It is F.A. Cup time once again as we welcome Swindon Town to the Causeway Stadium for the second time this week. Our youth teams met in the F.A. Youth Cup here on Wednesday evening and we faced each other at the County Ground last Saturday in a Division Two fixture. Three meetings in one week against the same side is very unusual, I looked to see when our reserve sides were due to meet and that was not until early December.

Before talking about the match at the County Ground I would like to comment on our very first visit to Hartlepool United a fortnight ago. The entire trip was most enjoyable, we stayed in a nice hotel on the outskirts of Darlington that left us with a comfortable one hour journey to the ground. Upon arrival we were met by a group of very friendly people who did their best to look after us in every way. The match turned out to be a great piece of entertainment that on another day we should have won by three or four goals.

The team played really well and got off to a wonderful start when Darren Currie put us ahead after just three minutes. We saw the tempo, the passion and the desire, all the things John Gorman had asked from the team in his pre match briefing.

It is interesting to note that in our last six league games we have had a player one on one with the opposition goalkeeper and failed to score on every occasion. If we had taken those chances then maybe three points against Tranmere Rovers, Plymouth Argyle, Luton Town and Hartlepool United and a point against Barnsley would have seen us mid table by now.

Turning to last Saturday at Swindon, we continued to play some good football but it was the same old tale of woe. In front of goal we get a sudden rush of blood and the ball either flies wide or over the crossbar. We created three great opportunities in the game and didn't even make their kepper make a save.

We travelled to Plymouth Argyle on Monday for the LDV Vans Trophy Second Round game on Tuesday evening. John Gorman was in charge for this game and by the time you read this the Directors will have made an announcement about the managerial situation on Wednesday.

LET'S hope Wycombe Wanderers and Swindon Town can provide some five star entertainment this afternoon because if they don't, some fans may find themselves with an appearance in the magistrates court!

It appears that falling asleep in a football ground is now a crime regardless of how dull the action on the pitch is.

I was amazed to read this week that Middlesbrough fan Adrian Carr is being prosecuted after falling asleep during a Premier League match at the Riverside, so woe betide any fan who starts to feel drowsy if this afternoon's encounter ends up as one big yawn.

The Boro supporter in question was removed from the ground by the stewards, who found him taking forty winks in his seat during his team's less than impressive 4-0 home defeat by Arsenal earlier this season.

He had his season ticket confiscated and is now being prosecuted for being drunk in a sporting arena.

The shift-worker denies the charge but admitted to having a few pre-match pints. He insisted he was not drunk and claimed the reason for his afternoon nap was that he had been working a night shift.

And it seems it could happen to anyone. We've all seen the pictures on Sky of fans dozing off during games.

Just recently the long lenses of

the TV cameras have picked out fans catching up on their shut-eye at games at Newcastle United and Manchester City.

And at the goalless Tottenham versus Middlesbrough game at White Hart Lane a couple of weeks ago a supporter was actually woken up by the stewards and told to watch the game or he would be ejected from the ground.

It puts a whole new responsibility on the players to keep us entertained.

Who knows, if this trend continues, maybe we will have a situation where a supporter who ends up in court, counter sues a team for sending him to sleep.

It doesn't bear thinking about. It could drive clubs out of business, and not just the little ones.

Whatever would have happened to Arsenal in their Boring, Boring days before they discovered entertaining football?

The Gooners would have been sued every week. They would have been bankrupt before Christmas.

But it is not just the old Arsenal side that would have to watch out. Liverpool, on their day, can be every bit as effective as a double-strength sleeping pill and as for some of those Champions League group matches, need I say more?

And in the second division, we can all think of games where the persistent whacking backwards and forwards of aimless long

balls has had an almost hypnotic effect on the crowd.

It puts a whole new perspective on that nightmare performance!

It wouldn't be so bad if fans could bring their alarm clocks into the ground, but then the sleep police (or the stewards as they are more popularly referred to) would probably then accuse supporters of bringing an offensive weapon into the ground.

Fortunately dozing off shouldn't be a problem this afternoon as Wanderers and Swindon go head to head for the second time in seven days, or third time if you include the FA Youth Cup.

It's advantage Town at the moment after their 2-0 win in the league at the County Ground last Saturday.

That result put Wycombe back to the bottom of the table and Wanderers will be hell-bent on exacting revenge as thoughts turn back to the FA Cup this afternoon.

The recent performances under John Gorman have been better than the results have been, so here's hoping for a change in luck and a game that will keep us all on the edge of our seats.

For Robins fans it is a familiar picture each season, the team get off to a flying start and then run into a mini slump. Once more manager Andy King has wrung the changes and added some good players to his squad, mixed with some good loan players Swindon began with a look of the play off's about them. Then a run of five defeats on the spin sent them tumbling down to 16th in the table. A goal less draw at home to Port Vale stopped the rot, the first for over a year that totals 67 games as Andy King challenged his side to rediscover their early season form.

Last season Swindon finished in tenth spot and would have been disappointed not to have reached the play off places. Our 3-0 win at the County Ground in February was one of our better performances of the season away from home and made up for the 3-2 defeat by Town at Adams Park in November 2002.

Town opened this season with a home defeat against title favourites Sheffield Wednesday before going on a run of ten unbeaten games in both league and cup. It was the best start the club have made since season 1995-96 and included taking Premiership Leeds United to a penalty shoot out at Elland Road in the Carling Cup.

What has been a tremendous



lift for the team is having two players in the leading scorers chart. Sam Parkin (remember him?) and Tommy Mooney had been averaging more than a goal a game between them until the recent injury to Parkin. With the loans of Jerel Ifil from Watford and James Milner from Leeds the Robins looked a very solid outfit but injuries to Sam Parkin and winger Sammy Igoe plus the return to Leeds of James Milner and Jerel Ifil to Watford has taken an effect. As replacements Junior Lewis has arrived on loan from Leicester City and Deon Burton from Portsmouth.

This afternoon is a one off occasion as both clubs play for the right to enter the second round of the World's greatest cup competition. Last Saturday we met at the County Ground in a Division Two fixture and a goal in each half gave the Robins all three points. Once again we showed plenty of endeavour but lacked any kind of finish in front of goal. Hopefully we shall put that right this afternoon.

The Manager **ANDY KING**



As a player Andy made 150 appearances for Everton, scoring an impressive 38 goals in four seasons at Goodison, the club he is most remembered for, before joining QPR.

Made his first managerial appearance at Mansfield Town in 1993, they were relegated at the end of that season but King steered them to a mid-table finish the following season.

In 1995-96 he lost his job at Mansfield, he continued in the game working with good friend Peter Reid at Sunderland. Andy joined Swindon Town when Colin Todd appointed him as his assistant in the summer of 2000.

The Robins struggled to get free of the relegation zone, a win over Peterborough and our victory at Bristol Rovers ensured their safety for another season. The great escape was not enough to save his job and he was replaced at the County Ground by the former Liverpool manager Roy Evans. One year later King was back when Roy Evans left the club – King had taken legal action against Swindon Town with regard to his dismissal and was reinstated as manager in December 2001. He guided the Robins to tenth place last season and used the closed season to build a side capable of making the play off places.

'Sam Parkin – the Robins' striker who helped Wycombe to FA Cup Glory'

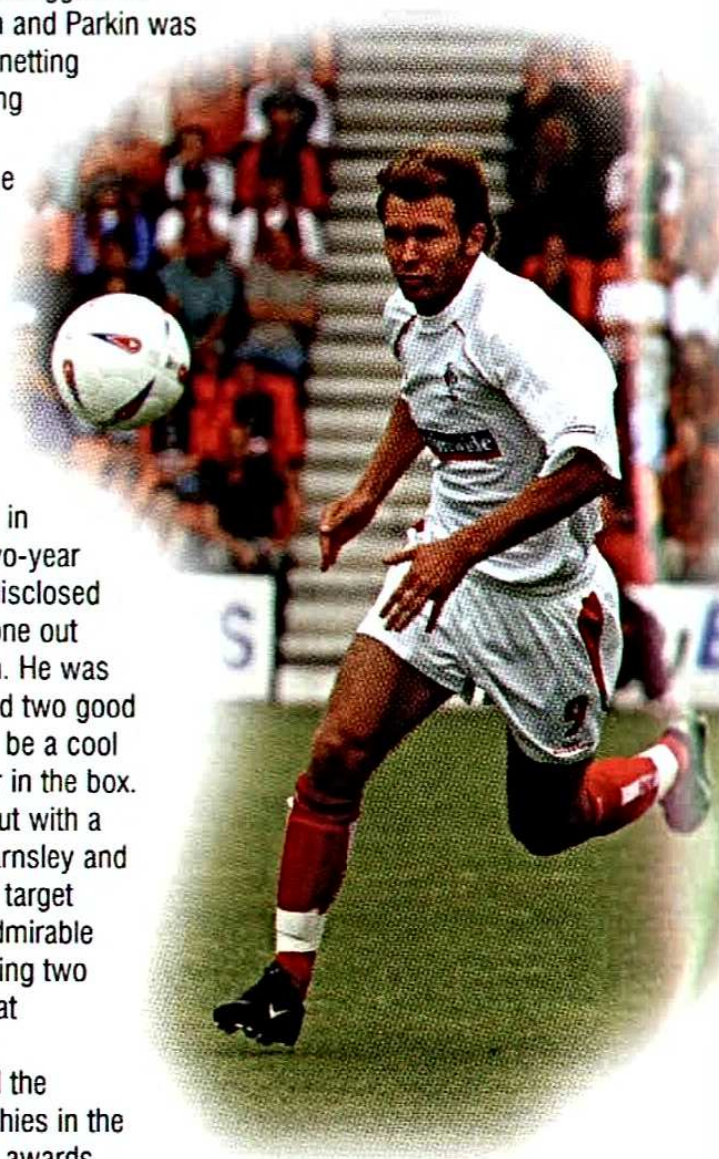
No one connected with Wycombe Wanderers will ever forget Sam Parkin's only previous FA Cup tie played at Wycombe. In Jan 2001, the 19-year old striker, on loan from Chelsea, powered a late header wide of Wolves keeper Mike Stowell to earn the Chairboys a place in the last 16 – uncharted territory indeed for the Wanderers who had never previously survived beyond round 3.

That was the highlight of an eventful season for the Roehampton born former England schoolboy international. With Chelsea keen for Parkin to experience first team action he was loaned first to Millwall where he netted twice on his debut and went on to notch four goals in just seven appearances. Destination number two was Adams Park – Chelsea loaning him for two months but ruling him out of any FA Cup matches. Parkin made his Chairboys debut at Col U, but was forced to sit out the cup clashes with Millwall and Grimsby. With Wycombe now in round 4, Chelsea agreed to extend the loan period for another month and also permitted Parkin to play against Wolves. The youngster was also influential in the 5th round at Wimbledon, setting up McCarthy's last gasp equaliser in extra-time then putting away a spot-kick in that nail-biting penalty shoot-out. After that epic, Parkin resigned himself to return to Chelsea – "It's a terrible thing to happen. I would love to play in the Quarter-finals but that's life and I'm just hoping to do what's best for my career now." This paved the way for a certain Mr Essandoh, but that is another story!

Destination number three for Parkin in season 2000/01 was Boundary Park, Oldham where he netted three goals in seven appearances late in the season. How many other players have appeared for three clubs in the same division over the course of one season? Oldham boss Andy Ritchie wanted to retain Parkin for the next season and indeed Chelsea were prepared to extend the deal. Parkin however decided to stay south and join another Division 2 outfit – Northampton Town. The Cobblers however struggled for most of the season and Parkin was far from his best - netting just five times during the campaign.

By the start of the 2002/03 season it was clear that Parkin was now surplus to requirements at Stamford Bridge. He impressed in Swindon's pre-season games and in August signed a two-year contract for an undisclosed fee. His talents shone out through the season. He was useful in the air, had two good feet, and proved to be a cool and clinical finisher in the box. He marked his debut with a hat trick against Barnsley and consistently hit the target finishing with an admirable total of 26 – including two in Town's 3-2 win at Adams Park. He deservedly claimed the majority of the trophies in the 'Player of the Year' awards.

Parkin started this season in the same rich vein of form. He struck up a deadly attacking partnership with Tommy Mooney that led to boss Andy King hailing his strikers as "the best in the division". Parkin had already claimed eight goals by the end of September but sustained knee damage against Peterborough. If now fit, he will undoubtedly be relishing the chance of further FA Cup sensation this afternoon!

Between the posts they have the giant keeper **Bart Griemink** who arrived on a free transfer in the summer of 2000. The former Dutch U21 International was originally on loan as cover for Frank Talia before eventually joining the club. Has been a regular in the side for the past three seasons but this season has seen the rise of a young man who has been waiting his chance. **Rhys Evans** (top left) has grabbed his chance to become the number one keeper at the club. This Swindon born young keeper has been out on loan with Bristol Rovers, QPR and Leyton Orient as part of his first team experience that has given him the chance to prove to Andy King he should be number one.

In defence they have a range of players to select from, some who have been at the County Ground for a while. **Adrian Viveash** began his career with Swindon before signing for Walsall in 1997. Captain of the Saddlers side that won promotion to Division One 1998-99. Joined local rivals Reading in July 2000 on a Bosman. Returned to the County Ground this summer on a free transfer. **Alan Reeves** is another experienced centre back who causes problems for the opposition at set pieces. Joined Swindon in 1998 from Wimbledon where he had the tough task of replacing John Scales. **Andy Gurney** can either play at full back or wing back. Signed on a Bosman from Reading in the summer of 2001 and he has been a regular for the Robins in defence. Andy will continue as club captain again this season. **Ian Herring** was on his way out of the club until Andy King thrust him into the side at the end of last season. He has since earned a six month contract and has become a

favourite at the County Ground. **Matt Heywood** was snapped up on a free transfer from Burnley by Andy King has been ever present since 2000-01. Strong in the tackle and good in the air he is a very important cog in the Robins defence.

In midfield there are a number of players contesting the four places available. **Stefan Miglioranza** (bottom left) is the product of American College football where the most successful players are drafted into Major League Soccer. He was taken from MLS side Chicargo Fire and joined Everton on trial, although keen to sign him a deal was not agreed and he moved to Portsmouth who did take him. He can play in midfield or defence and joined the Robins before the start of last season. Scored a fine second goal last Saturday in our league meeting at the County Ground.

David Duke is a left sided player that arrived on a free transfer from Sunderland. Now in his third season at the County Ground the Scotsman could become a real find for Swindon, a good crosser of the ball. **Steve Robinson** is a right sided player, a tough tackling energetic terrier signed from Birmingham City for £50,000 in February 2001.

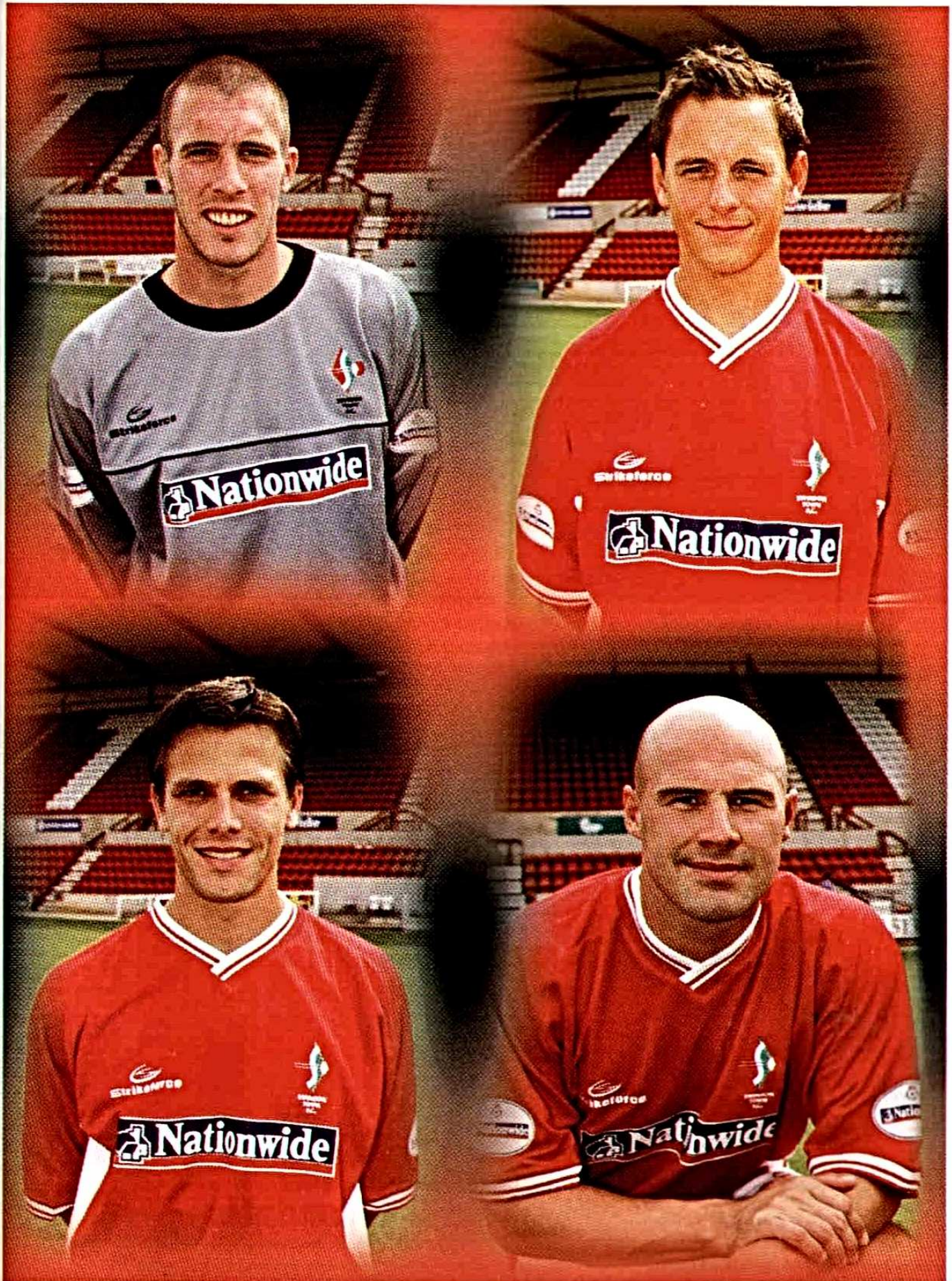
Usually plays in the centre or on the right of midfield, likes to win the ball and move it quickly. **Matthew Hewlett** (top right) is an attacking central midfielder, a former Bristol City player who joined Town in the summer of 2000. Has suffered with injuries throughout his career and will be hoping for a good season.

Grant Smith joined Swindon from Sheffield United in the summer. Many were surprised he did not appear in the United first team more often last season. Strong in the air and dangerous at set pieces.

Andrew Nicholas is a skillful, right footed player with a versatility that allows him to play in midfield or up front. He usually appears at left back for the Robins and possesses a Dave Challinor style long throw.

The attack is made up of some formidable players who have already shown they can score goals this season. **Sam Parkin**, a name Wanderers fans will be aware of when he was on loan from Chelsea during 2000. A bright and intelligent forward with natural goalscoring ability who was the clubs leading scorer last season. Has started this season in fine form with eight goals so far, returned against the Blues last week after a short injury spell. Came off the bench and hit the bar in the 2-0 win for Swindon.

Tommy Mooney (bottom right) arrived from Birmingham City in July this year. Tommy is a very experienced striker who has played in all four divisions of the English game. Has made an exciting goalscoring combination with Sam Parkin, the two could prove to be a real handful for anyone this season. **Alan Young** is one of Swindon's brightest hopes for the future, he has risen from Town's youth team and played himself into the England set-up. Has been on the verge of first team football but has not shown the promise all had hoped for. His contract is up at the end of this season. **Sammy Igoe** began his career on the south coast with Portsmouth where he started out as a trainee. He moved to Reading in a £100,000 deal but found it difficult to move into the first team and spent a lot of time on the bench. Was signed by Andy King in the summer and has made a good start at the County Ground. He is another who could miss this afternoon with an injured wrist.

Relief for King

Millwall. Bob Booker, who was acting as caretaker-boss, remains as assistant-manager. An ambitious McGhee commented – "Working in the first division is the minimum level I'd like to work at, and the short way of doing that is to get Brighton promoted. It's nice to have a fancy big stadium, but in the long-term I'm concerned about the working environment, getting on with the job and establishing ourselves in Division One." McGhee's first game in charge ended in a 2-2 draw at Peterborough – Leon Knight netting both Seagulls' goals to take his personal tally to 13. The result meant that the Posh equalled their club record of nine home matches without a win – Barry Fry's side have only won four points at home from a possible 27.

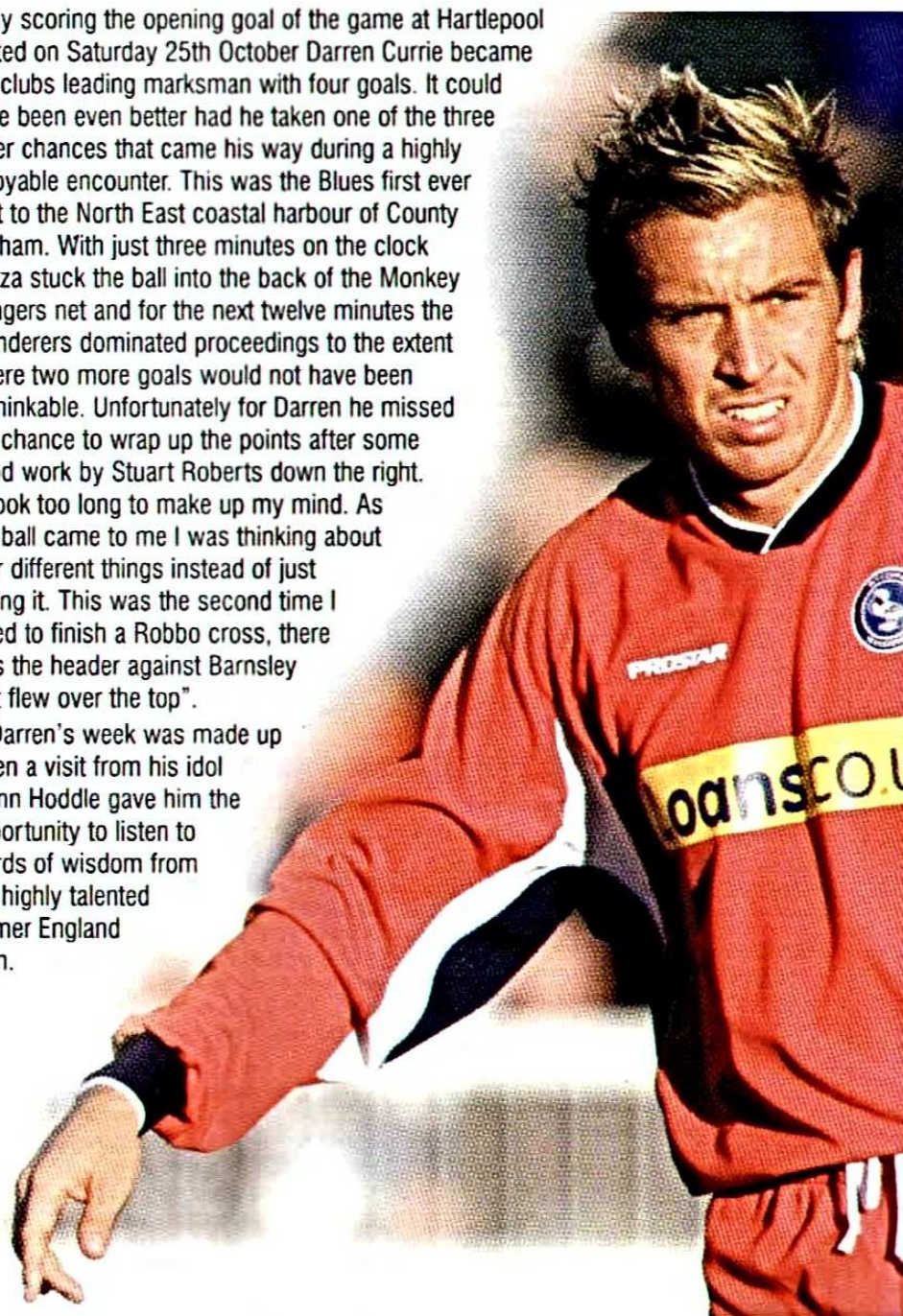

THE SECRET DIARY OF KEITH ALLEN
AGE FIFTY FIVE AND A HALF
With Apologies to Adrian Mole
(EVERY WORD TRUE)

Monday 20th October

8-46am Day of AGM, but also a very busy working Monday Routine start to the week, completed stats., marked the referee's and filled in various match report forms.

9-14am Welcome interruption from the Manager who had once more arrived early, discussing several things before preparing for training.

9-47am Prepared loan extension form for Guy Branston and rang Rotherham to discuss whether they would allow him to play in the FA Cup whilst on loan, thus cup tying him when he returns. Rotherham Chief Executive Phil Henson was co-operative but unsure, promising me he would ring me back with a decision when his Manager returned from training.

10-17am Opened post and replied to the more urgent items, also replied to a stack of emails that had arrived during the weekend and this morning.

Interrupted several times, including the Secretary of Plymouth Argyle who wished to discuss arrangements for our visit to them in the Second Round of the LDV Vans Trophy. We agree 4th November as the date of the game and after a short discussion on admission prices she promises to ring me back later in the week when they had made up their mind.

11-13am Booked hotel for the trip to Plymouth, the round trip of 410 miles being considered too far on the day of the game, we are entitled to an overnight stay as part of match expenses. Also gave Motts early notice of coach hire, we could well have done without such a long journey as early in the competition as this, but that is the way our luck is going these days.

11-37am Checked the dates of birth for all the players "in the frame" for a place in the Youth Cup, players in this competition must have been born after 31st August 1985. As such it is an under 18 competition, with our youth teams being under 19 and under 17, very easy to make a mistake and I always check the dates of birth before the squad is announced. Wednesday's trip to Chalfont St. Peter in the FA Youth Cup will make a pleasant change for us all and I am quite looking forward to the experience I hope the lads are.

12-27pm Spent some time trying to find the best method of getting to Hartlepool on Saturday, it is a 504 mile round trip and I thought that maybe rail would be the answer. Got all the times and prices, but would first have to get to Kings Cross, Peterborough or Stevenage dependent on the route taken, all seemed a little inconvenient to me suspect we will be driving.

1-10pm After grabbing a quick bite of lunch, received a call from Chief Scout Alan Fogarty informing me of the faxes he wanted me to send booking him tickets for his visits for the whole week. Following the call sent eleven faxes to different clubs, ordering tickets for "Foggo", Peter Cawley, Colin Barnes, Terry Gibson and the caretaker Gaffer.

1-58pm AGM this evening, started to make final

checks to ensure all the paperwork was in place for a successful evening, particularly the ballot papers which were being prepared by the ubiquitous Suzie.

2-21pm Interrupted by a telephone call from Phil Henson at Rotherham informing me that they did not agree for Guy Branston to play in the FA Cup whilst on loan and also insisting on a 24 hour recall clause. Understood their reasons, although a little disappointed (Guy will be furious), faxed the completed form through to Rotherham for their signature and waited for one minute, the form being sent back signed by return.

Faxed the completed form through to FA and Football League, the extension to the loan only confirmed when their reply is received (both approvals were destined to be received by fax overnight).

3-05pm Being happy that everything was ready for the AGM began to prepare for pre-AGM Board Meeting to be held at 4-00pm.

3-40pm Completed preliminary arrangements for tomorrow's game with Bristol City which I had been "chipping away at" all day, will finalise arrangements tomorrow but do hate to leave it all until the day.

4-00pm Board Meeting, as Company Secretary I attend all Board Meetings and take Minutes as well as being Secretary to The Board of Directors.

6-53pm Board Meeting reached a discussion stage, enabling me to make my excuses and leave, being anxious that everything was ready for the AGM to run smoothly.

8-00pm AGM starts on time, with items 1-3 going through without too many problems, The Chairman and Financial Director speaking well.

8-20pm Time for the ballot, stood and explained the procedure and made the mistake of asking the Membership if they had any questions on procedure, only one man passed comment. He informed me that although I had stated the candidates for election were in alphabetical order, we had placed Rowlands before Parry, complete embarrassing "cock up". Doing what all good Company Secretaries do, looked round for someone to blame calling for the ubiquitous Suzie, of course it was my fault as I should have checked the forms.

8-38pm Counting completed, my fellow tellers (Ian Mobsby and Andy Warboys) and I had one vote cast too many!! Even though the vote was not close we had to find the error, which we eventually did and we returned to The Chairman with the result of the Ballot.

9-08pm The AGM now over the meeting turned into a Fans Forum, which was constructive, full and frank, although to be fair could possibly have been more controversial.

10-38pm Forum over Members and Fans drifted away.

11-25pm Following a drink, chat and post AGM relax, gave Rod Tomlin a lift home before arriving back to find a long suffering wife fast asleep, not surprising as it was now Tuesday 21st October at 12-05am.

We took the opportunity to record an interview with Glenn for Wanderers World website and recalled the time when he and John were together at Swindon Town. Who will ever forget that tremendous legendary Wembley Play Off final against Leicester City in 1993 when the Robins led 3-0 and finally got through 4-3 with a late penalty.

Speaking to Glenn about the three games coming up against Swindon he said. " By

the time you have played in the League the F.A. Youth Cup and the F.A. Cup both sides should know quite a bit about each other. John and I have good memories of the County Ground, we both managed there and they are great times to look back on. We have had a good time this morning working out with the lads. I was pleasantly surprised with the standard amongst the players, when they get themselves clear of the bottom and the pressure is off I can see them moving up the table. There are a number of lads here

who show some real talent, Darren Currie looks good on the ball and can deliver with either foot. Jermaine McSparran is a quick lad who will cause plenty of problems for opposition defenders. I have always looked upon Wycombe as a really good club, I have been here many times in the past for pre-season games and other events, you get the feeling the place is well run and that has been emphasised again today".

FIFTY YEARS AGO

To start with we take a look back over the last fifty years of our involvement in the F.A. Cup back in the days when we were an Amateur club as members of the Isthmian League. Season 1953-54 we departed in the Preliminary Round on Saturday 12th September 1953 away to Banbury Spencer by 2-1. They were a Southern League side in those days and were favourites for the match, Ken Butler scored our lone goal after five minutes but two goals, one in each half by the home side, won the day.

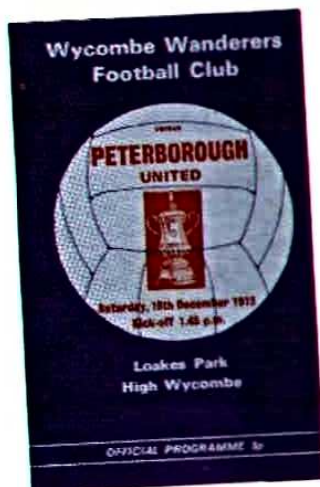
FORTY YEARS AGO



Ten years on, season 1963-64 we faced a difficult trip to Barnet in the Fourth Qualifying Round on Saturday 19th October 1963. This was a hard fought match with Dave 'Harry' Bassett making one of his few appearances for the club and scoring in the 6-3 defeat at Underhill. Barnet scored three in the second half playing down the slope

as the two teams went in level at 3-3 after the first 45 minutes.

THIRTY YEARS AGO

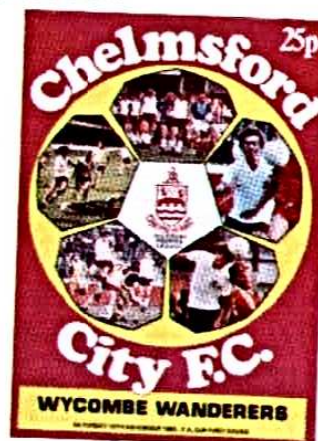


Season 1973-74 was very memorable for the club as we reached the Second Round after our first win against Football League opposition in the competition in Round One. Newport County had been well beaten 4-1 at Loakes Park and now we looked forward to the visit of Division Four leaders Peterborough United managed by former Manchester United half back Noel Cantwell. They took no chances, stayed overnight before the game and trained on a sloping pitch. The first half was very even with Larry Pritchard equalising just before half time. In the second half the visitors took control and ran out 3-1 winners in front of 10,200 on Saturday 15th December 1973.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

This season 1983-84 created a non-league record for the Blues by reaching the First Round Proper for the eleventh consecutive season and were drawn away at Chelmsford City. Wanderers put on a good show to come away with a 0-0 draw and take the game back to Loakes Park. The following week, Tuesday 19th November 1983, Wycombe found it hard to break

down the Chelmsford defence. Home advantage seeped away as Wanderers squandered a number of good chances. Chelmsford went in front with goals from Frank Bishop and Gary Anderson, the Blues scored a last minute goal from Terry Glynn, too late for a revival and the Blues went out of the cup with a 2-1 home defeat.



TEN YEARS GO

Season 1993-94 was our first as members of the Football League, the good times abounded as we reached the Third Round of the F.A. Cup with a home draw against Premiership Norwich City. We had beaten Second Division Bristol Rovers at Bath and Cambridge United at home to reach this stage for the first time since 1985-86. Norwich City arrived at Adams Park without a manager and gave a very professional performance to win 2-0 with both goals from Chris Sutton. The match attracted 7,802 on Saturday 8th January 1994.

TODAY

**8th November 2003 - First Round Proper
v Swindon Town**

Can we go one better than last season and reach the Second Round? We went out to Brentford here in Round One last season, the previous season we had reached Round Three and lost in a tense replay at Craven Cottage to Fulham.

The connection with players and management who have appeared for both clubs is amazing, in fact there are enough names to make an entire team, including a goalkeeper and subs. We have two current players who have played for both plus our former manager and first team coach had spent time at the County Ground. Our current caretaker manager John Gorman was in charge at Swindon and took Keith Scott to the County Ground for what is still our clubs highest transfer deal at £375,000 in November 1993.



Keith played for a year with Swindon before moving to Stoke City for £300,000 in December 1995.

Paul Bodin came in on loan from Reading to Wycombe, he joined the Robins from Newport County for £30,000 in March 1988. After three years at the County Ground he moved to Crystal Palace for £550,000 in March 1991. He returned to Swindon in January



1992, Paul came on a months loan during the John Gregory era in March 1997 from Reading for one month. David Kerslake came on loan from Ipswich but was originally signed by Swindon from QPR for £110,000 in November 1989. He moved to Leeds United for £500,000 in March 1993 and seven months later joined Spurs for a similar fee. He was a loan player at Adams Park under John Gregory in season 1997-98 for three months. Ty



Gooden signed on a free for Swindon after being released by Wycombe manager

Martin O'Neill in September 1993. After a good career at the County Ground he moved to Gillingham with Iffy Onuora for a crazy fee of £150,000 the pair in 2000. Ty was forced to retire from the pro game in 2002 and now plays part time for Canvey Island.

We signed Andy Thomson in March 2002 prior to the transfer deadline, he came in from Bristol Rovers



where he moved to from Portsmouth having begun his career with Swindon Town. Andy began his career at the County Ground in 1993 as a YT and two years later he moved to Portsmouth for £75,000. After four seasons at Fratton Park Andy then moved to Bristol Rovers for £60,000 in 1999.



Frank Talia arrived at Adams Park in August 2002 on a three month contract and proved to be very able cover for Wanderers favourite keeper Martin Taylor. Frank joined Blackburn Rovers direct from Melbourne, Australia in 1992. He then moved to Swindon for £150,000 in August 1995 before being given a free transfer in 2000 to Wolves, a month later he joined Sheffield United. Another move, this time to Reading, came at the end of 2000-01 season where Frank remained until joining the Wanderers.

Terry Gibson was on loan at the County Ground from Wimbledon in 1992 when Glenn Hoddle was the Player/Manager. Swindon were members of the First Division



in those days, Terry finally moved to Barnet where he finished his playing career. During a very good goalscoring career Gibbo played for Tottenham Hotspur, Coventry City, Manchester United and Wimbledon.

Lawrie Sanchez ended his playing career



after spending time at Swindon Town having been on loan there from Wimbledon in March 1994 to the end of the season. As members of the Premiership the Robins spent just one season in the top flight under John Gorman before being relegated. The Sanchez debut was against Manchester United where Sanchez marked Eric Cantona who was sent off for stamping on John Moncur.

Three other names jumped out of the woodwork last Saturday, Paul Franklin. Steve Abbley and Alan Mayes have played for both clubs bringing the total connection to fourteen.



Sam Parkin was signed by the Robins from Chelsea at the start of last season for just £50,000 and went on to be leading scorer. Sam was on loan at Adams Park three seasons ago and scored the winner for the

Blues against Wolves in the Fourth Round of the F.A. Cup. He was loaned out to Northampton Town for the entire 2001-02 season before returning to Chelsea.



Our most recent addition was Iffy Onuora who came on loan from Sheffield United but was

a former Town player and was with Andy Thomson, Ty Gooden and Frank Talia at the County Ground. Iffy joined Swindon from Gillingham for £120,000 in March 1998.



Our last connection, and by no means least is Viv Busby. Viv played for the Blues under

Brian Lee in 1969-70 season and appeared in every position in the Blues forward line, he signed pro for Luton Town in January 1970. Viv went on to have a good career in the game and appeared for Fulham in the 1975 F.A. Cup Final against West Ham. After ending his playing career Viv went into coaching and is now Youth Team Coach at Swindon Town.

This was a fine turn around at the County Ground last season as the Blues ran out 3-0 winners on the day. A meeting with Swindon Town is always interesting and this was a victory that was unexpected prior to the game. The Robins had been on a good run of form and the Blues were looking to kick start their season.

Midfielder Keith Ryan grabbed his second goal of the season to set Wycombe on their way after twenty five minutes. He scrambled the ball over the line from four yards for his first goal since October after Steve Brown had seen his header thump the crossbar.

Seven minutes into the second half Dannie Bulman made it 2-0 when he calmly drilled the ball into the bottom corner from twelve yards out after being fed by Stuart Roberts on the right.

It was joy for Wanderers top scorer Craig Faulconbridge who wrapped the points up with fifteen minutes remaining when he headed his sixth of the season to make it 3-0. Wycombe dominated the midfield area and that was where the game was won for the visitors.

For Swindon Australian International Danny Invincible had the best effort when he sent a 30 yard pile driver against the Blues crossbar early in the second half. Wanderers continued to press forward and in the end it was a thoroughly deserved victory that could have seen a greater margin.

After the match Swindon boss Andy King said, "It was a second rate performance that we didn't deserve to get anything from. The players thought they could win without the commitment we have shown in previous games".

Blues longest serving player Keith Ryan said, "If Swindon had won today they would consider themselves play off contenders so there is no reason why we can't think along those lines. We have some difficult games ahead of us so if we can win those it would put us in with a real shout".

AH What has the last eight months been like?

CF Terrible. It was not so much the last eight months but the first three when I did not know how things would turn out. I was on crutches for so long as the knee had to have time to knit properly and allow the bone to heal. At one time I thought I might be left with a permanent limp.

The entire seven months have been a test of my character, and a test of how hard I can work. When I came round in hospital I had the choice of letting things take their course or making sure I did everything possible to get back in top condition. Needless to say the second choice was my only option. My own hard work plus the excellent help of physio Dave Jones has been worth all the effort.

AH Do you feel you have learnt something from the experience?

CF Without a doubt. Other people moan about various things, the weather, the car, the misses and whatever. For me it is a case of concentrating all efforts on what I want to do more than anything, play football again. It is easy to take your eye off the most important thing but you have to stay focussed after such an injury of this length.

AH How difficult has watching games been?

CF What has really been shown is the difference between last season and this season in terms of getting the ball in the box. The quality has been so much better this season, the ball has been coming in from all angles, just what a striker needs to put goals away. I think if I had been in the side I could have notched a few by now. I have always been strong in the air, if you look at my goal record I have scored lots of goals with my head and the lads have really provided the crosses. But as everyone knows playing the game in the stand is much easier than being on the pitch, just wait and see how we go.

AH Have you formed an opinion of how you want to contribute?

CF Dreamed about it. First of all I need

to be involved, this is the worst injury I have ever had in football and it is a case of re-launching my career. The main point I want to make is I intend to make an impact. Most people will expect goals right away, I do want to put myself under pressure by setting targets on the goal front but Wycombe fans will see a new Craig Faulconbridge.

AH Now you are close to returning what is the feeling like?

CF It's like Christmas has come early. We are doing this interview on the 28th October I am off to the training ground and although I shall be working on my own it is a big day. By the time you read this article I will be back in training with the lads and involved for the first time in eight months. I have set a target to return to playing and that is mid November. If I can be involved this afternoon it would be incredible but next week against Brentford could be a possibility. Unfortunately the reserve fixture with Northampton Town on 5th

November was postponed and that would have suited me well for my first game.

AH Finally Jona tells me you built up 2 centimetres on your right leg

CF Yes I have. When you first met me at Wrexham I was scoring goals and felt very good about myself. When I came here I adopted the wrong attitude, I thought it would all be very easy and got far too comfortable. I have changed my attitude and realised you have to be prepared to work at everything. Lying in hospital did wonders for me, and as you have seen my work rate has been 120% on getting the leg stronger. With the extra strength the leg has bulked out and I feel so good about myself and want to work everyday. This injury has been an eye opener and I am determined to make a big contribution for the future of Wycombe Wanderers and Craig Faulconbridge.

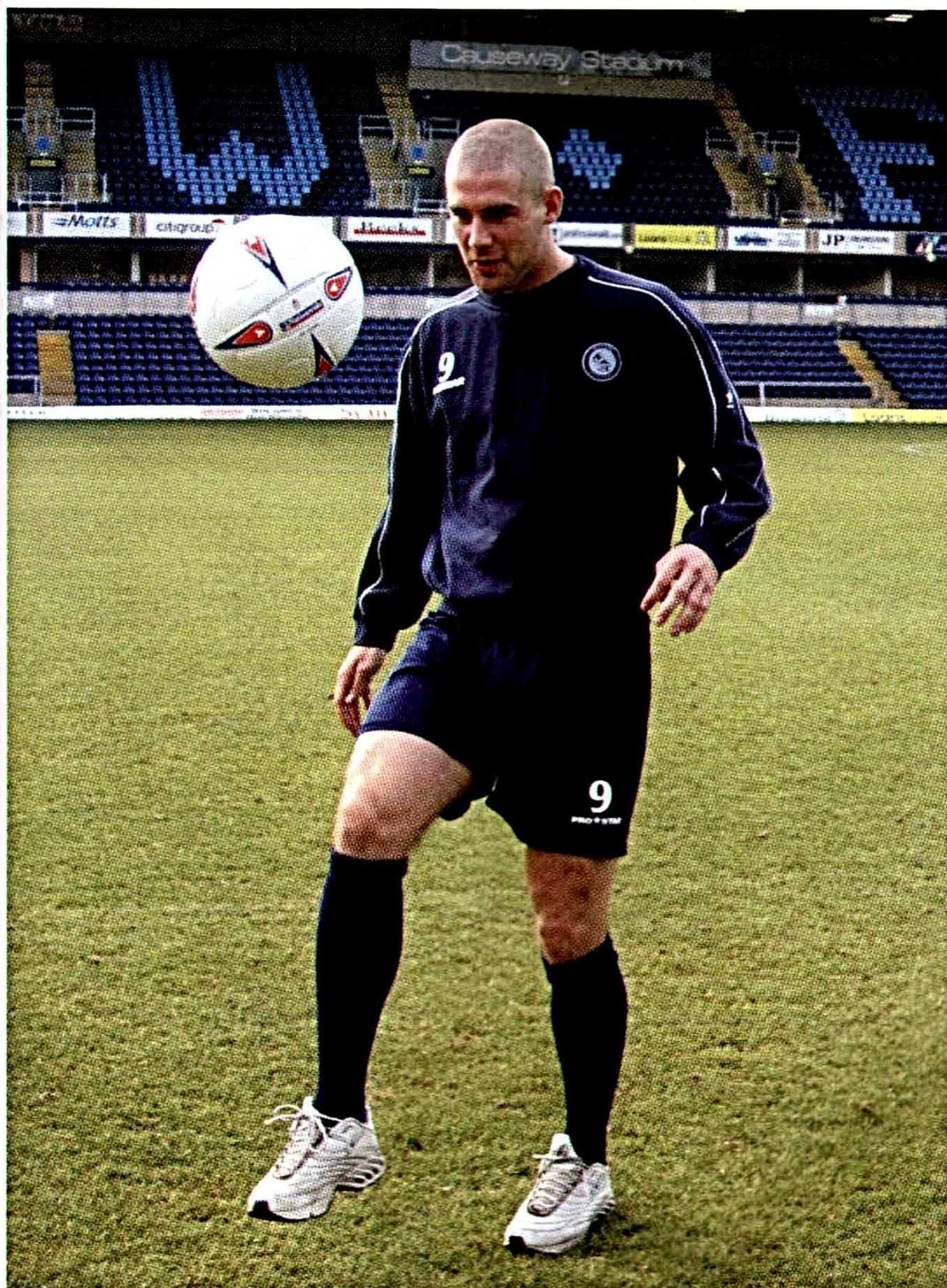

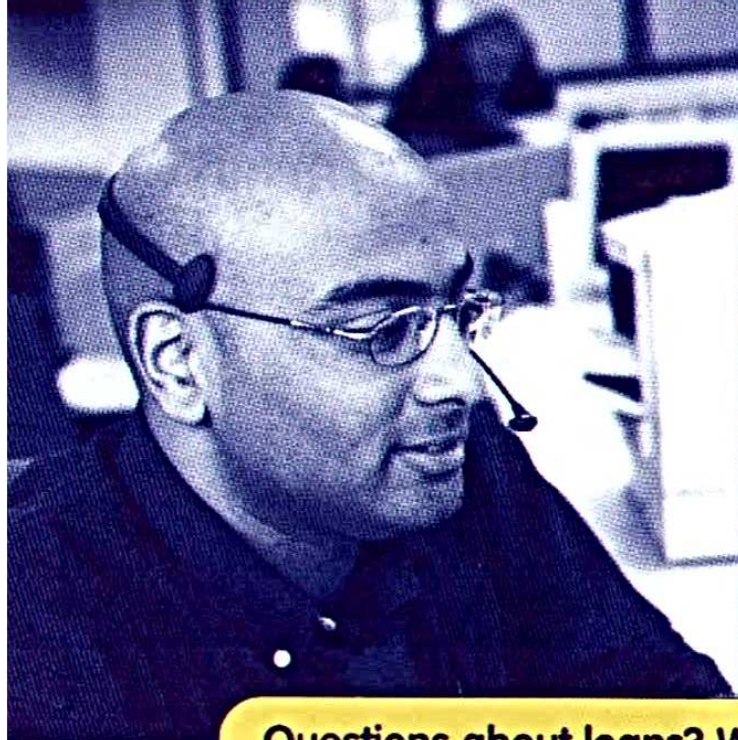

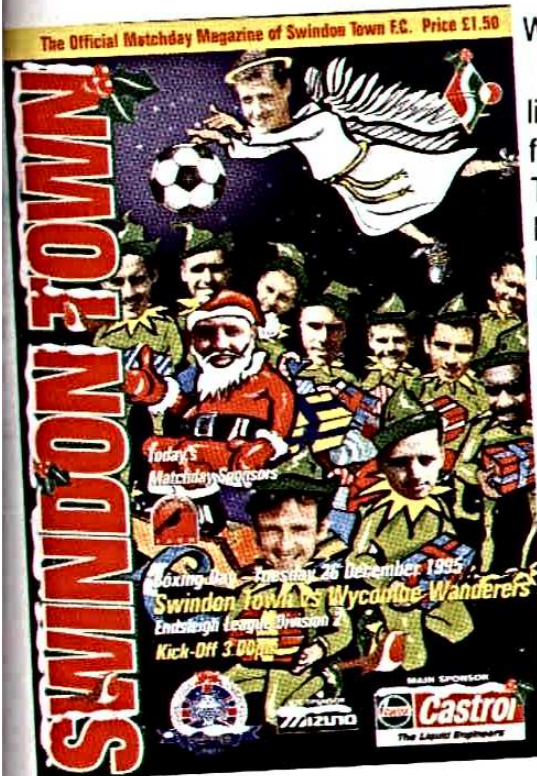

It was Boxing Day 1995 when Wycombe Wanderers travelled to the County Ground, Swindon for the first ever meeting between the two sides in the Football League. It was a reflection on where they had both come from three years previously. Swindon had been driving on toward the Premier League while Wanderers had come out of the GM Vauxhall Conference.

For the Blues it was the return of midfielder Steve Brown who played like a man who had been released from prison. His return from a three match suspension brought a performance of a player who had been forced to watch for a month from the sidelines.

It would have all been very fitting if Steve had scored the winner in the dying moments when one on one with keeper Fraser Digby, it ended when the Swindon man denied the one

Wanderers shot on target.

Wycombe defended with their lives to deny the Swindon strike force of Wayne Allison and Peter Thorne. Blues skipper Terry Evans rallied his troops with Mickey Bell raiding down the left hand side supplying the loan front man Gary Blisset who troubled the home defence with his hustle and bustle.

The nearest the hosts came to scoring was a header from Kevin Horlock which went over the bar on 50 minutes. The second half certainly warmed up in comparison to the icy weather as Swindon without a home win since October enjoyed some good possession.

But on 89 minutes the chance of the game fell to Steve Brown when he was put clear on the left by Gary Blissett. He ran on and unleashed a fierce shot which Digby got down well on the frozen surface to parry away, no



Christmas present for the Blues after all.

Wanderers skipper Terry Evans said after the game, "We were fired up for it. We always enjoy the big battles. It was a full-blooded game and that's the way I like it".

Wycombe manager Alan Smith said, "I was very disappointed in the end that we didn't get all three points. Our goalkeeper didn't have a save to make, I am pleased with a point but we had the best chance to win when Brownie went clear".

Midfielder Steve Brown commented, "To be honest my suspension did seem like a prison sentence. Four weeks is a long time to be out and coming here today is the highlight of my Christmas. It was just a pity I didn't finish off with a goal and three points for the team".

Swindon manager Steve McMahon commented, "It was another disappointment for us. We had a lot of the game but never created a real gilt edged chance. If we had done so then I think we would have won as they only had one shot on goal all game, to be fair it was a good save from Fraser".

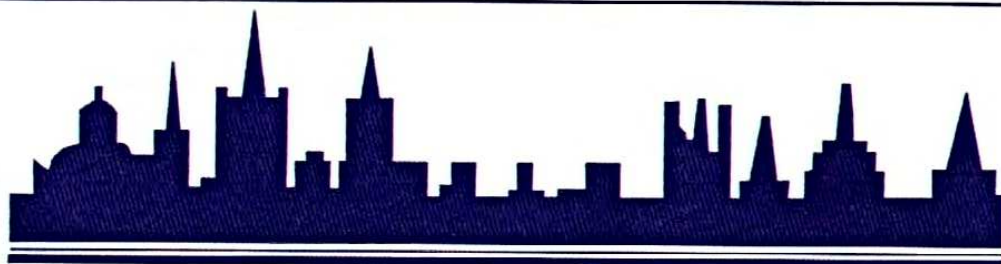

For almost 400 years, bonfires have burned on the 5th November to mark the failed Gunpowder Plot!

The tradition of Guy Fawkes-related bonfires actually began the very same year that the plot failed. The Plot was foiled on the night between the 4th & 5th November 1605. Londoners knowing that the plot had been foiled joyfully lit bonfires in thanksgiving on the 5th. As the years progressed the ritual became more elaborate by adding fireworks and Guy Fawkes dummies.

The Gunpowder Plot

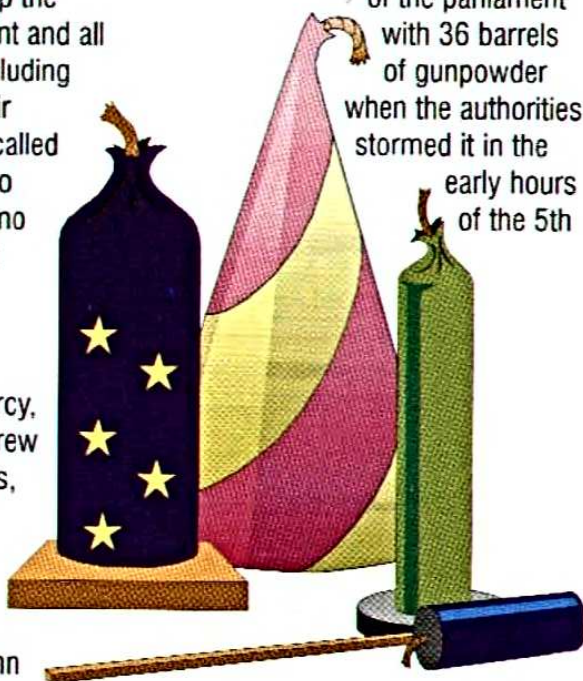
In 1604 a small band of men were conspiring to blow up the Houses of Parliament and all the people in it, including King James I. Their leader was a man called Robert Catesby who believed there was no other way. His first recruits were close friends and relatives: Thomas Wintour, Jack Wright and Thomas Percy, but the group quickly grew to include Guido Fawkes, Robert Wintour, Christopher (Kit) Wright, Robert Keyes and Thomas Bates. Latecomers included John



Grant, Ambrose Rookwood, Francis Tresham and Everard Digby, in all there were 13 conspirators.

To carry out their plan the group got hold of 36 barrels of gunpowder and stored it in a cellar just under the House of Lords. But as the groups worked on the plot it became clear that some innocent people would be hurt and some began to have doubts. So one of them sent an anonymous letter warning his friend, Lord Montague, telling him to stay away from Parliament on the 5th November. The warning letter reached the King and plans were made by the Kings forces to capture the conspirators. Guy Fawkes, who was in the cellar

of the parliament with 36 barrels of gunpowder when the authorities stormed it in the early hours of the 5th



November, was caught, tortured and executed.

I found all of this information on the internet, maybe you could go on and find the answer to these questions: -

- If Robert Catesby was the leader, how did Guy Fawkes become so famous?
- Was the letter genuine?
- There was said to be no signature and the content was very vague?
- Yet the King knew where to find them!

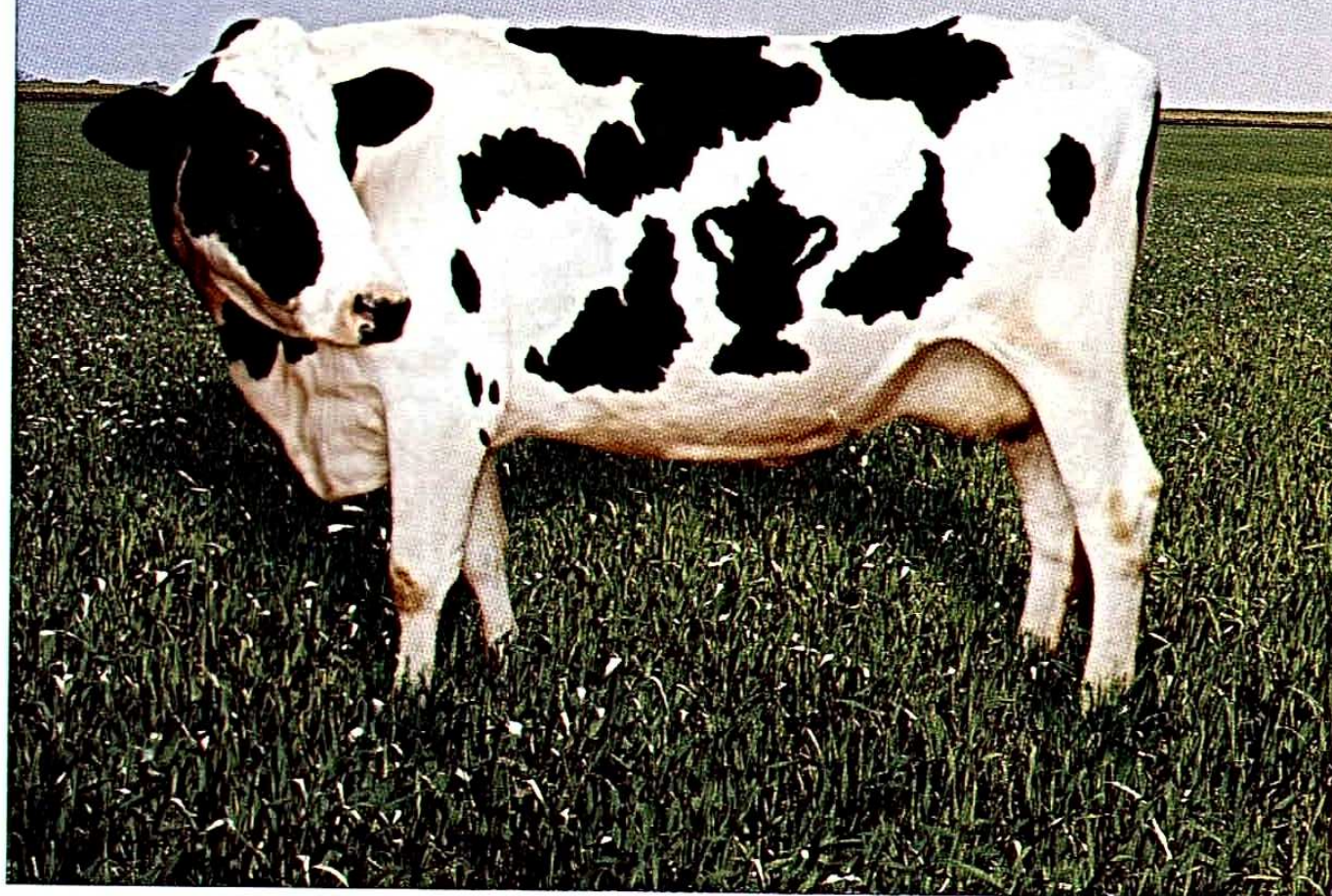

In 2001/02 a superb display of attacking football saw us come from behind to win 5-3 with goals from Rammell (2), Vinnicombe, Bulman and Owusu (own goal). Our 4-0 success last March was possibly our best home performance of the season, our goals coming from Dixon, Senda, Holligan and Currie. This helped us avenge our 2-4 FA Cup defeat by the west

Londoners a few months earlier. The game two years ago was watched by a crowd of 8,013 – the best for a league meeting at Wycombe between the sides.

Previous visits

Since our arrival into Division 2, the Racecourse Ground has been one of our most regular away venues, the exception being last season when Wrexham were in Division 3. Our record there is an interesting one – four successive defeats, followed by two wins, and most recently two goalless draws. All we had to show from our early visits was a cracking goal from Keith Ryan as we went down 4-1 back in 1994/95. We broke the losing sequence in 1998/99 when second half goals from Dave Carroll and Jermaine McSparran gave us a 2-0 success. The most enjoyable of our visits to date was the meeting in season 1999/00. A superb second half performance by a young Wycombe side turned a 0-1 interval deficit into a 3-1 victory. Our goals came from Brady, Carroll and Senda. Attendances for our visits to North Wales have been pretty mediocre, ranging from 4,290 (97/98) to just 2,450 (98/99).

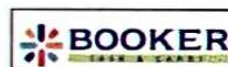

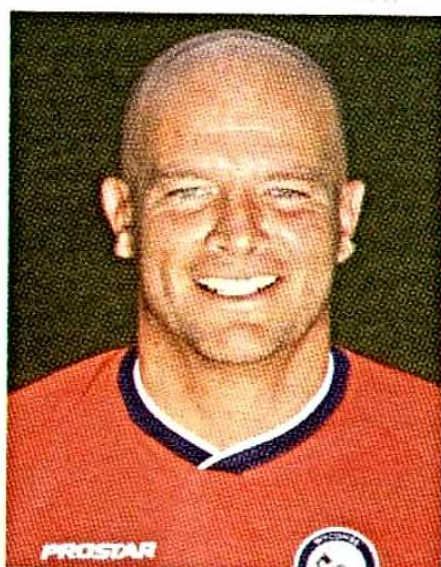

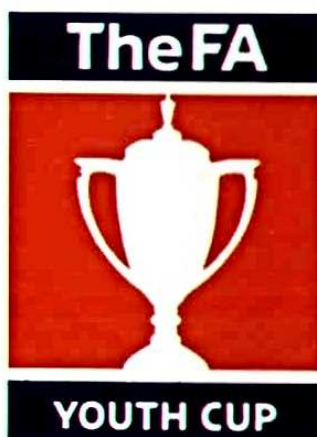
In the second half we concentrated on giving nothing away and when Leon Gordon scored a fine goal on 65 minutes we knew a place in the second round against Swindon Town was assured.

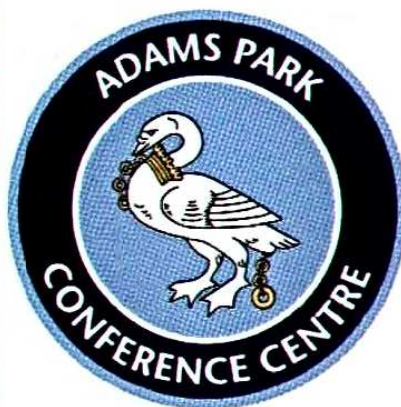

You may have noticed that Jim our ever present grounds man / kit man has not been present on the bench at Swindon and Plymouth. Jim unfortunately has been hit sideways by a viral infection that has laid him low since our arrival at our overnight stop for the Hartlepool game. Hopefully he will have recovered by the time you read these notes.

On the injury front I am delighted to inform you that Craig Falconbridge returned to training last week. He has worked extremely hard in the last fortnight not only retraining his football skills and fitness but also enhanced his confidence in the knee. Craig has worked like a Trojan as he recovered from this injury. I will recap for you that it was seven months ago that he had surgery for a very serious problem that necessitated him keeping the leg off the floor for the initial eight weeks. During that period he was strapped to a machine that bent and straightened the leg every minute for eight hours a day! When he started walking

again it was clearly evident that the muscles of the leg had withered away to almost half their original size. This was despite him doing plenty of work to minimise this muscle loss. He then started on double leg exercise and progressed slowly to single leg. Then we introduced small double leg jumping exercises and progressed them to single leg jumps. In the meantime he had to slowly learn how to walk and then run again. Finally he had to be able to carry out the activities needed for him to be able to do his job, play football. One interesting point is that his right thigh is now 2 cm larger than it was when he arrived at the Football Club despite the effects of the surgery. I think that it is only fair to say that Craig's approach to his work and the effort that he has put in can only be described as "monumental" that has gained both mine and the other staff's respect.

Disappointingly Gavin Holligan had felt too unwell to train prior to the Cambridge

City LDV match but had recovered sufficiently for him to play a significant part in the Wednesday night reserve match at Aldershot. However, more recently Gavin could not continue in last weeks match with Swindon because of a tight thigh. Despite him looking and being as strong as an Ox we are at a loss as to why his football career has been blighted by niggling muscle strains whenever he starts to string a few matches together.

Mark Rogers has trained and played with a small niggling pain behind his knee. This became somewhat worse when he made a challenge during the reserve match at Colchester. We felt that Mark should step out of action, as clearly it was not responding to treatment whilst continuing to play, despite his protests. He however now has a smile on his face as not only has the knee settled down but he should be fit to joint the Canadian national squad for their forthcoming internationals.

Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen.

The Centre of Excellence games programme is now well into progress and I have had the opportunity to watch and coach most of the various age groups we have at the club. My impression has been favourable and there are certainly players in all our age groups who could come through to the scholarship scheme. I have been busy setting up, with Matt Chandler, development centres for the younger ages groups. Wednesday night at Cressex Astroturf sees us coaching under 8's, 9's & 10's. Aylesbury centre is now working on Monday nights to find under 8's 9's & 10's as well. On top of this the advanced community scheme system

running on Mondays at Beaconsfield. This sees us operating 3 centres to date. I do want to see if we can add 3 more small centres to cover all of our catchment areas. These being in Brent/Harrow/Hayes/Hillingdon and Reading. To try and encourage the youngsters to come to Wycombe. 8 & 9 year old players are important because all the best youngsters are being snapped up by the Academy Clubs like Arsenal/Chelsea/Watford/Spurs and Reading to name but a few. When you consider Aston Villa/Leicester and Coventry are running development centres in Bucks, at Milton Keynes. We need to compete to attract the best talent locally. We need to offer coaching and the

opportunity to play in our younger age group matches to get the best talent.

On top of the Development Centres I see a vital need to have a well structured, scouting system with us building up partnerships with local clubs, offering something in return. I am presently looking at recruitment as a priority because without the raw talent you can have the best coaches in the world but if the raw material is poor you will not produce players at all. With this in mind I am looking to recruit scouts to cover our catchment area within 1½ travelling time from Wycombe.

More than any of the other commercial areas of the business, the Sales & Marketing Department relies on the team's results to assist in generating income. Likewise they rely on us achieving our targets to be able to pay them. We are therefore reliant on each other.

The Sales & Marketing Department



would not be able to bring in any hospitality revenue at Causeway Stadium without the excellent back up of the full time catering team from Adams Park Conference Centre. The jewel in the Crown there is Warren. For those who do not know Warren he is an excellent Chef, who has prepared and cooked food for tens of thousands of customers, both on matchdays (he works at London Wasps and Wycombe Wanderers home games) and on non-matchdays. Warren is backed up by the equally loyal and hardworking Roy and Bobbie, who form a formidable team in the kitchen. To give you an example of how magnificent they are, let me give you a real life example. Adams Park Events Ltd held a Boxing Evening in the Vere Suite last month. 220 persons were scheduled to sit down to a waitress served 4-course meal at 7pm. At 6.20pm it came to light that the former Head Chef Rick Brown had told Warren the numbers were 180. The function sheet said 220. Now the Club only ever buys in the food it needs for each function due to storage, good housekeeping and ensuring the customer gets high quality freshly cooked fresh foods. Warren reckoned he could stretch what he had to 200, but not 220. Rather than panic, our super cool headed Chef, came up with an alternative menu for the remaining 20 persons, which was perfectly satisfactory, and in-fact if anything better than the set menu. Consequently, the 20 persons concerned had no complaints and in-fact had a Cheese board thrown in by the resourceful Warren for any inconvenience caused. The amazing thing was that Warren and his team cooked and prepared from scratch

this new menu in under 40 minutes, so the 20 persons were served their own special menu at the same time as the other 200. Once again, I was entirely reliant on others to resolve the situation and very much appreciated their dedication and professionalism.

It is not the first (or last!) time Warren, Bobbie and Roy and all the part time staff that work with them have triumphed in adversity, putting on high quality snacks, buffets and sit down meals for tens of thousands of people every year. On a matchday, they have to provide food for all the people in the Vere Suite, Keen Lounge, Boardroom, Chiltern Sponsors Lounge and Centre Spot in the BCUC Stand, while at the same time ensuring all the people in the executive boxes and Woodlands Lounge have sufficient to eat as well. There is many other dedicated staff working behind the scenes on matchdays, all of who are vital to the smooth running of the matchday operation, and many of which have served both the Club and supporters for more than 10 years. My sincere thanks to them all for their loyalty and hardwork, proving the old adage that the whole is only as strong as the sum of its parts.

There is nothing quite like the FA Cup, emotionally and financially, so please get behind the lads as it needs both you the supporters and the team to keep the FA Cup special.
