


FRIDAY 31ST OCTOBER ARNOLD & MILLS GET INTERNATIONAL CALL

Swindon Town complete the signing of Barnsley striker Rory Fallon. The 21-year old progressed through the youth ranks at Oakwell aged 15 and progressed through to the first team. He scored seven goals last term and has notched four so far this season for the Tykes.

But despite being born on New Zealand's East coast, the towering frontman has gained international honours with England at Under 16, 17 and 18 level. His strike partner was none other than Jermain Defoe, the

star in the making at Premiership West Ham United.

'I was at Barnsley for six years, I joined as a YT when I was 15 and progressed through to the reserves and then the first team. I enjoyed my time up at Oakwell but it was time for a change and here I am! I was played as a target man at Barnsley but I have much more in my locker than that and I am looking forward to the chance to show the Swindon fans what I can do.

"The play-offs have to be the aim. The squad looks strong and I want to get to know the place and the lads as soon as I can. It is a great challenge and I can't wait to get started."



Good afternoon and welcome to everyone for today's visit of Division Two leaders Queens Park Rangers. On behalf of the board of directors can I also offer a very warm welcome to the QPR Chief Executive David Davies, his fellow directors, management, players and the supporters of QPR. On a personal basis I would also like to welcome my old colleagues from my time working at Loftus Road, who I hope to catch up with at some stage during the day. I hope they have an enjoyable day, but I am sure they will understand that my loyalties this afternoon will be with the team in red as we strive to get the win that will take us further up the table.

On the subject of the league table, it riles me a little that the Division is put down somewhat, just because we don't have a Wigan-type team who are romping away from the rest. A win for us today would see us just four points off top place, and with the exception of perhaps half a dozen sides, I would think that every club in this division still believes they have a realistic chance of at least reaching the play offs next May. It will make for a tremendous competition and hopefully we will all benefit from the bigger attendances generated by such a close and exciting competition.

The players deserve great praise for their performance up at Oldham last weekend, when we managed to win the game despite playing with only 10 men for all but the first twelve minutes. There is a fantastic spirit amongst the players and Andy and Malcolm and the desire to take this club forward is there for all to see. It was good to see Jerel Ifil back in a Swindon shirt and I would like to welcome our latest signing, Rory Fallon, to the club and wish him, on behalf of everyone at Swindon Town, every success in his career at the County Ground. Such was Rory's desire to join the club that his girlfriend had already made appointments to see properties in the area during the time it took to get all the paperwork and contract signed.

The signing of Rory Fallon is another sign of the progress we are making as a club. For us to spend money on a player I have to be completely convinced that we can afford the purchase from our existing cashflows. Once we are happy we then have to convince the Football League. Not only that but the Football League also had to take into account the fact that we had Junior Lewis on loan and we wanted to bring in Jerel Ifil on loan as well. I assume from the fact the transfers were sanctioned that the League are happy with the figures we have provided and that in itself is another sign of progress. From a revenue prospective November and December are crucial periods for the club. Our exit from the FA Cup doesn't help, even though we only budgeted for one round of the competition. We are fortunate the in Plymouth Argyle and Brighton we have two attractive fixtures which will probably see bigger thn average crowds in attendance. But also, importantly, we have significantly improved the numbers of companies using our facilities for their Christmas festivities and the projected revenue we will receive from these events is likely to be at record levels and will help us make ends meet during the next couple of months.

One final note. Our community outreach continues to grow rapidly. Following on from the record numbers the Football In The Community scheme catered for at half term, we were proud and privileged to host a game between two special needs schools- Springfield House and St Lukes last week. Some of the children participating came from backgrounds where they had been abused, physically and mentally, and to see their pleasure in getting the chance to play football on the pitch at a professional club was truly inspirational. Amongst all the talk of missed drug tests, strikes and police investigations it is wonderful to also note that football can represent some positive values. I hope the national media take the time to report on this as well.





STEFANI MIGLIORANZI SEALED MAXIMUM POINTS FOR TOWN WITH A SPECTACULAR 25-YARD EFFORT AFTER DEON BURTON BROKE HIS GOALSCORING DROUGHT TO OPEN THE SCORING WRITES STFC SPORTS REPORTER ADRIAN SMITH

Town recalled Andy Gurney after suspension and Andy Nicholas retained his place as the home team kicked off and went close when Gurney had a free-kick which eventually fell to Burton but his shot struck a Wycombe defender.

Stefani Miglioranzi and Tommy Mooney combined to set up the opening goal for Town with an excellent through ball which led to Deon Burton's first goal for the club in the 11th minute as he coolly sidefooted home from the edge of the area. In the 16th minute Town were awarded a free-kick when Robinson was fouled by Brown but Talia easily took the ball and his long ball over the Town defence fell to McSporran but Gurney was on hand to cut out the danger from Brown. Shortly afterwards Nicholas was penalised for a foul and Currie's free-kick almost caught out the Town defence as his ball reached McSporran but Evans made a fine save to push the hall out for a corner

A mistake by Gurney in the 24th minute led to a corner by Wycombe but Lewis made a good defensive header by Lewis and moments later Evans made a good save from a McSporran shot after being set up by Brown. Burton was just denied in front of goal after a cross by Duke but the ball got stuck between his feet and a couple of minutes later Hewlett set up Miglioranzi but his shot flew over the bar.


Burton, Robinson and Miglioranzi combined to set up a chance for Duke but his shot went wide and at the other end another in-swinging cross by Currie reached Brown but his weak header was saved by Evans.

A long goal kick by Evans fell kindly for Burton but his turn and shot on the volley just dipped over the bar in the 41st minute. Two minutes later Brown was cautioned for a foul on Robinson and the resulting free-kick was taken by Gurney but Lewis's header just went wide and the halftime whistle went soon afterwards.

Wycombe went close in the 60th minute after a scramble in the Town defence and moments later Mooney had the ball in the net from a header but the assistant referee had already flagged for offside. Three minutes later Town threatened with a Gurney free-kick which was headed behind for a corner taken by Robinson but gathered by Talia.

Super Sam Parkin made a welcome return after injury in the 65th minute when he replaced Burton and Wycombe replaced Brown but it was Stefani Miglioranzi who grabbed the limelight two minutes later with a

sublime curling shot from the edge of the box after a superb build up. Parkin was unlucky not to add Town's third when he was first to react from a cross by Robinson but his header struck the post and rebounded to safety.

Evans made a good save from Bell and his long clearance set up Mooney but his curling shot went just wide from twenty yards in the 75th minute. Moments later Evans was again involved when he showed some excellent defensive skills as he sprinted from his line to cut out another Wycombe attack. Town replaced Lewis with Brian Howard and moments later Gurney made a good defensive header from a Senda cross.

Miglioranzi had a long range shot

from 30 yards in added time which was saved by Talia just before referee Mr Butler blew his whistle for full time as Town claimed their first win in eight games to push Wycombe down to the bottom of Division 2.





WYCOMBE PROGRESSED THROUGH TO ROUND TWO OF THE FA CUP AT TOWN'S **EXPENSE AS A BRACE FROM DARREN CURRIE ENSURED** TONY ADAMS MADE A WINNING MANAGERIAL START.

Sam Parkin, a former Wycombe hero having scored in their memorable FA Cup run, started in the Town line-up and soon found himself in the thick of the action, forcing a throw after pressurising Senda. The resulting throw by Nicholas was launched into the box before Miglioranzi saw his shot blocked.

Darren Currie made a lively start with a 25-yard curling effort drifting just over Rhys Evans in the Swindon area. Keith Ryan then fired well wide of the right hand post after being deployed in a front three, a tactical change by the Wycombe management after last week's loss at The County Ground.

Brian Howard, replacing the suspended Hewlett, saw his free-kick punched away by former Town keeper Frank Talia as Town pushed forward. Tommy Mooney then drove into the Wycombe half and after an interchange with Howard, poked a left foot shot wide.

On the half-hour Town created their best chance of the half when Howard's left foot shot from 20-yards rebounded off the post and fell to Parkin but his goal-bound shot was parried acrobatically by Talia. Minutes later Alan Reeves then headed straight at Talia from a Gurney corner.

On 64 minutes Nicholas gave away a free-kick on the edge of the area. Currie then stepped up and bent the ball around the wall into the top corner of the net to leave Town trailing 2-0.

Swindon were handed a lifeline in the 70th minute when Sam Parkin was tripped by Roger Johnson inside the area. Referee Mr R Beeby pointed to the spot to the delight of the 1,127 Town fans and Captain Andy Gurney led the way to blast the ball past Talia into the corner of the net to make it 2-1. Shortly after Gurney had a longrange free-kick deflected away before some good pacy defending by Nicholas denied McSporran.

A deep cross by David Duke from the right was headed behind by Ryan and seconds later Grant Smith replaced Howard. The resulting corner by Miglioranzi struck Mooney and fell away from danger and Nicholas went close with a toepoked shot from close range on 81 minutes.

Sebastien Ruster replaced Reeves but Wycombe went further ahead in the 85th minute when a shot by Dannie Bulman was not gathered by Evans and Currie slid the loose ball home. Although Keeper Evans protested that he had been fouled, the referee awarded the goal.

Two minutes later McSporran broke down the right hand side and skipped past Gurney to drive the ball past Evans from the right hand edge of the area to complete the scoring.

Gurney was cautioned in the 90th minute for a foul but the resulting freekick was easily cleared as the full-time whistle blew


The 4-1 scoreline ensured a successful start to Tony Adams' managerial career and this result leaves Town to focus on the League as they are out of all cup competitions this season.



SWINDON ACHIEVED THEIR **FIRST WIN AT BOUNDARY** PARK SINCE 1968 AS SAM PARKIN SCORED THE ONLY **GOAL DESPITE MATT** HEYWOOD'S SENDING-OFF IN THE 11TH MINUTE WRITES STFC SPORTS REPORTER ADRIAN SMITH.

Town included Jerel Ifil and Matt Hewlett who returned from suspension as Steve Robinson and Stefani Miglioranzi were involved in some good early attacking play. Andy Gurney chose to go for placement rather than power in his first free-kick after Robinson was fouled but Oldham keeper Pogliacomi caught the ball easily.

Referee Mr Cowburn controversially sent off Matt Heywood in the 11th minute as the Swindon player challenged former Town target Calvin Zola for the ball and a penalty was awarded against Town. However Lady Luck smiled on Town when Zola's penalty struck the post and the resulting shot from the rebound went high and wide.

Town reshuffled their line-up and Gurney dropped into the defence and in attack Sam Parkin and Lewis combined to create an opportunity for Mooney but his shot went wide. In the 25th minute

Rhys Evans made an outstanding save in a one on one situation with Ernie Cooksey and the ball was cleared for a corner that was gathered by Evans. Lewis was cautioned in the 34th minute when he kicked the ball away a split second after Zola had again tumbled over and a free-kick against Town.

Evans made an incredible save from a header by Zola who was two yards from the goal-line and the resulting corner was cleared and although Oldham had the ball in the net, Mr Cowburn had already awarded a freekick for offside.

After the break Mooney showed some good skill as he set up Miglioranzi for a long range shot which was saved by Pogliacomi and Hewlett shot wide from 25 yards after some good approach work by Mooney.

Jerel Ifil made a good tackle in the penalty area as Zola threatened and the ball was cleared for a good attack involving Mooney and Lewis which was cleared. However Town took a deserved lead in the 61st minute when Sam Parkin side footed home from close range after a cross by Junior Lewis who was injured in the build up. but he eventually carried on after treatment. Oldham counterattacked strongly and Mooney was back helping

out in defence with a long-range clearance from a corner.

Rory Fallon made his Town debut in the 78th minute replacing Parkin and Alan Reeves replaced Robinson as Andy King elected to try and preserve Town's slender lead. Roca tested Evans reflexes with a close range shot but found the Town keeper equal to the task and at the other end Miglioranzi set new boy Fallon up in front of goal but he took one touch too many and the ball was cleared.

Oldham captain John Eyre went close with a dipping shot in the 4 minutes of added time and the home team continued to press forward with Evans making another smart save from a Vernon header. Miglioranzi and Gurney pushed forward but lost the ball and the home team had one last attack before Mr Cowburn blew for full time to seal a fine battling, winning display from ten man Town.

Who ate all the pies? Well, hopefully everyone if Brian Wood has anything to say about it. And not just the pies but the Chicken Chasseur as well. Or maybe you prefer a Mexican Wrap? Food, glorious food is what it's all about for ex-restaurateur Brian whose job is everything culinary at the County Ground.

Trained Chef Brian is a proud man who constantly strives to improve on his already high standards so that his guests (all 7,000 of them!) enjoy what they eat in every part of the ground.

Starting as manager for contract caterers Halliday in 1994/95, Brian began in his current position in August 2002 when conference & banqueting went in-house. His team is Clive Harper, Head Chef, Chris Abrook, Kiosk & Bars manager and Nikki Whitaker, Conference Assistant. He also oversees 80 people spread throughout the ground.

Family man Brian describes football as "his hobby, his job and his life". Married to Lynn for 26 years he has four children and at 46 still plays Sunday league football in his Gloucester home. Like Mike Sullivan he is also a qualified referee and, Rhys beware, his son Ashley is a youth goalkeeper at Gloucester City.

On A Matchday Saturday...

6.45am -

Preparation in catering is done prior to matchday i.e. ordering food etc... However I arrive early to put the finishing touches in place. Its having that eye for detail - are the televisions dusty, are the rooms warm?

8.15am -

Clive, our Head Chef arrives.

9.30am -

Nikki and Chris arrive. We sit down to run through the order of the day so that everything coincides with the marketing team. This ensures matchday runs smoothly and is why our guests tend to go away very happy.

10.30am -

Around mid morning Chris and I go to check on the various kiosks. We make sure everything is ready for the arrival of the fans i.e. the pie warmers and coffee machines are switched on etc... It generally takes 45 minutes to visit them all.

11.30pm -

Nikki, Chris and I do the last minute jobs so that everything is ready.

12.00pm -

Guests arrive from mid-day onwards. We're on our toes from around 11,30am. It's ensuring the first impression of the Club is a good one. They are shown up to us, we take them to their rooms and hope it's the beginning of a great day.

2.00pm -

We revisit the kiosks to make sure that the standards expected are being met, i.e. staff are wearing their hats, they have their hair tied up and, very importantly, a smile on their faces.

3.00pm - 4.40pm -

We try to watch some of the game but also have to get ready for half-time. This means clearing up the pre-match meal, cleaning the rooms and getting the tea and coffee ready. Half-time is very busy and when the second half starts its clear down time again.

4.45pm - 6.00pm -

At the end of the game we look after guests from the game but also get ready for any evening function. Most weekends we have some sort of event such as a wedding.

6.00pm -

Guests start arriving for the evening but we may still have guests from the game in the bars so we have to make sure that we keep everyone happy.

1.30am -

After the function has finished I usually get away by 1.30am.



The programme itself contained the Bush Telegraph with news about Queens Park Rangers and an article by Gordon Jago the manager. A centre spread gave information and a picture of Swindon while there were two pages of excellent detail on Rangers matches in the previous weeks.


The match itself was played out on a slippery surface at Loftus Road. The best chance of the first half came after 23 minutes when Don Rogers skilfully

outpaced three defenders only to see his shot saved by Phil Parkes in the Rangers goal. When the Rangers attacked they came up against Stan Harland on top form ably assisted by Ron Potter deputising for Frank Burrows.

The first goal came after 61 minutes. Joe Butler attempted a shot that was going wide when it came close to the quick thinking Arthur Horsfield who redirected it with a volley into the Rangers goal. Seventeen minutes later Swindon increased their lead. Again Joe butler was the provider but this time not with a mis-directed shot but a carefully placed through ball that enabled Peter Noble to run through and beat the advancing Parkes. The score might have stayed like that but for a strange penalty decision. Mike McGovern had a shot tipped onto the bar by Downsborough that came back

to Leach who should have scored but fired over. While Downsborough was receiving treatment referee Derek Nippard consulted his linesman and awarded a penalty for handball by Rod Thomas who had been about four feet away. Rodney Marsh tucked the kick away thus making for a nervewracking period before the final whistle. It was to be Town's first and last F A Cup win of the season as for the second season in a row they went out to Leeds United. This time heavily beaten by 4-0 at Elland Road. In the league Queens Park Rangers finished just above Swindon with 43 points to Towns 42. Both clubs right backs Dave Clements and Rod Thomas were ever present in the League as were Joe Butler and Stan Harland for Town. Rodney Marsh led the Rangers scorers with 23 in League and Cup while for Swindon Don Rogers with 20 goals in league and cup led the scorers.


But manager Ian Holloway, a former player at Loftus Road, is still cautious about his side's chances of climbing out of the Second Division, saying:

There's an awful long way to go yet and anything can happen from now until next May. It's going to be mighty tough with so many decent teams all in with an excellent chance of finishing in the top six at least."

Last season Rangers missed out on promotion when they lost 1-0 to Cardiff City after extra-time in the Play-off Final at The Millennium Stadium. That defeat was a huge disappointment for all concerned at Loftus Road, but Holloway, vastly experienced in the game, was confident that if he was able to hold on to his best players, then there was no reason why Rangers couldn't claim promotion in 2003-04...and that's his goal, despite; losing 1-0 at Grimsby in the 1st round of the FA Cup a fortnight ago.

Holloway finished last term by fielding this line-up: Day; Kelly, Padula; Palmer, Shittu, Carlisle; Bircham, Gallen, Furlong, Pacquette and McLeod, with Thomson, Williams, Ross and Plummer all being used as substitutes.

So far this season, Rangers have had mixed results away from home. From the nine games played in the Football League, they have won three, drawn four and lost two.



THE GAFFER

In his playing days, lan
Holloway was hard-working,
right-sided midfielder who
amassed a fine record of more
than 600 first-class
appearances, with over 550
coming in the Football League
(49 goals scored). Born in
Kingswood near Bristol in
1963, he started his career
with his local club, Bristol
Rovers and went on to serve,

in turn, with Wimbledon,
Brentford, Torquay
United, Bristol Rovers (again),
Queen's Park Rangers (August
1991-July 1996) and Bristol
Rovers for a third time. Indeed,
he was appointed as playermanager of the Pirates in 1996
and remained in office until
February 2001 when he
replaced Gerry Francis in the
hot-seat at Loftus Road.

DANGERMAN KEVIN GALLEN



Kevin Gallen is able to play in midfield or up front and is in his second spell at Loftus Road. Born in Chiswick in September 1975, he started his professional career at Loftus Road in 1992 and over the next eight years netted 40 goals in 191 first-class games, gaining England Youth and Under-21 recognition. He then assisted Huddersfield Town (10 goals in 39 outings), and Barnsley (two in 10) before returning to Rangers two years ago this month. Since then he has added a further & 25 goals to his tally (in less than 100 appearances) and is currently in pretty good form. He feeds well off Paul Furlong but can also graft hard and long himself and when drafted into midfield, he certainly puts in his fair share of work. He was rangers' 'Player of the Year' last season and he also scored the club's 'Goal of the Season'.

DID YOU KNOW?

Queen's Park Rangers were the first team from the Third Division to play in and win a major Cup Final at Wembley - beating the holders West Bromwich Albion 3-2 in the 1967 Football League Cup Final (after trailing 2-0 at half-time). Rodney Marsh was the star performer in the Rangers side that afternoon. And two years later...(!)

LAST MEETING

The corresponding fixture here at The County Ground last season, played on 1st March 2003, ended in a 3-1 win for the Robins in front of a crowd of 7,116. Steve Robinson, Sam Parkin and Matthew Heywood scored the home goals after Danny Shittu had given Rangers a 15th minute lead.



GARETH AINSWORTH

Gareth joined Rangers on a free transfer in July 2003 after being released by Cardiff City. His debut for Rangers was in the first match of the 2003/04 season at home to Blackpool where he also scored two goals in a 5-0 victory.

MARCUS BEAN

Marcus came through the youth ranks at Rangers after first joining the Club as an eleven year old. He scored his first senior goal for Rangers in September 2003 when he bagged the first in a 2-0 victory at Wrexham.

MARC BURCHAM

Lifelong Rangers final Marc joined Rangers on a free transfer from Millwall in July 2002. His all-action displays in the heart of the Rangers midfield have made him a firm favourite with the Loftus Road fans.

CLARKE CARLISLE

Highly rated central defender signed in May 2000 from Blackpool for an intial fee of £250,000 which could rise subject to appearances. Now back to full fitness and a vital part of the Rangers defensive unit.

NICK CULKIN

Nick joined Rangers on a free transfer from Manchester United in July 2002. Made his debut for Rangers in the opening match of the 2002/03 season at Loftus Road v Chesterfield.

WESLEY DALY

Wesley joined the club as a ten year and has progressed through the youth system to the First Team squad. Made his debut two weeks after his eighteenth birthday against Colchester United in March 2002. Another youngster who will be pushing hard for a first team place this year.

CHRIS DAY

Former England Under 21 goalkeeper signed on a free transfer from Watford in July 2001. Made his

See you all back here for the visit of Plymouth Argyle on December 13.



THE RETURN OF TOWN STRIKER SAM PARKIN TO THE FIRST TEAM FOLD DURING THE HOME WIN OVER WYCOMBE WANDERERS A FEW WEEKS BACK GAVE EVERYONE AT THE CLUB A LIFT, LEAST OF ALL THE TOWN SUPPORTERS WHO STOOD AS ONE TO WELCOME THEIR HERO BACK ONTO THE FIELD.

It was a frustrating injury for the 22-year old, who has racked up almost 100 appearances in his career. As a youngster starting out at Chelsea, he was loaned out to Millwall, Oldham, Wycombe and Northampton. His spell at Adams Park was a happy one, although he made a losing return to the renamed Causeway Stadium just two weeks ago.

Despite a successful start to his Swindon Town career last season where he hit 26 goals to help Town secure Second Division status, the 2003-2004 campaign began well but injury kept the 6'2 striker out for several games, a frustrating time as Parkin explains.

"I did the injury in the home game against Peterborough. It was a twist and I played on to the end of the game not knowing the extent of the injury. After that game I tried to get fit for the following game against Luton but it wasn't right and I subsequently missed the game at Bristol City before going for a scan. That was when the

damage was noticed and it went from there.


"It was probably the most frustrating moment since I have been involved in first team football. It was the first time I had missed four or five games on the bounce with anything other than a muscle injury. It was a little bit unsettling because I thought I might have had to have an operation and miss a few months but we left it and the right decision was made in the end."

Now firmly 'back in the groove' at The County Ground, Parkin made his first start since returning from injury against another of his former loan clubs, Oldham Athletic, last weekend. Parkin latched onto a ball from Junior Lewis and stylishly swept the ball past the Oldham keeper to give Town all three points.

"I was delighted to get back on the scoresheet at Oldham on Saturday. It was my first league start since returning from the injury, and it was a very important win for us, especially having not won there for a little while! We were going through a bit of a sticky patch over the last few weeks with the FA Cup defeat but we have now put together two back-to-back victories in the league against two of my old Clubs."

Town Boss Andy King spent £50,000 to bring 'Super' Sam to Wiltshire and what a bargain that has proved to be.





Having hit 26 goals last term and with nine goals so far this season, it looks like another successful campaign ahead for the Londoner. The boy from Barnes has also seen various changes during his spell at the Club and acknowledges that the changes over the summer have benefited the Club.

"There has been a big difference in the squad this year and I think that has showed in our performances. Last year we went seven or eight defeats on the run and didn't know where our next win was coming from whereas this year we have really turned it around. This season we have signed a few players and the squad is generally stronger.

"All of the new lads have made a difference. Adi is injured at the moment but he was great at the start of the season with an experienced head at the back. Tommy has been banging in the goals and we have struck up a good relationship. 'Nicho', Grant, Brian and Stevo have also played their part and there is a positive vibe around the place.

"As regards to ambitions, I would love to move up with

Swindon Town and take us into the First Division.

Obviously my agent and Mark Devlin are still talking over the final points of my new contract and I would hope that it will have been sorted out before today's game."

As for today's opponents QPR, Parkin has made no secret of the fact that he is a Rangers fan but hopes to sink his boyhood heroes once again with a repeat of last season's goalscoring feats, that prompted Parkin to celebrate, minus his shirt, in front of the Town End!

"I think I made it aware before last years game against QPR when I scored that goal that I was a big Rangers fan and I think probably a lot of supporters will know that so it will be a big game for me and I am looking forward to it immensely.

"If I score I can safely say I won't be stripping off in celebration again, I will leave that until it is pouring down with rain in February. I said I wouldn't do that again and I am sticking to that."



'OUI' MEET AGAIN...

DAVE WALLIS DELVES INTO HIS ARCHIVES TO PROVIDE US WITH TWO PEOPLE WHO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED WITH BOTH CLUBS.

Mick McGovern

Joining Swindon from QPR in February 1973, midfielder Mick McGovern became a member of manager Les Allen's playing staff for the second time, the pair having previously teamed up at Loftus Road.

Mick had begun his career at QPR when he completed his spell as a trainee in November 1968, but he would appear just 12 times for Rangers. After a four-match loan spell at Third Division Watford, McGovern completed his transfer to Wiltshire, a move which retained his Division Two place just as QPR secured promotion to the top flight.

In a coincidence that belongs in the twilight zone, Mick's first appearance in a Swindon shirt took place at Loftus Road where Town were on the receiving end of a 5-0

drubbing. Playing his first couple of games at number eight, he was to also wear 11 and seven before the campaign closed with a 16th place finish.

1973/74 saw Mick make a more settled contribution, taking to the field in a total of 20 matches and generally operating on the right hand side of midfield. As relegation became inevitable, Allen shuffled his options and moved McGovern to the wide left role as a replacement for winger and record signing Tommy Jenkins.

Back in the Third Division, John McLaughlin was pushed up from right back and he effectively deposed McGovern from his midfield role. In February 1975, Mick made his final appearance in a Swindon shirt in a 3-1 defeat at Gillingham. A loan spell at Aldershot in March 1975 produced his last six games of his League career and a final goal.

Eric Sabin

During the summer of 2001 Andy
King came over all continental
and added the pace of
Frenchman Eric Sabin to
Town's squad. Sabin joined
from Wasquehal and teamed
up with Danny Invincibile to
provide the speed in attack
that had been conspicuous by its
absence for some time. Born in
Sarcelles in January 1975, Eric had
made 28 appearances and notched a
trio of goals for the French side.

The first games of the season were notable for the penalties stroked away by Keith O'Halloran, invariably a result of Eric's fast and tricky runs into the box which showed up the clumsiness of his markers.

By the end of 2001/02 he had appeared in 34 League games for Town and had struck a disappointing 5 goals, but Eric's movement was always capable of creating chances for others. Starting the following season as a first choice, the arrival of loan signing Luke

Nightingale from Portsmouth on Boxing Day saw Eric dropped to the bench and he was not to reclaim a regular first team shirt.

12 of his 39 outings that season were to be made as a substitute and the close season of 2003 brought a move to today's visitors QPR after a protracted trial period.

No one could deny that Eric was one of the fastest players to have graced the County Ground pitch for a very long time, but equally truthful was the fact that his final ball often failed to consummate the expectation generated by his approach play.




COLCHESTER UNITED

Someone once said that rugby is a hooligan's game played by gentleman and football is a gentleman's game played by hooligans. Whoever called football a gentleman's game obviously had one man in mind. If ever there was a true gent to grace the corridors of The County Ground it was John Gorman.

John, Town's Assistant Manager at Wembley, recalls his honour at leading out the team, perching perilously on the roof of the coach and giving his wife the good news.

He began by giving his account of the play-off final from his view on the touchline and revealed that he had seen the game again recently on video.

"Funnily enough on the coach with Wycombe last weekend we put on a video of some of the great games and Swindon against Leicester at Wembley was one of them and it brought it all back again. It's was a wonderful, wonderful day.

"We stayed a fair way out at the Marriott Hotel near Heathrow the night before and I remember getting to the stadium and seeing one end totally red and the other end totally blue. It was a wonderful scene to be honest

"I led the team out because Glenn was playing and that was a big moment for me. It was a great honour to lead a team out for the first time at Wembley as I didn't expect to be doing that although I've been there since with England.

"I'll never forget the game, it was a crazy game! We played really well and Glenn scored an excellent goal as he didn't score many that season. We played a very good first half and totally controlled it if I look back.

"We came out in the second half and Craig Maskell's got a great goal and then big Shaun's got a third and we thought

- game over, and then unbelievably Joachim gets one back before Walsh and Thompson scored to make it three each. At one point the ball rolled towards the touchline and came between me and Brian Little and we just looked at each other and said 'what a great game'. I then put on Steve White and we had two good chances through Dave Mitchell and Steve White just before we got the penalty. When Paul Bodin stepped up and scored it to make it 4:3 there was no way back for Leicester. It was an epic final.

"After the final there were the best celebrations you could get, we didn't want to come out of Wembley. When we went back on the team coach and we got back to Swindon we got on top of the team bus. We took our lives in our hands then I think. We then went around the whole of Swindon, from place to place and then back to the stadium and as we drove into the entrance it was phenomenal. It was just one of those wonderful days from the point of view of being a coach.

"I kept many close work connections with players from that day. Colin Calderwood was a coach with me at Tottenham, so was David Kerslake and Mickey Hazard as well as Shaun Taylor at Bristol City and we still talk about it now."

The events that followed in the weeks after the final are etched in Swindon Town folklore as gentleman John took full control of team affairs as Glenn took the road to Chelsea. He remembers the moment when the decision was made.

"The day Glenn left I went in to say my goodbyes to everyone at the Club as I was convinced I was going to follow Glenn to Chelsea. Ray Hardman, the Chairman, then grabbed me for one last chat and he said 'John, we want you to stay, we don't want you to go,' so I said, 'OK, I'll stay'. I phoned my wife straight away and I said 'I'm not going to Chelsea, I'm going to stay and I'm going to be Swindon manager." The rest, as they say, is history.



visited Southampton and won by four goals to nil. Stephnie Lewis grabbed a hat trick and Polly New got the other goal.


