



Four points from the away games at QPR and Plymouth was an excellent return which has put us in good heart for today's West country derby.



In both of the last two games we have had to show our battling qualities, falling behind at Loftus Road and then being put under a lot of pressure having taken the lead at Home Park.

I couldn't be more delighted with the way the players came through those tests, particularly in view of the fact that we finished with ten men against QPR and had two key defenders in Louis Carey and Danny Coles missing for the Plymouth match.

Taking the Rangers game first, I thought the lads showed great character to bounce back so quickly from conceding a goal and equalise through Lee Miller's superbly

struck volley.

Lee was sent off moments after scoring for a second yellow card and I have to say I felt he was very unlucky.

For the first booking a Rangers player clearly fired the ball at him from a free-kick intending to get him cautioned, while the second card resulted from a collision as one of their defenders tried to check his run off the ball.

Still we held firm in the closing minutes and I knew the same characteristics would stand us in good stead at Plymouth. Tony Butler and Matthew Hill must have finished that game with headaches the number of balls they cleared in the air.

It was important to get our noses in front and Lee Peacock ensured that was the case on his return to the team. Although we got penned back for periods of the game when we came under a long-ball assault, I felt we defended fantastically well and limited Argyle to two or three real chances.

Craig Woodman came in and did a terrific job at right-back as cover for Louis and in the closing stages at Plymouth we had two more young players in Leroy Lita and Clayton Fortune making important contributions.

Now we have successive home games in which to build on those away results, starting with another tough test against a Swindon Town side who are suggesting they will be in the promotion shake-up.

A warm welcome to my old buddy Andy King and his players today. Andy has done a fantastic job of turning Swindon's fortunes around and I look forward to another exciting game with a derby atmosphere that always adds that extra bit of spice.

Supporters always have a key role to play and never more so than in a local derby when the visitors are also guaranteed loud vocal backing.

So please shout your loudest in getting behind the team and help us make home advantage count.

It is on days like this that we all have to stand up and be counted — a derby against a team which is going well in the League and threatening to take one of the promotion places that we want for ourselves.



The players need to perform on the pitch and the fans need to be loud and supportive in the stands.

I am sure that, having seen their fortunes having turned round dramatically this year, Swindon will bring a large and voluble following and it will be a good test of the Ashton Gate faithful as to how we back our team and hopefully sweep them to victory.

Today should also see our largest crowd of the season so far and, for the viability of the club going forward, we need to see these levels of gates repeated on a regular basis.

I urge all City fans to get along to Ashton Gate as often as they possibly can. Let's have none of this staying at home on a Tuesday night to watch Champions League football, or perhaps staying in the pub on Saturday lunchtime watching a live game which might be on at the time.

This club needs your support more than ever now as we financially look to hold things together in order to maintain the progress we have made over the past few years and get ourselves into the First Division. It has already been publicised that the club lost

My appeal to all fans is simply this. We need your financial support now and the best way you can provide this is by turning up to cheer on the lads.

Everybody talks about the good old days but what we should be aiming to do now is pack Ashton Gate on a regular basis, the revenue from which will reduce our any losses going forward.

Perhaps the first big test will be our very attractive third round Carling Cup draw at home to Premiership Southampton. A full house would make it a night to remember and would certainly be of great financial benefit to us. Make sure you come along and make sure all your mates do too.



And the manager insists there will be every chance of producing another shock result following the second round win over Watford.


Danny said: "I'm delighted with the draw. Southampton are a top side these days with quality players and it goes without saying that they will be hard to beat.



MILLER FACES BAN

LEE MILLER is set to miss the start of City's defence of the LDV Vans Trophy because of suspension following his controversial sending-off at Loftus Road last Saturday.

The young striker was dismissed for bringing down Marc Bircham in the 1-1 draw at Queens Park Rangers, having already been booked for delaying the taking of a free kick.

Lee faces a one-match ban affecting the LDV Vans visit to Plymouth Argyle on October

14th. But he is still protesting his innocence over the second yellow card.

Re-instated as manager in December 2001 following a boardroom upheaval at the County Ground.


King spent his playing days as a midfielder with Luton Town (twice), Everton, QPR, West Brom, Dutch side Cambuur, Wolves and Aldershot.

His first managerial appointment was in charge of Mansfield before Colin Todd took him to Swindon in the summer of 2000.

King took over as manager following Todd's departure to join Derby County and his first season with Swindon saw the Wiltshire club avoid relegation on the final day of the season.

He was briefly replaced by ex-Liverpool manager Roy Evans for the first half of 2001/02 but won his job back following the arrival of new owners.

4 MATT HEWLETT


Born: Bristol, 25.2.76.

“ SINCE losing at home on the opening day of the season we have gone ten games unbeaten in the League and taken Leeds to penalties in the Carling Cup.


It is all a bit different from last season when we were in the midst of administration.

That was a very difficult period for us but going into administration early has arguably put us ahead of the game — as other clubs will undoubtedly follow down that route in the future — and has enabled us clear the wage bill.

After we finally came out of administration in the close season, Andy King was able to go out and bring in seven new players. Sammy Igoe and Tommy Mooney — who has formed a strong partnership with Sam Parkin up front — have gone straight into the first-team, but our other signings have tended to be younger players on the up.





'It was a wrench'

It's not so long ago that Matt Hewlett and Tommy Doherty were being looked upon as a home-grown midfield duo that would serve City for years.

This afternoon they are set to be on opposite sides, having both been through dips in their career since the 1997/98 promotion season under John Ward.


Matt made 32 starts for City in that campaign, plus a further eight appearances as a substitute.

But, having started the following season as a first choice in Division One, he fell out of favour and made only two starts during Benny Lennartsson's spell in charge.

The 1999/2000 campaign was equally frustrating and at the end of it Matt decided it was time to move on from his home-town club.

"It was a real wrench because I had supported City since boyhood and had been associated with the club from the age of about ten," said the Swindon Town midfielder.

"Scout Jock Rae spotted me playing schoolboy football and I went to the School of Excellence run by Pete



Coleman and Frank Jacobs at Redwood Lodge.

"I had never really thought of playing for any other club. But I needed regular first-team football at the age of 24 and it didn't look as though I was going to get it at Ashton Gate."

Released by City, Matt was free to join Swindon, a move that allowed him to continue living in Bristol. He and wife Rachael were married last year and have a house in Downend.

"It's very handy for the motorway and that makes the journey to Swindon very quick," he said. "The move has worked out well for me in all respects because, apart from injuries, I've held a first team place.

"The club has had more than its fair share of problems off the field in the three seasons I have been there, but this fourth one is looking very promising.

"We don't have the biggest

squad in the division so the big test will come when we have a few injuries. But the manager has made some really good signings and things have started very promisingly for us."

Matt says City's result remains the first one he looks for and he still has a number of friends at the club. "I keep in touch with Louis Carey and Tommy Doherty and have so many good memories of the club," he said.

"It did look at one time as though Tommy and I might be in the first team to stay. Since then he's had his share of injuries, but I understand he is playing really well again this season.

"I signed an extension to my contract at Swindon last year so we both seem to be enjoying our football again, which is what it's all about."

Opening casualties

How quickly fortunes change. As 2002/03 ended with Tranmere Rovers narrowly failing to snatch Cardiff's play-off place, manager Ray Mathias seemed on the brink of success.

Instead, the impressive 15-game unbeaten run that carried the Wirral side to within a point of sixth place last May gave way to a dreadful start this season, yielding just one League victory – a 4-1 opening day drubbing of **Brentford**.

Suddenly the pre-season suggestion that smart money should be placed on Rovers didn't seem quite so wise, and Mathias paid the price with his job.

On paper Tranmere have a strong squad. Former Wigan man Simon Haworth is one of the finest strikers in the Division on his day, Kevin Gray has the ability to marshal any defence and Micky Mellon can drive any midfield at this level.

Mathias, however, was not the first Division Two boss to be shown the door this season. After two years overseeing an abysmal relegation season and a poor season last time out, Carlton Palmer found himself surplus to Stockport's requirements, and was replaced by John Hollins – who had been enjoying a successful start at Rochdale.

Elsewhere, Lawrie Sanchez finally ended an eventful spell as manager at **Wycombe** this week.

By contrast City fans will no doubt hope to witness good reason for the jamming shut of the Ashton Gate revolving door. Last Saturday's draw with **QPR** suggested that clubs showing a little more patience with their managers might benefit long term.

LEE: 'I'm ready now'


Goal hero Lee Miller believes City's Carling Cup win over Watford can be the springboard to a successful League campaign.

"There was contact, but it was unintentional. Where I was stupid was with the first booking for not retreating at a free kick. I'm not sure what was going through my head at that moment, but it proved very costly."


The goal was almost a carbon copy of the one Lee scored against Notts County at Ashton Gate on the opening day of the season.

"Tommy Doherty headed the ball through to me and Rangers had been looking to catch us offside all afternoon," he said.

Say boo to boo-boys

The merciless hounding of Brian Tinnion by sections of the Ashton Gate crowd in the mid-1990s seems scarcely believable today given his cult status, says **Ed Hayes**.



And Tinman is by no means the only player to have suffered the jeers of the City crowd only to go onto enjoy better times: Richard Dryden spent a successful spell in the Premiership with Southampton despite the view of some supporters that he wasn't up to the Second Division; and it was only a few years ago that Scott Murray was being targeted.

Joe Burnell, of course, is the latest player to receive the boo-boy treatment, having apparently been identified as the sole reason for City's mediocre form in the opening weeks of the season.

Whilst it is arguable that Burnell's impressive form of 2002/03 has dipped slightly, it is unarguable that some of the treatment meted out to him has been entirely unreasonable.

If Burnell was being deployed in an explicitly creative capacity then the critical reaction would be more understandable even if

the nature of its expression was unjustifiable; but the continued indication by the management team of his primary defensive responsibility and the simple requirement to break up play and feed more creative players



leaves the very vocal criticism bordering on the ignorant.

It would be a real shame if a talented youngster, genuine professional and Bristol City fan were to be hounded out of the club by those who seem to be happiest when they have a target to abuse.

Ultimately, of course, Joe Burnell must assume some responsibility for the variation in the quality of City's performances so far, but that responsibility is shared: with his team-mates, and with the management.

So far this season the poor defending of set pieces has been the biggest single factor in League defeats to Port Vale and Colchester and that is no doubt a factor that must be addressed if an otherwise hugely impressive defensive record is to become one on which to build a promotion

challenge. The failure to find a genuine

replacement for the attacking inventiveness and threat of Murray is also something which must be resolved soon, in my opinion.

Victories over Watford and Plymouth, plus an impressive backs-to-the-wall draw with QPR, have indicated that there is much promise and encouragement to be taken, however.


THIS WAS A much-improved display against a Cardiff side fielding some big-money signings in the likes of Spencer Prior and Andy Campbell.





Firstly, we have purchased our own scoreboard so the children can read all about the things happening with the team and feel part of the club when their names appear on the screen.

We have also been working on a Prediction League with some of our schools. We ask the children to look at the League tables and predict the scores for the next game.

Each child is allocated points on the basis of predicting the correct result and score, as well as the player who scores the first goal for City.

OUR SECONDARY SCHOOLS have all been scouring Bristol looking at possible stadium locations for City.

In this exercise they have to put together a presentation on the benefits of the locations they have visited.

The picture above is thought to be the oldest relating to Bristol football. It was taken at Bedminster AFC's Greenway Bush Lane enclosure on 19th April 1892 when a fancy dress match took place between a side selected by H.G. Harris and a W.G. Griffiths XI.

No information exists as to who won this light-hearted affair, which brought the curtain down on a rather mixed 1891/92 season.

The campaign was notable in as much as the "Minster" made their FA Cup debut, following the pioneering path blazed by Clifton and Warmley some 12 months earlier. After receiving a bye past the first qualifying round and then a walkover when the 93rd Highlanders scratched,

Bedminster lost 4-1 at home to Luton Town on 14th November 1891 after conceding two own goals.

Bedminster were more successful in the Gloucestershire Cup, however, reaching their second successive final. A record 6,000 crowd at the Kingswood Athletic Ground (this Lodge Road enclosure being later named the "Chequers"), paying £100 receipts on 12th March 1892, saw Warmley

gain revenge for their previous season's defeat by securing the trophy for the first time with a 2-1 victory. A report of the time states:-

“The 'Minster' kicked-off up the slope, defending the Pavillion End in

front of a large gathering of spectators, many of whom bore cards urging their favourites to 'play up'. Macfarlane opened the scoring with a high shot after about quarter-of-an-hour, but ere (sic) had another 15 minutes elapsed than King drove in Warmley's leveller. After Peacock gave the renowned 'white shirts' the lead in the 40th minute the result was never in doubt as Bedminster rarely threatened.”

“Minster” were later to merge with City in 1900, which lead to the club's brief spell as the top Southern club of the Edwardian era.

Imagine it. It is the 91st minute and City need a goal. Steve Phillips is up for the corner which is taken by Aaron Brown, writes **Alistair Durden**.



Almost in slow motion, Phillips leaps salmon-like to thump it home and City have equalised!

Well it's got to happen soon hasn't it? After all it seems goal-scoring goalkeepers are the latest fad.

In the last couple of weeks we've had Mart Poom of Sunderland springing up to score a header Alan Shearer would have treasured, and Paul Robinson netting a late Carling Cup equaliser for Leeds against today's visitors Swindon.

How keen Steve is to join the army of gloved heroes I'm not sure. Keeping them out against Parkin and Mooney may be enough of a job today.

He wouldn't be the first City keeper to score, of course. Thirty years ago Ray Cashley's enormous clearance bounced on the edge of the Hull City 18-yard-box and over their keeper – who was reportedly closer to the penalty spot than he was his goal-line.

The official distance of the kick was 95 yards, two-feet, and I believe it's still a record distance for a League goal.


There's no doubt that

goalkeepers have evolved since Ray's day.

Not only have they improved their kicking to adapt to the back-pass rule, but nowadays they're often the starting point of an attack with a measured pass or a quick throw-out.

How much further can their role develop? Will we ever see a day when a goalkeeper nets a

Manager Brian Tinnion bites his nails nervously as he watches his goalkeeper Brooklyn Beckham stand over the ball 20 yards from the Liverpool goal.

Brooklyn's father David is still a little disappointed his first-born opted for a career between the posts, but thankfully he has retained his dad's penchant for free-kicks.

Our Radio Bristol commentator takes up the story: "Here's Beckham junior right-footed, he's scored and that's his hat-trick ... he celebrates before dashing back to the Wedlock End to defend his goal for the kick-off."

Fanciful, of course, but goalkeepers are often the biggest players in the side and in the right circumstances it becoming a more frequently used weapon.

And with Swindon more than a little tender about the subject, perhaps Steve could get his calling today.

Survey helps

Chief Executive **Colin Sexstone** reveals more results from the club's biggest-ever supporters questionnaire.



OF THOSE REPLYING to our summer questionnaire – sent out with the club's official newsletter **gatepost** – thirty per cent stated that they went to all home and away games, indicating that responses to the questionnaire had largely come from the club's more committed supporters: 47% were season ticket holders.


The primary reasons for buying a season ticket were split equally between loyalty, the financial savings available, and the ability to have a reserved seat. The biggest reason for not buying a season ticket was the inability to attend every match (66%), followed by the price (34%).

A large majority of fans felt the club rewarded fans loyalty and also cared for the supporters, although the response showed that these feelings were only lukewarm. For example, 18% stated that the club did not reward loyalty, and 13% felt that the club did not care about them.

Of those replying, 78% felt the allocation of tickets for big games were dealt with fairly, although there were a number of comments criticising ticket sales for the play-off games and LDV final last season.

Eighty-one per cent of supporters aimed to always try and get to home games, but the main reasons for missing home games were put as cost, family commitments and supporters' own sporting commitments.

The website has now become the most popular primary means of fans getting news on the club, with 36% stating that is was their major source of information. This compares favourably with the next two most important sources; the *Bristol Evening Post* (28%) and Radio Bristol (10%). Fans were also pleased to receive e-mails from the club relating to club news and information.

LAST SEASON WE trialled introducing mini-season tickets for a limited amount of games, although we are always careful to ensure that full season ticket holders always receive the best price per match.

Half-season tickets will again be made available at Christmas. Season tickets are also available now until the end of the season with prices available from the ticket office.

Cheap season tickets for juniors have helped us to increase our level of support for younger fans, and have also helped to make football affordable for the entire family.

The club's official website has become the focal point for all information about the club, and we strive to ensure that any news is released on **bcfc.co.uk** before it is available anywhere else. The site also carries other services such as online tickets, online retail (which has been redeveloped very recently) and our own TV channel.

We continue to work with other parts of the media to ensure that information about the club is always available in a variety of sources.

WHAT WE WILL DO

WE MUST CONTINUE to improve our communications with all supporters, and are hoping to introduce a Customer Relationship Management system that will allow us to talk to supporters on a more personal level.

In the meantime all members of the club will strive to be helpful, approachable and efficient in dealing with fans' needs.

We are currently involved in a strategic review of our ticketing systems in order to procure an updated system that will provide us the best possible service. This could take up to a year because our requirements are not yet technically available, but are being developed by a number of companies who will be able to provide us with what we want.

We have also taken note of the deficiencies that occurred towards the end of last season for the play-off games, and will ensure that the same mistakes do not occur again. Such games, however, are notorious in terms of ticketing and will always require a degree of patience in order to sell so many tickets in such a short space of time.



Bristol City endorse the Football League campaign to reduce the problem of persistent standing in football stadia. Whilst the club in no way wants to stop fans showing their support for the team, supporters are reminded that persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress contravenes ground regulations. Offenders can face prosecution and/or prohibition notices.

Message from FA

You will be aware of The FA's decision not to make tickets available to England fans for next month's European Championship qualifier in Turkey.

Given the unfortunate recent history between our countries, we have taken this difficult decision to ensure that this important match passes off as smoothly and as safely as possible for everyone concerned.

The FA, supported by the Government, the Police and UEFA, urges anyone thinking of travelling to Istanbul and who might be considering purchasing black market tickets NOT to do so. The Turkish authorities are not expecting our supporters to be present and there will be no segregation in the Sukru Saracoglu stadium in Istanbul for England supporters.

The England team has worked extremely hard to secure pole position in Group 7 and, throughout this qualifying campaign, the vast majority of England fans have provided the team with fantastic support. We are extremely grateful for this. However, due to a number of unsavoury incidents involving some England supporters home and away, UEFA have made it very clear that any further trouble could lead to the team's expulsion from the tournament.

We realise that our policy will prevent some fans from pursuing their hobby. We also realise that our stance penalises innocent fans. However, we are



doing all we can to protect the wider interests of the game. The England team is as important to the millions of fans who watch matches on TV as it is to the thousands who watch the team live.

Please do not put our country in a position where our players' and coaches' efforts are undermined by problems off the pitch. Please ensure we do not have to face the shame and indignity of expulsion from a major tournament. On behalf of The FA and all of the England players and coaches, please respect our request for England fans not travel to Istanbul.

Thank you for your support and co-operation.
