



Firstly I must start with a massive thank-you to all the fans who have responded to our call-to-arms by supporting the club when we need you so much.

Patrick Cryne and I have been deluged with messages of goodwill since our take-over plans came to fruition. We are now in the final throws of the legal procedure to finalise the deal and I believe there is nothing to stop the transaction going through.

With the backing of manager Gudjon Thordarson, Patrick and I wrote last week to over 6000 fans who have bought season tickets in recent years. To those who have stood by the club in our recent troubles we offered our sincere thanks. To those who are now pondering the prospect of returning to the Oakwell fold we asked them to climb off the fence and actively support the new regime to the hilt.

We set ourselves a couple of goals for Tuesday night's game against Oldham. We hoped we would attract the biggest crowd to Oakwell for the season and that the figure would top the 10,000 mark.

We achieved both those aims. In fact, we had the biggest crowd of all the Second Division that night and actually topped the attendance figures for three First Division matches being played at that time.

You can be assured that all revenues the club is now receiving will be put towards building an exciting future. And it's not just in numbers that your support has been so fantastic.

The passion, commitment and spirit generated from our supporters - both at home and away games - has been remarkable. Your backing just makes us even more determined to see the takeover through and to launch our building plans for the future.

They say you can gain strength in adversity. All of us must be wiser for the experiences we've endured in recent times. Together we can harness all those lessons and build a bright future for Barnsley FC. You, our supporters, undoubtedly deserve it.

"I was not happy with the first half performance against Oldham although the second half was completely different and possibly as good as we have played. I was fairly happy with that - we had chances to win the game even though we did not take them.

"I wanted to see how we could cope playing a 442 but that seemed to be difficult and we did not adapt too well. Halfway through the first half I was even considering changing the formation but I decided to give it a bit more time. I changed it at half time and we were stronger and looked more like a team.

"It is hard to say why we struggled to get going at Port Vale and again in the first half against Oldham. We did not keep the ball well enough and we rushed it a bit. The players sometimes want to impress and catch my eye with their play but the most important thing is not each individual impressing but keeping cool and doing the right thing. Sometimes they want to impress too much and do too well and that is when mistakes happen. That is when your standards drop easily and that is how we gave the ball away too cheaply.



"In a way I was surprised how many saves Sasa Ilic had to make in the first half against Oldham. It seemed as though when we lost our shape going forward we also lose it defensively as well. It became easy for teams to come at us but the second half against Oldham was different. We were strong and solid and it is something that we have to pay attention to.

"Our goal was one of the best I have seen in a long while. It was not only a cracker of a finish but also a beautiful build up from the right to left and back across. Chris' execution in front of goal was good. It is the nature of the game that teams switch off after they get a goal because they believe they are on top. It is important for the next five or ten minutes to stay focussed and firm and not give anything away - that is something we did not do and it cost us dearly in the end.

"I said at half time that I believed a clean sheet would win us all three points. That was the outcome in the end and if we had kept them out then we would have won

the game. We got back into the game and showed a positive response after Oldham's goal went in. We got at them and had chances to win it with Lee Crooks and Dean Gorre. Unfortunately we did not do that and even at the end Crooks had a decent attempt in the air. At the end of the game we were disappointed not to collect all three points.

"Missing a penalty is something that happens in football. A couple of weeks ago we saw Alan Shearer - one of the best penalty takers in the UK - hit the stand. Most people would have put their mortgage on Dean to score but then again it is part of the excitement and unpredictability of the game. We are all human and we will make mistakes. Dean had a good game and he was very, very disappointed but I told him that we win together and lose together as a team. We stick together and there is no blame to be put on any individual whatever the result.


"It was a disappointing night for everyone but I was very pleased with the response of the supporters. They were very positive throughout even after the game when we had drawn. I know the players are trying to do their best on the pitch and I believe the supporters see that. They saw our response - we tried to improve after the first half and we kept going to win the game. I

think that matters to people.

"My friend Andy King will be at Oakwell today with Swindon and I hope he has a good day - apart from the game. I am pleased for him that Swindon are doing well and I am looking forward to a tough game. I know that Swindon have some quality players in there. It will be a tough challenge but we will be ready because it is a crucial game for us after the last few results. We have only picked up one point from the last two games so we must get all three today.

REDS youngster Brian O'Callaghan spoke exclusively to the Oakwell Review following the side's excellent start to the new campaign.

He said: "It is hard to say where things went wrong at Port Vale and we are not really too sure ourselves. We did not play in the way that we have been in the opening weeks which was very disappointing.

"I do not know what was happening and we have been scratching our heads today but



we have to make sure that we do not make the same mistakes this week. It was frustrating but the good thing is that we have two games coming up quickly to put things right.

"We can focus and there has not been time to dwell on the defeat because we want to make sure that there are no more games like that. I think we have been working really hard as a team this season and everybody has been defending well. That was not the case against Port Vale - which was disappointing.

"We had to get beat eventually and there was no chance that we would go throughout the full season without losing but it was the manner in which we played after going a goal up that was the worst thing.

"The gaffer was ok. He wanted to make sure that we did not get too down after losing and we had to focus on the coming matches. We came in on Sunday for a warm down and then started again on Monday".


He added: "I have played in midfield before when Dave Bassett was here but it has been nice to get a decent run in the team

this season. I am playing more or less a sweeper role that is something that I like.

"It is different to playing full back but to be honest I am naturally a centre half but I want to play football. Having Peter Handyside and Craig Ireland behind me has helped because they talk you through the game well. They are experienced players and have come in and done well.

"We needed some fresh faces because we have had the same players here for the last few seasons. We needed freshening up and it has been good.



"I cannot see any reason why we cannot get promoted this season after the way we have started. Since the season has started we have just got on with the games. Because of the pre-season we have had it has meant that we are quite fit so it has not worked out too badly.

"We are a bit surprised with the start we have had and perhaps it would have taken a few games to get used to each other. We did not have many games in pre-season so we now want to build on the start we have had and kick on".

REDS skipper Peter Handyside spoke exclusively to the Oakwell Review ahead of today's big game against high-flying Swindon Town.

He said: "It is difficult to say why we did not do well against Port Vale or in the first half against Oldham Athletic on Tuesday. We have played a lot of games and got the results so there was a chance that we expected to do the same in those games as well. That is something we have learnt from and we have to set our stall out from the kick off.

"We would be kidding ourselves if we thought that we would go out and dominate every game for 90 minutes. Oldham simply got out of the blocks quicker and started better than us on Tuesday night but to be fair I felt that we weathered the storm well.


"Sasa Ilic was busier than he has been in previous matches but that is what he is there for and what he has been doing very well this season. When he was called upon he has done his job fantastically. We were glad to get to half time goalless - even though we weathered the storm - because it gave us the chance to rearrange the team after a frustrating opening.

"We are always disappointed to concede a goal but to let one in straight after we had taken the lead was a blow. It is something that we must deal with and learn from but our general play in the second half fully justified us taking the lead. To be fair we could have easily folded after conceding but the lads were very positive and kept going. We wanted to win the game and that showed in our reaction to being pegged back.

"As captain there was not much that I could say to Dean (Gorre) at the end of the game because he was bitterly disappointed after missing the penalty but one thing is certain - he will be the first player to get the ball when we have another. Dropping another two points at home feels like a defeat but the lads have reacted well in training and we are all looking forward to today's game.

"We now have a very tough game against a good Swindon side. They got a great result in midweek and will be full of confidence. There are never going to be any easy games at this level and each match will always be a real battle. Swindon are doing well so today's game will be no different.

"The supporters were fantastic on Tuesday and we are all disappointed that we could not get a win for them. It was frustrating but we have a great opportunity to put that right this afternoon".

THURSDAY AUGUST 28

Reds boss Gudjon Thordarson receives a welcome boost with the news that Neil Austin, Carl Barrowclough and Kevin Donovan have all returned to training following injuries meanwhile the club's odds for promotion are slashed following the side's excellent start to the new campaign.

FRIDAY AUGUST 29

Chris Lumsdon's suspension is confirmed by the FA. The midfielder was sent off against Brighton and will sit out the big local derby at Chesterfield.

SATURDAY AUGUST 30

The Reds throw away a one-goal lead at Oakwell against Notts County. Former manager Steve Parkin returns with the Magpies as the visitors score a 90th minute leveller to earn a share of the points. Dean Gorre nets the Reds goal.

MONDAY SEPTEMBER 1

Barnsley's five match unbeaten start to the new campaign equals their best opening run since the 1946/47 season. Former Reds defender Scott Jones leaves York City for family reasons.

Robbie Williams and Adam Oldham still face lengthy spells on the sidelines through injury although Griff Jones is poised to continue his comeback in a midweek reserve team game. Antony Kay is a doubt for the trip to Chesterfield with a toe injury.

TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 2

Former Barnsley striker Georgi Hristov is named in the Macedonian squad for the forthcoming match with England in Skopje.

WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 3

Ex-Stoke City keeper Danny Alcock will make his first appearance for the Reds as the reserves face Burnley. Steve Carson also starts the game as the Reds run riot and hit the Clarets for six. Carson, Rankin, Neil and a Griff Jones hat trick make it a memorable afternoon at Oakwell.

THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 4

Peter Ridsdale's takeover at Oakwell is formally announced at a press conference.

FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 5

Sean Lewis backs Peter Ridsdale's takeover of the club exclusively to www.barnsleyfc.co.uk. The Reds look to take around 2,000 supporters to Chesterfield as the Box Office reports a boom in business. Antony Kay, Dean Gorre and Tony Gallimore are all passed fit for the big game at Saltergate.

SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 6

Goals from Antony Kay and Craig Ireland give the Reds a hard-fought win at Saltergate but the game is marred by Kay's controversial red card midway through the second half. Barnsley's Academy draw 0-0 with Blackburn Rovers. Hristov nets Macedonia's goal as the minnows threaten to derail England's Euro 2004 hopes before Wayne Rooney and David Beckham earn all three points for Sven's men.

A MESSAGE TO ALL ENGLAND FANS FROM THE FA

Dear Football Supporter

You will be aware of The FA's decision not to make tickets available to England fans for next month's European Championship qualifier in Turkey. Given the unfortunate recent history between our countries, we have taken this difficult decision to ensure that this important match passes off as smoothly and as safely as possible for everyone concerned.

The FA, supported by the Government, the Police and UEFA, urges anyone thinking of travelling to Istanbul and who might be considering purchasing black market tickets NOT to do so. The Turkish authorities are not expecting our supporters to be present and there will be no segregation in the Sukru Saracoglu stadium in Istanbul for England supporters.

The England team has worked extremely hard to secure pole position in Group 7 and, throughout this qualifying campaign, the vast majority of England fans have provided the team with fantastic support. We are extremely grateful for this. However, due to a number of unsavoury incidents involving some England supporters home and away, UEFA have made it very clear that any further trouble could lead to the team's expulsion from the tournament.

We realise that our policy will prevent some fans from pursuing their hobby. We also realise that our stance penalises innocent fans. However, we are doing all we can to protect the wider interests of the game. The England team is as important to the millions of fans who watch matches on TV as it is to the thousands who watch the team live.

Please do not put our country in a position where our players' and coaches' efforts are undermined by problems off the pitch. Please ensure we do not have to face the shame and indignity of expulsion from a major tournament. On behalf of The FA and all of the England players and coaches, please respect our request for England fans not travel to Istanbul.

We now have money in the back to the tune of £800,000 after the monthly wage bill has been paid; are owed around the same amount by the Football League and have a good cash flow coming through the club.

All I have had at heart is securing the future and success of Barnsley FC hence my faith in the club to put my own money to keep things going through the dark periods. I am sure that we can go from strength to strength and I hope that all the assets are kept intact for the Club and the generations of Barnsley people to come.

Even now, although we have not yet completed the final contracts completing the deal, I have the faith and belief in Peter Ridsdale and Patrick Cryne to allow them to start making managerial decisions however until everything in completed these must still receive my approval until such a time as those contracts are finalised. As far as I am concerned I have made a deal with Peter Ridsdale and Patrick Cryne. That deal is like my word - once I have shaken hands it is done.

It is still a little premature to say my final farewells to Oakwell as the final contractual arrangements still have to be completed however at this stage I can say that it has been a different experience that I have learned a lot from. One thing for certain is that there is still a football club playing at Oakwell. I do know that there were quite a few people who wished that this was not the case but I would like to challenge them to come down here now and see what we have built and the success we are achieving on the pitch at the moment.

Thank you for your support, enjoy the game and lets cheer the Reds to victory.



The recent troubled tales of the Football Clubs who go by the name of Swindon Town and Barnsley are alarmingly similar, but it seems the fortunes of both are slowly turning for the better.

Demotion from the Premiership has hit the two sides on show today hard in the last decade, with the cash problems that go with such a drop proving a little too much for both to handle. With that in mind, the fact that this fixture is taking place at all should be a source great relief, but these two clubs are now targeting something a little more than stability in the next few months.



With the focus moving from the boardroom and back onto the field, Tykes and Robins followers are looking to the future with optimism and the signs at the start of this season suggest both can make serious pushes for promotion to the First Division this term.

Few can doubt the ambition shown by Swindon boss Andy King in a summer of major moves in the transfer market. Without spending a penny in fees, the squad that finished in a solid tenth position last season has been given a major overhaul and now boasts more than a few big names to go with the solid professionals who have carried the club through some dark days.

It seems that boss King targeted the forward positions as the area that needed strengthening as he went bargain hunting in his summer transfer dealings. With a relatively modest 25 goals scored on the road last

season, it was an observation that is backed up by facts and if the new boys add that cutting edge. there is no doubt the Robins will be a threat this season


Players like Tommy Mooney and Sammy Igoe are proven performers at higher level than this and the capture of James Milner from Leeds was truly a masterstroke that is bound to pay huge dividends for Swindon in the next few months.

The Leeds United prodigy may only be at the County Ground on a month's loan, but he is bound to light up this league with his raw talent that sparkled in the Premiership last

season.

The early signs are that the host of new faces are settling in well. After a 3-2 reverse on the opening day of the campaign against Sheffield Wednesday, they have been in impressive form as they recorded wins against Colchester, Notts County and Wrexham.

Useful points have also been collected against Bournemouth, Brighton and Blackpool and with the goals flowing, three more points here at Oakwell will doubtless raise expectations once again.




Thesquad

RHYS EVANS (goalkeeper) Born: 27.01.82

Squad No.20

A promising young stopper who cut his professional teeth at Chelsea, Evans failed to make a first team breakthrough among the stars at Stamford Bridge. A summer signing who has forced his way into the Swindon first team at the expense of last season's first choice Bart Griemink.



A young star on loan from Watford, Ifil should benefit from the regular first team action that is coming his way at the County Ground. This is his second stint on loan at Swindon after a successful spell last season and he has shown flashes of class in Robins colours.

ADI VIVEASH (defender) Born: 30.09.69 Squad No.5

Making a return to Oakwell this afternoon, Adi played a couple of games for Barnsley during a loan spell from Swindon back in 1995. Loans moves were a regular part of his diet in his first stint at the County Ground and he returned in the summer after a spell at Reading.

ANDY GURNEY (defender) Born: 25.01.74 Squad No.6

Fired a brilliant winning goal against
Wrexham last weekend and Andy is a consistent performer in this side. He started his career at hometown club Bristol Rovers and went on to play for Torquay and Reading before settling at the County Ground. An attack-minded, right-sided defender who scored eight league goals last season.

JOHN STEVENSON (forward) Born: 13.10.82 Squad No.14



"Barnsley will give us a big test as they have got some good results at the start of the season, but we will go there confident of doing well," he adds. "It is the start of a tough period of games and we have to be ready for them."

A game between two of the form sides in the first month of the season should provide a useful pointer to the promotion credentials of both the Tykes and the Robins. Andy King seems confident that his team have what it takes to succeed in the months ahead.





Past Gonnections

WITH DAVE COPPING

FRANK BARTLETT / SWINDON TOWN

FRANK BARTLETT came to Oakwell in the summer of 1950. Twice in those early weeks he left Barnsley homesick but was persuaded to return. After his National Service was completed he made his first team debut.

Frank preferred to play at wing half or inside forward but by far his most successful season came when played in a position he detested. Injuries forced manager TIM WARD to play him on the left wing. At the end of the season he had 15 goals and a Division 3 (north) championship medal around his neck. That was in the 1954/55 season and although not happy he remained there until an injury to NORMAN SMITH meant a move to his favourite right half position.

By the beginning of the 61/62 season he was now playing at inside forward. The previous season he had been top scorer but the team was now doing poorly. When Swindon arrived in late September for a third division game the Reds had only picked up four points from 10 games with only one point from four games at Oakwell. Swindon were also in the lower reaches of the division but were two points better off.

In those circumstances it was an amazing match that the faithful were to witness.

It was BARTLETT who showed his eye for goal when he opened the scoring in the fourth minute. However Swindon had a lethal marksman in those days and RALPH HUNT showed his class with a 10th minute equaliser. BOBBY WOOD restored the Reds lead and BARTLETT extended it before the half hour mark. Then just before the break it was four this time through KEN OLIVER. At the start of the second half HUNT again narrowed the gap but as the match came towards its end BERT TINDILL and RON SMILLIE took the Reds score to six.

The 6-2 scoreline still remains Barnsley's best against Swindon.

BARTLETT remained at Oakwell for a couple more seasons and after suffering homesickness at the start of his career he remains in Barnsley to this day. He was a workaholic who liked to be involved in the game all the time and that was the reason he did not like being out of it on the wing. He also played most of his career at one club. It was fairly common in those days but it is a rare commodity nowadays.

Reds Academy Coach Barry Wagstaff spoke exclusively to the Oakwell Review following his side's defeat by Crewe Alexandra.

He said: "We are very disappointed obviously particularly after the work that the lads had produced throughout pre-season and in the first few matches. There were quite a few things happened in regards to the selection of the team where we had our hand forced a little. We had to bring in Under 16s and college kids who have not played at this pace before.

"That showed up in parts of the game. Having said that it was some basic mistakes that cost us. Goals change games and it certainly changed us mentally against Crewe.

"The game was only five minutes old when the ball was received by a young college boy, who is not used to playing at this level, and he got caught on it right on the edge of the area. The ball went out of his feet and was struck in for the first goal. It was a big disappointment for everybody to start with.

"Crewe are an efficient outfit and we had several shuffles to the team that cost us. We had a first year midfielder at full back, a trialist at centre half so the discipline of the back four was not at its best. We understood that but Crewe always have and always will pass the ball well.

"The second goal was a basic one again. It came from a through ball and if the keeper was on his toes then he would come out and collect it. He decided to stay at home so their boy has broken onto the ball and struck it in.

"The third again came from a through ball but this time the keeper elected to come out past his 18-yard line. Again we felt he should have headed it or chested it but Marc (Shackelton) opted to go with his foot. Their lad went in, the ball broke his way and he rolled it into the net.

"We were three nil down on basic goals against but our possession was a major disappointment. They showed us what we had been doing to other teams and we did not respond well for the first time this season. Chances were made and we had Jarman in on the right hand side with Tom Baker on the penalty spot waiting

but Nathan opted to strike it. That was his right but he will have to learn those things.

Maybe there is a little bit more to learn before the next level comes because those should be goals. Tom also had a decent chance where he worked hard to get into the box but he smashed it straight at the keeper. It was a missed opportunity. We are not finishing - you can see that from our other games. That is not because of a lack of chances so that is not something that we will find it difficult to recover.

"The game was disappointing but we know the reasons why. One is the change of personnel and the other is the fact that we did not react well. The lads know that but on this occasion it was not there".

REDS midfielder Chris Lumsdon spoke exclusively to the Oakwell Review following the midweek draw with Oldham Athletic.

He said: "I enjoyed the second half more against Oldham last week because I did not get on the ball in the opening forty five minutes. Even when I got it I did not use it as well as I could but after the break I enjoyed myself more.

"The game at Port Vale was just one of those things and we were not at the races but against Oldham we were fit and feeling good. We did not get out of the blocks again but we knew that if we kept going our game would come.

"We were never going to go the full season without losing so the defeat at Port Vale was going to happen sooner or later. It is over with now and we have to concentrate going on another run. I do not think that people should get too carried away with the start we have had and it was important that we did not lose against Oldham - maybe last year we would have slumped to another defeat but we could have won the game with the penalty. We conceded quite a soft goal but I felt that we bounced back quite well.

"Mr Thordarson went 433 in the second half which meant that I had to come into the middle and get more on the ball. I enjoyed that a lot more. I broke on the right and made a forward run because Kevin Betsy had moved inside so Dean Gorre played it through and I just hit it. I knew it was going in as soon as it left my foot - like the one at Blackpool - but it hit the post and knowing my luck it would have come out.

"I had a similar one in the first half which is why I just hit that one. I took it inside and just could not get the ball out of my feet to shoot. I just felt that I would hit the next one that came my way".

He added: "The lads are disappointed to drop points at home and we knew that we would have won if the penalty had gone in. There is no point making an issue of it because these things happen and Dean has saved and won us matches this season already.

"There is no blame on Dean and there is not much that anyone can say to him because he knows himself. I have missed a penalty before and you always feel a lot worse than the lads do because you feel you have let everyone down. The lads do not see it that way but Dean will bounce back. I have to admit that I wanted to take the penalty on Wednesday but you cannot get the ball off Dean.

"We now have a tough game against Swindon and they are one team that I feel may go up this season. They have improved over the last couple of years and this could be their year. I prefer to play in these games instead of against teams like Notts County, who come and sit back. It will be an end-to-end game and there should be space at the back for us to break.

"There is a lot more to come from this team and definitely a lot more to come from me. I am quite pleased with the way I am playing at the moment but could get more involved in the game. There are certain positions where I could do better even though I enjoyed the second half against Oldham because I was more on the ball. Hopefully the team will keep going now and keep improving.

"I feel fitter now and every game I am getting stronger and more confident. I am happier with life here now but feel there is a lot more to come.

"The supporters were brilliant against Oldham last Wednesday and I only wish that we could have got a win for them. Hopefully they will all turn out today and we can go and get a win".





Enjoy the game. Come on you Reds!







with Benny Hill





Today's writer is **Peter Howard** (Ex Sheffield Star sports editor)

When Benny Hill asked me to do a piece for this Barnsley v Swindon programme, I was surprised. Especially when he said it was to celebrate 30 years of this column; even more especially because I haven't reported on football in many a year.

Yes, I'm still involved in defence and attack because I write on the defence industry. Not much midfield there

At the tender age of 66 I'm still working, and doing a part-time degree in history. A young female student at University College, Chichester asked: "Peter, are you a mature student?" "Not really", said I, "more sort of over-

ripe!" Barnsley and Swindon are both towns rich in industrial history - and proof of how

quickly things can change. However, some things never change and it was with Barnsley FC in the mid-1950's that I learned so many valuable lessons.

used to stand (rain, shine and often freezing cold) on Queen's Ground, next to Oakwell, to report on Barnsley A (Yorkshire League) or the Juniors (Northern Intermediate League) in the days when John Steele and Norman Rimmington were coaching.

At half-time, notebook in hand, off I went to Oakwell's press box to phone 100 words and the score to the Green 'Un.

(30th Season)

This could take a while but once done I would return to the Queen's Ground.

On one such occasion - Barnsley A v Rawmarsh Welfare, if memory serves me right - I asked a trainer if there was any change to the score. Being given a negative answer, at full-time I returned to the Press Box to phone a 3-3 result. On the Monday I got a severe roasting from the Sports Editor because the score was in fact 3-4, not 3-3.

From that point, surviving the hilarity of the players. I would always check the final score of such matches with the referee. He would look puzzled, and on being told I was a reporter, would carry on walking, shaking with laughter. Never mind, 'when in doubt check it out has stayed with me ever since.

Also in those days the Telegraph & Star had a London office sports writer by the name of Basil V. Easterbrook. Telephoning reports to copy-takers (people with headphones on, typewriter at the

ready) involved a number of procedures. Part-timers were among those who were used for the Green 'Un rush period on Saturdays and they needed to know your name, the teams involved and the competition. Asked his name on talking to a copy-taker, the writer replied "Basil V. Easterbrook", "Right", replied the voice in Sheffield, "but what league is that and what's your name?!!"
