The programme will of course be an essential souvenir of our historic day out. The contents however were rather disappointing - a shortage of action photos from previous rounds and few statistics - it was nice however to see the name of Wycombe Wanderers sitting proudly in the listing of clubs that have appeared at the semi-final stage. It was nice also to read the comments of some of our supporters on the club's achievement. We had a moan at the price - but what is a fiver when you've bought tickets at £35?

Match Overview - first half

When our players emerged for the warm-up they received an incredible reception from our supporters, and the sight of the light and dark blue cards held aloft by the packed ranks at the Holte End before kick-off was truly spectacular. We survived an instant Liverpool assault then competed tremendously well early half. Ryan's audacious lob was just too high and later his header from a Simpson free kick unfortunately found Westerveld ideally placed. Taylor's superb save from Owen produced chants of

"Taylor for England" from the Holte End. We were then denied a penalty when Brown was seemingly pushed in the back, then Rammell just failed to reach a Bulman cross. Ziege's overhead kick was too close for comfort, but we were deservedly on level terms at the interval.

Match Overview - second half

With the pitch becoming increasingly heavy, and certain Liverpool legs looking tired, the minutes passed steadily without us having too many problems. The longer it stayed goal less, I thought the more chance we had of our miracle going one step further. Houllier however didn't want extra time and on the hour made the change that was to prove crucial - the introduction of Heskey for Ziege. Taylor saved his header in the 76th minute in style, but was helpless when the England forward met Gerrard's cross in style two minutes later. Five minutes later came that debatable free kick on the edge of the area and Fowler's unstoppable free kick. Ryan's lob however gave us all hope and, remembering our late, late goals at Wimbledon and Leicester, I prayed for a repeat. It was not to be however. We were losers on the day but our players could proudly look back on their performances at Villa Park - they had given their all.

Post Match

It was truly mixed emotions afterwards. The sunshine of the morning had long since given in to steady, heavy rain. No-one said much on the walk back to the car park – flags were now used as protection against the

rain and all efforts were concentrated on keeping those giant programmes dry. It took an eternity to travel the short distance to the M6 where the traffic congestion was made worse by convoys of north Londoners returning from Old My 10-year-old Trafford. daughter for once was quiet her dream of seeing her beloved Wanderers in the final had been finally destroyed. Her face paints, lovingly applied hours earlier, were soon smudged beyond recognition by innocent tears. We were truly proud of the team but couldn't hide the disappointment of having come so close to a trip to the Millennium Stadium.

Monday Morning Writings

The Daily Telegraph - "Driven by a dream and a manager who had tasted Liverpool blood once before, the team who sit in 18th place in Div 2 were simply magnificent. They defended just as Liverpool had done at the Nou Camp three days earlier. defying the individual brilliance of their opponents as if far more than a place at a Cup Final was at stake. Wycombe fought with breathless enthusiasm for the opening 75 minutes, chasing every ball, making every tackle. and limiting their illustrious opponents to only a handful of chances."

The Independent — "For three quarters of this match, Wycombe's tireless harrying and covering, allied to a belief in themselves which echoed that which had been publicly expressed by their manager in the preceding week, kept alive the possibility that Liverpool might find themselves on the wrong end of an FA Cup semi-final."



The majority of the 5,482 crowd at Adams Park last Saturday breathed an enormous sigh of relief when Chris Vinnicombe's 86th minute free kick found the back of the Wrexham net. It was the defender's first goal in Wycombe colours in his 131st appearance, and salvaged a vital point as we endeavoured to keep away from the bottom four.

Oxford United had booked the first relegation slot the previous Saturday when Oldham Athletic became the 13th side to win at The Manor. Last Saturday David Kemp's side went down 3-2 at Wigan Athletic. This latest defeat increased their goals conceded column to 88. With five games remaining they will hope to avoid reaching the century mark. There are problems off the field as well with a fire at their new stadium causing damage estimated at up to £60,000. Detectives are suspecting arson - United however remain hopeful that the stadium will be ready for the start of their 3rd Division campaign in August. The result at the JJB stadium was a vital one for Wigan as they bounced back after their home defeat by Brentford seven days earlier. The three points enabled Steve Bruce's side to consolidate their play-off slot.

Swansea City boss John Hollins called it "two pints lost rather than one gained" after his side only drew 0-0 at The Vetch with third placed Rotherham United. The Swans had a great chance to secure the points when they were awarded a penalty when Jamaican striker Walter Boyd (two goal hero against Wycombe four days earlier) was brought down by Rotherham keeper Paul Pettinger. The keeper redeemed himself by saving Matthew Bound's penalty. Swansea remained 14 points away from safety with just 6 games remaining.

Luton Town increased their run of games without a victory to 7 following Saturday's 0-0 home draw with Oldham Athletic. With relegation now seemingly becoming inevitable, boss Joe Kinnear lamented - "We played ever so well and I can't complain about the general standard of our play except for the allimportant matter of scoring goals we must have had at least 9 clear cut chances but weren't ruthless enough to take them and that is the root of our troubles

Bristol Rovers kept their hopes of avoiding the drop alive when two goals in the last five minutes secured the points against Colchester United. This was just their 4th home win of the season. The first goal came from Latvian international Vitaliis Astafievs who will miss Rovers' next two games due to international commitments. The result leaves Col U far from safety, Steve Whitton's

side being just 6 points ahead of Rovers. Wycombe's last two games of the season are against these

Today's opponents Swindon Town, who had moved above Wycombe by virtue of their midweek victory at Brentford, returned to London and went down 1-0 at leaders Millwall. The Lions winner came from Neil Harris who netted his 26th of the season just two minutes after coming on as substitute. This left Mark McGhee's side five points clear at the top and needing 7 points in their last 3 games to secure automatic promotion. At the end of the day it looks as if Wycombe did Millwall a favour by knocking them out of the FA Cup last December as the Londoners are one of the few sides without major fixture congestion in the final stages of the

Following their 4-1 demolition of Bury at the Madeiski, Reading stayed in 2nd place, 5 points behind Millwall but with a game in hand. The game was watched by The Royals best gate of the season, 16,829. Jamie Cureton netted his 26th goal of the season, while Martin Butler's brace took his personal tally to 24. Bury striker Colin Cramb had given the visitors an early lead but was later red carded for striking Reading skipper Phil Parkinson. Bury's Bhaichung Bhutia recently played for India as they recorded a historic 1-0 win over the United Arab Emirates.

Two of the clubs likely to be involved in the play-offs met at the Britannia Stadium and Walsall were probably the happiest as they returned with a point from a 0-0 draw. Stoke City had the best chance to seal the win but Graham Kavanagh failed to convert a 30th minute penalty.

Bristol City's hope of making up ground on the play off slots was dealt a blow when they went down 2-1 at Peterborough United. Lee Matthews had given The Robins the advantage but Leon McKenzie equalised from the penalty spot and substitute Francis Green won the points for Barry Fry's side.

Finally this week. Bournemouth's slim chances of making the play-offs were kept alive when two goals from Steve Fletcher earned them the points at Notts County. Sean O'Driscoll's side have now picked up 16 points from the last 21 available. News from Notts is that they may have to spend £200,000 on re-laying the Meadow Lane pitch because of flooding. The pitch was sunk under 2 feet of water in the winter.







BERKS & BUCKS SENIOR CUP

This season's final will be staged at Slough on Bank Holiday Monday, May 7th. The finalists are our two highest placed non-league clubs - Chesham United and Maidenhead United. The Generals denied Burnham a first ever final appearance with an emphatic 6-2 victory at The Meadow. Their goals came from Statham (pen), Brown, Bowes, Pinnock, Duru and Watson. Burnham replied through Durkin and Bartley. The other semi-final was a much closer affair. Windsor & Eton (two divisions below Maidenhead) gave the Magpies the fright of their lives, hitting crossbar and post, and going close several other times. Matt Glynn had put United ahead only for Dennis Greene to equalise from the penalty spot. Then, in the 90th minute, Lee Channell netted his 19th goal of the season to put United into the final. It will be Maidenhead's third B & B final in four years, whilst it was 8 years ago when Chesham last won the trophy.

WINDSOR & ETON

Like most of our neighbours, the Royalists are having major fixture congestion.
